#### ORGANIZATIONAL/ORIENTATION MEETING WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TUESDAY, APRIL 19, 2022

### **ELECTION OF COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN**

County Clerk Ertmer, called for nominations for Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. Motion by Supervisor Gabert to nominate Supervisor Tom Egan as Chairman.

Motion by Supervisor Norton and seconded by Supervisor Powers to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Supervisor Egan. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Supervisor Egan was seated as County Board Chairman. Chairman Egan thanked the Board for their support.

## **APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES**

Chairman Egan will serve as the fifth member of this committee. They will meet at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, April 22, 2022 at the County Administration Building conference room to assign supervisors to committees.

#### **ORIENTATION SESSION**

**Explanation of County Board Room Voting System, -** Patty Francour, Director of Information Systems, explained the use of iPads and how beneficial they will be in County Board meetings. A survey will be sent to all members to determine if anyone is interested in training for use of the iPads.

# Explanation of the Functions of the Corporation Counsel's Office and the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors' Ethics Handbook

Mary Anne Mueller, Corporation Counsel, gave a brief presentation on the duties of the Corporation Counsel. She congratulated everyone for being elected to the board. They provide legal counsel and representation to all Winnebago County Department Heads, Committees, Commissions and Boards, Board of Supervisors and the County Executive. Ms. Mueller provided the source of procedural rules that need to be followed: Wisconsin State Statute, Chapter 59 – Open Meetings Laws; Local Ordinances and Rules; and Roberts Rules of Order.

Ethics Handbook – Corporation Counsel Mueller provided a power point presentation regarding the ethics handbook. This book provides statutes, ordinances and sources that refer to ethics. She explained how to bring business before the board and getting noticed on the floor. Ms. Mueller discussed open meeting laws; walking quorums; and negative quorums. Public records were another item that was addressed. She strongly encouraged using the county e-mail account that was assigned to everyone. If anyone has any questions, do not hesitate to contact the Corporation Counsel's office.

<u>Personnel / Payroll Information</u> – Mike Collard, Director of Human Resources, stated that everyone should have received a packet in the mail containing documents that need to be completed and returned to the Human Resources Department before being reimbursed for meetings, mileage, etc. Mr. Collard explained that supervisors are eligible for Health and Dental Insurance. Supervisors would be responsible for the full premium for the insurance. Contact the Human Resources Department with any questions.

**iPads and Supervisors' E-mail Account Information** – Patty Francour, Director of Information Systems, explained the importance of using the County's e-mail address that is provided to everyone, especially in regard to open records request.

WHEREAS, it is a pleasure, honor and a privilege to represent County government for all of the residents of Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, county government stresses democracy and representation and strives for fair representation in all county-related issues; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County takes pride in the multitude of districts it serves; and

WHEREAS, every member should have a chance to serve as a Supervisor on a committee; and

WHEREAS, incumbents statistically remain on the same committees longer than new members; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest for our constituents as well as Supervisors, to work on a rotation of issues instead of staying on the same committee and working on the same issues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors all Supervisors, whether appointed or elected, shall be limited to four full terms serving on a committee starting April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. A term is defined by the term of office of a Winnebago County Board Supervisor, which is typically two years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Committee on Committees must adhere to this Resolution when assigning Supervisors to committees at every organizational meeting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that if it is discovered that a Supervisor has been serving on a committee longer than four full terms, the County Board Chair will automatically appoint and/or replace that Supervisor to a new committee, to be ratified by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors by a majority vote at the next business meeting.

- 26.2 County Supervisors are expected to individually contribute to a collaborative effort to set a vision and strategic mission goals and make broad policy decisions that support the strategic mission to advance the priorities of the county. Examples of such activities, include, but are not limited to:
  - 1. Participating in the process of debate and voting on proposed ordinances, resolutions and motions in County Board and Committee meetings;
  - 2. Providing policy and direction to the management of the county regarding delivery of county services while refraining from the delivery, management or administration of daily operations of the county;
  - 3. Being responsive to the needs of their constituency through effective communication;
  - 4. Establishing priorities for the delivery of county services through the annual budget and tax levy.

# EQUINE COMPLEX 2022 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Adam Breest, Director of Parks & Expo Center, presented the 2022 Capital Improvement Project for the Equine Complex located at the Sunnyview Expo Center.

There are four phases to this project:

- Phase One: Existing Barn Lights There are 80 lights in this facility. The plan is to replace the current lights with LED lights. The budget for this project is \$55,000. With the new lights, they feel they would save \$5,200 annually.
- Phase Two: Existing Barn Pavement The pavement is separating, spider-cracking and sinking. Cleanup from animal shows in this area is difficult. The road pitches toward the barns. The plan is to have the Highway Department complete this project. The budget for this project is \$60,000.
- Phase Three: Existing Conditions Entrance Placing gutters over door entrances to the buildings to stop the rain and erosion in front of the doors. The budget for this project is \$12,000.
- Phase Four: Existing Insulation Having trouble with the existing insulation and would like to paint the steel. Concerns regarding sand-blasting to be able to paint will disrupt the insulation. Plans are to hold this phase until the fall to study the best process for this phase. The budget for this project is \$115,000.00. This would not include the insulation.

Total cost for the three proposed projects would be \$127,000. Paint estimate would be \$115,000. The 2022 Capital Improvement plan budget was projected at a total of \$190,000. Prices have increased slightly for the lights and asphalt.

Director Breest and Rick Helms, Parks Operations Manager, then took questions from the board. A copy of this presentation is available in the County Clerk's Office, 112 Otter Avenue, Oshkosh.

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the update process has been extended. Since Winnebago County is already in the update process, Winnebago County is not considered non-compliant;

WHEREAS, updating the plan is required to remain compliant with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM) agency; and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Emergency Management Committee reviewed the current "Winnebago County Hazard Mitigation Plan" and determined:

1. Natural disasters pose a tangible threat to residents and property;

2. Undertaking hazard mitigation actions before disasters occur reduces the potential for harm to residents and property and saves taxpayer dollars;

3. Winnebago County participated jointly in the planning update process with other local units of government within the County to prepare an updated hazard mitigation plan;

- 4. The plan is in the public's best interests;
- 5. The plan serves as a general strategy and may be amended from time to time;

6. Nothing in this plan obligates Winnebago County to undertake any of the recommended activities and/or projects; and

7. Adoption of the plan is needed to apply for federal funding for mitigation projects and to comply with state and federal mandates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby finds

that:

- 1. Natural disasters continue to pose a tangible threat to residents and property of Winnebago County;
- 2. The undertaking of hazard mitigation actions before disasters occur reduces the potential for harm to residents and property and will ultimately save taxpayer dollars; and

3. Adoption of the "Winnebago County Hazard Mitigation Plan" is in the public's best interests.

WHEREAS, the Biden Administration recently announced the signing of a proposed rule to revise the definition of Waters of the United States (WOTUS); and

WHEREAS, the proposed rule expands federal jurisdiction by changing the WOTUS definition to include waters that significantly affect the chemical, physical, or biological integrity of traditional navigable waters, interstate waters, and the territorial seas (the "foundational waters") and waters that are relatively permanent or that have a continuous surface connection to such waters; and

WHEREAS, the proposed WOTUS definition directly impacts local governments as owners and operators of local infrastructure, co-regulators and stewards of the environment; and

WHEREAS, counties own and operate public safety water conveyances, stormwater municipal separate stormwater sewer systems (MS4), green infrastructure construction and maintenance projects, water reuse and infrastructure, and emergency management readiness; and

WHEREAS, counties may need to apply for a federal permit to maintain or build new infrastructure projects such as: roads and roadside ditches, flood control channels, drainage conveyances, culverts, bioswales, vegetative buffers, constructed wetlands, stormwater detention ponds, etc.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby supports the National Association of Counties (NACo) position which advocates for a definition that is consistent with traditionally navigable waters, territorial seas, their regularly flowing tributaries, and abutting wetlands.







When the CTH CB capital road project was completed in 2000, a traditional "T" intersection was constructed at the intersection of CTH CB and CTH JJ. Due to lower traffic counts at the time of construction the intersection was able to operate in a sufficient manner. #### Background:

CTH AP was reconstructed in 2006 and with the increased average daily traffic, it has created unsafe conditions to ingress/egress onto CTH AP and for pedestrians to cross the roadway. The feasibility study that was completed in 2020 recommended that a center turn lane with one lane in each direction and designated bike lanes. This recommendation is the safest and most cost-effective alternative outside of another total reconstruction, which would be very costly and unnecessary due to the age of the roadway. In conjunction with this proposed project, a mutual agreement was made in 2021 between the City of Menasha, the Menasha Joint School District and Winnebago County to fund the installation of a high intensity activated crosswalk (HAWK) on CTH AP, at the Maplewood Middle School crosswalk. The four-lane road configuration has created unsafe crossing conditions for students at Maplewood Middle School and with approved funding to complete the prosed project, will provide safe crossing and safe driving conditions on CTH AP.




Location Map Photo of present pavement condition







#### Background:

The Highway Department's main facility on CTH Y was originally constructed in 1995 and has not received any building or system upgrades since that time.

The mechanical control system, HVAC and carbon monoxide system need to be upgraded and replaced. The truck storage area is too small and cannot accommodate the fleet of equipment owned by the Highway Department. The front office area requires remodeling, mold mitigation and a larger conference/training room. The existing meeting/training room is located in the mezzanine above the mechanic's shop area and doesn't function well or meet ADA requirements.

The aging fuel and petroleum system does not function well, causing fueling issues with other county departments using our fueling service. The most affected are the Highway and Sheriff departments.

#### **Policy Discussion:**

The requested 300,000.00 will initiate design services that will identify possible options of upgrades of systems, utilization of storage/office space and overall projected costs of a proposed building renovation.

LIEUTENANT – CORRECTIONS DIVISION

DEPARTMENT: SHERIFF'S OFFICE

PAY BASIS: SALARIED

#### PURPOSE AND SUMMARY:

Oversees and supervises daily operations of the Corrections Division. In the absence of the Corrections Captain is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Corrections Division. Supervises corrections deputies and civilian members, and coordinates routine operations.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

- 1. Performs supervisory duties for the Corrections Division members. Oversees the Work Release Unit and specialty programming. Oversees the Corrections Division Field Training Officer program. Ensures that routine security inspections of the facility and equipment are consistently completed, with cleanliness or damage being properly documented. Oversees maintenance of the facility including the repair order process. Conducts inmate discipline and related due process hearings. Serves as the point of contact for all programs for incarcerated inmates to include inmate worker programs, community service, GED, AA, NA, and religious programming. Oversees all activities of the Work Release Unit.
- 2. In the absence of the Corrections Captain, assumes responsibility and decision making authority for the Corrections Division. Creates, maintains, and modifies Agency General Orders, Directives, procedures, and records to ensure compliance with Wisconsin States Statutes and Wisconsin Administrative Code. Makes sound decisions based on General Orders, Directives, and past practice. Completes assignments independently and without close supervision. Isolates and identifies problems, evaluates alternative courses of action, makes logical decisions, employs good judgement, common sense, and knows when and what type of action is appropriate.
- 3. Organizes, distributes, and delegates work to subordinates fairly and impartially. Provides clear and appropriate direction to employees. Provides training and coaching to subordinates. Ensures that staff has the resources and flexibility to perform, improve, and learn in their jobs. Keeps open communication with subordinates, listens to them, and provides feedback. Positively motivates, mentors, and leads employees. Provides appropriate and timely performance evaluations for all subordinates.

#### ADDITIONAL ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- 1. Ensures effective operations through supervision and direction of divisional activities.
- 2. Ensures that the Winnebago County Jail is operated according to Wisconsin Administrative Code, Wisconsin State Statutes, Federal statutes, and recognized best practices.
- 3. Ensures the maintenance of professional standards among subordinate personnel.
- 4. Reviews all division incident reports to ensure thorough investigations are completed and dispositions are reached.
- 5. Maintains an accurate key log and inventory, orders replacement locks and keys, and ensures that security devices are inspected and functional.
- 6. Responds to inmate grievances while ensuring due process and statutory requirements are met.

- 7. Assists in the training of all division members.
- 8. Serves as the Sheriff's Office liaison on special committees or community groups.
- 9. Ensures a positive working relationship between the divisions and other officials, agencies, and persons.
- 10. Ensures that the personnel functions of the division are performed according to established procedures and policies.
- 11. Conducts internal investigations as assigned by the Sheriff or Chief Deputy.
- 12. Performs all other duties as assigned by the Sheriff or designee.

### WORK RELATIONSHIPS:

- 1. Reports to the Corrections Captain.
- 2. Directly supervises twelve (12) Sergeants, three (3) Officers in Charge, and indirectly supervises 53 Deputies and 20 civilian members.
- Works closely with the all divisions of the Sheriff's Office, and interacts regularly with other criminal justice professionals and members of the community.

#### **Background:**

Created in 2011 and originally designed for repeat drunken driving offenders, the 24/7 Alcohol Program quickly expanded to include any offense involving alcohol. In 2014, this program further expanded, with the creation of a second, companion 24/7 Drug Program. Since the inception of these programs, Winnebago County judges have assigned the 24/7 Alcohol program in 3,227 cases and assigned the 24/7 Drug program in 628 cases. While these programs have been successful, we have determined the resources and support offered by the Human Services Department are better suited to overall program sustainability. Their resources can assist clients with major mental health issues along with their substance use, therefore these programs have been transferred to that department.

In the past the community programs position was assigned to two people. In 2015 with position changes and reorganization it was reduced to one. Over time the need for all deputies to be more involved in the community has increased and many tasks are now shared.

The timing of the 2 retirements within one month of each other coincided with reviewing all position duties and the clear need for supervision in the Jail. The Correction Division is one of the highest liability areas for Winnebago County. The addition of a Lieutenant during evening hours will help mitigate the risk with a tighter span of control for staff. The addition of a supervisory position in the Corrections Division will provide a command level oversight and support of jail operations.

#### **Policy Discussion:**

As Treatment and diversion programs have come to the forefront the need to move management of the 24/7 Sobriety Programs to the Human Services Connect Program for continuity of operations has become evident. Consolidating job duties with more streamlined technology along with the impending retirements afforded us the opportunity at the county level to move the program to Connect and look at our staffing needs in other areas.


With impending retirements of the Corrections Financial Associate on May 2, 2022 and the Community Services Police Officer on June 6, 2022 we were compelled to do a self-assessment of position duties and assignment of staff. In reference to the position fill request the alternatives to filling both of these positions were to assign duties to other staff. The movement of the 24/7 program and greater community outreach among all of our staff allowed us eliminate both of these positions.


The elimination of the 2 positions and the addition of one position gives us a net savings of \$56,665.





#### Background:

The Marine 1 Boathouse is located on the Fox River at the end of Broad Street, adjacent to the railroad trestle. The boathouse was constructed in 1952 by the City of Oshkosh to be used to store the Oshkosh Police Department Patrol Boat. The wet-bay was constructed with wooden pylons and sea walls, and the boathouse was a steel frame structure clad in metal sheeting.

The City of Oshkosh Common Council voted to transfer ownership of the boathouse to Winnebago County in a quit claim action in 1980. Shortly after taking possession of the boathouse the County removed the metal structure from the foundation and had the wet-bay rebuilt, again using wood pylons and sea walls. The materials used in the construction had a life expectancy of 30-40 years. The original metal structure was placed back onto the new foundation.

The boathouse is centrally located within the waterways of Winnebago County and provides for the best emergency response to incidents on Lake Winnebago and the surrounding waterways. Since 1980 the Marine 1 Boathouse has been used by the Sheriff's Office to house the largest of the Sheriff's Office boats (Marine 1), which is the most capable boat to handle the large waves and adverse conditions that can occur on Lake Winnebago during severe weather events.

Marine 1 is the Sheriff's Office primary search and rescue vessel for Lake Winnebago, and acts as the primary platform for Dive/Rescue operations.

In March of 2021 it was found that the wooden seawalls in the wet-bay had rotted through in several places and the boathouse was starting to fill with gravel and sediment. Additionally, the South/East corner of the boathouse had sunk about 6 inches because the foundation structure had been compromised. With the low water levels on the Lake Winnebago system at the time, and the sediment filling the wet-bay, the vessel could not be moved in or out of the boathouse safely.

The discovery of the failing structure prompted an effort to replace the wet-bay which had been in existence for approximately 40 years and had reached the end of life expectancy. This also prompted an effort to replace the boathouse structure which had been in place since 1952, and needed repairs. With current technology in treated lumber and pylons used in the construction of wet-bays the life expectancy of a new wet-bay would be 50 to 70 years.

At the March 18, 2021 County Board meeting funding (\$322,850) was approved for a capital project to repair the slip and boathouse. Subsequent to the funding approval, the design and permitting process began.

The project design was completed and the project went out to bid in January 2022. Only one bid was received in February for the work. Design costs were \$48,680 and are already expended. Radtke Contractors bid \$465,536 for the boathouse repair project. This exceeds the remaining approved budget or \$274,170. Additional funding, \$238,370, is required to allow this project to move forward and to provide a 10% contingency. The additional funding would come from the Undesignated General Fund Balance, the source of the original funding.

# Policy Discussion:

Public works are projects consisting of the construction, repair, renovation, or maintenance of public buildings, structures, sewers, water works, roads, bridges, docks, underpasses and viaducts, as well as any other improvement to be constructed, repaired or renovated or maintained on public property to be paid, in whole or in part, with public funds or with financing to be retired with public funds in the form of lease payments or otherwise.

Public works projects are subject to State statutes 59.52 and 66.09 for the bidding and award of contracts.

59.52(29) requires all public work that exceeds \$25,000 to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

66.09(1m) requires; 1) the bidding shall be on the basis of sealed competitive bids, and 2) the contract shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

Sealed bid responses were solicited and received from Radtke Contractors. Radtke was determined to be a responsible bidder. They met the requirement that they have completed at

least one project that involved similar work and the project was at least 50% of the project being bid. Radtke has access to all necessary equipment and has the capacity and technical competence to complete the work. They have provided the necessary bonds. They have been in business for more than 12 months. They are eligible to do business in the State. The County has limited actions available. The County can award the bid if there are sufficient funds. If funding is insufficient, the County can seek additional funding or decline to award the bid.

This project would need to be changed significantly in order to rebid. This project is relatively simple. There is no opportunity to reduce the scope of work significantly to rebid and still provide a facility that will provide the security and shelter needed for Marine 1.





## Background:

Flooring in Direct Supervision Pod 1, Direct Supervision Pod 2 and C-Pod is original to the building which was constructed in 2003. Due to the age of the facility and high use there are increasing areas in need of ongoing repair and the upkeep and maintenance on the current flooring include areas of disrepair and creates undue hardship for daily jail operations. The areas of flooring in question are directly where the inmates are housed and we have an affirmative obligation to maintain the safety and security of both the inmates and the facility.

## Policy Discussion:

The jail improvement fund is a separate fund created under the Wisconsin state statute that states in section 302.46 (2) counties may make payments for construction, remodeling, repair or improvement of county jails and for costs related to providing educational and medical services to inmates from county jail funds.

Public work projects are subject to state statute 55.52(29) All public work, including any contract for the construction, repair, remodeling or improvement of any public work, building, or furnishing of supplies or material of any kind where the estimated cost of such work will exceed \$25,000 shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

Sealed bid responses were solicited and received. Schleis Floor Covering and was determined to be a responsible bidder. Schleis Floor Covering has all of the necessary equipment, capacity and technical

competence to complete the work. They have provided the necessary bonds and are eligible to do business in the state.

<u>General Description</u>: The Parks Department is proposing improvements and renovations to the Sunnyview Expo Center lights and barn areas.

## **Background:**

The Sunnyview Expo Center Equine Facility was constructed in the early 1990's. Many shows are hosted annually with most returning year after year since its inception. The equine center is considered the jewel of the Midwest due to its size, multitude of barns and arenas, and ease of access. The covered arena, nestled in amongst the trees attracts many riders from outside the area and the state for its country feel. While the equine center was state of the art when installed, it has declined over the years due to lack of proper upkeep. The main structural beams of the covered arena are starting to rust, the roof insulation has become a haven for birds to pull nesting material, the lighting has outlived its cost effectiveness and the paved areas around the barns are showing their age as well.

## **COST ESTIMATES**

Arena/Barns LED Lighting: \$55,000 Barn Blacktop Improvements/Repair: \$60,000 Barn Gutters: \$12,000

Total Project Cost: \$127,000

# Justification:

Replacing all of the current light fixtures within the barn areas and covered arena with LED fixtures will provide a cost savings on our monthly electrical bills. This return on this investment will only take approximately 1.4 years. The gutters will provide a better experience for our patrons and direct the water away from doorways and entrances to the barns. The blacktop repairs will provide a better experience for our patrons and save staff time from having to clean manure and trash from gravel areas.

Painting the steel within the covered arena will prolong the life of the outdoor arena structure before the rust would take over and cause extensive repairs. Parks staff needs to look at more options for this portion of the project and will be bringing this back to the County Board later in 2022 for more discussion and action.

# **Exhibit A**

- **19.01 DEFINITIONS:** Unless otherwise stated, the following terms shall have the meaning as defined in this section.
  - (1) ARCHEOLOGICAL SITE. Archeological site means any tract of land owned or acquired by Winnebago County due to the unusual or unique historical or archeological significance that the area possesses.
  - (2) CAMPGROUND. Campground includes those tracts of county park land specifically designed for camping purposes.
  - (3) CAMPING UNIT. Camping unit means any single shelter used for a camp by a camping party, except sleeping bags, hammocks and shelters used exclusively for dining purposes.
  - (4) CAMPSITE. Campsite refers to a section of a campground which is designated for camping use by a camping unit or camping party.
  - (5) COMMITTEE. Committee means the County Parks and Recreation Committee.
  - (6) DIRECTOR. Means the Director of County Parks.
  - (7) DOG PARK. Park Properties officially designed for exercise of dogs off leash.
  - (8) NATURE AREA. Nature area shall include all tracts of County Park land specifically set aside for environmental preservation, nature study and for environmental interpretation purposes.
  - (9) PARK. Park shall include the grounds, buildings thereon, waters therein, of the parks, river and lake access sites and other recreational areas which are now or may hereafter be under the control of the County Parks and Recreation Committee.
  - (10) PERSON. Person includes any individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association of persons and the singular number includes the plural.
  - (11) PICNIC AREA. Picnic area means any tract of land developed and maintained for picnicking including adjacent playground and playfield areas containing not less than five picnic tables.
  - (12) RECREATION TRAIL. Recreation trail designates any parcel of land owned or obtained by easement by the County which is used for snowmobiling, hiking or bicycling purposes.
  - (13) SERVICE CENTER. Building located adjacent to the Community Park Swimming Lake facilities providing outreach services that help support Parks Department

program functions.

- (14) SERVICE CENTER STAFF. Service Center Staff means the assigned individual(s) (or appointed substitute when needed) designated by the Director who facilitate the operation of the Service Center.
- (15) SPECIAL EVENT. Special event means any planned occurrence on county owned park land including but not limited to parades, gatherings, festivals, and athletic events which is not within the normal and ordinary use of the public premises or place or which, by nature of the event, may have a greater impact on County services or resources than would have occurred had the event not taken place. Whether the event is considered within the normal, ordinary, or intended use of the park land shall be determined by the County. Special events are typically an event where the event organizers invite the general public to participate in the event whether or not the event charges a fee.
- (16) SWIMMING LAKE. Refers to the water and beachfront area of the Community Park contained within a fenced enclosure and designated as a swim and leisure activity area by standard regulatory markers and posted notices.
- (17) SUNNYVIEW EXPOSITION CENTER. Specifically means the County- owned land officially designated as the exposition center site and operated as such.
- (18) VEHICLE. Vehicle means any device by which a person or property may be transported and which is self-propelled.

## 19.13 PETS AND ANIMALS.

(1) No domesticated animals shall be allowed onto Park property, except as follows:

- a Leashed animals are allowed on the WIOUWASH and Mascoutin Valley State Recreation Trails and at specified times at the Sunnyview Exposition Center during scheduled events and per the edicts set-forth within the Sunnyview Exposition Center Policy Statement/Administrative Directive.
- b Persons shall be allowed to have domesticated animals on-leash at County boat landings only when being transferred from vehicles to boats, or boats to vehicles.
- c Persons shall be allowed to have domesticated animals on-leash on the Community Park shared use path and such persons shall be permitted to utilize those Community Park parking lots that abut the shared use path to facilitate direct transfer of their animal(s) from vehicle to path, or from path to vehicle.
- d Within a designated Dog Park, specifically the Best Friends Dog Park located within the Community Park and the Jerry Finch Winnebago County Dog Park located in Fox Crossing.
- (3) With the exceptions as noted in Section 19.13(1) no person shall bring or

permit any domesticated animal onto Park property at any time unless the animal is on a leash of suitable strength with a maximum length of six (6) feet.

- (4) The following rules shall apply for the Best Friends Dog Park located in the Community Park and the Jerry Finch Winnebago County Dog Park located in Fox Crossing
  - a Dog owners use the park at their own risk.
  - b Dog owners are responsible for the actions and behavior of their dog.
  - c Dogs must be leashed until the dog is within the fenced perimeter of the dog park.
  - d Dogs must wear a collar or harness at all times.
  - e Owners must carry a leash at all times.
  - f Dogs must be under supervision and control at all times.
  - g Clean up dog waste before existing the dog park area.
  - h Dogs are not allowed on tables or benches.
  - i Dog must be licensed and have current rabies vaccinations.
  - j No more than 3 dogs allowed per owner.
  - k Discourage barking and digging. If your dog digs a hole, fill it in.
  - I Use common sense and courtesy at all times.
  - m Park hours for Jerry Finch Winnebago County Dog Park are 6am 10pm
  - n Park hours for Best Friends Dog Park is 7am 11pm
- (5) No person shall bring or permit any animal except a service animal access into any building or onto any Nature Area, nor onto any parkland including disc golf courses, rugby and soccer fields, prairie plantings, playgrounds or play areas, shade shelters, ballfields, ponds, picnic or lawn areas, or public event areas.
- (6) While on the Community Park shared use path domesticated animals shall yield to bicycles, strollers, roller bladders, skate boarders, walkers, runners, those using mobility assistance devices, and, with the exception of marked crosswalks, all motorized vehicles.
- (7) No leashed animals shall be allowed on the segment of shared use path within the Community Park soccer complex during sports tournament events unless written permission is granted by the Director.
- (8) Persons making use of either the Community Park on-leash or off-leash facilities shall be allowed to have no more than three dogs.
- (9) Animals must be under control at all times so they will not disturb the park setting or prevent the public from enjoying the facilities provided.
- (10) No person shall bring a horse into or ride a horse onto Park property except that horseback riding shall be permitted in areas specially designated for horses.
- (11) Nothing within Winnebago County General Code Chapter 19.13 shall prohibit or

restrict dogs from being present in posted off-leash dog park areas.

- (12) Service animals as defined by the ADA are allowed onto all Park property with on-leash restrictions excepting where these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices.
- (13) Owners are required to clean up any waste deposited by their domesticated animal and properly dispose of it off-site.
- (14) Rules set forth in Winnebago County General Code Chapter 19.13 may be waived by the Director or his/her designee as circumstances may require for fixed periods of time.

<u>General Description</u>: The Parks Department is proposing to amend Chapter.01 and 19.13 of the Winnebago County Code in order to include a definition of a dog park and the dog park rules.

The Parks Department recommends that the Parks and Recreation Committee recommends to the County Board to amend Chapter 19.01 and 19.13 of the Winnebago County Code to include the rules for the Best Friends and Jerry Finch Winnebago County Dog Parks.

#### **Background:**

In 2021, the Parks Department opened the Jerry Finch Winnebago County Dog park to the public with a soft opening. On May 10 of 2022, Winnebago County will host a ribbon cutting to officially open the dog park in Fox Crossing. Park staff have been working with the Fox Crossing police, parks, and community development departments in order to make sure that we create a good working relationship with the new dog park. Part of this process is working to make sure that the Winnebago County Code is enforceable in both dog parks. Parks staff have also met with the Oshkosh police department and the Friends of Winnebago County Dog Parks to ensure that there is a good line of communication and that the rules we create are enforceable and are not too restrictive. Once the rules have been solidified, park staff can finalize the signs at the park.

## Justification:

The Winnebago County Parks Department wants to ensure that dog owners have as little confusion as possible when going from one dog park to the other. The goal is to have a consistent set of rules between the two parks. The minor updates to the park rules will ensure that there is consistency between the two parks and that the rules are enforceable by law enforcement or by county staff. Park staff will continue to work with the Fox Crossing police department to see if there is anything we need to do within village ordinance to make sure the rules of the park are enforceable.

#### AGREEMENT

## RE: Use of Land for Kayak Rental & Storage Winnebago County Park System Winnebago County, Wisconsin

This LEASE AGREEMENT (agreement) by and between Winnebago County, a State of Wisconsin Municipal Corporation, hereinafter called "LESSOR", and MidWest Rental Company, c/o Michael Amos, 1000 Bauman St., Oshkosh, WI 54902; info@midwestrentalcompany.com; 920-915-0428, hereinafter called "LESSEE", provides as follows:

- <u>PURPOSE</u>. The purpose of this agreement is to incorporate the terms and conditions under which the LESSOR will permit LESSEE to conduct kayak rentals and storage at the Asylum Bay Boat Landing.
- TERM. The term of this agreement will begin June 1, 2022 and will continue thereafter to and including October 31, 2022.
- 3. LOCATION. Rental and storage of kayaks will be located at the Asylum Bay Boat Landing, 3400 Sherman Road, Oshkosh, WI 54901. Specific location of storage unit shown in "Exhibit B".
- LESSEES OBLIGATIONS. In addition to the foregoing, the undersigned, LESSEE, further agrees as follows:
  - A. Fifteen percent of the proceeds collected by LESSEE from the rental of kayaks located at the Asylum Bay Boat Landing will be paid to LESSOR no later than November 30, 2022.
  - B. By the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month, LESSEE will provide LESSOR with a monthly report on the rental sales from the previous month (i.e. A June sales report will be provided by July 15<sup>th</sup>).
  - C. LESSOR will supply a four-kayak storage rack at the Asylum Bay Boat Landing similar to the picture in "Exhibit C."
  - D. **LESSEE** will supply a locking mechanism for the kayaks. **LESSOR** is not responsible for damage or theft of the kayaks or other kayaking gear stored at the kayak rack.

- E. LESSEE may install one sign near the kayak storage rack with their logo and information related to the kayak rental offerings, which may include the LESSEE's contact information for the purpose of promoting the use of the kayak rack.
- F. **LESSOR** reserves the right at any time to move the kayak rack to an alternative location at the **Asylum Bay Boat Landing** if necessary.

#### 5. NAMING RIGHTS & RIGHT OF EXCLUSIVITY.

A. In the event the LESSOR enters into a naming rights, sponsorship, or pouring rights agreement for all or any part of the Asylum Bay Boat Landing, use of said name(s), and/or products shall replace all previous facility name references in all promotional and advertising materials used by LESSEE, and/or the LESSEE'S agents, vendors, or subcontractors, for the remainder of the lease.

#### 6. LESSEE LEGAL STATUS.

- A. LESSEE warrants that it has complied with all necessary requirements to do business in the State of Wisconsin and that the individual executing this agreement on its behalf and is fully authorized to do so.
- B. It is specifically understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be construed to create or evidence a partnership or joint venture between LESSOR and LESSEE and that both parties hereto are individually responsible for their respective debts and financial obligations. The LESSEE shall not make presentations to third parties contrary to the terms of this paragraph.

#### 7. INSURANCE.

A. LESSEE shall, at its own expense, obtain insurance in accordance with Exhibit "A" and shall provide proof of such insurance by June 1, 2022. The provisions of this contract and any duties placed upon LESSOR as a result thereof shall be null and void in the absence of LESSEE'S provision of a certificate of insurance indicating that coverage as is required herein.

#### 8. HOLD HARMLESS & WAIVER.

- A. LESSEE will indemnify and hold LESSOR harmless from all liabilities, judgments, costs, damages and expenses which may accrue against, be charged to, or recovered from the LESSOR by reasons or on account of damage to the property of the LESSOR or the property of, injury to, or death of any person arising from LESSEE'S activities under any circumstances, except when caused by the LESSOR'S sole negligence or by the joint negligence of the LESSOR and any persons other than the LESSEE or LESSEE'S subcontractors.
- B. To include the **LESSOR** on any waiver and release form signed by participants. A copy of the waiver and release form shall be provided to **LESSOR by June 1, 2022**.

#### 9. ASSIGNMENT/TRANSFER.

The **LESSEE** agrees it will not assign or transfer this Agreement without prior written consent of the **LESSOR**.

#### 10. TERMINATION OR DEFERMENT OF AGREEMENT.

- A. Should LESSEE or LESSOR fail to substantially comply with any material provision of this lease, LESSEE or LESSOR shall have the right to terminate this agreement if said breach occurs during the agreement period, upon five days written notice to LESSEE or LESSOR and upon LESSEE'S or LESSOR'S failure to cure said breach within 24 hours of receipt of said notice.
- B. At any time during the agreement period, should **LESSEE** or **LESSOR** fail to substantially comply with any material provision of this lease, **LESSEE** or **LESSOR** shall have the right to terminate this agreement and immediately cancel all further operations of the agreement. Additionally, given the early termination of the agreement for any reason whatsoever, **LESSEE** shall remain obligated to honor all terms and conditions of this

agreement as contained herein.

#### 11. NOTICES.

Any notices required pursuant to this agreement shall be considered provided upon deposit in the U.S. Mail, First Class postage affixed. Notices shall be mailed to the parties at the following addresses:

#### 12. DISCRIMINATION.

During the term of this agreement, **LESSEE** agrees not to discriminate against any person, whether a recipient of services (actual or potential), an employee, a guest, or an applicant for employment on the basis of race, sex, handicap, national origin, age cultural differences, sexual preference or marital status. Additionally, **LESSEE** agrees to comply with all ADA requirements applicable to the management and operation of **kayak rentals**.

#### 13. COMPIANCE WITH LAWS, ETC.

**LESSEE** agrees to comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations promulgated by **LESSOR** and any governmental unit having jurisdiction, applicable to the use of the **Asylum Bay Boat Landing** and to use said areas in compliance therewith.

#### 14. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

The entire agreement of the parties is contained herein and this agreement supersedes any and all oral agreements and negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. Should any part of this agreement be held to be invalid by a Court of law, said ruling shall not invalidate the remainder of this agreement.

#### 15. USE AND LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.

LESSEE understands that the LESSOR is bound by the Wisconsin Public Records Law, Wis. Stat.

sec. 19.21, et. seq. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 19.36(3), the LESSOR may be obligated to produce, to a third party, the records of LESSEE that are "produced or collected" by the LESSEE under this Agreement ("Records"). LESSEE is further directed to Wis. Stat. sec. 19.21, et. seq. for the statutory definition of Records subject to disclosure under this paragraph, and LESSEE acknowledges that it has read and understands that definition. Irrespective of any other term of this Agreement, LESSEE is (1) obligated to retain Records for seven years from the date of the Record's creation, and (2) produce such Records to the LESSOR if, in the LESSOR'S determination, the LESSOR is required to produce the records to a third party in response to a public records request. LESSEE'S failure to retain and produce Records as required by this paragraph shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement, and LESSEE must defend and hold the LESSOR harmless from liability due such breach.



Such insurance shall include a 30-day notice prior to cancellation or material policy change, which notice shall be given to the Winnebago County Insurance Administrator, c/o Winnebago County Courthouse, P.O. Box 2808, Oshkosh, Wisconsin 54903-2808. All such notices will name the LESSEE and identify the event.

## **Background:**

In 2021, the Parks Department began the process of looking at different options for providing a selfservice kayak rental station at some of the County's 7 boat landings. Through a conversation with the Oshkosh Convention and Visitor Bureau, parks staff met with MidWest Rental Company staff. Through conversations we decided to offer self-service kayak rentals at the Asylum Bay Boating Landing for 2022 as a trial run. MidWest Rental Company will provide the kayaks, paddles, life vests, online registration software, and staff. The Parks Department will provide the kayak rack at a cost of roughly \$800 through the 2022 operational budget. 15% of all rental fees will be paid to the Winnebago County Parks Department through a 1-year rental agree. The agreement is valid from June 1, 2022 – October 31, 2022. After this first year, the department and MidWest Rentals will evaluate the program for a possible continuation or expansion to other boat landings in 2023. Revenue from this program will go towards the Boat Landing fund for the department.

## Justification:

Renting kayaks to the general public provides a recreational opportunity to the residents of Winnebago County and tourists that may not own a kayak of their own. Also, the program has the opportunity to become a revenue generating program for the Parks Department and the boat landing program.

# RESOLUTION: Resolution Opposing the Mapping of a Flood Storage District for Sawyer Creek TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

7 WHEREAS, the city of Oshkosh conducted a Sawyer Creek Hydrology and Hydraulics Analysis that is based 8 on the mapping of lands outside the city limits as a flood storage district to serve the City of Oshkosh; and 9 WHEREAS, the lands that are proposed to be mapped are private property; and 10 WHEREAS, there is no evidence that the owners of these lands were consulted during the study the city 11 conducted; and 12 WHEREAS, the towns in which these lands are located were not consulted or advised of the proposed 13 mapping outside the city limits until it was being imposed on them by the City's request that the County map these 14 flood storage districts; and 15 **WHEREAS**, owners of these lands are not being compensated for addition regulations placed on their lands; 16 and 17 WHEREAS, there are proposed changes in the design of drainage structures in the study area that may 18 have an unknown impact on the overall functionality of the modeling that was done; and 19 WHEREAS, the request from the City to the County was previously taken up by Winnebago County Board 20 and previously not approved: specifically 21 a. On March 26, 2019 the Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee conducted a public hearing on 22 the flood storage zoning amendment. 23 b. On April 5, 2019 the Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee voted 4-0 to deny the flood storage 24 zoning amendment. 25 c. On April 16, 2019 the Winnebago County Board voted to deny the flood storage zoning amendment. 26 d. On July 30, 2019 the Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee conducted another public hearing 27 on the flood zoning storage amendment. 28 e. On August 23, 2019 the Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee voted 4-0 to approve the flood 29 storage zoning amendment, primarily due to the potential of all rural flood plain property owners losing flood 30 insurance. 31 f. On September 17, 2019 the Winnebago County Board postponed the vote on the flood storage zoning 32 amendment until the October 15, 2019 Winnebago County Board meeting. 33 g. On October 15, 2019 the Winnebago County Board voted to refer the flood storage zoning amendment back 34 to the Planning and Zoning Committee for reconsideration. 35 h. On January 23, 2020 the Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee and the City of Oshkosh 36 Planning Commission conducted a joint information meeting for the affected land owners and general public. 37 38 WHEREAS, no alternatives have been brought forward in lieu of the existing study. 39 40 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby 41 opposes any flood storage mapping outside the city limits. 42
