NAOMI ROHT-ARRIAZA IS A DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR OF LAW AT UC HASTINGS LAW SCHOOL AND IS THE AUTHOR OF THE PINOCHET EFFECT: TRANSNATIONAL JUSTICE IN THE AGE OF HUMAN RIGHTS (2005). SHE IS THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF THE DUE PROCESS OF LAW FOUNDATION, WHICH WORKS ON JUSTICE ISSUES IN LATIN AMERICA.

HIS RESEARCH INTERESTS INCLUDE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL JUSTICE, CRIMINAL LAW, AND SOCIAL THEORY AND IS THE AUTHOR OF FOUR BOOKS, AND SEVERAL ARTICLES ON INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ETHICS.
