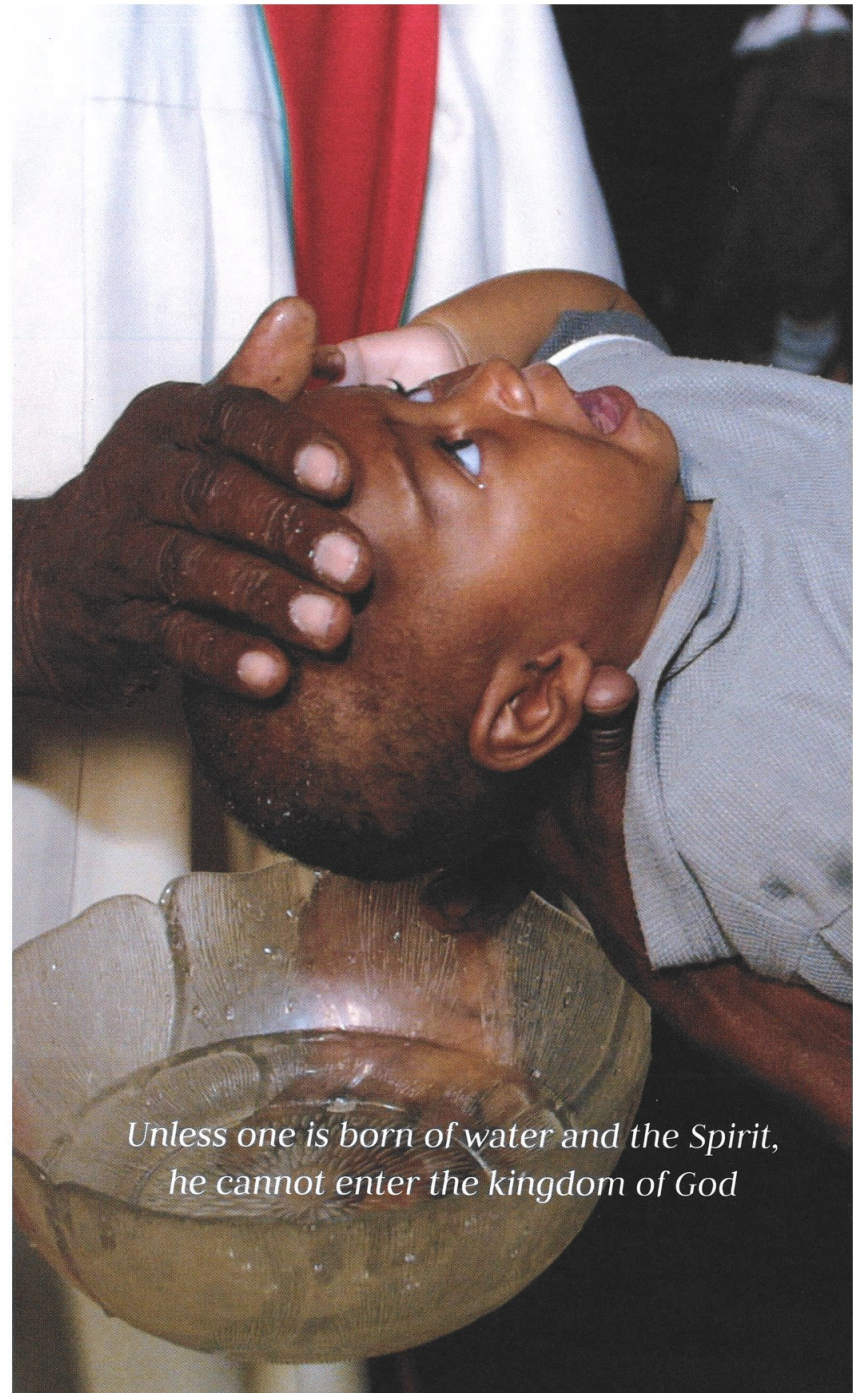

<sup>14</sup>For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. <sup>15</sup>For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, “Abba! **Holy Gospel** *Matthew 28:16–20*

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-eighth chapter.

C **Glory be to Thee, O Lord.**

<sup>16</sup>Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup>And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. <sup>18</sup>And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup>Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup>teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

P This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C **Praise be to Thee, O Christ.**

**Athanasian Creed**

P We confess the Triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as we profess portions of the ancient ecumenical creed written by Athanasius in the third century. Whoever will be saved shall, above all else, hold the universal faith...

C **and the universal faith is this, that we shall worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.**

**MEN: the Father is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.**

**WOMEN: the Son is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.**

**ALL: The Spirit is uncreated, incomprehensible, eternal.**

P So likewise the Father is almighty God, the Son is almighty God, and the Holy Spirit is almighty God.

C **and yet they are not three Lords but one Lord.**

P For we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge every person by Himself to be both God and Lord.

**MEN: So we cannot by the universal faith say that there are three Gods or three Lords...**

**WOMEN: There is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.**

P And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another, ....so that in all things....the Unity in Trinity is to be worshipped.

C **He, therefore, that will be saved is compelled thus to think of the Trinity.**

P Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe faithfully the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. For the right faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and man.

**MEN: Who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead.**

**WOMEN: He ascended into heaven, He sits at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**MEN: At whose coming all men will rise again with their bodies and will give an account of their own works.**

**WOMEN: And they that have done good will go into life everlasting; and they have done evil, into everlasting fire.**

P This is the universal faith which, except a person believe faithfully and firmly, he cannot be saved.
