Amarnath Yatra cut short | Mediation fails, SC Ayodhya daily

After Pak-based ultras attempt to target yatris foiled, Govt asks pilgrims to return immediately

The security forces have uncovered a "sinister" plot hatched by the Pakistan Army to target Amarnath pilgrims in the last leg of the 45-day-long pilgrimage. Following this, the Government on Friday issued an advisory asking the tourists and pilgrims to curtail their pilgrimage to the Amarnath cave shrine and leave the State "as soon as possible".

A top officer of the Indian Army based in Srinagar, along with the Director General of State police, on Friday claimed that an attempt to target the pilgrims has been foiled by the alert troops, who recovered a mine bearing mark of a Pakistan ordnance factory from one of the two yatra routes leading to the cave shrine.

"The recovery indicates that Pakistan Army is involved in terrorism in Kashmir. This will not be tolerated," Lt General KJS Dhillon, Commander of the Chinar Corps, said. Displaying pictures of the mine bearing Pakistan's ordnance factory's stamp, Dhillon said, "It laid to rest any doubts about Islamabad's direct role in attempts to destabilise J&K". Meanwhile, the Jammu &

Kashmir Government on Friday issued an advisory directing tourists and pilgrims to curtail their pilgrimage to the Amarnath cave shrine and to leave the State immediately. "Keeping in view the latest Army's General Officer Commanding for the Srinagar-based 15 Corps Lt. Gen. KJS

intelligence inputs of terror threats, with specific targeting of the Amarnath Yatra, and given the prevailing security situation in the Kashmir Valley, in the interest of the safety and security of the tourists and Amarnath Yatris, it is advised that they may curtail their stay in the Valley immediately and take necessary measures to return as soon as possible," the order issued by the State Home Department said.

Last week, Union Home Ministry had rushed 10,000 troops to Kashmir Valley to effectively handle security related and law and order duties. Speculations were rife over the arrival of 25,000 more troops in Kashmir Valley as part of the ongoing exercise.

During a three-day intensive search operation conducted to sanitise the Amarnath Yatra route, security forces had also recovered a cache of arms. including an American sniper rifle M-24. Security forces acted on the basis of specific intelligence inputs that Pakistanbased terrorists might target the Yatra using IEDs and attack pilgrims, he added.

Dhillon said the threat of improvised explosive devices (IEDs) in Jammu and Kashmir is more "pronounced" in the hinterland even as the situation along the Line of Control (LoC) remains "largely peaceful".

Dhillon said the security forces had considerable success against the terrorist groups operating in J&K recently and most of the top leadership of Jaish-e-Mohammaed, Lashkare-Taiba, Hizbul Mujahideen had been eliminated in the operations in last three months.

The 15 Corps commander

said IED threats had increased in the last year with several attempts made to blow up security forces vehicles or installations. "There was a failed IED attempt in Banihal in June and on Âugust 2, one of the Army vehicles was targeted." said Dhillon, adding that one IED expert Munna Lahori was killed by security forces last week.

Capt asks Pathankot district admin to ensure safe return of pilgrims from Kashmir

 P^{unjab} Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh on Friday directed the Pathankot district administration to make all arrangements to ensure the safe return of Amarnath Yatris from the bor-Government's advisory to cut short their stay in the Valley.

The border areas have been put on high alert in view of the intelligence inputs of terror threats in Kashmir. Capt Amarinder asked the various departments in the State,

particularly in Pathankot, to facilitate the smooth movement of the Yatris and tourists shifting

out the Kashmir valley following the advisory, issued amid the terror intelligence reports. An official spokesperson

said Amarinder had directed the DC to coordinate the operations for the safety of the Yatris once they cross the border into Punjab. He has also asked all concerned departments to cooperate with the district administration in this regard.

Punjab Police has also been asked to stay on high alert to check any infiltration of terrorists from Kashmir into the state. The DGP has been asked to coordinate with his counterpart in J&K to ensure that the bordering areas are not under any threat in view of the latest intelligence reports on terror.

Capt Amarinder has asked for security to be beefed up at all vital installations in the state in view of the terror threat in the neighbouring state. All communications and movement between the two states should be strictly monitored round the clock, he has further ordered

OPDS SUSPENDED IN PGIMER

Chandigarh: In view of the indefinite protest by the Association of Resident Doctors against the NMC bill, all routine services in PGIMER including OPDs and elective procedures will remain suspended till further notice. However, Emergency and ICU services will continue to work. The PGIMER administration has appealed to all the faculty members to be on duty. The faculty, nurses and technologists will render patient care in all the emergency areas and wards. Elective services will be suspended but emergency and intensive care areas including emergency operation theatres will not be affected.

PUNJAB RELEASES ₹71 CR FOR ASHIRWAD SCHEME

Chandigarh: Puniab Finance Department, on the directives of the Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh, on Friday released funds to the tune of Rs 70.72 crores on account of outstanding payment under the Ashirwad Scheme. Spokesperson said that this would cover 33,677 beneficiaries whose dues are pending under Ashirwad Scheme from January 2019 to May 2019. UT NOTIFIES VICTIM ASSISTANCE SCHEME

onvened after almost six Cmonths, the first day of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha's monsoon session lasted for just about 14 minutes. The Day 1 of the session saw tributes being paid to the three-year-old borewell vic-tim Fatehveer Singh, along with Delhi's former Chief Minister Sheila Dixit, and others

The brevity of the first sitting of the monsoon session, however triggered an out-of-anordinary reaction by Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA Aman Arora who refused to accept the travel and dearness allowance (TA/DA) for the day citing "no work-no allowance".

At the same time, the demand to extend the session failed to find any favour during the meeting of Business Advisory Committee (BAC), which has the representatives of all political parties.

Apart from the Speaker Rana Kanwar Pal Singh, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Brahm Mohindra, SAD MLA Parminder Singh Dhindsa, the Leader of Opposition and AAP MLA Harpal Singh Cheema attended the meeting.

The opposition leaders demanded extension in the monsoon session to discuss number of burning issues concerning the State and its people, but the Speaker refused to accept the same. The session, which started on Friday, will now meet on Monday after two holidays — Saturday and Sunday.

As just the obituary references were made on the first day, the House will now have just two operative days - Monday and

Singh Dod. Freedom Fighters — Gurmej Singh, Kulwant Singh, Isher Singh, Ujagar Singh, Jangir Singh, Santa Singh and SGPC member Jathedar Lakhvir Singh were also remembered by the

Speaker Rana KP Singh proposed that tributes be paid to all those members who had passed away since the previous session. After the obituary references to the eminent personalities, he passed a resolution for conveying the condolences of the House to their respective families. A two-minute silence was observed as a mark of respect to the departed souls.

ARORA SURRENDERS TA/DA, PERKS FOR MON-SOON SESSION'S FIRST

Setting an example for other lawmakers, AAP MLA Aman Arora on Friday surrendered his TA/DA and other perks for the first day of the monsoon session when "no actual work had taken

Arora, in a letter he personally submitted to the Speaker

Rana KP Singh immediately after the Session, contended that his "conscious does not allow him to take TA/DA and other perks for the day when Session was adjourned within 14 minutes after paying obituaries to the departed souls, and no issue concerning the State or its public was discussed".

Backed by data since 1948, Arora reminded the Speaker of the rich precedence of the Punjab Assembly between 1948 to 1979, where conduct of usual business used to be a norm on the days of obituaries, which were gradually given up by successive regimes. He urged the Speaker to bring back those rich traditions and precedences back

to the iconic Punjab Assembly. Arora pointed that the Chief Minister had recently, while justifying shorter Assembly Sessions, stated that it cost the state exchequer a whopping Rs 70 lakhs a day to conduct the assembly proceedings.

CONG RAISES ILLEGAL MINING. MINISTER

REFUTES

Congress raised the issue of alleged illegal mining in a Haryana district, a charge denied by the ruling BJP that said no such activity was found in the area. During the Question Hour, Congress legislative party leader Kiran Choudhry sought to know from Mines and Geology Minister O P Dhankar what action the government had initiated regarding the issue. Choudhry asked whether illegal and unregulated sand mining or stone crushing was being operated in Charkhi Dadri district regularly with the "connivance" of the district officers/officials.

The Tosham MLA sought details about the action taken by the government on the report submitted by a panel set up by the National Green Tribunal -which consisted of representatives from the Ministry of Environment and Forests and Climate Change, the Central Pollution Control Board and the Haryana State Pollution Control Board.

Replying to the question, Dhankar informed the House that NGT panel inspected the mines and stone crushers at Jhojhu Kalan village and nearby areas on March 19, and found no case of illegal mining in the area. "There was no illegal crusher operating in the area also," he

Out of the 36 stone crushers inspected by the committee, 31

had valid consent to operate and five crushers had consent to establish permissions, the minister said. "However, the committee observed lack of effective air pollution control measures in 31 of the stone crushers," he said. On the basis of this observation, 19 stone crushers in the village and also in Ramalwas, have been sealed, Dhankar said in his

Choudhry remained dissatisfied and alleged that the ruling Bharativa Ianata Party was showing a lackadaisical approach. This is a serious issue of which NGT has taken cognizance of. The government must inform the House what action has been initiated," she said.

SURVEY FOR RRTS CORRIDOR IN PROGRESS,

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal said that the survey for the Sarai Kalen Khan (Delhi)-Panipat Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS), a semihigh speed rail corridor, is in progress. 

As of now, the trust which manages the memorial, has the Prime Minister as the chairperson, President of Indian National Congress, Culture Minister, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Punjab Governor, Punjab CM as its members.

The memorial was established in 1951 by the Central Government to mark the massacre of unarmed people on April 13, 1919 by the British Indian Army under the command of Col Reginald Dyer.





The Government placed a list in the State Assembly on Thursday which contained district-wise figures of people left out of the hugely contentious NRC, which is being updated under the supervision of the Supreme Court. The development came

despite an apex court directive to the state coordinator of NRC to submit before it the details in a sealed cover as the matter was "a human problem with great magnitude".

PTI had erroneously reported on Thursday that the percentage of people excluded from the draft NRC was higher in disricts along the Indo-Bangladesh border.

Assam Accord Implementation and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Chandra Mohan Patowary laid the district-wise list of inclusion, rejection and non-inclusion of applicants' names in the NRC.

The list showed the total number of applicants was



3.29,91,385 out of which 40,07,717 names, which is 12.15 per cent, were not included.

According to the list, the percentage of non-inclusion of names in districts bordering Bangladesh like South Salmara was 7.22, Dhubri 8.26 and Karimganj 7.67.

Non-border districts Hojai and Darrang have the highest non-inclusion rate at 32.99 per cent and 30.90 per cent respectively. "It is a matter of concern

that the percentage of names excluded from the draft NRC is lower in the Bangladesh border districts compared to the rest of the state," Patowary said.

The NRC coordinator came under fire from ruling BJP members who expressed doubt whether a correct NRC will ever be published.

They claimed that the rate of exclusion of NRC applicants in the districts bordering Bangladesh was less than the state average — 12.15 per cent. This is a proof that a section

of people residing in border districts of Assam has wrongly been included in the NRC, they said, slamming the coordinator. They alleged there was gross

misuse of the legacy data in various districts, particularly in those bordering Bangladesh.

"Due to this misuse, comparatively fewer people were left out of the draft NRC in those districts", the minister said. BJP MLAs Debanana Hazarika, Shiladitya Deb and Numal Momin and AIUDF member Nurul Amin raised the issue

NIA seeks in-camera trial to protect 'communal harmony'

Mumbai: The NIA has moved a special court seeking in-camera trial of the 2008 Malegaon blast case claiming that "unwarranted publicity" to the proceedings can damage "communal harmony".

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) filed an application before special court judge, S Padalkar here on Thursday.

In the plea, the agency has submitted that the allegations against the accused are that they committed the offence to take revenge against "Muslim Jihadi activities" and "to create a rift between two communities".

According to the NIA, Malegaon was chosen for the bomb blast as it is a Muslim-dominated area. "It is necessary to conduct the trial of this case in-camera under the provision of the NIA Act and the UAPA [Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act],



Over 90K engineering seats vacant in TN

engineering studies in the State should think many times over about their decision if the 2019 admission to engineering colleges are any indication. Though there are 1,67,652

seats in Tamil Nadu's engineering colleges (Government colleges, Government aided colleges and private engineering colleges put together), there were only 83,396 takers for the total seats leaving nearly 90,000 seats (89,544 to be exactly) go abegging.

This is a major setback for the State which claims itself as the educational hub of the country. Fate of many engineering colleges hang in the balance as 34 out of the 479 self-financing engineering colleges which took part in the counselling for the Tamil Nadu Engineering Admission 2019 failed to get even one student. Only 22 per cent of the seats in the self financing colleges have been filled up leaving the managements in the lurch.

But elite institutions like College of Engineering, Guindy, Indian Institute if Handloom Technology, Salem, had their seats filled within days of the counselling session that has send mixed signals



State's engineering colleges. "The self financing engi-

neering colleges have failed to change ahead with the times. In addition to this, there has been a stagnation in the demand for engineering graduates over the years. Both parents and students have failed to take note of the situation," said M Ananthakrishnan, former chairman, IIT Kanpur and former Vice Chancellor, Anna University. Though he did not tell it openly, Prof Ananthakrishnan, a widely respected educationist expressed his unhappiness over the quality of education imparted in these colleges. Prof S P Thyagarajan, for-

annual performance of these colleges have led to the deterioration of their standards. 'Equally important is the fact that there has been a dynamic change in skill set required by the industry from engineering graduates. The industries have changed to modern methods of production while the most of the colleges gave failed in updating the curriculum to suit the changed environment," said Prof Thyagarajan.

He also pointed out that students from Tamil Nadu keep abreast of the quality and standard of the engineering colleges where they seek to get seats. "The new age industries in the country prefer science and commerce graduates, offer them training in the kind of skill expected from them and appoint them at lower salary scales for the work previously done by the engineering graduates at higher wages," said Prof Thyagarajan.

Most of these self financing colleges release glossy advertisement campaigns in the newspapers and TV channels in the State which would ensure that no negative reports about their institutions make it to the public domain. Case registered under triple talaq Act in Mumbai

Within hours after the new Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) legislation was enacted on Thursday, the police late in the night registered the triple talaq case against a Muslim husband and two of his family members at the minority community-dominated mini township of Mumbra in the adjoining Thane district of Maharashtra.

Acting on a complaint lodged by victim woman Jannat Begum Patel (31), the Mumbra police booked her husband İmtiyaz Ghulam Patel (35), mother-in-law Heena Ghulam Hussain Patel and sister-in-law Sultana Ghulam Hussain Patel under section 498 A (husband or relative of a woman subjecting her to cruelty) and 406 (criminal breach of trust) read with section 34 (common intent) of Indian Penal Code and section 4 of the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Act, 2019.

Ex-Goa CM seeks to know if 'feni' & 'hurrack' cause cancer

Former Goa Chief Minister Pratapsingh Rane sought to know in the state Assembly on Friday whether consumption of local alcoholic beverages 'feni' and 'hurrack' causes cancer. Speaking during the

Question Hour on the issue of cancer cases in the state, Rane said the state government should conduct a survey to know if these drinks cause cancer. "Do you have a study on the kind of cancers that are faced by people in Goa? Have you conducted a study on it," he asked Health minister Vishwajit Rane. "It is a well-known fact that smoking causes cancer. But we also have to know whether drinking local alcoholic brew like 'feni' and 'hurrack' can cause cancer?... A survey should be conducted and its findings be placed in the House," he said.

In his reply, the health minister said the government has the statistics about the types of cancer.

"Maximum cases in the state are that of breast cancer,

followed by head and neck and other types," Vishwajit Rane said. He was speaking on the question asked by Congress MLA Aleixo Reginaldo Lourenco over the number of cancer cases in Goa.

Rane said lifestyle is one of the reasons behind the increasing number of cancer cases in

He said the government was serious about the cancer cases in the state and facilities are being created for treatment of cancer patients in the overnment-run Goa Medical College and Hospital (GMCH). According to him, although cancer is on the rise,



PAPER WITH PASSION = **Power shots**

With an eye on Assembly polls, the AAP govt offers free electricity but will it be enough to get Kejriwal another term?



hey may look jaded slogans but when it comes to governance in Delhi, it is the classic bijli, sadak and paani (power, roads and water) issues which have worked in local elections. Particularly, the city's power supply has been the most crucial swing factor for the continuity of regimes. Power reforms were the reason the Congress, then led by Sheila Dikshit, got mass acceptability between 1998 and 2013. Her focus was on improving the quality of power supply through privatisation of the electricity distribution sector. And

when that frayed at the edges, the mess was a fertile ground for the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) to emerge as a champion of people's right to a good life. The party questioned the privatisation model, alleging financial irregularities by distribution companies (discoms) and suggesting a collusion between the Congress government and the discoms to keep tariffs artificially high at public expense. In fact, power reforms have found mention as a key plank and a promise of an affordable living index in all its manifestos. Not only that, AAP has consistently detailed its rationale for the tariff, revenue and distribution to justify its claims and ensured execution to gain popular vote. Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal intends keeping it that way and as he seeks another mandate; he has not changed Delhi's power tariff, calling it among the lowest in the country, and even announced free electricity for those who consume less than 200 units a month and a 50 per cent subsidy for those who consume till 400 units. The Delhi Electricity Regulatory Commission (DERC) also reduced fixed charges for most domestic connections by up to 84 per cent. The subsidy has, of course, been criticised many times about its broad-based nature that allows many of the privileged to claim benefits but that was revised last year to benefit the low consumption end. And Keiriwal has sweetened his latest announcement saying he has equalised free power for the poor with that of the city's political elite. Some observers also point out that in the absence of a tariff hike, how is it possible to manage discoms with subsidy payments that will cost about ₹1,700 to 2,000 crore additional expense. Despite these naysayers Kejriwal has admittedly scored on power infrastructure, improving the revenues and funds for power companies, eliminating red tape and ensuring almost zero power cuts. But this toggling between populism, vision and institutional viability can prove costly if exuberant enthusiasm is not curbed by rational discretion.

The AAP regime has consistently built social capital that has strengthened its electoral traction. Its improvement of the public school infrastructure, teaching standards and student performance has revolutionised the way we look at Delhi's government schools. The "Happiness Curriculum" and the construction of new classrooms in government schools have received accolades globally. The doorstep delivery of services, the primary healthcare centres offering free consultations, the *mohalla* clinics, some regularisation of unauthorised colonies have all worked for the "common man's" agenda. This despite AAP's consistent runin with the Centre on allocation of full statehood powers and constant delays on infrastructure projects pending clearance. But AAP is desperate for consolidation of its votebase, which has slipped to a dismal 18 per cent in the May Lok Sabha polls from about 33 per cent previously. It has even slid to third position in five Lok Sabha seats behind the Congress this time. The BJP's vote percentage is at 56 per cent and following victories in the municipal corporation, it is hoping for a short-term cascading impact on the Delhi Assembly polls. But worryingly for AAP, the BJP, in its bid to end a power drought in Delhi, is intensively promoting a Mission 2020 campaign to ensure that the underprivileged pockets, slum clusters and the Muslim community are provided with the benefits of the Modi government schemes. It is this aggression in AAP territory that needs a far stronger counter-script from Kejriwal than just power reforms.

Pipe dreams

The Hyperloop promises to revolutionise travel but questions remain about its economic viability



he world is littered with expensive transportation infrastructure projects that are barely used and even abandoned after a few years. There is the famous example of a brand new airport near Madrid, Spain, which was abandoned after a few months. In 2002, China inaugurated a magnetic levitation train between the Pudong airport and the outskirts of Shanghai, the harbinger of a massive network of space age connectivity. While that train remains the world's fastest commercially operating train, with speeds touching 500 km per

hour, it is nothing more than a tourist attraction today. The 30 km rack cost an eye-watering \$1.2 billion in the early-2000s and it should serve as a cautionary tale for those who want to make India a hub for the new 'Hyperloop' technology. In essence, Hyperloop is 'Maglev Plus.' Magnetic levitation lifts a 'shuttle' which travels through an enclosed pipe. It operates ideally, in a vacuum, but realistically with very low air pressure, allowing the shuttles to move without any air resistance at up to 1,000 km per hour. Such a system would make immense sense then as a transportation system between urban agglomerations located close to each other. Such as Mumbai and Pune, and it is no surprise that those who back the technology feel that this will make for a great test track. Sure, reducing the three-four hour travel time by road between Maharashtra's industrial hubs will be welcome but there are several caveats. First, there is little certainty on who will fund this extremely extravagant programme. While the Maharashtra government has given it 'infrastructure' status, the State government and the Centre are not investing any money. The estimated project's price is a truly sky-rocketing \$10 billion, and that is before the inevitable cost escalations, since the technology itself is currently in its testing phase.

Would the money be better spent on developing a regular high-speed train track between the two cities that tunnels through the Western Ghats instead? Or should money be poured into a unproven technology with immense potential but possibly still years, possibly decades away from commercial application? Will the Hyperloop in India end up like the Maglev track outside Shanghai, a tourist attraction that showcases the future that might have been? It is one thing to look at the future, but practicality should also come into consideration. Massive, futuristic infrastructure projects and technologies get politicians goggly-eyed but running headlong into something without thinking it through is plain silly. Has anyone asked the question on who will use the 'Hyperloop' between the two cities? If the project costs a bomb, then only the very rich or tourists can use it. After all, in Shanghai, locals prefer taking the regular, slow subway train instead of the Maglev. We do not have the luxury of building infrastructure to make a point, we have to build infrastructure to be used by a billion people.

Big cat's leap of faith

An increase in its population is gratifying but the tiger still faces problems, including the frequent man-animal conflicts. A national-level strategy is needed to manage this interface



im Corbett wrote in the Man-Eaters of Kumaon, the "tiger is a large-hearted gentleman with boundless courage and that when he is exterminated as exterminated he will be unless pubppinion rallies to his support — India will be the poorer, having lost the finest of her fauna." Had the legendary hunterturned conservationist and writer been alive, he would have noted with relief the contents of the latest estimation report on the number of tigers, titled the Status of Tigers, Co-Predators, Prey and their Habitat, 2018, released by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on July 29, annually observed as Global Tiger Day. The report puts the number at 2,967, which marks an increase of 33 per cent over the figure of 2.226 in the estimated tiger count in 2014 and a phenomenal 210 per cent over the 2006 figure of 1,411.

The increase is gratifying because it comes as a part of a continuing upward trend since 2006. Besides it represents one of the few instances in which the Union or a State Government's efforts have succeeded. It all started in 1970 when the Union Government banned the hunting of tigers throughout the country. Two other important developments followed in 1972 The country's first tiger census put the number of the striped lords of the jungles at 1,827. More important, Parliament passed the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, for protecting animals, birds, reptiles and plants. It prohibited the capturing, killing, poisoning or trapping of wild animals, the injuring, destroying and removing any part of a wild animal's body, also forbade disturbing or damaging of the eggs of wild birds and reptiles. It further prohibited the picking, uprooting, destruction, acquisition and collection of specified plants and trade in these. The Act also provided for the creation of sanctuaries and national parks where wildlife would be safe and for restriction of entry into these. More, it provided punishment for each category of crime.

The Act was an important step as the Wild Birds and Animals Protection Act of 1912 (eight of 12) and the various State laws prevailing until then offered little protection. It was, however, aimed at wildlife in general and not specifically tigers. For the latter, Project Tiger was launched on April 1, 1973, with two objectives — identification of the causes of shrinking tiger habitats, adoption of remedial measures and repair, to the extent possible, of the dam-

tenance of a viable tiger population. The project's distinguishing feature has been the creation of sanctuaries, called Tiger Reserves, to protect tigers from poaching and other threats. Against nine spread over 9,115 square kilometres at the beginning, there are now 50 of these encompassing an area of 74,749 square

kilometres. No human activity is allowed in their core areas, while limited access is granted to the buffer zones around these. Strong action is being taken against poaching with rangers and forest guards being provided wireless communication systems, improved weaponry and facilities for rapid movement.

Funded by the Union Government, administered by the Union Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MOEFCC), and functioning under the direct supervision of the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), set up under the provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Amendment Act, 2006, Project Tiger has made the most important contribution to increasing the number of tigers. One, however, has also to take nificantly, particularly since poaching to meet the demand abroad for tiger body parts for their allegedly medical and aphrodisiacal value, has been a contributory factor in the decline in numbers. In this context, one needs to recognise

the critical role played by the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (WCCB) set up in 2006 under the same amendment act that established the NTCA. A statutory multi-discipli-

nary body under the MOEFC, to combat organised wildlife crime in the country, it collects and collates intelligence pertaining to organised wildlife crime and disseminates the same among State and other enforcement agencies for immediate action. Its functions also include the establishment of a centralised wildlife crime data bank, co-ordination of actions by various agencies in enforcing the Act's provisions and assistance to foreign authorities and international organisations to facilitate global action against wildlife crime. Among other things, it also helps to improve the capacity of agencies combating wildlife into account the efforts made crime to conduct scientific and to protect wildlife from crimes professional investigations and successfully conduct prosecution for the same

A proud feather in its cap has been the United Nation Environment Progamme's conferring on it in November last year of an Asia Environment Enforcement Award in the

cessfully innovating enforcement techniques that have dramatically improved action against trans-boundary environmental crimes in India. Earlier, in 2010, it had received the prestigious Clark R Bavin Wildlife Law Enforcement Award for outstanding work on wildlife law enforcement. Not surprisingly, its actions, along with those of other enforcement agencies, have resulted in the arrest of 350 wildlife criminals and huge seizures of tiger/leopard skins, rhino horns, elephant ivory, turtles/tortoises, raw mongoose hair, mongoose hair brushes protected birds, marine products, live pangolins, deer antlers and so on across the States.

There is, however, hardly any scope for complacence. Human-tiger conflicts are becoming more frequent as the increase in the number of tigers continues along with into their habitats in the form of new settlements, more extensive farming, infrastructure, and environmentally-disastrous industrial projects benefitting blue-eyed entrepreneurs. In this context, there is an urgent need to implement the NTCA's

suggestion for developing a national level strategy for management of human-tiger interface and dispersing tigers in compliance to its standard operating procedure, ensuring active collaboration between district administrations, police and forest department personnel, and, when required, for mob management to ensure safe capture or movement of

All this, however, will not help if State Governments clear projects threatening the tiger's survival. Two examples come immediately to the mind. Maharashtra sanctioned last year the diversion of 467.5 hectares of forest land in Yavatmal district for a cement plant. Also, its recommendation has led to the clearance, in principle, of 87.98 hectares of land in Kondhali and Kalmeshwar ranges — barely 160 km from Yavatmal — to an explosives company in defence products.

A regulatory approach

It is the responsibility of the taxi aggregators to ensure passenger safety. Monitoring app-based services is essential for accountability



ecently, the Karnataka Government asked taxi aggregators like Ola and Uber to withdraw carpooling services in Bengaluru. The Government said that the ride-sharing services were illegal as there is no relevant legal provision in the Karnataka on-demand Transportation Technology Aggregators Rules, 2016, which currently governs the operation of taxi aggregators in the State. Undoubtedly, these ridesharing taxi services, wherein multiple passengers avail the same transportation facility at the same time along a common route, is an ideal supplement to the public transit system. This facility is very likely to minimise the travel costs, level of greenhouse gas emissions and traffic congestion among other things.

Although the shared mobility service has its own benefits, the main challenge facing it is that these services do not fit into our existing legal framework. The civil liability of the taxi aggregators like Uber and Ola for the damages caused by the car drivers during the course of a ride is uncertain. The inevitable question which arises is whether these car drivers are the employees of the taxi aggregators, who hire them to provide transportation services.

On this issue, taxi aggregators like Uber have stated time and time again that the car drivers, who register with them to provide transportation services, are not "employees" but "independent contractors" and, therefore, ineligible for any employee benefits

Legally speaking, as far as the manner of execution of the work is concerned, an independent contractor is not under the direct control of the person who has employed him/her to do the work. On the other hand, an employee acts under the direct control and supervision of his/her employer. Thus, the employer is not vicariously liable for the tort committed by independent contractors in the course of work.

These taxi aggregators further contend that they only provide a convenient forum to connect the riders with the selfemployed car drivers. In this regard, it is pertinent to note here that the relevant provisions of the Karnataka On-demand Transportation Technology Aggregators Rules, 2016, prescribe that the taxi aggregators must issue brand stickers and identity cards to the registered car drivers and organise at least one structured refresher training programme in a year.

The taxi aggregators must also ensure that all the taxies at their command maintain uninterrupted contact with the control room and that the vehicles entered in their licence do not operate independently or accept bookings directly. They are continuously tracked with GPS and GPRS facility, with the provision of a panic button to alert the control room of the aggregator as well as local police.

Simply put, these taxi aggregators control the manner of the work carried out by these self-employed drivers, thus bringing them under the purview of "employee". On the other hand, Ola, Uber drivers, who generally own the cars, have the freedom to work on their own time, thus giving them more control over their work schedule. They are also free to work for their company's competitors. The Karnataka On-demand Transportation Technology Aggregators Rules, 2016, gives liberty to the registered car driver, who is in operation under one taxi aggregator to operate his vehicle simultaneously with any other aggregator. This implies that the taxi aggregators have no absolute control regarding the time and manner of the work carried out by registered car drivers, thus bringing them under the purview of "independent contractors"

To remove this ambiguity, the court's opinion on the subject is the need of the hour. The much-needed clarity on the liability of taxi aggregators will also remove ambiguity with respect to insurance coverage policies in cases of damages caused by the the drivers during the course of a ride. The safety of passengers is a growing concern with respect to shared mobility services as it involves sharing the cabs with unacquainted people. High level of security technologies to help the rider in trouble, strict screening procedures for drivers, effective monitoring by the control room can, however, address the safety issues. The larger question to ponder over is the responsibility of the taxi-aggregators. The answer to be sought is whether the taxi aggregators exercise sufficient control over the manner of work of the drivers so as to hold the former liable for the damages caused by the latter in the course of a ride. In this digital age the old definitions of employer, employee, independent contractor hold no relevance.

Time to stand up for real

While Modi's first term performance may be open to debate, what the current victory has done is to highlight the fact that he can no longer get away by foisting the blame on his predecessors

rime Minister Narendra Modi's recent electoral victory can be clearly attributed to two essential arguments that he was able to sell successfully, no matter how cosmetic the value. First, that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was a party with a difference when it came to matters of honesty and integrity. Second, it was not a family concern and had no place for dynasts. Without any doubt, the Congress and some other Opposition parties are facing an existential crisis, having been voted out of power earlier for corruption and now because the voter has made its distaste for family-run concerns pretty obvious, especially given the rather underwhelming performances of some of these very "families."

Unfortunately, if we go beyond the superficial, the reality on both counts is quite different. As the Report by the Association for Democratic Reforms makes it quite clear, as per their own declarations, the average assets of those in the Union Council of Ministers is ₹14.72 crore, while 22 (39 per cent) of them have declared criminal cases against them, of which 16 Ministers have serious criminal cases pending. As a matter of fact, of its 301 members in the Lok Sabha, 116 have declared criminal cases pending, just marginally better than that of other parties and certainly no indication of either honesty or integri-

Moreover, despite its claims to the contrary, the BJP is really no different from the family concerns that it so disparages. It, too, is run by an extremely small and close-knit "family", albeit not related by blood, in which other leaders are treated more as bystanders or retainers.

While Modi's performance in his first term may be open to debate, what the current victory has done is to highlight the fact that he can no longer get away by foisting the blame for the prevailing difficult security, social, economic or law and order issues on his predecessors, something he had turned into a fine art then. And immensely challenging task is at hand for the Government with the economy being in the doldrums, foreign investors jumping the ship, the security environment far from being conducive and the country's foreign policy has just been upended by the actions of US President Donald parison to the fact that the BJP's credibility rests solely on the popularity that Modi enjoys and without him, it is likely to flounder very quick-

Interestingly, his popularity depends significantly on the larger-than-life image he has been able to generate as a leader, who is not only seen as strong, bold, pragmatic and decisive but also a very capable administrator, who is forward thinking and empathetic. While much of this is a carefully tailored media creation, the latest being his participation in a survival-based reality show, similar to what Russian President Vladimir Putin puts on, his inability to fully live up to the image he projects is quite evident.

Take foreign policy for instance. No Prime Minister, other than Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, has devoted as much time and effort to foreign policv as Modi has done. He has been travelling much of the world to raise India's stature with-

in the international community. Yet, in our own neighbourhood, in Afghanistan, where the Taliban is on the ascendancy, Modi's influence is as good as non-existent and we find ourselves discarded by the wayside.

For us, Afghanistan's importance is in the access it provides to the Central Asian Republics through the Iranian port of Chabahar. By succumbing to American pressure over sanctions against Iran, we have dealt a mortal blow to our Chabahar initiative and hope of access to those Republics. Similarly, the re-emergence of the UShas once again derailed our efforts to isolate Pakistan internationally, a key strategy in Modi's Kashmir policy.

Clearly, tilting towards the US has not been without adverse consequences, and despite all the rhetoric and posturing, in his dealings with both the US and China (remember the Wuhan Summit?), Modi has emerged as a weak and pliable leader, unable to stand up for what is obviously in our national interest.

There is a similar disconnect with regard to our internal security issues as well as our military capabilities. Regardless of whether the Balakot episode should be seen as the "new normal" or not, our Kashmir policy has not made much headway, especially given the increase in popular discontent

within the Valley. While levels of violence have been contained, for the present, the Central Government has made little effort to push for an equitable political solution that can help negate insurgency. Of course, one may well be proved wrong with the recent induction of a hundred companies of the Central Armed Police Forces (CRPF), ostensibly to strengthen the counter-insurgency grid. This seems odd given that there are more than adequate troops already available in the sector. This action may well herald a serious effort to break the political as to the manner in which the situation develops in the coming days and

In this context, it is also worth repeating that while much is made of cross-border terrorism, even at the worst of times, foreign militants have played only a marginal role in the ongoing insurgency. While we must stay alert to avoid a Kargil repeat, we have to focus inwards. In addition, while the issue of funding of separatists by Pakistan receives enormous media attention, we refuse to acknowledge the bigger problem of domestic financing. Surely our intelligence agencies and the security establishment are quite aware that the militant groups corner a percentage of all Government contracts and developmental funds in Jammu & Kashmir. This is what makes the business of insurgency tick and what the Government needs to tackle.

Finally, where this divergence between fact and fiction is most notable is in the Prime Minister's dealings with the military. In these past five years, he has made much of the military publicly, even constructing the long demanded National War Memorial in quick time. Undoubtedly, as it is generally accepted, his electoral victories also owe much to the "surgical strikes" undertaken by the military. While scarce budgetary support for defence is understandable, what is utterly incomprehensible is the fact that the Government spares no effort to demean, degrade and demor-

alise our forces. Examples abound and are well known to bear repetition, with the latest example being the manner in which a modified form of One Rank, One Pension (OROP), given by this very Government with much fanfare, is in the process of being gutted. The problem for the Prime Minister is that he can't be all things to all people. More importantly, we the people deserve to know what exactly he stands for? So,

When anything goes

A few media outlets, who still hold on to the intent of objective journalism, have become victims of not only external forces, but also by the mess created by their more subjective peers. The battle for media freedom, in an era of subjective journalism and relative truths, will be messier this time round

n 1995, I came across a book written by a Pakistani political activist Lin 1985, after he was released from solitary confinement where he had been mercilessly tortured by the police. As a young activist, the author had participated in various protests against the reactionary Gen Zia dictatorship (1977-88). In the early 1980s, accused of being a member of a "terrorist communist outfit" and an "Indian agent", he was thrown in jail and constantly tortured in the various prisons of interior Sindh. Finally, in 1985, he was allowed medical treat-

ment in Karachi. He was not a member of any communist outfit, nor was he a member of Zia's most active opponent, the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP). He was-

n't a Sindhi, Baloch or Pakhtun nationalist either. He belonged to the Jamiat Ulema-i-Islam (JUI) — one of the few Right-wing parties that were against the Zia regime.

In 1984, when the Zia dictatorship banned student unions, various Leftwing student groups and the student wing of the Right-wing Jamaat-i-Islami, the Islami Jamiat Tulaba (IJT), set aside their ideological differences to protest together against the ban. At least for a month or two, the dictatorship was put under tremendous pressure, until the IJT decided to suddenly exit the protest.

During the same period, journalists and their unions often cooperated to protest against what were called "Zia's black laws" against Press freedoms. A detailed study by Philip E Jones of the 1968 movement against the Ayub regime saw similar left-right alliances taking shape. The late scholar, Khalid bin Sayeed's study of the 1977 movement against the authoritarian Z A Bhutto regime also speaks of the left and right journalist groups coming together. This happened again

during the movement against the

Musharraf dictatorship in 2007.

There is nothing unique about this. Large protest movements have a tendency of bringing together distinct ideological groups to address shared concerns. Consider the present scenario in the context of the kind of harassment and censorship the country's media has been facing these days. If, for example, one media group comes under attack by the powers that be, its peers are likely to either remain quiet or even celebrate!

How did this happen? Whenever a profession, an institution or an individual faces a crisis, the instinctive thing to do is to point out the external forces responsible for triggering the crisis. And on most occasions, the external forces are the triggers.

Pakistan has had a long history in which certain state institutions, Governments and political parties have bullied, harassed, terrorised and censored the media. However, if today we begin to again point out these external forces, we won't be saying anything new. We won't be saying anything that hasn't already been said for over 40 years. It is being lamented again. But

during a crisis, it is equally important for one to look for triggers within.

Internal reasons that might be contributing to the crisis often get ignored when all the effort is being invested in pointing out external triggers. Looking for internal triggers is important because, I believe, the crisis faced by the media today may be slightly different than before.

To begin with, there is a battle going on within the media between objective journalism and subjective journalism. The former is based on facts that are thoroughly investigated, checked and cross-checked. Their agenda is simply to provide information without any obvious bias towards a particular political party or individual, a state institution, a religion, a sect, an ethnicity, etc.

We can all agree that absolute objectivity is impossible, but at least the intent to be objective (in the media) was once there. That's why, for example, newspapers used to have what were called "gatekeepers." Their job was to safeguard the intent of remaining objective and factual.

But from the 1990s onwards,

across the world, we saw a concentrated attack on the whole idea of objectivity. Vulgar post-modernism derided objectivity as being an intellectually elitist tool to repress popular opinion. The gatekeepers were brushed aside and a new subjective idea of journalism started to take root. All of a sudden, anybody could say just about any-

That's why what is being said especially on TV news channels — is mostly opinion. But opinions are not necessarily facts. As a US Senator once correctly pointed out: "Everyone is entitled to their opinion, but not to their facts." The whole Fox News model turned this on its head. Opinions were presented as facts and anyone with a theory or a rant was welcome to appear on TV. This model was a huge commercial success. Those, who thought they knew better than the snooty experts and intellectuals, lapped

Conspiracy theories, distortions of historical and contemporary facts and the demonisation of imagined enemies, all became acceptable content. News journalism crossed into

show-business and reaped the ratings. After the success of Fox News, almost all private news channels, which mushroomed across the world, including Pakistan, adopted the same model.

The nature of the media as a business changed. The intent of remaining objective was now bad for business. When news media, show business and popular opinion came together, the result was a new form of entertainment + a kind of "newstainment" that blurs the line between fact and fantasy, truth and lie. It became okay to come on TV or print in a newspaper or a website "facts" such as: 9/11 was an inside job; that ancient Hindus were flying around in spaceships thousands of years ago; that one can derive energy from jinns: That Malala's shooting was staged: That there were billions upon billions of dollars stashed by Pakistani politicians in foreign banks: That he or she was corrupt or a traitor, or an infidel or a racist, a sexist, immoral, fas-

cist, liberal fascist, et al. All this is now okay to say and write as long as it is generating ratings, circulation, likes and retweets. All forms of media have become platforms

for all kind of opinions. But opinions dressed as "facts." Ironically, the attack on the idea of objectivity was encouraged by the media. But if objectivity as an intent once bothered external forces, adopting subjectivity can become a self-destructive act.

Subjective journalism does not bother about objective things such as evidence. But this opens it up to counter-accusations that also do not bother with things such as proof. That's why the nature of censoring today's media has become a lot more brazen than before. It's all subjective now, all "relative." One man's ban (on a media group) is another man's act of patriotism, and another media group's triumph. Typical post-modernist hogwash. The few media outlets that are still holding on to the intent of objective journalism have become victims of not only external forces threatened by their objectivity, but also by the mess created by their more subjective peers within the media industry. Therefore, this time the battle for media freedom is and will be a lot more complex and messier.

US to impose additional 10% tariff on \$300 bn Chinese goods: Trump

 $P^{\text{resident Donald Trump on}}_{\text{Thursday announced that}}$ the US will impose an additional 10 per cent tariff on \$300 billion in Chinese imports, as he accused China of not being serious in arriving at the trade deal and failing to keep its promise to buy more American agricultural products.

In a series of tweet, Trump said the new tariff, in addition to the 25 per cent on goods worth \$250 billion that was previously in place, would come into effect from September 1.

The announcement came a day after US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin returned from Shanghai after two days of latest round of trade negotiations with China.

"Our representatives have just returned from China where they had constructive talks having to do with a future trade deal," Trump tweeted. "We thought we had a deal

with China three months ago, but sadly, China decided to renegotiate the deal prior to signing. More recently, China agreed to buy agricultural product from the US in large quantities, but

did not do so, Trump said.
"Additionally, my friend
President Xi said that he would

stop the sale of Fentanyl to the United States — this never happened, and many Americans continue to die!" said the president.

"Trade talks are continuing, and during the talks the US will start, on September 1st, putting a small additional tariff of 10 percent on the remaining 300 billion dollars of goods and products coming form and products coming from China into our country,' Trump tweeted.

"This does not include the 250 billion dollars already tariffed at 25 per cent. We look forward to continuing our positive dialogue with China on a comprehensive trade deal, and feel that the future between our two countries will be a very bright one!" said the US

Since the commencement of trade war last year China and US have so far hit each other with punitive tariffs covering more than \$360 billion in twoway trade.



Airtel to shut down 3G network across India by March 2020

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Telecom major Bharti Airtel I on Friday said it expects to shut down its entire 3G network across the country by March 2020, the process for which has already started with Kolkata service area.

The company said it was keeping razor sharp focus on driving greater realisation and Average Revenue Per User (ARPU) but emphasised that tariffs need to move up in long term for industry viability. The process of switching off

the 3G network has already started with Kolkata in the recent-concluded June quarter. By September, the shutdown will be affected in 6-7 more circles and between December and March the entire 3G network would be shut down, Gopal Vittal, CEO (India and South Asia), Bharti Airtel, said during the company's post earnings call. "Yes, we do see an upgrade when someone moves from 2G to 4G... On spectrum, probably by April 2020, we will really have only 2G and 4G. So all our spectrum will sit on 4G other than the administered spectrum which is on 2G, plus a small slug of spectrum that we require to

BSE NET PROFIT DROPS 19.8% TO ₹41.3 CRORE IN JUNE QUARTER

The BSE on Friday reported a 19.8 per cent

decline in consolidated net profit to ₹41.3 crore for the quarter ended June 30, mainly on higher expenses. The bourse had posted a net profit of ₹51.5 crore for the corresponding period of the previous year, the BSE said in a filing to the National Stock Exchange (NSE). Its total income was marginally up at ₹166 crore, compared with ₹164.20 crore in the June 2018 quarter. Total expenses were higher at ₹119.10 crore. against ₹108.69 crore in the year-ago period. On a standalone basis, the stock exchange reported a profit of ₹34.4 crore, down from ₹51.8 crore during the quarter ended June 30. The exchange said it proposes to buy back 67.65 lakh fully paid-up equity shares of ₹2 each at ₹680 per equity share through the tender offer route. We haven't ruled out any motives.

Two men from the far south were arrested after wires and ball bearings were found in an inactive device outside Thai police headquarters late Thursday, in what police said was a linked incident.

Police chief Jakthip Chaijinda confirmed the men

But he said it was "too early" to clearly tie them with the rebellion.

Outrage is boiling in the south over the treatment of a 34-year-old rebel suspect who was left in a coma hours after being taken into a notorious military interrogation centre in Pattani province.

The blasts in Bangkok Friday appeared to be symbolic attacks aimed at embarrassing the government during a major summit but not designed to cause mass casualties.

Small devices -- some believed to be so-called "ping pong bombs" around the size of a table tennis ball -- exploded at several locations across the city, none close to the summit venue.

Officials said four people were wounded.

"Reports are they were 'ping pong bombs' hidden in bushes by the road," said Renu Suesattaya, director of

Suanluang district where the first bombs were reported.

Two further explosions shattered glass near a wellknown downtown skyscraper, emergency police added.

Bomb disposal experts

were deployed around the Mahanakorn Tower -- owned by the King Power group that counts Leicester City football club among its assets. Most of the dead in the

highly-localised insurgency in the south are civilians, but the conflict garners few international headlines. Malay-Muslim militants

are fighting for autonomy from Thailand which annexed the region over a century ago.

Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the launches were conducted at 2:59 a.M. And 3:23 a.M. From an eastern coastal area but did not immediately confirm how many projectiles were fired or how far they flew.

The North fired short-range ballistic missiles on July 25 and conducted what it described as a test firing of a new multiple rocket launcher system on Wednesday. Experts say the North is demonstrating its frustration over planned US-South Korea military exercises and stalled nuclear negotiations with the US, and its weapons tests could intensify if negotiations do not proceed rapidly over the next few months.

EFFORTLESSLY

Actress SONAKSHI SINHA believes that sometimes the best way to get across a difficult message is through humour. By Ayushi Sharma

urned out in all-white — a lacy bralette draped with a short cropped jacket and culottes paired with sporty shoes — I could feel the peaceful aura which actress Sonakshi Sinha exuded at a single glance. We are like yin and yang, as am dressed in black. Both perfect for an ideal exchange of ideas.

Though she has adorned simplicity, her choice of roles are bold and more complex. In her latest outing Khandaani Shafakhana, she plays Baby Bedi, who is a quick-witted small-town medical representative from an orthodox Punjabi family. Despite her earnest efforts, her modest income never matches up to the est income never matches up to the mounting bills, which results in multiple loans and creditors knocking at her door constantly. One day, she is presented with an unique opportunity. She must choose between her utterly ordinary life or bail her family out of their perenni bail her family out of their perennial money crunch by running a sex clinic, which she inherits from her estranged uncle. The conditions in follows is the no-holds-barred journey of a girl in a world where people prefer to hush up things. This small-town girl will break all the taboos around sex, open hearts and ultimately, minds.

Sonakshi says that there is a social taboo around the 'sex' word itself. We have made it abnormal to say it out loud or discuss it openly with anyone, within families or even with friends. That's just how, as a society, we have been brought up. Yes, things are changing gradually. She says one of reasons why she did the film was, "Because I am one of those people who never had this conversation with my parents. And this despite the fact that I come from a liberal and modern family. So imagine, if I am having this issue, what people in small towns are going through and how they must be feeling. It is surprising to see sex being treated as a taboo especially in a country, which is so heavily populated. In the trailer, there's a dialogue — Duniya mein 17 per cent abaadi vale hum aur baat toh aise karte hain jaise 130 crore log parshaad vale kele khake prakat hue hain. (We constitute 17 per cent of the population and we talk as if this appeared as a blessing of God). Envision a country like this. Maybe this is the reason why India is over populated because we do not have proper sex education and we don't talk about it The actress feels that this should-

n't be the case. "Whenever there's a condom advertisement, one probably feels awkward and acts innocent. But why? Is practising safe sex a crime? No, right? Then why does this happen," she asks, clearly referring to our history where ancient texts reveal that sex was considered a mutually pleasurable act and premarital sex was accepted. But today, sex talk, sex education and everything related to the topic have a stigma attached to them.

Sonakshi feels that such subjects, when merged with an element of humour, stays with the audience. "If you ask my opinion, yes, comedy does help a lot in putting across a subject like this. But I don't believe it is the only way to express the message. There have been films with



social messages, which are serious but they were a bit different. This kind of subject needed humour. Also, what are films? They mirror the society, right? So it's human nature, if you show somebody where they are going wrong, they get defensive but if you do it in a funny manner or joke about it, they always listen. It becomes more palatable. Humour just makes people think without offending them, of course," explains the Dabangg actress.

She is happy to become a flagbearer for women by taking up a subject like this. Does she think a male protagonist would have been better for the role? Or if it was a male filmmaker directing her, would she have been as comfortable? "There have been films with male protagonists but I am really happy to take up sex as a subject. It's important as well as relevant in today's day and age. It is something that should be dis-cussed and thought about to make a difference in the future. For this particular role, a female protagonist was required," she says with great zeal and goes on to add, "Honestly once you decide to do a film, if it was this particular theme and even if it was a male director, I would have done it with conviction and I would have stood by my decision. I think, that's exactly when you throw all your embarrassment out of the window because once you are committed to do something you have to put your heart to it. However, I feel, the kind of sensitivity that Shilpi (Dasgupta) has directed this film with definitely did make me a lot more comfortable. She has done it so beautifully that it's not even border

line cheap or vulgar in any manner.

It's a very well-made, intelligent and

funny film. As I said before, it's always good to express these kind of emotions and thoughts with humour.'

Sonakshi is one such person, who believes that roles and characters that are played on-screen shapes you in real life. "Your roles always teach you. I take away something from most of my roles. It's like the role is a part of yourself and at the same time, you take something from it. I could easily relate with the character of Baby Bedi. And it's not only me but every other girl as she is one of those, who somewhere, when she was a child, had a dream of becoming a doctor but due to family responsibilities, she had to let go of that dream. 
VINTAGE HEART

And due to this, there have been so many times where when two people are going to get married and the guy is aware about his sexual problem but he doesn't discuss it. Neither with his family, nor with the girl's. It is finally revealed after the two get married and that is when the problems begin to arise. This has led to the break down of

so many marriages in India.' Indeed, an example of impotency in men and his difficulty in discussing it was evident in one of the episodes of Amazon Prime's Made In Heaven, where the girl gets to know about her husband only after they are married. Varun says, "The man needs to accept it rather than hide it as a weakness and maintain an illusion. This would in turn affect not just his life but also his partner's. 

From an asthmatic sickly boy, the journey to becoming a Guinness world record holder in mountaineering was riddled with hurdles but SATYARUP SIDDHANTA refused to give up, says Sakshi Sharma

journey from being an asth-matic kid, who could barely run 100 metres, to being the youngest Guinness world record holder for climbing the seven summits and seven volcanic summits, Satyarup Siddhanta has fought against all the odds and made India

proud by inspiring young talent.

But Satyarup knows how to crawl out from the depths. While climbing the Everest, which he considers his most challenging expedition, he fell into a deep crevice after a snowbridge broke enroute to camp. He was stuck in the middle and it was so deep that he could not see its bottom. But he was lucky enough to be alive and tell the tale.

He says, "On my death bed, I won't remember how much bank balance I have or what contract I won or lost." Rather, he wants to feel content that he touched lives. But to battle the odds, tough conditions and extreme weather needs a special kind of motivation. He says, "Every step that I put on the high altitude, fills me up with gratitude. It's like a miracle, as I never thought I could climb any mountain. The joy in surpassing my own limits, breaking the barriers and shattering the self limiting belief makes me feel unstoppable." He realised human potential is unfathomable and the discovery of this strength served as the greatest motivation for him.

Adventurous since childhood, Satyarup says, "I never dreamt of mountaineering, but I was always adventurous in my thought process. I used to read a lot

of novels and imagine that I am the central character. People often saw me on the treetop or climbing on the parapets or the

boundary walls. Sharing about his initial years, he says, "Because my college was in the Himalayas, I had intense asthma attacks because of the high altitude." The turning point came when he had an asthma attack and had forgotten the inhaler in his room. He says, "I was rolling on the ground to breathe and get some oxygen. I tried everything possible to regularise my breath but nothing worked. After 10 minutes, it automatically became normal." This incident changed Satyarup's life. He became contemplative and saw the incident through a broader perspective. He realised how dependent he was on his inhaler and wanted to get rid of that helplessness for which he started training his body by eating food that he

was allergic to. It was when he joined a job at Bengaluru in 2005 that the seeds of

showed him his trekking pictures at Parvathamalai hill which gave him an insight into the world he was not aware of. He says, "For a moment I was shocked because I always used to think that treks were possible only in foreign countries because the adventure novels that I read were mostly set abroad. I asked my boss if I could also do this, and he counter questioned, 'if I can why can't you?" This excited him to the core but he knew that it would not be easy for him on account of his asthma. But, he decided to chase his dreams and went on a trek to Parvathamalai hills. He says, "When I reached the top, I not only had the joy of climbing the hill but also of the fact that I didn't use the inhaler during the whole journey. I felt liberated. That moment instilled confidence in me and I realised that I could achieve all my dreams if I am

Since then there has been no looking

back. Satyarup decided to fight with his problems and fulfill his wildest imagination. He says, "Every weekend, people saw me on the Western Ghats trekking, diving and skydiving. I never thought that I would become a mountainer." Things took a 360 become a mountaineer." Things took a 360 degree turn in 2010 when he went for the Everest base camp trek in Nepal. He says, The highest mountain stood there casting a spell on me. I did not know what mountaineering was, I just knew it is yet another mountain, a little high but I could definitely do it. So, I promised Everest that I am going to come back." But, he soon realised that mountaineering was not like normal trekking and was a different game altogether. But he clung on to his dream and started preparing for it.

He then went to Kilimanjaro, the highest mountain in Africa and came to know about the concept of seven summits. (The 7 summits represent the highest point on each of the seven continents). Satyarup says, "I was blown away by the idea and

started dreaming about it. But, soon realised that I didn't have money for climbing even one and here I am thinking about seven mountains."

Talking about the challenges of his journey he says, "I went to Mt Denali, the highest mountain of North America in Alaska, unsupported and unguided because of its heavy cost." But the good part was that he completed the journey and this boosted his confidence for Everest. But financial constraints held him back, so he collected funds from his college, friends, collected funds from his college, friends, parents and crowdfunding. But in 2015, there was an earthquake in Nepal which killed more than 10,000 people and all expeditions were closed. Talking about the tough time he says, "I lost my four friends, I was shattered. Our dreams were crushed but Lidid not lose hope. I held together all but I did not lose hope. I held together all the broken pieces of my dreams and started rebuilding it." Mountaineering involves challenges in

all aspects, be it physical, mental or financial. A mountaineer should be strong enough to combat these in order to turn their dream into a reality. Satyarup says, "You have to be mentally very strong because it's not easy to see someone falling from the cliff in front of your eyes but then you have to walk ahead without feeling anything. This needs a lot of guts." One needs to be patient in order to handle the uncertainties. Talking about the financial challenges, he says, "I had to leave my job because there was no policy for such long leaves in my office. So, I had to choose between Everest and my job and I chose the former because I had no idea whether I would come back from the climb or not. I thought there was no point bothering about the job? Therefore, he is trying to get the government's support. He feels that India is not mature enough about mountaineering. He says, "There are consistent efforts to encourage sports which has shown results as we have been breaking records. My request is to extend this to mountaineering as well." He hopes that the government understands his situation

"It will be a failure on part of our country if the potential and passion of mountaineers is held back because of financial constraints. I could have used this money to buy a house or a car and lead a settled life but I wanted to make my country proud. Nobody asked me to, but I felt an urge to be instrumental," adds he. He repeatedly urges the government to support mountaineers who silently bring glory to the country but are suffering ter-

Patience and power

Production consultant of *Dynasties*, DHRUV SINGH, says that tiger is one such animal that can freeze for unimaginable lengths of time. By Team VIVA

Phone Circle Consultant in the epic wildlife series Dynasties. He was vital in liaising with the Forest Department and local community in Bandhavgarh to make the filming happen. He also spent several days on the field filming with the production crew, given his expertise and awareness of the local scenario and challenges.

Tell us about your journey. How did you get into this profession and how many wildlife shows have you been a part of?

Since my childhood days, I have been interested in wildlife, all thanks to my parents, who pioneered the wildlife and ran one of the first wildlife lodges of the country in Bandhavgarh, Bhopal in 1978. I was brought up in Bandhavgarh and had been exposed to tigers since childhood. Initially, in this profession I was a wildlife photographer. I can still recall the day I got an opportunity to work on a wildlife documentary and since then I never looked back. So, I have been working on such documentaries since the year 1996. My first film was the Lands of the Tigers (1997), which was a groundbreaking film of BBC on the Indian subcontinent and it was one of my most enjoyable experiences in life. That's how my passion for tigers and wildlife grew and turned into a profession.

What is that one trait of a tiger that is distinct from other animals?

The trait that appeals me the most is the patience, especially when they are about to hunt. And because I have spent all my life with tigers, I have observed them. A tiger can absolutely freeze for unimaginable lengths of time. There will be absolutely no movement. One can never sense that the animal is around them. So when a tiger is inquisitive, it would just freeze in any position. And you can see that in some of the parts of





How difficult was it to shoot in Bandhavgarh Reserve for the

It was a struggle that we knew we were getting into. I would like to advice people, who want to make a film or a documentary on the animal — do carry a few pills for blood pressure because it's a real challenge. Actually, filming wildlife itself is a challenge as it's among one of a few professions or maybe the only type of genre, where the subject you're going to film is completely uncertain. There is no surety whether you're going to see a tiger or not. There could be days when you wouldn't see a tiger at all. There was a part of the shoot, where out of three

weeks, for two weeks we didn't find a single Raj Bhera, the tigress. It was a very stressful moment for the entire crew. However, shooting in Bandhavgarh, we had the best possibility of seeing them because it has the highest numbers. We knew the territories, which part of the park to find them. So we had the best knowledge and that made Bandhavgarh the perfect location to film the show

What is the current situation of tigers in India? Is it better than before? If yes, then how and what more can be done to

help conserve the tiger? I would answer that in two ways. The number of tigers is

before but even that is worse. Where will they go and how can we create a space for them is a challenge. And to answer that further, the government of Madhya Pradesh has taken bold steps. Because of their conservation efforts, the numbers have increased. And this is a problem that they have foreseen that when the numbers will grow, where would the tigers go. They have made efforts by making headway into programmes by which they can keep them evenly. They can move them from parts which are big in numbers to areas that have smaller number of tigers. It was very successfully in Panna, where the numbers had drastically dropped. They were able to repopulate by bringing them from other tiger reserves.

Does filming in proximity in the jungles disturb the ani-

The reason why I agreed to work with Sony BBC Earth for *Dynasties* was that they deeply respect the space for animals. And It was very clear that this film about tigers in their habitat, living a natural life. And that is what was exciting as well as a challenge. In order to make a

successful film, we need to have a safe distance. The tiger must not feel your presence, which is a hard thing. So it was all possible because of the lenses we used. The ethics of the channel are very clear. The entire team behaved in a certain manner in which they should. To shoot the tigers, there should not be any disturbance, and the minute a tiger is disturbed, the shot is of no use to us.

What are the ground realities in the jungles that contribute to extinction of animal species including tigers? What can a common man do to help in tiger conservation?


I feel that people of the country are very responsible as they understand what does it mean to be cruel towards animals. That is why most of the species animals have survived in India. Even though India being the most populated country in the world, there is still room for animals. And that is not only because of education or conservation efforts, it is because people care for animals and that for me is the essence of conservation. It is our duty, me as a filmmaker and every other individual as common person to understand their manner of living. Giving them freedom is what matters the most as everybody likes to live in their natural habitat and live a life as they want. If we let them live on their own terms, this simple means that we care enough to protect them. In a nutshell, the biggest responsibility to have is to fidget nature, national parks, reserves and spend time with animals.

What drove you to the world of wildlife? Tell us your scariest moment while assisting in filming the tiger?

A lot of people find get scared

when something happens. However, while filming wildlife, it's scariest part is when nothing is happens. It means that it is scary when you can't find anything to shoot. When a tiger sleeps, it sleeps through out the day. The longest we have gone without seeing a tiger is two and a half weeks, almost 18-20 days. It was so dreadful. It's really difficult because the entire crew's patience is tested to extreme levels. And that's where the production plays a big role in keeping the morale of the team high and keeping

them excited.



England still had plenty of work to do to get back on level terms but this was a vast improvement on their firstinnings 85 all out in a Test win over Ireland at Lord's last week.

Surrey opener Burns was 82 not out and fellow Ashes debutant Joe Denly nine not out at tea, with Root the only batsman dismissed in a session that yielded 99 runs in 27 overs.

Australia's total had been built on a superb 144 from Steve Smith in the former captain's first Test match since completing a 12-month ban for his role in a ball-tampering scandal in South Africa. The tourists been struggling at 122-8 before their last two wickets more than doubled their score.

England were 10-0, with left-hander Burns four not out and Surrey team-mate Jason Roy six not out, when play resumed Friday in slightly overcast conditions.

Roy made a blistering 85 in eventual champions England's World Cupsemi-final win over Australia at Edgbaston last month.

But in just his second Test, he never looked comfortable against Australia's fast bowlers and, on 10, he edged a good length ball from James Pattinson low to Smith at second slip, with England
