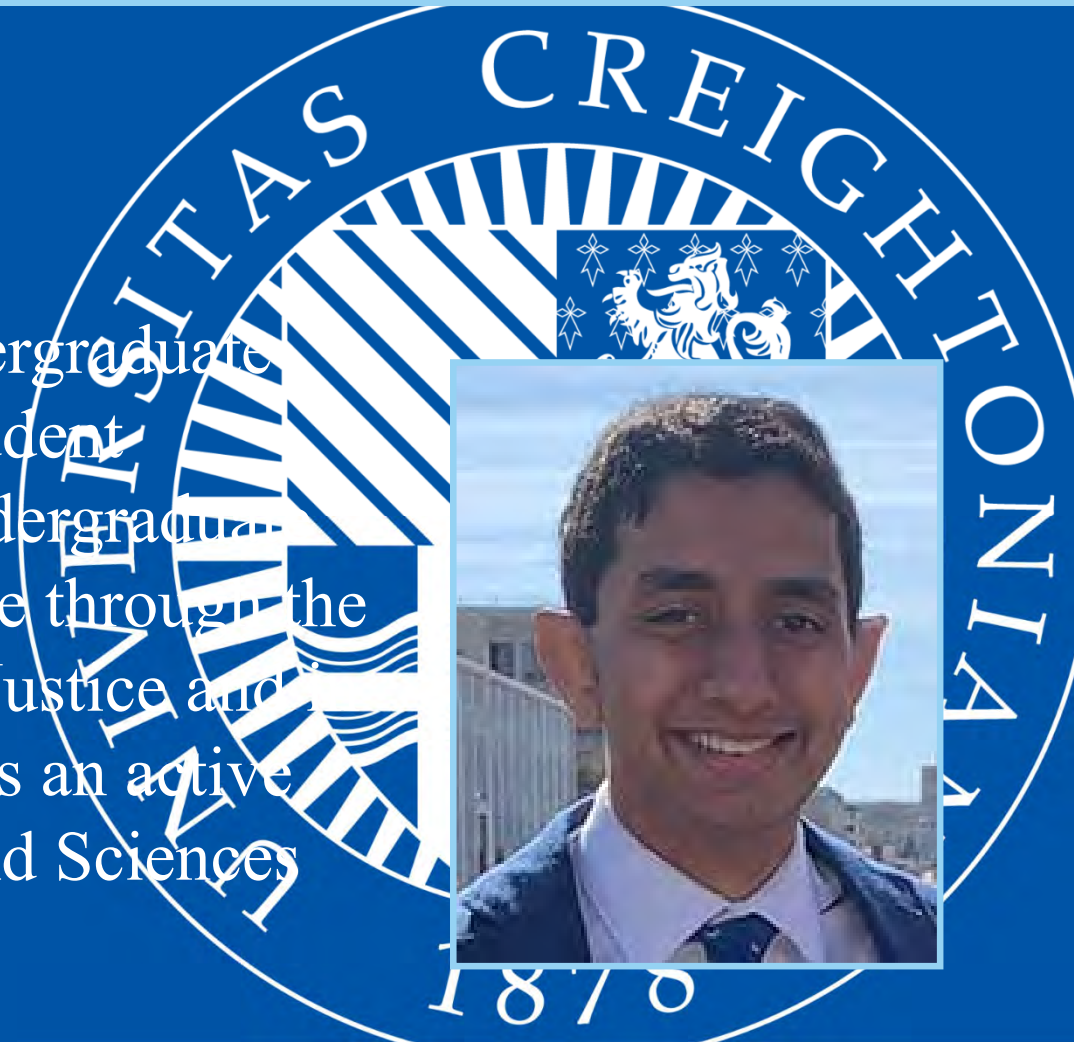
Paige Eicher

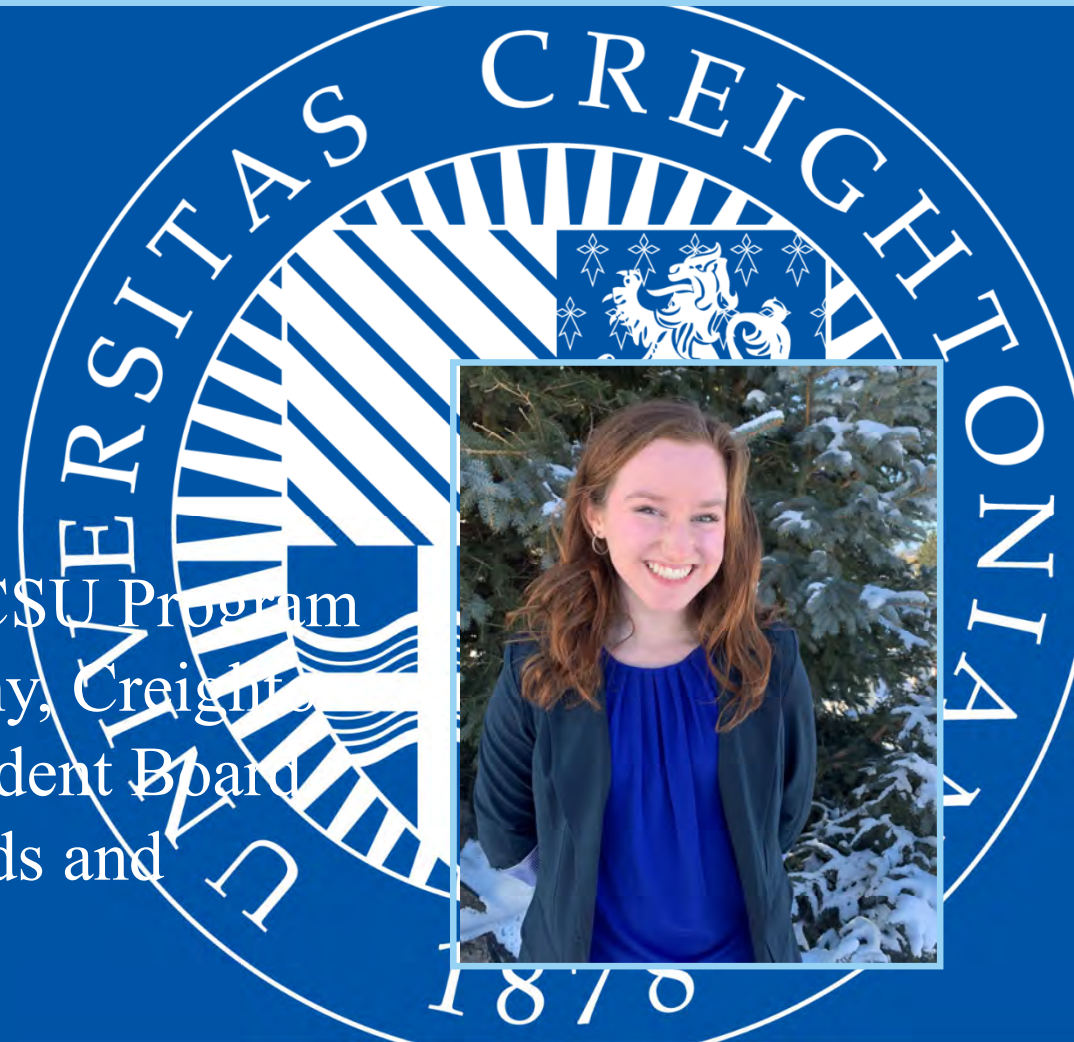
Camryn Kopp

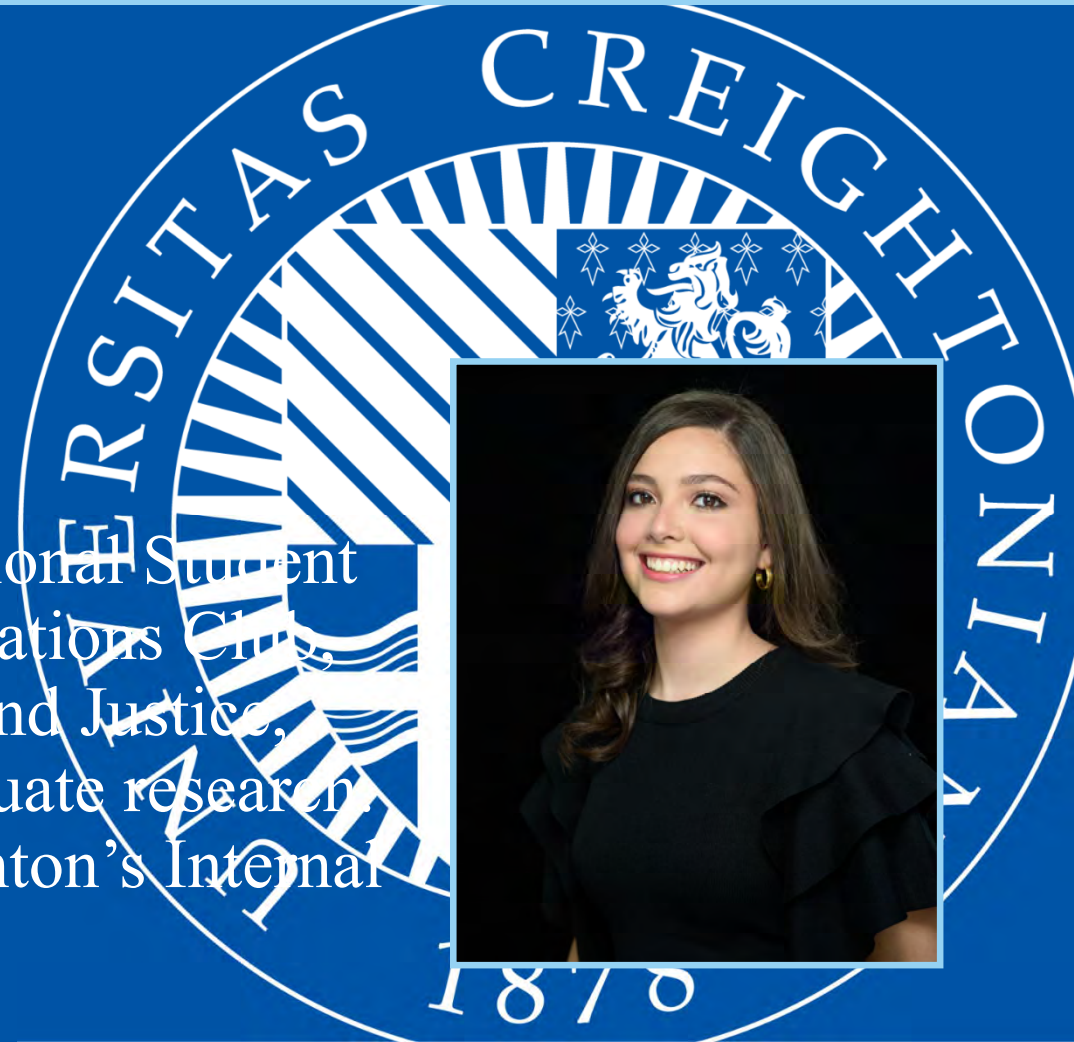
Brendan Plate

Sadie has participated in services trips through the Schlegel Center for Service and Justice. She has also been involved in research and had an internship.



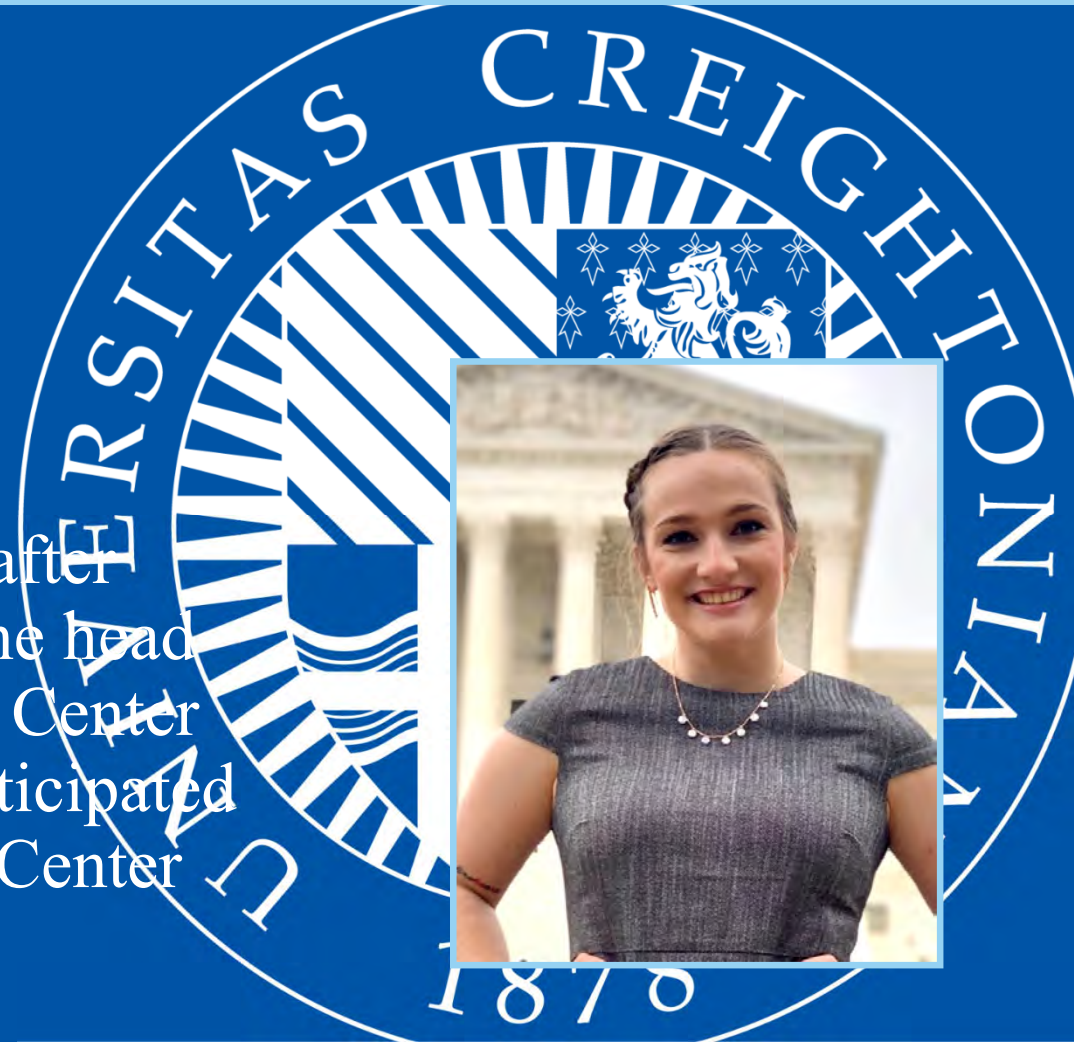
Sarah Sinsel

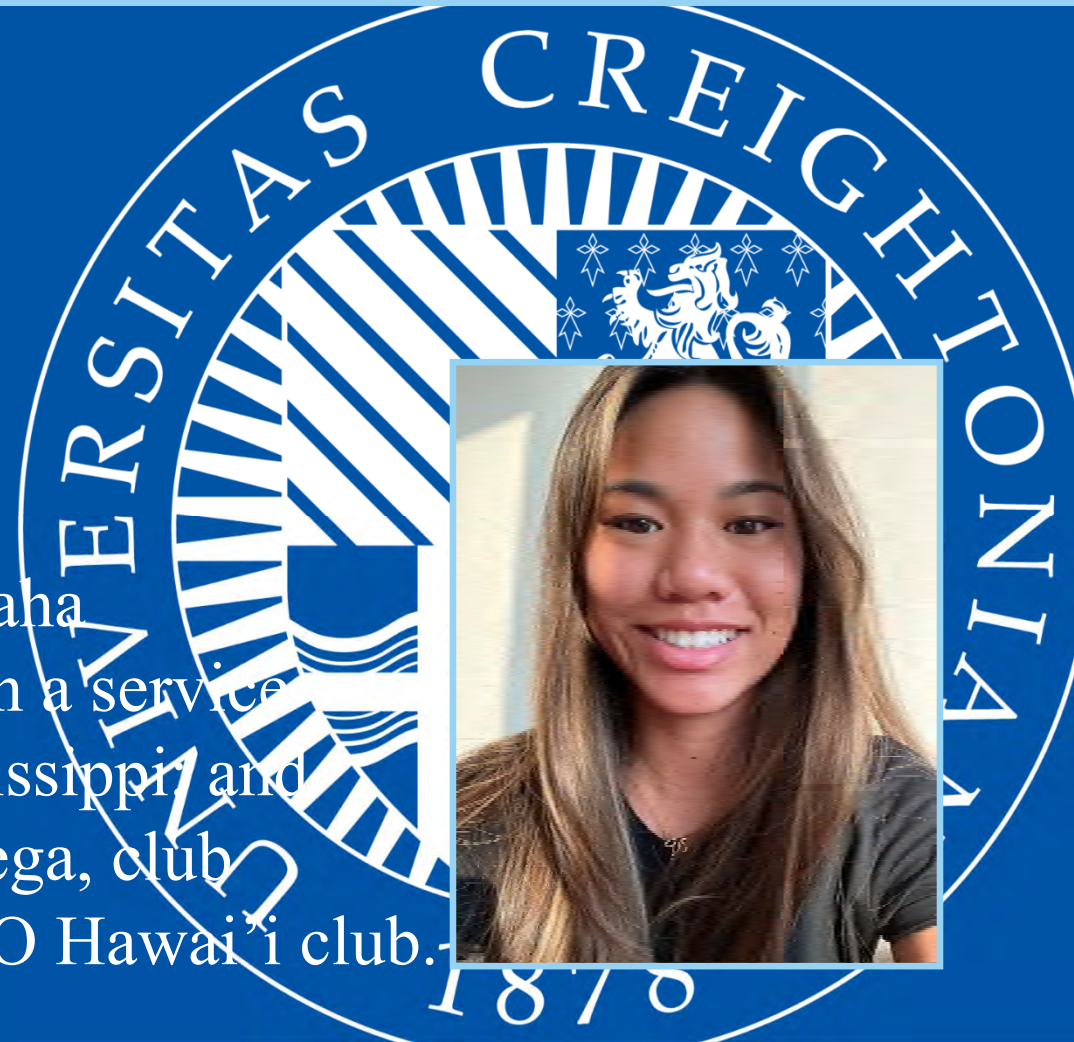
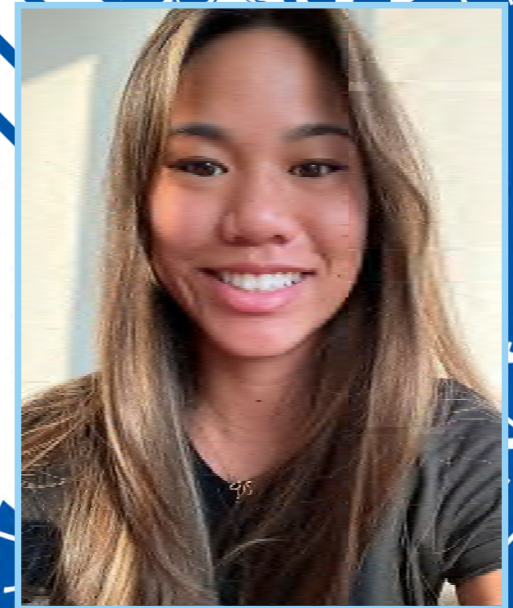
Boston Small

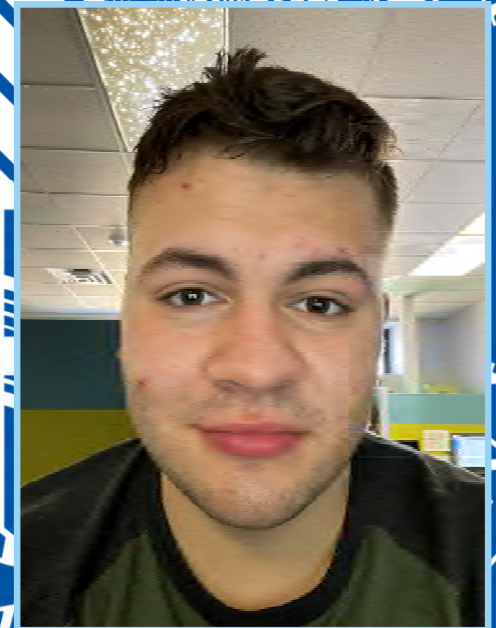
Sarah Tooley

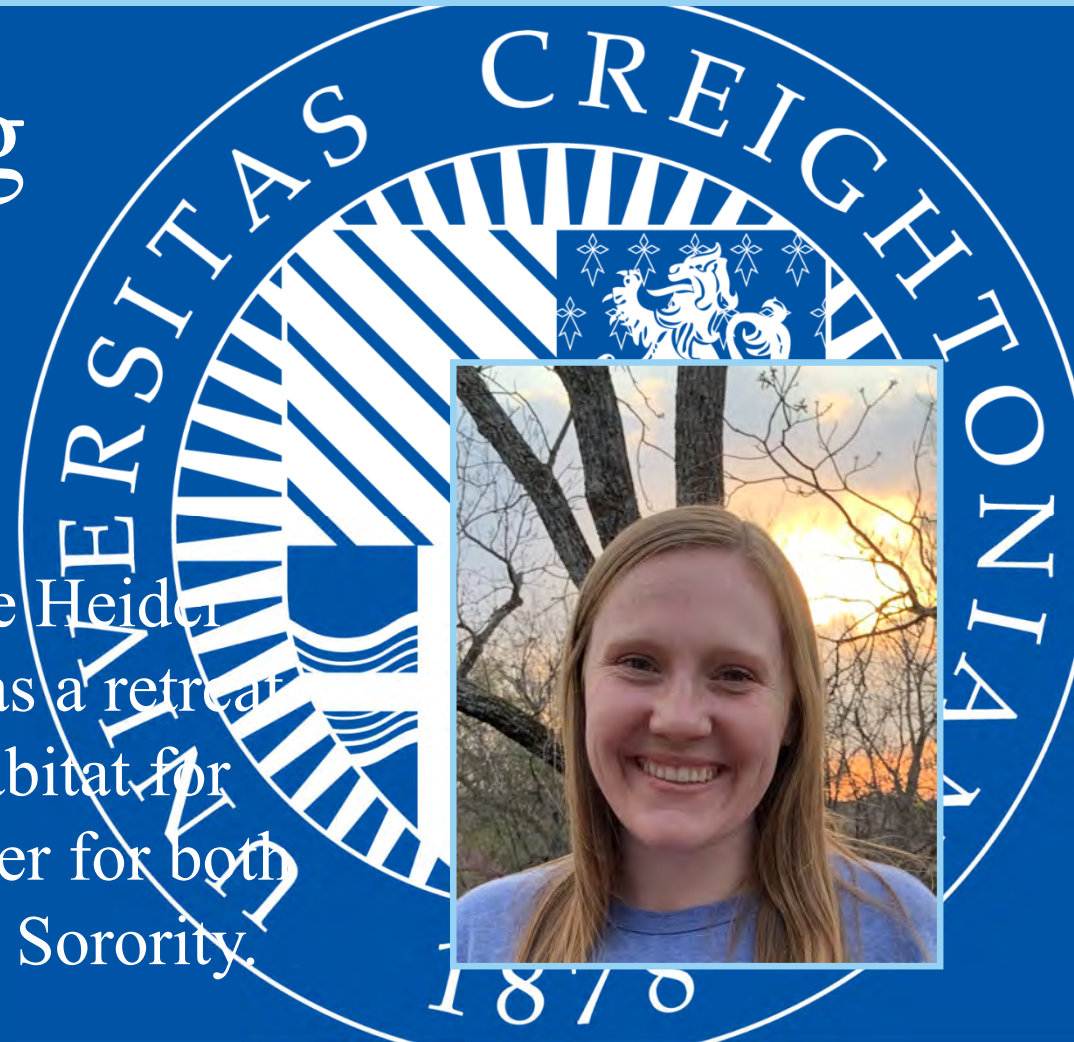
Jacob Benne

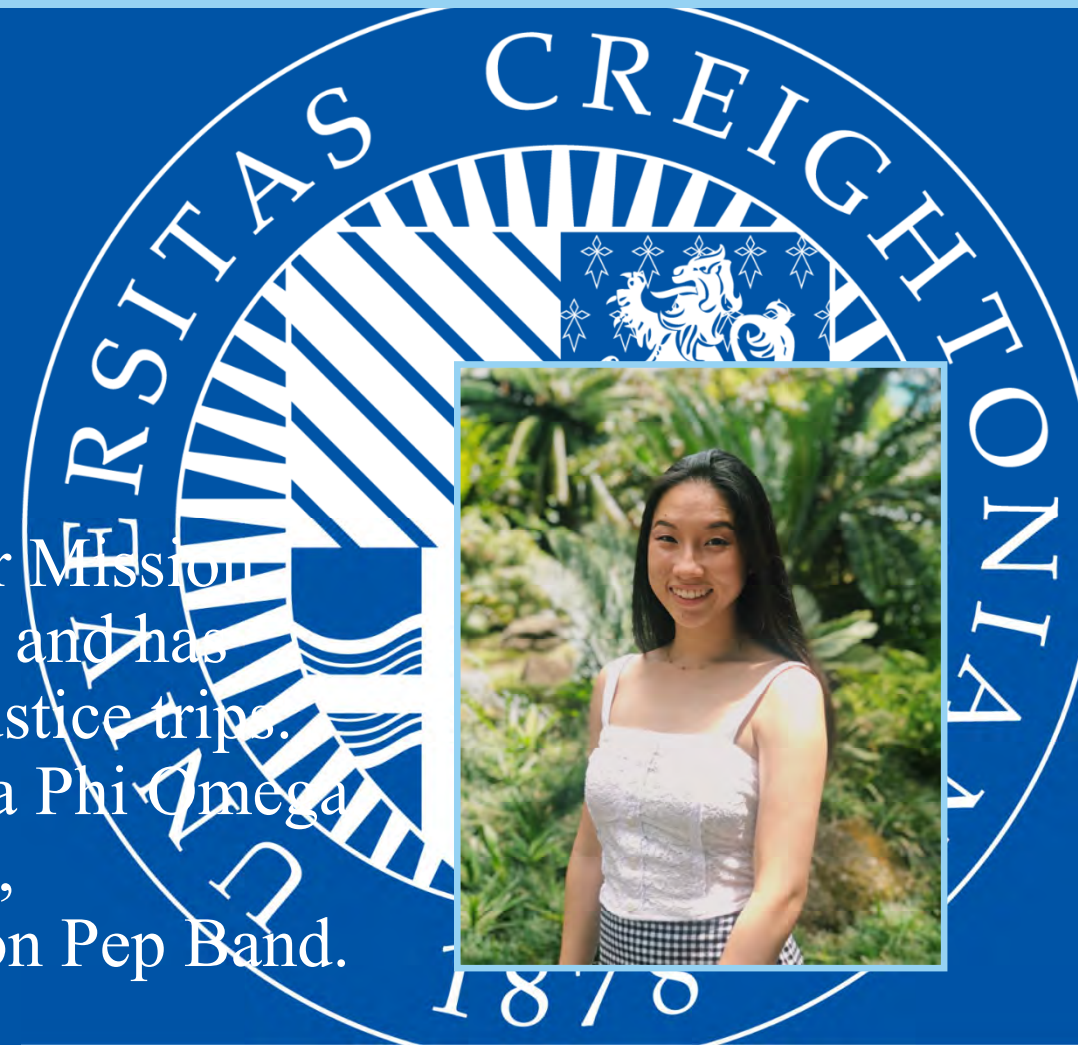
Alexandra Taylor

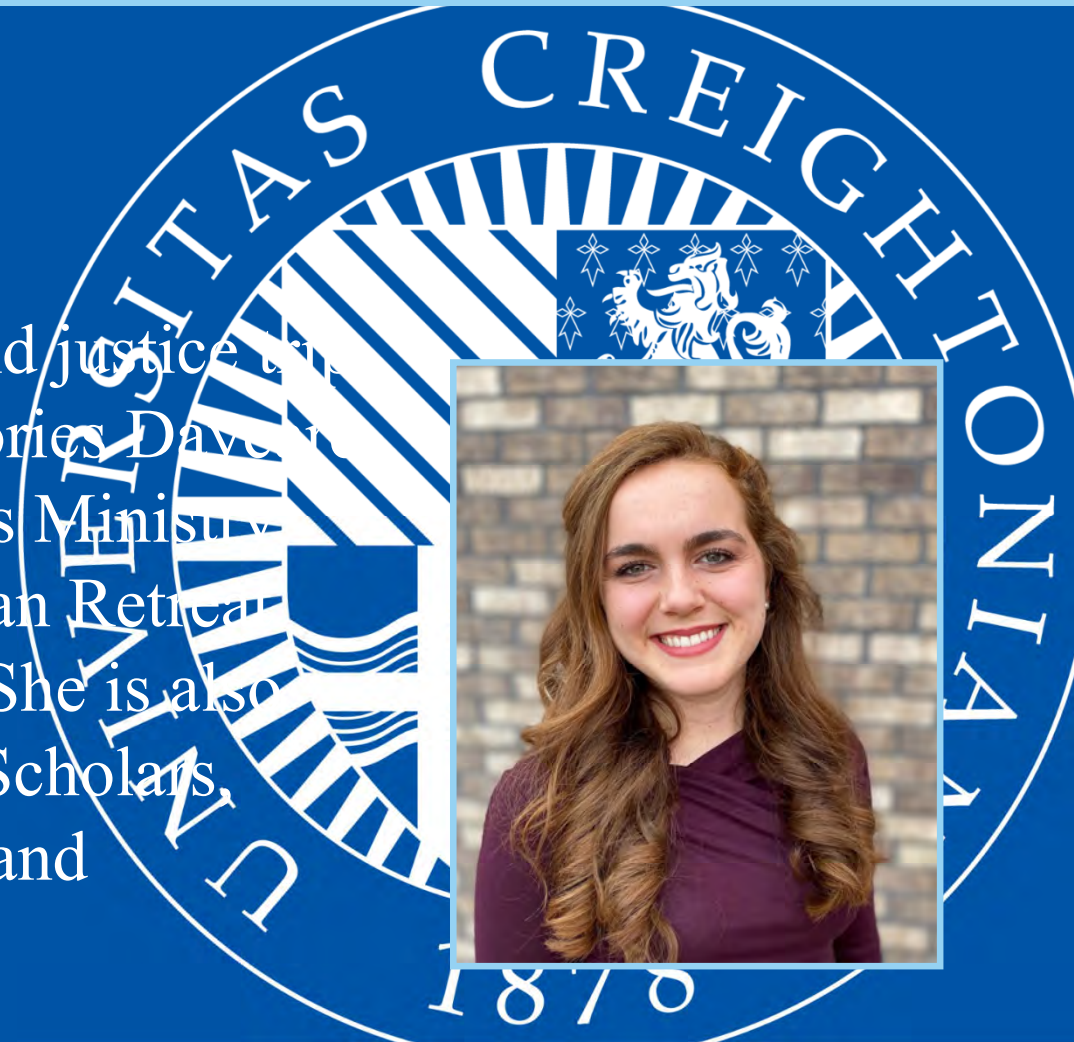
Nicholas Guzzo

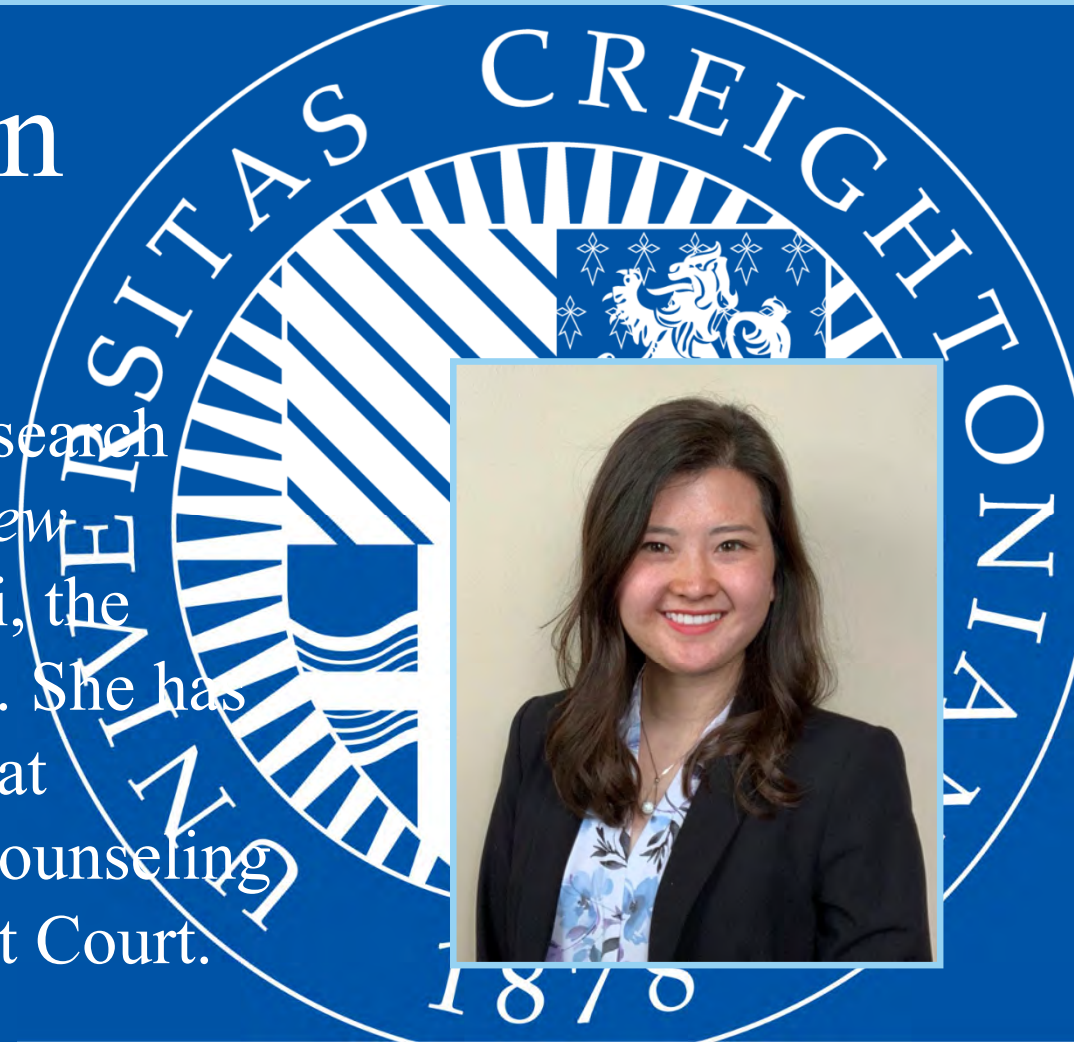
Jacqueline Schoenebeck

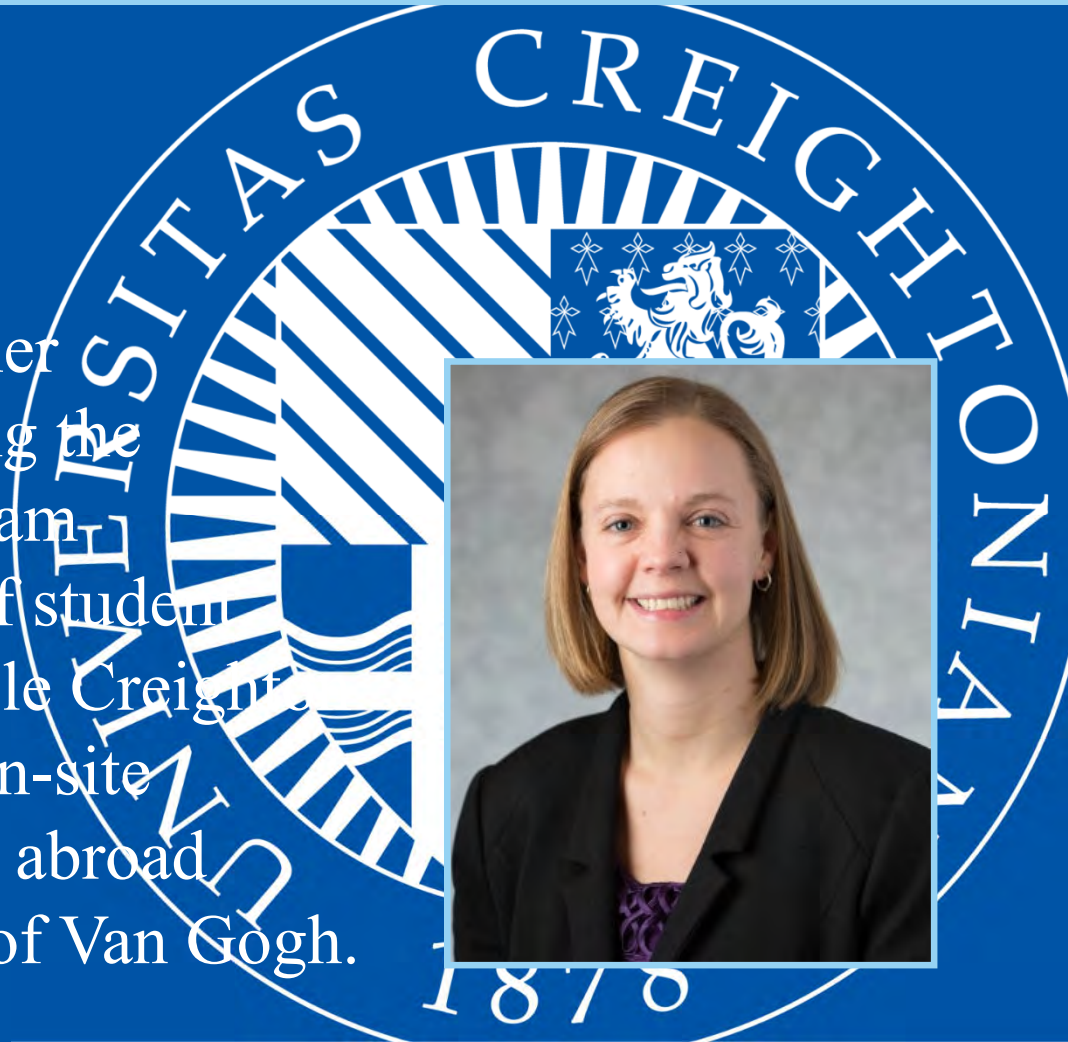
Margaret Blanchard

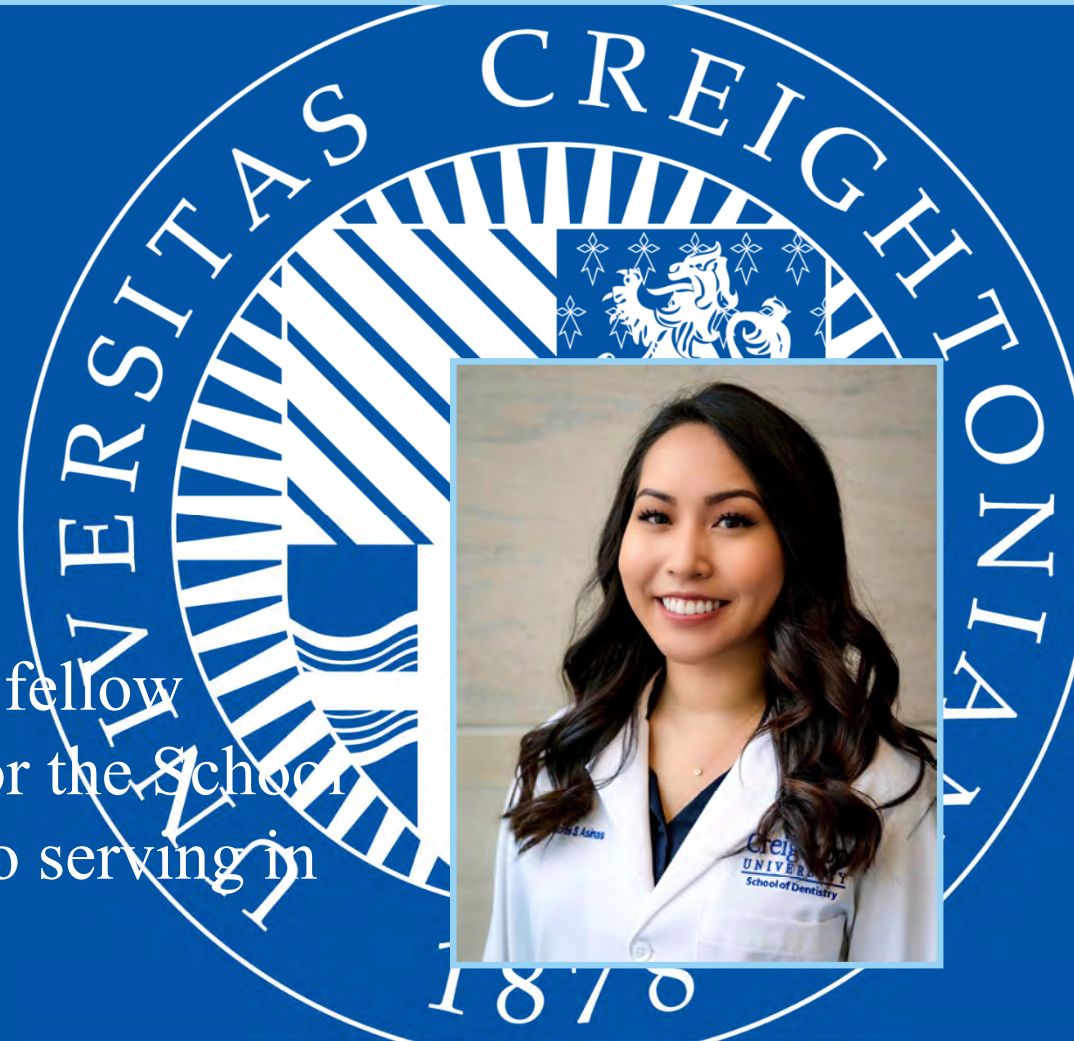
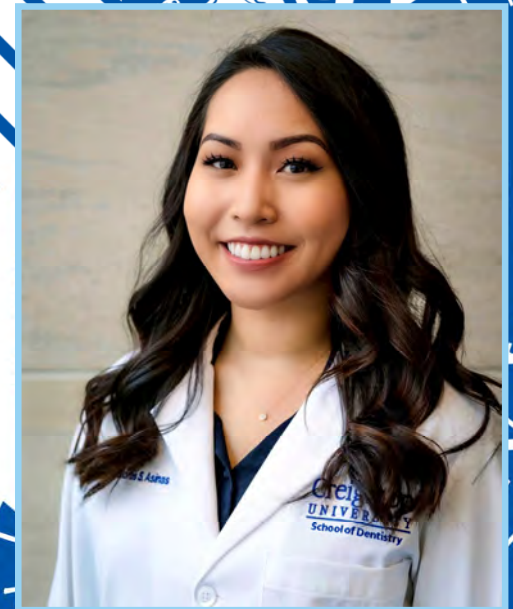
Andrew Weinberger

Adam has been awarded the Health Professions Scholarship Program through the U.S. Army and tutors second-year dental students in multiple lab sessions and didactic courses.



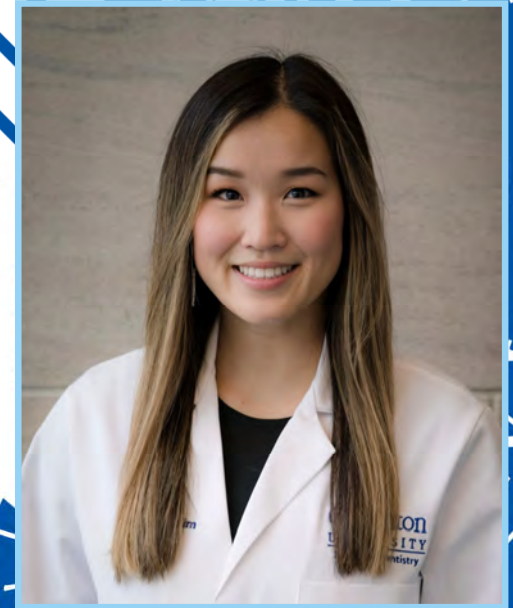
ChunWoo Kang

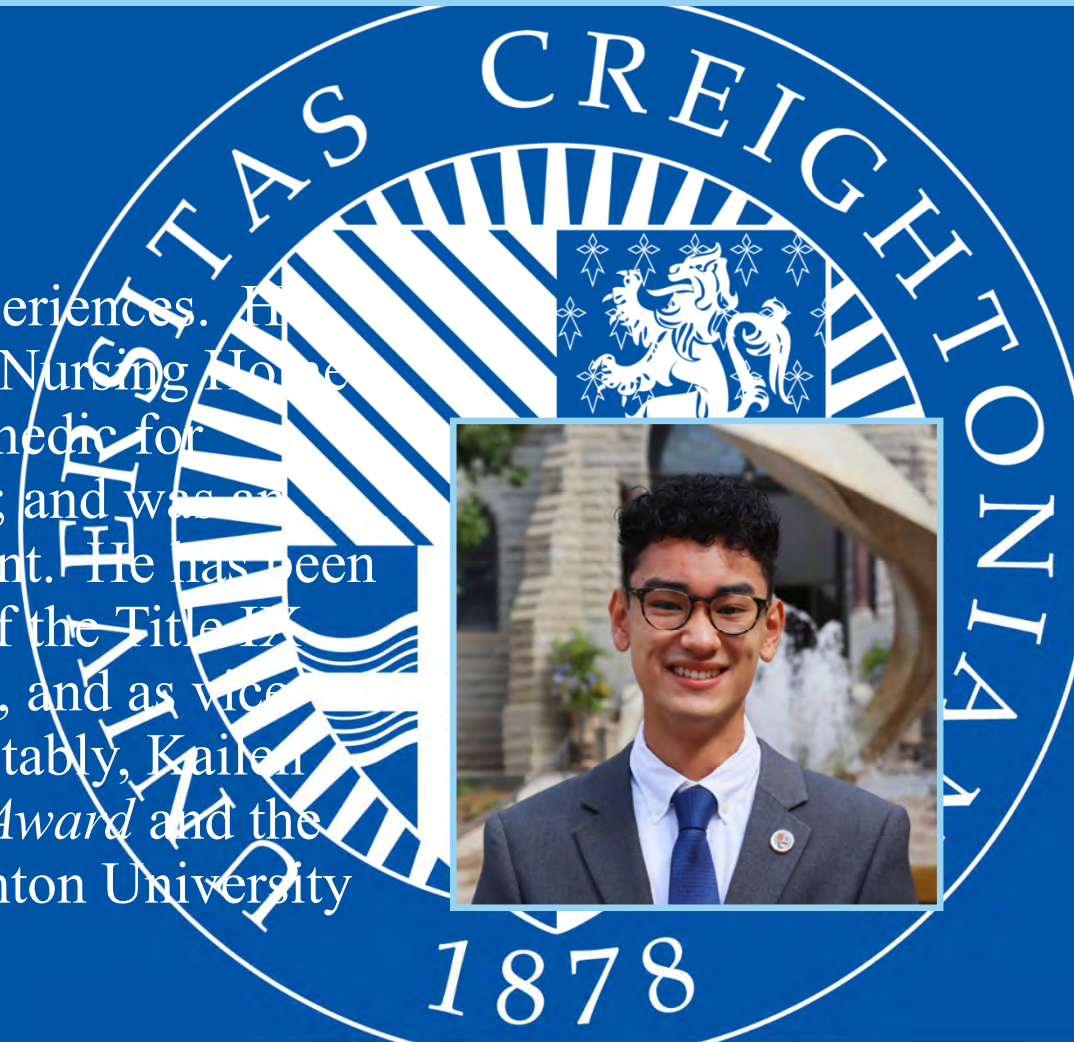
Heidi Knofczynski

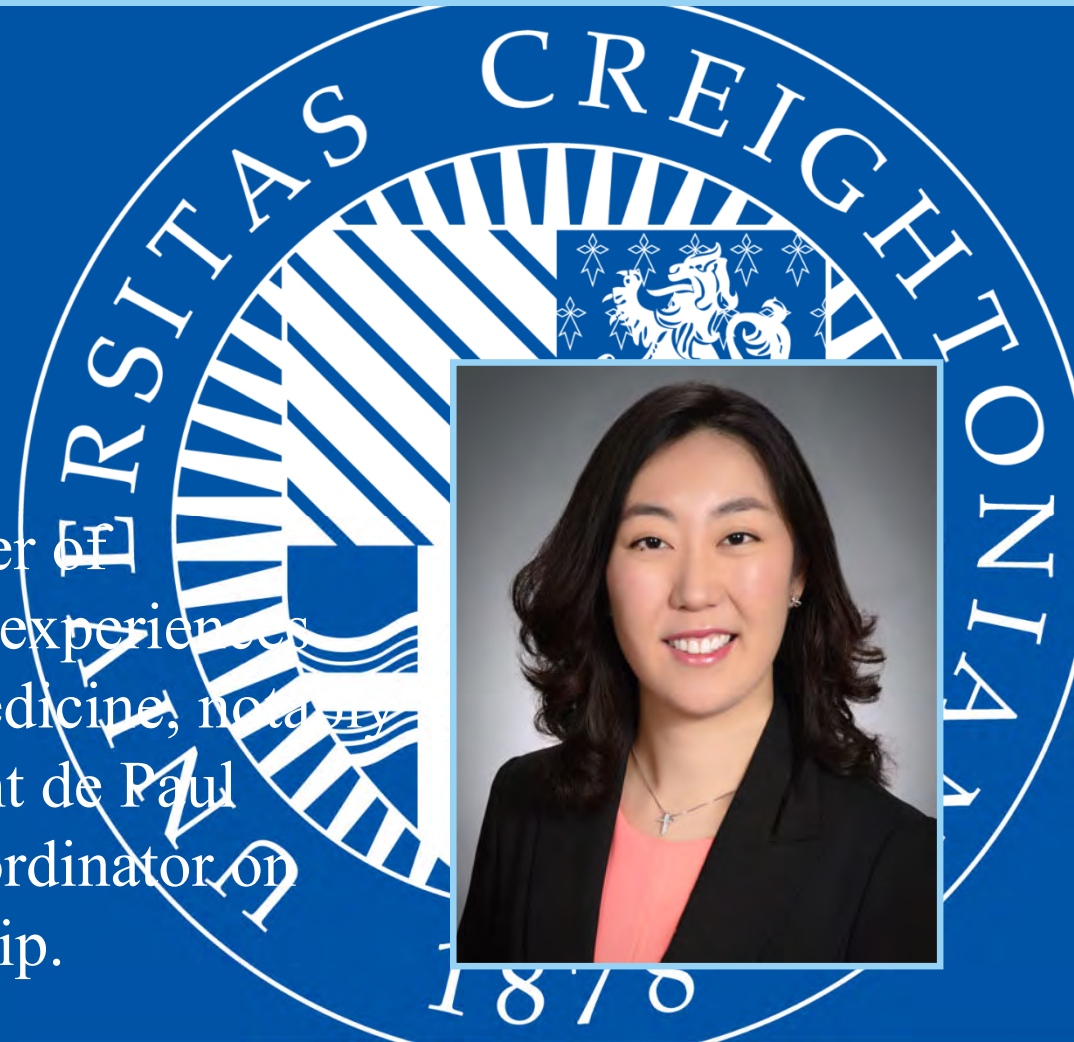
Kailen Wong

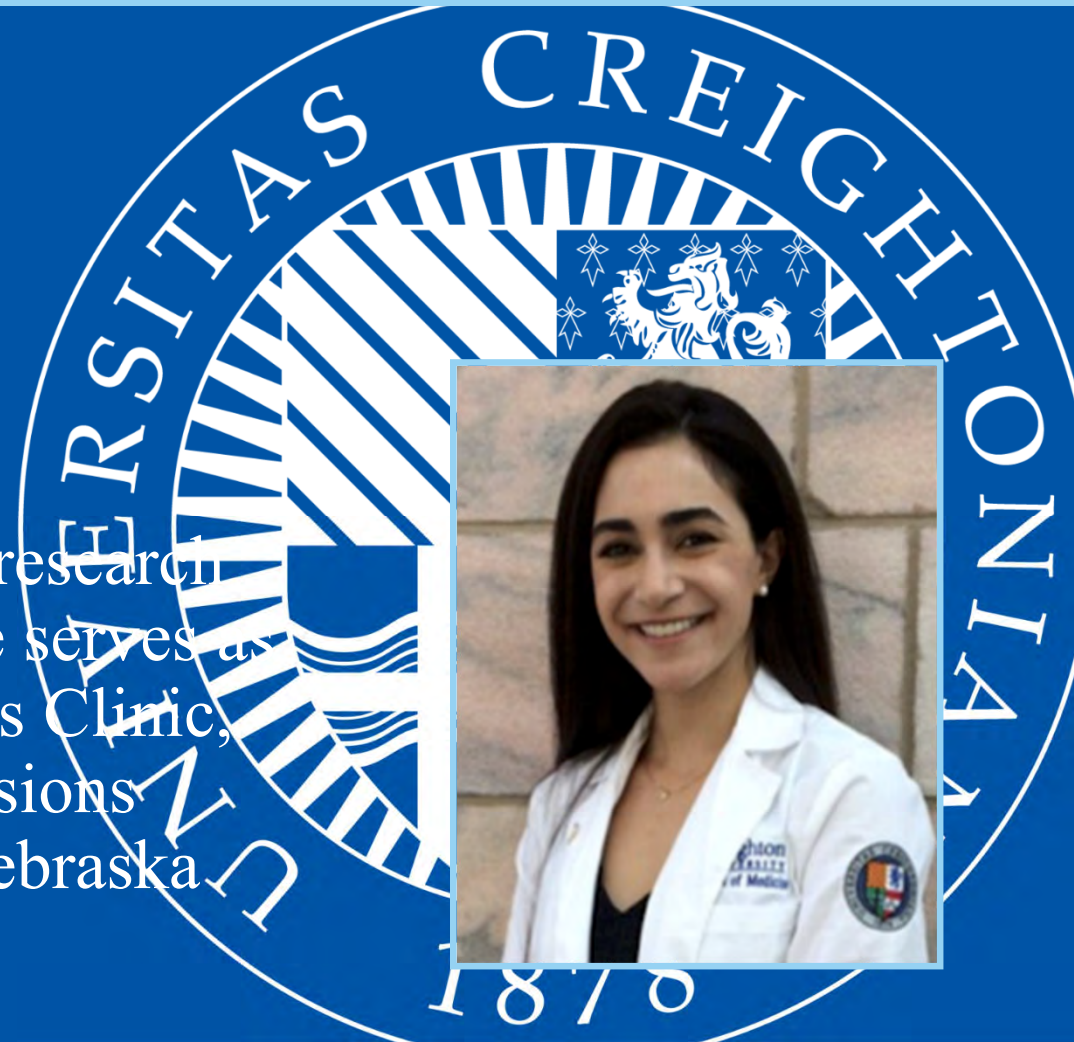
Paula Choi

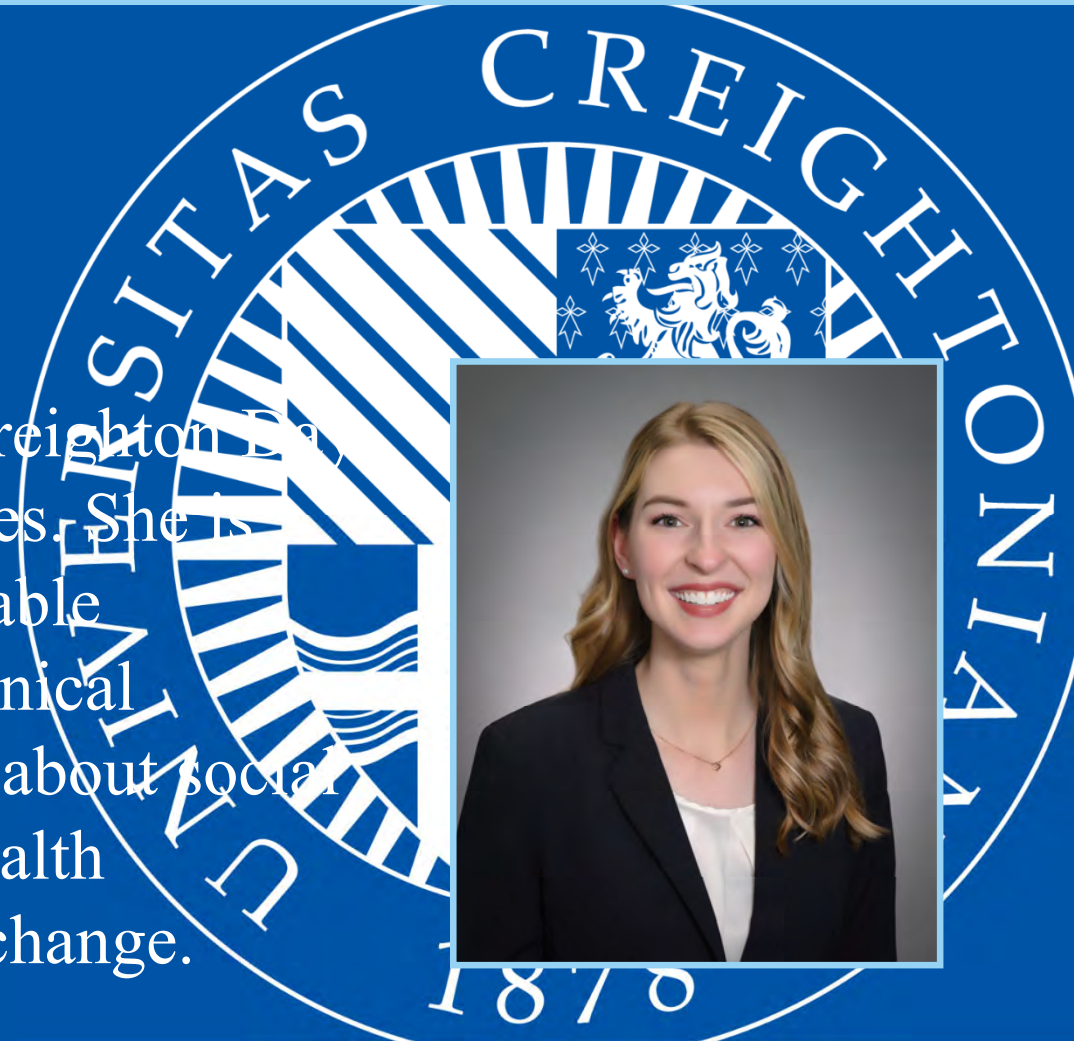
Emma Patello

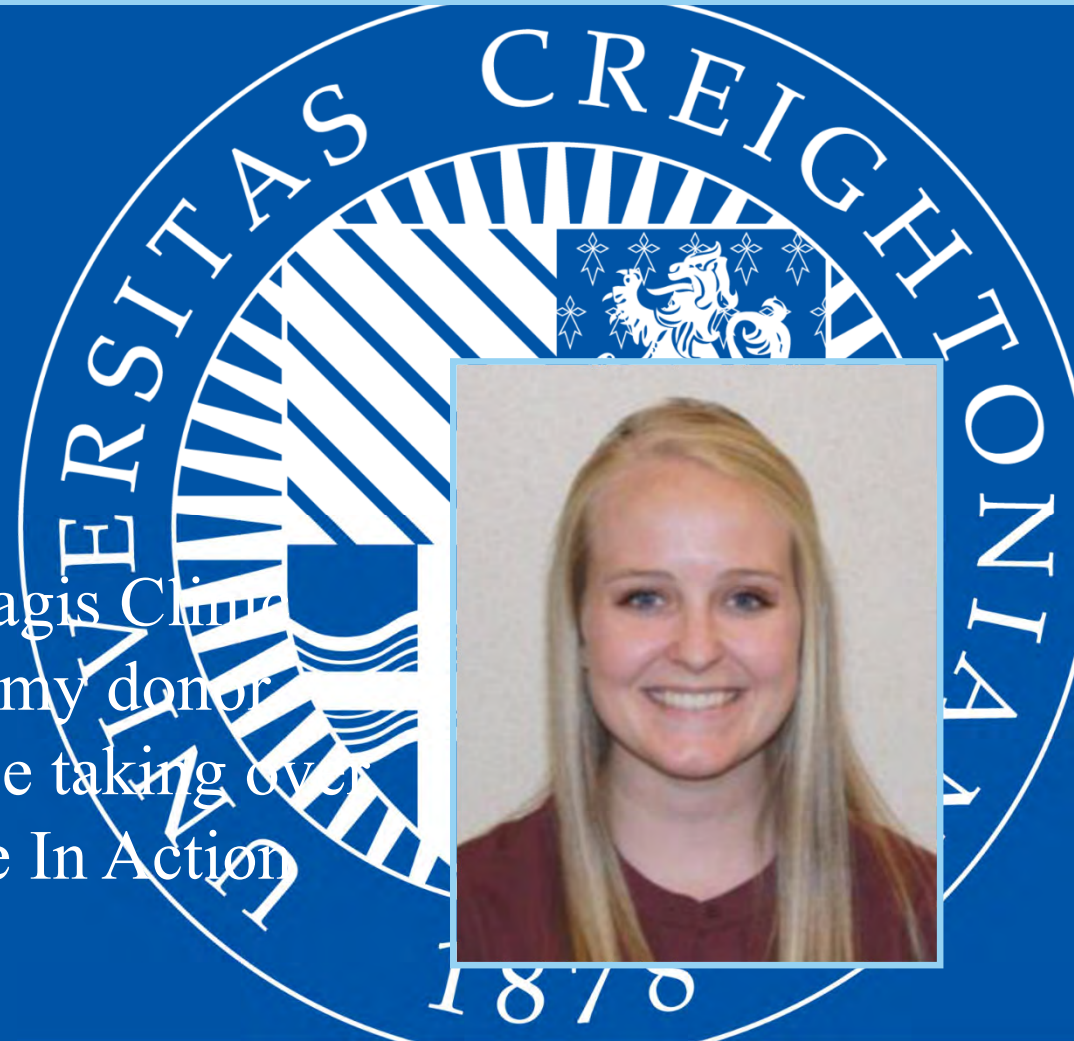
Madison Wolfe

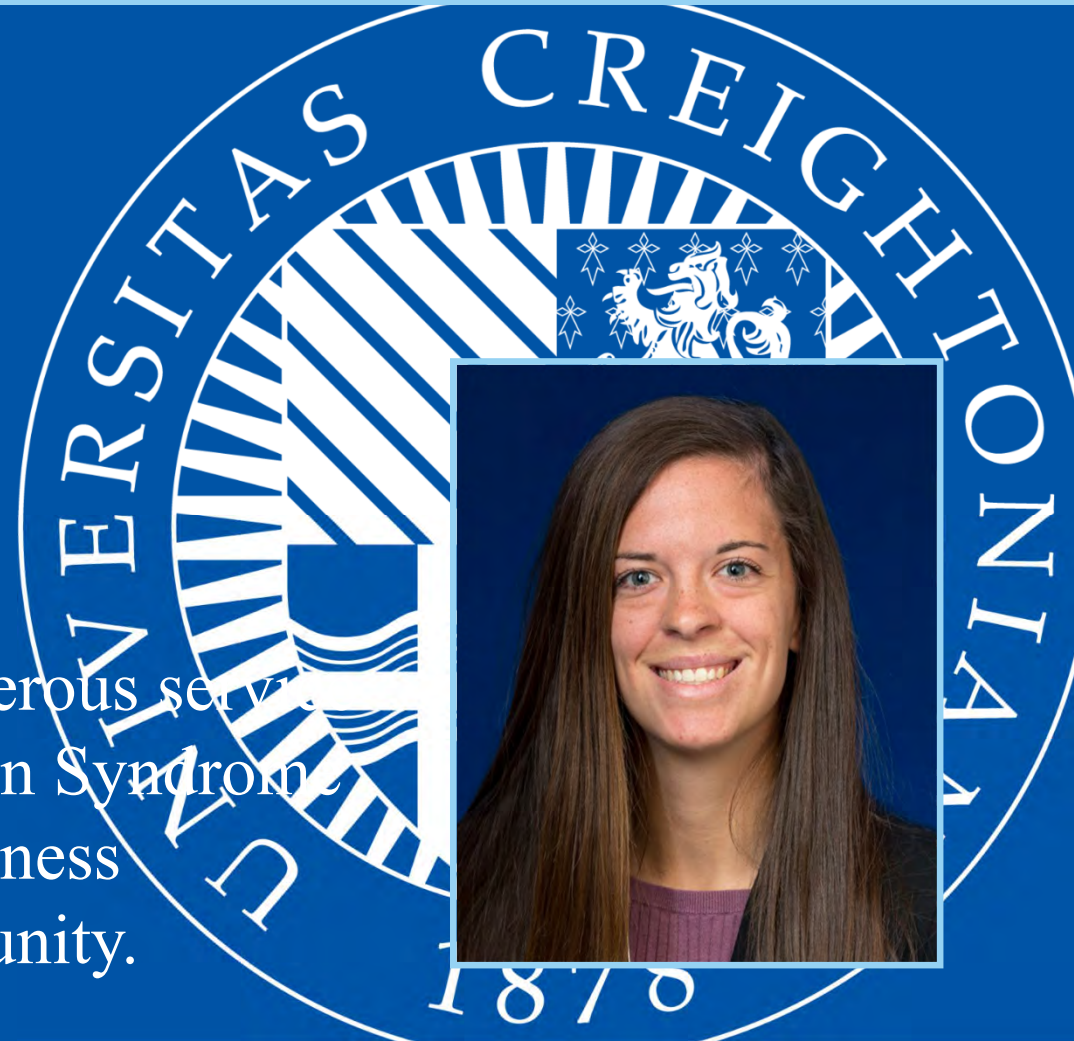
Kaitlyn Young

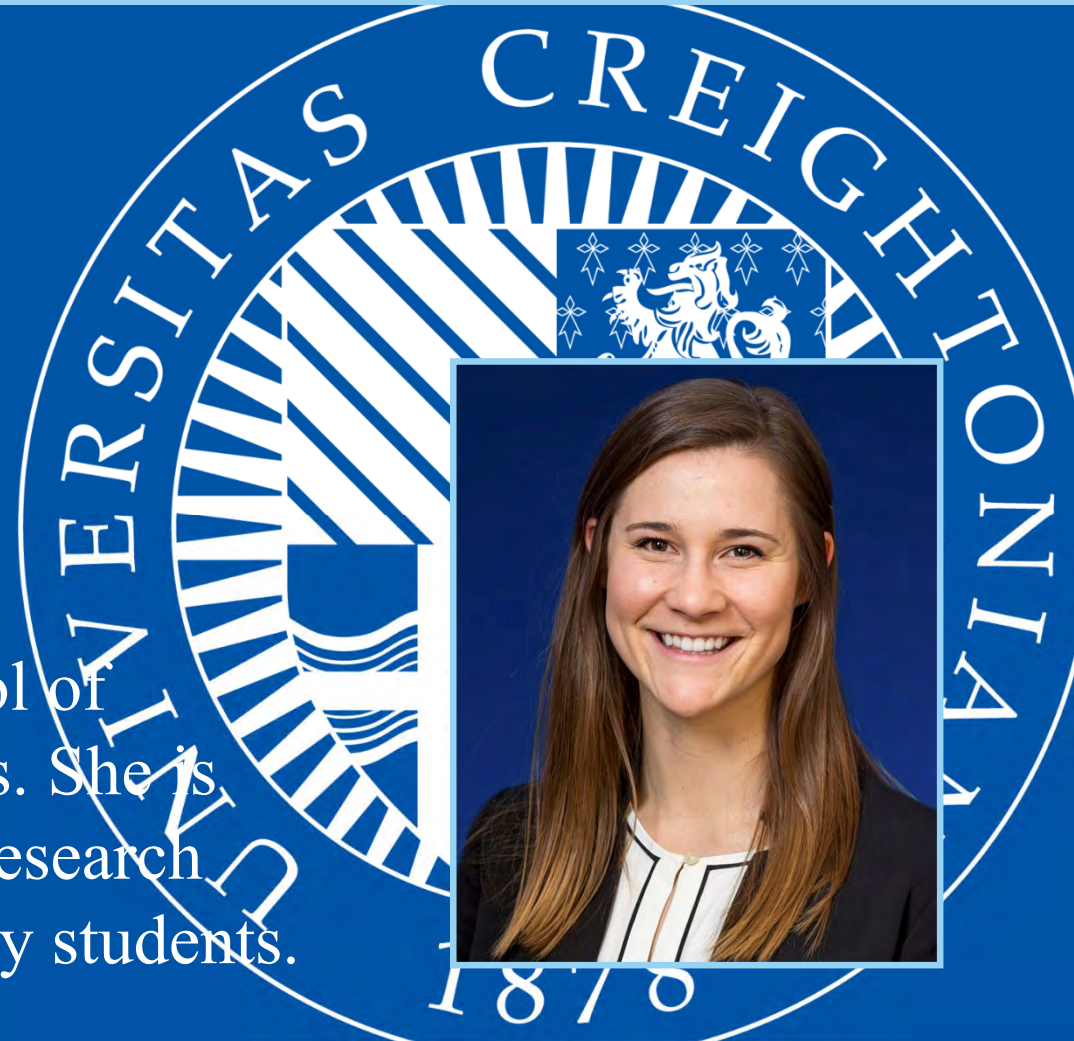
Joseph Coufal

Kayla is quite active in the School of Pharmacy and Health Professions. She is a student ambassador, a student research fellow, and tutors physical therapy students.



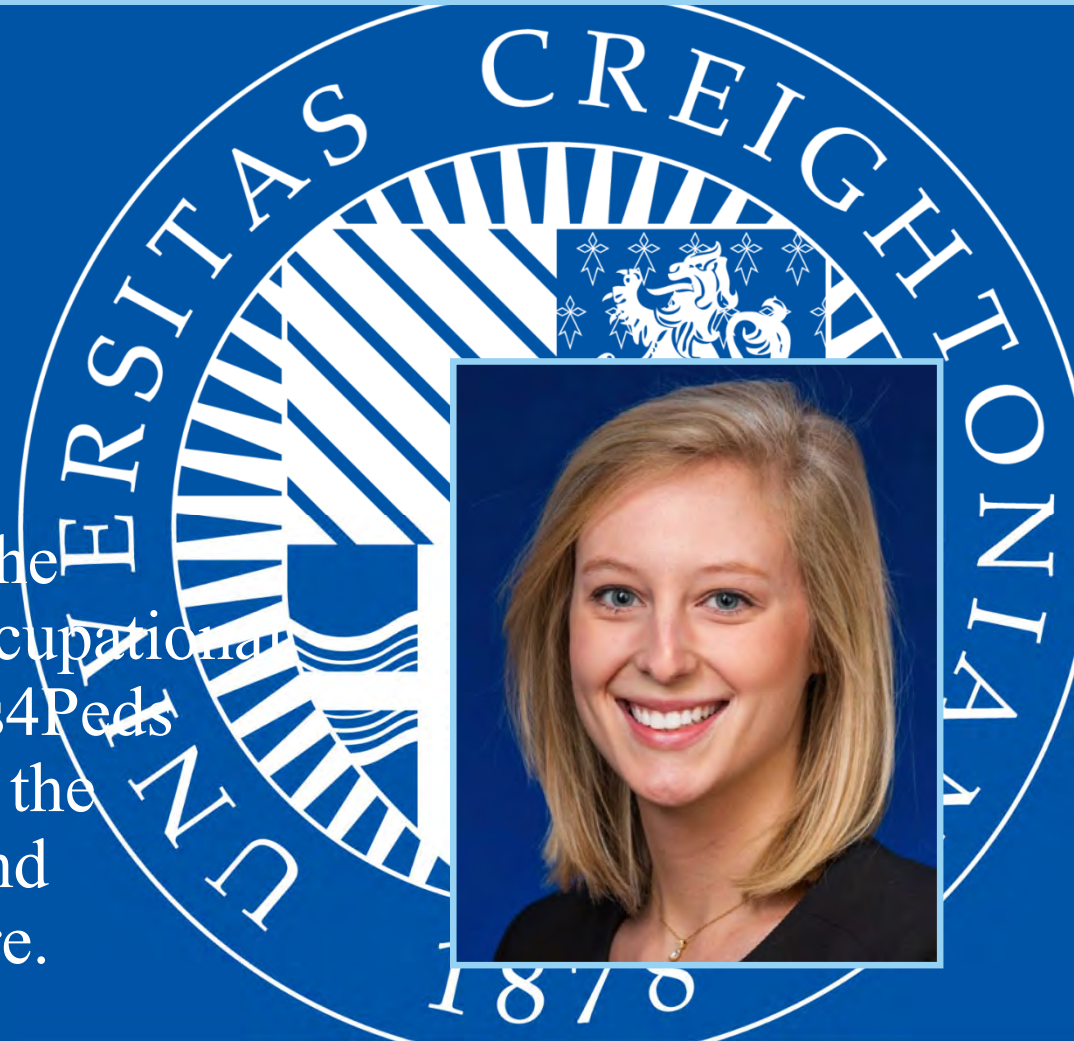
Sadie Jung

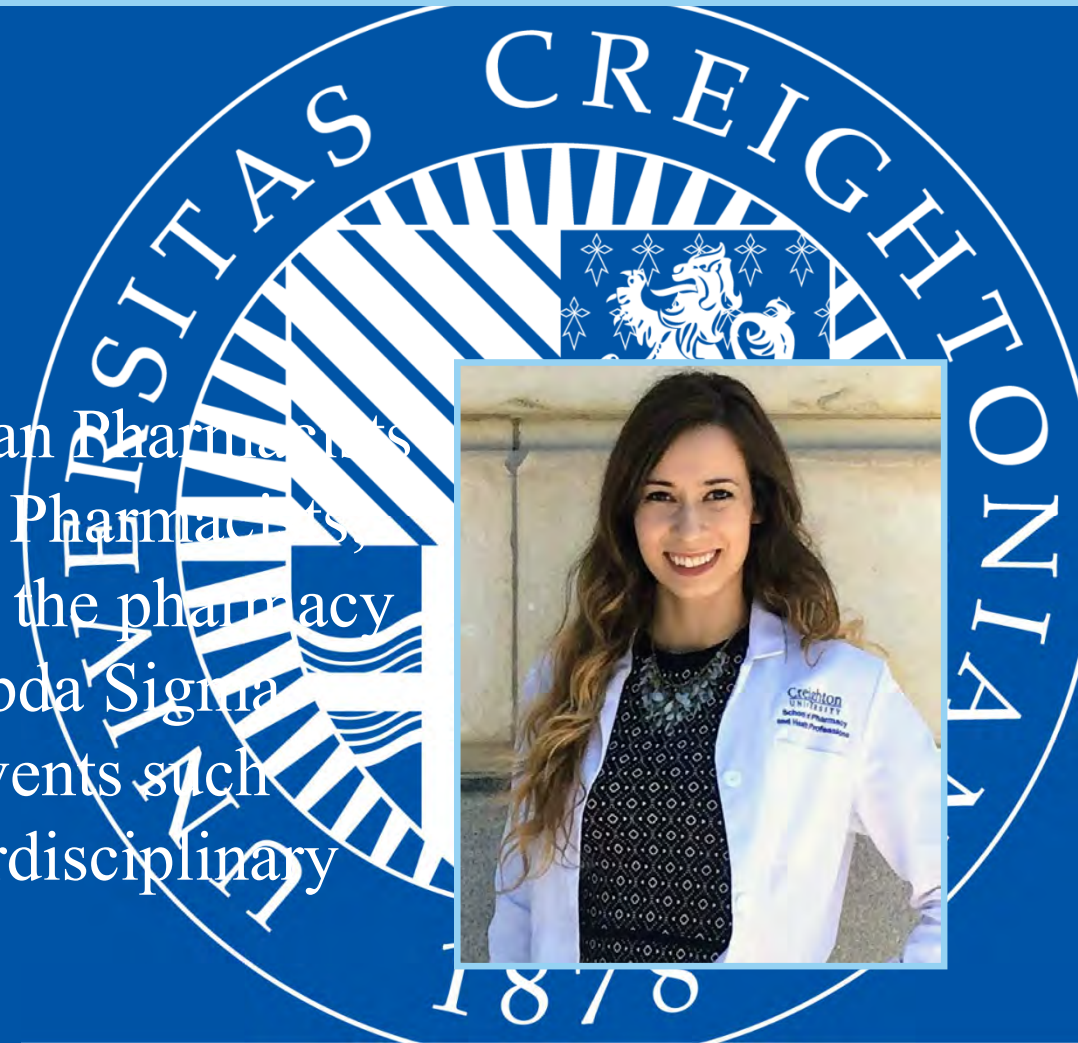
