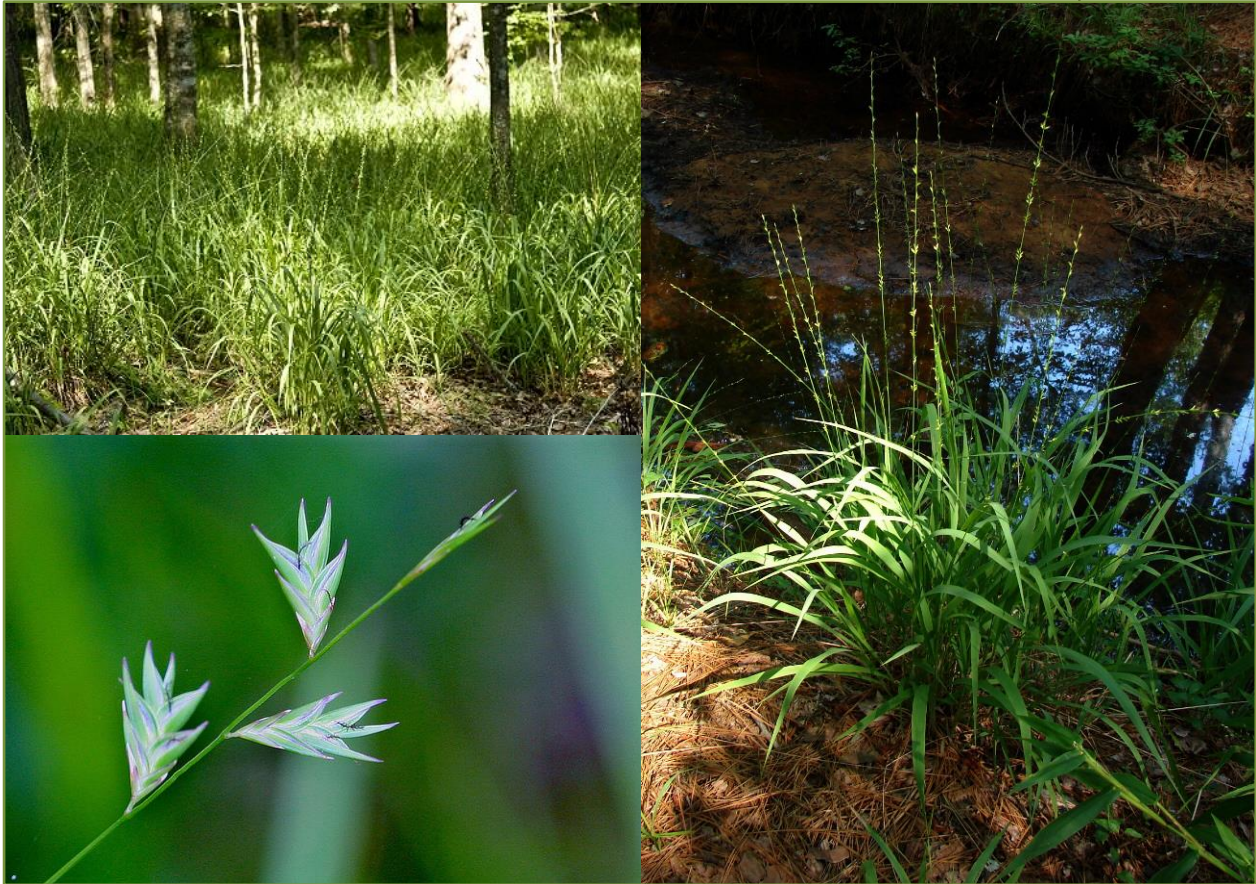




Longleaf Woodoats

Chasmanthium sessiliflorum



Flower stalks are produced growing high above the foliage, sometimes up to 5 feet high, but usually 3. This grass is drought resistant once established, and can form clumps up to 2 feet wide. Able to grow in full sun if the summers are not too hot, this plant can usually be found in shaded areas, in clay, loam, or even sandy soil. In spring, old growth should be cut back before new growth appears. Flowers are tiny and white, and seed heads arrow shaped.
