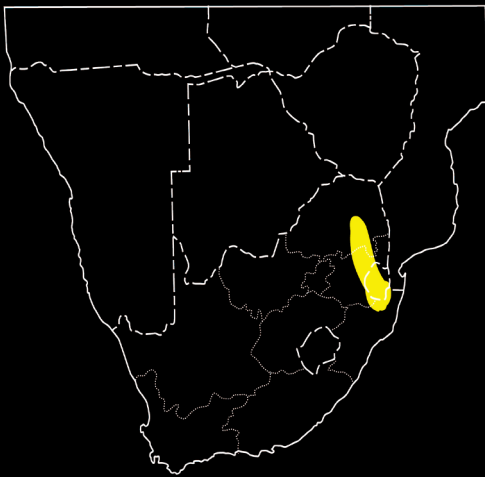




HARMLESS

Swazi Rock Snake (*Inyoka swazicus*)

Maximum Length:
90 cm



Other names:
Swazi House snake; Swazirotsslang

A rock-living snake that inhabits narrow rock crevices in grasslands and savanna. It averages 60 cm but may exceed 90 cm in length. This is a slender-bodied snake with prominent eyes and is active at night.

The Swazi Rock snake is endemic to South Africa, occurring from northern KwaZulu-Natal to central Limpopo. It feeds largely on lizards, especially geckos and skinks. Females lay up to 7 elongate eggs in summer. This snake is harmless and poses no threat to humans
