Mitú, Perijá, Inírida, *llanos*

November 9th - December 10th 2023

Report by Ann Duff

This four-week custom tour was arranged through Nature Colombia (www.naturecolombia.com) for five of us to visit less well-known areas of Colombia in search of some of the more difficult-to-see species. We were pleased that we used this company as they were helpful and efficient in sorting out any logistical problems we encountered. The main areas we wanted to visit included the Perijá range in north-east Colombia and the Amazonian towns of Mitú and Inírida in the far east of the country. An optional post-tour extension to the eastern Andean slope and *llanos* was made available and was taken up by all of the main tour participants. This trip report also includes our notes on a one-day pre-tour extension to the paramo in Chingaza National Park near Bogotá, as well as a last-day-of-the-tour visit to Sumapaz National Park and Chicaque Nature Reserve near Bogotá. 720 species of birds were recorded, of which 28 species were heard only. 19 species of mammals and 19 species of butterflies were also recorded.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Flights International return flights with Air Europa from London to Bogotá via Madrid cost £870 per person inclusive of all taxes. I have to add that I would not recommend this airline! During a 10 hours and 20 minutes outward bound flight we received only one meal soon after take-off and after that just a cup of tea or coffee prior to landing. On the return flight of 8 hours and 30 minutes we were given 'lunch' at 23:30! No visa is required but a Colombian immigration Checkmig form (see https://apps. migracioncolombia.gov.co/pre-registro/en) must be completed no sooner than 48 hours before both the inbound and outbound flights. In Colombia we had six internal Avianca or Satena flights, of which only one departed as originally scheduled. We had been warned that there were frequent changes to schedules and to expect such delays. The costs of all internal flights were included in the Nature Colombia invoice and had to paid in full well in advance.

Guides Nature Colombia provided English-speaking birding guides and drivers for all stages of the tour. We found all of them to be excellent birders, all having great skill at identifying bird calls, use of playback and using laser pens to help us get on to the birds.

Transport in Colombia For five tour participants and a guide we had transport according to the terrain, varying from modern mini-buses to somewhat ramshackle 4x4s and at a couple of places a tuk-tuk!

Accommodation We spent several nights at a very good hotel in Bogotá then at variable quality hotels elsewhere, mainly with a/c or fans in the rooms. All had en-suite bathrooms but sometimes only cold showers in the Amazonian towns. Accommodation in Perijá was at a fairly basic, although clean and comfortable, lodge high in the mountains - perfectly acceptable.

Food and drink Generally good: *Breakfast*: Boxed breakfasts almost daily became rather tedious with the usual ham and cheese sandwich on soggy white bread predominating. Our guide was kind enough to obtain yogurt and fruit where possible. *Lunch*: provided at reserves or restaurants/cafes en route with an occasional boxed lunch. *Dinner*: plentiful quantity with a free choice from the menu except at Chamicero del Perijá Lodge and the Ecolodge Juan Solito where we were given set meals. *Drinks*: bottled water was provided throughout with juices or sodas with meals.

Currency Colombian peso (COP) is the national currency with an exchange rate of approx. COP5000 to GBP1 at the time of our visit. On arrival into the country, we used our debit cards to obtain currency from an ATM inside Bogotá Airport, in order to pay for laundry, drinks and tips. US\$ are not generally accepted in Colombia.

Health Anti-malarial prophylaxis was advised for Mitú (where a case of malaria was reported during our visit) and Inírida. Yellow fever certificates are not compulsory nor were we asked for proof of COVID vaccinations. Chiggers and other biting insects were a constant irritation, especially in the lowlands, and wearing wellington boots in the field is advisable almost anywhere in Colombia.

Time zone Colombia is 5 hours behind GMT.

Weather Cold and misty at high altitude at Chingaza NP, Perijá and Sumapaz NP. Mostly very hot and sunny in the Amazonian region and on the *llanos*. Some time was lost due to occasional showers and an early morning in Inírida on 25/11 due to heavy winds and a tropical downpour.

Books For birds we relied on the *Birds of Colombia* by Steven L. Hilty (Lynx) as a reference book but on *Field Guide to the Birds of Colombia* by McMullan, Donegan & Quevedo (Proaves) once in the field. For mammals we used *All the Mammals of the World* (Lynx) on our return to the UK.

DAILY DIARY

Nov. 9th - International travel day

10:00 GMT Air Europa flight from London Gatwick to Bogotá via Madrid arriving at 19:35 local time. Met by our guide from Nature Colombia for transfer to the Hilton Garden Inn, Bogotá Airport.

Nov. 10th - Pre-tour extension: Chingaza NP, Observatorio de Colibries

04:40 Left our hotel for the long, slow drive to Chingaza NP. Visitors must check the official website: https://www.parguesnacionales.gov.co/nuestros-pargues/pnn-chingaza/ for the rather onerous entry restrictions! Cold, mist and drizzle hampered birding. Bronze-tailed Thornbill, Crowned Chat-tyrant, Pale-naped Brush-finch, Pale-bellied Tapaculo and Rufous (Muisca) Antpitta were some of the birds seen. In the afternoon we transferred to the Observatorio de Colibries where we spent a couple of hours enjoying the activity at the feeders. Highlights included Blue-throated Starfrontlet, Sword-billed Hummingbird, Great Sapphirewing and Coppery-bellied Puffleg.

Nov. 11th - La Florida Park, flight to Mitú

Checked out at 04:30 and drove to La Florida Park arriving before the gates were open at 06:00 so we ate our boxed breakfasts. We walked as far as the lagoon and had good views of Bogota Rail and Spot-flanked Gallinule. Transferred to the airport for our 13:15 Satena flight to Mitú; at 13:20 we were told it would be delayed. Eventually arrived in Mitú at 20:25 having lost our afternoon's birding. Our guide was required to pay a tourism tax of COP33000 (approx. £6.50) per person.

Nov. 12th - Mitú

05:15 met our local guide, Miguel; drove to bridge which accesses start of Mitú Cachivera

trail, an area of white-sand forest. Wellingtons were essential as we walked through the grassy area which preceded the trail itself. From this point it was hard to keep up with so many birds! Orangecheeked Parrot, Maroon-tailed Parakeet, Black-chinned Antbird, Golden-headed Manakin and Shorttailed Pygmy-tyrant were just a few. Further along the trail we found Short-billed Honeycreeper, Imeri Warbling Antbird, a day roosting Blackish Nightjar, Grey-bellied Antbird, Black Manakin and Blackheaded Parrot. We returned to Mitú for lunch before driving to Urania in the afternoon, seeing Bronzy Jacamar, Amazonian Scrub Flycatcher, White-browed Purpletuft, Spangled Cotinga, Red-fan Parrot, Amazonian Pygmy-kingfisher, Amazonian Tyrannulet and Opal-rumped Tanager for some. A take-away dinner delivered to our hotel was excellent.

05:00 start for 40-45 minute drive to Ceima Cachivera - terra firme forest (permits required). We walked through the village to the Guianan Cock-of-the-Rock lekking area seeing Black-throated Antbird, Fiery Topaz (sub-adult), Paradise Jacamar on the way and then our target, a single Guianan Cock-of-the-Rock. Rain from 09:45 to 10:15 delayed our return to the vehicles and on our way back to them we were accosted by a rather inebriated couple who we couldn't understand as we don't speak Spanish and Miguel was some way ahead of us. Turned out they thought we didn't have permits which we did have. Mitú for lunch and a welcome siesta before visiting a hot, arid, white sand area near the worked-out Finca los Caucanitas. Good for Azure-naped Jay and Green-tailed Goldenthroat. On our way back into Mitú we visited various palm groves and eventually found a single Palmcreeper and the first of several Scarlet Macaws seen during the tour.

Nov. 14th - Mitú

04:30 drove for just over an hour to Puente de Lata (the metal bridge) where we had excellent views of three sparring male Fiery Topazes superb! Close to the bridge there is a loop trail which produced Gould's Jewelfront, Scalybreasted Woodpecker and great views of White-browed Purpletuft. On emerging back on to the main road we were delighted to see a Mottled-face Tamarin crossing the road. We continued to Pueblo Nuevo where we walked past the community long houses and on through waist-high grass to the start of the trail. Many new birds included Cinnamonrumped Foliage-gleaner, Common Scalebacked Antbird, White-shouldered Antshrike and Chestnut-crested Antbird. We returned to the edge of the village for a boxed lunch;

unfortunately there were no facilities available for us to use so we sweltered in the midday heat! We birded a different forest trail in the afternoon, seeing Banded Antbird and glimpsing a Tawny-tufted Toucanet.

Nov. 15th - Mitú

04:45 drove to Sendero Bocatoma (Pipeline Trail), in white-sand forest, where wellingtons were again essential as a stream ran down the path and there were several log 'bridges' over deep water ditches to negotiate. Well worth it as the birding was excellent: Yellow-billed Jacamar, Yellow-green Grosbeak, Spot-backed Antwren, Citron-bellied Attila and, a real star, White-plumed Antbird. After lunch and a siesta we visited Cerrito Verde and had to wait for the rain to stop before adding Spot-backed Antbird. Lots of insect bites!!

Nov. 16th - Mitú

04:30 drove to Cruce Bocatoma, an area of terra firme forest, and largely uphill. Rather quiet with the best birds being: Black-headed Antbird, Mouse-colored Antshrike, Pinkthroated Becard, Great Jacamar, Black-bellied Cuckoo and Paradise Jacamar. Returned after lunch to bird the lower section seeing Amazonian Grosbeak. What was most exciting was having a large frog leaping madly along the track between us and then we realised that it was being chased by a very large fast-moving Fortunately the snake poisonous, so Miguel said, just a cazadora, a hunter.

Nov. 17th - Mitú, flight to Bogotá

05:00 birding around Mitú town early for parrots dispersing from roost, including good numbers of the very localised Kawall's Parrot, while also seeing a very confiding Amazonian Umbrellabird. Our 09:00 Satena flight to Bogotá had been rescheduled to 16:00 so most of the group continued to Urania to pick up a few extra species: Brown-banded Puffbird, Chestnut Woodpecker and Drab Water-tyrant. 14:30 transferred to the airport and were told that the plane was still in Bogotá and was due to arrive at 19:00. Eventually left Mitú at 21:30, only 12 hours late! We received 30% of our fare back but this was poor compensation for the morning's birding we missed at Los Besotes on the following day. We arrived at the hastily-booked Hilton Garden Inn, Bogotá Airport, at just after midnight, having missed our 16:19 Avianca flight to Valledupar.

Nov. 18th - flight to Riohacha, Riohacha to Chamicero del Perijá

No flights were available to Valledupar so we flew to Riohacha instead. The only House Sparrows of the trip were in the car park at Riohacha Airport. A brief stop in coastal scrub south of Riohacha was very worthwhile, producing Tocuyo Sparrow and Russet-throated Puffbird. We then continued driving south to La Paz where we exchanged our minibus for two 4x4s. A diversion not far from Manaure was a stakeout for the regional endemic Perija Brush-finch which performed despite the rain. We then carried on uphill to Chamicero del Perijá Lodge at approx. 2600 m, arriving at 17:45. Longuemare's Sunangels were still attending the feeders and at dusk we saw two Greater Band-winged Nightjars.

Nov. 19th - Chamicero del Perijá

05:00 took the 4x4s to Sabana Rubia, high paramo at an altitude of approx. 3000 m, to search for Perijá specialities. Perija Thistletail played hard to get in the cold, misty dawn but was eventually seen well as were the Black-fronted Brush-finch, Perija Metaltail, Perija Antpitta, Perija Tapaculo and a brief Perija Starfrontlet. An Andean Pygmy-owl was also called in. After an excellent lunch at the lodge we enjoyed watching Black-fronted Wood-Quail and Chestnut-crowned Antpitta at the feeders before retracing our steps to bird above the lodge, slowly making our way back down. After dinner we heard and saw a Rufous-banded Owl just outside the lodge.

Nov. 20th - Chamicero del Perijá to La Jagua de Ibirico, near La Paz

After breakfast we thanked the staff who had taken such good care of us at the lodge, packed our bags and drove slowly down the mountain above Manaure, stopping near Mashiramo Glamping to search for the highly localised and seasonal Rufous-shafted Woodstar, which we found. En route to La Jagua de Ibirico we took a side road near La Paz for Stripe-backed Wren.

Nov. 21st - La Jagua de Ibirico to Ocaña, Finca No Hay Como Dios

Left La Jagua at 05:00 for the rough ride in old 4x4s up to Finca No Hay Como Dios where we were greeted by the owner, Nelson. Our main target was Perijá Parakeet and once we'd seen the parakeets Nelson's daughter-in-law cooked a delicious breakfast. On our way back to the main road we received news that there was a protest at La Palmita where locals had blocked the road which meant our minibus couldn't get through to pick us up in La Jagua. Our guide hastily contacted Nature Colombia's office and arranged for the 4x4s to take us to La Palmita where we walked through the blockade to another mini-bus on the other side. We continued to Ocaña were we briefly visited the garden of Don Carmito, a now-retired forest guard of the Recurve-billed Bushbird Reserve.

Nov. 22nd - Recurve-billed Bushbird Reserve

We again went to Don Carmito's garden to eat our boxed breakfasts while watching the birds at his feeders, before continuing the short drive up to the reserve. It took a while to find any bushbirds and the first was a female that we watched using her curved bill to strip a piece of bamboo. Other birds included Klages's Antbird, Stripe-breasted Spinetail, Chestnut-bellied Thrush and a pair of Black Hawkeagles. Afternoon birding was delayed as our driver sought a way out of town; there was yet another blockade, this time by local minicab drivers. We returned to bird a different track outside the reserve, finding Band-tailed Guan, Grey-throated Warbler and Chestnut-bellied Thrush.

Nov. 23rd - Ocaña to Bucaramanga travel day, flight to Bogotá

A slow travel day on winding roads with two fairly long delays, firstly due to two lorries breaking down either side of the road with little room to get through and secondly due to a bad accident in which a large lorry had completely overturned. However we made it to Bucaramanga Airport in time for our delayed Avianca flight to Bogotá.

Nov. 24th - travel day, flight from Bogotá to Inírida, Inírida

Breakfast at the Hilton Garden Inn - luxury! The Satena flight to Inírida was on time and after checking in to our hotel we went birding in the afternoon with local guide, Daniel, of Orinoco Nature Tours. There was a slight breeze which helped as it was very hot. We drove along the rubbish-strewn Gaumal Road to visit an area of white-sand forest and savanna adding several new birds to our list, including Brown Jacamar, Golden-spangled Piculet, Rufous-crowned and Plain-crested Elaenias, Least Nighthawk and heard an Ash-throated Crake.

Nov. 25th - Inírida

Woke early to see lightning and to hear the wind then thunderclaps followed by torrential rain and a power cut. We waited for the rain to ease off and left the hotel at 09:30 for the Sabanitas community village where soon after our arrival Brendan spotted a Sunbittern sauntering between the houses! We walked slowly through the white-sand forest for about three hours seeing a pair of Slate-colored Hawks and eventually our main target, Capuchinbird. An excellent lunch was cooked for us by members of the community who made us very welcome. Late afternoon we drove to Caño Culebra which was very quiet but where a Crested Eagle had been photographed a week or so prior to our visit. A large raptor was glimpsed flying away but unfortunately was not identifiable.

Nov. 26th - Inírida

This morning we took a boat across the Río Inírida where we were joined by a sharp-eyed member of the local Guardia Indigenia. Along the river were several Black-collared Swallows. We birded the Matraca Trail (varzea forest) where it was very hot and sweaty but worth it for many new birds, including Varzea Schiffornis, Chestnut-capped and Collared Puffbirds, Cream-colored Woodpecker, Black Bushbird, Wire-tailed Manakin, Rufous-capped Antthrush, Orinoco Softtail and Orinoco Piculet! One highlight was watching a Buff-breasted Wren bathing repeatedly in the cup of a large white fungus - quite delightful. After lunch we explored Caño Cunuben by

boat, failing to find Sungrebe but there was some consolation in seeing Orinoco River Dolphin.

Nov. 27th - Inírida

A brief foray along a trail in woodland opposite our hotel for Spot-winged Antbird then across the river again to the El Paujil trail which was fairly quiet. Best birds were Blue-crowned Trogon and Rose-breasted Chat, and on the way back a surprise sighting of two Common Terns on a sand bar. After lunch

the boat took us downriver then up the Río Guaviare to a very modest one-family settlement at La Rompida. Our target was the so-called Unnamed Antshrike which we duly saw very well. On our way back to Inírida at dusk we paused to watch a group of Bandtailed Nighthawks hawking low over the water where the rivers met. Our spotlights attracted the attention of a vigilant Colombian Navy patrol boat, all of the crew being armed with assault rifles and dressed in commando outfits, but we soon satisfied them that we were harmless. Back at the jetty in Inírida town we observed good numbers of Sandcolored Nighthawks feeding around some brightly-lit buildings.

Nov. 28th - Inírida

Out today from 05:45 to 17:00 - exhausting! We first visited the Yapacana Antbird Reserve (Ecoparque KENKE) and after close views of a pair of said bird continued on the Sendero Flor de Inírida trail. Highlights included Spotted Puffbird, Saffron-crested Tyrant-manakin, Red-shouldered Tanager, and a Campina Thrush hopping about among the houses. Before lunch our tuk-tuks took us to Caño Vitina where we connected with Purplebreasted and Pompadour Cotingas. Back at the centre the ladies had prepared a traditionallycooked feast for us and we were glad of the brief shower which necessitated a siesta. A Russet-crowned Crake was later attracted to playback from the dormitory at the centre.

Late afternoon we returned to Sabanitas to try for Pale-bellied Mourner again but without success.

Nov. 29th - Inírida, flight to Bogotá

Our Satena flight to Bogotá had been rescheduled but we still had time to revisit Sabanitas where we did eventually see the *Myiarchus*-like Pale-bellied Mourner - third time lucky! After a futile trip to Caño Culebra for potential Crested Eagle we drove into town to watch Orange-crowned Yellow-finch feeding on some rice put out for them on the pavement. Our flight time was changed again so we had plenty of time to shower and finish packing. Quite nice to have a few hours to relax at the Hilton Garden Inn in Bogotá when we eventually arrived.

Nov. 30th - Bogotá to Villavicencio, Finca La Herreria


04:00 start this morning to beat the traffic which we did until a few minutes away from our first destination, the town of Guayabetal, when a problem at one of the tunnels delayed us briefly. Jeeps were waiting to drive us from the town for over an hour up a bumpy, steep road to Finca La Herreria. By the time we arrived it was raining quite heavily so we had a drink before the short walk to the hide which the family have erected for guests to enjoy and photograph a very special bird: the recently described Cundinamarca Antpitta. The bird was already waiting to be fed and was at times too close to photograph - oh that more antpittas were so obliging! Ochre-breasted Brush-finch was also seen on the nearby

hillside. Shaira, the Herrero's 8-year-old daughter, gave us a wonderful talk, in English, explaining how this blackberry farm had become a nature reserve. After a good breakfast we walked one of the trails where Brown-breasted Parakeets were calling but not showing themselves. Another delicious meal before we left for the drive downhill back to our minibus, birding along the way and seeing two Greenbellied Hummingbirds and a White-browed Antbird. Drove to Villavicencio.

Dec. 1st - Villavicencio to San José del Guaviare, Bosque Bavaria, Puente Nowen

05:15 drove the short distance to Bosque Bavaria where we ate our boxed breakfast before walking the track until mid-morning. Good birds included: Yellow-mandibled Sparrow, White-chested Puffbird, Yellow-billed Nunbird, White-chinned Jacamar and Amazonian Motmot. We were surprised to see a very large Green Iguana stationary on the track; sadly it had a broken leg and there was nothing we could do for it. A long drive to San José del Guaviare followed with a few stops en route, notably at Puente Nowen where the marshes held Scarlet Ibis, Snail Kite, Horned Screamer, Limpkin and other wetland species.

Dec. 2nd - San José del Guaviare

Met our local guide, Wilbur, and drove to Buena Vista close to the Río Guaviare where we quickly found Scarlet-crowned Barbet. Some other species seen were Dugand's Antwren, Orange-eyed Flatbill, Solitary Cacique and Grey Seedeater. We also saw several Golden-brown Uacari monkeys and a group of Proboscis Bats roosting under the footbridge. In the afternoon we took a boat to Playas del Río Guaviare, a river island where it was very hot and some of the group were feeling unwell with upset stomachs. We managed to find Lesson's Seedeater, River Tyrannulet and Orinoco Goose.

Dec. 3rd - San José del Guaviare, Raudal del Guayabero, Puente Nowen

04:30 start for the 90-minute drive to Raudal del Guayabero where Sooty-capped Hermits were buzzing among the buildings. We then took a boat through the most amazing gorge before disembarking to bird terra firme forest for the main target, Brown Nunlet. Apart from a nice Amazonian Royal Flycatcher the birding was rather quiet and the Common Woolly Monkeys were a nice diversion. We returned to the village for lunch where the villagers were busy putting up Christmas decorations and a Nativity scene in the centre of the village. Our guide decided we should try birding the far end of the trail we'd been on in the morning. However our driver refused to take his newish 4x4 up the fairly rough track. We began walking and spent some time getting acceptable views of a fast-flying Stripe-necked Tody-tyrant. The forest was a long way off from where we were and there was no shade; with some of the group still unwell we decided to head back to San José. We visited Puente Nowen again where we saw our only Capped Heron of the tour.

Dec. 4th - San José del Guaviare, Playa Guio, flight to Yopal via Bogotá

A lovely morning at Playa Guio being paddled silently to the Laguna Negra; sadly no Sungrebe although we did see lots of Hoatzins, Silvered Antbird, Great Potoo and a White-rumped Sirystes. On the way back to town we saw Purple-throated Fruitcrow and at a wetland on the edge of town there was a Slender-billed Kite. We walked to the airport from our hotel as it was across the road from it and yet

again our flight was delayed and it was touch-and-go as to whether we would make it to Bogotá in time for our connecting flight to Yopal. Fortunately the Yopal flight was delayed and we made it in time.

Dec. 5th - travel day, Yopal to Hato La Aurora

Left Yopal at 05:00 for the long drive to Hato La Aurora arriving at the Ecolodge Juan Solito at midday, having stopped en route for boxed breakfast and birding. Best birds on the journey were Sharp-tailed Ibis, Pale-headed Jacamar and good views of Crested Bobwhite. After lunch we met our lodge guide, Jeremiah, and birded in the lodge grounds seeing Two-banded Puffbird, White-bearded Flycatcher and Masked Cardinal. As we walked back to the lodge we casually asked our guide if there was any chance of seeing Giant Anteater on the estate and were told that one had been seen that afternoon close to the lodge and if we went quickly it might still be around! Jeremiah went to find the drivers and we followed after a brief detour to our rooms. We crammed into one jeep and raced to a small area of woodland where we soon found the anteater snuffling for ants amongst the tree roots and fallen branches. We watched until it disappeared from view, delighted to have fulfilled an ambition.

Dec. 6th - Hato La Aurora

We had arranged with Jeremiah that he would come to get us at first light if the anteater was still around which meant that, when news came that it was still showing, we immediately deserted our breakfasts. It was such a pleasure to watch this magnificent mammal ambling through the vegetation, pausing occasionally to sniff the air. Plain Thornbirds were also found around their huge stick nests in the same area. Satisfied, we returned to our cold scrambled eggs. We crossed the river where an African safari-style vehicle waited to take us across the open scrubby savanna as far as the wetlands. Apart from a distant Azure Gallinule, two Yellowish Pipits, Grassland Sparrow and an Aplomado Falcon, the lakes were rather



disappointing with just a few common waders, ducks and herons. After lunch back at the lodge we returned to the boat to go upriver looking for Crestless Curassow, but to no avail. However we did have amazing views of three Sunbitterns and a large Caiman with part of a mammal dangling from its jaws. A Tropical Screech-owl showed very well close to the dining room at the lodge in the evening.

Dec. 7th - Hato La Aurora

05:30 breakfast before crossing the river where two vehicles were waiting to take us back across the savanna but this time as far as the main house at Hato La Aurora where we birded the grounds, seeing Crane Hawk, King Vulture, some Spectacled Parrotlets and good views of the localised Venezuelan Troupial. Back at the lodge there was no vehicle available for us after lunch so some of the group set off on foot to bird along the entrance drive. It soon became apparent that it was too hot with no shade and very few birds. As there was a boat for us we had one last go at finding a curassow but without any success.

Dec. 8th - Hato La Aurora to Yopal, flight to Bogotá

We left the lodge at 06:30 for Yopal with stops en route for White-tailed Goldenthroat. Our 15:20 Satena flight to Bogotá had been delayed so our guide managed to get us on the earlier 11:00 flight which had also been delayed - confusing! We finally left Yopal at approx. 16:00, arriving at Hilton Garden Inn at

17:50. After 45 minutes trying to check-in for our Air Europa flight home (we were being asked to pay extra for the seats the airline had assigned to us!) we gave up and went for our last dinner all together.

Dec. 9th - Bogotá, Sumapaz NP, Chicaque NR, flight to London

Last birding day so a very early 04:00 departure from the hotel, arriving at the paramo in Sumapaz NP at 05:50 after picking up a young lady from the parks department - seems it was necessary to be accompanied. It was cold, misty and drizzling when we walked from the lagoon down to the marsh for Noble Snipe where a pair of Northern Tawny Antpittas and Apolinar's Wren also put in an appearance. It took a while to find our main targets, Green-bearded Helmetcrest, Chestnut-winged Cinclodes, Andean Tit-spinetail and Rufous-browed Conebill, before we drove on to the army checkpoint where we had good views of a stunning Red-rumped Bush-tyrant. We still had plenty of time before our evening flight so we drove to Chicaque NP for a key target for some of the group. The feeders at the restaurant did not disappoint with great views of Golden-bellied Starfrontlet. The area around the toilet block also proved fruitful with two Chestnut-crowned Antpittas and an elusive Ash-colored Tapaculo. Further up the road a small feeding flock included a Plushcap and several Yellow-fronted Whitestarts. We left the reserve at 15:00 allowing lots of time to get to the airport just in case there were any holdups. Once at the airport we packed wellies away in our cases and settled in the Crepes & Waffle restaurant for drinks and to catch up on the checklist. Our flight inevitably was delayed for half-an-hour and after an uncomfortable eight-and-a-half hours of not sleeping we arrived in Madrid. From then all went smoothly and we landed at Gatwick on time on 10th December.
















