

Rhagodia baccata* subsp. *baccata
Commonly: Berry Saltbush
Vascular Plant Family: Chyenopodiaceae

Flowers spring to autumn

Rhagodia baccata subsp. *baccata* is a shrub that will grow to 4m provided it has support from another plant.

The inflorescence is branched, and the flowers are dense.



The flowers are about 1.5mm long, unisexual with male and female flowers on separate plants. The calyx is 5-lobed with bladderly hairs, there are no petals but 5 stamens which are reduced or absent in the female flowers.

The mature stems are red with distinct ribs.

The leaves are shortly stalked up to 40mm long and 6mm wide, upper surface without hairs and lower surface with dry bladderly hairs.



The fruit is a red berry about 3mm in diameter.
