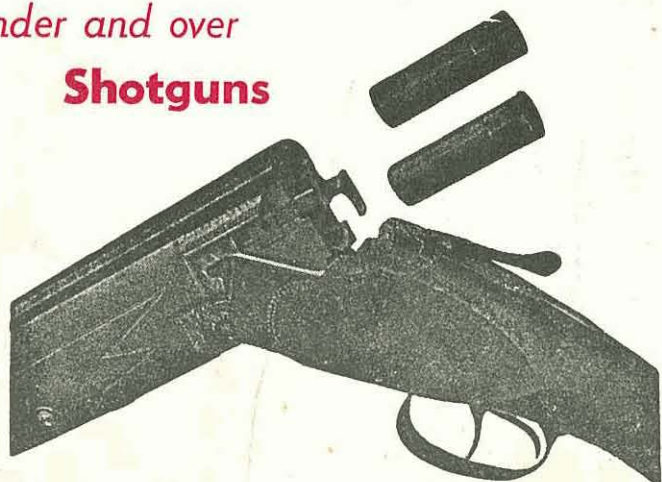

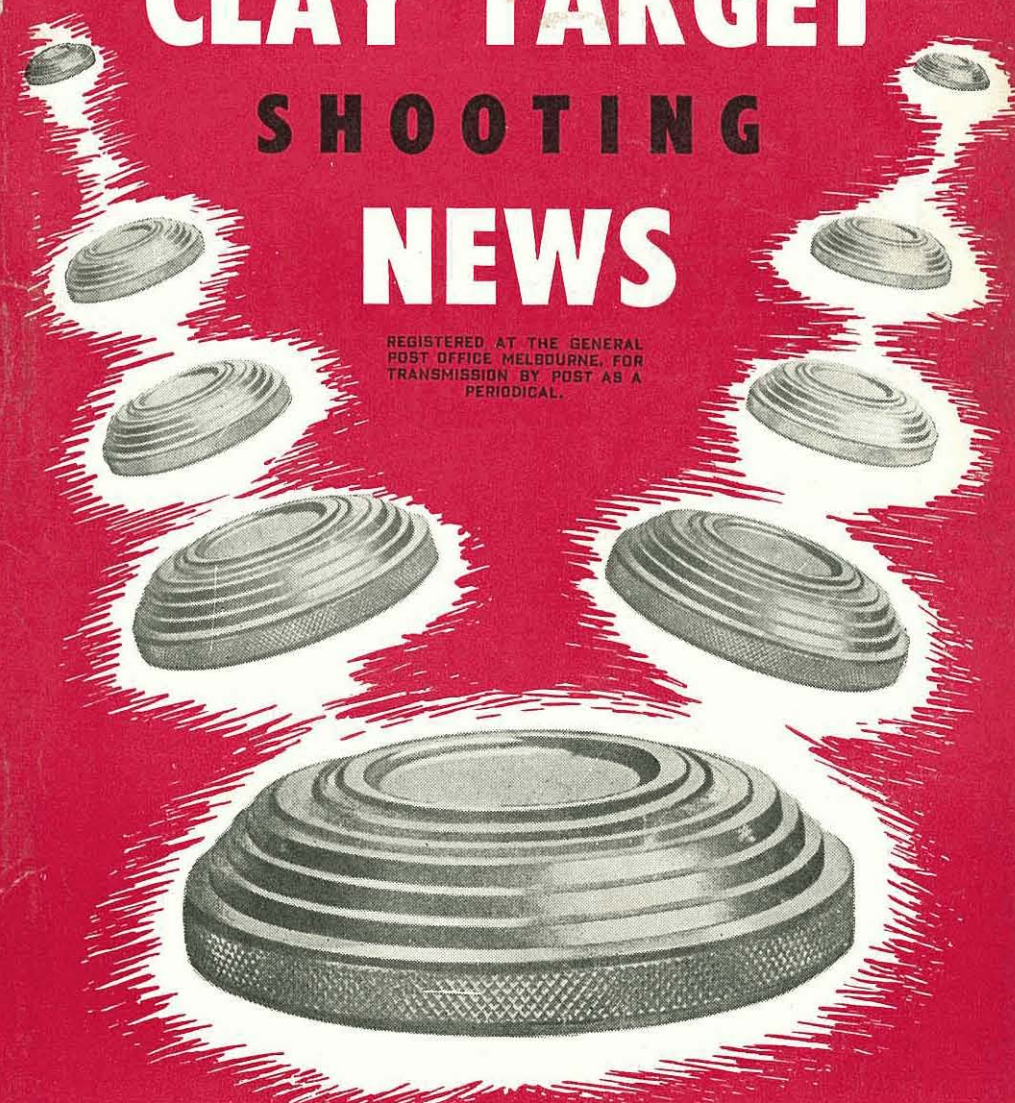

The Editor's Notebook



HANDICAPPING. A South Australian club has written in requesting publication of A.C.T.A. Handicapping formula. Accordingly the official formula is again published hereunder:

Outright winner of a main event or three divisions on any one programme 1 yard back
 75 or more break, from handicap mark or behind 1 yard back
 A shooter who attends three shoots and competes right through the programme and receives no more than 2 (two) divisions 1 yard forward

A shooter winning a Championship from a mark behind his Association handicap automatically goes back to the mark from which he won the Championship.

Once a shooter has attained the handicap of 16 yards he cannot again be handicapped in front of that mark.

No shooter can be moved forward more than 3 (three) yards from the maximum mark he has at any time attained.

All handicap marks, as they appear in Association "News", to be accepted as official.

All clubs are required to send to the Association office a "Handicap Return Form", duly completed, within 14 (fourteen) days of shoot being held. The Handicap Return Form must include details of all shooters, whether the shoot be an open shoot, club shoot or picnic shoot.

Clubs are required to notify the Association Handicapper of all

shooting dates at least 14 days prior to the holding of any shoot. The management committee of a club is empowered to move a shooter back when he wins in accordance with the handicapping formula. The Association to be notified of any such move within the customary three days of such action taking place.

PENALTIES. The following penalties have been adopted for non-observance of the foregoing directions:

(1) Club President will be informed by the Handicapper if his club fails to submit completed Handicap Return Form that club will be de-registered unless return is submitted to the Association Handicapper within 7 (seven) days.

(2) Any shooter suffering de-registration by his club's failure to submit required Handicap Return Form may be re-registered by joining any other affiliated club.

(3) Any shooter knowingly shooting with a de-registered club will be liable to de-registration.

(4) Any de-registered club to be re-registered on supplying the completed Handicap Return Form required and paying a fine of £1/1/-. For a second offence under this clause a fine of £3/3/- will be imposed. Also an undertaking will be required from the offending club that Handicap Return Form will be furnished on all future occasions.

The new Handicapping System applied as from 1/1/1959.

Compilers of the New Handicap Form are reminded that the Return must contain the name of every

shooter who takes part in any shoot covered by the Return. This is a very important point and it is required to be strictly observed.

The question of properly compiled result returns for publication is a matter which arises for discussion. Recently a club forwarded a result sheet, extracted from the official score-book, which showed that the club had conducted four events on the day mentioned as being the day of the shoot, but in completing the result sheet the secretary had not bothered to show the results of three events. All that was shown was the result of the main event; the other three events were scantily described, such as No. 1, 10 birds, D.B., "6 possibles div." Similar descriptions were shown for all but the main event. The result sheet was returned to the secretary of the club concerned for amendment and completion of correct information. It is pointed out that "News" had its origin in being "a publication to show club results". Those who sponsored the idea of "News", now more than a decade ago, had only those thoughts in mind when it was decided to "publish a bulletin". If club officials are not prepared to provide the information required, it serves no useful purpose in publishing the results of one event on the programme.

Another point arises in connection with preparation of "result sheets" for "News", and that is the proper arrangement of details. Frequently some club officials when preparing the return sheet go into far too much detail. As an instance, a very common failing is to show as in the following example: "No. 1, eye-opener or gun-warmer, divided by". All that is required in this instance is, "No. 1, 5 birds D.B.", because if it is the first event on the programme, it is obviously the "eye-opener" or "gun-warmer" or "rust remover" or whatever superfluous title is given to it. It should be remembered that if all clubs forwarding returns included the unnecessary words referred to, it would take probably several pages to allow for inclusion, hence these words are always deleted by the Association office. Another series of quite un-

necessary comment which always has to be deleted is the practice of repeating the full results in the "General Comments" section, after already detailing them in the "results" section. Such comment must necessarily again be deleted for the reason that such information is shown immediately above the "General Comments" section in the "results". One other instance of unsatisfactory compilation came from an interstate club which merely completed the "results" section of the score book by naming the events and mentioning that so many divided in each instance. Such a result is, of course, completely out of order and useless.

"Shooting at the pieces" is another question which has again caused some discussion among certain metropolitan clubs. In one case a referee indicated that he would "no-bird" a shooter if he continued "shooting at the pieces". For the information of all interested, it is advised that this question of shooting at the pieces is one which has been discussed at length by the Executive Committee as far back as 1955, and the ruling given at that time is as follows: "Unless, in the opinion of the referee, it was contrary to the equity of the competition, shooters could shoot at the pieces if so desired". This ruling was adopted at the October 1955 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Association, and up to the present, same has not been altered. The information and ruling was published in the November 1955 issue of "News".

1960 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS. Latest date for lodging applications for 1960 Commonwealth, State and District Championships is September 28. Applications are required to be made in writing to the Secretary A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I. Late applications will be accepted up to October 1. Club officials are advised that clubs not making application for open titles within the prescribed time will not be considered for allocation by the Executive Committee at the annual allocation in October next. Also no 1960 championships will be approved after the official allocation in October, except under very exceptional circumstances.

"Tips and Tails"

Secretary of the Apsley Gun Club — the club where a shooter may stand in Victoria and shoots his targets in South Australia — is W. T. Caldwell. There is no greater enthusiast for the sport of clay target busting than W.T.C. In a recent report he indicates that the club has now a permanent site on Crown land, and a club house 36 x 12 with 8 ft. verandah has now been built. The club recently installed lighting for night shooting, and this has proved an immediate success. A second automatic trap has also been installed and all formations (trap-house, lanes, etc.) have all been set down in concrete. The lighting system is powered by a Holden FJ engine with Fl.69 reflectors on 16 ft. poles. Altogether a very nice and up-to-date set-up which no doubt will be enjoyed by all who visit the far-western District of Victoria club. Caldwell in his report concludes, "News' is a wonderful little periodical. I sure look forward to its prompt delivery on the first of each month. It reaches every shooter in the Commonwealth of Australia and, in my opinion, there is no better way to advertise".

Five duck shooters in Western Australia are reported to have been awarded prizes in a £1,000 competition organised by the local Fisheries and Game Department. Before the W.A. duck season opened on December 20, 50 secret duck band numbers were selected and every shooter who returned one of these bands to the Department before the season closed on April 30 received a case of 500 shells. The successful shooters are reported to be T. Mincham of North Perth, who shot a grey teal at Taarblin Lake, east of Narrogin, in February. The duck had been banded at Wardering Lake, near Katanning, in March 1956. F. Neve of Kalgoorlie also shot a grey teal at Kalgoorlie

in February. F. Gibbs of Thornlie shot a black duck at Lake Wannama, on the Geraldton line, south of Moora, in April. B. Clifford of Brookhampton shot a black duck at Narrogin in March, and E. J. Moore of Three Springs also shot a black duck at Green Lake, north of Jurien Bay, in February. It had been banded at Queen's Gardens, Perth, in May 1958. The five winners are congratulated on gaining the good luck to bring down birds carrying the "right number".

The American publication "News-week" goes to some length in outlining the cost of shooting equipment to properly equip a duck hunter. The figures are somewhat surprising. The publication states that the following costs are involved, making up to a total of 755.90 dollars, which in A.C. is quite a fair sum. The items are as detailed, with costs shown in dollars. Cap 5.00, shirt 18.50, Parka (coat) 85.00, gloves 10.00, duck call 7.50, blind 10.95, trousers 49.50, socks 3.00, boots 21.00, shotgun 525, shell box 9.95, decoys 3.50 each (the coat and trousers referred to are of water-proof material).

Cobar Club in far western New South Wales advertises details of its two-day championship shoot on September 26 and 27 next. The Commonwealth Single-barrel Sparrow Championship will be decided on the opening day, plus a £50 Handicap. On the second, the Far Western District of N.S.W. Double and Single-barrel Championships will be held, as well as a £100 Handicap. First-class supporting events are also listed. A high-gun trophy will be awarded as well as an intermediate trophy over the programme. Enquiries to S. J. The shoot is a preliminary for the Deniliquin Club's all-day shoot on Monday, October 5 (Labour Day Holiday in New South Wales). So shooters south of the Murray and elsewhere may enjoy a full week-end of competition. Methods and ways of addressing the automatic trap is a matter often discussed when trapshots foregather. Recently an American correspondent mentioned when writing in an overseas magazine that he had had plenty of time to study the mannerisms and actions of leading trapshots in U.S.A. How their guns were held and how fast they fired, etc. His comments are of interest. He states that most shooters, that is leading shots in the U.S.A., when on No. 1 station held their guns several feet to the left of trap-house. At station two, even with the left-hand edge of the trap-house. At station three, directly over the centre, and from stations four and five, to the right of the trap-house. With a wind coming in from behind the shooter and the birds low, the gun was pointed just a short distance over the trap-house, and for a high frontal wind the gun was held high. The writer continues that on the last day he attended the big American shoot under review, at which 350 shooters took part, there were no

less than thirteen 100 straight scores. Perhaps the commentator "has" something in his outline of "holding" by the various leading shots. He concludes by adding that he noticed only three shooters using side-by-side guns (double-barrel), a dozen or more over and unders, a few single-shot trap guns, but fully 80 per cent. of the competitors used the American "pump" gun, many using this type of gun for doubles.

Concern has been expressed in the English "Shooting Times" at the destruction of small birds, particularly song-birds, as they fly over Europe, especially through Italy. Reports from the British Section of the International Committee for Bird Preservation tells the story of the wholesale destruction of these small creatures which are later served up in savoury dishes or pierced by a wooden skewer and grilled. In certain parts of Europe such dishes are considered to be an added attraction for tourists. In an article published in a Dutch paper in November 1958 was a description of the "Feast of the Birds" at a small town in northern Italy where every year thousands of tourists come to feast and holiday. "Shooting Times" states that the position in Italy is very similar to that of the demand for quail in Great Britain a decade or two ago. Vast numbers of quail used to be netted in Egypt and exported alive to London and Paris to be fattened and killed for banquets during the summer months. The number of quail exported from Egypt, the paper states, totalled 579,726 in 1934. In 1936, mainly due to the efforts of the late Sir Thomas Russell, a law was passed in Egypt prohibiting the netting and exporting of quail during the spring migration. Britain in 1937 followed with a Bill promoted to prohibit the importation of live quail; France followed suit soon afterwards, and by thus cutting off the demand, the great destruction of quail was stopped. "Shooting Times" has requested its readers to support the Committee for Bird Preservation and ask intending tourists to protest at the wholesale destruction of larks, swallows, nightingales, robins, tits and finches whenever the birds are offered as delicacies at tourist resorts in Europe, especially in Italy.

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Years Ago

Fred Burns, still one of Australia's fore-front trapshooters, was described in 1939 by a Sydney publication of the day as "one of the younger school of brilliant trapshooters". The publication continued by emphasising that Burns, who won the 1939 Champion of Champions Cup with 49/50, "owes much of his present elevated position in the trapshooting world to the veteran International champion 'Calrossie' (J. W. Sutherland), whose tuition carried him over his early hurdles". The comment was probably one of the truest ever made. It is of great interest to recall that in mid-1939 the now non-existent weekly "The Australasian" gave no less than two full pages of descriptive comment and pictures on the 1939

Association Champion of Champions series. The paper apparently thought so highly of the pastime that it sent its leading sporting writer, "Old Boy" (the late R. W. E. Wilmot), well known to readers of another age, to cover the fixture. "Old Boy" commented, among many other items, that "clay target shooting in Victoria is little more than 10 years old; there had been clay bird shooting before that, but it was not organised. One Sunday morning in 1928 a number of sportsmen met in an old quarry at the Nobel works at Footscray, when the subject of establishing a clay pigeon trapshooting club was mooted, and before they dispersed they had decided on action. Among those who were present on that occasion were

H. G. James ('Duxbac'), Jack Sutherland ('Calrossie'), L. L. Schilling, G. Rutledge, Vernon Evans, B. Anquetil, George and Frank O'Shanessy, L. Bloom and Clarence Hall. From that Sunday morning meeting grew a great sport, and today (1939) there are 70 clubs and 1,600 registered shooters. New clubs are being formed every month and converts to clay target shooting are being registered rapidly". Continuing, the paper states, "During the last few years, under the secretaryship of Mr. W. McCullough, who assumed office in November 1936, the Association has increased by leaps and bounds.

Mr. H. G. James has retired from the Presidency in favour of Mr. M. H.

Baillieu, but he still exercises a fatherly influence. The Vice-Presidents are Lieut.-Col. Bridgeford, Mr. J. M. Wilson (Victoria), Mr. R. Darvall (Qld.), Dr. S. A. McDonnell (Q.) and Mr. W. Rainbird (Tas.). To Mr. McCullough is attributed the idea of having the International Match. An International Badge for trapshooting is as highly prized by marksmen as are the cups for football prowess".

(The fact that papers in 1939 were prepared to devote two full pages to the sport, indicates how present-day editors have failed to appreciate the importance of clay target shooting as an international pastime of standing.—Ed.)

Ten Years Ago

In 1949 Australia "regained" the Mackintosh Trophy for International honours when the scores were announced from Dundee (Scotland) after the Home Country teams had shot. Australia recorded 1,374/1,500 to win from England 1,336, Scotland

1,321, Wales 1,289, and Ireland 1,28. High-gun for the 1949 series went to the English shooter, S. T. Rimmer, who carded 99/100.

At Hobart, at this period of 1949, the late Ted Casey is recorded as having "recorded one of his finest

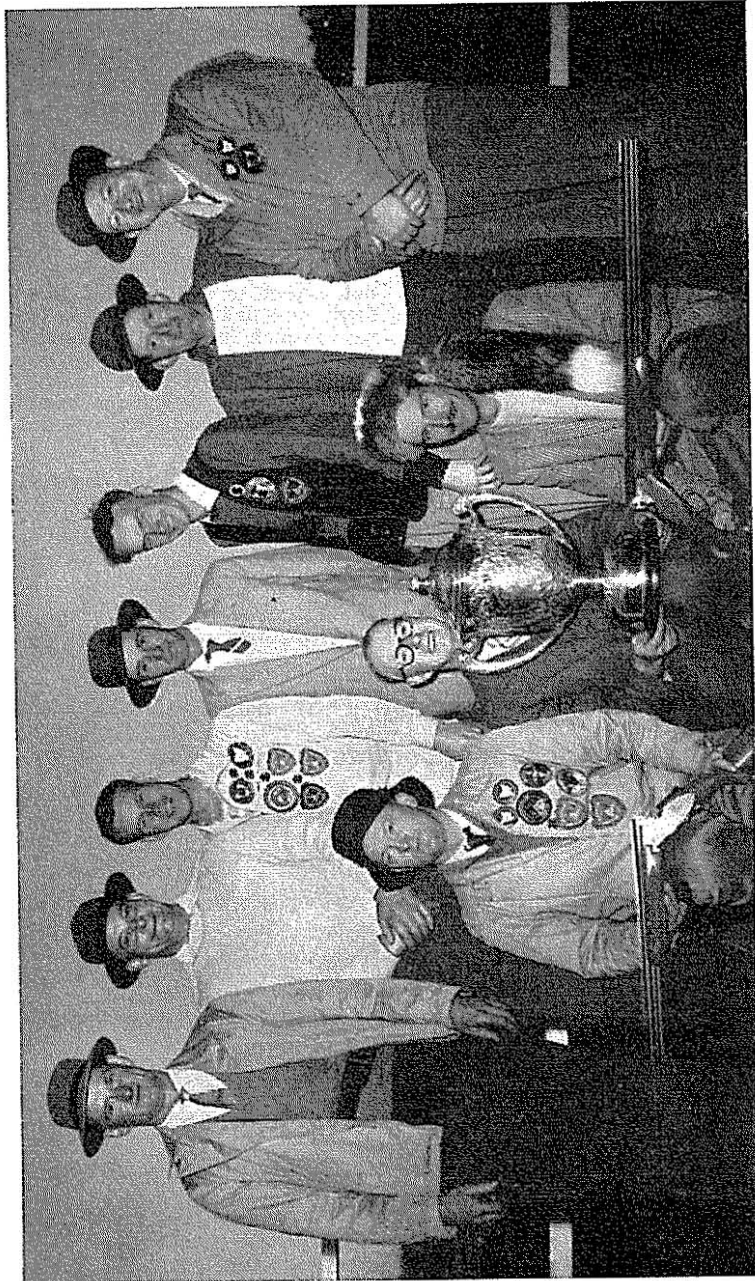
