With a lead gift of \$10,000,000 from Fresenius Medical Care, the foundation established the Ben J. Lipps Research Fellowship Program. The Program funds 10 new and 10 continuing fellowships annually, and recipients receive \$100,000 over two years to conduct original, meritorious research projects.
