
## Encalypta rhaptocarpa

Ribbed Extinguisher-moss





Identification A pale green moss with broad, more or less parallel-sided, opaque, very matt leaves, abruptly narrowed to a shortly excurrent nerve, which is sometimes elongated into a colourless hair point. Shoots typically grow up to about 2 cm tall, with leaves 3 mm long. The capsules, which are usually present, are longitudinally ribbed, have a peristome, and until maturity are entirely covered by a very large calyptra.

Similar species The very large calyptra over the capsule confirms this as a species of Encalypta. It differs from other species of Encalypta (pp. 556–559) except E. streptocarpa, by the longitudinally ribbed capsules, and from E. streptocarpa (p. 557) by the strongly excurrent nerve.

Habitat Base-rich rock crevices at medium to high altitudes, often associated with other rare and scarce, montane species.
