Introduction

Mark Bankunda is a nature guide trainee at Bird Uganda Safaris

I was blessed with the opportunity to “tag along” on a tour lead by one of the best guides in to country, Crammy Wanyama, as part of my training processes and evaluation.

Tour Summary

This tour was set to cover the traditional Uganda birding circuit, which starts and ends at Entebbe. Considering the habitats covered and the biomes encompassed, this is by far one of the best birding circuits in the region, indeed, the world! We did very well scoring 520 bird species, of which 504 were seen and 16 heard only, 51 mammals including two great apes and 10 Reptiles and 3 Amphibians. The weather was generally great except for one day that we birded Mabamba in pursuit for the Shoebill. The scenery never disappointed and the people were welcoming at all points. A fantastic trip in brief.

June 12th 2019 Day 1

After the arrival of the last client, we had a short afternoon excursion to The Botanical Gardens in Entebbe from 3:50pm for about 2 hours. This gave us wonderful sightings of a variety of birds like the African Gray Parrot, Orange Weaver among others and also sightings of our first primates, Vervet Monkey and the only Red tailed Monkey in the area.

We then drove back to the airport View Hotel which was the accommodation facility for the clients that day.

June 13th, Day 2

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Early morning departure from the lodge headed for the Mabamba Wetlands in Mpigi, one of the places in the country with high chances for the Shoebill sighting. **Mabamba Bay Wetland** is one of the vast swamps found in Lake Victoria. It is located close to Entebbe town (40km) and Kampala city in a small village in Kasanje. The boat cruise started at 9 am and was to last about 3 hours. We might have been the luckiest group that day as we were able to see the shoebill within a few minutes into the boat cruise did see the Shoebill, the clients had good views and some were able to take some really nice photographs. Since the “main attraction for the day came in quite early, it gave us a chance to look for a variety of other birds such as the Weyn’s weaver, Lesser Jacana, Purple Heron, Papyrus Gonolek, Great Egret and lots more.

From the boat cruise we continued our drive to Lake Mburo National Park in Mbarara. The park **covers only 370km²** yet it has 5 lakes within. It’s situated between the towns of Masaka and Mbarara taking you about 4 hours to get there. Along the drive we had plenty of bird sightings like the Long Crested Eagle, Speckled Pigeons as we were driving through the towns, Pied Crow, and Wahlberg’s Eagle

We arrived at the Mantana Tented Camp, which is one of the lodges located within the park boundaries.

June 14th, Day 3

We had an early morning boat cruise on Lake Mburo and gave us wonderful sightings of the African Finfoot, Red Headed Weaver, African Fish Eagle, Black Crake, African Jacana and lots more.

After the boat cruise, we had a game drive on the way out of the park and this provided us with sightings of the Impala, Zebras as well as a couple of Buffaloes and also birds like the Bare-Faces Go-Away-Bird, Levillant’s Cuckoo, White-backed Vulture, Bateleur and plenty more as we drove towards Bwindi Impenetrable National Park.

We stayed at the Gorilla Mist Camp

June 15th, Day 4

The plan was the Gorilla tracking for the clients, but since a few opted out due to the severity of the terrain within the forest, we opted to do some birding along the community trail which provided sightings of the Regal sunbird, Chubb’s Cisticola, Yellow Streaked Greenbul, Yellow

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Whiskered Greenbul, Strip-breasted Tit and lots more. Later in the Afternoon after the clients had an arrest after the successful tracking experience, we did some more birding along the Ruhija Community Trail just before we left to do some roadside birding in the late evening and this enabled us to see the Doherty's Bushshrike, Willard's Sooty Boubou, Black-tailed Oriole then later on we had wonderful views of the Rwenzori Nightjar in the same night.

June 16th, Day 5

Today we embarked into the Bwindi impenetrable forest using the Amufa Trail, a substitute for the Mubwindi Swamp Trail due the difficulty level of the terrain, in search for the forest birds and we were lucky enough to find the Equatorial Akalat, Mountain Illadopsis, Crowned Eagle, White-headed wood-hoopoe, Red-faced Woodland Warbler, and prefect views of the breeding

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Grauer's Broadbill also known as the African Green Broadbill. We had bush lunch at the spot then later started our journey back where we saw the Lagden's Bushshrike, Grauer's Swamp Warbler and plenty more.

June 17th, Day 6

Today was basically a driving scheduled day with a few particular birding spots we had planned to hit for some birds. We were lucky to find the Handsome Francolin as we were driving out of Ruhija on our way to Buhoma, which on the other side of the Forest. We managed to do some birding along the Ruhija Main Road where found birds like the Yellow-rumped Tinkerbird, African Blue Flycatcher Cinnamon chested Bee-eater, through The "Neck" where we found the Cassin's Flycatcher on River Munyagwa, Black Bee-eater, African Black Duck among others and

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at the lodge where we had the resident birds such as the Rock Martins, Slender-billed Greenbul, Brown-throated Wattle-eye among lots more.

We stayed at the Buhoma Community Haven Lodge

June 18th, Day 7

The plan was to spend another whole day in the forest so as to maximize the bird sighting opportunities. We did our excursion along the Buhoma Main Trail headed towards the Waterfalls but we started from the park gate so as to capture some of the Secondary Forest bird species located in that area like the Tambourine Dove, Grey-winged Robin-chat, Blue-shouldered Robin-chat, Red-capped Robin-chat, Brown-capped weavers among others. As we moved further on the trail and into the forest, we had sightings of Mountain Wagtail, Ayre's

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Hawk Eagle, Elliot's Woodpecker, Tullberg's Woodpecker (Fine-banned), African Broadbill (displaying beautifully), Chestnut Wattle-eye among others. Later returned to the lodge in the evening.

June 19th, Day 8

Early morning birding around the Secondary forest at the Headquarters of the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest in Buhoma before our drive to the Savannah of Queen Elizabeth National Park. The park includes the [Maramagambo Forest](#) and borders the Kigezi Game Reserve, the [Kyambura Game Reserve](#), and the [Kibale National Park](#) hence a variety of bird species.

Our drive provided us with sightings of birds like Spot-flanked Barbet, White-headed Barbet, African Gray Woodpecker, Marsh Tchagra, Wing-snapping Cisticola, Croaking Cisticola and lots more. We drove

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through Kihhi and the Southern Section of Queen Elizabeth National Park also referred to as the Ishasha sector.

We stayed at the Enganzi Lodge.

June 20th, Day 9

In morning we drove through the park where we had views of the Uganda Kob, Defassa Waterbuck and other wildlife and then to Kasenyi Salt Lake in a bid to look for the flamingos but it was no avail but we did get sightings of a couple of other birds like the African Crake, Small Buttonquail, Temminck's Courser, Collard Pratincole among others along the way. We had Lunch at the Tembo Restaurant in the Mweya Peninsula and we were graced with the presence of up close Warthogs and Marabou stocks as well as a variety of Weavers around our table.

In the afternoon we had a scheduled boat cruise on the Kazinga channel and it was fruitful as we managed to get sightings of the African Skimmer, Pied Kingfisher, Marsh Sandpiper, Kittlitz's

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Plover, and Three Banded Plover among other shorebirds like the Yellow-billed Stock, African Spoonbill and the like.

June 21th, Day 10

We did some morning birding around the vicinity of the lodge and we found the Western Citril, White-browed Robin-chat, Yellow-fronted Canary and lots of Village and Black-headed Weavers. We then proceeded to drive through Kasese as we headed to Fort Portal commonly known as Kabarole, where we would find the Kibale Forest National Park that is famous for a high success rate as regards the Chimpanzee tracking as well as the sighting of the Green-breasted Pitta.

On arrival at our accommodation, Chimpanzee Forest Guest House, we had sightings of a variety of sunbirds like the Scarlet-chested Sunbird, Copper Sunbird, Olive-bellied Sunbird and even a Palm-nut Vulture. After the check in we headed to the Bigodi Wetland Boardwalk which gave us a new list of birds like the Yellow-billed Barbet, White-spotted Flufftail, and Great Blue Turacco and added to our primate list with the Uganda Red Colobus, Mantled Guereza and Uganda Mangabey. We also happen to have the Forest Elephant crossing the road back into the forest as we drove back to the Guesthouse.

June 22th, Day 11

Early morning birding in the Kibale Forest in a bid to find the Pitta displaying. It took about 3 hours before we sighted it but it was well worth the wait. We also got to see the Scaly-breasted Illadopsis as we returned to the Ranger Station so as to start the Chimpanzee tracking experience. Along The drive to the starting point, we found a group of about 4 individuals (chimpanzees) crossing the road so we hoped out of the bus and followed them. The terrain was generally flat so it was not as strenuous as the trails in Bwindi was it involved a lot of underlying vines to get to the Chimpanzees but we did see them and get some good views. There was a split in the group since some members did not partake in the Chimpanzee tracking so they did some birding with the Tour Leader around the Ngogo Road and hey managed to see Crowned Hornbill, Lesser Honeyguide and others

Later in the afternoon we hit the Kibale Main road and did some forest edge birding that gave us sights of the Afep Pigeon, Yellow-crowned Woodpecker, Narrow-tailed Starling, Hairy-breasted Barbet, Thick-billed Honeyguide among others.

June 23th, Day 12

We did some birding along the Fort Portal-Kampala road, as we headed towards Hoima. We passed through a section of the Kibale forest where we found the Masked Apalis, Banned Prinia, Red-tailed Bristlebill, Northern Masked Weaver, Northern Brown-throated Weaver among others. We had our lunch at Kagadi and saw a couple of Northern Gray-headed Sparrows and African Blue Flycatchers. We later proceeded to Kikube where we found a pond that was rather fruitful as we managed to see the Gray-headed Oliveback, Brown Babbler, Holub's Golden Weaver, and African Firefinch among others.

We stayed at the Masindi Hotel

June 24th, Day 13

Early morning departure as we headed for the Budongo Forest where we were to spend the rest of the day. Budongo Central Forest Reserve is the largest survival natural forest in Uganda, with a total surface of approximately 825 square km, of which 430 square km is continuous forest. The reserve sits atop the Albertine Rift, part of the Great Rift Valley, and is located within the boundaries of Murchison Falls National Park. Budongo Forest Reserve is a medium altitude, moist, semi-deciduous tropical rainforest. It provided us with beautiful sightings of the Chocolate backed Kingfisher, Dwarf Kingfisher, Ituri Batis, Lemon-bellied Crombec, and Yellow-browed Camaroptera among a variety of many more.

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June 25th, Day 14

We departed from Masindi heading towards Murchison using the Butiaba Escarpment. We had plenty of stop overs during the drive which enabled us to see the Black-billed Wood-dove, Gray-headed Kingfisher, Black Bishop then proceeded to Bulisa town where we found the Little Weaver and the White-rumped Seed-eater. We managed to get the 4 O'clock Ferry crossing which provided us with some Game viewing as we travelled to the lodge and we saw the Kobs, Buffaloes, Lelwel Hartebeests, Oribi, and Giraffe

We stayed at the Pakuba Safari Lodge.

June 26th, Day 15

The day started with a morning game drive to the Pakuba Airfield and the Albert Nile Track where we managed to find a feeding Lion as well as Side striped Jackal with what looked like the tail of dead Kob. The clients had good views of both canivores and tis was just the start of the day as found up to 5 lions taking a nap in a tree. Then later as we drove off we had a Spotted Hyena seen from a distance. Well, the mammals were not the only ones willing to play ball as we also had good views of the White-backed Vulture, Lappet-faced Vulture, Rüppell's Griffon all feeding on the same deacedes Kob. This gave for some upclose photos of the Vultures. We drove back to the lodge for lunch.

In the afternoon we had a boat cruise to the bottom of the Murchison falls which provided the group with beautiful views of the game like the Elephants by the shore as well as a variety of birds like the Osprey, Rock Pratincole, Senegal Thick-knee, Goliath Heron, Purple Heron among others.

June 27th, Day 16

The day started with a boat cruise to the Albert Delta in the morning. This was a longer boat cruise that was sadly brought to a quick end due to the intense rain fall but we had already seen quite the number of bird species including the Shoebill and a couple of Denham's Bustards as we approached the delta.

We had a late evening to Night game drive that blessed us with sighting of the Slender Mongoose, hite-tailed Mongoose, Emin's Gerbil as well as the Grayish Eagle Owl, Barn Owl, Northern White-faced Owl and many more.

June 28th, Day 17

This was a long drive back to Kampala but we did manage to squeeze in some birding that gave us views of the Red-headed Lovebird, Brown-rumped Bunting among others when we stopped to do some birding near the Sambiya River Lodge as we headed out of the park. It was straight driving after that but we managed to see a couple of Marabou stock and varies Rock Pigeons along the way.

Clients stayed at the City Blue Hotel in Kampala.

June 29th, Day 18

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A morning excursion to Mpanga Forest in Mpigi and the Black-and-white –casqued Hornbill was doing an amazing job at constantly calling. We drove back to Entebbe where we had dinner before properly saying our good byes to the clients.
