Thus, for example, almost all the *Cubensis* cultivars, which are the majority, came through as *Insignis* cultivars, which are actually a very small minority.

This information can be useful especially to breeders, which is why we record it, and we of course apologise to everyone who was inconvenienced by the problem we experienced. The error was certainly the cause of no small amount of tearing out of hair here at BGI. Nevertheless, we received no direct complaints that I am aware of, and we sincerely thank the *brugmansia* and *datura* community, within and without BGI, for their understanding and patience.

We manually adjusted every record, which work was done almost entirely by our Vice President, Al Maas, and our Treasurer, Shaun Douglas. I would like to express my great appreciation for their undertaking that substantial task.

We are always very open to having errors in our data pointed out to us, and will look into and correct them promptly (or, if we disagree that something is an error, do our best to explain why!).

## Some notes on hybridising with mutant Colombian *Brugmansia* cultivars — Part 2: Breeding with *B.* 'Taita's Gift'.

In the previous issue [Herald 14(1): 3-5], we discussed breeding with *Brugmansia* 'Culebra', and the gist was that both the characteristics of abnormally narrow leaves and of split corollas are recessive, and apparently linked: crossed with a normal plant 'Culebra' produces normal offspring, and when those offspring are crossed amongst themselves, they produce a proportion of seedlings with narrow leaves *and* split corollas, and a proportion of offspring more or less normal in both respects. Other mutant Colombian cultivars, which have modified leaves but normal corollas, seem to tell a quite different story.

Besides *Brugmansia* 'Culebra', Bristol also recognised and named a number of other Sibundoy cultivars with modified leaves but normal, always white, flowers apparently conforming to *Brugmansia x candida*. They include 'Amarón', a robust tree with irregularly ruffled leaves; 'Munchira' with the most extremely reduced, irregularly shaped leaves, and which is possibly now extinct in the Valley; 'Quinde' with very irregularly chewed-looking leaves often reduced in places to just the mid vein; it is common and exists as several clones with slightly but distinctly different flower form; and 'Salamán' a rare cultivar which tends to have more normal leaves but often with the blade much distorted in the tipward half. A cultivar with leaves like 'Quinde' but yellow flowers strongly resembling *Brugmansia aurea* has since been found further away, near Popayán in the Department of Cauca (Hay et al. 2012: 78, figs 1.56 & 1.57); it has recently been named 'Quinde Dorado' (BGI Herald 9 (3) 2013). 'Quinde' had been introduced into cultivation in Europe twenty or thirty years ago but does not seem to have persisted.

In 2012, A.H. was generously given seeds from a plant of *Brugmansia* 'Quinde' [see front cover of Herald 12 (2) 2016] by Taita Juan Matumbajoy, a leading Kamëntsá traditional healer in the Sibundoy Valley, and some plants, all white-flowered, were raised from them in Colombia and a few in Australia. Nearly all had distinctly modified leaves but to varying degrees, one or two indistinguishable from 'Quinde' others towards the form of 'Amarón' which is an abundant plant in Taita Juan's garden and which was the presumed pollen parent of the seed. Many represented a range of intermediate forms. The most free-flowering one raised in Australia, which had leaves approaching but not quite as much modified as 'Quinde', was named 'Taita's Gift' (fig. 1). 'Taita's Gift' has since been used by Tura Horder to produce a very pretty single white with slender, irregularly lobed, weeping leaves *B.* 'Weeping Beauty' [BGI Herald 13 (2) 2017].

*Brugmansia* 'Taita's Gift' has also been crossed with three normal-leaved double-flowered

cultivars: pink 'Evelyn' and 'Monika's Meroo Magic', and cream 'Monika's Meroo Tagtraum', in the hope of raising some doubles with interesting leaf form. All three crosses yielded a range of seedlings with modified through to apparently normal leaves, in contrast to the all normal-leaved offspring that result when 'Culebra' is crossed with normal plants, suggesting that leaf modification here is not a recessive trait.

Although all crosses produced some seedlings with modified leaves, the cross with 'Evelyn' not only produced the greatest proportion, but also produced a number of seedlings that were considerably *more* modified than 'Taita's Gift' itself, resembling robust 'Quinde's. By contrast, the cross with 'Monika's Meroo Tagtraum' not only produced the smallest proportion of modified-leaved offspring, but the least modified as well, and has so far only resulted in one new cultivar 'Regalo' [BGI Herald 14 (1) 2018] raised by BGI Vice-President, Al Maas (with a second still under watch in A.H.'s garden). The cross with 'Monika's Meroo Magic' was intermediate in both respects, and produced some very nice ruffled-leaved offspring including double 'Ruffled Feathers' (fig. 3) and 'Romeo's Bustle' [BGI Herald 14 (1) 2018], and single 'Louche Ruche' [BGI Herald 12 (2) 2016], but nothing remotely as modified as 'Quinde'. Why the different normal-leaved parents produced such different results in terms of leaf form modification is a mystery, but perhaps it might have something to do with the normal-leaved parents' leaf size: 'Evelyn' has the smallest of the three, 'Monika's Meroo Tagtraum' is a decidedly large-leaved cultivar, and 'Monika's Meroo Magic' is intermediate.

All the offspring from these crosses were white-flowered, with the double-flowered seedlings from the cross with *Brugmansia* 'Evelyn' mostly of poor quality [only 'Insanity' (fig. 2) was kept, more as an oddity than a thing of beauty!], while those from the crosses with 'Monika's Meroo Magic' and 'Monika's

'Meroo Tagtraum' produced very good quality doubles, but so far combining the highly modified 'Quinde'-type leaves with good quality double flowers has not been achieved.

The next aim was to combine modified leaves with coloured, in particular pink, flowers (a yellow-flowered mutant exists in Colombia around Popayán, *Brugmansia* 'Quinde Dorado'). As the cross *B.* 'Taita's Gift' x 'Evelyn' had produced the most extremely modified seedlings and which were likely to carry genes for pink, one of them (un-named) was pollinated with another un-named single-flowered strong pink seedling from 'Monika's Meroo Tagtraum' x 'Meroo Cascade' (which also had relatively small leaves). Quite a number of strongly modified seedlings resulted, mostly white, but a few of them pink, and one good enough to keep, now 'Rosada Mordida' (see front cover of this issue), which has leaves quite close to 'Quinde' in form, and with a slight bluish-green cast to them. It was a bud-dropper at first, grown in a pot, but now holds its buds well, established in the ground.

Since *Brugmansia* 'Ruffled Feathers' had a pink parent *and* had well-formed double flowers, it was chosen as the parent of a hoped-for pink double with modified leaf form. It was crossed both ways with 'Monika's Meroo Rubin' which has enormous pink flowers. Unfortunately there was rather low germination rate with both crosses, and most were single whites which were discarded. However, one double pink with large, rather oak-like, rich deep green leaves (fig. 4) is being trialled, and has been crossed with other modified forms including 'Rosada Mordida' in the hope that the third generation will be more rewarding!

When Bristol (1969) formally named the Sibundoy cultivars, he included *Brugmansia* 'Munchira', which has leaves so modified they are often little bigger than a finger nail (see Hay et al., 2012: fig. 1.50). This cultivar has not been seen in the Sibundoy Valley for a long time but crossing the most highly modified-leaved seedlings with each other is yielding a few plants which approach 'Munchira' in form.



A curious characteristic of these modified leaved plants, other than *Brugmansia* 'Culebra' and its descendants, is that the modification tends to be much less marked in the warmer months, and much more obvious in winter here in Australia. Indeed those with relatively slightly modified leaves become almost normal-leaved in summer. Even *Brugmansia* 'Quinde', whose leaves become almost like bent wire in winter, becomes broader-leaved (though still very obviously abnormal) in warm months.

It is difficult to know whether it is temperature or day-length or something else that causes this effect. However, by crossing the most extremely modified forms available with each

other, seedlings are emerging which seem to retain modified form year-round.

Therefore, in the interests of nomenclatural stability, we establish them here. It is to be understood that the epithets listed here are preceded by the name of the denomination class, *Brugmansia*.
