Notes from the Nurse

February is National Heart Month. Heart disease is one of the most common causes of death in the United States but did you know, that the majority of heart diseases are completely preventable?

Quality sleep plays a huge role in our health and well bring. Not getting enough sleep can increase your risk for chronic heart problems. The recommended amount of sleep based on age is cited below:

Babies 4-12 months: 12-16 (including naps)

Children 1-2 years: 11-14 (including naps)

Children 3-5 years: 10-13 (including naps)

Children 6-12 years: 9-12

Teens 13-18 years: 8-10

Adults 18 years or older: 7-9

Choosing fresh foods (such as fruits and vegetables) over processed foods or those with saturated fats is another key step in preventing heart disease.

Encourage your kids (and lead by example!) to fill your plate with half fruits/vegetables at every meal.

Chronic stress also affects your heart. The world we live in is fast paced and hectic. Try taking just 5 minutes a day to allow yourself to de-stress. Listen to music, meditate or stretch. Your mind - and your heart - will thank you.

COVID Corner

On Thursday January 6 - the Cambria-Friesland School District began offering COVID testing at the school for any students or staff and their immediate household members. Testing has been well utilized. Unfortunately, due to the nation wide shortage of rapid tests, we can only offer PCR testing at this time. We do not know when rapid testing will be come available but when we do, this will be communicated.

Additionally, the School Board approved several changes to our COVID protocols at the Monday January 24 meeting.

- Individuals who test positive for COVID or who have symptoms and do not wish to test will now be required to isolate out of school for 5 days, followed by 5 days of mask wearing while in school and school functions
- Household close contacts now have 2 options to return: After day 5 with no test and masking for 5 additional days at school and at school functions OR after day 5 with a negative test and no mask wearing.

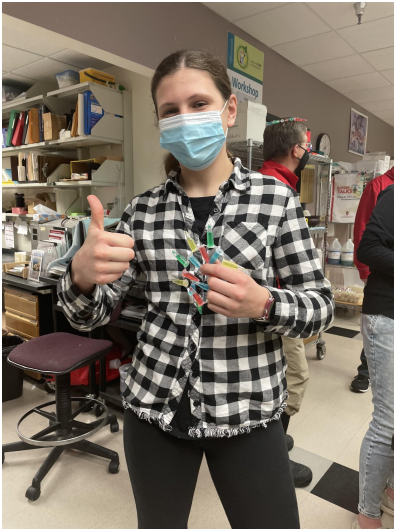

Seventh Grade Students Visit UW-Madison Biotechnology Center



On January 14th, the Cambria-Friesland Seventh Grade Class along with teachers Mr. Link, Ms. Kasperek, and Mrs. Sell traveled to the UW-Madison Biotechnology Center for a day of science-based activities. Throughout the day, students were able to work in the same laboratory spaces that UW-Madison researchers use. The students completed two different experiments involving the extraction of DNA from wheat germ and the simulated analysis of blood using gel electrophoresis. Additionally, they received a full tour of the facility, including its history, the type of research currently being done including COVID-19, and learned about UW-Madison's many Nobel Prize recipients. Cambria-Friesland School District Preschool Screening

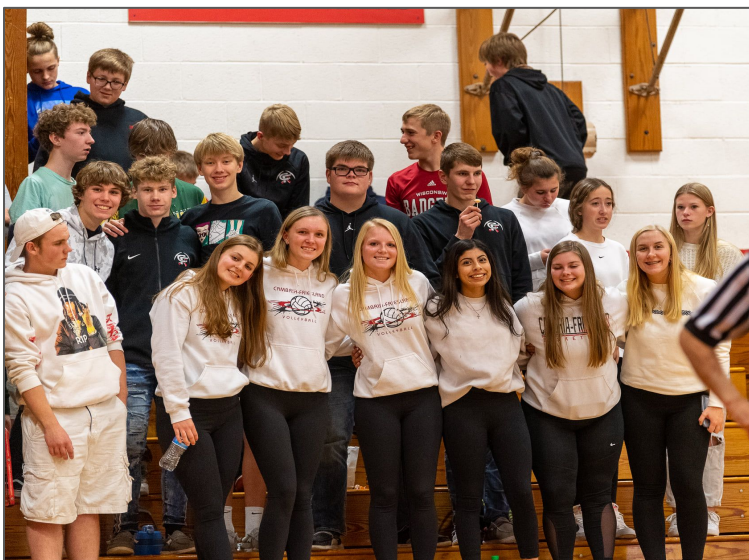

If your child will be three by September 1, 2022, you will receive a letter encouraging you to call and make an appointment. Please take advantage of this opportunity.

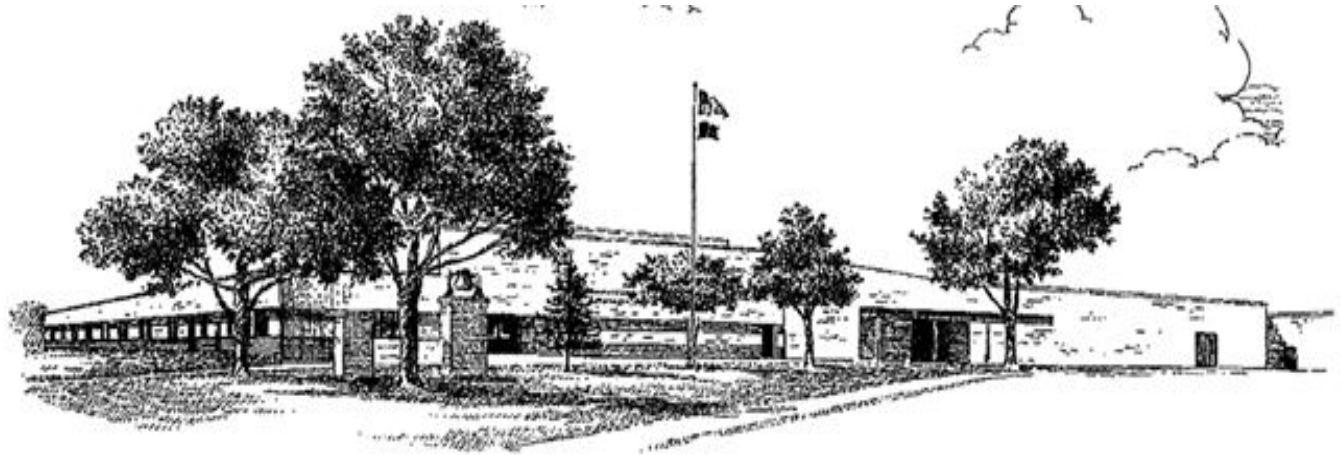

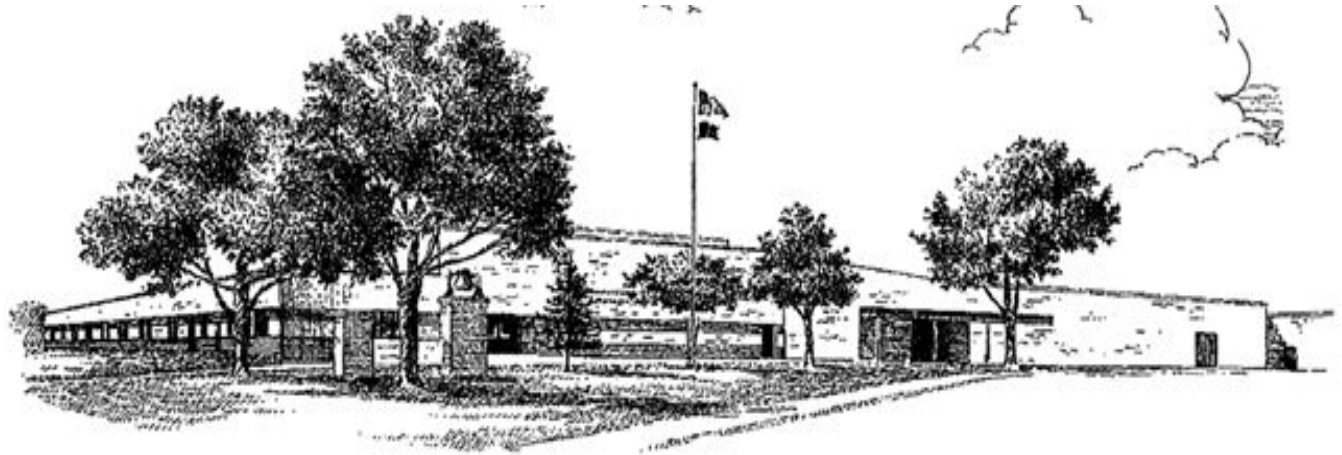
