Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.

	A very dainty allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost. Lacking a name only adds to its allure. 10 cm

	Loose, low (5cm) spreading cushions of small obovate silver-green leaves. From Ala Dag, Turkey; Holubec seed.		
A324	Alyssum oxycarpum	Sun	\$ 8
	Mounds of tiny grey green leaves with profusion of yellow blooms in early spring.		
A211	Anaphalis depressa	Sun Part-sun	\$ 10
	Dwarf, mat forming with silvery, downy leaves; white straw flowers in June; from Chola Shan, 4800m in Sichuan.		
A333	Anaphalis nepalensis	Sun	\$ 10
	The Nepal Pearly Everlasting; fuzzy lanceolate, silver-green leaves. Papery white flowers; 20cm tall. Sichuan, 3000m; grown from Pavel Krivka seed.		
A137	Andromeda polifolia Ft. Chimo	Sun	\$ 9
	A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.		
A151	Androsace minor	Sun	\$ 10
	From 4200m Kangding , Sechuan; bright, lime green rosettes, very miniature in size; large white flowers.		
A154	Androsace sarmentosa	Sun Part-sun	\$ 8
	From a wild collection at 3300m, Garwal. Soft cushions of lonate leaves, rose/pink flowers with a dark eye; spreads into larger mats.		
A065	Androsace sempervivoides	Sun Part-sun	\$ 9
	A neat, mat forming species with deep green, succulent leaves. Bright pink flowers on short stems.		
A014	Androsace villosa v. jacquemontii	Part-sun	\$ 10
	Originally from Ota Vlasak, this collection is stoloniferous and mat forming, but slow. Flowers are a vivid red-purple with greenish yellow eyes, quite striking.

	Linc Foster's selection of a tiny garden seedling with dark green leaves and pink flowers.

	Jurasek collection from Litang, Sichuan. Collected at 4300m.

A286	Aquilegia barnebyi (mini form)	Sun	\$ 9
	Miniature form of A. barnebyi - possibly genetic or from exposed conditions. Juicy dark peach sepals with yellow corollas. Alplains collection; Rio Blanco Co. CO, 2576m.		
A311	Aquilegia flabellata var. pumila	Sun Part-sun	\$ 8
	Bells of violet blue and creamy white; compact at 15cm high, "Dwarf Fan Shaped Columbine"; easy to please.		
A299	Aquilegia hybrid Porteous	Sun Part-sun	\$ 9
	Large, fully purple blooms; plant forms a tidy and compact mound at 15-30cm high. From Barrie Porteous' garden.		
A066	Aquilegia jonesii	Sun	\$ 11
	A fabled plant with incredibly blue flowers in late April, set just on the leaves. It likes a gravelly limestone soil with a boost of fertilizer in the spring, which very much encourages it to bloom.

	Tidy, tight cushion of heavily tomentose leaves giving it a soft appearance. Covered in white flowers in spring.		
A021	Arabis ferdinandi-coburgii 'Variegata'	Sun Part-sun	\$ 8
	Waxy leaves with a yellow/green variegation. Useful mat-forming species; white flowers.		
A348	Arabis pumila	Sun Part-sun	\$ 9
A329	Arabis scopoliana	Sun	\$ 9
	Large flowers for an Arabis - 5 to 10cm across. Cushions of short green pointed leaves. Pavelka collection from limestone slopes in Vranica Planina, Herzegovina at 1900m.

A041	Arctostaphylos uva ursi 'Wood's Red'	Sun	\$ 10
	Excellent dwarf form. Mats of dark green leaves. Delicate pink lanterns followed by red fruits.

	Grassy, liner leaves form a tight 5-10cm cushion. Jurasek collection from Gansu at 4200m.		
A108	Arenaria drypidea	Sun Part-sun	\$ 9
	Leaves arranged in a columnar fashion on short stems producing tight, globose cushions; somewhat like an acantholimon- an adaptation to cold dry conditions; white flowers with red spots; from Ercias Dag, Turkey at 2400m.

	Mats of trailing stems with tufts of short needles. White blooms in late spring to early summer. Alplains collection from Albany Co., WY, 3310m.

A228	Arenaria 'Turkish Frost'	Sun Part-sun	\$ 9
	Grown from seed from a Czech collection in Turkey, this is not keyed out, but is so good that it must be listed. Narrow blades of grey/green form a dwarf, soft mound; many white flowers with distinctive purple striping are borne in the heat of summer making a valued addition at this time of year; 6cm.

	A perennial borage with tufts of hairy dark green leaves. Short stems bearing sulphur yellow 5-petalled flowers, each with a distinctive brown dot. A standout for a rocky scree.

	A high collection ~3300m, Utah; small woody crowned shrub with spreading branches of silvery blue/gray foliage; flowers are small yellow discs on 10cm stems.		
A193	Artemisia 'tiny green'	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Unusual mat of green filigreed leaves in tiny marble sized balls.		
A222	Aruncus aethusifolius	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$8
	Native to Japan and Korea; low mounds of finely divided leaves with airy plumes of white flowers over a long period; tolerates dry, shaded sites.		
A079	Asclepias asperula	Sun	\$12
	Leaves are pale green, narrow and twisting; terminal flowers have purple hoods over yellow/green petals. Unusual as the stems lie prostrate; grows on lean, dry calcareous gravel. Alplains collection from Cache Co., UT, 1463m.		
A033	Asclepias tuberosa	Sun	\$10
	Our native milkweed with brilliant orange flowers on July; about 50cm. tall. Grow in sand.		
A052	Aster alpinus	Sun	\$9
	Clumps of green leaves. 5cm violet-blue flowers held on 15cm stems.		
A240	Aster asterioides	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Dwarf, tufted plant of West China and Tibet, ~ 6cm. tall; short sprays of lilac/blue flowers.		
A295	Aster diplostephioides	Sun	\$9
	Large, and extremely thin petalled purple daisy - that's what makes it striking. A taller alpine, at 20-45 cm. Jurasek collection, N. Qinghai, 3600m.		
A173	Aster dumosus 'Heinz Richard'	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Hot magenta blooms from August to September. Only ~20cm tall.		
A313	Aster dumosus 'Wood's' Purple'	Sun	\$9
	Tidy 30cm mound, multitude of purple flowers with yellow centres in late summer to early fall. Disease resistant.		
A207	Aster mongolicus	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	A Josef Halda collection from the 2700m in Altai Mts. bordering the Gobi Desert. Short tufts of gray/green leaves amongst dolomitic rocks; large lavender/blue flowers on short stems, at ~6cm. Suitable for a trough.		
A036	Astilbe simplicifolia 'Willie Buchanan'	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$8
	Very low with sharply toothed leaves; pale pink flowers.		
A043	Astragalus angustifolius	Sun	\$9
	Received from Fred Case, this woody plant makes an excellent mat of silver divided leaves and white pea flowers. Easy to grow, and excellent draped over rocks.		
A314	Asyneuma linifolium	Sun	\$9
	Basal linear-lanceolate leaves spread beneath 10-15cm spikes adorning purple star like flowers. A subtle beauty – a close up look will bring delight! Jurasek collection from Dedegol Dag, Turkey; 2200m.

C228	Calluna vulgaris 'J.H. Hamilton'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Deep pink double flowers late in the summer. Dwarf, dark green heather growing to just 15cm high. Needs to be planted in an acidic bed.		
C264	Calluna vulgaris 'Jana'	Sun	\$8
	Stunning double red, late summer blooms; grows to 40cm high.		
C246	Calluna vulgaris 'John F Letts'	Sun	\$8
	Only 10cm tall mat, with lavender blooms through autumn. Foliage is quite attractive with tonal changes throughout the seasons - from gold in summer to bronzey reds in winter.		
C272	Calluna vulgaris 'Kinlochruel'	Sun	\$8
	Said to be the best double white calluna! Compact bushes of bright green foliage; tips turn bronze in winter. Late summer bloomer; grows to about 30cm high.		
C265	Calluna vulgaris 'Leslie Slinger'	Sun	\$8
	Beautiful spring foliage, with coral pink branch tips! Dense, upright mat, just 20cm in height; mauve flowers in late summer.		
C240	Calluna vulgaris 'Martha Hermann'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Bright green foliage; white flowers with a shade of lilac sprout to 20cm high from late summer to early fall.		
C271	Calluna vulgaris 'Mick Jamieson'	Sun	\$8
	Long spikes of double deep pink flowers in late summer. Dark green leaves; grows to a height of 35cm. Raised by David Wilson.		
C212	Calluna vulgaris 'Peter Sparkes'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Double rose pink flowers on elegant long spikes blow in late summer through the autumn. Vigorous, dark green branching habit to 35cm.		
C213	Calluna vulgaris 'Red Favorite'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Dark green, low spreading and bushy heather (20cm); double dark red flowers. Foliage gets a tinge of bronze in the winter.		
C226	Calluna vulgaris 'Rock Spray'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Another lovely heather from Bunchberry Nursery; deep pink flowers on 20cm stems; woody spread of dark green foliage.		
C268	Calluna vulgaris 'Silver Knight'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Long (40cm) silver wooly stems with soft lavender blooms in late summer.		
C245	Calluna vulgaris 'White Coral'	Sun	\$8
	Double white blooms in late summer; compact form. Bright green foliage all year long; 15-20cm high.		
C214	Calluna vulgaris 'White Lawn'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	This heather only grows sideways. Completely prostrate light green stems with single white flowers. Found near Loch Fryne, Argyll Scotland during the 1930's.		
C090	Caltha leptosepala	Part-sun	\$9
	From the Rockies. Low growing, white flowered marsh marigold for wet areas in your garden.		
C273	Calylophus serrulatus	Sun	\$9
	Orange buds produce cheerful four-petaled yellow blooms all summer; narrow leaves form 30cm mounds. Alplains collection at 2012m; Elbert Co. CO.		
C121	Campanula bellidifolia	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Dense tufts of dentate leaves; short scapes with large blue flowers; to 10cm high; from the Central Caucasus; 2500m.		
C004	Campanula betulifolia	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Tufted Turkish species with prominently toothed leaves. In June, large bell shaped flowers, pink to red in bud, but open to white; spectacular when allowed to splay over rocks; easy to grow.		
C235	Campanula 'Blithe Spirit'	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Delightfully compact with white blooms so fully open they can hardly be called 'bells'. Seedling of C. Maie Blyth raised by Lesley Cox.		
C257	Campanula carpatica var. turbinata	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Mounds of heart shaped leaves and full purple cupped blooms in summer. Grown from Piatek's seed.

	A species from Japan to Kamchatka and over to Aleutian Is. Bright green clumps of leaves on slowly spreading rhizomes; blue, single flowers with white hairs; for a moist scree or trough.		
C097	Campanula coch. 'Elizabeth Oliver'	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Tiny mat former, slender rhizomes with small rounded leaves; in this form the flowers are double and pale blue.		
C122	Campanula fenestrellata	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Similar to c. garganica but more compact; doubly toothed leaves; blue flowers; 10cm.		
C080	Campanula kirpicznikovii	Sun Part-sun	\$10

	A Halda collection from the Siberian Altai; dense cushions of serrate leaves; large upright lavender/blue bells for rich, moist soils.

C009	Campanula linifolia 'Alba'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	White form of this popular species which resembles a larger c. rotundifolia; very beautiful in bloom as the flowers sway in the wind.		
C040	Campanula petrophila	Part-sun	\$10
	Small, tufted campanula with broadly ovate leaves. Blue-purple flowers hold heads straight up and the petals are outstretched wide. From the Caucasus.		
C013	Campanula pulloides	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Low growing mat of dark green leaves; large, upturned purple flowers.		
C120	Campanula saxifraga	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Grows in rock crevices, the cushions of narrow, spatulate leaves, crisply dark green, have wide, bell-shaped, violet flowers with a white eye. At 8cm it is small enough for a trough.		
C239	Campanula thyrsoides	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	An interesting biennial, you have to twist your mind to believe it's a campanula. Spikes are covered in what seems like a million upward facing pale yellow (yes, yellow) flowers. At about 30cm tall it makes quite a statement in group plantings (or reseeding).		
C296	Campanula tridentata	Part-sun	\$10
	M. Pavelka collection.		
C274	Campanula trogerae x choruhensis	Sun	\$10
	Combination of two stunning white campanulas. Holubec seed from intermediate plant in cultivation.		
C297	Campanula turczaninowii		\$10
C091	Carmichaelia nana 'Mt. Harper'	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Collected on Mt. Harper at 1800m by Chris Smart. Flattened stems with vestigial leaves and small decorative pea flowers, white with purple veining. A true dwarf and forms a small hummock under 5cm tall. Excellent miniature broom for the trough or scree.		
C282	Centaurea dichroantha	Sun	\$9
