• Colorectal cancer screenings save lives

Colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer diagnosed in both men and women in the United States according to the American Cancer Society. It is estimated that 104,270 new cases of colon cancer and 45,230 new cases of rectal cancer will be diagnosed this year in the U.S. The earlier colorectal cancer is found, the better your chances for successful treatment and recovery.

If you're an adult 45 or older, here's what's covered by your health plan:

- One colonoscopy every 10 years (members age 40-49 are encouraged to have a screening, and it's covered, if there's a family history of colorectal cancer)
- One flexible sigmoidoscopy every five years
- One fecal test in your doctor's office per year
