

LaDonna Joy was born on the family farm near Orange City, the daughter of William and Johanna (Bloemendaal) Van Klompenburg. She attended the Orange City Public School and the Orange City Christian School before graduating from the Orange City High School. She then went for two years to Northwestern Junior College in Orange City and earned her bachelor's degree from Westmar College in Le Mars.

On June 21, 1957, she married Kenneth L. Huisman at the Second Christian Reformed Church in Orange City. They made their home on a farm near Newkirk, where LaDonna enjoyed helping Ken with the farm work, especially driving the tractor. In addition to being a homemaker and helping on the farm, she taught at Western Christian High School in Hull for one year and then worked briefly at Silent Sioux in Orange City. In her later years she managed the formal wear at L&K Clothing in Orange City, while also being a Tupperware dealer for twenty years. LaDonna and Ken moved to Orange City in 2003, and LaDonna became a resident of the Prairie Ridge Care Center in February of 2021.

LaDonna was a lifelong member of the Calvary Christian Reformed Church in Orange City, where she sang in the choir from high school until 2000, and she loved to sing the Hallelujah Chorus. She also helped with the Calvinettes as a counselor, a head counselor, and an area head counselor for ten years; and participated in Coffee Break and Harmony Circle.
