## Catoscopium nigritum

Golf-club Moss





Identification This bright to dark green, or even almost black moss packs its shoots tightly together in firm cushions that are sometimes several centimetres tall. The very small (less than 2 mm long) leaves are narrow and straight. Usually fertile, the small (about 1 mm across), nearly spherical, black capsule on a long (up to 1 cm), red seta looks very like a miniature golf club.

Similar species It would be difficult to confuse this moss with any other, particularly when fertile. The dark, robust, hard cushions and the small, black capsule on a long, red seta are diagnostic. Its two habitats are also distinctive.

Habitat C. nigritum only occurs in open, base-rich, coastal dune slacks and base-rich flushes in the mountains.
