

In 2021, the AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) continued to grow our programs and our commitment to advancing the health of all dogs and their owners. While the world continues to adjust to the COVID-19 pandemic, canine health research and clinical trial recruitment are rebounding to explore more accurate diagnoses, develop new treatments, and further our understanding of canine disease.

CHF awarded \$3.4 million in 50 canine health research and educational grants in 2021. We increased our commitment to One Health - a concept that recognizes the interconnected health of animals, humans, and our shared environments - with more than 40% of new funding supporting studies with One Health significance. We continued investments in the future of canine health research and veterinary medicine, awarding three new Clinician-Scientist Fellowships and supporting two new residents through the American Kennel Club/AKC Canine Health Foundation/Theriogenology Foundation Small Animal Theriogenology Residency Program in 2021.

In addition to again receiving a Platinum Seal of Transparency from GuideStar in 2021, CHF also earned its fourth consecutive highest 4-star rating from Charity Navigator, America's premier independent charity evaluator, Only 21% of evaluated charities have received at least four consecutive 4-star evaluations, setting CHF apart from our peers and demonstrating our trustworthiness to the dog loving public.

Thanks to the strength of CHF's programs growth, our fiscal accountability, and unwavering support from donors like you, CHF is poised to launch an aggressive plan for expansion and growth in 2022. We are grateful that the American Kennel Club recognizes the value of our mission and has provided an additional \$1 million gift in support of our enterprising efforts.

As we highlight CHF's annual achievements in this Annual Report, we sincerely thank each of you for supporting our pursuit to prevent, treat and cure canine disease for all dogs.

Our Partners



In 1995, the American Kennel Club (AKC) founded CHF to advance canine health research. The AKC's cumulative investment of over \$32 million in financial and in-kind support helps to further the mission of CHF. The AKC partners with CHF to support the AKC/AKCCHF/TF Small Animal Theriogenology Residency Program. The AKC is a champion for dogs and canine health as demonstrated by their additional \$1 million gift to support cuttingedge canine health research and outreach to dog owners and veterinary professionals through CHF in 2022.

Research Initiatives

Research initiatives in epilepsy, hemangiosarcoma, and tick-borne disease allow CHF to focus fundraising and research efforts on these devastating diseases that affect all dogs. Research proposals are requested and reviewed by CHF annually to ensure ongoing progress in these fields of study. 2021 funding included four new epilepsy grants, three new hemangiosarcoma grants, and four new grants to study tick-borne diseases.



Our Impact

Publication Highlights from CHF-Supported Projects

Through peer-reviewed publications, CHF-funded research outcomes are broadly shared with donors, researchers, veterinarians, breeders, and the dog-loving public to bring about better treatments, more accurate diagnoses, and an improved understanding of the mechanisms that cause disease. In 2021, CHF-supported investigators published 47 new peer-reviewed publications in high impact scientific and veterinary journals, contributing to the more than 900 CHF peer-reviewed publications and over 34,000 citations to date, significantly adding to the body of work helping dogs every day.

2021 Conference

The AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) held its first ever *virtual* National Parent Club Canine Health Conference in August 2021. The new format allowed CHF-funded investigators to present their latest findings to a larger and more diverse audience of dog club representatives, researchers, veterinarians, students, and more. The biennial event, sponsored by Purina and supported by the AKC, included a focus on One Health - a concept recognizing that the health of people is closely connected to the health of animals and our shared environment. Lectures included a One Health approach to atopic dermatitis and environmental cancer risk in dogs and people, as well as recent outcomes for neurologic and cardiac conditions in dogs.

During the conference, Dr. Cindy Otto was presented with the 2021 Asa Mays, DVM Excellence in Canine Health Research Award. Named for Dr. Asa Mays. a member of CHF's first Board of Directors in 1995, the award is a biennial honor presented to a research investigator who demonstrates meritorious achievements in furthering the mission of identifying, characterizing, and treating canine disease and ailments. The cornerstone of Dr. Otto's CHFfunded research has been the 9/11 Medical Surveillance Study. To date, the work has produced 11 peer-reviewed publications describing the short and long-term effects of search and rescue team deployment on toxicology studies, behavior, mortality, the dog-handler relationship, and more. Findings will help us protect not only the health and safety of search and rescue dogs, but provide valuable translational information benefitting the health of human handlers and first responders.

Thank you to Dr. Otto, her research team, and all the 9/11 search and rescue dog teams for their valuable contributions.





The Theriogenology Residency Program is a collaboration between the American Kennel Club, the AKC Canine Health Foundation, and the Theriogenology Foundation to increase the number of trained practitioners in companion animal theriogenology and clinical genetics.

Theriogenology is the branch of veterinary medicine concerned with reproduction, including the physiology and pathology of male and female reproductive systems, and the clinical practice of veterinary obstetrics, gynecology, and andrology. Each two- to three-year residency program provides specialty training in all aspects of companion animal reproductive medicine and surgery, clinical genetics, as well as clinical practice related to male and female reproduction, obstetrics and neonatology.
