Hairy nightshade

Solanum sarrachoides Sendtner



Life cycle

Erect, branching summer annual.

Leaves

Seedlings have small, egg-shaped cotyledons with pointed tips. First leaves are hairy with wavy margins and distinct veins; later leaves are prominently hairy and egg- to diamond-shaped with entire to irregularly toothed margins. Foliage often feels sticky.

Stems

Erect and branching, up to 2-foot-tall stems with distinct hairs. Plants often have a

spreading habit, up to 3 feet in diameter.

Flowers and fruit

Flowers are white and star-shaped with five petals fused at the base surrounding five bright yellow anthers. Berries are green and contain small seeds.
