




TREASURER'S REPORT:

PRODUCT REPORT

by KEITH HUTCHINSON

Not a week passes in my Nursery without at least one report of damage to ferns or indoor plants by the use of Leaf Plus.

When this product is used on tender foliage, particularly closer than 30 cm., the release at very low temperature from the pressure pack freezes the plant tissues, destroying them completely.

I find this product of no value for ferns.
