Women Board Directors of the Fortune 500

Catalyst continues its series of reports on women in corporate leadership with the 1996 Catalyst Census of Women Board Directors of the Fortune 500. This Census and its companion piece, the 1996 Catalyst Census of Women Corporate Officers and Top Earners, offer accurate information on women's representation in the ranks of corporate leadership today.

This year, for the first time, women hold just over 10 percent of board seats, a slight increase over last year. Yet women still hold only 626 of a total of 6,123 board seats; and they make up only .9 percent of inside directors, a marker of the work yet to be done by corporations if they are to benefit from the insight and experience women bring. Catalyst's Corporate Board Placement tracks the ever-growing pool of women with the operational experience needed for board service and continues to serve as the premier resource for helping businesses identify the right women for their boards.

This year Catalyst analyzed the correlation between women on boards and women in management. Those companies with three or more women directors lead the pack with the greatest numbers of women corporate officers in general and of women officers at the highest corporate levels. It is particularly encouraging to note that since 1994 there has been a 21 percent increase in our Blue Ribbon Board of companies with multiple women directors, for as the positive correlations demonstrate, an effort to advance women in one area of a company is reflected throughout the organization.

As in its three previous years of publication, Catalyst's 1996 Census of Women Board Directors of the Fortune 500 will continue to serve as a reminder of progress accomplished and progress yet to be accomplished.



Introductory Note

Catalyst has traced the number of women on the boards of top companies over a period of years and in 1992 began a rigorous annual survey of the *Fortune* 500 companies. Catalyst first published the *Catalyst Census of Women Board Directors of the* Fortune 500 in 1993 to serve as a continuing reminder of where women sit in the governance apex of corporate America.

Methodology

In June, 1996, Catalyst sent a letter to the Corporate Secretary of each of the *Fortune* 500 companies as published in the April 29, 1996, issue of *Fortune*. The letter sought (1) to verify the company's total number of board members and inside board members as of the *Census* cut-off date of March 31, 1996, and (2) to confirm the number and names of any women board members and inside board members. The information sent to companies for verification was derived from the *Census* database created from the 1995 *Census* and updated throughout the year. Companies verified or corrected the information by letter, fax, or telephone. In any instance where a company failed to respond to a series of requests for verification, Catalyst turned to the annual report and proxy statement to obtain accurate information.

Catalyst Corporate Board Placement's extensive database of candidates has accrued as a result of the work of Catalyst's staff throughout American corporations and professional firms. Recommendations come from Catalyst affiliate organizations, corporate executives, current board members, and professional or industry organizations. Some candidates self-nominate. Catalyst Corporate Board Placement continually updates its database through the work of the Catalyst Information Center, the activities of Catalyst staff in their research and advisory work, and professional interviews. Catalyst Corporate Board Placement has had personal contact with all candidates offered on each slate.

1996 Findings: Overview

The 1996 Catalyst Census of Women Board Directors of the Fortune 500 documents that this year, for the first time, women broke the 10 percent barrier of total board seats held on Fortune 500 companies—with 10.2 percent of the seats. In other positive news, for the four years that Catalyst has published the Census, there has been a small but steady increase in the number of women on corporate boards and in the number of boards with women directors.

Catalyst also is encouraged to note a 21 percent increase between 1994 and 1996 in companies with multiple women directors. The Catalyst Blue Ribbon Board now boasts 177 such companies, or 35 percent of *Fortune* 500 boards.

However, the rate of growth in women's presence on *Fortune* 500 boards appears to be slowing. Catalyst reports a declining rate of increase in the number of boards with women directors; that number increased by 9 percent in 1994 and by 7 percent in 1995, but slowed to a 3 percent increase in 1996. Unfortunately, 83 *Fortune* 500 companies continue to lag behind their competitors by having no women on their boards.

In a similar pattern, from 1994 to 1995 the total number of women directors on *Fortune* 500 boards increased by 11 percent, while from 1995 to 1996 the rate of increase declined to 8 percent. The number of board seats held by women—626 out of 6,123 total board seats—shows progress yet to be made.

The three-year trend of increasing numbers of women new to *Fortune* 500 boards continues with 66 new women this year, confirming that the talent pool of qualified women with senior-level operational and managerial experience and other expertise sought for boards is expanding. The Catalyst Corporate Board Placement database of women candidates for corporate boards has grown to over 1,900 highly qualified women currently holding top-level corporate positions in corporations and academic and nonprofit organizations or running their own businesses.

For the first time, Catalyst compared data from this *Census* with that of the recently released 1996 Catalyst Census of Women Corporate Officers and Top Earners in order to understand the relationships that might exist between the prevalence of women board directors and women corporate officers. These tests of statistical significance indicate that there is a positive correlation between the number of women officers and the number of women on a corporation's board. This is especially true for boards with two or more women members. This same trend holds true for the number of women on a board and the number of women at the highest levels of corporate management. These findings indicate the mutually reinforcing effect that the presence of women in leadership roles can bring.

1996 Findings: Companies

More Companies With Women Directors

Eighty-three percent of *Fortune* 500 companies—417 companies—now have one or more women directors (as of the *Census* cut-off date of March 31, 1996), and 83 *Fortune* 500 companies (17 percent) have no women on their boards. (See Table 1.)

Companies With Multiple Women Directors Of the 417 *Fortune* 500 companies with women on their boards, 240 (58 percent, or 48 percent of the *Fortune* 500) have only one. Thirty-five percent (177) of *Fortune* 500 companies now have two or more women directors as compared to 33 percent in 1995 and 29 percent in 1994. (See Table 2.)

This year, 154 companies have two women directors. There are 16 *Fortune* 500 companies with three women on their boards, five companies with four, and two companies with five. (See Table 3.)

¹In 1995, when *Fortune* magazine consolidated the industrial and service companies into one list, Catalyst followed the new listing. Since the companies in the *Fortune* 500 change each year, as does the composition of the boards of directors of the companies remaining, the numbers pertaining to women directors also shift from year to year.

Companies by Revenue

Of the top one hundred companies by revenue, 97 percent have at least one woman on their boards. Dividing *Fortune* 500 companies into quintiles according to revenue, the higher the quintile in which the company is found, the greater the likelihood of the company's having at least one woman director. Companies in the first quintile are more than twice as likely to have multiple women directors as those in the fifth quintile. (See Table 5.)

Companies by Profitability

Seventeen women serve as directors at *Fortune*'s top ten most profitable companies; seven of these companies have two women directors. (See Table 6.)

1996 Findings: Women on Boards

Increase in Board Seats Held by Women

The number of board seats held by women continues to increase this year. As of March 31, 1996 (the *Census* cut-off date), women hold 10.2 percent of the seats on the boards of *Fortune* 500 companies. Of a total of 6,123 board seats, women occupy 626. This is an increase of 26 board seats held by women over 1995. (See Table 7.)

More Women Serving on Boards 1996 saw a net increase of 30 individual women serving on the boards of *Fortune* 500 companies. The total number of individual women on boards is 420, up from 390 in 1995 and from 352 in 1994. This is an increase of 7.7 percent from 1995 and a total increase from 1994 of 19.3 percent.

In 1996, 305, or 72.6 percent of those 420 women, serve on only one board; 15 percent serve on two boards, 6.9 percent serve on three boards, and 5.5 percent serve on four or more boards. (See Table 8.)

New Women on Boards

Inside Directors

Sixty-six women directors serving in 1996 have never before served on the board of a *Fortune* 500 company. Of these, 23 women were on the boards of companies new to the *Fortune* 500 in 1996. Catalyst analyzed the professions and positions of these 66 women and found that 36 percent come from operational and managerial positions in corporations, 20 percent hold leadership positions in academic institutions, 18 percent are entrepreneurs, and 9 percent are leaders of nonprofit organizations. The remainder are in a variety of positions.

In *Fortune* 500 companies, there are 1,216 inside directors.³ Just eleven of these inside directors are women. Thus, women account for less than 1 percent (.9 percent) of inside directors. This number of women inside directors reflects the low number of women in the highest positions in corporations, as enumerated in the *1996 Catalyst Census of Women Corporate Officers and Top Earners*.⁴

Women of Color⁵

Catalyst examined the list of women board members to determine the number of women of color. In 1996, 53, or 12.6 percent of women directors, are women of color. Therefore, women of color hold 1.4 percent of total board seats. One inside director is a woman of color.

1996 Findings: Industry Analysis

The soap/cosmetics industry continues to lead the *Fortune* 500 with the highest percentage of women directors, at 19 percent. Other leading industries include publishing/printing (17 percent); scientific/photo/control (16 percent); savings institutions (15 percent); beverages (14 percent); and pharmaceuticals (14 percent). Industries with 13 percent women directors include diversified financials, telecommunications, and utilities.

Women have low representation on the boards of companies in the following industries: airlines, trucking, and brokerage (7 percent women respectively); wholesalers and computer/data services (6 percent respectively); railroads (5.5 percent); and mail/package/freight delivery (3 percent).

The industries with the greatest percentage of companies with no women on their boards include computers, engineering, food and drug stores, motor vehicles, and wholesalers. (See Table 9.)

1996 Findings: Geographical Analysis Companies in the South for the second year in a row lead the country in adding women to boards. Currently, 142 women sit on the boards of companies in this region, an increase of 11 percent over 1995 and a two-year increase of 28 percent. The Midwest saw an 8.2 percent increase in women board directors since 1995 and a two-year increase of 21 percent. The Northeast continues to have the highest percentage of companies with at least one woman director. (See Table 10.)

1996 Findings: Correlations

Women on Boards and in Top Management Catalyst released its first *Census of Women Corporate Officers and Top Earners* in October, 1996. To understand possible correlations between women on corporate boards and women in top positions within the company, Catalyst analyzed the relationships between the frequency of women as corporate board directors, as corporate officers, and as holders of the top titles in corporate America (chairman, vice chairman, CEO, president, COO, and executive vice president) in *Fortune* 500 companies.


Catalyst found the following statistically significant correlations:⁶

• The more women on a company's board of directors, the more women corporate officers there are at the company. (See Table 11.)

Correlation Between Women Corporate Officers and Women Corporate Directors





•• Indeed, the more women on a company's board of directors, the more women in the company hold the highest-level corporate titles—chairman, vice chairman, CEO, president, COO, and EVP. A dramatic increase is observed for companies with three or more women directors. (See Table 12.)

These tests of statistical significance suggest a synergy within a company between efforts in different areas to increase women's representation in leadership, with increases in one area affecting increases in another area. Thus, companies with three or more women directors are four times more likely to have top women corporate officers than those companies with just one woman director.

The statistically significant relationships between the representation of women in corporate governance and women in corporate management support past Catalyst research findings that women directors can serve as mentors and role models for women corporate officers and that companies mindful of the talent pool of women are tapping that talent for a variety of leadership roles. Concomitantly, as women corporate officers continue to advance, and more women enter the ranks of corporate officers, the feeder pool for women directors expands.
