**Dr. RAS Mikey (Michael) Courtney** is an Emmy awarded, Assistant Professor of Dance at Wayne State University. Dr. RAS is co-founder and CEO of Fore I'm a Versatile Entertainer (F.I.V.E.) LLC. He holds a B.F.A. in Dance from UARTS in Philadelphia, an MA in Ethnochoreology and Ph.D. in Arts Practice Research from University of Limerick in Ireland. As a cultural conduit, he uses edutainment to spread universal understanding to global communities. His research investigates movement as cultural knowledge through embodied practice, with a specialization on Ethiopia. Dr. RAS has developed a contemporary Ethiopian form he calls Ethio-Modern Dance. He recently published 'Interlude 10: Dancing as a Citizen of the World, in The Artist and Academia (Routledge, 2021) He has facilitated a student/ staff exchange between the University of Limerick and Addis Ababa University. Dr. RAS is also an established songwriter/recording artist with two major releases, RASOUL (2018) and Love Year (2020).



**Jessica Rajko** is an Assistant Professor at Wayne State University in dance and big data analytics. She has presented and performed in various collaborative artworks nationally and internationally, including Amsterdam's OT301, Toronto's Scotiabank Nuit Blanche festival and New York City's Gotham Festival at The Joyce Theatre. Jessica has been invited to present her research at several transdisciplinary institutional programs such as Harvard's Digital Futures Consortium, UPenn's Price Lab for Digital Humanities, and University of New Mexico's ART Lab. She is currently conducting collaborative research within Dance Computing Studies - an emerging field and international community of artists/scholars concerned with the ethical and aesthetic dimensions of movement analysis and representation.

# Maggie Allesee Our Namesake



In recognition and appreciation of Maggie Allesee's history of generous support of the arts at Wayne State University and of theatre and dance in particular, the WSU Board of Governors approved the renaming of the theatre and dance department in 2012. They had originally named it the Maggie Allesee Department of Dance in 2000 when Dance and Theatre were separate departments.

Maggie's contributions as a volunteer, philanthropist, and community and civic leader have been vast and varied. An avid supporter of the arts, she has served as a board member for the Cranbrook Academy of Arts, Birmingham Bloomfield

Art Center, Detroit Metropolitan Dance Project, Detroit Symphony Orchestra Hall, Meadow Brook Theatre, Michigan Opera Theatre, Music Hall, Eisenhower Dance Ensemble, Oakland University Department of Music, Theatre and Dance, Kendall College of Art and Design, the Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary, Wayne State Hilberry Understudies, and many more.

In addition to donating her time, talents, and knowledge, she also a generous financial contributor to many organizations, particularly in arts and education. She has given individual gifts of \$1 million or more to The Parade Company, Oakland University for the Maggie Allesee School of Nursing to establish a Chair in Gerontology, WSU for the Bob Allesee (Allison) Endowed Chair in Media Studies, Detroit Historical Museum, Music Hall and \$2 million plus gifts to WSU for the Dance Department, Florida State University for a major statue and the establishment of the Maggie Allesee National Center for Choreography, and Michigan Opera Theatre for the reception room and library. Mrs. Allesee was recognized for her \$3 million gift to Hospice of Michigan with the unveiling of the Maggie Allesee Center for Quality of Life. She has received four Honorary Doctorate Degrees from Kendall College of Art and Design, Wayne State University, Oakland University, and Florida State University.

### **Guest Artists**



Lawrence Fung raised in the concrete jungle of Hong Kong and the American Southwest, the presence of contrast has been a common theme in the dance works, films, and photographs that Lawrence creates. The self-taught photographer and filmmaker has a particular interest in finding details and patterns in his worldly encounters. Inspired by the vastly diverse landscapes, urban architectures, and environments we live in, Fung finds purpose in uncovering the hidden layers and stories beyond what meets the eye. He uses visual language to draw his viewers' attention to an encapsulating storytelling experience by exploring the theories of composition, color, scale, and choreographed camera movement all in relation to dance. As a choreographer and movement artist, Fung is constantly exploring the integration and similarities between ballet and breaking, bringing the opposite disciplines into a free-flowing harmony that exists in a new dimension without contextual boundaries. Modern masculinity, self-discovery, and religion are themes that gravitate Fung's curiosity in his dance-making.



Wanjiru Kamuyu Wanjiru Kamuyu, native Kenyan based in Paris, France, is associate artist with Theater L'Onde (Velizy, France). Her career began with her genesis in N.Y. City. As a performer she has worked with Jawole Willa Jo Zollar, Bill T. Jones, Molissa Fenley, Anita Gonzales, Okwui Okpokwasili, Nathan Trice, Dean Moss, Tania Isaac...and in Europe with choreographers Robyn Orlin, Emmanuel Eggermont, visual artist Jean-Paul Goude and TV director Christian Faure. Alongside Kamuyu has performed in industrials, television and broadway musicals, The Lion King (Paris) and Fela! (UK and Equity European and US tours). Kamuyu founded dance company, WKcollective, associate company with creative production agency camin action (Montpellier, France). Her choreographic projects include tours in the US, Africa, and Europe. Commissions include musical A la recherche de Josephine, director Jerome Savory (Paris and International tours); Love is in the hair, director Hassan Kassi Kouyate (Paris); US esteemed dance departments (Mills College, U Of M, W.S.U., Stephens College); artistic consulting/ outside eye for choreographer Bintou Dembele's ZH; choreographer assistant to Nathan Trice's Their speech is silver, Their silence is gold; storyteller Nathalie La Boucher's La Chevauchee du Gange. While touring she offers master classes and workshops for dance companies, universities, community and dance centers. Kamuyu holds an MFA (performance and choreography) from Temple University (Philadelphia, PA). She has served as Visiting Guest Professor at Mills College (USA) and is currently core faculty for University of South Florida's Dance in Paris semester and summer programs.



**Gabrielle McLeod (Queen Gabby)** was born in Detroit and raised in Inkster, Mi. Gabby McLeod is the queen of Detroit Jit culture, Queen Gabby has performed in the opera Blue with the Detroit Opera and with Slippage at the Detroit Institute of Arts; showcased Jit in Paris, France; taught at universities across the country, including Wayne State University and the University of Michigan; choreographing for the Detroit Pistons; and has been featured on platforms such as Red Bull and Forbes Magazine. Queen Gabby's mission is to shine a light on the city's hidden gem and educate future generations about Detroit Jit.



**Miranda Roman** is a third year dance major and is so excited to be performing in "At The Moment of Encounter!" They hope you enjoy the embodied seaweed.




