President's Notes

Welcome to a new shooting year, and one of the fullest calendars in a long time. With the World DTL coming to Wagga Wagga in March 2018, members have the opportunity to compete in the showcase World event in our DTL discipline, The 13th ICTSF World DTL Championships. Visitors are welcome to attend the event, especially the final on

the 27th March, or attend some of the functions being held during the Nationals and the World and visit our sponsors and exhibitors on site at your National Grounds. We look forward to welcoming our International visitors to your ground, undoubtedly now one of the best in the world of DTL.

SportsPass

Shooters registering for 2018 will receive an offer from SportsPass of a **DIGITAL** Rewards card, providing the ACTA has your email address. A digital card is able to be stored on your mobile, without the need for yet another plastic card in your wallet. The office has received some quite rude and unnecessary emails regarding this as the senders did not receive a plastic card and obviously hadn't read the instructions in the email.

National Ground

The three western layouts 17-19 have now been refitted at a more constant height. The 20th layout has also been completed and all four now have full handicap marks. Once seating is in place on a few more layouts the shooting facilities for the World DTL will be complete. It should be noted that Don Power is acting as our project manager for the new building and has been responsible for all development work on the ground including the new layouts. He is spending over 30 hours a week onsite. All at no cost to the ACTA. Thank you Don from all of us.

Board Meeting

The ACTA board met over two days recently and have made many recommendations to the Executive. One of particular interest is the request received from the Australian Trapshooters Association (ATA), for recognition by the ACTA as a supporting Association. We believe as only ACTA members can shoot at their events and as they have been a valuable sponsor to some clubs and State Associations that this recognition is acceptable. If accepted by the Executive this will allow the two Associations to work closer together, save the ATA insurance costs on its events and make it easier for them to promote their events in ACTA publications and the website.

The benefit for our members is that they can be assured they are protected by the Associations insurances whilst competing in the ATA events and the clubs hosting the events will also be protected. The aim of the ATA is to establish a professional Trap shooting circuit with large prizemoney which will lift the profile of clay target shooting as a sport. If accepted they will join the Australian Skeet Shooters Association (ASSA) as a Supporting Association of the ACTA.

This arrangement has worked well between the ASSA and the ACTA for over seven years now and has only proven beneficial to the ACTA.

The meeting also recommended to the Executive the budget for 2018 and an Insurance offer that covers all Association insurances. It is interesting to note that some correspondence floating about quotes the cost of insurance per member as being \$3.50 when the actual cost is about \$8.70 per member.

Scholarship

The Association is considering a proposal to commit some funds to a Scholarship at the Charles Sturt University for post-graduate students in

a field related to our sport. This could be in the sports science or promotion area, legal studies etc. and would give the Association some exposure in the tertiary sphere where many future law makers come from.

Clubs brochure

All states have now been sent copies of a promotional brochure to be distributed by them to their clubs. It will also be available online. The brochure explains the ACTA shotgun disciplines and has room for clubs to insert their contact details. Another brochure is currently being developed to detail and promote membership benefits and it will be available to clubs soon.

Hall of Fame – Supporters

It was pleasing to be approached recently by Peter and Anne Moloney with an offer of support for the ACTA Hall of Fame. Peters' mother Pam Moloney nee Coxon is an inductee and after discussion the ten family members have decided that rather than give each other small and often somewhat useless gifts at Christmas they would each donate \$50 towards the Hall of Fame Fund, being \$500 in total. Thanks so much to the Moloney family as the first contributor to this worthy cause. We have also since received an anonymous donation of \$2000. All contributions will be recognised in the CTSN.

ACTA Conference Centre

Construction is progressing on schedule with all walls now standing. Steelwork is being erected and air-conditioning units are on site. We feel confident the facility will be ready for the Nationals and the World DTL.

Trade area

As an unforeseen benefit of construction we have been fortunate to have a large slab poured to the south of the existing target shed. This was used to pour conference centre wall panels on prior to their erection. This slab will now be considered as a site for a traders building. A secure, all weather area which in the long term will release the carpark (currently fenced as a secure area) for its original intended purpose. This will not be ready for the 2018 event but if supported it should be in place for ensuing years.

Sporting Clays Australia

I recently had the opportunity to talk to the President of SCA Mr. Tony Trainor. I reiterated that the offer to SCA of an agreement for SCA members to shoot our sporting disciplines on our grounds at club level remains on the table, subject to their formal acceptance at National level.

2018 and beyond.

2017 has been a big year for the ACTA with construction and events planning taking up much time and resources. With the limited human and financial resources available to the ACTA we have achieved as much as we could. When this workload is over, emphasis will shift to other matters we see of great importance.

Membership and retention issues will be at the forefront of these and I am sure with hard work, further consultation and co-operation we can solve some of these problems. I believe we need the Recreational membership category to be accepted Australia wide as a class for those that do not want to compete. It also needs to become our Nationwide introductory level membership category and as such it need to be as affordable as possible. I will be encouraging the ACTA to revisit the cost of this membership category with the intent of a relaunch in 2019. In my opinion the current inconsistent approach to this category across different States and Zones is negatively affecting its uptake, and thus exposing many to unnecessary risks. To have a truly National introductory level membership with the same cost everywhere would be ideal and that is what I will be asking the Executive to consider in 2018.

Executive Officer's Report

The 2018 AGM will be conducted on Sunday the 18th March in the ACTA auditorium commencing at 6.00pm. In accordance with the ACTA constitution agenda items need to reach the ACTA by the 18th December 2017.

Riverina Water

Local water authority Riverina Water responded positively to a request to reimburse fees paid by the ACTA for the provision of services to the National Ground. The cost of a new main was significant, given the size of the main required. Due to the size of the building, firefighting services were required which lead to further significant costs. Riverina water responded by refunding the development services cost of \$53,516. We will provide appropriate recognition on the National ground to Riverina Water through signage thanking them for their contribution.

Gun Insurance

Gun insurance was introduced November 2016 with all eligible members provided with insurance covering firearms up to \$12,000 with the option of increasing the benefit to \$25,000 for an extra \$10.00.

The policy has been used by a small number of people. In the scheme of numbers however it is not insignificant for those who have had to use the cover. There have been cases of fire, theft and accidental damage, these cases were handled and dealt with efficiently and quickly allowing our members to get on with their chosen sport.

Membership Time

We have received many renewed members through email to the registrations email address.

Club secretaries please note, if you have renewed members through the data base you do not need to send these through to the registrations email address. They are processed.

To enter new members the forms are accessed through the Website page. Only new members, change of Club or category & loyalty/concession members are entered through this process.

The ACTA has introduced a number of initiatives to significantly increase member benefits over the past two years, firstly firearms insurance, now sportspass and a NAB supported initiative.

We are introducing an initiative in conjunction with the ACTA's banker the NAB, a program where by taking out a loan through NAB can benefit the sport as well as getting the borrower significant benefits. All of this is through a referral system.

Member retention is always a big issue at National, Club and State level. At this time of the year Clubs are conducting Christmas and New year shoots and rely on people paying membership at this time of the year. For many reasons not everyone attends these events. Follow up by invitation to

previous members can take many forms. Why not hold a social "come and try" "bring an old member" day, every club has access to the ACTA data base, you can easily download a copy of all of your club members, current and lapsed.

Allocate these names to committee members and get them to phone, inviting them to the club to start 2018. This may be at the end of holidays when everyone is back to work and settling back in. A great way to bring some previous members back and make them feel welcome, these previous members are more likely to return knowing the club and its members. If you make them welcome and appreciated you may win some previous members back and entice those who have not yet joined to sign up. There is a list of benefits the ACTA membership provides when people join, it is on our website and is in this CTSN on page 4, print some out and give them to all members, I am sure there will be members in your club who don't know the benefits of being an ACTA member.

If your club is the town's social hub for members then Christmas and New Year may be the best time. If you, like most other sporting clubs share your members with other sports and their families you may need to look at "special" days to bring these new and previous members together. Just food for thought.

There will be limited storage available in the ACTA vault as it is a condition of the permits for overseas visitors to store their firearms in the ACTA vault.

QCTA State Skeet Carnival

The recent installation of a fifth skeet layout at the Roma Clay Target Club certainly took the pressure off for our carnival and it was obvious club members had been working around the clock to prepare for the event. The fine weather helped to welcome skeet shooters from across Queensland and interstate to contest the championships.

The Multigauge championships continue to grow in popularity and some excellent scores were posted in these events. Dave Dundon was the overall winner in the 20 gauge shooting 56/56, Nigel Hughes won the 28 gauge event with 57/58, Antony Ballarino shot the only possible in the 410 to win the overall sash and Adrian Cousens won the 12 gauge with 62/62. Port Denison's Antony Ballarino was the overall Multigauge Champion just 3 targets down across all four events with 197/200.

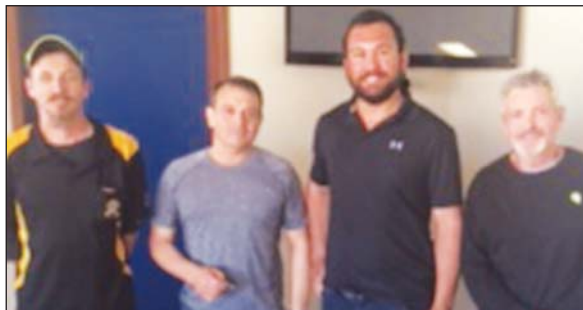
Sunday came round & like Saturday, the predicted weather held off, allowing the

● DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases.

Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.

weight equalisation" movement inherent in females. Vision was spoken about, asking all the ladies to globalise their eyes rather as the norm tunnel vision. Questions were asked & answered, putting any fears close to rest as to what would happen or go on out on the tracks. We ensured that the ladies had a get out clause & informed them that if they felt that they did not want to participate after having a shot, then that was fine as there

was no pressure or force on them to continue.

From here, it was out to the tracks for demonstration of DTL with all Mentors involved & a secondary one of Skeet with just Stu & the WACTA SDC involved just to show the two main disciplines in Clay Target shooting. Then the real moment came that they were all looking forward to the ladies undertaking Clay Target shooting. The Come & Try was operated over 2 ranges & at end of the day, all of the women present hit targets. In the group were 3 left handers, so left hand specific shotguns were provided for these women to use. Out of the 3, one woman had a problem trying to gauge her eye & target alignment but it did not seem to want to conform so a decision was made to convert to right hand to see & hit targets. This proved a great success with a very happy lady hitting a considerable amount of targets. The 3 females Mentors operated one range whilst the 3 Coaches operated the other. Very good reports were received about the 3 Mentors in how the ladies felt very comfortable with their approach & knowledge. The Mentors appeared to thoroughly enjoy their roles as well. As something different & in line with spot gifts, lime fluro or white targets were used as prize winning targets & quite a few were hit, so the rewards were reaped.

When the ladies weren't on the tracks, the men present (Club members, partners & husbands) took the responsibility of assisting those ladies who wished to also undertake the firing of rifles with carefully setup temporary rifle targets. This also proved a great success with all undertaking the second part of the Firearm Awareness initiative. It seemed that the static rifle targets didn't survive the day out with the amount of ammunition used & holes in the cardboard targets. In both the Shotgun & Rifle area, safety was always listed as the mandatory factor in shooting. Thank you gentlemen for having taken on this important area related to the Ladies Come & Try Day.

It was extremely hard to get the ladies off the tracks for lunch & afternoon teas as they were so involved & excited about their clay target shooting experience. At end of day, all the ladies had a great time & finished off with Wine, Beer, Champagne & Nibbles. Each lady was presented with a specially designed Certificate of Participation by Christine Alexander, noting that she supported her specially selected Mentors thoughts of hoping to see a number of the ladies become either social or competitive members of the Boyup Brook Clay Target Club.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

The Gun Fitting Session at Holland and Holland

Regular readers of this column will be aware of the significance of having a gun fitted properly and of my belief that it is a significant factor that

affects your scores and enjoyment. When buying a gun off the rack, and not making necessary adjustments to personalise the length of pull, cast on or off, drop or pitch will mean that the shooter will modify their gun hold, stand or mount to accommodate and will in effect make themselves fit the gun rather than have the gun fit them.

In August, Barbara and I travelled to Europe. When we were planning the trip, I contacted Holland and Holland Shooting Ground to organise a gun fitting session and shooting lesson. Holland and Holland have been making the "Best London Guns" for over a century. These bespoke guns sell at a premium price, so it is essential that when clients order a gun it will fit them precisely.

Confidence is an essential element of mental toughness, and all shooters must have confidence in their ability as well as their gun and cartridges. Holland and Holland trade in confidence. They are confident they can measure the shooter properly, so that the gun they make will be a personal fit. The client has to have confidence in the process of getting the measurements right and the finished product: a personally fitted, bespoke "Best London Gun". Unfortunately, I am unable to buy a new Holland and Holland shotgun but the gun fitting session and lesson provided me with confidence, when I use my own guns they will fit properly. Holland and Holland provide a copy of the dimensions to take to their showroom or to your preferred maker or stock fitter. In my case, I wanted to make sure my Kemens fit me properly.

I was not sure what to expect when the day finally arrived. I had seen the promotional videos and the website but the experience completely overwhelmed my perception. Barbara and I travelled out to the ground at Northwood by catching the Underground to Ruislip; a quick stroll through the village, then a short taxi ride through a very modest entrance to the grounds.



The Holland and Holland Shooting Ground is a bit like the Royal Botanical Gardens: manicured lawns, well drained and functional paths, statues, hedges, gardens and groves of trees: gingko, horse chestnut, spruce and oak trees, for example. Being summer the trees and the grass looked healthy and green. This was a far cry from the field and game grounds in western New South Wales where I normally

shoot. Set on one hundred acres of undulating countryside only 17 miles from the centre of London.

Nathan Dudley, Senior Instructor introduced himself and we followed him to the gunroom where he selected a try-gun to start the fitting process. The try-gun is completely adjustable: length of pull, drop at the comb and heel, pitch and cast. Nathan sized me up and adjusted the gun to what he thought would suit. When I shouldered the gun, it came up nicely so we headed out through the grounds to the pattern plate.

Every shooter knows the importance of patterning their gun, however it is

rarely taken seriously. Firing the gun at the pattern plate not only showed where the gun was shooting but it also showed how I stood, held the gun, whether I kept my head on the stock and whether or not the gun's recoil would affect me. After a minor adjustment, we headed out through the ground to shoot some targets.



Nathan asked me to shoot an incoming target. He was looking at my gun mount, feet and weight positioning, balance and follow through. I found this process strange because it is unusual to have someone actually watch how you shoot. Nathan wasn't focused on whether I hit the target but how I addressed the stand, how I mounted the gun, acquired the target, shot and followed through. I have often written about the importance of focusing on the process of shooting rather than the product. The experience this morning dealt primarily with the process of shooting and as a result I was hitting targets consistently and well with a gun that was completely different from my own. Using the gun felt effortless because it obviously fitted. As we wandered through the grounds I shot 115 targets in approximately 90 minutes: crossers, rabbits, battues, high tower birds and springers.

After what seemed like a pleasant morning stroll through the beautiful grounds, with a very personable and friendly coach and effortlessly shooting targets, we headed back to the pavilion, where Nathan measured the gun and presented me with the measurements.



Barbara and I had a most enjoyable morning. Since coming home I have altered my guns to match the measurements. My trap gun was practically the same but I had to make some minor changes to my sporter. I feel assured that my guns now fit me. I also feel confident that Nathan's advice about positioning, gun mount and follow through will help me enjoy my shooting even more. Like most shooters I like to succeed and where possible win, but I also just enjoy shooting.

This day was a memorable experience: a warm welcome, great shooting at a beautiful ground, expert advice and tuition, fine weather and the knowledge that I was part of something special.

I can now pick up my guns with confidence that I have been fitted by the best gun-fitters in the world.

Letter to the Editor

To the Editor,

We are writing to inform you of a revolutionary format that we have developed to run in parallel with major clay target shooting carnivals that adds a new layer of excitement and competition that the sport has never had. We have taken the tournament-style championship format used by tennis grand slams, AFL and NRL premierships, and many other major sporting codes and applied it to clay target shooting to create a new event, without a single extra shot being fired.

Shooters are assigned to a draw (as per the figure below) either randomly or by the result of seeding based on their performance in the first event. Each event in the program then serves as an elimination, with the field halving each round until one shooter emerges the victor. This format means that in any given round a competitor only needs to beat one other shooter in order to progress into the next round.

The format has been tested using data from the 2017 NSW State Carnival as well as the 2017 American Trap Fall selection event, and was implemented live for the first time, unofficially, at the 2017 Victorian State Titles as a sweepstake. There were sixty-four shooters that entered the competition, and they were randomly assigned to a draw (see below). Due to there being only five events at the Victorian State Titles, the first round consisted of groups of four shooters, before narrowing to one-on-one eliminations thereafter. Some shooters shot excellent scores only to be edged out by their opponent who

managed one better, while others shot relatively poor scores that were enough to beat the individual they were matched up with for that round. Overall, as should be expected, better shooters tended to prevail, but there were also unexpected upsets. Congratulations to Sam Clifford for taking out the event after winning tiebreaks in rounds 1 and 2, and a shoot-off in the semi finals (when a tie occurred in a given round, the event itself was used as a shoot-off, and the first person to miss in said event was deemed the loser).

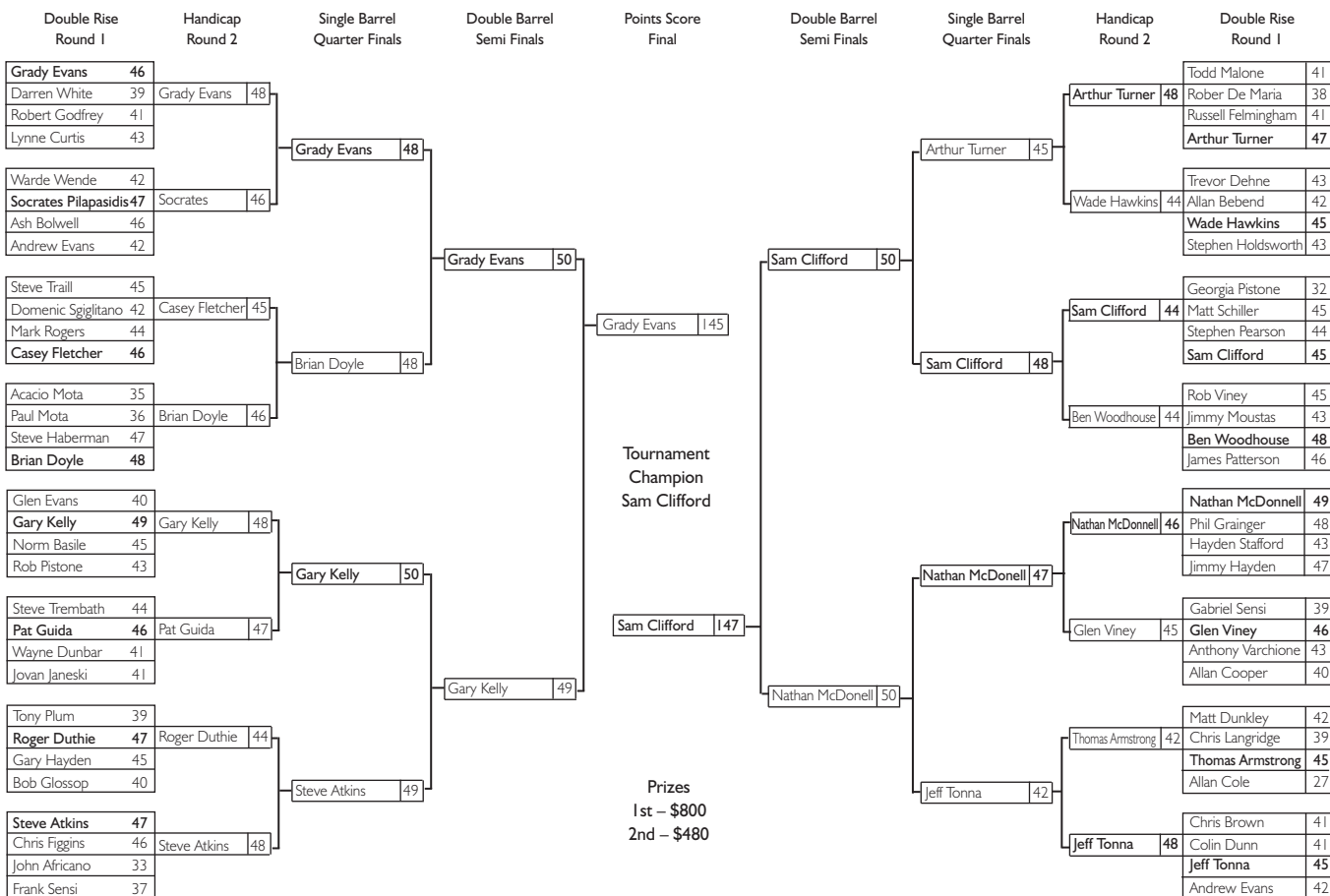
The tournament was given rave reviews and had shooters paying attention to more than just who shot the possible in each event, and how the High Gun picture was affected. It spawned good-spirited rivalries between friends and strangers, and generated a new level of interest among competitors and spectators alike. Speculation about who would progress to the next round and how pairs of shooters matched up in each event added a new layer of excitement to the carnival.

There are a number of tiebreaker situations we have carefully considered and found solutions to, but we won't expound on these here. The tournament format need not be restricted to the limited numbers illustrated above; the first round of any program can be used as a qualifying event to cull the field to the desired number before the draw takes its more familiar form for round 2.

Given the reception from shooters thus far, we would like to see this tournament format adopted for the upcoming National Titles as an official sweepstake. The format could be applied to the entire field of shooters as well as to individual grades.

We believe that implementing this format will give shooters something extra to compete for and follow at major events, without adding any additional financial or time burden.

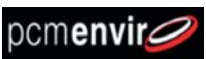

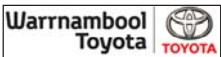

THE BACK PAGE

Welcome to "The Back Page", I hope you enjoy this month's articles and invite you to call me on 0468 437 000 to discuss our history, records, personalities or other points of interest.

From The Past:

At the turn of the 20th century the biggest money events in Trap shooting were challenge matches and the undisputed "King" of these matches was a young man named Harry Bridge "Ellalong", he was said to have had nerves of steel and loved the pressure of the challenge matches. His early life was spent in Ellalong from where he gained his nom de plume, he moved to Newcastle in his early 20's and started to compete in trapshooting tournaments and challenge matches.

He first rose to prominence when he accepted a \$500 challenge that Arthur Eales had made to any shooter in the Commonwealth. Eales was the Australian Challenge match champion at the time and was expected to win easily.

It was to be one of the biggest challenge matches held anywhere in the World and certainly the biggest challenge match to be held in Australia. The match took place at the Tamworth racecourse on September 15th 1909, the format was 100 pigeons from 30 yards, "Ellalong" won easily.

He successfully defended the title of "Challenge Match Champion of Australia" on multiple occasions and in the process made himself enough money to set himself up in business. His other passion was billiards and he purchased several billiards businesses, two of which were located in Colac and Port Augusta.

His career was to be short as he took his own life at 30 years of age in Adelaide. His mother had died a few days earlier and he had been depressed for some time

Before his death he had beaten all the great trapshooters of the time in challenge matches for \$100 to \$500. His wins included victories over Charles Massey, "Calrossie", Arthur Eales, WB Wilkinson, Louis Clark and "Tommy" Grant.

For The Record:

Darryn Nicholls set a new record at Wagga Wagga at the 2015 National Trap Championships when he shot 1553 straight to eclipse Russell Marks record of 1177 set in Tamworth in 1992.

At the same Nationals Bill Iles made the Mackintosh team to become the 6th trapshooter to make the team 20 times. He joins Newton Thomas, Doug Smith, Pud Burgess, Sperry Marshall and Roger Duthie in this very exclusive club.

Did You Know:

Australia and New Zealand have co-operated in the holding of their National Championships since the mid 1950's. Prior to the formation of the State Associations the two major shoots conducted each year were the Australian and New Zealand Championships.

In 1965 the ACTA decided to award a High Gun at our National Championships to bring ourselves in line with the New Zealanders. This award has grown in status to the point where it is now considered the major title of both Championships. It is regarded as the hardest of all the titles to win as the winner must shoot at the very highest level for the entire championship.
