The picture has changed with the dramatic suddeness which always accompanies catastrophes due to weather.

The worst drouth in history wiped out in a few weeks the surplus grain crops which had depressed markets for years, and at the same time worked widespread destruction in florists' planting stocks.

Cut flower and plant production is reduced so much below its former volume that firm or rising prices may be confidently expected for a long time to come.

Prices on Dutch bulbs are higher, due to government control measures in Holland, and foreign exchange stabilization which makes the guilder, formerly 40c par, now about 68 cents.

Oregon and Washington have fixed minimum prices on narcissus bulbs, which cause substantial increases on top size northwestern grown stock, the only grade on which prices are quoted in this catalog. Bulbs from other sections may be offered at less, but not by us.

Remember, in comparing Dutch bulb prices, WE PAY OCEAN FREIGHT AND DUTY. You are not asked for cash payment of these items, and other added expenses, on delivery of bulbs, as is the case with some American Importers. While prices cover these items, they are much reduced on your order by savings due to large volume handling.
