

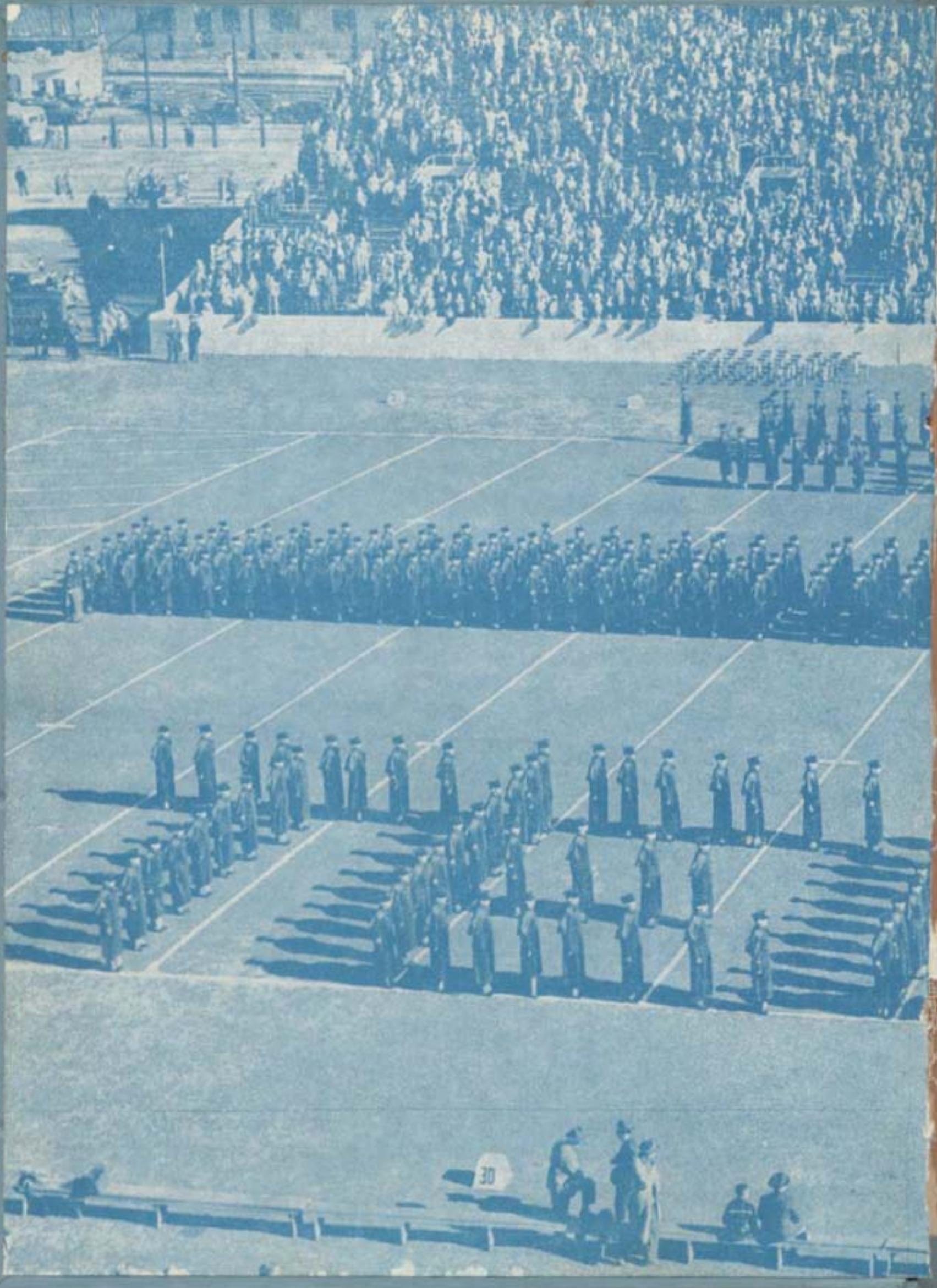

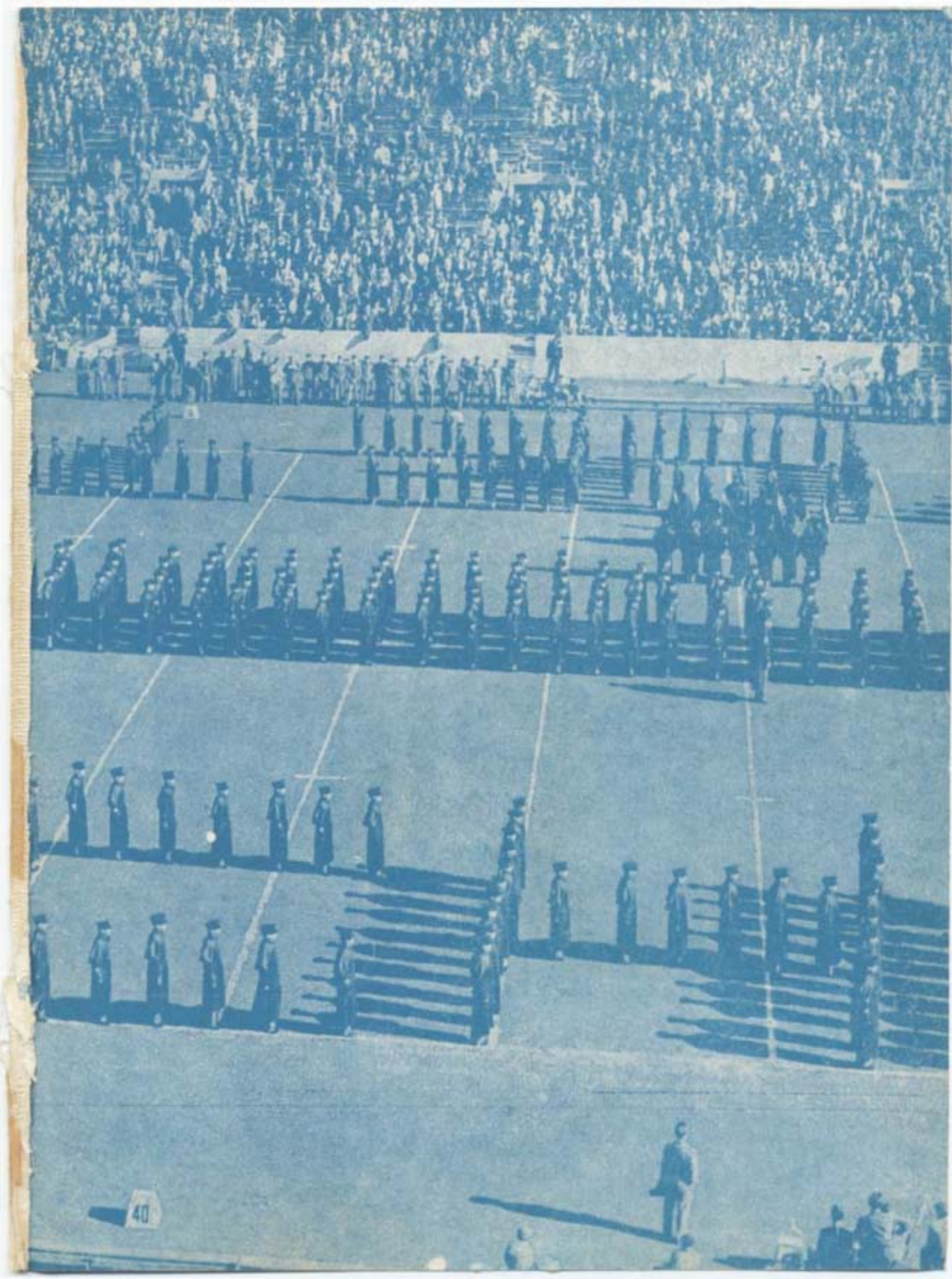

SERVING HER COUNTRY FOR SEVENTY-FIVE YEARS

THIS, the 1947 BUGLE, is the first edition of the Tech year-book to appear since 1943 when, due to wartime conditions, it was necessary to discontinue publication. In the four years which have elapsed Alma Mater has seen many changes. The accelerated program was inaugurated and graduation exercises were held each quarter. To assist the country in its war effort the school welcomed the establishment of the Army Specialized Training Program and the Navy V-12 Program on the campus. With the cessation of hostilities the school prepared to expand its facilities in order to accommodate the thousands of veterans seeking an education at V. P. I. under the G.I. Bill of Rights.

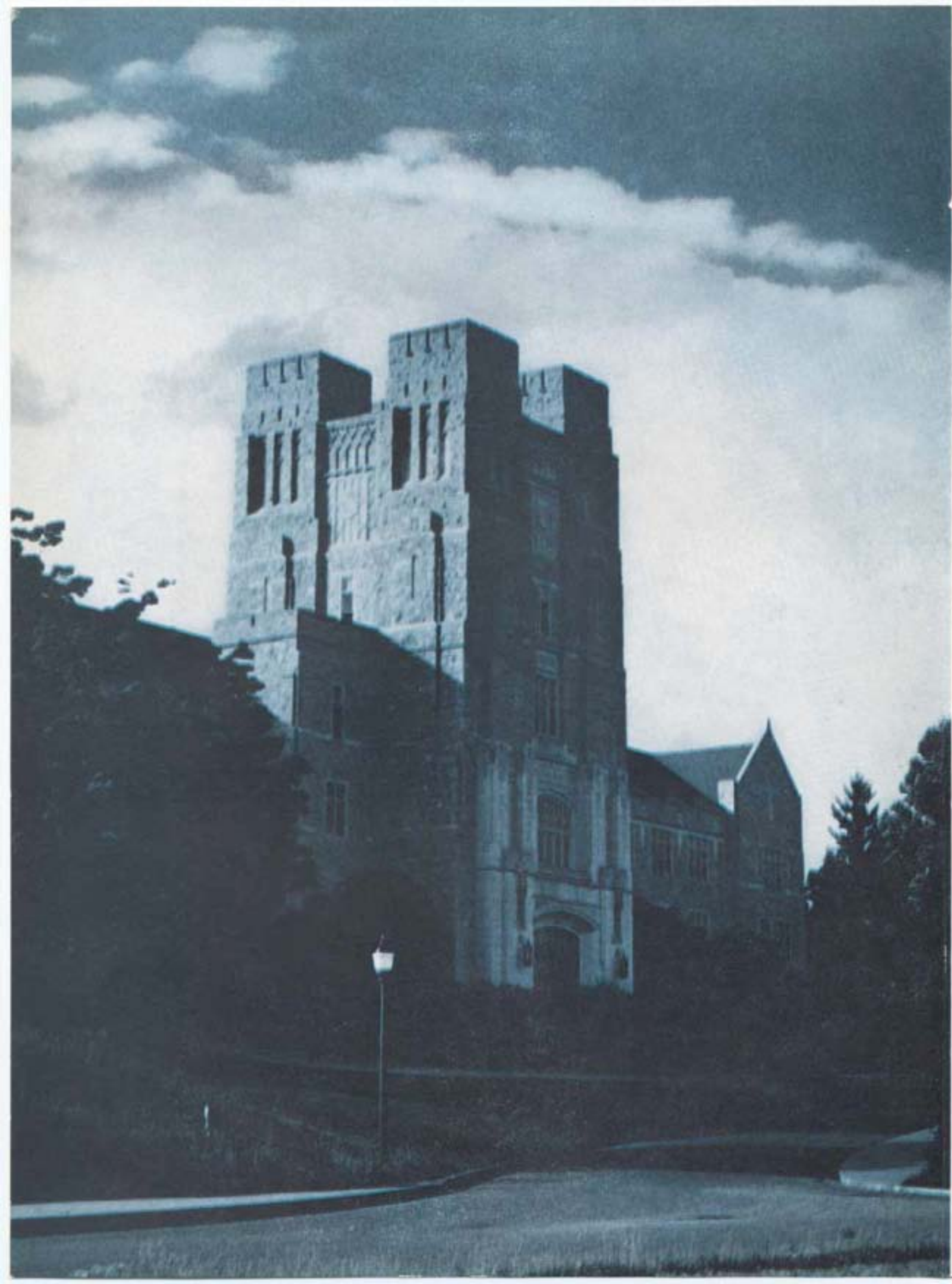
We have tried to bridge this gap by including pictures of the students who graduated since publication of the last BUGLE. While this section is by no means complete, we feel it is just compensation for the efforts expended in trying to contact all of these graduates.

The year 1947 marks another memorable event in the history of V. P. I.—the seventy-fifth anniversary of its founding. 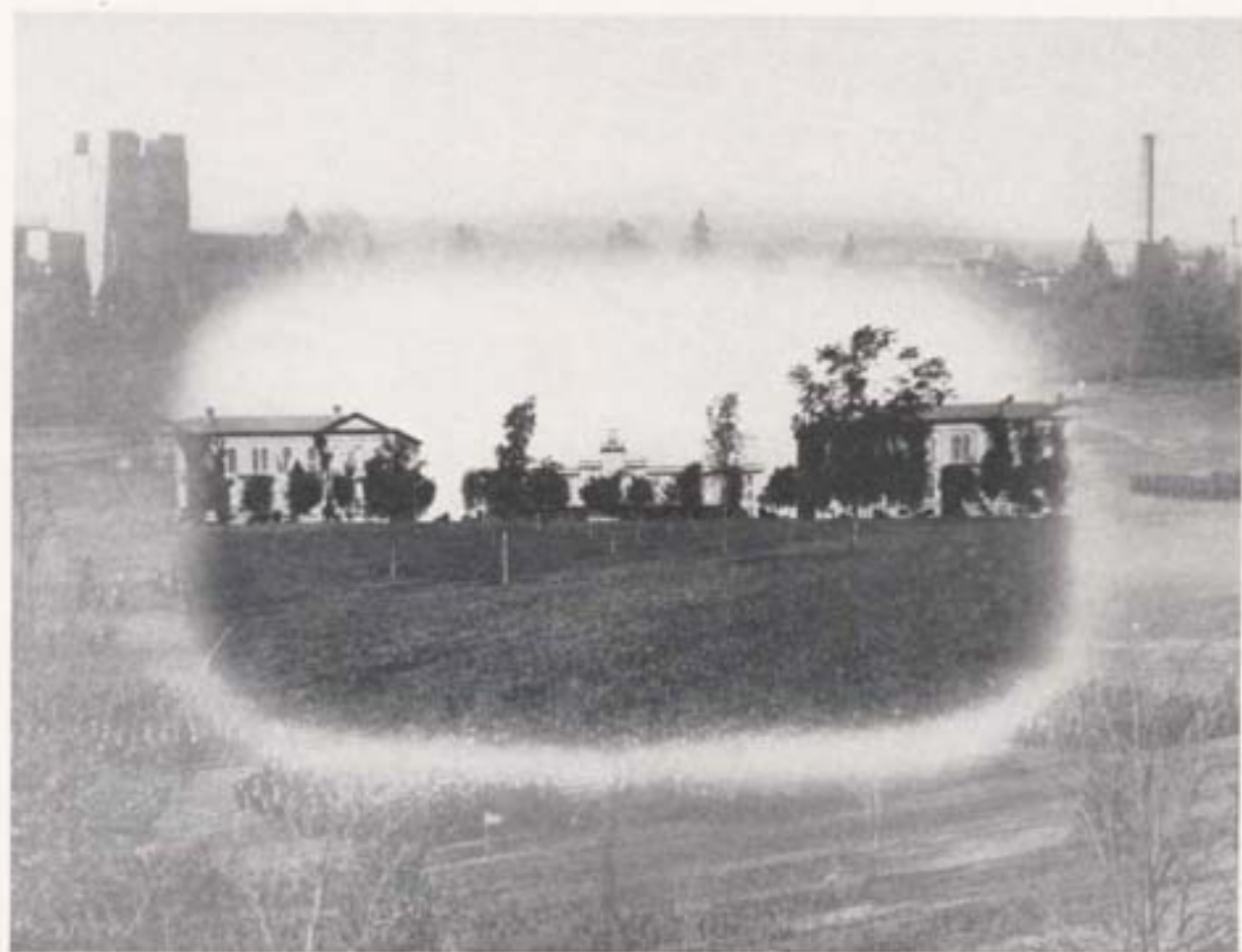

IN RETROSPECT

History of V. P. I.

With comments in the captions by Professor William H. "Bosco" Rosche.

IN 1872, the Virginia Legislature, with the assistance of the Congressional Land Grant College Endowment, passed an act making possible the Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College. An offer by Montgomery County of \$20,000 and the grounds and buildings of Pres-



ton and Olin Institute was largely responsible for the location of the college in Blacksburg. The Legislature, being unfamiliar with the prevailing climate of this mountain resort, immediately approved the site. Dr. C. L. C. Minor was appointed the first president of V. A. M. C. A bitter disagreement brought about his removal in 1897, however, and he was succeeded by Dr. J. L. Buchanan in 1880. The first two buildings of the present

campus—First and Second Academic buildings — were completed in 1877.

Political interference and feeble support from the state checked the progress of the young college. Captain Thomas N. Conrad replaced President Buchanan as head of the school in 1886. Smooth plans were again interrupted when, four years later, a new political party in power reorganized the faculty and named General L. L. Lomax as president.

Military training has been an integral part of the campus life since the founding of the school. Confederate officers were placed in charge of all military training for the first decade. In 1884, realizing the value of having military instructors who were in constant contact with new developments in military training, the college secured the

assistance of Army officers from the War Department. Number one barracks, which was completed in 1888, offered the first living facilities on the campus for the cadets. The annual "sham battles," which were now becoming a tradition, attracted to the campus large crowds from all over the state.

The Board of Visitors in making Dr. John McBryde president in 1891, gave him freedom in selecting his faculty and in formulating the policies of the college. This final removal of political interference made way for future progress.

Dr. McBryde fostered military training and instigated broad improvements in the corps. Composed of one hundred thirty-five cadets, it was made a permanent organization in 1891. The two Civil War can-

nons which have long flanked the entrance to the upper quadrangle were purchased in 1893 with prize money won in competitive drill in Norfolk.

The first Cadet Band, organized in 1892, was composed of sixteen members, with Cadet Clifford Anderson as leader. The school offered a concession to the members and appropriated funds for music and a place to practice. In this same year the first intercollegiate football game was played with Saint Albans in Blacksburg. Score:

the same time. October, 1896, saw the school colors changed from gray and black to orange and maroon.

The Spanish American War in 1898 instigated the mobilization of the army that defeated Spain and established the United States as a world power. Governor Tyler declined for Virginia the service of the corps offered for national defense, but many cadets answered the call to arms. The Band entered the service as a unit and did training duty in Florida.

V. A. M. C., 14; Saint Albans, 10. In 1894 the V. A. M. C. eleven lost the first game against V. M. I. by the score of 10 to 6.

The following year, by an act of legislature, the name of the college was changed to the Virginia Polytechnic Institute. The school motto, *Ut Prosim*, "That we may serve," was adopted by Dr. McBryde at

Having established a high technical standing in the South for the school, Dr. McBryde considered his task completed. He resigned in the Spring of 1906, ending a sixteen year term as one of V. P. I.'s most successful presidents.

Dr. Paul B. Barringer, who succeeded Dr. McBryde as head of the institution, as-

sumed office in the midst of bitter alumni disagreement. He initiated broad and significant changes in the instruction offered by the school and raised to a high level the entrance requirements. Dr. Joseph D. Eggleston, during his administration (1913-

1919), saw little need for radical changes in the college. Every passing year saw V. P. I.'s influence further extended in Virginia.

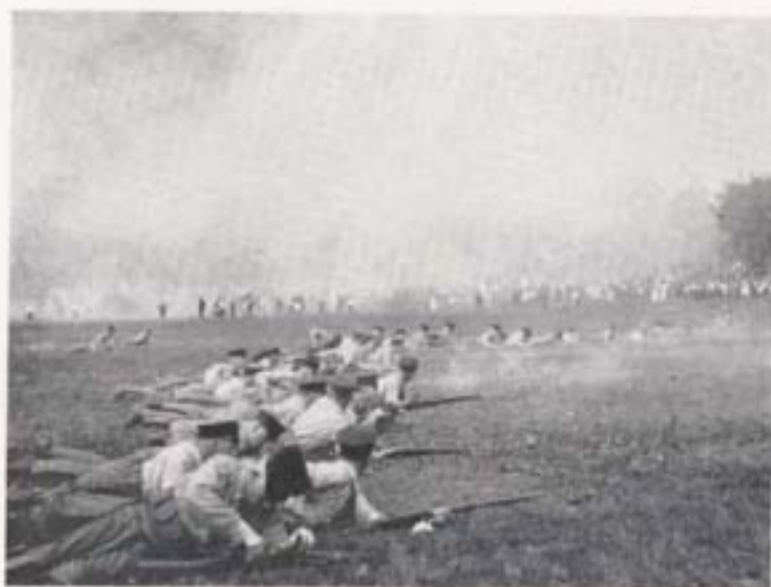
Meanwhile, the student honor system was introduced in 1908 during a Corps reorganization. In 1909 the old "rat system" was revised to abolish the hazing of freshmen. This same year the football team was dubbed "The Gobblers," the name by which all Tech teams are known today.

Being a military college, V. P. I. was more affected than most schools by the national call to arms in 1917. Nearly three thousand cadets and alumni entered the armed forces, and over six hundred Techmen held military commissions. In 1919, eighteen months after the establishment of R.O.T.C. at Tech, the War Department designated the Virginia Polytechnic Institute as one of the twelve "distinguished colleges" in the country.

Following the war, the national enthusiasm for education extended to V. P. I. Tech's greatest growth came during the administration of Dr. Julian A. Burruss, who

was made president of the school in 1919. In his twenty-six years of service Dr. Burruss saw his Alma Mater grow from an enrollment of seven hundred students and a physical plant valued at one million dollars to a peak enrollment in 1943 of 3,582 students and facilities valued at more than eight and one half million dollars. In build-

ing the institution to a strong technical college he raised the entrance requirements, increased the scope of graduate instruction, added new curricula to serve the expanding agricultural and industrial needs of Virginia, and in 1921, made V. P. I. a coeducational school. In 1944, the Board of Visitors voted to rename the Teaching and Administration building "Burruss Hall" as a token of appreciation for his twenty-five years of devoted service to the school. The following year President Burruss was forced to resign his position because of poor health. In accepting his resignation the Board of Visitors elected him President Emeritus of V. P. I.

In the last few years of Dr. Burruss' ad-

ministration the school saw many significant changes. With the advent of war many students were called to serve in the armed forces of the United States. By 1944 the enrollment had dropped to seven hundred students, and the Cadet Corps was reduced to four companies consisting almost entirely of Freshmen and Sophomores. One year after the attack on Pearl Harbor the Navy V-12 Program was established on the campus. In 1943 the War Department began training soldiers at V. P. I. under the Army Specialized Training Program. Many students who first came to Tech in one of these programs returned after the war to continue their education.

Dr. Burruss was succeeded as head of the school by Dr. John R. Hutcheson, former Director of the Agricultural Extension Service. In his first two years as

president, Dr. Hutcheson has done much toward improving and expanding the facilities of the school in order to accommodate the countless number of veterans seeking admission. Through his efforts were constructed the three trailer camps now housing married students on the campus. His plans for the future include the building of new dormitories and classrooms and the strengthening of the faculty.

In seventy-five years V. P. I. has risen to become an outstanding school, ranking among the best in the country. Loyal alumni, successful in their chosen fields, reflect the thorough college training and the high caliber of the student body. Guided by the same principles that have given her a successful past, Tech looks to a glorious future.


THE ADMINISTRATION

A message from our President — to the Students

The record of V. P. I.'s sons in two world wars is such as to endear them to the State and the Nation. Many former students have re-assembled on the campus and are again engaged in the task of preparing for participation in a peaceful civilization. Others have come to us for the first time as veterans or directly from high school. Each of you has found here many changes from pre-war days, and all of us recognize that we are passing through a transition period with some accompanying uncertainties and inconveniences.

We believe the cooperative attitude of the student body and faculty is indicative of the wonderful spirit we have all shown in view of certain physical difficulties such as housing, over-crowded classrooms, and scarcity of many important items. We have been pleased with the academic achievement of the majority of the student body during the session and are conscious of the fact that the seriousness of purpose demonstrated by the students has constituted a distinct challenge, and that the faculty, although over-loaded, has performed unusually well under trying conditions. The present student body is at least twenty-five percent larger than ever before enrolled, and as evidence of the quality of the students and the instruction offered, the percentage of withdrawal of students throughout the year has been remarkably low.

We have been pleased with the interest manifested by the student body in fields other than technical training. The reactivation of certain of the honor societies and social and curricular clubs is another indication of our return to normalcy. It will be the endeavor of the Administration to continue to seek the advice and support of the student groups and the faculty in order that we may build here at V. P. I. an even greater institution serving the student body, the State, and the Nation.

The Cadet Corps as a whole is always well represented in any function of which the band is a part.

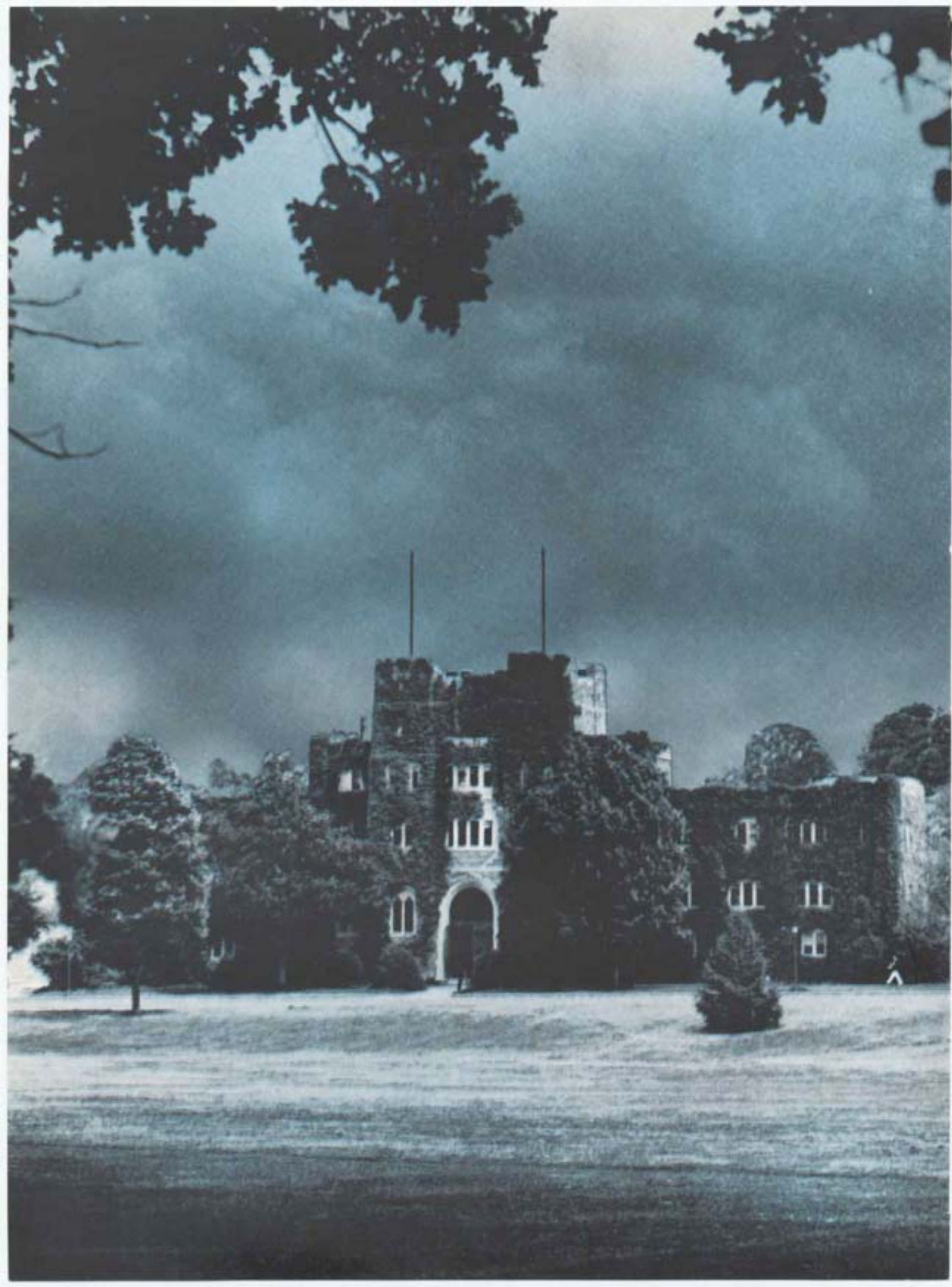

Tech headed into the '46 football season with an abundance of material. One hundred candidates, including such former stars as John "The Greek" Maskas, Frank Ballard, Joe Foltz, and Bobby Smith, turned out for spring drills. It was thought these men were certain of a place on the squad, but the competition for every position was so keen that up until the season's opening game the first string had yet to be established. With such a wealth of material Virginia Tech looked for one of its greatest seasons. No one was disappointed with the season as a whole, though there were times that caused a great deal

of anxiety. As the last game ended the final tabulation showed three games won, three lost, and three tied.

V. P. I. 14—NORTH CAROLINA 14. The season opened on September 28th with Virginia Tech playing the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. During the first half the game was strictly a one-sided affair, with the Tarheels tallying fourteen points while holding the Gobblers scoreless. "Choo-choo" Charlie Justice swept around the ends time after time racking up several first downs. In the second half, however, a determined Tech eleven came back and completely turned the tide of the game. The line, paced by John Maskas, put on a startling exhibition of defensive play and twice put Tech in scoring position by blocking Justice's kicks. The game ended in a 14-14 tie establishing the Gobblers as one of the nation's leaders.

V. P. I. 21—VIRGINIA 21. The following week the team journeyed to Roanoke to meet a powerful Virginia eleven. The game was a hard fought battle with both teams putting on a splendid display of offensive power.

Tech showed the fighting spirit that was to mark every remaining game on the schedule by three times fighting from behind to knot the score. The Cavaliers counted first in the opening quarter, but the Gobblers fought back and carried the ball to pay dirt early in the second period. Later in the same quarter the Cavaliers again crossed the





goal line to forge ahead by a 14-7 score. The second half opened with Tech taking possession of the ball. A 35 yard pass from Beard to Hopkins plus several short drives by Beard placed the ball on the Virginia four yard line. Bobbie Smith took a short pass from Walton to give the Gobblers their second touchdown. Striking back, the Cavaliers took to the air and for the third time in the game went out in front only to have Tech again tie the score with a third tally in the first few minutes of the last quarter.

V. P. I. 0—WILLIAM AND MARY 49. On October 12th the Gobblers met the College of William and Mary

in Williamsburg. It was a sad day for Coach Kitts and his boys. Tech was missing that certain spark that pushes a good team on to victory.

V. P. I. 0—MARYLAND 6. The following Friday, under the lights at College Park, the Gobblers lost a tough game to the previously untried Terps of the University of Maryland. This was supposed to be a breather for the over-worked Techmen, but the "little team" from north of Washington proved to be anything but a soft touch. The hard hitting Terps held the Gobblers scoreless, a feat accomplished only twice during the season. Maryland's

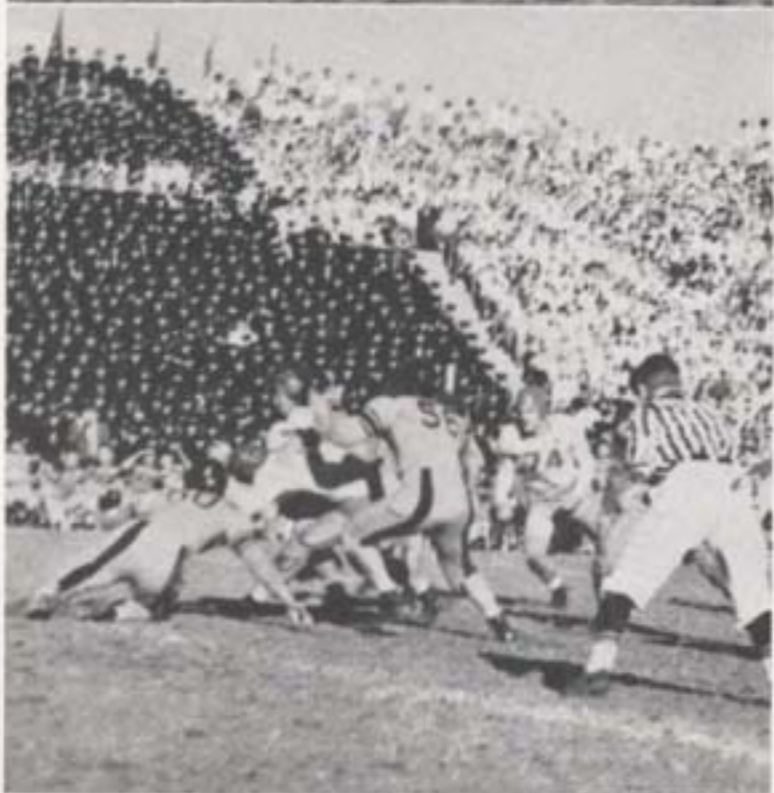


score came late in the second period when Poling circled wide around end to carry the ball over from the twelve yard line. In the final moments of the game both Smith and Beard crossed the goal for Tech, but the field judges ruled that the forward motion of the ball had stopped short of the line.

V. P. I. 14—N. C. STATE 6. October 26th was homecoming day, and Tech played host to North Carolina State. A record breaking crowd of 13,000, including 4,000 alumni, squeezed into Miles Stadium to see the Gobblers whip the previously unbeaten and untied Wolfpack. Midway in the second period Beard heaved a pass from the thirty-five yard line to Ramone in the end zone for the first touchdown of the day. Orr converted, making the score 7-0. The Wolfpack struck back, however, when late in the third quarter State's left end intercepted a pass and ran forty-three yards to the goal. The attempted placement was wide. In the last period Tech recovered the ball on the State six after blocking a quick kick. Beard, running off the T, circled the end to carry the ball over. Once again Orr made good putting the Gobblers out in front by eight points.

V. P. I. 7—CLEMSON 14. On November 2nd V. P. I. met the Clemson Tigers in the second home game of the season. The contest opened with Tech taking the upper hand. Midway in the first period Jack Cooke recovered a fumble giving Tech the ball on Clemson's twenty-five yard line. For three plays the Tigers held the Gobblers to no gain, but on the fourth down DeShazo carried the ball around end to pay dirt. Orr tallied his eighth PAT of the season putting Tech out in front 7-0. Clemson struck back in the second quarter and three times pushed deep into Tech territory only to be stopped each time short of the marker. Taking to the air in the fourth period the Tigers displayed an abundance of offensive power that completely overwhelmed the haughty Gobblers. Both of their scores were made on passes from Gage.

V. P. I. 13—WASHINGTON AND LEE 7. Tech again broke into the win column on the following Saturday at Lynchburg by defeating Washington and Lee in a thrill packed game. Both teams threatened to score in the first half, but neither was able to make good. In the





first few minutes of play the Gobblers drove to the General's fourteen where they lost the ball on a faulty pass from center. Late in the second quarter W. and L. moved down the field via the air to the Tech ten yard line. A penalty then set them back to the fifteen. An attempted field goal fell short of the uprights, and the half ended with the score 0-0. In the second half Smith intercepted a pass and started the Gobblers on a march that ended with Beard crossing the line for the first touchdown of the day. Orr failed to convert. Before the end of the third period, however, the Generals had stepped ahead by the score 7-6. After running back a punt to the Tech 29, W. and L. advanced the ball to the eight. A pass into the end zone was good for the score. With a very few minutes left to play Tech carried the ball to pay dirt in a drive that started on their own twenty-eight. The score came when Thomas drove off tackle from the one yard stripe. Orr's conversion was good.

V. P. I. 7—RICHMOND 7. The Gobblers put their third tie game on record on November 16th by battling to a 7-7 count with a highly favored Richmond eleven at Richmond. The game was scoreless until late in the third

quarter when the Spiders, opening a hole in Tech's forward wall, plunged over the goal from the eleven yard line to rack up six points. The placekick was good and Richmond surged ahead 7-0. In the fourth period Burns, recovering a fumble for Tech, set the Gobblers up for their only score of the day. A pass from Walton to Stud Johnson placed the ball on the fourteen where Walton took over and carried it across in two plays. Orr's conversion tied the score.

V. P. I. 20—V. M. I. 7. Amidst the color of Thanksgiving festivities, the Tech eleven routed a favored V. M. I. team in the "Military Classic of the South." A record crowd of twenty-four thousand fans were on hand to greet the cadet corps of both schools as they paraded into the stadium immediately preceding the kick-off.

Near the end of the first period Tech started a long drive down the field which carried the ball to the four yard line. Beard smashed off tackle for the first tally of the day and Orr converted making the score 7-0. In the second quarter Jack "Rabbit" Hutchinson, on a pass from Thompson, galloped down the sideline to score the Keydet's only touchdown and make the ball game all tied up at the half. Coach Kitt's boys came back strong in the third quarter with a great display of offensive power. Walton returned a V. M. I. punt thirty-five yards to mid-field, and by a succession of passes and line drives the Gobblers moved to the Keydet nine. Beard carried the ball the rest of the way for Tech's second score. Sure footed Ross Orr again

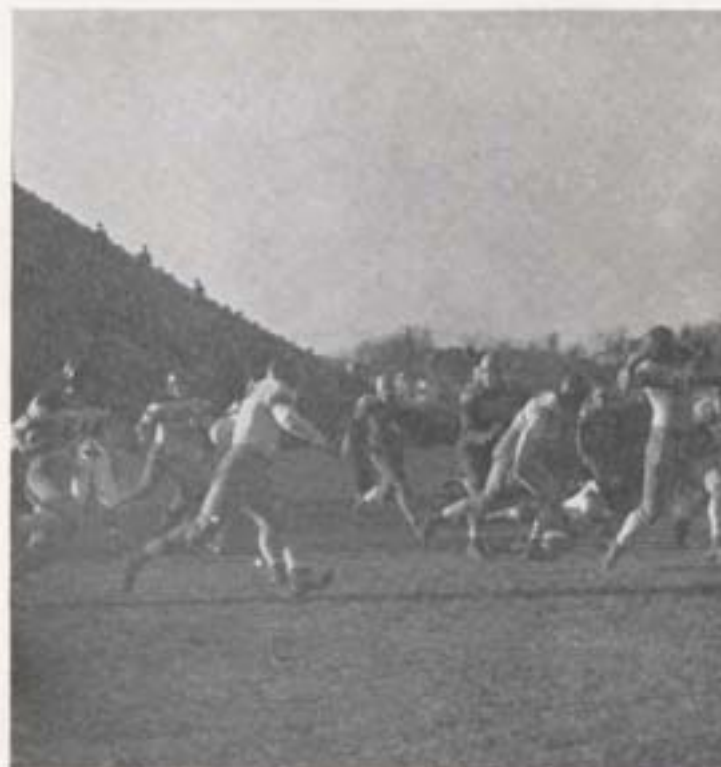


made good. In the last quarter a ferociously charging Tech line pushed the Keydets back to their own goal. Huffman then fell on a blocked kick in the end zone to climax the scoring for the day.

V. P. I. 6—CINCINNATI 18. On New Year's Day the Gobblers flew to El Paso, Texas, where they met a highly favored team from the University of Cincinnati in the snow-bound Sun Bowl. Tech, the first Virginia team to participate in a post-season contest, played their

best game of the season but bowed to the superior offensive power of the Bearcats.

In the first half both teams threatened to score though neither was able to carry the ball across the marker. Shortly after the kick-off the Gobblers made their way to the Cincinnati two on passes from Beard to Walton. Here their drive was checked, and the Bearcats took possession of the ball. Following an exchange of kicks Cincinnati managed to penetrate to the Tech fifteen, where they were stopped cold by the defensive play of Orr and Maskas. Striking back in the third quarter, however, they twice climaxed long drives by racking up two scores. Both attempted conversions were stopped by the charging Tech forward wall. Early in the fourth quarter the entire complexion of the game changed, and V. P. I. surged to a score on Beasley's accurate passing and the hard running of Beard who drove off tackle for the six points. Usually reliable Ross Orr missed the uprights and the score stood at 12-6. Later, Tech was again on the march when the Bearcats intercepted a pass from Beasley to set themselves up for their third and final score.

Basketball

With bright prospects for a brilliant season, the basketball team got off to a flying start. The Christmas holidays saw Tech hit the road to garner two victories and suffer their first defeat at the hands of American University. During the first week of the winter quarter the boys managed to chalk up three more triumphs, beating Lynchburg College, Roanoke College, and Emory and Henry. Next came V. M. I. This one turned into a thriller, the Gobblers coming out on the long end of a 53-52 score at Lexington. The next game saw Tech playing host to the University of Maryland. The Terps, by far the most polished team to perform in War Memorial Hall, took the measure of "Gummy" Proctor and company by a 57-49 score. Washington and Lee followed on the schedule, and the Generals from Lexington won, 53 to 46. Two nights later Tech lost a hard-fought tussle to the University of Virginia, and then came back to defeat Hampden-Sydney College by a 60-50 score. The Gobblers dropped the next two games to the University of Richmond and The College of William and Mary. Still in the depths of its losing streak, the team went on the road to North Carolina during the following week. This trip saw the Gobblers lose to Duke University and to the White Phantoms of North Carolina. Upon returning home Coach Proctor changed his offense, and the Gobblers managed to shake their slump

long enough to win three games — the last wins of the season. All remaining tilts on the schedule were played on opponents' courts, and Tech did not manage to score a victory.

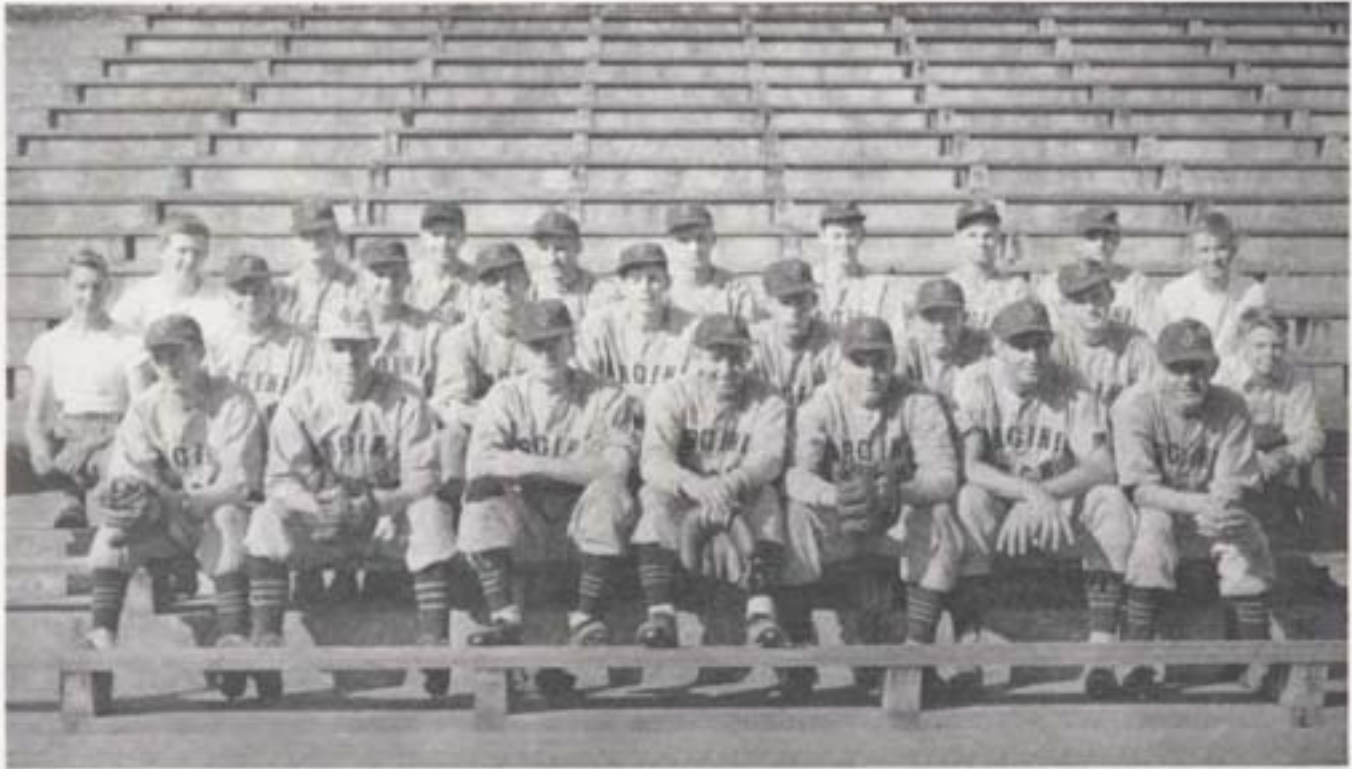
As a whole the season was a fairly successful one. The Gobblers won thirteen of twenty-six games and scored an average of 50.7 points per game. Joe Ruddell was high scorer for the season with 232 points in twenty-five games. Bob Dickson was next in the



standings with 203 points in twenty-four games, followed by Jack Chambers with 199 points in twenty-two games. As the season progressed, Coach "Gummy" Proctor consistently juggled his starting five in an effort to find a winning combination. Joe Ruddell, Bob Dickson, Jack Chambers, Crennie Reed, Charlie Harris, and Hank Caravati saw equal amounts of action, with Jim Ashburner, Tom Phillips, Perry Frye, and Jim Pruitt coming in to give the boys a rest.

Ruddell, Caravati, and Phillips will be lost to the team through graduation, but with a number of promising men coming up from the Junior Varsity, hopes are high for a great season next year.





Baseball, 1946

The 1946 baseball team experienced little better than a fair season, winning only eight of its nineteen game schedule. The Gobblers seemed to do much better at home than on the road and picked up six of their wins in Miles Stadium.

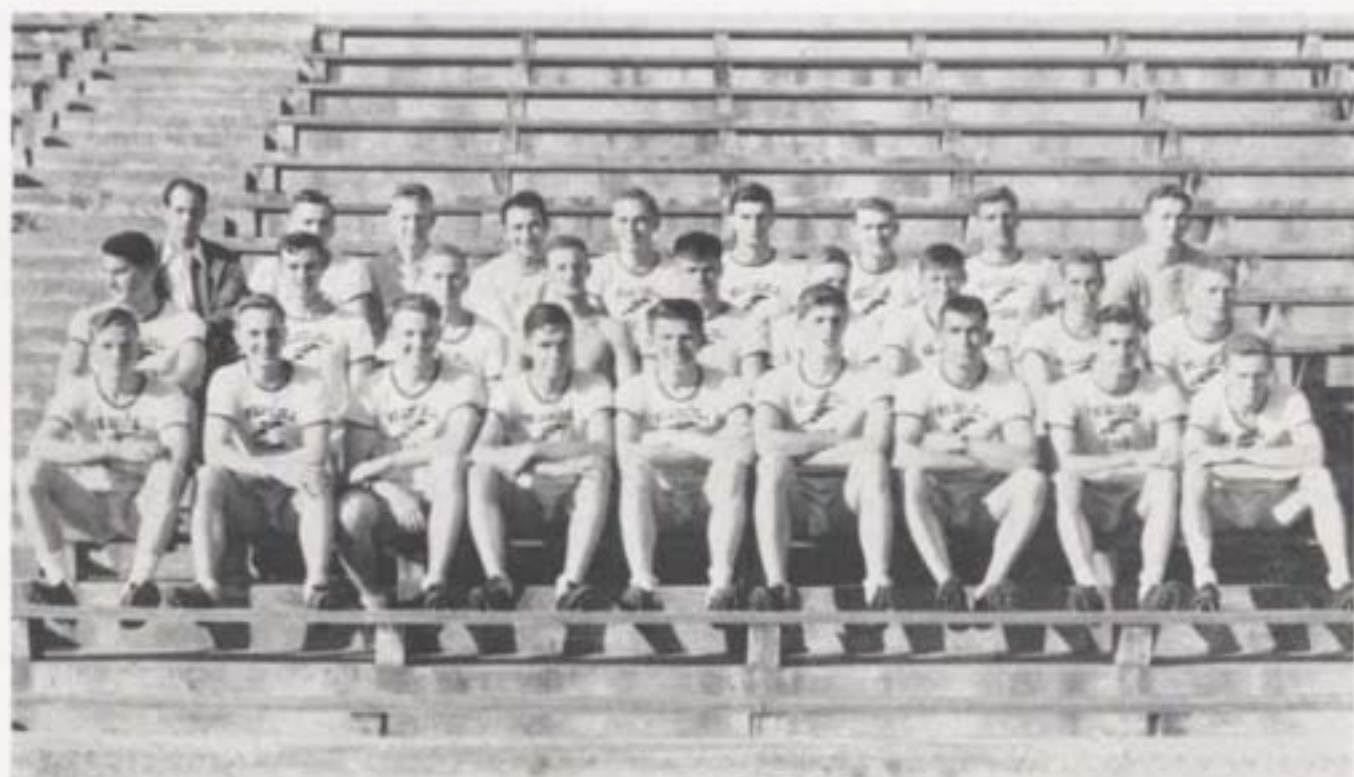

Under the wise direction of Coach Rollins, Tech's thinclads made a successful return to the oval in 1946 by defeating a strong Davidson team in the season's opener at Miles Stadium. Rifle Team

The Rifle Team, captained by M. C. Hobson and coached by Captain Tyler, Sgt. Birdwell, and Sgt. Watkins, experienced a very successful season. The team fired a large number of postal matches, averaging between 70 and 80 percent wins over such teams as Clemson, Idaho, Pittsburgh, Gettysburg, and Johns Hopkins.

The team is looking forward to a better season next year as the entire squad, which includes Scales, Hobson, Rawls, Wood, Field, Harrison, Harvey, Wright, Mattox, Montague, Bush, Watts, Nettles, and Miles, is expected back. Paced by J. B. Scales, this season's highest scorer, they will accept all challengers.



Athletic Council

The Athletic Council serves in the capacity of a board of directors for the Athletic Association. The Council formulates the policies and plans of the Association and sees that they are carried out. The group is composed of the President of the Association, who is a member of the senior class; the Vice-President, who is a member of the junior class; a third student representative, who is a member of the sophomore class; four members of the faculty; one member at large from the General Alumni Association; and the Director of Athletics, who is chairman by right of office.

The Athletic Association was organized September 26, 1891, at a meeting of the Corps of Cadets. It is a self-governing, formally-organized

body of regularly matriculated male students of the college. The purpose of the association is to foster, maintain, promote, manage, and conduct all forms of intercollegiate athletics at Virginia Tech and assist insofar as is possible with the intramural and physical education program. Members elect the officers of the Association and vote on other questions involving the association.

During the regime of the Athletic Association, some of the ever-present problems have been solved, others are continually encountered, yet there is encouraging evidence that the Association has placed its steadily expanding athletic programs upon the soundest basis yet attained. The Athletic Association continues to grow with Virginia Tech.

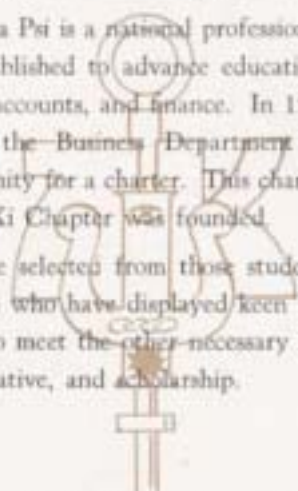

Members are selected from those students of Business Administration who have displayed keen interest in commerce and who meet the other necessary requirements of character, initiative, and scholarship.

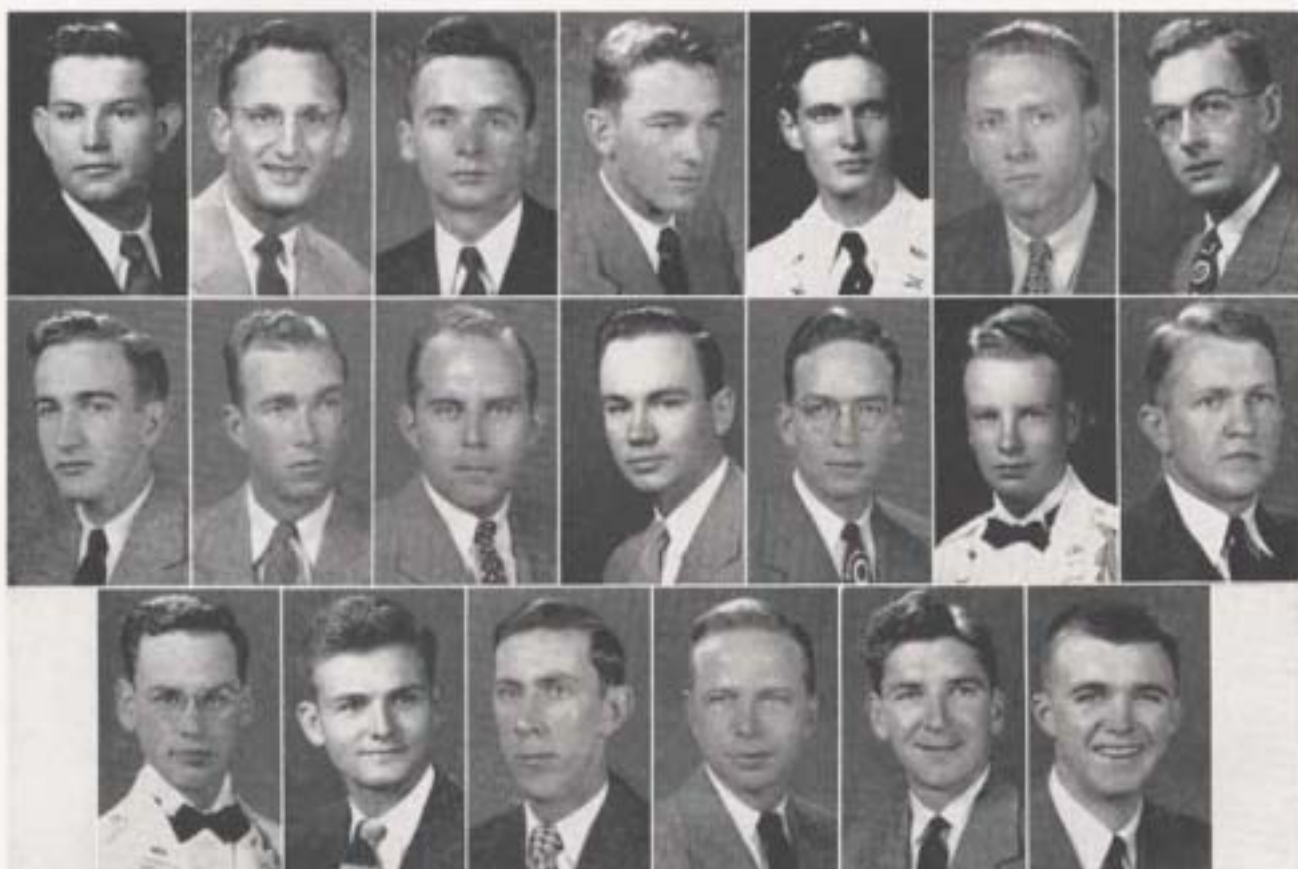

Cave Club

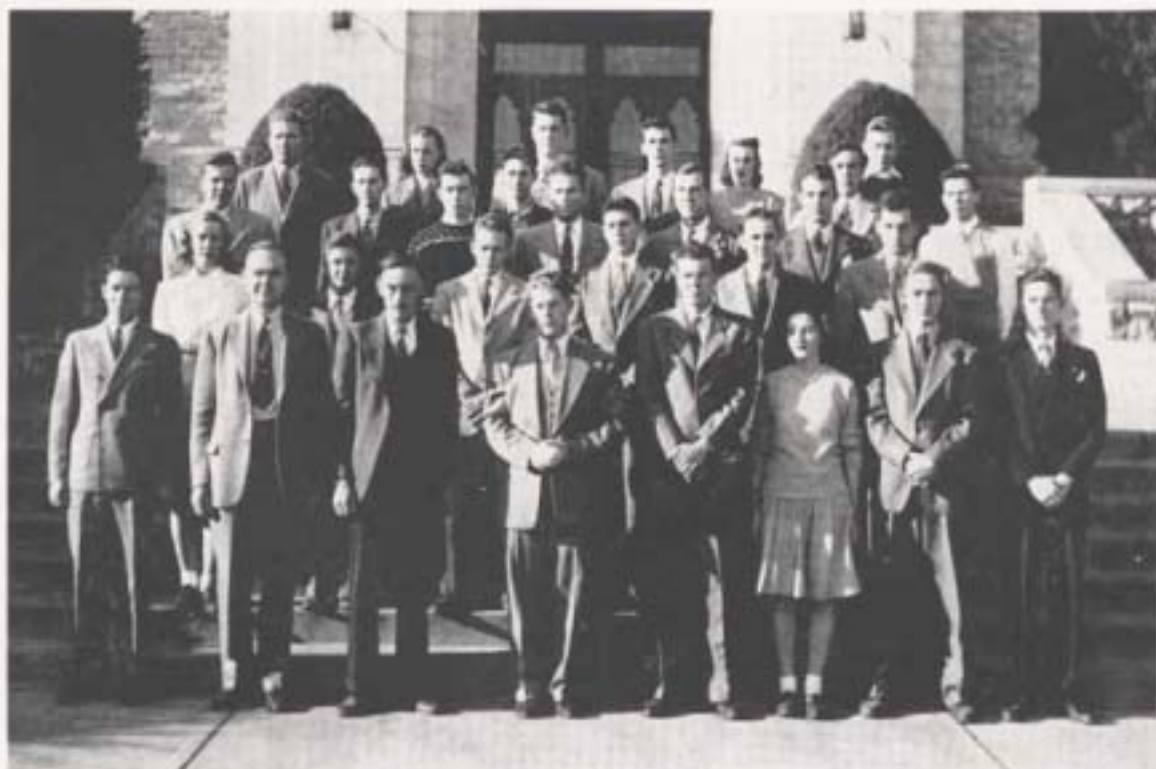

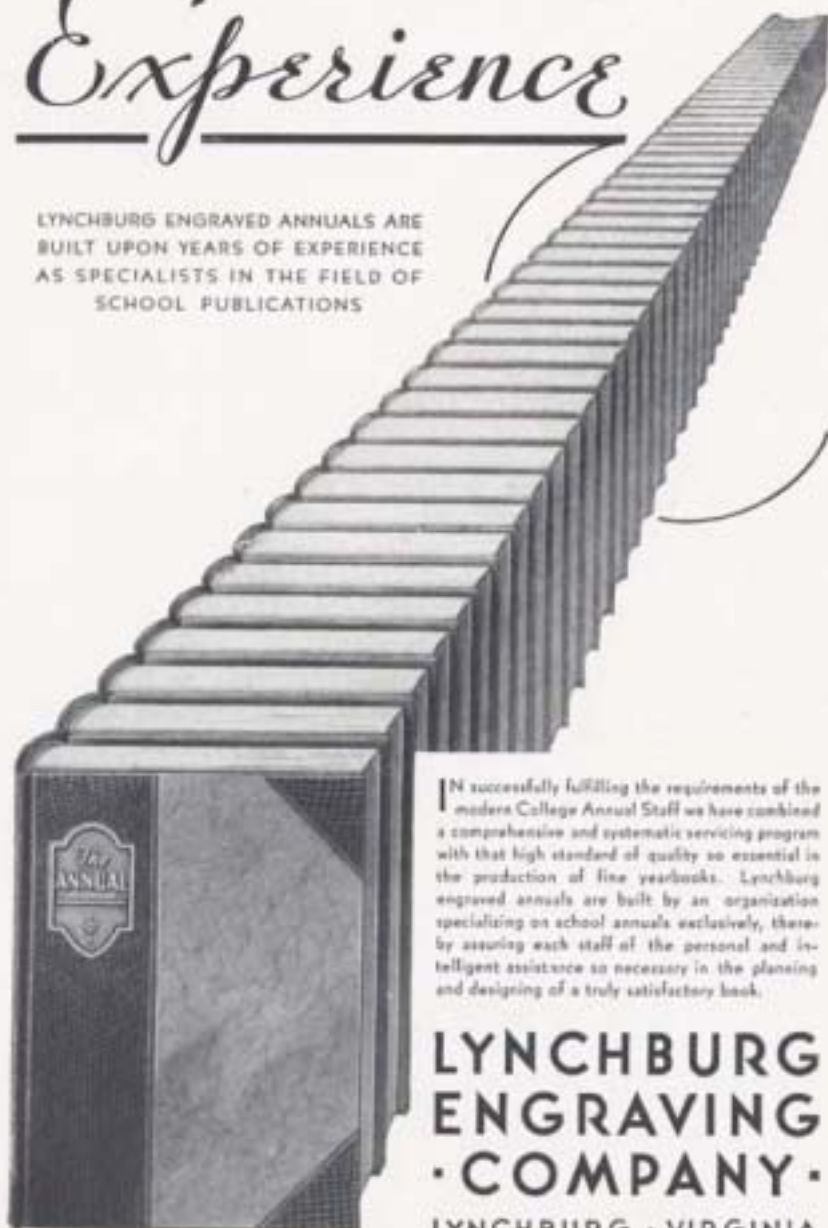
