<p>Ash-Grey Ladybeetle <i>(Olla v. nigrum)</i></p>  <p>Eats primarily psyllids, occasionally aphids Host plant: Papaya</p>	<p>Black Chilocorus <i>(Chilocorus nigritus)</i></p>  <p>Eats armored scale, some soft scale</p>	<p>Common Spotted Ladybeetle <i>(Harmonia conformis)</i></p>  <p>Eats primarily psyllids, occasionally aphids</p>
<p>Metallic Blue Ladybeetle <i>(Curinus coeruleus)</i></p>  <p>Eats scale, aphids, psyllids, mealybugs, whitefly Host plant: Koa haole</p>	<p>Three-Striped Ladybeetle <i>(Brumoides suturalis)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, whitefly, psyllids, scale, mealybugs, mites Host plants: cilantro, cosmos, crimson clover</p>	<p>Twenty-Spotted Ladybeetle <i>(Psyllobora viginti taedata)</i></p>  <p>Eats powdery mildew Host plants: zucchini, sunn hemp, papaya</p>
<p>Variable Ladybeetle <i>(Coelophora inaequalis)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, including milkweed aphid Host plant: Crimson clover</p>	<p>Variable Ladybeetle <i>(Coelophora inaequalis)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, including milkweed aphid Host plants: buckwheat, cilantro, cosmos, crimson clover</p>	<p>Yellow-Shouldered Ladybeetle <i>(Apolinus lividigaster)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, including milkweed aphid Host plants: crown flower, cosmos</p>
<p>Globe-Marked Ladybeetle <i>(Azya orbigera)</i></p>  <p>Eats soft scale, occasionally aphids and mealybugs Host plant: A'ali'i (<i>Dodonaea viscosa</i>)</p>	<p>Minute Two-Spotted Ladybeetle <i>(Diomus notescens)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, mealybugs, some caterpillar eggs Host plants: Buckwheat, marigold, fennel, cosmos, crimson clover</p>	<p>Scymnus sp.</p>  <p>Eats aphids Host plants: Buckwheat, fennel, cosmos, crimson clover</p>
<p>Seven-Spotted Ladybeetle <i>(Coccinella septempunctata)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, thrips, whitefly, psyllids, leafhoppers, moths, beetles Host plants: Cilantro, fennel, dill</p>	<p>Stethorus sp.</p>  <p>Eats mites Host plants: tea plants, papaya</p>	<p>Ten-Spotted Ladybeetle <i>(Bothrocalvia pupillata)</i></p>  <p>Eats aphids, whitefly, psyllids, thrips Host plant: Mamaki</p>
