## **Our Mission**

TEACH provides educators with intensive training and coaching in de-escalation and conflict resolution, which decreases disciplinary referrals, improves student achievement and reduces teacher turnover.

## **About TEACH**

Education becomes more equitable when teachers are empowered to create productive learning environments where deep learning can occur for all students. Based on this core tenet, TEACH was founded in 2005 by businesswoman Susan Sarofim and lifelong educator Mary Yenik. Both were concerned with a trend among school districts to send the newest and least experienced educators to the most challenging schools serving students with the highest needs.

They concluded that with intensive, job-embedded training and follow-up coaching, teachers could maximize instruction time, minimize classroom disruptions and empower students to succeed. TEACH is the only education nonprofit in Houston to combine both training and coaching, providing an opportunity for educators to apply their training while receiving supportive feedback throughout the school year.

# From Our Executive Director



Dear Friends of TEACH,

Before we share an update on the impact of your support in the 2019-20 school year, allow me to introduce myself. My name is Alvin Abraham, and I am the new executive director of TEACH – To Educate All Children.

After spending eight years in Minnesota, I am happy to be back in my hometown of Houston and thrilled to join the winning team at TEACH. In my 18-year career in education, I have been a Teach For America corps member, an elementary school teacher, an assistant principal, a principal, executive director at KIPP Minnesota and founding dean of Dougherty Family College, a two-year college serving students from high financial need backgrounds. I have had the privilege of serving as principal of two Houston ISD schools, Askew Elementary (go All-Stars!) and Robinson Elementary (go Raptors!).

My passion for this work is simple—I believe all kids deserve access to a great education that puts them on a path to post-secondary success. TEACH's mission is aligned to this passion. HISD's research shows that TEACH's strategies improve attendance rates and increase instructional time, all the while reducing behaviors that lead to suspensions. It is my great privilege to join TEACH in this mission and to thank you for being a member of our team.

While the events of spring 2020 brought some unusual challenges, including school closures, your continued partnership allowed TEACH to adapt, find new ways to serve and finish the school year strong. At the start of the pandemic, TEACH reached out to leadership at each of our schools to survey their most pressing needs. With this real-time data, TEACH continued helping educators and parents adjust to learning in the home environment, beginning an expansion of TEACH's offerings that will continue into the next year.

Below are just a few highlights of 2019-20:

- In fall 2019 and spring 2020, TEACH served 1,000 educators across 25 Houston ISD campuses, helping to create more productive classrooms for 16,000 students.
- In May 2020, TEACH created a webinar series geared toward helping parents build stronger relationships with children and better facilitate learning at home. More than 75 parents were able to participate in this virtual training.
- Also in May, TEACH partnered with the Vallone family, Tony's Restaurant, Constable Alan Rosen and the Harris County Precinct One Constable's Office to provide more than 1,010 family dinners to Houston ISD students and families who lost an important source of food due to school closures. Through this Dinner for Families initiative, more than 4,040 children and family members were fed over the course of four distribution days in May.
- With the success of TEACH's fall 2019 fundraiser, Grand Slam for TEACH, our first annual Tee Up Fore TEACH online auction in June 2020 and other generous donations, TEACH was able to raise more than \$2.6 million in the 2019-20 fiscal year. These funds put us in a strong position to continue serving our schools.

As our partner schools adapt to the changing circumstances, balancing virtual and face-to-face learning, TEACH continues to adapt our services to better serve the needs of educators and students. TEACH is enhancing and tailoring our curriculum to meet the unique needs of Houston schools, building a robust virtual training and coaching platform, and participating in the important conversations surrounding public education in a post-pandemic world. We look forward to sharing our progress with you as this work evolves.

This has been a challenging year for education, and restoring calm, productive learning environments for Houston children is more important than ever. With your support, TEACH is energized and ready for the new challenges ahead.

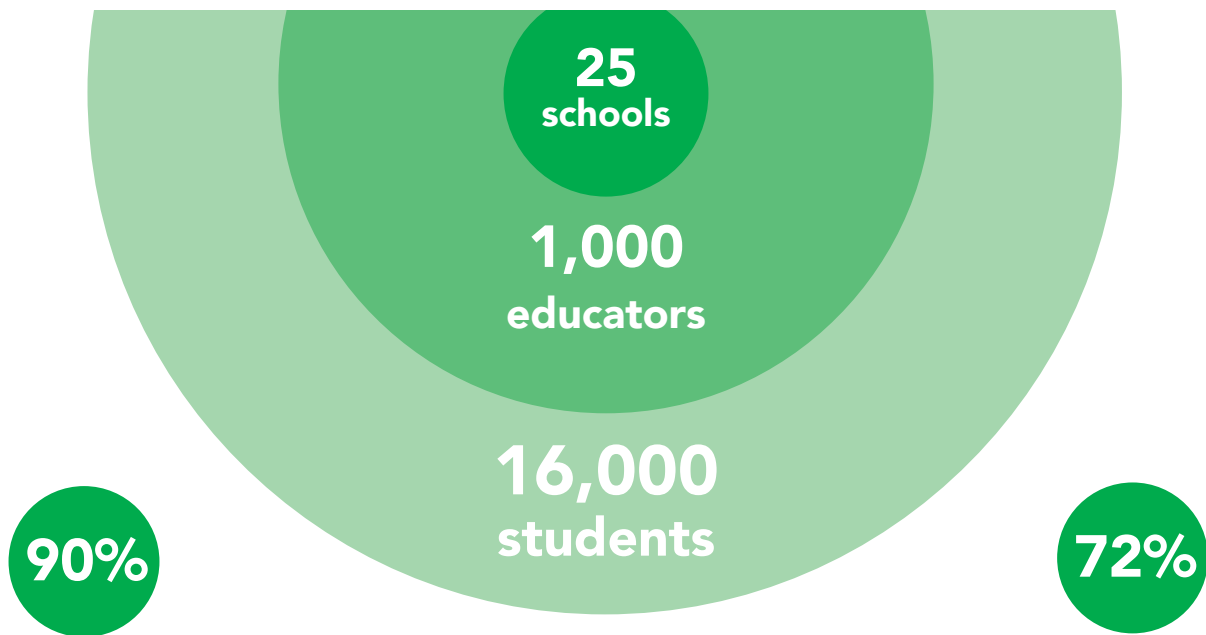

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At the center of our work is the drive to provide healthy, safe and engaging classrooms in which children can learn. We do this through extensive training and support for educators and administrators so they can model how to motivate their students through influence versus authoritative power, creating a more student-centered, productive and encouraging environment for students.

## Campus Leadership Support

Intensive executive training and coaching for principals and campus leadership teams helps in implementing TEACH's curriculum.



## School Staff Training

Small group sessions with educators give them practical strategies to enhance classroom management.



## Parent Workshops

Parent workshops educate parents on TEACH skills while also transferring the skills from the school to the home environment.



## Teacher Coaching

TEACH provides teachers with an individual coach to help educators implement new skills at their own pace, in their own classrooms.



## Videos

TEACH uses the latest in video technology to record and replay the coaching sessions.

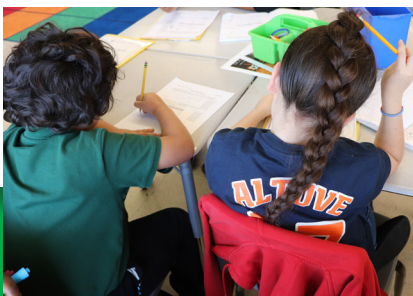

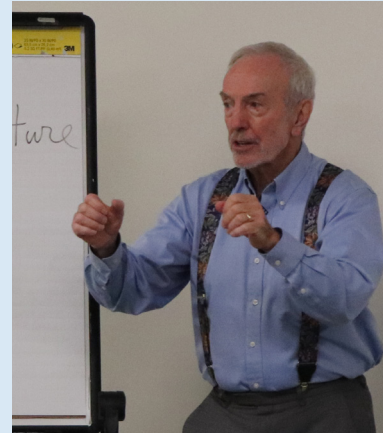

## Educator Trainings

In partnership with Houston ISD, TEACH provides several district-wide trainings to new and veteran teachers each year. In 2019-2020, TEACH provided these trainings to educators as a part of their 2019 August Inservice, New Teacher Academy, and Principal Academy.

In light of the pandemic, TEACH redesigned these trainings to be conducted in a virtual setting. "Go Virtual with TEACH," hosted for teachers and principals, provided tools to help prepare them for the new dynamics of virtual teaching and learning going into the 2020-2021 school year. Training included the following: Setting Up Successful Routines and Procedures; Creating Engaging Lessons; Checking for Understanding.

## What the Data Shows

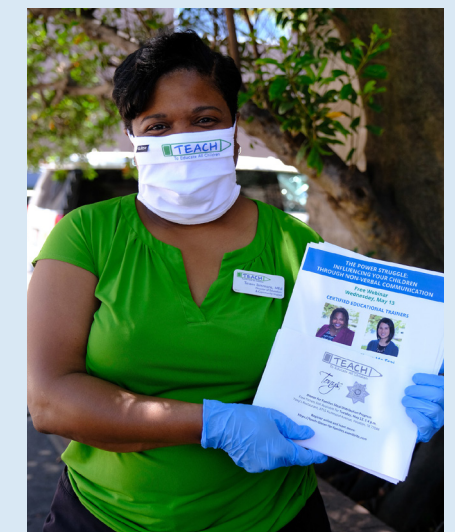
- ✓ All TEACH elementary schools significantly improved their reading and mathematics scale scores across the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years.
 94% of teachers surveyed believe TEACH strategies have made a difference in their classrooms.
- ✓ Students were highly engaged in learning, and there were few interruptions or behavioral incidents in the classroom.
 93% of teachers agree that it is easier to gain and maintain student attention using TEACH strategies.
- ✓ Administrators and teachers said that TEACH strategies increased classroom instructional time.
 91% of teachers say relationships with their students have improved because of TEACH strategies.

## A Pivot to Virtual Support

After the onset of the pandemic, TEACH shifted focus and operations to support the immediate needs of educators and students. Programming pivoted to include classroom management support, lesson creation and virtual coaching. TEACH also developed a resource guide to provide proprietary and external resources for educators to utilize in their classrooms as well as in their own professional development.

Recognizing the additional burden distance learning has placed on families, TEACH also developed virtual programming geared toward parents. Two webinars led by TEACH's certified educational trainers offered skills and strategies to reduce stressful interactions in the home, balance work and family life, and influence children to reach their full potential. More than 75 parents were able to participate in these virtual trainings offered in the spring and summer.

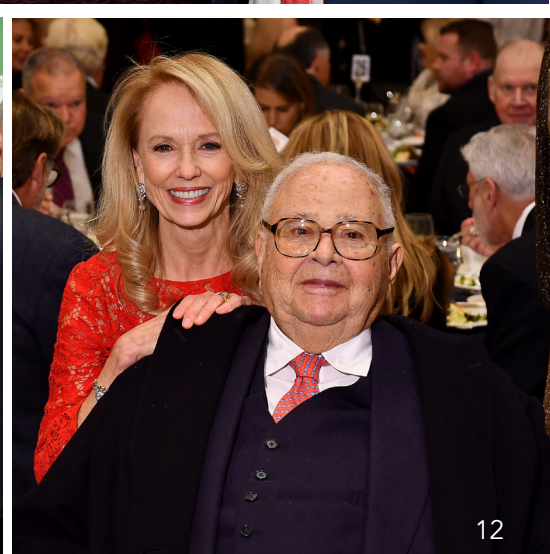

# Feeding Families



## Dinner for Families Program Provides Over 1,000 Meal Packs to Houston ISD Families

Cars started lining up at noon on May 6, 2020 as TEACH, Tony's Restaurant and Constable Alan Rosen partnered in an initiative to provide more than 1,000 family-style meals to students in need from Houston Independent schools.

Family-style meals were made and distributed by TEACH and Tony's staff at the Richmond Street restaurant, which is owned by the Vallone family. Students and their families were invited to apply to pick up a packaged meal via curbside service.

"The important fact to remember is more than 90 percent of children attending HISD schools qualify for the free or reduced-price lunch program. Just in the schools TEACH serves, that is more than 10,000 students," said TEACH co-founder Susan Sarofim. "Simply put, without school, many children are going without food. Therefore, TEACH and Tony's joined in creating this community-based project with HISD to provide nutritious meals to as many of these children as we can."

The program was supported by Constable Alan Rosen and the Harris County Precinct One Constable's Office. "This is an important initiative during these challenging times, and I am proud to be a part of this effort to ensure families have enough to eat," said Constable Rosen.

Each meal pack was designed to feed a family of four and included a roast chicken, mashed potatoes, seasonal vegetables and dessert. In total, more than 1,000 dinner packages were distributed, feeding 4,000 children and family members in need.

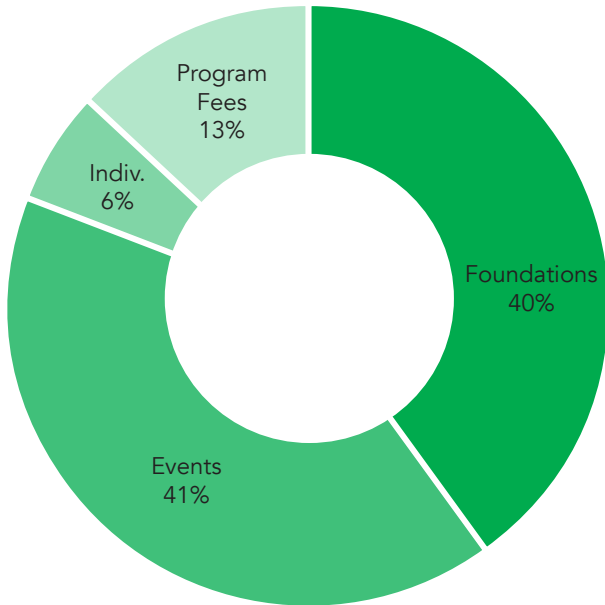

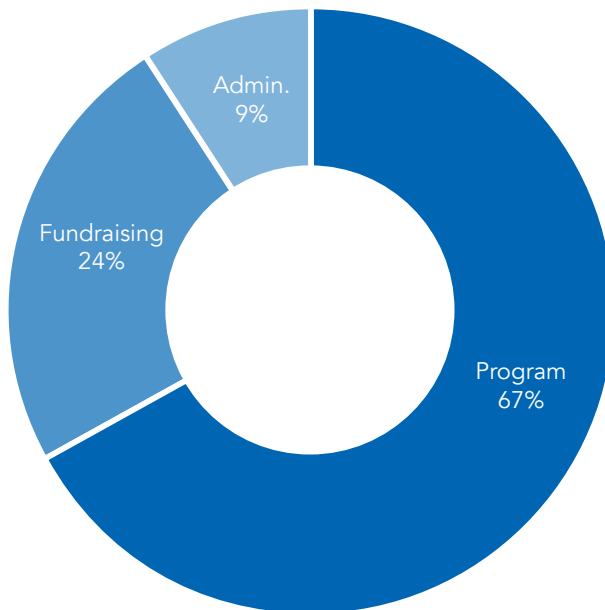
