ORIGINALITY VS. GRIT

The concept of student "grit" and its impact on student success has gained some popularity in recent years. The concept was introduced in 2007 with research by Angela Duckworth. Originally, "grit" was defined as perseverance and passion for long-term goals. While perseverance of effort has continued to show great consistency in predicting student success, the second half of the equation - the passion or consistency of interest has not.

In fact, the concept of "grit" does show great impact for students who also have the time and financial resources to pursue their passions and interests. For students who may have challenges or barriers to success, encouraging them to display "grit" is not effective. When disabilities, financial status, or other factors make things more difficult, it often takes "grit" just to show up and keep trying, but it doesn't necessarily correlate with success. Students today need skills in collaboration, creativity, problem-solving, and critical thinking to be successful.

The type of persistent focus associated with "grit" can actually undermine some of these skills. Sticking with the same course of action rather than stopping and reassessing can put some students in a downward spiral. Self-regulation and self-efficacy can be stronger keys to success.

This is where originality or creativity comes in. The phrase identified by Shannon Audley and Maleka Donaldson in their research is, "When to grit and when to quit." There is something to be said for recognizing when what you are doing isn't working and persevering in doing the same thing is not going to yield better results. While it rhymes nicely, "quit" may be a bit misleading. In reality, it's the ability to recognize something isn't working, stop, and assess why that may be the case. Then, coming up with an original or creative strategy to try and accomplish the task is critical.

Simply stopping and giving up is not going to be effective. But, coming up with a new approach can be a challenge. It's this skill that actually helps all students, regardless of challenges or barriers to success. Some barriers are out of our control and some we create ourselves, but regardless of their source, it's original thinking that will help us succeed.

This could be mean changing something small like the time of day and place where a student studies or completes school work to changing the entire way they approach completing academic tasks.

December Character Trait of the Month: Respectful

At the beginning of December students were taught a school wide lesson on the importance of being respectful. This includes respect for others, for things, and for ourselves. When it comes to respect for ourselves, that includes what we are putting into our minds and bodies. The food we eat, the exercise we get, the way we talk, and the media/entertainment we consume all reflect on how we show respect for ourselves. Often, what we are putting in is a reflection of what comes out so the importance of being mindful of what you are consuming is highlighted.



Elementary School Report Card

Every year the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction publishes "report cards" for every public school in the state of Wisconsin and some private schools that choose to participate. These report cards offer a "grade" for individual schools and districts to see how they are doing. The primary metrics used to create this report are scores from the Wisconsin Forward Exam and "On Track for Graduation Indicators" such as Attendance and 3rd grade literacy. Some schools are graded more heavily on their academic achievement in math and English/Language Arts. Some schools are graded more heavily on their "academic growth" i.e. how students are closing the gap if they are behind or moving up in percentile as compared to their peers. Our score this year, from 2021-2022 data was a 67.6 which "Meets Expectations" and is 2.4 points short of "Exceeds Expectations". Our math achievement scores were 7 points above the state average and our ELA achievement scores were right at the state average. I take these measurements with a grain of salt as the Wisconsin Forward Exam measures one moment in time and at our size, a student have a bad day can significantly impact these scores, however, I also believe that our students and staff have what it takes to consistently exceed expectations. In school, we will continue to evaluate our teaching practices and curriculum to best help our students grow and learn. At home we ask that families continue to make a push for reading, early and often. Finding books that students are interested in and carving out time for reading such as bedtime routines or trips to the library can help promote lifelong literacy and achievement in the classroom. Notes from the Nurse



I get many questions about viruses going around this time of year. Below is a list of common respiratory viruses and some helpful information for each one. I hope you and your family have a healthy & enjoyable holiday season. – Nurse Katie

Virus Type	Symptoms	Treatment	Additional Information
Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)	Fever, cough, irritability, wheezing, decreased appetite Primarily affects the lungs	Home Care - see below Severe cases may require hospitalization, airway suctioning, and oxygen	Premature Infants, children < 2 underlying heart/ lung issues, immunocompromised most affected Lives on surfaces for longer than other viruses
Adenovirus	Has the widest range of symptoms including: sore throat, pink eye, cough, diarrhea, bladder inflammation, fatigue (fevers are rare)	Home Care - see below	Can also be transmitted in feces or water (pools) Those with pre-existing heart or lung problems have an increased risk
Influenza	Affects primarily the respiratory tract - nose/throat/lungs: Non productive cough, severe body aches, chest discomfort, headache, fever Often exacerbates asthma	Home Care - see below Anti-viral medication is most effective if given within 48 hours of symptom onset Severe cases may need IV fluid, supplemental oxygen or mechanical ventilation	Can lead to severe/life threatening complications An annual influenza vaccine reduces your chance of getting the flu and prevents severe complications
Rhinovirus	Sore throat, runny nose, body aches, sneezing, ear infections; exacerbates asthma	Home Care - see below	Many people will have 2-3 rhinovirus infections a year

Home Care: Drink plenty of non-caffeinated fluids, rest, alternate Tylenol and Ibuprofen every 3 hours for fever and pain control, cough drops, patience (viruses are expected to last 7-10 days)

When to seek medical care: The ill person has underlying medical conditions or is immunocompromised,, breathing is labored/skin sucks into the ribs when breathing (retractions); severe chest pain, fever is sustained over 102 despite using Tylenol or Ibuprofen, no urine/wet diapers for > 8 hours
