From the Board of Supervisors...

After months of careful planning and consideration, the Township adopted a new 5-year capital expenditure plan in early 2021. A 5-year plan is meant to be an expenditure guide for future incorporation into budgets. Projects and expenditures can shift from one year to another as demand changes, equipment lasts longer (or shorter) than expected, and roads deteriorate at varying rates. Therefore, we ask that as you review the plan summary below, you take into consideration that, as with all plans, they are subject to change:



Philly Workers Who Stayed Home May Be Due a Wage Tax Refund

Has your home turned into an office during the last year? With the pandemic forcing many people to work from home, thousands in our area are no longer commuting to work. For those who in the past commuted to Philadelphia, there is yet another benefit to working from home beyond saving time, gas, and tolls: a tax refund.

Anyone who works in Philadelphia and lives elsewhere is subject to pay the non-resident Philadelphia Wage Tax, which stands at a hefty 3.5019% of gross wages. Nearly all municipalities in the Philadelphia area levy an Earned Income Tax (EIT), with most topping out at 1%. Residents living in the suburbs are subject to this lower rate EIT where they live- unless they work in Philadelphia. However, with many required to work from their homes during the last year, they may no longer be subject to the Philadelphia Wage Tax while telecommuting.

Is it worth the effort to pursue a refund? The simple answer is yes! Someone working from home in the suburbs during the pandemic making \$60,000 per year would be subject to their home municipality's EIT, which is typically 1%. In the span of one year, this would equal a savings of about \$1,500! Plus, the 1% you contribute to your local EIT will be invested into public safety and infrastructure improvements into the community you and your family lives.

How do you take advantage of this? For any amount of time a Philadelphia job was completed at a home outside of the city limits, they may request a Wage Tax refund from the City of Philadelphia. When submitting a tax return to Keystone Collections, the tax officer for all EIT in Bucks County, use the Out-Of-State Tax Credit Worksheet on Line 12 of the tax return form if you need to receive a tax credit for the time you did not work in Philadelphia.

For anyone who continues working from their home outside of the City of Philadelphia, they should submit a Residency Certification Form to their employer and request that their local EIT be deducted from their wages instead of the City Wage tax. A political subdivision (PSD) code will be needed for the form, which can be found at the PA Department of Community and Economic Development website.

Are your smoke detectors working?

As fire prevention week approaches, everyone is probably aware that most smoke detectors need to have their batteries replaced yearly. And that you can "test" the smoke detectors by pressing the button on the detector. Most people don't know that this procedure only tests if the detector has a power supply and does not test the functionality of the detector. This can only be done by introducing "smoke" to the detector to see if it will sound. If the detector is more than 10 years old, the sensor may be degraded and not work as intended. This is the reason it is now recommended to replace smoke detectors every 10 years.

Warwick Township Code requires an "interconnected smoke detector" in every bedroom, on every level, in the garage and every room in the basement with a door. When any detector senses smoke, every detector sounds, alerting the occupants of the earliest



occurrence of smoke. Detectors are also available with wireless interconnection so setting this up is easy to do. Some even have 10-year batteries built into the detectors to make changing batteries yearly unnecessary. At the end of the battery life, you replace the whole detector which renews the battery and detector at the same time.

This is also a good time to check that your house numbers are clearly visible from the street or on your mailbox so responders can easily find your home in case of an emergency. And having a home escape plan and outdoor meeting place is also a highly recommended. Performing a home fire drill is always a way to see if something needs improvement in your home safety practices. It is better to be prepared before an emergency happens.

Recycling Services

Did you know that most residential recycling services don't accept batteries, shopping bags, or light bulbs?

According to the EPA, about 86,000 tons of alkaline batteries and 3.04 million tons of plastic bags end up in landfills each year. In May 2021, Warwick Township purchased dedicated recycling containers to collect these hard-to-recycle items.

Located toward the rear of the Township Administration Building lobby, residents are invited to deposit their alkaline batteries, clean shopping bags, and incandescent light bulbs into the bins.


Once the containers have been filled, they will be shipped back to Terracycle, a company dedicated to diverting millions of pounds of resources from landfills.

Bin 1:

- Alkaline Batteries
 - No Lithium or Rechargeable Batteries
 - Shopping Bags
 - Must be clean

Bin 2:

- Incandescent Light Bulbs
 - No LED, Fluorescent, or Halogen Bulbs



Know Your Local Wildlife – Small Animals Prepping for Winter

As winter approaches, animals are preparing! You may see wildlife more on the move at this time to gather all the resources they need to survive the winter months.

It is recommended that all openings (vents leading to the outside, holes granting access to the interior, etc.) are secured as mice and other small animals may be searching for a cozy home for the winter. Any potential food source, including bird seed, domestic pet food, garbage, etc. close to the home should be removed/relocated to avoid attracting wildlife to the structure. Animals are often opportunistic in order to survive; it is important to take steps to ensure you are not mistakenly attracting a potential nuisance.



Small animals are an important part of the local ecosystem as they are at the bottom of the food chain. These animals support larger wildlife by being food. Although people often find mice and other small animals unpleasant, they can be less of a nuisance when set up for success.

Central Bucks School Real Estate tax bills were mailed July 1st. If you would like to pay at discount, the due date is August 31st. Between September 1st thru October 31st, please pay middle amount. After October 31st, penalty is due. School installments 8-31, 9-30 and 10-31, are at no discount. Drop box and mail in payments are appreciated. The County Township Real Estate tax bills were mailed March 1st and are now past due. They are due at the penalty amount. Unpaid Taxes as of December 31st will be liened at Bucks County Tax Claim. If you have not received a tax bill, it is important to contact Denise at the Tax office 215-491-0611 or e-mail Warwicktaxbetts@aol.com. Please update the Tax office of any address changes. If you would like to be added to the email list of bills sent and reminders, please send your email with "Reminder List" in the subject line. New homeowners please note there is a 1% earned income tax. You must file a return by April 15th for the previous year with Keystone. This office collects only real estate taxes. FALL PROGRAM REGISTRATION INFORMATION






Goat Yoga at Memorial Park with Namaaaaste Goat Yoga



Warwick Township Police Corporal Sets Out to Break a World Record

In June of 2005, four Navy SEALS participated in Operation Red Wings in Afghanistan. The team was spotted by some goat herders and their location was reported to Taliban forces. The Taliban attacked and the SEALS were in danger. Lt. Michael Murphy, the officer in charge, left his protected location to call headquarters for support. He selflessly put himself in direct line of fire to be in a better position to transmit that call. Due to Lt. Murphy's complete disregard for his own life, the call went through, and a member of his team was able to escape. Murphy was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor in 2007.

The CrossFit community created a workout in Lt. Murphy's honor, called The Murph Challenge. The workout consists of a 1-mile run, 100 pull-ups, 200 push-ups, 300 air squats, and another 1-mile run, all while wearing a 20-pound weighted vest. Participants complete the challenge on Memorial Day and track their completion time. The world record for the Murph Challenge is 34 minutes and 13 seconds.

Corporal Wade Ditommaso, of the Warwick Township Police Department, has been completing the Murph Challenge for 6 years now. He has been training and improving his time over those 6 years. His first recorded time was 42 minutes. After training, he got his time down to almost 37 minutes. "I have always been able to run really fast and do a ton of pull ups," Ditommaso said. Seeing that his time was not that far off the world record, he decided to make it official this year. Ditommaso set out to break the world record.

Along with being a physical challenge, The Murph Challenge encourages participants to give back to the community. Being a husband and father, and having family members in the military, Ditommaso wanted to support an organization that focuses on military families. This is when he discovered the American Widow Project. This organization brings so much support to military widows and their children. Through organizing group trips, therapy, and connecting these women to other women in the same circumstances, American Widow Project has been able to change the lives of so many military families. Instead of just beating a world record, Ditommaso wanted to raise money for these women and their families. He set up a GoFundMe page, and in his first year of fundraising, collecting \$2,125.00 for the American Widow Project.

Ditommaso spent the year training hard, and on Memorial Day 2021, he was ready to break that world record. On that rainy and chilly morning, Ditommaso and his family arrived at the track at Fleetwood Area High School in Berks, PA. Along with the family was an official CrossFit officiant, a video camera, a timer, and a portable pull-up bar. With his 20-pound vest on, Ditommaso began his first mile run. In the pouring rain and colder than normal temperatures, he was making suitable time. On to pull-ups, push-ups, and squats. There was a lot of flexing in the pull-up bar, causing Ditommaso to begin his second mile run later than anticipated. He completed the Murph Challenge with an impressive time of 40 minutes and 37 seconds. While this is not the time he strived for, he does acknowledge that the terrible weather and portable equipment had more of







an impact on his time than he realized. Undeterred, he will continue to train this year, and next Memorial Day will set out again on the Murph Challenge. In his words "I am doing it next year and I'm ABSOLUTELY beating the world record".


