East central Illinois viewers might recognize Shade-Spain from her days at WCIA, where she served as both a news reporter and anchor. Since then Shade-Spain has worked in economic development within her hometown of Danville, Ill. Most recently she is completing her certification in the University of Illinois Extension's Illinois Master Gardener program.

In this new host position, Shade-Spain is able to bring her love for gardening and her broadcast experience together. "She is a charismatic, garden-forward person who will be able to manage conversations between experts and callers with great ease thanks to her broadcast journalism background. She also has a great vision for

the show," said Lisa Bralts, director of content and strategic communications for Illinois Public Media. "I couldn't be more thrilled to have her on board."

Shade-Spain's vision for the program is to show viewers how accessible and easy gardening can be. "I think a lot of people are intimidated or don't feel like they have time, and neither of those things are true. If you've got a dollar for a pack of seeds and a few minutes, you

can do it."

She is also looking forward to taking discussions of urban and backyard farming and gardening to the next level while also keeping the topics and advice within the show's localized lens. "We need more young people growing food and flowers. We need more kids breaking beans and picking apples. I want to help make that happen in our communities via the program," she explained.

Filmed over the course of five years, **Betty** White: First Lady Of Television is a warm look at the life and career of the beloved television and film legend who celebrates 80 years in show business this year-officially the longest career in the history of TV. Lauded for her roles as the bawdy Sue Ann on The Mary Tyler Moore Show, the innocent Rose on The Golden Girls and her more recent role as the worldly Elka on Hot in Cleveland, Betty White is also an industry pioneer. She was the first woman to produce a national TV show, the first woman to star in a sitcom, the first producer to hire a female director, and the first woman to receive an Emmy nomination.

Granted exclusive access to Betty and her team, the producers were able to capture the magic of her performances at various venues, along with more personal moments at home and interacting with close friends. The film is packed with hilarious clips from her long career and comments from friends and co-stars, including Valerie

Bertinelli, Georgia Engel, Tina Fey, Valerie Harper, Jennifer Love Hewitt, Gavin MacLeod, Carl Reiner, Ryan Reynolds, Tom Sullivan, Alex Trebek, and many more

"Betty White has created some of the most memorable characters in television history," said Jerry Liwanag, vice president of Fundraising Programming, PBS. "This new special reveals that she's been a ground-breaking pioneer since her earliest days in the fledgling medium—both in front of and behind the camera. Her talent and creativity are timeless, transcending generations and cementing her legacy with each passing decade. She's truly one of a kind."

"The goal of the film from the beginning was to highlight the universal appeal that is Betty White... to showcase Betty's life in front of and behind the curtain," said codirector Steven J. Boettcher.

The Outback is a new three-part series that explores the people and animals of Australia's Kimberley region in North West Australia, a vast, rugged and remote wilderness bursting with character. As large as California, Kimberley has a population of only about 40,000 people, who live alongside animals that have superbly adapted to the harsh and beautiful extremes of their habitat. Filmed over the course of two distinct seasons, The Outback premieres at 7 pm Wednesdays, August 1, 8, and 15.

From the Outback's red-hot heart, to its spectacular and pristine coastline, a particular breed of people also inhabits this land. **The Outback** is their story—past and present, tough and compassionate.

Great Performances presents *The Vienna Philharmonic Summer Night Concert* at 9 pm Friday, August 17. This annual performance by the philharmonic takes place in the park at Vienna's Schönbrunn Palace as a free event.

This year's program has the theme "An Italian Night" and is exclusively dedicated to selected works from the opera and ballet repertoire of Italian and Russian composers. 



On June 12, Illinois Newsroom had a full house for the first News & Brews community gathering. Coordinated by Senior Engagement Strategist Kristin Walters and held at Riggs Brewery in Urbana, the event featured a discussion on trauma, its effects on children, and how to help children cope.

Niala Boodhoo, host of **The 21st**, led a panel that featured Regina

The kids create a turtle (*above*) and a pig in its pigpen (*right*) using recycled packaging.


