

At the prompt, press OK.

◆/▼ to change current field.

◆/▶ for previous/next field.

OK to accept.

NOTE: To change language or date/time in the future, use the Setup menu (see page 35).


Storing pictures on an optional SD or SDHC Card

Your camera has internal memory. You can purchase an SD or SDHC Card to store more pictures and videos. (Maximum supported card size is 32 GB.)



CAUTION:

A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. Inserting or removing a card when the camera is on may damage the pictures, the card, or the camera.





Taking pictures/videos


Taking a picture



- Turn the Mode dial to Smart Capture
 - Press the Shutter button halfway to lock the focus.
 When the framing marks turn green, press the Shutter button completely down.

NOTE: For more information on Smart Capture and other modes, see page 7. Framing marks do not appear in some SCN (Scene) and Video modes.

Using the framing marks




Framing marks indicate the camera focus area.

- 1 Press the Shutter button **halfway**.

 If the camera is not focusing on the desired subject, release the Shutter button and recompose the scene.
- 2 Press the Shutter button **completely down** to take the picture.

NOTE: Multiple framing marks may appear when faces are detected.

Taking a video



- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Video
- Press the Shutter button completely down and release. (To stop recording, press and release again.)

Reviewing the picture/video just taken

After you take a picture/video, the LCD displays a quickview for several seconds. (To dismiss the quickview sooner, press the Shutter button halfway.) The picture/video is saved unless you press the Delete button.

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Scene **SCN**.
- **2** Press **4/ a** to select Scene modes.

NOTE: If the mode description turns off before you finish reading it, press OK.


3 Press OK to choose a Scene mode.

SCN mode	For
High ISO	People indoors, in low-light scenes.
Portrait	Full-frame portraits of people.
Night Reducing red eye of people in night scenes or low-light conditions. Portrait camera on a flat, steady surface or use a tripod.	
Landscape	Far-away scenes. The camera uses infinity auto-focus. Auto-focus framing marks are not available in Landscape.
Night Landscape	Distant scenery at night. Flash does not fire. Place the camera on a flat, steady surface or use a tripod.
Flower Close-ups of flowers or other small subjects in bright light. Focus is Macro.	
Sunset	Capturing the deep hues seen at sunset.
Backlight	Subjects that are in shadow or "backlit" (when light is behind the subject).
Candle light	Capturing the ambiance of candle light.

Using zoom

Use optical zoom to get up to 10X closer to your subject while taking pictures/videos.



- 1 Use the LCD to frame your subject. For focus distances, see Camera specifications, page 51.
- 2 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in. Press Wide Angle (W) to zoom out.
- **3** Take the picture or video.

NOTE: To get a focused picture every time, use the auto focus framing marks (see page 5).

Use digital zoom to get up to 5X beyond optical zoom while taking pictures. Press Telephoto (T) to the maximum optical zoom. Digital zoom is not available in Smart Capture mode.

NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider on the LCD turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.

Using the flash

Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows. Flash settings are limited in some capture modes.

Using the self-timer

Use the self-timer when you want to be included in a picture, or to ensure a steady Shutter button press. Place the camera on a tripod or flat surface.

- 1 Repeatedly press the Self-timer/Burst button to choose a self-timer setting:

 10 seconds—100 A picture is taken after a 10-second delay (so you have time to get into the scene).
 - **2 seconds** 2 A picture is taken after a 2-second delay (for a steady, shutter release on a tripod).
 - 2 shot—2x The first picture is taken after a 10-second delay. A second picture is taken 8 seconds later.
- **2** Compose the scene. Press the Shutter button **halfway**, then **completely down**. The camera takes the picture/pictures after the delay.

Use the same procedure to take a 2- or 10-second self-timer video, but press the Shutter button **completely down**.

Using burst

Use the same procedure as above to use the burst feature.

Mode	lcon	Description	Purpose
First Burst	ā	Camera takes up to 3 pictures while the Shutter button is pressed.	Capture an expected event. Example: A person swinging a golf club.

NOTE: The camera stops taking pictures when you release the Shutter button, when the pictures are taken, or when there is no more storage space. Burst is unavailable in some modes.

Taking panoramic pictures

Use panorama to "stitch" up to 3 pictures into a panoramic scene.

NOTE: For best results, use a tripod. Individual pictures are not saved, even if panorama capture is cancelled before stitching occurs. (Exposure Compensation, White Balance, Exposure Metering, AF Zone, AF Control, Color Mode, and Sharpness are set with the first picture. The flash is set to Off.) You can use the self-timer (2- and 10-second delays) while taking panoramic pictures. See page 11.

- **1** Turn the Mode dial to Panorama **【**□**▶**.
- 2 Press / to highlight Panorama Left-Right or Panorama Right-Left (depending on the direction you want to pan), then press OK.
- **3** Take the first picture.

 After a quickview, the LCD displays the liveview and an "overlay" from the first picture.
- **4** Compose the second picture. Make the overlay from the first picture cover the same portion in the new picture.
- **5** If you are taking only 2 pictures, press OK to stitch them together. *After you take 3 pictures, the pictures are automatically stitched together.*

Take 2 or 3 pictures.

Get 1 panoramic picture.



P, A, S, and M modes

Use these modes when you want more control over your camera and pictures.

Mode	When to use	Press 4/ , A/ to control
P	Program mode offers the ease of auto shooting with full access to all menu options. The camera automatically sets the shutter speed and aperture (f-stop) based on the scene lighting.	Exposure compensation (how much light enters the camera), flash compensation, focus mode, and ISO
A	Aperture Priority mode controls depth of field (the range of sharpness). The aperture setting may be affected by optical zoom.	Aperture, exposure compensation, flash compensation, focus mode, and ISO
S	Shutter Priority lets you choose a faster shutter speed to prevent motion blur. The camera automatically sets the aperture for proper exposure. (Use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)	Shutter speed, focus mode, ISO, and flash compensation
M	Manual mode offers the highest level of creative control. (Use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)	Aperture, shutter speed, flash compensation, focus mode, and ISO

NOTE: Settings you change in P, A, S, or M modes apply only to pictures taken in those modes. The settings, including Flash, are maintained for P, A, S, and M modes—even when you change modes or turn off the camera. Use Reset Camera (see page 35) to reset P, A, S, and M modes to their default settings. If using flash compensation, the flash cannot be in the Off setting (see page 10).

Changing P, A, S, or M mode settings

P, A, S, and M modes control the aperture (f-number, also known as f-stop), shutter speed, exposure compensation, flash compensation, focus mode, and ISO. Use the Menu limbul button to control all other settings.

- **1** Turn the Mode dial to P, A, S, or M.
- **2** Press **//** to access a setting. Press **/** to change the setting.



Note: A yellow setting indicates possible unsatisfactory results. (However, you can still take the picture.)

Aperture—(also known as f-stop) control the size of the lens opening, which determines the depth of field.

- Smaller f-stop numbers indicate a larger lens opening; good for low-light.
- Larger f-stop numbers indicate a smaller lens opening; keeps the main subject sharp; good for landscapes and well-lit conditions.

Shutter Speed—control how long the shutter stays open. (To prevent blur, use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)

Exposure Compensation—adjust the exposure. If the picture is too light, decrease the setting; if it's too dark, increase the setting.

Flash Compensation—adjust flash brightness.

Focus Mode—choose Auto, Close-up, Landscape, or Manual Focus.

ISO—adjust the camera's sensitivity to light. Higher ISO indicates greater sensitivity.

NOTE: A higher ISO may produce unwanted "noise" in a picture. For ISO speeds, see Camera specifications, page 51.

Using exposure compensation to adjust brightness

In P, A, and Panorama modes, you can adjust exposure compensation before you take a picture to make your pictures darker or lighter. Only the first picture in Panorama mode can be adjusted—that adjustment is applied to the remaining pictures.

- Press **1** to access the exposure compensation setting.

An exposure compensation level is shown on the LCD and the image gets darker or lighter. Take the picture when you are satisfied with the exposure compensation level.

Using exposure bracketing

Exposure bracketing lets you take three pictures—one at, one above, and one below proper exposure—so that you can decide the best exposure. (To find Exposure Bracketing in the menu, see page 32.)

You can also use exposure compensation with exposure bracketing, as in this example:

If the exposure compensation is set to:	And if the exposure bracketing interval is set to 0.3 steps:	Then the exposures taken are:
0.0	(Set the Exposure Bracketing Interval in the Capture + menu.)	-0.3, 0.0, +0.3

Using the histogram to view picture brightness

Use the histogram to evaluate the distribution of light before or after you take a picture. Optimal exposure is achieved when the peak is in the middle of the histogram. The flash may affect a picture's light and shadow.

To turn on the histogram in PASM modes or in Review, press the Info **1** button until the histogram appears.


Reviewing pictures/videos

Press the Review button to view and work with your pictures/videos. Press Review again to exit.



- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **4/** for previous/next picture/video.
 - Press the Shutter button halfway down to return to Capture mode.
 - To view pictures/videos as thumbnails, see page 27.

- 1 Press Telephoto (T) to magnify 1X–8X.
- 2 Press / to view other parts of a picture.
 - Press OK to return to 1X.

 - Press during playback to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
 - Press during playback to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
 - Press // during 4X to jump to a bookmark. See page 24.)

Deleting pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **4**/▶to find a picture/video.
- **3** Press the Delete **m** button, then follow the screen prompts.

Using the undo delete feature

If you accidentally delete a picture/video, you may be able to use Undo Delete to retrieve it. This feature is only available immediately after you delete a picture/video.

Protecting pictures/videos from deletion

- **1** Press the Review **b** button.
- 2 Press **//** to find a picture/video.
- 3 Press the Menu 🔚 button.
- **4** Press **1** to highlight Protect, then press OK.
 - The Protect icon

 appears with the protected picture/video.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.



Formatting internal memory or an SD or SDHC Card deletes all (including protected) pictures/videos. (Formatting internal memory also deletes email addresses, tag names, and favorites.)

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

Using the menu button in Review

- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- **2** Press **4/**▶ to choose a tab:
 - **Review** to view pictures/videos
 - **Edit** to edit pictures/videos
 - **Setup** for other camera settings (see page 30)
- **3** Press **/** to highlight a setting, then press OK.
- **4** Choose an option, then press OK.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

Adding sound tags

You can record a voice or sound (up to 1 minute long) to a picture.

NOTE: Only one sound tag can be added to each picture (not to videos).

Recording a sound tag

- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then $4/\$ to highlight the Edit tab.
- **3** Press —/ to highlight Sound Tag, then press OK.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.

The sound tag is applied to your picture.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.


Playing a sound tag



- 1 Press the Review button, then \to find a picture with a "Play Sound Tag" prompt.
- **2** Press **v** to play the sound tag.
- **3** Press **/** to adjust the volume.
 - Press OK to stop playback.

Cropping pictures

You can crop a picture so that only the desired portion of the picture remains. (You cannot crop these pictures: panoramic, 16:9, video action prints, pictures from a video, or pictures that are already cropped.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then **1** to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **1** to highlight the Edit tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Crop. Press OK.
- 4 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in, or **4/** to move the crop box. Press OK.
- **5** Follow the screen prompts.

 The picture is cropped, the original saved. (Cropped pictures cannot be cropped again.)
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

Using KODAK PERFECT TOUCH Technology

KODAK PERFECT TOUCH Technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures. PERFECT TOUCH Technology is automatically applied to pictures taken in Smart Capture mode. (You cannot enhance videos, panoramic pictures, pictures that are already enhanced, or pictures taken in Smart Capture mode.)

- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then 4/1 to highlight the Edit tab.
- 3 Press __/_ to highlight Perfect Touch tech. Press OK.


 A preview is shown in a split screen. Press
 /> to view other parts of the picture.
- **4** Press OK. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.
- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Editing videos

Making a picture from a video

You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for printing.



- 1 Press the Review ▶ button, then ***/** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu **■** button, then **</** to highlight the Edit tab.
- **3** Press to highlight Make Picture, then press OK.
- **4** Press OK to play the video. (Press OK to pause). Press **4/** to navigate through video frames.
- **5** During play or pause, press to make a picture.


A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)

■ Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

Trimming a video

You can delete an unwanted portion from the beginning or end of a video.



- **1** Press the Review **▶** button, then **√/**▶ to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu **■** button, then **1** to highlight the Edit tab.
- **3** Press _____ to highlight Trim. Press OK.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.


The video is trimmed. (You can save it as a new video or replace the original.)

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using video bookmarks

You can set bookmarks at interesting places in your video, then jump from one bookmark to another.


Setting bookmarks



- **1** Press the Review button, then to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu **■** button, then **1** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Bookmark, then press OK.
- **3** Press to highlight Create/Edit, then press OK.
- **4** While the video plays, press to add bookmarks. When finished adding up to 9 bookmarks, press .
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.


Using bookmarks



- 1 Press the Review ▶ button, then **1** to find a video.
- 2 Press to play the video. To jump to the first bookmark, press and hold //> for 4 seconds while the video is playing.
 - After you jump to a bookmark, press **4/** to jump to other bookmarks.
 - To view all bookmarked video frames, press the Zoom wide angle (W) button. To return to normal view, press the telephoto (T) button.

Making a video action print

From a video, you can make a 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture, suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **1** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **1** to highlight the Edit tab.
- **3** Press to highlight Action Print. Press OK. Choose an option, then press OK:
- Auto options: The camera includes the first and last frames, then 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
- Manual: You choose the first and last frames; the camera chooses 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
- Use Bookmarks: Bookmarked frames are used.

 A 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture is created. If you have less than 4 or 9 bookmarks, equally-spaced video frames are used.
- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

Play a multimedia slide show

To show all pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then 1 to highlight the Review tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Multimedia Slide Show, then press OK.
- 4 Press for to highlight Preview Slide Show, then press OK.

 Up to 100 pictures/videos are displayed. (To select which pictures/videos are displayed, see below.) To interrupt the slide show, press OK. After the slide show plays, you may save or modify it.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 44.

To show selected pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Menu **■** button, then **1** to highlight the Review tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Multimedia Slide Show, then press OK.
- **4** Press __/_ to highlight Select Images, then press OK.
- **5** Press **1** to locate a picture/video, then press OK.

A check mark appears.

Press **//>** to continue adding (from 2–100) pictures/videos. When finished, press **//** to highlight Done, then press OK.

6 Press to highlight Preview Slide Show, then press OK.

Selected pictures/videos are displayed. To interrupt the slide show, press OK. After the slide show plays, you may save or modify it.


Viewing pictures/videos in different ways

Viewing as thumbnails (multi-up)

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Wide Angle (W) button to change from single-picture view to multi-up thumbnails
- **3** Press Telephoto (T) to return to single-picture view.
 - To select multiple pictures/videos, see page 27.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print or delete. (Multi-select can also be used in Multi-Up mode, page 27.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then \(\big| \) to find a picture/video.
- 2 Press OK to select pictures/videos. A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print or delete the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.

Copying pictures/videos

You can copy pictures/videos from a card to internal memory or from internal memory to a card.


NOTE: Before you copy, make sure that a card is inserted in the camera.

Copy pictures/videos:

- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- **2** Press to highlight Copy, then press OK.
- **3** Press —/ to highlight an option, then press OK.

NOTE: Pictures/videos are copied, not moved. To remove pictures/videos from the original location after copying, delete them (see page 18).

- **2** Press **//** to highlight a tab:
 - **Capture/Video** for the most common picture/video-taking settings
 - **Setup** for other camera settings




