

salt marsh. The Minster locality (V.C. 15) is similar. My specimen was on a fence rail in Minster Marshes near the old sea wall by the River Stour, which is now some distance from the shore. Part of it is now incorporated in the herbarium of the British Museum (Natural History), and part in my own herbarium. The only other lichens growing on this fence were *Buellia punctata* (Hoffm.) Massal., *Lecanora conizaeoides* Nyl. ex Cromb., and *Xanthoria candelaria* (L.) Th. Fr.
