## Parties slam J&K Guv, Malik defends move

PDP, NC, Cong rue 'murder of democracy'; Guv claims opposing ideologies can't give stable Govt

Aday after Jammu & Kashmir Governor Satya Pal Malik dissolved the State legislative Assembly to scuttle formation of a Government by any of the two alliances, the Congress and mainstream parties in I&K described the Raj Bhawan's move as "undemocratic, unconstitutional and against the mandate of people."

The Governor has justified his decision to dissolve the Assembly and rejected claims that he acted at the behest of the Centre and the BJP.

Former Home Minister I Chidambaram slammed Malik for dissolving the State Assembly, saying he is attracted to the "Gujarat model" of Government not the Westminster model. "As long as no one staked a claim to form a Government, the J&K Governor was happy to keep Assembly under suspension. The moment someone staked a claim, he dissolved the Assembly," Chidambaram said.

"The Westminster model of democracy is outdated. Like in all other matters, it is the Gujarat model that has appealed to the J&K Governor, Chidambaram added.

Congress spokesman Manish Tewari said after the PDP, the NC and the Congress staked claim to form a Government, the Governor's decision to dissolve the Assembly without giving them a chance to form a Government and prove majority "is murder of democracy and must be

challenged".

"Dissolution of Assembly in this manner is unconstitutional, immoral and unethical. A dangerous harbinger of

things to come.
Thank God founding fathers were wise enough not to provide for President's rule at the Centre? Shudder to think what could have happened when BJP loses 2019," Tewari said at AICC Press briefing.

The sudden political development is likely to trigger permutations and combinations in I&K. In the first such move, Sajjad Lone, who too had staked claim to form a Government with the help of BJP and rebel PDP MLAs, announced PDP rebel Imran

Raza Ansari has joined his party, People's Conference.

Former Chief Minister and National Conference vice- president Omar Abdullah mocked the Raj Bhawan for not receiving Mehbooba's letter for staking claim to form a Government.

"Strangely the fax machine was rendered defunct when PDP chief Mehbooba wanted to fax a letter to stake claim for formation of a Government with our outside support and outright support by the Congress, but barely a few minutes later the Governor's fax machine worked when he sent an order on dissolution of the Assembly," Omar said at a



at Nadi Par under Satbarwa block. This crop belongs to Mana Manjhi. He has left this paddy un-harvested as it is worth now straw only.

There are similar patches of paddy gone wasted all around Palamu. Some patches have spectacular paddy but the overall scenario is drifting towards bleakness. Drought is slow but steady in Palamu. It is worrying the poor and the farmers. Sakunta Devi lives at Badlaya Tola under this Satbarwa block. She ekes out her living by selling fish that she catches from a nearby river. She earns ₹60 to 90 a day if she catches fish and the hotels in Satbarwa buy it as well otherwise she cooks the same fish for her family.

This coming drought she is most anxious. A team of Congress leaders led by Palamu district Congress committee Jeyesh Ranjan Pathak alias Bittu Pathak on Thursday visited this hamlet and saw the ground reality there. The team had senior members like Ishwari Pd Singh, Chhotu Singh, Avinash Gupta Fauji (district head of Congress Seva Dal) Chhotu Pathak (president sadar block Congress) and Ramzan Ansari Satbarwa block president of Congress.

Bittu Pathak said, "Lack of developmental schemes in hamlets is a serious thing. There is no scheme here in these Harijan

DALTONGANJ: Paddy is burnt hamlets namely Nadi Par and Badlaya Tola. There is no road to these hamlets when these are just within one and a half kilo-

meter away from NH 75." He said, "What this woman is saying that she sells fish to keep her family going is to be taken most seriously in times like drought when the BJP led State Government has been quick enough to declare whole of Palamu as drought hit but a mere lip service in declaring it as drought hit will not be of any relief unless village related schemes here are not started."

The road here can be made motorable which will create employment. There is no surface water management here when this hamlet is located some what at tarn a kind of high land unfit for paddy demanded Pathak. He said Savita Devi built a shouchalaya with her own hard cash but till date she has not been given any payment out of 12,000 that comes per unit of IHHL (individual house hold latrine). When this newspaper asked her as to why her shouchalaya is without any door fixed to it Savita Devi said, "I pooled in all my savings for it. This is without door. Jal Sahiya Preeti Gupta asks me to install the door but I have no money left now for

This shouchalaya is no abandoned by us for want of money as if it is given to me I will fix door to it


skills on the ground.

### Cabinet OK's draft bill, medical college at Silvassa

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

¬he Union Cabinet approved I on Thursday a draft bill for the establishment of national and State-level councils for regulation and standardisation of education and services provided by allied healthcare professionals such as physiotherapists and nutritionists. Currently, allied and healthcare professionals remain unidentified, unregulated and underutilised. The Cabinet has also approved the setting up of Medical College at Silvassa in the Union Territory (UT) of Dadra and Nagar Haveli.

Welcoming the move Union Health Minister JP Nadda said that it will help better medical infrastructure and enhance medical education opportunities to youth.

He said that the draft bill for the establishment of national and State-level councils for regulation and standardisation of education and services provided by allied healthcare professionals will cover 15 major professional categories, including 53 professions in allied and healthcare streams.

Offences and penalties the bill to check malpractices.

He said professional advisory bodies under the central and State councils will examine issues in detail and provide recommendations relating to specific recognised categories.

Nadda stated that this legislation will bring all existing allied and healthcare professionals on board within a few years from the date of establishment of the council.

"This will pave the way for high quality multi-disciplinary care in line with the vision of Ayushman Bharat," he said. The central council will

comprise 47 members, of whom 14 shall be ex-officio members representing diverse and related roles and functions

and remaining 33 shall be nonex-officio members who mainly represent the 15 professional categories, the statement

The State councils are clauses have been included in also envisioned to mirror the central council, comprising seven ex-officio and 21 non-exofficio members, and chairperson to be elected from amongst the non-ex-officio members.

The bill will also have an overriding effect on any other existing law for any of the covered professions. It also empowers the central and State Governments to make rules. According to statement

### Scheme on climate, ocean forecast extended

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved continuation of the nine sub-schemes of the umbrella scheme "Atmosphere & Climate Research-Modelling Observing Systems & Services (ACROSS)" during 2017-2020 at an estimated cost of ₹1,450 crore. The Cabinet also approved a proposal making jute packaging mandatory for all food grains.

The scheme will provide improved weather, climate and ocean forecast and services, thereby ensuring transfer of commensurate benefits to the various services like Public weather service, disaster management, Agro-meteorological Services, Aviation services, Environmental monitoring services, Hydro-meteorological

services, climate services, tourism, pilgrimage, power generation, water management, orts and adventure.

Briefing reporters after the Cabinet meeting, Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said the scheme will be implemented by the Ministry of Earth Sciences through its institutes namely India

Meteorological Department (IMD), Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), National Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecasting (NCMRWF), and Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Service(INCOIS). In an official statement, the

Government said the scheme will generate employment opportunities. "A sizable number of scientific and technical staff alongwith requisite administrative support, thereby generating employment. To ensure last-mile connectivity of the weather based services to the end -user, a large number of agencies like the Krishi Vigyana Kendras of Indian Council of Agricultural Research, universities and local municipalities are roped in thus generating employment opportunities to many people,"

The Cabinet also approved establishment of National Facility for Airborne Research (NFAR) with a financial commitment of ₹130 crore during 2020-21 and beyond.

On the making jute packaging mandatory, the government said that the CCEA approved that 100 per cent of the food grains and 20 per cent of the sugar shall be mandatorily packed in diversified jute bags. Earlier, it was compulsory to pack 90 per cent of the food grains and 20 per cent of the sugar in jute bags.

"Initially, 10 per cent of the indents of jute bags for packing food grains would be placed through reverse auction on the GeM (Government e-Marketplace) portal. This will gradually usher in a regime of price discovery," it said.

### American killed in Andamans not preacher: MHA

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

The Centre on Thursday denied that the American national allegedly killed by members of a protected tribe in the Andamans was a missionary even as it claimed his death was due to his enthusiasm in adventure sports and not in any evangelist mission. However, the American national John Allen Chau violated local laws to reach the highly-restricted island, officials said.

Chau, 27, neither informed police as is required under the law nor did he take permission from the forest department and the local administration before reaching the North Sentinel Island, where two fishermen were also killed in 2006 by the Sentinelese tribals who are fiercely opposed to establishing any contact with for-

"We even cannot carry out proper census in the island. We can only make an assessment of the number of people living in the island through aerial survey," a senior Home Ministry official said.

Access to North Sentinel Island and its buffer zone is strictly restricted under Protection of Aboriginal Tribe (Regulation), 1956 and Regulations under Indian Forest Act, 1927. Recent circulars of the Union Home Ministry also restrict movement of foreigners in these

"Despite knowing fully well about the illegality of the action and the hostile attitude of the Sentinelese tribesmen to the outsiders, these people (seven persons arrested in the case) collaborated with John Chau for this visit to North Sentinel Island without any permission from the authorities," according to a statement by the Director General of Andaman and Nicobar Police Dependra

Pathak said Chau had enlisted the help of local electronics engineer Alexander and a water sports service provider and hired five fishermen to evade the patrolling teams of police, Coast Guard and Navy to approach the

For this, the local fishermen were paid around ₹25,000 by Chau. "They started on November 14 around 8 PM for

the North Sentinel Island and reached there by midnight. The next day, Chau moved to shore using his kayak which he got towed with the fishing boat. After dropping him the fishermen fixed their timings and place to meet each other between the shoreline and their high sea fishing area.

"In the morning of November 17, they saw a dead person being buried at the shore which from the silhouette of the body, clothing and circumstances appeared to be the body of Chau," Pathak said in his statement through a release issued late on Wednesday night.

Subsequently, returned to Port Blair and narrated the incident to Alexander and handed him the 13 pages of the journal written by Chau.

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Thursday sought the Centre's response on a petition seeking quota benefit in Government employment for people with speech and language disability.

'Speech and language disability' refers to a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.



A bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and justices K M Joseph and M R Shah issued notice to the Centre on the PIL filed by Reepal Kansal that said that though disabled persons falling in the category of 'speech and language disabili-ty" are getting the benefit of reservation in education, the same is not given to them in

public employment.

Lawyer Yadunandan Bansal, appearing for Kansal said the Centre was unjustified in not granting reservation in employment to people with speech and language disabilities and it amounted to discrimination.

The petition, filed through advocate Ashutosh Garg, said not granting quota benefit to such disabled people was "flagrant violation of their rights under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016". PTI

"Having carefully considered the factual material and circumstantial evidences so far available at my disposal, I have provisionally come to the conclusion that the unfortunate incident of running over of 60 persons near Jaura-Fatak near Amritsar railway station of Ferozpur division of Northern Railways on October 19, 2018 at 6:55 pm occurred due to the negligence of persons reportedly standing on and near railway track witnessing Dussehra Mela at Dhobi Ghat," CCCRS S K Pathak said in the report, a copy of which is with PTI.

### Experts call for legalising pot for medicinal use

ARCHANA JYOTI ■ NEW DELHI

While India is taking its own time to allow the cultivation of cannabis (marijuana) in the country, experts including scientists have raised a chorus calling for legalising it as is being done by many developed nations to reap the benefits of the growing medicinal and industrial green herb market.

Currently, Uttarakhand is the only State in the country to have legalised the cultivation and production of hemp (a variety of marijuana) for industrial purposes.

On Friday, scientists from CSIR labs such as J&K based-Institute of Integrative Medicine (IIIM) and Institute of Himalayan Bio-resource Technology in Palampur (HP) besides senior doctors from premier health and research institutes like AIIMS, Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai and for research into its medand experts from Narcotics Control Bureau among others will be holding a brain storming session here to deliberate and establish an action plan to cash in on the potential future opportunities of the cannabis.

The event "Cannabis R&D in India: A Scientific, Medical & Legal Perspective" has been organised by the Bombay Hemp Company (BOHECO), a first startup in India to study the medical and industrial use of cannabis in partnership with the CSIR and the CSIR -IIIM.

Vishwakarma, Ram Director of the Jammu-based IIIM, which has obtained commercial licence from the State Government to grow cannabis at its research station, said that they are already in talk with NITI Aayog and the Drug Controller General of India's office for a suitable policy to legalise cannabis cultivation

icinal use. "Cannabis-derived API (active pharmaceutical industry) alone has a \$23 billion export possibility from India. In future, India could be a large supplier to the world for CBD-derived API," he added.

For its clinical trial, the CSIR-IIIM is in touch with all reputed cancer hospitals in the country to test the drugs on terminal patients. "We expect to have results for regulatory approvals in a year or two before we can release our research for commercial exploitation," said Vishwakarma.

Sanjay Kumar, Director, CSIR-IHBT too said that the herb serves as a major painkiller for the patients suffering with cancer third stage. Apart from many medicinal and industrial benefits, the plants can also provide livelihood to the farmers. "It is ecofriendly, need less water, does

not attract pests and animals like monkeys, its bio-product can be used for fuel purpose. Given its enormous benefits, it's high time that the government come out from the myth and doubts surrounding this plant. We need to focus on the variety with is less narcotic," Dr Kumar said.

Jahan Peston Jamas, Cofounder, BOHECO said: "The cannabis plant is a victim of misperception despite being an integral part of Indian cul-ture. For thousands of years, it has been a trusted ingredient in the treatment of various ail-

"Yet cannabis is mired in ambiguity when it comes to its application in modern healthcare. Till now, there has been limited debate in India on the medicinal, legal and scientific aspects of using cannabisderived products as medicine,'







### Guv expresses concern over humiliation of Union Minister at Sabarimala

PSathasivam, Governor of Kerala, informed Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan his concern and displeasure over the behavior of Yatheesh Chandra, police officer, towards Pon Radhakrishnan, Union Minister of State for Finance, Surface Transport and shipping when the latter visited Sabarimala on Wednesday. He also told the Chief Minister about his unhappiness over the slapping of Section 144 at the shrine.

The Governor invited the Chief Minister to Raj Bhavan on Thursday to discuss various issues concerning Sabarimala. Delegations of various political parties including the Congress, the principal opposition party, had called on the Governor early this week and had briefed him about the shortcomings at Sabarimala.

"I highlighted the grievance expressed by Shri. Pon Radhakrishnan, Hon. Minister of State for Finance & Shipping. Need to improve transport facility between Nilackal and Pampa also was discussed in meeting with the Chief

Minister," the Governor posted in his social media site after the meeting which lasted for 30 minutes.

"I discussed with the chief minister the measures to address complaints on lack of basic amenities like drinking water, toilets and rest rooms at Nilackal, Pampa and on way to Sanidhanam," said the Governor after the meeting. Sabarimala had witnessed

unpleasant scenes when union minister Pon Radhakrishnan visited the shrine on Wednesday. Yatheesh Chandra, a superintendent of police 'misbehaved' with the union minister when the former was asked why private vehicles and outstation vehicles were not being allowed at Pamba. The officer shouted at Radhakrishnan asking whether he would take the responsibility for the same.

The Governor also discussed complaints he received about police action and possibilities of lifting restrictions imposed through Section 144 of the CrPC . The misbehaviour of the Kerala Police officer towards Union Minister Pon Radhakrishnan had its fall out in Tamil Nadu.

### **Upright IAS officer** Mundhe shifted yet again, **Nashikars stage protest**

12th transfer in 13-year career

nown for his uprightness, Kdiscipline and peoplefriendly approach, IAS officer Tukaram Mundhe has been transferred yet again, his 12th transfer in 13 years and fourth since May 2016. Not unexpectedly, his latest transfer from being the Nashik Municipal Commissioner to a relatively insignificant post as joint secretary in the State Planning department at Mantralaya (State Secretariat) has sparked protests from citizens in Nashik.

After having been transferred to the state secretariat within nine months of being taking over as the Nashik Municipal Commissioner, Mundhe arrived at the Nashik Municipal Corporation (NMC) for the last time on Thursday morning before handing over the charge to the district collector, only to witness a protest being staged by local citizens against his sudden transfer to Mumbai.

The protesters, who had come to express their solidar-

ity with the outgoing Municipal Commissioner, were shouting slogans like "We want Mundhe" in support and against the Maharashtra government for shifting him out of Nashik at the behest of the ruling BJP's elected representatives at the NMC.

No wonder, around e the same time, BJP corporators celebrated Mundhe's transfer by bursting crackers at Nashik Mayor Ranjana Bhansi's official bungalow "Ramayan". The celebrations by the BJP's elected representatives should be seen in the context of a proposal by the BJP corporators to move a non-confidence motion against Mundhe at a special civic general meeting that the Mayor had called on September 1 this year ostensibly in protest against the Municipal Commissioner's move to increase the rateable value for property tax from 3 paise per sq foot to 40 paise per sq foot and likewise in differing categories.

### **Manhandling J&K**

Are Kashmiris unfit for democracy? The Governor's refusal to allow NC and PDP a shot at power will intensify anger against Delhi



🦳 ince Independence, Jammu & Kashmir has led a troubled and contentious existence. Pakistan has never tired of making trouble here, starting with the first attempt in 1948 to forcibly detach the State from India. It hardly needs recalling that hardcore Islamic groups in the Valley are aided and abetted by Islamabad to keep the State simmering. These external provocations have been

compounded by many internal errors of judgment or ham-handed actions fomenting popular discontent. Democracy, the cornerstone of India's political basis since 1952, has only fitfully survived in a State riddled by myriad complexities. For many decades after elections began in the rest of India, voters of Jammu & Kashmir rarely got an opportunity to exercise their franchise as candidates' nomination papers were routinely rejected to ensure hand-picked nominees of Delhi were elected unopposed and presided over the State's destiny. Also, Governments in Srinagar were periodically toppled on Delhi's orders and puppet politicians installed as Chief Ministers.

Many rued the growing alienation of Kashmiris from the mainstream of Indian politics and society but the Centre, citing national security reasons, firmly kept the lid on. A combination of these factors along with the rise of Islamic radicalism in the 1980s saw the eruption of terrorism in the State in a big way after 1989. The Centre's iron-fisted response to this led to the forced migration of Kashmiri Pandits from the Valley. Rigged elections and frequent spells of direct Central rule removed the remaining safety valves and the gulf of mistrust between Delhi and Srinagar continued to widen, spurred by occasional excesses by security forces and frequent terrorist outrages. But instead of reaching out to the Kashmiri people including politicians loyal to India, Delhi carried on playing a double game. Only once at the initiative of then Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee was a sincere attempt made to address the festering sores in a spirit of insaniyat or humanity. But that too was short-lived and the State was pushed back into the dark abyss from which it had tried furtively to emerge.

Actions like what we witnessed late last Wednesday night are typical of the cavalier manner in which Jammu & Kashmir has been handled by Delhi. The appointment of a has-been politician with no experience of Kashmir affairs as the State's Governor was bad enough, especially after the enforced demise of the BJP-PDP coalition. But the refusal to allow Kashmir's two main regional parties, National Conference and PDP, to bury differences and form a new Government amounted to a criminal error of judgment. To cover up the folly, the Governor has been compelled to fall back on the unconvincing plea of national security. It is also being said that most parties wanted the Assembly dissolved anyway. But politics is dynamic and a Governor is expected to respond to changing political realities with alacrity. The premature dissolution of the Assembly is a flagrant violation of existing constitutional norms, clearly laid down after the SR Bommai judgment. It reinforces the impression that Jammu & Kashmir cannot be allowed to have genuine democracy if the party ruling at the Centre is kept out of power. Both the State and the country as a whole must be ready to pay a heavy price for this chicanery thereby risking further alienation of the Kashmiri people.

### Savaging the civilised

umans, by nature, have since time immemorial nurtured an insatiable desire to explore. The world grew more inter-connected and communities become more settled, first pastoral and later urbanised, but our desire to explore new frontiers remained. Human curiosity not to mention greed led us to explore the habitats of inaccessible peoples in remote geographies usually at a terrible cost to those being 'discovered', who are some-

times dubiously referred to as 'primitive' and/or 'savage'. The latest example of this desire for exotica was manifest in the ill-advised journey of John Allen Chau, an American national, who ventured illegally into the highly restricted and protected North Sentinel Island of the Andamans and Nicobar group, apparently motivated by a wish to establish contact with the Sentinelese tribe which inhabits it and has established a self-sustaining eco-system for itself bereft of any contact with the "modern" world. He paid for his misguided effort with his life as he was reportedly welcomed with bows and arrows, killed and ultimately buried in the sand on a beach. There is some talk of his being in touch with a preacher and being on a mission to proselytise. The issue now for Indian and US authorities is whether to attempt to retrieve his body. Not only will the island's tribal inhabitants strongly resist any interference from modern humans as they have in the past, there is also the danger that any outside contact with them may cause an outbreak of diseases to which they have no immunity and might wipe them out. Even the flu bug can be fatal for the Sentinelese.

Unfortunate as his death is, Chau should never have been anywhere near North Sentinel Island. He had no business bribing local fishermen to drop him off at the island at night, exposing not only himself but those who conveyed him there and the inhabitants of the island, to danger. Even since the 1960s, any attempt to establish and/or maintain contact with the Sentinelese has been met with fierce resistance. In 2006, a similar incident had taken place when two fishermen unknowingly strayed on to the island; they too were attacked and killed. The Sentinelese, perhaps even more than the Jarawas, are an insular tribal community and have been living their lives on their own terms for at least 60,000 years. Their isolated and sustainable way of life, hunting and gathering food from the pristine forests and shores of their island, has kept them going without any unsolicited help from outsiders. The very fact that they survived the tsunami of 2004 despite being directly in its path and rejecting any form of help from the Indian authorities is further proof that they are best left alone. As it is, the Sentinelese have been hovering on the brink of extinction. Though there is no confirmed head count, their population was estimated to be 40 in 2014. Any contact with the outside world, therefore, means a threat to not only the inhabitants, but also to their fragile ecosystem and survival. Memories of the atrocities on the vulnerable Jarawas when allegedly civilised human beings made contact with them are still fresh in our minds. The withdrawal of special tourist permits from Sentinel and other islands was erroneous as certain things are best left the way nature intends them to be.

# An unrecognised explorer

It's time we do justice to Radhanath Sikdar, the man who first measured Mount Everest



ll of us are aware from the days of our childhood that the highest mountain peak in the world is Mount Everest and it was discovered by George Everest. It was only much later that one came to know that Sir George Everest was the Surveyor General of India and the peak was so named as he had discovered it to be the highest in the world. As the Surveyor General, he had his offices in Dehradun and used to stay in Mussoorie. He left India in 1843, almost 200 years ago, but his house in Mussoorie is still being preserved and is now a place of tourist interest.

The truth, however, is somewhat different. It is a fact that Sir George Everest was the Surveyor General of India from 1830 to 1843, but it is also a fact that during his tenure of office, Mount Everest, that we know of today, was only known as 'Peak XV'. Everest had neither initiated the process of measuring the height of this peak, nor was he instrumental in its naming, which was done much later, long after he had proceeded to England to enjoy his retirement after 1843. Located on the border of Nepal and Tibet, this 'Peak XV' has been worshipped as a holy place by the Tibetans, who called it Chomolungma, the Mother Goddess of the World. In Nepal, this peak is known as Sagarmatha, meaning the peak of heavens. Even these days, this peak is addressed by its traditional names, both in Tibet and Nepal, while we have followed what was given to us by the British ie Mount Everest.

In fact, the name Everest was given by Col Sir Andrew Waugh of Bengal Engineers, who succeeded Everest as the Surveyor General of India from 1844 to 1861. Circumstances under which 'Peak XV' was named as Mount Everest are rather peculiar and reveal a very biased handling of the matter so that the entire credit goes to the British officers of the East India Company. Going through the historical records of the Survey of India Volume IV: 1830 to 1843, pertaining to the tenure of Sir George Everest, one can observe at a glance that he had shown no interest in 'Peak XV' during this period. It was his successor, Andrew Waugh, who made the official announcement of 'Peak XV' being the highest known peak of the world in 1856, the measurements had, of course, been initiated much earlier and finalised by our own Radha Nath Sikdar in 1849.

Recognising the work of Sikdar, the Government of India had issued a postage stamp in his honour in 2004. But his work is of such a great importance that issuing a does not do full justice to his unique and great contribution. It was Sir George Everest who had recruited Sikdar in the great trigonometrical survey and became extremely fond of him. Volume IV of the Historical records of Survey of India, pertaining to his tenure, have the following mention about Sikdar:



"Radanauth is high in favour with everybody, and universally beloved in the GT Survey. You will not know him for the same person when you see him again, for he is no longer a puny stripling, but a hardy energetic young man, ready to undergo any fatigue, and acquire a practical knowledge of all parts of his profession. ... There are few of my instruments which he cannot manage; and none of my computations of which he is not thoroughly master. ... Eventually he will furnish a convincing proof that the aptitude of your countrymen for the practical, as well as the theoretical, parts of mathematics is in no wise inferior to that of Europeans."

"Of the qualifications of the young man himself I cannot speak too highly. In his mathematical attainments there are few in India, whether European or Native, who can at all compete with him, and...even in Europe those attainments would rank very high.

Later, on account of a spe-cial technique developed by Sikdar for accurate computation of heights and distances through Spherical Trigonometry, he virtually became indispensable to the organisation and rose to become the Chief Computer in the office of SGI. In that position, he moved from Dehradun to Kolkata in 1849. As to why Everest, even though he had left the scene long ago, is an interesting piece of history.

Had SG Burrard, a later Surveyor General of India, not acknowledged the good work of Radhanath Sikdar through a research paper published in 1904 in the scientific journal *Nature*, these facts would not have come to light. He published in detail various steps taken for the measurement of 'Peak XV'. This in a way also exposed the machinations of Andrew Waugh who had tried his level best to take credit away from, to where it truly belonged, that is Radhanath Sikdar.

It is human nature that in case something important is achieved, one tries to take credit or gives credit to someone, but in this case, Waugh specifically mentioned that Sikdar had nothing to do with this work, indicating his bias. Later, he could be seen placating him by asking him that he should be happy that the peak had been named after his mentor. Andrew Waugh also gave the additional charge of the Indian Metrological Department to Sikdar, raising his salary to ₹600 per month. This was unheard for an Indian in those days. Clearly, all these efforts were to keep him happy but away from the core of the survey work.

SG Burrard's publication in the Nature specifically mentioned that the Chief Computer (who was Radhanath Sikdar) from Calcutta had informed Andrew Waugh in 1852 that the peak designated 'XV' had been found to be higher than any the world at that time. Raw data from theodolites, taken from seven observation stations at Jirol, Mirzapur, Janjpati, Ladiva, Haripur, Minai and Doom Dongi was collected at the trigonometrical survey at

Calcutta. This was then processed by Radhanath Sikdar and conveyed to Andrew Waugh that 'Peak XV' had been measured at 29,002 feet, taking the mean value of all observations. Considering that the scientific instrumentation available at that time was only of a rudimentary nature, the level of accuracy reached was almost 100 per cent, and this figure has not undergone any change, despite the current state of technological progress.

Correspondence between Waugh and Sikdar reveals that Waugh did privately acknowledge the achievement of Sikdar but did not recognise his work on record and in public. In his letter dated August 25, 1856, Waugh wrote to Sikdar that he was glad to hear that naming the peak as Everest had given the latter a lot of satisfaction. Thus, it is clear that the name Everest was given to ensure that Sikdar, who could have been the rightful claimant for credit, did not object as he was extremely fond of Everest, who had recruited him in service. The situation would have remained obscure but for the research paper of SG Burrard in 1904. Later, Professor Meghnad Saha acknowledged this feat in 1938 by giving Sikdar full credit. Earlier, Kenneth Mason in 1928, recognised his work as also John Keay in his book, *The Great Arc.* 

In the given situation, changing the name of Mount Everest to Mount Sikdar Everest will perhaps do full justice to Radhanath Sikdar and give him worldwide recognition, which was legitimately his due, long time ago. We do not have to seek anybody's approval for such a change as the rationale is all well-documented. Even if the world continues to call it Everest, in India, we could still call it Sikdar Everest.

On several earlier occa-

sions, achievements of Indian scientists have not been recognised, as Sir JC Bose could have got the Nobel Prize for Physics or at least shared it with Marconi for his work on wireless and radio; SN Bose could have got the Nobel Prize wav back in 1932 for his work with Einstein on Bose Einstein condensate but atleast he was recognised, though belatedly naming the God particle, Higgs-Boson after him. Naming Everest as recoginition of a scientist whose work has stood the test of time. Besides it would also justifiably

### The clock is ticking

Fighting pollution must be a concerted effort by every citizen. Otherwise, it shall remain a matter of academic and media discourse

his is a classic example of all talk and no work. Every year around this time, we hear lot of noise about smog and pol-I lution. Suddenly the aura of Delhi gets diminished and is portrayed as one of the worst cities to live in. Government agencies, doctors, environmentalists, NGOs, activists and a host of other players, including many foreign universities, suddenly get vocal and bring to the fore myriad of troubles that plague India's capital and her surrounding regions.

Yes, the problems abound — and there is a funny repetition of the pattern every year — what's baffling is that we don't hear or see much by way of action. And who is to blame for this? Many would like to put the onus on the Government. However, the fact is that this is a massive challenge and requires concerted and sustained intervention by each one of us. Else, it shall remain only a matter of academic and media discourse and will lead us into a smoke of perennially lingering threats.

This is why the Air Quality Life Index (AQLI) developed by the University of Chicago's Milton Friedman Professor in Economics Michael Greenstone and his team at Energy Policy Institute (EPIC) calculates the effect of air quality on life expectancy. And according to this Index, each one of us living in Delhi could be sacrificing 10 years of our lives to the apathy of the Government and other stakeholders. "The AQLI is an index that translates particulate air pollution into its impact on life expectancy. In Delhi, pollution concentration in 2016 averaged 113 microgram per cubic metre. Based on the research, life expectancy would be more than 10 years longer for people of Delhi of the World Health Organisation (WHO) standards had been met," said Ken Lee, Executive Director of EPIC India. WHO prescribes the safe limit of annual mean PM 2.5 to 10 micrograms per cubic metre.

For India, the limit was raised to 40 micrograms per cubic metre. However, the PM 2.5 concentration (particles in the air with a diameter of less than 2.5 micrometres) in Delhi was 114 micrograms per cubic metre in 2016, which is 1.6 times more than 70 micrograms per cubic metre in 1998, the study said. On November 22 morning, the PM2.5 levels were at an alarming 261 as per *aqicn.org*, a website where you could check

Little surprise the EPIC report found Delhi to be among 50 most polluted areas of the country. India, on the other hand, stands as the world's second most polluted country, after Nepal. Globally, particulate pollution reduces average life expectancy by about 1.8 years. The study highlighted, "The impact of particulate pollution on life expectancy is comparable to that of smoking, twice that of alcohol and drug use, three times that of unsafe water, five times that of HIV/AIDS, and more than 25 times that of conflict and terrorism." The study pointed out that over the past two decades, the concentration of fine particulates increased by 69 per cent on an average across India, reducing the life expectancy of a typical Indian citizen by 4.3 years compared to 2.2 years in 1998. All this is scary. What have we done to ward off these present dangers?

On November 14, the Supreme Court-appointed Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority (EPCA) wrote to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) asking them to implement either the odd-even scheme or impose complete ban on non-CNG private vehicles. CPCB in turn said that this was to be deliberated by EPCA, which was a larger body, even as per protocol, the latter can only notify those anti-pollution measures which are recommended by the former. So far, no action is seen on this. Earlier this week, we also heard about plans to induce artificial rain over Delhi to wash away toxic pollutants. It was reported that scientists from IIT Kanpur, depending on the conditions, would do seeding of silver iodide and other chemical substances.

Intriguingly, talks on cloud seeding have been under way for many decades but we have not been able to operationalise it as yet. The Pune-based Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) has been conducting cloud-seeding experiments in Maharashtra. One hopes we see it happening as it will bolster the confidence of citizens. On their part, citizens, too, can take some initiatives including volunteering not to use private vehicles. The tasks of the authorities, meanwhile, are clearly cut out. Unprecedented in-migration, rise in private and commercial vehicles, growing construction and an over-stressed public transport system are few areas that are intricately linked with rising pollution in Delhi and the National Capital Region. The clock is ticking and there is never a better time to take tough measures than now.

### Bounce back from failure

Experience from failures and life lessons are crucial for an entrepreneur. In fact, venture capitalists have invested in those who have survived multiple troughs

ailure and age are the two biggest reasons why people do not venture out of their comfort zone and try new, exciting and innovative ideas. This shows that individual or societal perception of failure is directly proportional to entrepreneurial attitude and intention in an economy. We all love to hear stories of young entrepreneurs, from Mark Zuckerberg, who changed the way we commu-nicate with the world, to our very own Ritesh Agarwal, who is known to be one of the youngest CEOs in the Indian hotel industry besides being the first resident Indian to be awarded the prestigious Thiel Fellowship. With the advent of booming techpreneurs around the world, youth have become synonymous with entrepreneurial success. Does that mean that youth and inexperience are better than experience in both life and industry? Not really. A study by the Kauffman Foundation states that the average age of successful start-up founders is 40 with at least six to 10 years of industry experience. They are twice as likely to be launched by people over 55 as well as people of age group 20 to 34, thereby bursting all myths linking youth and entrepreneurship.

Additionally, according to a recent survey by First Round, a early-stage venture capital fund, almost one-third of start-up founders are over 40. In fact, busting the myth, failure may not be a bad word in a start-up world either, since an entrepreneur, who has never experienced failure, is untested and has not learnt from adversity. Quite a few venture capitalists have been known to invest in entrepreneurs who have undergone multiple entrepreneurial failures. There could be several reasons for failures like bad timing, funding, or product-market fit. It is not failure that would matter the most but the kind of lessons an entrepreneur is able to draw from it and how many times s/he gets back up on his/her feet. This intrinsic ability of bouncing back from a failure and a 'never-say-die' attitude makes an entrepreneur successful. Failure is a great teacher and all entrepreneurs must learn from it.

We all know about the world's most successful entrepreneurs. However, we are unaware of the failures they have faced to reach where they are. Steve Jobs was an unconventional leader and an impressive entrepreneur not only because of his make emphatic comebacks from almost irrecoverable failures. Not many of us realise that one of the world's wealthiest persons, Bill Gates, tasted failure early in his entrepreneurial life with his first venture, an early version of big data, Traf-O-Data, which was a complete disaster. However, the failure did not hold Gates back from exploring new opportunities, and a few years later, he created his first Microsoft product and forged a new path to success. Jeff Bezos, founder of Amazon, who recently surpassed Bill Gates as the richest man on this planet, also has had his shares of failures. Before

Amazon became a household name, the company's CEO had several failed ideas. One of the most notable was an online auction site which evolved into zShops, a brand that ultimately failed. Still, CEO Jeff Bezos re-purposed the idea into what eventually became the Amazon Marketplace.

Walt Disney, one of the most creative geniuses of the 20th century, after being fired from a newspaper apparently for lacking creativity, formed his first animation company called Laugh-O-Gram Studio, which failed due to the closing of an important distributor partner. Disney achieved success later in Hollywood after facing similar criticism's and failures.

The journey for making Hershey's successful was not as sweet for Milton Hershey as their chocolates taste. After his initial three candy-related ven-tures failed, his fourth attempt in this business started showing results, which eventually led him to create Hershey Company, one of the well-known companies in the candy industry and also led to realise the dream of milk choco-

There are numerous entrepreneurs for whom age is just a number and one can find these examples in all industries. Colonel Harland Sanders, the man behind the world famous KFC's chicken recipe, is far from being an ideal entrepreneur. Having faced troubled early years, Sanders slowly gained popularity for his delicious chicken recipe while working at a local service station in Kentucky. In 1952, at the age of 62, Sanders franchised his 'Kentucky Fried Chicken' for the first time. Today, KFC has over 18,800 outlets in 118 different countries and territories.

McDonald's, which is highly popular in India as well as around the world as one of the leading fast food outlets, was popularised by Ray Kroc using the franchise model who finally ended up buying the company from the McDonald family for \$2.7 million at the

### The real Chinese revolution

It is unrealistic to expect Indian restrooms to become cultural hubs. But there is a need to adapt from the Chinese Government's initiative to rate toilets and penalise laggards to ensure standards of hygiene are maintained at public conveniences

t is a well-established fact that a country's sanitation standards L play an important role in boosting its tourism inflows. Public toilets, especially, can make or break a country's image. But can public restrooms be turned into a cultur-

al experience? Ûnimaginable as it may seem, Libo, a picturesque county in China's Guizhou Province, has done just that. Tourism being the mainstay of the economy in Libo, popularly called the Green Emerald because of its breath-taking green lakes, the famed Seven Holes Bridge (a UNESCO world heritage site) and lush landscape, public toilets here are not just free and hygienic but have been so planned and built that users get a glimpse of their rich cultural heritage as well.

Called service stations, the eight public toilet complexes in Libo weave tradition and culture with modern sanitation infrastructure to showcase the fascinating history of its ethnic communities.

This has been done so that tourists can learn about their unique customs and culture, say local officials.

Much like India, each of the 56 ethnic communities in China has its own unique costumes, jewellery, language, music and musical instruments and scripts.

Spreading greater awareness of the history and folklore of these ethnic communities is the Yao Service Station. Named after the Yao ethnic community, this public toilet complex has used a 160-yearold Zhangaoshu tree to tell an

interesting tale. The purpose of building the restrooms around this Zhangaoshu, or Sticky Paste tree as it is known, was because the bark and juice extracted from this tree have been traditionally used by the Yaos to weave fabric and make the famed indigo dye.

Known for their expertise in weaving, dyeing and embroidery, the Yaos are believed to have first developed their craft during the time of the Han Dynasty.

In the two-storyed Yao service station, there is more than just separate women's, men's and unisex toilets (these have extra baby seats, safety handrails and speakers). Stories of the Yao community line the walls in addition to a café, a teatasting room and a library.

Since the restrooms are situated on the ground floor to cater to the special demands of the elderly. women, children and people with disabilities, the Yao exhibits have been strategically placed so that when visitors walk out of the restrooms, they are bound to see them as well as the tree. They can also step into the café for a quick bite or relax in the library, brows-

sourced these service stations to private companies to ensure that the quality of hygiene is maintained. So while the toilets are free, revenue is generated from the café to help sustain the facility. Now with the increase in the number of tourists, (mostly domestic), from nine million in 2016 to 12 million in 2017, six more such service stations have been planned. It is not just Libo which has

invested heavily in upgrading its infrastructure. Guizhou has invested 1.243 billion yuan (\$198 million) in building and upgrading 3,200 public toilets in the entire province since 2015. The decision to make public

loos more than just toilets was taken after a three-year "toilet revolution" was launched in China in 2015 by President Xi Jinping to build better bathrooms at tourist sites.

A sum of 20 billion yuan (\$3.03 billion) has already been spent on

installing and improving 68,000 toi-

lets located at tourist destinations

The local government has out- across the country, according to Chinese media reports.

Now there is a bid to improve toilets in the rural areas much like the Swachh Bharat campaign initiated by the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2014. In fact, it was believed that inspiration for the toilet revolution in China came from the India.

India, too, has made progress in its cleanliness campaign. Government statistics show that just a little less than 80 million toilets have been built and 89 per cent of the population have access to a toilet. But toilets at tourist spots have somehow not received the same priority and focus. The photograph of incomplete toilets at the recently opened Statute of Unity complex is a case in point. Could not the inauguration have waited until everything was completed? Considering the huge sum of money spent on building the Statute, why was this aspect over-

The lack of basic facilities at

prominent tourist destinations not only leaves a bad impression but also impacts negatively on tourism. In Karnataka, for example, the 2014-15 Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India's report found that 33 per cent of the people were unhappy with basic facilities such as toilets and their maintenance at tourist destinations. This translated in a decline in tourist inflow and consequently, a decline in tourism revenue.

It is unrealistic to expect Indian restrooms to become cultural hubs. But clean, hygienic and user-friendly public toilets are a must. Sulabh International has a good record and could be given the responsibility in conjunction with other like-minded NGOs.

Maybe there is a need to adapt from the Chinese Government's initiative to rate toilets and also penalise laggards to ensure standards of hygiene are maintained at public restrooms.

Ghosn stands accused of under-reporting his income by millions of dollars and a host of other financial irregularities, in a stunning fall from grace for the once-revered titan of the

The 64-year-old Brazilborn tycoon is credited with turning around the Japanese brand and forged an alliance with Renault and Mitsubishi Motors that last year sold 10.6 million cars between them more than any other firm in the

Ghosn's fate appears all but sealed after his hand-picked replacement as CEO, Hiroto Saikawa, launched an astonishing broadside at his mentor following his arrest on Monday at a Tokyo airport as he landed in his private jet.

Saikawa said "too much authority" had been placed in the chairman's hands and lamented the "dark side of the Ghosn era", as he called the board meeting to fire him.

Seven board members will vote on the motion to dismiss Ghosn, which needs a simple majority to pass. Insiders say Saikawa would likely not have suggested the ouster unless he were sure of support from his fellow board members.

### New rules for re-classification of promoter as public investor

Markets regulator Sebi rules for re-classification of a promoter as a public investor, wherein an outgoing promoter will have to relinquish special rights as well as control over the affairs of the listed firm and not be allowed to hold over 10 per cent stake.

Besides, the promoter would not be allowed to have any representation on the board of directors or act as a key managerial person in the listed entity.

Further, the promoter seeking re-classification must not be a wilful defaulter or a fugitive economic offender, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) said in a notification dated November

These norms will prevent the outgoing promoters from continuing to exercise their control on the company directly or indirectly.

The norms, aimed at simplifying, streamlining and bringing greater clarity in existing regulations, come after Sebi's board in September approved a proposal in this

### Comm Min not in favour of cutting duties on seven ICT products demanded by US

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The Commerce Ministry is not in favour of cutting or eliminating customs duties on seven categories of ICT products, including high-end mobile phones and smart watches, as demanded by the US citing revenue loss and adverse impact on Make in India initiative, sources said.

Moreover, the duty cut will not have any tangible benefit for American manufacturers as the US is not a major exporter of these products to India.

India and the US is nego tiating a mutually agreeable bilateral package on a number of contentious issues. Under these talks, the US is pressing for reduction or elimination of customs duties on these seven ICT (information and communication technologies)

"However, the US demand would have adverse implications for revenue generation, forex reserves, and also on the Make in India drive," they said.

In 2017-18, India's imports of these seven tariff lines (or product categories) stood at \$20.5 billion and the duty revenues generated on these imports amount to about \$3.2

On the other hand, America's exports of these

items to India in 2017-18 were only \$415 million, which is about 2 per cent of India's total imports of these products in that fiscal.

The other items on which the US is demanding reduction includes telecom network equipment such as switches and routing equipment; radio receivers; high-end mobile phones costing over ₹10,000; mobile phone parts, certain print circuit assemblies and smart watches.

The sources also stated that under the World Trade Organisation (WTO) norms, it would be not possible for India to extend these benefits only for the US.

"In this background, there is a need to workout some other mechanism to resolve the issue as the current proposal made by the US would not have the desired outcome or any fundamental advantage to America," they added.

India has in the recent past increased customs duties on these products with a view to promote domestic manufacturing.

### Market erases early gains, **Sensex falls over 200 pts**

¬he BSE Sensex gave up all lits early gains in choppy trade Thursday and ended lower for the third straight session by falling over 200 points due to selling in metal, PSU, auto and banking stocks amid fresh fund outflows and a weak trend in the global mar-

The 30-share Sensex opened higher at 35,282.33 points and advanced further to the day's high of 35,364.50 on the back of fresh buying by domestic investors amid further strength in the rupee.

It, however, slipped into the negative zone on selling pressure at improved levels, following a weak opening of European equities, and slipped below the 35,000-mark to hit a low of 34,937.98 before closing at 34,981.02, recording a fall of 218.78 points, or 0.62 per cent.

The gauge had lost 575 points in the previous two sessions. Similarly, NSE Nifty 73.30 points, or 0.69 per cent, to close at 10,526.75.

The indices closed with losses for the week, with the Sensex declining 476.14 points, and the broader NSE Niftv falling 155.45 points during the period. According to analysts, market failed to hold the opening gains as weak global market and selling in metals and PSU banks dragged the indices.

Global growth concerns due to trade war, rising interest rate and lower liquidity in the financial markets added to the woes, they added

Offloading of positions by participants ahead of the long weekend as markets will remain closed Friday on account of "Guru Nanak Jayanti", too, negatively impacted investor sentiment here, brokers said.

The Indian currency continued its upward rising streak for the seventh straight day by rising 45 paise to 71.01 in late afternoon trade against the American currency (intraday) at the interbank forex

Among Sensex constituents, M&M was the worst hit, dropping 3.02 per cent, followed by Tata Steel shedding 2.28 per cent.

Other laggards include Wipro, Axis Bank, Coal India, PowerGrid, SBI, ICICI Bank, Yes Bank, IndusInd Bank, NTPC, Bharti Airtel, HUL, Vedanta, Tata Motors, Sun Pharma, RIL, Asian Paints, HDFC Bank, Kotak Bank, Bajaj Auto, Hero MotoCorp, ITC and Infosys, falling up to 2.10 per cent. Bucking the trend, Adani Ports, L&T, TCS, ONGC and HDFC ended with

### CBDT gets tough on service charge by restaurants

Cervice charge collected by hotels and Srestaurants but not passed on to staff and workers will be liable to income tax in the hands of such entities, the tax department has said.

The department has asked the field offices to examine the books hotels and restaurants to see if there is any 'under reporting' or 'non-reporting' of service charge collected by them.

The missive from the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) came after the Ministry of Consumer Affairs flagged that some hotels and restaurants are collecting service charge from customers in a compulsory manner, which is in contravention with the guidelines issued by the ministry. The ministry also said that there is "every likelihood" that the service charge amount collected is not even distributed among staff and workers of the hotels and restaurants. The CBDT, which is the apex decision making body for direct taxes, asked the field offices to examine whether there is any under-reporting or nonreporting of additional income collected in the name of service charge

"The disclosure and disbursement details of service charge transactions as contained in P&L (Profit & Loss) A/c, I/E (Income/Expenditure) statement and balance sheet should be critically examined to ascertain whether receipts from service charges are fully disclosed as part of the turnover of the hotel/restaurant or not," the CBDT said. It said that in situations where it is found that the receipts have not been passed on to the staff or workers by the hotel/restaurant or there is some under reporting or non-reporting, the receipts

should be duly brought to tax in the hands of concerned hotel/restaurant.

In April last year, Ministry of Consumer Affairs had issued a guideline on fair trade practices saying payment of service charge by customer to hotel or restaurant is completely optional.

The guidelines said that the bill presented to the customer may clearly display that service charge is voluntary and the service charge column of the bill may be left blank for the customers to fill up before making payment.

The CBDT said that the Consumer Affairs ministry has brought to its notice that some hotels/restaurants are still preemptively deciding upon the service charge without allowing the customers to voluntarily decide whether they actually want to pay it or not.

Nangia Advisors LLP Partner Suraj Nangia said: "These guidelines are going to increase the strain of the mischievous hotels/ restaurant owners as it points out their misdeeds. Such taxpayers would now have to act prudently by either eliminating such levy on the total bill amount or passing on its effect to the hotel/restaurant's workers."

The ministry has also said that there is "every likelihood" that such amount collected as service charge from the customers in a compulsory manner does not actually reach the workers and is instead kept by the hotel/restaurant owners. Ashok Maheshwary & Associates Partner Amit Maheshwari said: "To tackle cases where there is no actual reimbursement or the service charges itself has been underreported, instructions has been issued by CBDT to field officers to exercise greater scrutiny.

#### **VOLVO CARS TO LOCALLY ASSEMBLE XC 90**

New Delhi: Swedish automaker Volvo Cars aims to locally assemble plugin hybrid variant of its premium SUV XC 90 in India from next year, a top company official said on Thursday. The company is also gearing up to drive in four additional plug-in hybrid models in the country over the next three years as part of its plans to build a portfolio of environment-friendly vehicles. "We are going to be the first car company to assemble plug-in hybrid cars locally in India. The first model would be introduced in the last quarter of next year. The localisation of plug-in hybrids marks the future of electrification for us," Volvo Car India Managing Director Charles Frump told reporters here. The company would be rolling out the locally-assembled XC 90 T8 plug-in hybrid from its Bengaluru facility. It currently imports the vehicle as completely built-up units (CBUs). In a plug-in hybrid electric vehicle (PHEV), battery can be recharged by plugging it into an external source of electric power. Volvo, which sells a total of ten models in India, currently assembles three models — XC 90, XC 60, S90 in India

#### RUPEE DEPRECIATION ADDING PRESSURE ON PRICING: XIAOMI

New Delhi: Xiaomi on Thursday said rupee's slide against the US dollar is adding to pricing pressure for the Chinese tech major in India, particularly in the handset market that is witnessing stiff competition. Xiaomi, earlier this month, hiked prices of two of its handsets Redmi 6 and Redmi 6A as well as that of power banks and some television sets on account of the depreciation of the rupee against the greenback. "The rupee has depreciated by about 15 per cent since the beginning of the year. While we do make our phones and power banks in India but raw material and PCBA (printed circuit board assembly) is bought in dollars. This (depreciation) is adding pressure on us... we want to continue to offer 'honest' pricing to customers, Xiaomi Vice-President and India Managing Director Manu Jain told reporters here. To offset the impact, prices of various products were raised ranging from ₹100 to ₹2,000 with effect from November 11. In April this year, Xiaomi founder and CEO Lei Jun had said the company will keep its net profit margin at under 5 per cent to earn the "long-term support" of its customers. India is a key market for Xiaomi and the company is aggressively ramping up its product portfolio and offline presence (through Mi Homes, Mi Preferred Partners and Mi Stores) as it aims to continue its dominance in the Indian market. As per research firm IDC, Xiaomi led the intensely competitive Indian smartphone market with 27.3 per cent share, followed by Samsung (22.6 per cent share), Vivo (10.5 per cent), Micromax (6.9 per cent) and Oppo (6.7 per cent). Xiaomi on Thursday launched its Redmi Note 6 Pro — priced ₹13,999 onwards — that features artificial intelligence-powered quad-camera setup. Successor to its Note 5 Pro, the latest device comes with 6.26-inch display, Qualcomm Snapdragon 636 octa-core processor, 64GB internal memory and 4,000 mAh battery. It will come in two variants — 4GB and 6GB

Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir said on Wednesday that calls for the crown prince to be held accountable for the grisly killing of Jamal Khashoggi would not be tolerated.

His comments came as the US president praised Saudi Arabia for keeping oil prices low -- one strand of his argument against punishing Riyadh \even though the CIA reportedly found strong evidence that the crown prince, the de facto Saudi leader, was involved in the murder.

"In Saudi Arabia our leadership is a red line. The custodian of the two holy mosques (King Salman) and the crown prince are a red line," Jubeir told the BBC.

### Trump spars with chief justice over their views of judges

 $P^{\text{resident Donald Trump and}}_{\text{Chief Justice John Roberts}}$ clashed in an extraordinary public dispute over the independence of America's judiciary, with Roberts bluntly rebuking the president for denouncing a judge who rejected his migrant asylum policy as an "Obama judge."

There's no such thing, Roberts declared on Wednesday in a strongly worded statement contradicting Trump and defending judicial independence.

Never silent for long, Trump defended his own comment, tweeting defiantly, "Sorry Justice Roberts." The pre-Thanksgiving dustup was the first time that Roberts, the Republican-appointed leader of the federal judiciary, has



offered even a hint of criticism of Trump, who has several times blasted federal judges who have ruled against him.

Before now, it has been highly unusual for a president to single out judges for personal criticism. And a chief justice's challenge to a president's comments is downright unprecedented in modern times.

It seemed a fight that Trump would relish but one that Roberts has taken pains to



# AROMOF ONE'S OVIN

Art patron FEROZE GUJRAL explains the lacuna in infrastructure and policy that hinders appreciation of our creative heritage and elaborates how she is documenting untold stories. By Asmita Sarkar

n amalgam of cultures in the 1870s India was not unheard of though not talked about much in contemporary times. "Those blurring of lines between the social, sexual and the creative can be noted in the Company paintings, which had Mughal-trained artists drawing Victorianinspired botanical paintings that were expected to have scientific accuracy. However, the art style was quirky to say the least. Some of the paintings in the style categorised as Company paintings are nowhere near scientific and instead lie close to being abstracts. These basic annotations to Indian art were mostly unknown and now a string of exhibitions will make these more accessible," said William Dalrymple, while taking a master class on the subject.

In a series of presentations, the historian talked of how paintings on flora, fauna and everyday life documented India beyond the official story. For example, there was Lady Impey, wife of Lord Impey, the first chief justice of the Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal, who commissioned Sheikh Zain al-Din, Bhawani and Ram Das, who were probably brothers, to draw whatever she fancied — shawl goats, storks and cranes. A candid portrait of Sir David Ochterlony drew laughs from the audience as it revealed an unknown facet of him. The man was dressed in Indian clothes while smoking a hookah, likely opium than tobacco, and had wives or maybe courtesans around him. Ochterlony had 13 Indian wives. His British ancestors looked down at him from their perch on the walls inside wooden frames. Dalrymple joked that those ancestors were likely appalled at Company school paintings were the most underrated and underpriced and could be bought at as little as 15,000 pounds apiece but were rare documents of social and cultural history and could help us reassess per-

The physical and the performative were porous and flowed into each other at Bikaner House where the Allure of India exhibition, a tribute to Company paintings, was held. For the uninitiated, the event was organised by the Art Induct series of The Gujral Foundation to develop an awareness of contemporary art forms and practices. Model-turned art connoisseur Feroze Gujral is pursuing a new passion, building value for Indian arts both domestically and internationally, something that is lacking

at the moment. She thinks that Indians are too blasé towards unique creations since it is routine for them but the only way to garner attention and create value is to acknowledge the customised nature of the products. "We each wear an individual saree. No two are the same. We don't realise that there is very high custom design in the rest of the world. It is high couture to get a single outfit made by somebody. My house help, you, me, everybody has a singular garment that is spectacular. We don't think that's rare. We have hand-woven carpets, wall decor and jewellery but nobody realises how unique they are," said she.

Asked how the arts battles mass production, Feroze added, "There is no mass production of our theatre, workshops or dance shows. There are films and the entertainment industry, the only creative disciplines that have managed to do that to Îndia. Even literature is not. We have at least 24 languages and 113 dialects, which make us so unique. All of this needs to be curated and made relevant through discus-

All the more reason for us to address the shortfalls in infrastructure, policy and generate awareness. "We have a lack of museums and infrastructure. There are not enough spaces for the pursuit of arts, workshops and studio spaces. For example, we have tried hard to organise spaces for the Kochi Bienniale. We facilitate and provide spaces, big and small. Mentorships and partnerships are also lacking and we try to give advice too," she said of her initiative.

However, she sees a change in attitude towards reception and acceptance of arta in the country. "Thanks to the internet, people are beginning to think it's cool to and as sustenance instead of a regular salary. It's possible alongside being married or having a job. Today, we had a lone gentleman in the audience who works in natural gas and oil but is a painter. It's wonderful that he can be uninhibited about it. Most Indians would not say 'I'm a housewife and a dancer' with confidence, as if the pursuit of the arts was nothing more than a hobby, not even an added skill set. Now there's a new-found pride in saying so. So far, becoming an artiste was a rare career choice. No mother would say that 'Ok darling, don't do engineering' but it's beginning to happen now," she said.

Apart from the Venice Biennale, the foundation has also partnered with the London Design Biennale and have exhibited in Berlin as well. "Internationally, there is very low visibility of contemporary and high visibility of craft and textile. Those skills are still known. People can identify if a textile is made in India. Lot of the Indian fashion to the Western world is costume. When they look at an Indian wedding, it's costume. There is a fantasmic idea. Nobody thinks India is great for ceramic, terracotta or sculpture. There is a lot of curiosity and reverence to the ancients like the Taj Mahal, miniatures or Company paintings. Contemporary India's art has not received the same attention but having said that, we are a very young country, we are only 70 years old and we can yet change discourse,"

Along the way, she's faced not just hurdles in doing the kind of projects she wants to but faced constraints in the audience as well. "People don't understand or come with the enthusiasm," she concluded.

"The project was meant to be an introduction without making art academic or distant. We collaborated with YFLO because they are perceptive and from the industry. We can't do random open groups because it doesn't come with a cohesive nature of the right age group or education," said Feroze.

With sessions on contemporary dance, art education, design and more, the event tried to touch on art practice and practioners and platforms available to them. As a foundation it also establishes patronage for artists from India providing funding and a platform.

"We always give the funding. It comes from us. We do, for special projects, try and get patrons or sponsors or support in different ways, but it's hard. The only project but that was because it was international. That's the only time we have asked for money in 10 years and we gotten money in that time. So people like Radhika Chopra and Rajan Anandan from Google, they gave us a large amount instantly because they believed in what we were doing. People from the art world like Dinesh Wazirani, Vikram Gandhi from New York, Ratan Chaddha from the UK and Netherlands. A lot of Indians understood the value of showcasing India. The rest of the time, we don't have a strong programme but we are starting one now. We also feel that we have done enough now, so it's not just about getting funding but clever money," said she.

# Altering the market?

The Ssangyong Rexton is reborn as the Mahindra Alturas G4. We take it for a spin near Lonavala

badge? By a country mile but as Pawan Goenka, the Chairman of Mahindra's automotive group, quickly told this reviewer, "it is also the most expensive." To be fair, I was not aware of the price when I first drove the Alturas G4, the alpha-numeric suffix signifying that it is the fourth generation of the Ssangyong Rexton (actually this is just the secondgeneration of the Rexton but the fourth generation of cars developed by Ssangyong), the vehicle that the Altura's is called elsewhere. In fact, the only change on the Alturas is the front radiator grille and the Mahindra badge, which replaces

the Ssangyong badge.

But a quick rewind and reminder, Ssangyong Motor was bought by Mahindra & Mahindra in August 2010. As far as purchases go, it has not been the cash cow that Jaguar Land Rover was for Tata Motors. Ssangyong was a slight basket-case of a company when Mahindra bought it over; they had just come off a period of ownership by Chinese firm SAIC Motor and a major workers' strike. In addition, the Chinese were alleged to have illegally transferred hybrid technology to their own engineers. Now, the Chinese are past masters at this across the world, and there is no doubt that over the past few years that SAIC has become a lobal leader in battery-electric and hybrid technology. Anyhow, the South Korean Government, which had bailed the loss-making carmaker out, sold it to Mahindra. And a few years ago, as a result, India got the previous-generation Ssangyong Rexton.

Frankly, the Rexton was an excellent car but it was on the slightly expensive side being an import and went up against the first-generation Fortuner. Those who own the Rexton love the car, but it did not quite sell, partially because there was no separate Ssangyong network to service the car and Mahindra dealers found themselves a bit stretched when it came to the Rexton, as a few owners have narrated.

Now, surprisingly Mahindra did not bring the new Ssangyong Tivoli, the first new Ssangyong product since the takeover to India. The Tivoli is a Creta-sized car and has been doing relatively well on global markets. Maybe the Tivoli's price Rexton but badge it with a Mahindra tag, change the name and slot it above the XUV500 in the Mahindra line-up. The Alturas, while assembled by Mahindra, is coming as a kit from Ssangyong's factories in South Korea though.

And let us be honest, when someone is buying an off-road capable large SUV in this segment, you go up against the Toyota Fortuner, and particularly the white Fortuner that every budding baahubali is North India desperately wants. The Fortuner has managed to show off success without implying massive amounts of wealth. It might not have the best interiors, gimmicks or even off-road capabilities (the Ford Endeavour's 'Terrain Response System' is far superior) but the Fortuner has bullet-proof build quality and a residual value that drives other carmakers green with envy, even though the Fortuner is topped by the Innova when it comes to residual values.

So let us start on the car — The word 'Alturas' is Spanish for altitude or height. Unlike the previous generation Rexton, which was born from an earlier partnership with Mercedes-Benz and Ssangyong and thus had Mercedes underpinnings, this car has an all-new chassis and a new Ssangyong 2.2 litre engine which produces 178 horsepower. It still retains the Mercedes-Benz 7G-tronic seven-speed gearbox though. It is a large car and the visual cues from the front and back make it feel even larger. The Mahindra radiator grille and badge, the only change from the Rexton, do impart a bit of a family look to the Alturas. The lines above the wheel

rs the Mahindra Alturas G4 the best vehicle to ever wear the Mahindra arches make it look more muscular. If there is something odd from the exterior, it is the sharply raked rear quarter-glass. Now that sharp rake is there on many SUVs nowadays, but it does have a major price to pay.

The front of the Alturas is really where ou want to sit, the quilted leather (in tan) feels superb, the front seats are ventilated, a feature am glad a carmaker beyond Hyundai has taken up in an "affordable" segment. The infotainment screen takes a few seconds to fire up but is pretty good with all the standard fitments such as support for Android Auto and Apple CarPlay. A large digital display between the dials on the instrument cluster has a lot of gimmicks for someone driving to play through. The steering controls are intu-itive and the overall fit and finish, including that of the plastics of the car, feels far more premium than on any other vehicle that wears a Mahindra badge. To be honest, I did not try the air-conditioner iven the very pleasant weather.

Getting into the second row, however, is not that easy given the ride height of the car and any owner should seriously consider fitting the optional stepping board, even though that might not suit the lines of the car. That said, the second row has a grab handle to enter unlike the driver and front passenger.

The big problem I have with the Alturas is in the third row. Now third rows are not that comfortable and really not a place that I would want to spend any part of my life. But in a pinch it works, even on this car. But that sharply raked windowline I talked about, well that gives a very thick pillar at the back and this makes the Alturas' third row feel dark. I was out on a sunny morning and that third row, already cramped by virtue of being a third row, felt downright depressing. And I am very sure I am not the only one feeling this way. How is the Alturas to drive? Well, on

ower it is between the Fortuner and Endeavour and the 2.2 diesel is torquey enough that even 178 horsepower feels enough. The car does accelerate very well up to speed and importantly feels planted at highway cruising speeds. However, I will not call the steering precise but that is something par for the course for large SUVs. The car will have would have been far too similar to that of a four-wheel drive option with the abilthe XUV500. What was not surprising is ity to change from two-wheel high ratio fly. The Alturas is more than capable enough as a two-wheel drive car and while I had the option, I never used fourwheel drive. What I did like about the Alturas

was its ride comfort, and driving on some rough unpaved roads, it did not clatter and clang as one might expect and even managed to keep up a decent rate of knots. The gearbox is extremely smooth and gear changes are made without a judder, even the kickdown when needed feels alright. However, if there is a teeny-weeny issue I had, it was with the manual gear-shifting option, which is just a little clicker on the gear-lever, not an 'H-gate' like many cars and there is no paddle-shift option either.

As a vehicle though, the Alturas is a compelling proposition. It is comfortable and luxurious and previous-generation Rexton owners will be pleased. The problem is that there were far too few pre vious generation Rexton owners and if Mahindra is to make the Alturas a success, it will not just be the price. The fourwheel drive Alturas should have an exshowroom price under 30 lakhs undercutting the competition while offering a better feature set. No, the big problem will be reliability (the Fortuner, as mentioned above is brilliant) as well as service but most importantly retailing the car. Selling a 30-lakh vehicle to a 'sophisticated audience' in the same showroom as a Bolero might be a challenge. Some of these questions will be answered at the formal launch of the Alturas in Jaipur on Saturday. As for the car, well, I really liked it.



∟our Indian authors and two from Pakistan are in the Contention for the coveted US \$25,000 prize for South Asian Literature, 2018. The shortlist of six novels was announced last week by Rudrangshu Mukherjee, Chair of the DSC Prize 2018 jury panel in London at a special event at the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Now in its eighth year, the DSC Prize for South Asian Literature is one of the most prestigious international literary awards specifically focussed on South Asian fiction writing. The moves by retailers came one day after several screenshots were circulated online showing co-founder Stefano Gabbana referring to China with crude terms and emojis as he defended promotional videos that had

sparked controversy earlier. The comments were made in a private message exchange with another Instagram user. Separately, the Dolce&Gabbana account used offensive language in another exchange.

The Italian luxury fashion house apologised and said both accounts had been hacked. "We have nothing but respect for China and the people of China,"

The apology was too late to save a major extravaganza in Shanghai that Dolce&Gabbana had billed as one of its biggest shows ever outside of Italy.

Major Chinese celebrities threatened to boycott the event, which had been scheduled for Wednesday night, and the company finally called it off. Actress

Zhang Ziyi, who starred in Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon, said that the Italian brand had "disgraced itself." An analyst said the bad

publicity will have a lasting effect. "It's the kiss of death for Dolce&Gabbana," said Shaun Rein, founder and managing director of China Market Research Group in Shanghai. "I expect them to have a real tough time over the next six to 12 months?

Rein said it's a big mistake when Westerners come up with creative content but don't understand how the campaigns will be received by Chinese consumers. He noted a trend of rising nationalism in China. "So if you, as a Western brand, do anything that looks like you are mocking or making fun of Chinese culture, that's a big no-no," he said.

The ruling Communist Party's People's Daily newspaper wrote on Weibo: "China has always been friendly to foreign businesses. But it doesn't mean there's no bottom line. There is a deal only when there is

# The tail-spin tale of Thanksgiving

MICHAEL CAROLAN finds out why the US shies away from eating an entire turkey body

Intensive livestock farming is a huge global industry that serves up millions of tons of beef, pork and poultry every year. When I asked one producer recently to name something his industry thinks about that consumers don't be replied. that consumers don't, he replied, "Beaks and butts." This was his shorthand for animal parts that consumers — especially in wealthy nations — don't choose

On Thanksgiving, turkeys will adorn close to 90 per cent of US dinner tables. But one part of the bird never makes it to the groaning board, or even to the giblet bag: the tail. The fate of this fatty chunk of meat shows us the bizarre inner workings of our global food system, where eating more of one food produces less-desirable cuts and parts. This then creates demand elsewhere — so successfully in some instances that the foreign part becomes, over time, a national delicacy.

#### **SPARE PARTS**

Industrial-scale livestock production evolved after Word War II, supported by scientific advances such as antibiotics, growth hormones and, in the case of the turkey, artificial insemination. (The bigger the tom, the harder it is for him to do what he's supposed to do: procreate.)

US commercial turkey production increased from 16 million pounds in January 1960 to 500 million pounds in January 2017. Total production this year is projected at 245 million birds.

That includes a quarterbillion turkey tails, also known as the parson's nose, pope's nose or sultan's nose. The tail is actually a gland that attaches the turkey's feathers to its body. It is filled with oil that the bird uses to preen itself, so about 75 per cent of its calories come from fat.

It's not clear why turkeys arrive at US stores tailless. Industry insiders have suggested to me that it may simply have been an economic decision. Turkey consumption was a novelty for most consumers before World War II, so few developed a taste for the tail, although the curious can find recipes online. Turkeys have become larger, averaging around 30 pounds today compared to 13 pounds in the 1930s. We've also been breeding for breast size, due to the American love affair with breasted variety was called Bronze Mae West. Yet the tail

### **SAVORED IN SAMOA**

Rather than letting turkey tails go to waste, the poultry industry saw a business opportunity. The target: Pacific Island communities, where animal protein was scarce. In the 1950s . US poultry firms began dumping turkey tails, along with chicken backs, into markets in Samoa. (Not to be outdone, New Zealand and Australia exported "mutton flaps," also known as sheep bellies, to the Pacific Islands.) With this strategy, the turkey industry turned waste into gold.

By 2007 the average Samoan was consuming more than 44 pounds of turkey tails every year a food that had been unknown there less than a century earlier. That's nearly triple Americans' annual per capita turkey consumption. When I interviewed

Samoans recently for my book No One Eats Alone: Food as a Social Enterprise, it was immediately clear that some considered this once-foreign food part of their island's national cuisine. When I asked them to list popular "Samoan foods," multiple people mentioned turkey tails—frequently washed down with a cold Budweiser.

How did imported turkey tails become a favorite among Samoa's working class? Here lies a lesson for health educators: The tastes of iconic foods cannot be separated from the environments in which they are

Food companies have known this for generations. It's why Coca-Cola has been ubiquitous in baseball parks for more than a century, and why many McDonald's have attachment to turkey and other classics at Thanksgiving. The holidays can be stressful, but they also are a lot of fun.

As Julia, a 20-something Samoan, explained to me, "You have to understand that we eat turkey tails at home with family. It's a social food, not something you'll eat when you're

Turkey tails also come up in discussions of the health epidemic gripping these islands. American Samoa has an obesity rate of 75 per cent. Samoan officials grew so concerned that they banned turkey tail imports

But asking Samoans to abandon this cherished food

overlooked its deep social attachments. Moreover, under World Trade Organization rules, countries and territories generally cannot unilaterally ban the import of commodities unless there are proven public health reasons for doing so. Samoa was forced to lift its ban in 2013 as

If Americans were more interested in eating turkey tails, some of our supply might stay at home. Can we bring back so called nose-to-tail animal consumption? This trend has gaining some ground in the United States, but mainly in a narrow foodie niche.

Beyond Americans' general squeamishness toward offal and tails, we have a knowledge problem. Who even knows how to carve a turkey anymore? Challenging diners to select, prepare and eat whole animals is a pretty big ask.

Google's digitisation of old

cookbooks shows us that it wasn't always so. The American Home Cook Book, published in 1864, instructs readers when choosing lamb to "observe the neck vein in the fore quarter, which should be of an azureblue to denote quality and sweetness." Or when selecting venison, "pass a knife along the bones of the haunches of the shoulders; if it smell [sic] sweet, the meat is new and good; if tainted, the fleshy parts of the side will look discolored, and the darker in proportion to its stal-eness." Clearly, our ancestors knew food very differently than we do today.

It is not that we don't know how to judge quality anymore. But the yardstick we use is callearned — against a different standard. The modern industrial food system has trained consumers to prioritise quantity and convenience, and to judge freshness based on sell-by-date stickers. Food that is processed and sold in convenient portions takes a lot of the thinking process out of eating.

If this picture is bothersome, think about taking steps to recalibrate that yardstick. Maybe add a few heirloom ingredients to beloved holiday dishes and talk about what makes them special, perhaps while showing the kids how to judge a fruit or vegetable's ripeness. Or even roast some turkey tails.

### Mary steps closer to making history

### Five-time champion goes past her Korean opponent to enter Gold medal match

ne of the most decorated boxer in amateur boxing arena, India's superwoman M C Mary Kom inched a step closer to her record sixth Gold medal at Boxing World's by reaching the 48kg final but her young fellow Lovlina Borgohain had to settle for a Bronze after losing her semifinal bout in 69kg in the Women's World

Boxing Championship on Thursday. The 35-year-old Mary Kom, who already has five Gold medals in her kitty, thrashed her North Korean opponent Mi Hyang Kim in a unanimous 5-0 decision in the last four clash.

And now in the summit clash on Saturday, She will take on Ukraine's Hanna Okhota challenge, whom the Indian had beaten earlier this year in Polish tourney.
"I have beaten this North

Korean opponent in the Asian Championships last year and that time it was a one-sided bout. She could not touch me in that bout. But win or lose, every boxer always learns and I think she has learnt (from that bout).

"At the same time I also have learnt and I came prepared to defend and counter. I am happy that I am in the final," Mary Kom said after the semifinal bout

The semifinal bout began on a cautious note with both pugilists trying to understand each other's game in the first round which had very few clean punches. In the second round, both showed their



aggressive intent and the North nent. Korean threw a flurry of quick punches

The Indian, who won her first World Championships medal — a Silver — in the inaugural edition, drew from her vast reservoir of experience as she ducked the punches and then, with quick feet movement, launched her own attack to land crucial punches on her oppo"My opponent was taller than

me and strong also. Taller boxers can have the advantage because of their reach, they can get inside immediately and come back again. But once inside the ring, I don't care whether my opponent is tall or not, I play my game," she added.

Mary Kom had earlier beaten Okhota, who she will meet in the

final, in the Silesian International Boxing Championships in Poland earlier this year.

"I have beaten her in Poland. I will read that bout and plan my strategy. I hope to beat her again," Mary Kom said.

Índia, however, suffered a jolt as the second semifinalist of the day, Lovlina lost 4-0 to Chen Nien-Chin of Taipei, who had won a Bronze in

the 2016 World Championships in

75kg.

The two pugilists went for attack in the first round itself and punches landed on both but neither managed to completely dominate.

In the second round, the Taipei boxer let Lovlina do the attacking and waited for opportune time to hit on the counter.

Unfortunately, Lovlina received a warning from the referee in the third round for hitting at the back of the head of the opponent and one point was cut from all the five

The one-point reduction, however, did not make much of a difference as Chen eventually won 29-27, 29-27, 28-28, 29-27, 30-26. Lovlina did not win any single

"Accoridng to me, the bout was all right but not that good as I would have expected. But I gave my 100 per cent. A point was cut from me in the final round, but there was a lot of closing, pulling and pushing from both of us. I lost because of the point reduction (due to warning), she said after her bout.

"I am feeling bad. After I could not win a medal in the Commonwealth Games, my aim was to win a Gold in the World Championships. But I have to settle for a Bronze. I wanted a Gold so it is disappointing," Lovlina said.

On Friday, two more Indians are in the fray in the semifinals. Sonia Chahal will take on Hwa Son Jo in 57kg while Simranjit Kaur will square off against Dan Dou in 64 kg.

Kerala on Thursday blew away home favourites Bengal by nine wickets and with a day to spare for their second successive win in the Ranji Trophy, consolidating the position atop the Elite Group B standings.

Sandeep Warrier complemented opener Jalaj Saxena's first innings 143 with an impressive 5/33 in the second essay, and the Kerala pacer rattled the top four Bengal batsmen, including a well-set skipper Manoj Tiwary (62), to set up the win.

Warrier was at his best during his second spell (7-2-10-2) in the post-lunch session, when he broke a 69-run third wicket stand between Tiwary and Sudeep Chatterjee (39).

He extracted reverse swing and cleaned up Tiwary with an incoming delivery before dismissing Chatterjee (39) in his next over. From thereon, it was just a matter of time as the last eight wickets managed to add just 69 runs to be bundled out for 184 in 56.5 overs.

Kerala knocked off the 41run target in 11 overs to hand Bengal their first loss at the Eden Gardens since December 2014, when they succumbed to Karnataka by an identical margin.

Kerala had a golden chance to complete the win by 10 wickets, which would have given the visitors a bonus point, but Bengal denied that with pacer Mukesh Kumar cleaning up first innings hero and Man of the Match Saxena for 26.

Kerala settled for six points to lead the table with 13, while Bengal remained on six points.

With this defeat, Bengal's hope for a qualifying suffered a big blow as tougher challenges lie ahead with three back-toback away matches beginning with Tamil Nadu from

November 28 to December 1. They have two home matches left against Delhi and national duty.


