1872 Aaron Montgomery Ward (photo 1) issues his first mailorder catalog. 246-254 Kinzie St, Chicago.

1894 Now located at 111-116 Michigan Ave, Chicago.

1904 Ward now has 3 million customers.

1960 Ward now has a new office at 618 W. Chicago Ave (photo 2).

1985 The last mail-order catalog is issued.

1997 Montgomery Ward files for bankruptcy.

1999 They are now owned by GE Capital.

2000 All remaining stores are closed at the end of the year.

2008 Ward is purchased by Colony Brands, Inc.

The earliest brass instruments marked with the Montgomery Ward name are these Jules DeVere examples. They are probably made in Austria by Bohland and Fuchs.














The 1916 catalog has a new American-made line and an imported line from Austria (B&F).

1962 Catalog – all said to be US made Good Kadit model, Better Thor model, & Best Grenadier.








