

### **GRECO-ROMAN PREVIEW**

#### 55 kg

The 55 kg weight class was reborn in 2018, when international wrestling expanded back to 10 weight classes in each discipline. This non-Olympic weight has had three World champions from three different nations, and two of them are among the high seeds. 2018 World champion Eldaniz Azizli of Azerbaijan is the No. 1 seed. Azizli won bronze medals in the 2019 and 2021 World Championships and was the 2022 European champion. 2019 World champion Nugzari Tsurtsumia of Georgia is the No. 2 seed. Tsurtsumia won World bronze medals in 2018 and 2021 and lost to Azizli in the 2022 European finals. The 2021 World champion, Japan's Ken Matsui, is not registered.

Claiming the No. 3 seed is 2018 World bronze medalist Ekrem Ozturk of Turkey, who was fifth in the 2021 Worlds. Max Nowry of the USA, who placed fifth in the 2019 Worlds and ninth in the 2021 Worlds, gets the No. 4 seed. No. 5 seed Fabian Schmitt of Germany, who was 10th at the 2021 Worlds is No. 5, while 2022 Asian silver medalist Amangali Bekbolatov of Kazakhstan earned the No. 6 seed.

2022 Asian bronze medalist Jasurbek Ortikboev of Uzbekistan is seeded No. 7, while Ukraine's Koriun Sharadian scraped up enough points for the No. 8 seed. Some medalists could come from the unseeded athletes such as 2021 U23 World silver medalist and 2021 U20 World champion Poya Dad Marz of Iran, 2021 and 2022 Asian champion Yu Shiotani of Japan or 2022 European bronze medalist and 2018 Military World champion Rudik Mkrtchyan of Amenia.

#### 60 kg

The competition should be fierce at 60 kg, with much experience and talent among the top stars. The favorite could be No. 3 seed Kenchiro Fumita of Japan, who was a 2020 Olympic silver medalist and 2017 and 2019 World champion. The No. 1 seed is two-time World silver medalist Zholaman Sharshenbekov of Kyrgyzstan. At No. 3 is 2021 World bronze medalist Murad Mammadov of Azerbaijan.

2022 European bronze medalist Gevorg Gharibyan of Armenia, who placed fifth at the 2021 World Championships secured the No. 4 seed. Gyanender Daihya of India, who was fifth in the 2021 Worlds and won the Sghaier Ranking Event in Tunisia, brings in the No. 5 seed. 2022 European champion Kerem Kamal of Turkey, who was a three-time U20 World champion, is seeded No. 6. Multiple-time African champion Haithem Mahmoud of Egypt, who was ninth at the 2020 Olympics, gets the No. 7 seed. Estonia's Helary Maegisalu scored enough points for the No. 8 seed.

There is good depth in this weight class, led by 2018 World bronze medalist and 2021 Asian champion Aidos Sultangali of Kazakhstan. Veteran Ildar Hafizov of the USA, a two-time

Olympian and multiple World Team member for the USA and Uzbekistan, is seeking to break through with his first medal.

#### 63 kg

The top entry in this weight class is unseeded, as the 2020 Olympic champion at 60 kg, Luis Orta Sanchez of Cuba, has moved up in weight. Orta, a two-time Pan American champion, has not wrestled since the Tokyo Games, and has never competed at 63 kg.

On paper, a star who could also challenge is No. 4 seed Victor Ciobanu of Moldova, who won the 2021 World Championships at 60 kg and has also moved up in weight. Ciobanu was fifth in the 2020 Olympics and claimed a 2018 World silver medal. If the seeds hold, he could face No. 1 seed Leri Abuladze of Georgia in the semifinals, who was second in the 2021 World Championships.

The No. 2 seed is 2022 European silver medalist Taleh Mammadov of Azerbaijan, who was fifth in the 2021 World Championships. No. 3 seed is Erik Torba of Hungary, who placed fifth in the 2019 and 2021 World Championships. None of the other seeds have major Senior level achievements. No. 5 seed Ahmet Uyar of Turkey was a 2021 U23 World silver medalist. No. 6 seed Hrachya Poghosyan of Armenia was a 2021 U23 World bronze medalist and 2016 U17 World bronze medalist. Neeraj of India, the No. 7 seed, was a 2022 Asian bronze medalist and won the 2022 U23 Asian Championships. Perhaps the best resume is from No. 8 seed Tynar Sharshenbekov of Kyrgyzstan, a 2022 Asian champion who was also fifth in the 2019 World Championships.

There is good talent among the unseeded entries, led by 2019 World bronze medalist Ali Reza Nejad of Iran, who has won World medals at the U17, U20, U23 and Senior levels. Another talent is Erbatu Tuo of China, a 2019 Asian champion who was fifth in the 2018 Worlds. Abolmohammad Papi, who was a 2013 Asian bronze medalist for Iran, is competing for Germany starting this year. Also watch for 2020 Asian silver medalist Jinseub Song of Korea. USA's Sam Jones is competing in his second-consecutive World Championships.

#### 67 kg

One of the world's best Greco-Roman wrestlers is also the top seed here, 2020 Olympic champion and 2021 World champion Mohammedreza Geraei of Iran. He was also a 2017 World bronze medalist. Geraei has won gold in his last six international events, including a 2019 U23 World title.

There will be a big battle on the other side of the bracket. Easily the most accomplished among the seeds is No. 7 Hansu Ryu of Korea, a two-time World champion (2013, 2017) and 2015 World silver medalist. The No. 2 seed is

Murat Firat of Turkey, the 2022 European champion who placed fifth in the 2021 Worlds. The No. 3 seed was also fifth at the 2021 World Championships, Hasrat Jafarov of Azerbaijan, who won both the U23 World title and U20 World title in 2021. Throw in the No. 6 seed, 2017 World silver medalist Mateusz Bernatek of Poland.

Geraei's side of the bracket includes No. 4 Mohammed El Sayed, a 2020 Olympic bronze medalist, who was also fifth in the 2019 World Championships.

Non-seeded stars include 2019 World bronze medalist Slavik Galstyan of Armenia as well as Mate Nemes of Serbia, a 2019 World bronze medalist who was also a 2021 European champion. Other tough draws could include 2022 Asian champion Abror Atabaev of Uzbekistan and 2022 European silver medalist and 2018 U20 World bronze medalist Krisztian Vancza of Hungary. Representing the U.S. is Olympian and two-time age-group World Team member Alejandro Sancho.

#### **72** kg

The 72 kg weight class is also one that should be wide open and exciting. There are only two past World medalists among the top-eight seeds, led by No. 1 seed and 2021 World bronze medalist Kristupas Sleiva of Lithuania. The other past World medalist is No. 3 seed and two-time World bronze medalist Gevorg Sahakyan of Poland. Sahakyan won his World medals in 2018 and 2021 when he competed for Armenia.

The No. 2 seed is 2022 European bronze medalist Ulvu Ganizade of Azerbaijan, who was eighth in the 2022 Worlds and has won age-group medals at the U17, U20 and U23 levels. No. 4 Mohammad Reza Mokhtari of Iran was fifth in the 2022 World Championships and won the 2022 Asian Championships title. No. 5 seed Valentin Petic of Moldova was seventh in the 2021 Worlds and won U20 and U23 World bronze medals in 2019.

There is great opportunity among unseeded athletes making a medal run. 2016 Olympic bronze medalist Shmagi Bolkvadze of Georgia, who was also a 2017 U23 World champion, should be in the mix. 2022 Asian silver medalist Ibragim Magomadov of Kazakhstan is also a rising talent. Serbia's Ali Arsalan won a 2022 European bronze medal, and previously wrestled for Iran, where he was a 2015 U20 World bronze medalist. Exciting Benji Peak of the USA is competing in his first Senior Worlds, and looks to throw people on their heads.

#### 77 kg

2017 World champion and 2018 World bronze medalist Viktor Nemes of Serbia received the No. 4 seed. Should seeds hold up, Nemes could battle No. 1 seed Sanan Suleymanov of Azerbaijan, the 2021 World silver medalist,

who placed third in the 2022 European Championships. Both of the other high seeds are talented. No. 2 Mohammadali Geraei of Iran is a three-time World bronze medalist ('17, '19, '21). No. 3 seed Akzhol Makhmudov of Kyrgysztan was 2020 Olympic silver medalist and the Asian champion in 2022.

2012 Olympic champion and 2016 Olympic bronze medalist Hyeonwoo Kim of Korea is in the field as well as Malkhas Amoyan of Armenia, a 2021 World champion at 72 kg and the 2022 European champion.

No. 5 seed Shohei Yabiku of Japan was a 2020 Olympic bronze medalist but has competed internationally just once since then. Two-time European silver medalist Yunus Basar of Turkey is seeded No. 6. Yosvanys Pena Flores of Cuba, a three-time Pan American Champion and 2019 Pan American Games bronze medalist gets the No. 7 seed. At No. 8 Aik Mnatsakanian of Bulgaria, a World bronze medalist in 2018 and 2019 at 72 kg.

Other talents without seeds include 2021 U23 World champion Idris Ibaev of Germany. 2017 Junior World champion Kamal Bey of the USA, who was seventh at the 2018 Senior Worlds, is back and ready to take the next step.

#### 82 kg

Sitting with the No. 1 seed is 2021 World champion Rafig Huseynov of Azerbaijan. He is a 2020 Olympic bronze medalist and a 2019 World silver medalist and added a 2022 European title this year. The No. 2 seed is 2021 World silver medalist Burhan Akbudak of Turkey. Earning a No. 3 seed is 2021 World bronze medalist Pejman Poshtam of Iran, also a 2021 Asian champion.

Many of the top athletes in the bracket did not receive a seed. Roland Schwarz of Germany was a 2021 World bronze medalist at 77 kg and Jalgasbay Berdimuratov of Uzbekistan was a 2019 World bronze medalist. Two athletes in the field reached a medal bout at the Olympics, as Karapet Chalyan of Armenia was fifth at the 2020 Olympics while Bozo Starcevic of Croatia was fifth at the 2016 Olympics.

No. 4 seed Mihail Bradu of Moldova won the Pellicone Ranking Tournament this year. Claiming a 2022 European silver medal was No. 7 seed Gela Bolkvadze of Georgia, while 2022 Asian silver medalist Dais Kalen of Kazakhstan got the No. 8 seed. Others to watch are 2021 U23 World champion and 2022 European bronze medalist Tamas Levai of Hungary, as well ask Rosian Dermanski of Bulgaria, who won bronze medals at the 2018 University Worlds and the 2018 U23 Worlds. USA's Spencer Woods, a 2022 Final X runner-up, will compete at his first World Championships.

#### 87 kg

The No. 1 seed here is highly respected, 2021 World champion Zurabi Datunashvili of Serbia, who was also a 2020 Olympic bronze medalist. Datunashvili started his career with Georgia, making two Olympic teams, then won his Olympic medal for Serbia. He is the only World or Olympic medalist to get a seed this year.

Among the past medalists who are not seeded are 2019 World silver medalist Alex Kessidis of Sweden, two-time World bronze medalist Roberti Kobliashvili of Georgia and 2019 World bronze medalist Haitao Qian of China.

The No. 2 seed is 2022 European champion Turpal Ali Bisultanov of Denmark. No. 3 seed Bachir Sid Azara of Algeria is a four-time African champion. No. 4 seed Islam Abbasov of Azerbaijan was fifth at the 2017 and 2018 World Championships and won a European bronze medal this year.

Two-time Asian champion Naser Alzadeh of Iran was third in the 2021 U23 Worlds. Others to watch are 2021 U23 World silver medalist David Losonczi of Hungary, 2022 European runner-up Nicu Ojog of Romania and 2018 World University champion Ali Cengiz of Turkey. Competing in his second-straight Senior Worlds for the USA is Alan Vera, who was a 2016 Pan American champion and 2015 Pan American Games bronze medalist for Cuba before emigrating to the United States.

#### 97 kg

No. I seed Mohammadihadi Saravi of Iran could face No. 4 seed Artur Aleksanyan of Armenia, a three-time World champion and three-time Olympic medalist, including a 2016 Olympic title. Saravi won a 2020 Olympic bronze medal, then a few months later, added his first Senior World title. Their half-bracket will also have No. 8 and two-time Senior World bronze medalist Mihail Kajaia of Serbia.

The seeds on the other side of the bracket include No. 2 Alex Szoke of Hungary, who was second in the 2021 World Championships and 2018 World silver medalist and No. 3 Kiril Milov of Bulgaria.

2018 World champion Metehan Basar has moved up from 87 kg and won the UWW Ranking Event in Kazakhstan. Two-time World medalist Rustam Assakalov of Uzbekistan also moved up to 97 kg this year. He won a 2015 World silver and a 2019 World bronze. Giorgi Melia of Georgia, a two-time U23 World medalist and a 2016 Junior World champion, is also in the field.

When 2021 World bronze medalist G'Angelo Hancock of the USA retired, Braxton Amos took the position. Amos, second to Hancock the last few years, won a 2021 Junior World title in freestyle and a bronze medal in Greco-Roman.

#### 130 kg

Four-time Olympic champion Mijian Lopez Nunez of Cuba is apparently retired, but his weight class is well stocked with talent that will battle for World medals in Belgrade. 2020 Olympic silver medalist lakobi Kajaia of Georgia nailed the No. 1 seed. He boasts World bronze medals from 2019 and 2021. Four-time World champion and No. 2 seed Riza Kayaalp of Turkey is heavily favored to reach the finals. Kayaalp has won three Olympic medals, a silver in 2016 and bronzes in 2012 and 2020.

There are a number of other tough stars looking to win a first World title. Unseeded Oscar Pino Hinds of Cuba has wrestled at the Worlds when Lopez did not, and won a World silver medal in 2019, and World bronze medals in 2017 and 2018. Pino Hinds has also wrestled freestyle in recent seasons, but Greco-Roman is his best style. Also unseeded is 2016 Olympic bronze medalist Sabah Shariati of Azerbaijan. Also watch No. 3 seed Yasmani Acosta of Chile, who won a World bronze medal in 2017, and was fifth in the 2021 Worlds. Acosta emigrated from Cuba, where he was a 2011 Pan American champion. Minseok Kim of Korea was a 2018 World bronze medalist.

Three-time Olympian Alin Alexuc Ciurariu of Romania, who was fifth in the 2014 and 2015 Worlds and fifth in the 2016 Olympics, gets the No. 6 seed and No. 7 Amin Mirzazadeh of Iran placed fifth at the 2020 Olympics and won a 2021 U23 World title and 2018 Junior World title. Cohlton Schultz of the United States won a 2018 U17 World title and two Junior World medals. Also watch for 2022 U20 World champion Mykhailo Vyshnyvetskyi of Ukraine and two-time U23 World medalist David Ovasapyan of Armenia.

Securing the No. 1 seed was U.S. star Sarah Hildebrandt, who comes off a 2020 Olympic bronze medal and a 2021 World silver medal, her second-career World runner-up finish. The No. 2 seed is 2020 Olympic champion Yui Susaki of Japan, also a 2018 and 2019 World champion. Susaki has not competed since the Tokyo Games, while Hildebrandt added a 2022 Pan American title, and a Ranking Tournament win in Algeria.

Stadnik, a two-time World champion (2009, 2019) and a very rare four-time Olympic medalist, was awarded the No. 7 seed but backed out due to injury.

2022 European runner-up Miglena Selishka of Bulgaria gets the No. 3 seed, with 2019 World silver medalist Emilia Vuc of Romania getting No. 4. Vuc won the Yasar Dogu Ranking Event and was third in the 2022 Europeans. The No. 5 seed, Otgonjargal Dolgorjav of Mongolia, a 2021 World bronze medalist, won medals in two Ranking Events this year. Canada's Madison Parks, a 2022 Pan American silver medalist and 2022 Matteo Pellicone Ranking Event champion, gets No. 6. A possible quarterfinal opponent for Hildebrandt is No. 8 seed Evin Demirhan of Turkey, the 2022 European champion.

Among the unseeded wrestlers who could bust the bracket is 2018 World bronze medalist Oksana Livach of Ukraine, a past Cadet World champion.

#### 53 kg

World champion and top-seeded Akari Fujinami of Japan pulled out of the tournament, due to injury. World silver medalist Iulia Leorda of Moldova and bronze medalists Samantha Stewart of Canada and Katarzyna Krawczyk of Poland are still in the field.

Of the other seeds, only one is a proven veteran, 2021 and 2017 World bronze medalist Maria Prevolaraki of Greece, who snagged the No. 8 seed. 2021 Junior World champion Emma Malmgren of Sweden is seeded No. 5, with 2022 U23 World bronze medalist Zeynep Yetgil of Turkey at No. 6. Competing in her first Senior Worlds is No. 7 seed Dominique Parrish of the USA, who won the 2022 Pan American Championships and has wrestled in three U23 World Championships.

None of the 2020 Olympic medalists are entered in the weight class, and the only top-10 placer from Tokyo in the field is Vinesh Phogat of India, who placed ninth. Vinesh added a 2022 Commonwealth Games title to her 2019 World bronze medal. Zhuldyz Eshimova of Kazakhstan, who has competed on the Senior level since 2005, boasts a 2008 World silver medal and a 2011 World bronze medal.

#### 55 kg

The top star in the field is unseeded, 2020 Olympic champion Mayu Mukaida of Japan, who won the Tokyo Games at 53 kg and is moving up to 55 kg. Mukaida won World titles in 2016 and 2018 and was second at the 2016 and 2019 Worlds. She has not wrestled since her Tokyo Olympic gold and is going to smash the bracket when she gets drawn in.

The No. 4 seed and 2019 World champion Jacarra Winchester of the United States is the other gold medalist in the field. Winchester was fifth at the 2020 Olympics at 53 kg and returns to the weight where she won her World title.

The No. 1 seed is 2021 World silver medalist Nina Hemmer of Germany, who was beaten by Japan's Tsugumi Sakurai in the World finals. No. 2 seed Oleksandra Khomenets of Ukraine was a 2021 World bronze medalist and added a 2022 European Championships title at 57 kg. The 2022 European champion at 55 kg is No. 3 Andreea Ana of Romania, who was also a 2021 U23 World champion. 2017 World bronze medalist Roksana Zasina of Poland gets the No. 5 seed, while 2022 Pan American champion Karla Godinez Gonzalez of Canada comes in at No. 6. A 2022 Asian bronze medalist, Shushma Shokeen of India, gets the No. 7 seed, while two-time U23 World bronze medalist Marina Sendeva of Kazakhstan is the No. 8 seed.

This weight class is not large in numbers. 2019 Asian champion Mengyu Xie of China will be a challenger, as will 2022 Pan American champion Yaynelis Sanz Verdecia of Cuba. Luisa Valverde of Ecuador was fifth in the 2021 World Championships. Others to watch are 2017 U23 World bronze medalist Otgonjargal Ganbaatar of Mongolia, 2021 Junior World bronze medalist Elvira Kamaloglu of Turkey and 2022 European bronze medalist Mariana Dragutan of Moldova.

#### 57 kg

The No. 1 seed is one of the greatest women wrestlers ever, 2016 Olympic champion and three-time World champion Helen Maroulis of the United States. Maroulis is the returning World champion and is the only 2021 World medalist from this weight in the field. Maroulis was also a 2020 Olympic bronze medalist, the first U.S. woman to win two Olympic wrestling medals. No. 2 seed Evelina Nikolova of Bulgaria was the other 2020 Olympic bronze medalist at this weight class and was second in the 2022 European Championships.

The wild card in the draw is 2021 World champion Tsugumi Sakurai of Japan, who moves up from 55 kg and does not receive a seed. Sakurai won the 2022 Asian Championships at 57 kg but did not score enough points at this weight class for seeding. She was a 2016 U17 World champion in her only other World appearance for Japan. Another star

without a seed is 2020 Olympic bronze medalist Bolortuya Bat-Ochir of Mongolia, who was at 53 kg at the Tokyo Games and was also a 2019 World bronze medalist. Both will be drawn into the brackets.

None of the other seeds have won a Senior World or Olympic medal. The Pan American nations have three of the top four seeds, with No. 3 Giullia Rodrigues Penalber de Oliveira of Brazil and No. 4 Alma Valencia Escoto of Mexico. Both were in the top 10 at the 2021 Worlds. No. 5 seed Sandra Paruszewski of Germany was third at the 2022 European Championships. At No. 7 is 2022 Asian champion Mansi Ahlawat of India. The final two seeds were both 2021 U23 World champions, with No. 7 Alina Hrushyna Akobiia of Ukraine at 57 kg and No. 8 Anhelina Lysak of Poland at 59 kg at the U23's.

#### 59 kg

Want to talk about a wide-open weight class? This could be it. Regardless of the seeds, there really aren't any dominant favorites at 59 kg, which offer some interesting action. The No. 1 seed is Sarita Mor of India, a 2021 World bronze medalist, who won two Ranking Events this year in Tunisia and in Kazakhstan. The No. 2 seed is 2020 Olympic bronze medalist Shoovdor Baatarjav of Mongolia, a three-time World bronze medalist (2018, 2019, 2021) who was also a 2022 Asian silver medalist. Poland's Jowita Wrzesien, the 2022 European silver medalist earned the No. 3. Coming in at No. 4 is 2022 Ivan Yarygin Grand Prix champion Alyona Kolesnik of Azerbaijan.

2022 Senior and U23 European champion Anastasia Nichita of Moldova gets the No. 5 seed. No. 6 seed Grace Bullen of Norway won U23 and U17 age-group World titles. 2022 Asian U23 silver medalist Diana Kaymova of Kazakhstan comes in at No. 7, and 2022 European bronze medalist Elena Brugger of Germany gets No. 8.

2018 World bronze medalist Diana Weicker of Canada is among the unseeded athletes. Japan brings an unseeded wrestler, 2017 U17 World champion Sakura Motoki, who has no Senior-level international experience. Qi Zhang of China, a 2017 U23 World bronze medalist, is also getting drawn in. 2020 European silver medalist Solomiia Vynnyk of Ukraine, a 2021 European bronze medalist, is also competing. First-time Senior World Team member Abigail Nette of the USA has been on two U23 World Teams.

#### 62 kg

This weight has plenty of firepower, led by two-time World champion and 2020 Olympic silver medalist Aisuluu Tunybekova of Kyrgyzstan. If the seeds hold up, she will face 2021 World bronze winner and No. 4 Nonoka Ozaki of Japan. This year, Ozaki has won the Senior Asian title and added a U20 World title. The other half-bracket has a pair of Pan American stars, No. 2 Lais Nunes of Brazil and No. 3

Kayla Miracle of the United States. Nunes placed fifth in the 2018 and 2021 World Championships. Miracle has a 2021 World silver medalist and four age-group World medals.

There are a pair of unseeded past World champions looking to wreck the bracket. Bilyana Dudova of Bulgaria was the 2021 World champion at 59 kg and a 2018 World silver medalist. Mongolia's Tserenchimed Sukhee was a 2014 World champion and 2015 World silver medalist.

The most accomplished of the other seeds is No. 6 Marwa Amri of Tunisia, a bronze medalist at the 2016 Olympics and the first African woman to win an Olympic wrestling medal. Amri also won a 2017 World silver medal. The other seeds include No. 5 Ilona Prokopeuniuk of Ukraine, who was fifth in the 2021 Worlds and is a two-time U23 World medalist. Ana Godinez Gonzalez of Canada is wrestling well, with a 2021 U23 World title, a 2022 Pan American Championships gold and a 2022 Commonwealth Games gold. 2022 European silver medalist Luisa Niemesch of Germany, who has won World medals at the U17, U20 and U23 levels, gets the No. 8 seed.

### 65 kg

The No. 1 seed went to 2021 World silver medalist Miwa Morikowa of Japan, who is a 2019 U20 World champion and 2022 Senior Asian champion. The No. 2 seed is 2019 World bronze medalist Elis Manolova, who has won World medals at the U23 and U20 levels. No. 3 seed is Kriszta Incze of Romania, a three-time European bronze medalist. Two-time Olympian Mimi Hristova, who won the 2020 European Championships, gets the No. 4 seed.

There are two Olympic medalists among the unseeded wrestlers, 2016 Olympic bronze medalist Sakshi Malik of India and 2008 Olympic bronze medalist Yelena Shalygina of Kazakhstan. Another unseeded wrestler to watch is 2020 Olympian Jia Long of China.

Of the other seeds, there a few other veteran stars. No. 6 seed Koumba Larroque of France was a 2018 World silver medalist and 2017 World bronze medalist. She dominated age-group competition, winning five World titles. 2018 World bronze medalist Mallory Velte of the United States has moved up in weight and claimed a spot on her third World Team. She beat 2021 World bronze medalist Forrest Molinari in Final X. No. 5 seed Tetiana Rizhko of Ukraine was a 2022 European champion. No. 7 seed Asli Demir of Turkey won a bronze at the 2021 U23 World Championships.

#### 68 kg

The biggest star at 68 kg is No. 2 seed Tamyra Mensah Stock of the United States, the 2020 Olympic champion, 2019 World champion and two-time World bronze medalist. Mensah Stock placed third in the 2021 Worlds, which was won by the No. 1 seed Meerim Zhumanazarova of

Kyrgyzstan. They did not wrestle each other in Oslo last year. There could be an Olympic finals rematch in the semifinals if the seeds hold up, as 2020 Olympic silver medalist Blessing Oborududu of Nigeria secured the No. 3 seed.

Joining Mensah Stock as past World champions in the field is No. 6 seed Irina Ringaci of Moldova and unseeded Linda Morais of Canada. Ringaci won the 65 kg Senior and U20 World titles in 2021 and has won the last two Senior European Championships. Morais was a 2017 World champion at 59 kg and also a 2016 World bronze medalist. No. 7 seed Zhou Feng of China is a two-time World medalist.

Japan brings a young star, 2022 U20 World champion Ami Ishii. Others who could challenge are 2020 European bronze medalist Alla Belinski of Ukraine, 2020 European silver medalist Dalma Caneva of Italy, two-time Junior World bronze medalist Nesrin Bas of Turkey and 2018 Junior World silver medalist Delgermaa Enkhsaikhan of Mongolia.

#### 72 kg

The No. 3 seed is 2021 World champion Masako Furuichi of Japan, who was also a 2019 World bronze medalist. Furuichi won three U17 World titles, three U20 World titles and a U23 World title. 2022 World silver medalist Zhamila Bakbergenova of Kazakhstan claimed the No. 1 seed. 2018 and 2021 World bronze medalist Buse Cavusoglu Tosun of Turkey claimed the No. 3 seed.

The rest of the field is either young or without many Senior-level achievements. No. 4 seed Davaanasan Enkh Amar of Mongolia was fifth in the 2021 World Championships. No. 5 Alexandra Anghel of Romania, a 2018 U23 World silver medalist, was fifth in the 22 European Championships. 2021 U20 World silver medalist Bipasha of India gets the No. 6 seed. No. 7 Kendra Dacher of France was a 2022 European bronze medalist and a 2021 U23 World silver medalist. No. 8 Anastasiya Alpyeva of Ukraine claimed a 2021 U23 World title and was also a 2019 Junior World bronze medalist.

Unseeded Amit Elor of the United States is breaking into the Senior level with four age-group World titles. She won the U20 Worlds in 2022, the U17 and U20 Worlds in 2021 and the U17 Beach Worlds in 2019. She has qualified for three World Championships this year, with a berth on the U23 World Team still ahead of her.

#### 76 kg

With Olympic finalists Aline Focken of Germany and Adeline Gray of the USA not competing this year, this weight class is still loaded with talent and experience. There are a pair of past World champions in the field, No. 4 seed Yasemin Adar of Turkey and unseeded Justina Di Stasio of Canada. Adar won the 2017 World title, and added a 2018 World silver, 2019 World bronze and a 2020 Olympic bronze to her resume. Di Stasio also won a 2017 World bronze medal and was a 2016 University World champion.

The high seeds are talented. 2021 World bronze medalist Aiperi Medet Kyzy of Kyrgyzstan is the top seed. No. 2 seed Samar Hamza of Egypt was third in the 2021 Worlds. No. 3 Epp Mae of Estonia was a 2022 World silver medalist and two-time World bronze medalist. No. 7 seed Martina Kuenz of Austria was a 2018 World bronze winner.

2019 European Games silver medalist Francy Raedelt of Germany has won World medals at the U17 and U23 levels. No. 6 Anastasiia Shustova of Ukraine was a 2013 U17 World champion. No. 8 seed Catalina Axente of Romania just won the 2022 Beach World Series Final.

Japan's Yuka Kagami was second in the 2022 Asian Championships and won U20 and U17 World titles. There are several past U23 World medalists in the field, including 2019 champion Milaimys Potrille of Cuba, 2021 silver medalist Tatiana Renteria of Colombia and 2018 bronze medalist Gulmaral Yerkebayeva of Kazakhstan. Dymond Guilford of the USA, a 2022 Pan American champion, has rapidly advanced on the Senior level.

### **MEN'S FREESTYLE PREVIEW**

#### 57 kg

Three of last year's four World medalists are back in action for the 2022 World Championships in Belgrade, Serbia, led by No. 1 seed and defending World champion Thomas Gilman from USA, who is also an Olympic bronze medalist and a 2017 World runner-up.

2021 World silver medalist Alireza Sarlak (Iran) and World bronze medalist Horst Lehr (Germany) will come in as the Nos. 4 and 3 seeds, respectively. The No. 2 seed goes to Olympic silver medalist and 2019 World bronze medalist Ravi Kumar (India).

Another Senior World medalist registered to compete is Toshihiro Hasegawa (Japan), who earned bronze at the 2021 Worlds at 61 kg. He was also a 2018 U23 World champion. Joining Hasegawa as U23 gold medalist is Aliabbas Rzazade (Azerbaijan), who won his title in 2021. In the finals, he defeated Bekbolot Myrzanazar Uulu (Kyrgyzstan), who will also be in Serbia.

Two U.S. natives will be in the field, competing for different countries in Darian Cruz (Puerto Rico) and Stevan Micic (Serbia). Cruz is a 2022 Pan American Championships runner-up, while Micic is a two-time European bronze medalist.

#### 61 kg

Holding the No. 1 seed is the only returning medalist at the weight, bronze medalist Arsen Harutyuyan of Armenia, who also won U23 World gold last year.

Rounding out the top-four seeds is Olympic fifth-place finisher Georgi Vangelov (Bulgaria) at No. 2, 2019 U23 World champion Ulukbek Zholdoshbekov (Kyrgyzstan) at No. 3 and two-time Senior World medalist Suleyman Atli (Turkey) at No. 4. Also carrying a seed into Belgrade is 2016 Olympic silver medalist and 2018 U23 World champion Rei Higuchi (Japan), who is No. 8.

Other notable athletes in the field include two-time U23 World champion Reineri Andreu Ortega (Cuba), two-time U23 World bronze medalist Islam Dudaev (Albania) and Tokyo Olympics fifth-place finish Reza Atri (Iran).

Representing the USA is Seth Gross, who defeated 2021 World silver medalist Daton Fix at Final X Stillwater for the chance to compete in Belgrade. Also with USA ties is Michigan wrestler Joey Silva, who will compete for Puerto Rico.

#### 65 kg

The 65 kg weight class has had a different champion every year since 2015, and it seems this year, it's anyone's crown to grab. The weight features two Olympic medalists in Haji Aliyev of Azerbaijan, who won silver in Tokyo and bronze in Rio, and Bajrang Punia of India, who claimed bronze in Tokyo. Aliyev, a three-time World champion, is the No. 1 seed, while Punia, a two-time World medalist, is the No. 2 seed.

There are five other Senior World medalists in the mix, including 2019 World bronze medalist and No. 4 seed Iszmail Muszukajev (Hungary), 2021 World bronze medalist and No. 5 seed Alibek Osmonov (Kyrgyzstan), 2013 and 2015 World medalist Vladimir Dubov (Bulgaria), 2017 and 2018 World bronze medalist Alejandro Valdes Tobier (Cuba) and 2016 World silver medalist Beka Lomtadze (Georgia).

Additionally, four athletes come into Belgrade with age-group World titles, including 2021 U20 and two-time U17 World champion Rahman Amouzad (Iran), two-time U17 World champion Yianni Diakomihalis (USA) and a pair of 2019 U20 World champions in Kaiki Yamaguchi (Japan) at 61 kg and Erik Arushanian (Ukraine) at 70 kg. They are joined by several other age-group World medalists.

American-born and 2022 Pan American silver medalist Sebastian Rivera (Puerto Rico) holds the No. 3 seed at the weight.

#### 70 kg

No. 1 seed Ernazar Akmataliev of Kyrgyzstan is the only 2021 70 kg World medalist returning to the field. He had a successful season last year, winning Senior World silver and U23 World gold. There are two other past World medalists, including 2017 World champion and two-time World bronze medalist Zurabi lakobishvili (Georgia) as the No. 2 seed, and No. 5 seed Amirmohammad Yazdanicherati (Iran), who won silver at last year's Worlds at 65 kg.

There are four age-group World medal winners heading to Belgrade such as 2012 U17 World champion Zain Retherford (USA), who is the No. 6 seed, and 2013 U20 World champion Selahattin Kilicsallayan (Turkey), who is the No. 7 seed. Those that aren't seeded are two-time U23 World bronze medalist Maxim Sacultan (Moldova) and 2017 U20 World bronze medalist Temuulen Enkhtuya (Mongolia).



# **MEN'S FREESTYLE PREVIEW**

In addition to Iakobishvili, Bacar Ndum (Guinea Bissau) and Taishi Narikuni (Japan) enter the field as 2022 continental champions.

#### 74 kg

Leading the field is USA's Kyle Dake, who is the defending World champion. Also a Tokyo Olympics bronze medalist, Dake seeks his fourth-straight World title in Belgrade. He won the crown at 79 kg in 2018 and 2019 before moving down to 74 kg for the Olympic year, where he also snagged a World gold.

Rounding out the top-four seeds is 2021 World silver medalist Tajmuraz Salkazanov (Slovakia) at No. 2, two-time World champion Frank Chamizo (Italy) at No. 3 and two-time age-group World champion Turan Bayramov (Azerbaijan) at No. 4. Chamizo won his 2015 and 2017 World titles at 65 kg and 70 kg, respectively. At 74 kg, Chamizo owns a 2019 World silver.

Holding the Nos. 5-7 seeds is 2019 World bronze medalist Yones Emamichoghaei (Iran), 2014 World champion and 2017 World runner-up Hetik Cabolov (Serbia) and 2017 World bronze medalist Soner Demirtas (Turkey).

Other World medalists in the field include 2018 World bronze medalist Franklin Marin Castillo (Cuba), 2019 World silver medalist Nurkozha Kaipanov (Kazakhstan) and 2011 World silver medalist Franklin Gomez (Puerto Rico).

Gomez went to college at Michigan State and trains in the USA with the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club. Other U.S. connections come from Malik Amine (San Marino), a 2022 Mediterranean Games bronze medalist, who was born and raised in the U.S. and competed for the University of Michigan.

#### 79 kg

The USA hopes to continue its stronghold on the 79 kg weight class, which was created in 2018. Only two people have claimed gold at the weight, Kyle Dake in 2018 and 2019 and Jordan Burroughs in 2021. Burroughs is back at the weight this year and seeks his sixth-overall World title. He won his first four World titles and a 2012 Olympic gold at 74 kg.

Looking to dethrone the American is 2021 World silver medalist Mohammad Nokhodilarimi (Iran), who lost to Burroughs in last year's finals, 5-1. Nokhodilarimi is also a 2019 U23 World silver medalist. Burroughs holds the No. 1 seed and Nokhodiliarimi will be No. 2.

There is only one other Senior World medalist in the field, two-time World bronze winner and Tokyo Olympic bronze medalist at 74 kg Bekzod Abdurakhmanov, who trains in the U.S. at the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club.

Six past age-group World medalists populate the field, including U23 medalists Arman Avagyan (Armenia), Muhammet Akdeniz (Turkey) and Akhsarbek Gulaev (Slovakia), U20 medalists Baliyan Gourav (India) and Gadzhimurad Omarov (Azerbaijan) and U17 medalist Georgios Kougioumtsidis (Greece). Kougioumtsidis, Avagyan, Akdeniz and Gourav are the Nos. 3, 4, 6 and 8 seeds, respectively.

#### 86 kg

We're likely to see the continuation of the David Taylor vs. Hassan Yazdanicharati (Iran) saga. The World/ Olympic series between the two is 2-1 in favor of Taylor, who took out Yazdani in the Tokyo Olympic finals and in the first round of the 2018 World Championships en route to a gold medal. The Iranian got his revenge in the 2021 World finals, taking the crown. Yazdani, a 2016 Olympic champion, enters Belgrade as the No. 1 seed, while Taylor is No. 2.

No. 3 seed Myles Amine (San Marino) is the only other Olympic medalist at the weight. Born and raised in the USA, Amine competed for the University of Michigan, where he was a multiple-time All-American.

This weight is loaded with several past Senior World medalists such as No. 4 Abubakr Abakarov (Azerbaijan), No. 5 Boris Makoev (Slovakia) and No. 7 Deepak Punia (India). Others that aren't seeded include silver medalist Fatih Erdin (Turkey) and bronze medalists Taimuraz Friev (Spain) and Stefan Reichmuth (Switzerland).

Age-group World champions Rakhim Magamadov (France) and Mukhammed Aliev (Ukraine) are ones to watch out for.



### **MEN'S FREESTYLE PREVIEW**

#### 92 kg

World champion and No. 1 seed Kamran Ghasempour (Iran) is back to defend his 2021 title; however two-time 92 kg World champion and 2016 Olympic bronze medalist J'den Cox (USA) seeks to get back on top of the podium. The two met up in the World semifinals last year with Ghasempour winning on criteria, 3-3. Cox eventually collected a bronze medal. As a result, Cox heads into Belgrade as the No. 3 seed.

Holding the No. 2 spot is the other 2021 bronze medalist Osman Nurmagomedov (Azerbaijan), who is also a 2021 U23 World champion.

Sohsuke Takatani (Japan) is the only remaining Senior World medalist in the field. He won silver at the 2014 World Championships.

Costa Rica's Maxwell Lacey, a 2022 Pan American bronze medalist, is from the U.S. and trains at the Indiana RTC.

#### 97 kg

Two athletes have owned this weight class over the last few years: Kyle Snyder and Abdulrashid Sadulaev of Russia. Since Russia is not able to compete at this year's World Championships, that leaves the door open for Snyder to snatch the crown once again. Snyder is a 2016 Olympic champion and two-time World champion with three other World and Olympic medals. Every year since 2015, Snyder has made his way to the podium. This year, he is the No. 1 seed.

Three past World medalists enter Belgrade with top-eight seeds, including 2019 World bronze winner Magomedgadji Nurov (Macedonia) at No. 2, 2021 World bronze medalist Mahamed Zakariiev (Ukraine) at No. 4 and 2014 World bronze medalist Mohammadhossein Mohammadian (Iran) at No. 5.

2018 U23 World champion Givi Matcharashvili (Georgia) and 2018 U20 World champion Magomedkhan Magomedov (Azerbaijan) are also athletes to watch out for.

A U.S. connection expected to compete is Ben Honis (Italy), who competed collegiately for Cornell and trains at the Michigan RTC.

#### 125 kg

The heavyweight field is loaded, featuring five Tokyo Olympic medalists, three at 125 kg and two at 97 kg. Olympic silver medalist and three-time World champion Geno Petriashvili (Georgia) has the No. 1 seed next week. In his last Worlds showing, he earned silver, falling to Amirhossein Zare (Iran). As the returning World champion, Zare enters as the No. 3 seed. He is also a Tokyo Olympic bronze medalist.

The No. 2 seed is occupied by 2016 Olympic champion and two-time World champion Taha Akgul (Turkey). Akgul won bronze at last year's Worlds and owns 2017 and 2019 World silver medals.

Bumping up from 97 kg are Olympic bronze medalists Reineris Salas Perez (Cuba) and Abraham Conyedo (Italy). They are joined by past Senior World medalists Lkhagvagerel Munkhtur (Mongolia) the No. 4 seed, Zhiwei Deng (China) and Oleksandr Khotsianivskyi (Ukraine).

Representing the U.S. is Hayden Zillmer, who will make his World Championships debut in Serbia. Zillmer defeated two-time World bronze medalist Nick Gwaizdowski at Final X New York to make the team. Others with U.S. connections are No. 8 Amar Dhesi (Canada), who trains at the Ohio RTC, Youssif Hemida (Egypt), who trains with the Spartan Combat Wrestling Club, and Jere Heino (Finland), who competed collegiately at Campbell.

# **HEAD COACHES**



IVAN IVANOV
GENERAL MANAGER OF
GRECO-ROMAN PROGRAMS

In April 2022, Ivan Ivanov was named USA Wrestling's General Manager of Greco-Roman programs, tasked to transform Greco-Roman wrestling in the U.S.

From 2002-2009, Ivanov served as the head Greco-Roman coach for the U.S. Olympic Education Center (USOEC), which is affiliated with Northern Michigan University in Marquette, Mich. Under his direction, the USOEC developed into one of the top Greco-Roman training locations in the nation.

Ivanov coached numerous athletes to Senior National Teams and national titles, as well as athletes who made age-group World Teams and won national titles. Among the star athletes developed by Ivanov were two-time Olympian Spenser Mango, two-time World medalist and Olympian Justin Lester, Olympian Chas Betts, and many others.

He has coached numerous U.S. teams on international tours, including serving as assistant coach for the 2001 Junior World Team and on the coaching staff for Senior World Teams. Ivanov is a gold-certified coach within USA Wrestling's National Coaches Education Program. In 2009, Ivanov was named USA Wrestling Greco-Roman Coach of the Year.

Ivanov emigrated to the United States from Bulgaria, where he was a world-class Greco-Roman athlete. He won a World silver medal at 62 kg in 1994, and placed fifth at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga. He was also fourth at the 1995 European Championships.



TERRY STEINER
NATIONAL WOMEN'S FREESTYLE
HEAD COACH

Terry Steiner was named USA Wrestling's National Women's Coach in 2002, becoming the first and only to hold the position. In 2004, Steiner led the first U.S. Women's Freestyle Olympic Team in history to one silver and one bronze medal. Steiner and the U.S. added bronze medals at the 2008 Beijing Games and the 2012 London Games. He coached Helen Maroulis to the first Olympic gold medal in U.S. women's freestyle history in 2016. At the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, he led the squad to a historic showing with a gold medal from Tamyra Mensah Stock, a silver from Adeline Gray and bronze medals from Sarah Hildebrandt and Helen Maroulis. With that, Maroulis became the first U.S. woman to win to Olympic medals in wrestling.

In 2003, all seven women's freestylers won World medals at the World Championships in New York City and took home a second-place team finish on tiebreaker after tying powerhouse Japan for first.

Under his guidance, U.S. women boasts 55 World medals, including 15 golds, 13 silvers and 26 bronzes. In this last quad, Steiner and team collected 10 World medals with five golds. In 2021, the USA scored seven medals with gold from Maroulis and Adeline Gray. For Gray, it was her sixth World title, making her the first athlete in USA Wrestling history, male or female, to win six World championships.

Previously, Steiner had worked as an assistant coach at Wisconsin and Oregon State.

As an athlete, Steiner was a 1993 NCAA champion for the Iowa and helped the Hawkeyes to three team titles in '91, '92 and '93. He was also a multiple-time National Team member and 1996 Pan American champion.



BILL ZADICK
NATIONAL MEN'S FREESTYLE
HEAD COACH

Bill Zadick has been at the helm of the U.S. Men's Freestyle program for six years, taking over for Bruce Burnett after the 2016 Olympics. In that short time, he has coached seven different athletes to 11 World titles and led the U.S. team to a Men's Freestyle World Team title in 2017, the first team title for the USA since 1995. Additionally, he has collected 14 other World medals, including six silvers and eight bronzes.

Zadick has been a part of the U.S. coaching staff since 2009, when he started as Resident Coordinator and Assistant National Coach. He has since worked his way up the coaching ranks and is now head coach of some of the best freestyle athletes in the world. Tokyo marked his third Olympic Games as a coach and first at the U.S. head coach. In Rio as the Assistant National Coach, Zadick helped coach Kyle Snyder to an Olympic gold and J'den Cox to an Olympic bronze, and at the London games in 2012, he helped coach Jordan Burroughs and Jake Varner to gold medals as well as Coleman Scott and Tervel Dlagnev to bronze medals. At the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, Zadick helped all five of the men's freestyle Olympians to medal performances with golds from David Taylor and Gable Steveson, a silver from Snyder and bronzes from Thomas Gilman and Kyle Dake.

As an athlete, Zadick competed on the 2001 and 2006 World Teams, winning a World title in 2006. He is the last American to win a World title at the weight. He was also an NCAA Division I champion for Iowa in 1996.

In 2021, Zadick was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Member, the highest honor.



# **ASSISTANT COACHES**



KATIE KRIEBEL
NATIONAL WOMEN'S FREESTYLE ASSISTANT COACH

Katie Kriebel joined the USA Wrestling coaching staff as the National Women's Freestyle Assistant Coach in April of 2022.

Kriebel, who competed under her maiden name Downing, won World bronze medals for Team USA in 2005 and 2007. She was a five-time World Team Trials champion and three-time U.S. Open champion. Kriebel added a Junior World silver medal in 1999.

She competed collegiately at the University of Minnesota-Morris during the era before there were college women's national tournaments, earning medals on the USA Wrestling senior circuit as well at the international level.

She also has extensive coaching experience at a number of levels. She has served as an assistant coach at Pendleton Heights High School in Indiana since 2013, first coaching the boys team, then a co-ed team and their growing girls team. She is the founder and head coach of Krieb's Club for freestyle and Greco-Roman wrestling in Indiana.

She served as an assistant coach for the women's wrestling team at Oklahoma City University from 2011-12. She has been an active coach with USA Wrestling nationally, as well as with the Indiana State Wrestling Association. She coached USA Wrestling's Senior Pan American team in 2011 and at the 2014 Klippan Open. Kriebel also coached Team Indiana for the Junior/16U National Duals in 2021.

She competed in high school for her boys team , Kriebel was elected to the Indiana High School Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2010.



JOE RUSSELL
NATIONAL MANAGER OF FREESTYLE PROGRAMS

Joe Russell was brought on as USA Wrestling's Manager of Freestyle Programs in May 2017, after previously serving as the head coach at George Mason University. One of the most beloved coaches in the country, Russell, alongside Zadick, has helped the USA to 24 Senior World medals, including 10 golds, a World Team title and five Olympic medals.

Also working with younger age-groups, Russell played a major role in the U.S.'s international success, highlighted by U23 World titles from Richie Lewis, Bo Nickal and Anthony Cassioppi, the only three Americans to accomplish the feat.

Prior to joining USA Wrestling, Russell had an extensive coaching background. In addition to his head coaching job at GMU, Russell was a long-time assistant coach at his alma mater, Minnesota. He was heavily involved with USA Wrestling throughout his career, earning coaching bids for the 1999 and 2013 Cadet Greco-Roman World Teams as well as the 2002, 2004 and 2014 Junior Pan American teams.

As a competitor, Russell wrestled collegiately for the University of Minnesota from 1988 to 1992. He was named team captain during his senior year, on top of acquiring Academic All-Big Tenhonors.

In 2007, Russell was awarded the Medal of courage by the National Wrestling Hall of Fame, which is given to a wrestler or former wrestler has overcome what appear to be insurmountable challenges, providing inspiration to others. In 1985, Russell was partially paralyzed after suffering a motorcycle accident. He recovered from the injuries suffered in the accident to lead an inspiring life on and off the mat.
