| New         | Campanula relative from Japan; slender arching branches with narrow, toothed leaves. Blue violet bells in very late in August-September; 15cm.   |              |      |

| New         | Compact 10cm evergreen mound of soft pink blooms. Easy to grow and will gently self seed about. Jurasek collection from Turkey.  |              |      |
| <b>A406</b> | <b>Aethionema glaucinum</b>  | Sun          | \$11 |
| New         | A 5-10cm subshrub with clusters of large pink flowers.   |              |      |
| <b>A092</b> | <b>Aethionema grandiflorum</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$11 |
| New         | Sub shrub growing to 25cm. A lot of pink flowers ~1.5cm; from Turkey.  |              |      |
| <b>A280</b> | <b>Aethionema saxatilis</b>  | Sun          | \$11 |
| New         | Blue-green, thick (almost succulent like) leaves form a low cushion of 10-15cm. Flowers are usually pink, but there is variability with white and mauve as well. Jurasek collection, 1700m Greece.   |              |      |

| New         | Found at 1494m, El Paso Co., Texas. This is a hardy collection with typical dagger like stems and etched patterning.   |              |      |

|             | A hardy Alplains collection from Grant Co., NM at 2073m, where it experiences a good amount of winter cold.  |              |      |
| <b>A382</b> | <b>Allium cupanii ssp. hirtovaginatium</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|             | Tuft of linear leaves, just 5-10cm in height. Large pink flowers, varying from light to dark pink in colour. Choice collection by M. Pavelka; Ulu Dag, Turkey.   |              |      |
| <b>A397</b> | <b>Allium cyathophorum v. farreri</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|             | Strong growing tight clump of grassy leaves from northern China. Late spring nodding clusters; dark pink flowers with very pointed petals; 20cm high.  |              |      |
| <b>A147</b> | <b>Allium flavum v. minus</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|             | Dwarf form from Turkey with umbels of bright yellow flowers; delightfully curled leaves, 12cm.   |              |      |
| <b>A219</b> | <b>Allium forrestii</b>  | Sun          | \$14 |
|             | A diminutive species growing at 4500m on the rocky slopes of Beima Shan, Yunnan; big red/purple flowers on short stems.  |              |      |
| <b>A288</b> | <b>Allium kurtzianum</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|             | Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; J. Jurasek collection.   |              |      |
| <b>A385</b> | <b>Allium Rawu</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|             | Pink flowered allium; from Jurasek seed collected in Rawu, E. Tibet at 4100m.  |              |      |
| <b>A362</b> | <b>Allium senescens ssp. glaucum</b>   | Sun          | \$11 |
|             | The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height. |              |      |

| New         | Clusters of bright yellow flowers on a loose 10cm high mat of grey-green leaves. M. Rejzek collection from the Julian Alps 1920m, Italy.  |              |      |
| <b>A324</b> | <b>Alyssum oxycarpum</b>  | Sun          | \$11 |
| New         | Tiny grey green leaves with profusion of yellow blooms. 20cm high mounds naturalize and brighten garden edges in summer.  |              |      |
| <b>A008</b> | <b>Alyssum propinquum</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
| New         | Condensed mats of gray/green leaves and stems. Mostly spring flowering, they do resume growth and blooming from September onwards, staying evergreen through the winter and often flowering through the snow. Is tolerant of heat and cold; very effective in combination with acantholimon and dianthus. |              |      |
| <b>A392</b> | <b>Alyssum repens ssp. repens</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
| New         | Procumbent stems spread across the ground, ending in striking clusters of large golden flowers. J. Jurasek collection from Romania.   |              |      |

|             | A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.   |              |      |

|             | Spiky, tight cushions of gray/green; large golden flowers on short stems. A wonderful new introduction from Sichuan, China.   |              |      |

|             | From rocky grasslands in NW China and Tibet this version has large rose/red flowers erupting from rounded, villous cushions. A beautiful plant suitable for trough planting; 5cm.   |              |      |

| New         | Clusters of 2-4 pink flowers on small green cushions, shiny, pointed leaves. 2400m; Sar Planina, Macedonia.   |              |      |

| New         | Very choice, silvery green, stoloniferous cushion; stemless lavender flowers; from drier regions of the Himalaya.   |              |      |

| New         | A neat, mat forming species with deep green, succulent leaves. Bright pink flowers on short stems.  |              |      |

|             | Linc Foster's selection of a tiny garden seedling with dark green leaves and pink flowers.  |              |      |
