
Aulacomnium turgidum

Swollen Thread-moss





Identification The shoots of A. turgidum are up to 10 cm tall. The blunt, concave leaves are 2.5-3 mm long, and appress the stem and overlap each other, giving the shoots of this fairly robust moss a very distinctive, swollen, turgid appearance. The pale yellowgreen colour is similar to that of the much more widespread A. palustre (p. 625). It grows in small tufts or as scattered shoots. Capsules are unknown in the British Isles.

Similar species The large, pale green, turgid shoots are not easily confused with any other species. A. palustre (p. 625) is a similar colour, but its leaves are not concave and the shoots are not turgid.

Habitat A. turgidum grows in short vegetation on heathy ledges on base-rich crags and the tops of mountains, notably with dwarf shrubs and Racomitrium.
