Spring Show Reserve Champion:

Cynorchis compacta, grown by Mark Clements



This plant was Reserve Champion of the Show in 2012, and received a Certificate of Botanical Merit to recognise a plant that is rare in cultivation and to serve as a benchmark for future judging. This is a lovely terrestrial orchid from the Drakensberg Mountains of South Africa. Mark was given this plant over 30 years ago. He grows it in the same conditions as his Australian terrestrials - in an unheated house with a solid roof so he can manage the watering better.

Perpetual Show Trophies

Since our perpetual show trophies are no longer required, the committee has approved the following actions:

- 1. An image of each trophy, along with a list of its winners, will be placed on our society's website to provide a permanent record.

September Orchid of the Night:

Paphiopedilum Houghtoniae, grown by David Judge



Paphiopedilum Houghtoniae was the Champion of the Show in 2012, and received an HCC (Highly Commended Certificate) for its quality. It is a primary hybrid between *Paphiopedilum haynaldianum* and *P*. rothschildianum. It was first registered by Sanders in 1918. The grex has received many awards in the USA, but only one other in Australia, an HCC in 2000. It was its first flowering, yet it carried 3 magnificent flowers. David figures that it'll really hit its stride by the 4th or 5th flowering - I can hardly wait to see it then.

General Meeting Minutes 5th September 2012

Members Present: 25 Visitor: Hendrik Maat

Speaker: Zoe Groeneveld presented a demonstration of the database she has developed to keep track of Karen's orchid collection.

The database is built with Brilliant Database v.9 (which is available online for \$79) and has the ability to edit fields after establishment. Zoe creates a full entry for each plant, including a photo. The fields in this database are:

Date acquired Notes

Number of plants Source

Cost Dates flowered Date re-potted Flowering period Date died Growing conditions Photo & source Country of origin Location in wild Pot/mount/basket?

Rest period?

Querying by any field is very easy and it is possible to generate reports. There is a need to keep track of synonyms. Some of the information in the database is also recorded on the plant label.

This led to general discussion about databases and different fields that might be included. It then moved to ageing and decline in orchids; for example Sophronitis coccinea lives only about ten years and Cattleya hybrids with Sophronitis in them decline fairly quickly while those without Sophronitis are much more long-lived. Several other examples were discussed which had flowered wonderfully but then declined progressively.

Preparing plants for the Show:

Jane Wright presented advice on preparing plants for the show. Owners should bear in mind the needs of both the judges and the public. Remove old yellow leaves and flower spikes. Wipe the leaves with a mixture of milk and water, or oil. Water thoroughly. Remove unsightly hangers. Feed with a teaspoon of Epsom salts to a bucket of water two weeks before the show to make the leaves greener if they are yellowish. Discreetly stake up any flowers that droop. If you have multiple flowers, remove damaged flowers, BUT an inflorescence must have all its flowers in place - or if damaged in transit, remove the damaged flower and place it on the pot with an explanatory note. Make the plants stable (e.g. put the plastic pot in a heavier pot) and bring supports if needed to show the plants as well as possible.

O&A session:

Paul Tyerman led a question and answer session. He invited members to note their queries to bring along each month.

Weeds: Oxalis is very difficult to eliminate. Preemergent weedicides do not work well. Glyphosate used carefully is effective. Onion Weed can be treated by dripping glyphosate into the centre of the crown.

Snails: are emerging from dormancy now. Leave piles of dampened dead weeds to attract snails, then tread on them at night. The best snail bait is iron-based (do not use metaldehyde baits). Coffee grounds (might be obtained from cafes) might control snails and slugs as caffeine is toxic to them.

Things to do in September: Re-pot Pleurothallids (before it gets too hot) and *Cattleyas* (as they are starting to develop new roots). More generally, re-pot when signs of new roots are present as re-potting too early can set the plants back. It is time to start raising humidity and adding shade. Also, de-flask now before it gets too hot. *Botrytis* has been observed in the last week, especially on plants with soft leaves. Moisture droplets (including condensation) can generate infection.

October Orchid of the Night:

Bulbophyllum lobbii, grown by Mark Clements



This species is widely distributed in Asia and Southeast Asia, with many variants. It is related to the Australian species *Bulbophyllum baileyi*. These orchids are pollinated by flies. Mark grows it in on a slab in a hot glasshouse in bright light.

General Meeting Minutes

3 October 2012

Members Present: 29

Visitors: 3 Apologies: 10

Speaker: Jim Brydie delivered an excellent presentation on Restrepias.

These members of the Pleurothallid alliance are from Mexico to northern South America, and provide a fascinating show of diversity. Their natural habitat is wet forests, often in open spots near streams. All Restrepias have narrow flowers ranging from 1.5 to 8 cm long, and come in a great variety of colour and form. Each individual species can be quite variable in colour and size. *Restrepia* plants have stems 5 to 15 cm tall with a leaf at the end of each. One flower arises at a time from the base of the leaf, and many flowers can be produced, each singly on its stem. A full review of the genus by Carl Leur in 1996 identified 48 species, but many plants were intermediate between the individual species. In contrast, the Internet Orchid Species Photo Encyclopedia

(http://www.orchidspecies.com) by Jay Pfahl says the genus has 30 to 40 species.

Jim said Restrepias are easy to grow and to flower. Reducing their water a bit in winter might possibly stimulate the production of numerous flowers, but Jim hasn't yet tested this theory. Most tolerate a temperature range of 0 to 40 C, but prefer a range of 5 to low 30s C. They are very adaptable to different light levels and need constant moisture without being soggy. Their roots are fine and Jim uses a potting mix of 5 parts coarse perlite, 1 part peat, and 1 part styrene foam. He uses European (Lithuanian) peat moss and grows them in shallow pots. Most of Jim's pots are 7.5 cm diameter and 6 cm high, but for specimen plants he uses *Vanda* pots (baskets). Jim suggests applying weak liquid fertiliser every second watering.

Awards: Jane Wright presented framed certificates for champions at the Show to the following members: Rob Rough (Display), Lance Sanders (*Cymbidium*), Jim Wheeler (Best Novice orchid), and Karen Groeneveld (Pleurothallid Alliance)

The show was very successful, with a record 1000 people attending. A Highly Commended Certificate was awarded to David Judge and three certificates of botanical significance were awarded.

Q&A session:

Jane led the question and answer session. The main activity for October is re-potting. Paphiopedilums respond well to frequent re-potting, whereas Cymbidiums should be re-potted every 2 to 3 years. Cymbidiums are heavy feeders and slow-release fertilisers are more convenient than liquid feeding. Some members apply dolomite once a year. The value of occasional application of calcium nitrate was questioned, but not resolved.

Next meeting: Dennis Diehm will talk on Cattleyas. He will also bring a flask of *Phalaenopsis* for a growing competition.
