INDIA EXACTS PAK VENGEANCE

12 days after Pulwama, IAF jets bomb JeM camps in Pak, kill 300 ultras FOrces keep eyes

Twelve days after rakshan based Jaish-e-Mohammad welve days after Paksitan ror attack in Pulwama killing 44 CRPF men, Indian fighter jets on Tuesday pre-dawn exe-cuted pin-pointed punitive strikes deep inside Pakistan territory against terror groups' training camps eliminating around 300 of their cadre. India termed the action as

"pre-emptive" and "non-mili-tary" to deter JeM from carrying out suicide attacks in the country. It was not clear whether JeM chief Maulana Masood Azhar's brother-inlaw Maulana Yusuf Azhar, alias Ustad Ghouri, was killed in the IAF attack

Precision guided ammunition and missiles were used to destroy the JeM's biggest terror camp in Balakot in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province (KPK) located at the tri-junction of Pakistan Punjab and KPK. Using air power for the first time since the 1971 war with Pakistan, India conducted "intelligence-led" operation. In fact, the IAF was not allowed to cross the Line of Control

(LoC) even at the height of the Kargil war in 1999.

The punitive strikes were carried out by at least 12 Mirage-2000 jets at 3.40 am. The terror camp in Balakot is located about 60km as the crow flies from the LoC in Uri in Kashmir, sources said.

The actual bombing at the terror camp was over in 90 seconds and at least five to six Mirages were in Pakistani territory for not more than six to seven minutes. The entire operation including the Mirages taking off from various locations close to the LoC to confuse the Pakistan Air Force (PAF) lasted about 20 minutes and all the aircraft landed back safely.

The Pakistan Army alleged the strike was futile. "Indian aircraft intruded from Muzafarabad sector. Facing timely and effective response from PAF, they released pay-load in haste while escaping which fell near Balakot. No casualties or damage," said Major General Asif Ghafoor, Director General of Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), which is the media wing of the Pakistan Army.


Sources said at least two Mirages flew in a loop after radars picked them up in order to confuse Pakistani defences. Two other Mirages flying at low level slipped through the radar net and targeted the terror camp, sources said.

The Mirages also used electronic warfare to jam the enemy radars to enter Pakistani

At least 1,000 kg of explo-sives were released by the IAF jets to destroy the camp. While the mother base of

Mirage-2000s is at Gwalior, more than 1,000 km from Balakot, the jets selected for the mission were shifted to some forward bases in Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab and Haryana shortly before the designated time. Mid-air refuellers provided fuel to the jets to sustain them for long in the air.

The Mirages also took off from various airbases to avoid Pakistan intelligence network, they said.

Giving details of the strikes and terming them as "non-mil-itary" apparently since the targets were not military, Foreign Secretary Vijay Gokhale said here credible intelligence was received that the IeM was planning to carry out other suicide attacks in India after the Pulwama bombing.

fter the IAF successfully A carried out the mission to destroy terror camps in Balakot on Tuesday, the Indian defence establishment is on guard to thwart any retaliation from across the border.

Officials said the next 48 hours are most crucial as Pakistan might be forced to carry out some action in "tit for tat" to assuage its domestic audience, which is questioning the lapses in Pakistan defences to detect the fighter jets which penetrated

deep inside the country.

In the fast evolving scenario post Balakot attack, the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi took stock of the situation and defence preparedness to meet any challenge from Pakistan.

Since India does not have any terrorist camps, Pakistan can resort to airstrike only by targeting military or civilian targets. This could be an open

declaration of war, which Islamabad could ill afford given its global isolation and miserable economic situation. Given that constraint,. Pakistan will try to ramp up pressure all across the 750km Line of Control (LOC) in Jammu & Kashmir and International Border stretching from Jammu to Punjab, Rajasthan and Gujarat. All these States are now on high alert.

The Army is on alert across the LoC as it is the first line of defence there. All the airbases of the IAF are also following the drills to prevent any aerial attack. Reports indicated that many high value targets like fighter jets were shifted to underground hangars to avoid detection by Pakistani satellites.

Most of these airbases are in Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Jammu & Kashmir, sources said. Also, the IAF has taken all offensive measures to respond in case Pakistan violates Indian airspace from any direction, they said.

Jaish Balakot safe haven proves mirage, vanishes

The terrorist training camp in Balakot was targeted by India after intelligence indicated that scores of terrorists of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and other terror groups had shift-ed there after the Pulwama attack to escape any action by attack to escape any action by the Indian security forces. Earlier, these fidayeen and fighters were lodged in launch pads close to the Line of Control (LoC) to infiltrate from multiple points in Jammu & Kashmir through South and North of Pir Panjal

Elaborating upon the reason for zeroing in on Balakot, located at the junction of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK), Pakistan's Punjab and Balochistan, officials in the security establishment said this camp is the main centre of JeM

and some other terrorist organisations. The camp is headed by IeM chief Maulana Masood Azhar's brother-in-law Maulana Yusuf Azhar. However, it is not yet con-firmed if he was present in the

camp when the IAF targeted it, sources admitted.

Balakot is located in a hilltop forest far away from civil-ian population and military establishments and therefore a "sitting duck target", for the Indian forces to avoid collateral damage for punitive action, they said.

At least 325 terrorists and to 27 trainers were at camp when the Indian fighter jets attacked and it was the biggest camp operated by the Pakistan-based JeM which had claimed responsibility for the February 14 suicide attack on a CRPF convoy in Pulwama that martyred 44 jawans.

In fact, JeM chief's son Abdullah had also undergone training in militancy at the same camp, they said adding new recruits are imparted training in handling weapons.

Capt Amarinder writes to Centre seeking Chandigarh's inclusion under open sky policy

Punjab Chief Minister Capt Pamarinder Singh on Tuesday sought inclusion of Chandigarh in the list of cities notified for operation of air-lines of ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) countries under the Government of

India's Open Sky Policy.

Capt Amarinder, in a demi-official letter to the Union Civil Aviation Minister Suresh Prabhu, said that the International Civil Terminal at SAS Nagar (Mohali) had been functioning for the last three years and was now set to launch 24x7 operations for wide-bodied aircraft with upgraded Code 4E status from April 1, 2019. 'The airport caters not

only to the population of the tri-city of Chandigarh but also to international passenger traffic from the States of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and even parts of Uttarakhand," he said adding would take all possible steps to support the growth of civil aviation and to harness its benefit for the overall develop-

ment of the region. He said that presently, the Airport is unable to operate direct flights to international destinations in ASEAN countries, such as Singapore,

Bangkok, Hong Kong and Kuala Lumpur.
As a result, passengers

from this region have to travel to New Delhi for taking flights to such countries, which is not only time consuming but also cause hardship in the form of extra travel by road, Capt Amarinder has pointed out in his letter.

Under the Centre's Open Sky Policy for ASEAN countries, 18 cities have been notified for operation of airlines in the country. Presently, Chandigarh does not feature in these 18 cities notified by the Government of India. Pursuant to its scheduled upgradation to Code 4E, it becomes eligible for notification under the Open Sky Policy, he added.

Urging the Union Minister to take cognisance of these facts, the Chief Minister has requested him to issue necessary directions to notify forthwith the International Civil Terminal at SAS Nagar (IXC) under the Open Sky Policy for operation of airlines to ASEAN countries from April 1, 2019. "This would not only help

in reducing the travel time of the passengers from the region to such countries and connecting destinations, but would also help in boosting tourism, economy and attracting investments in the region," he

The Chief Minister, who reviewed the situation at a high-level meeting with the top brass of the police and civil administration, has decided to

region for on-ground assessment of the situation.

As per official statement, the Chief Minister will leave for Pathankot on Wednesday morning, and will travel by road to villages in border areas of the district and Amritsar. where he will stay the night.

The next day, he will visit the Tarn Taran region and spend the night at Faridkot. Capt Amarinder will return to Chandigarh on Friday after visiting the border areas of Ferozepur district, said his Media Advisor Raveen

Thukral, who was present at the review meeting, dis-closed that the Chief Minister had ordered a spate of mea-sures as part of the State's preparedness to deal with any contingency in view of the latest developments at the LoC.

and Senior Superintendents of Police (SSPs) of the border areas have been asked to put in place all contingency plants to ensure the protection and safe-ty of the citizens," he said adding that the meeting found no need for panic and decided against any move to evacuate the residents of the border

The Chief Minister, who spoke to Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh, on the situation, earlier tweeted his full support

for the surgical strikes. "Great job by the #IndianAirForce. The #IAFStrikes have sent the much needed signal to Pakistan and the terrorists harbouring -don't think you can get away with acts like the #PulwamaAttack. Bravo to the #IAF men and my full support for the action," he wrote.

deadly Pulwama attack on a CRPF convoy, Capt Amarinder, a former Army captain, had made it clear that he was in favour of strong retaliatory action and that the Congress would support any course of action decided by the Central Government.

HIGH ALERT ON THE-BORDER

Modi," Shah said on Twitter.

Javadekar was the first prominent voice from the government to react on the strike. "This was a necessary step for the security forces. The entire country is backing the forces now".

India needs to be on guard as Pak may retaliate: Ex-Air chief

Defence experts on Tuesday hailed the IAF's pre-dawn air strike on a Jaish-e-Mohammed's terror camp in Pakistan with some saying "the message had been communi-cated strongly", while a former Air Chief said India needs to be on guard as Pakistan might react soon.

The operation drew reactions from various defence experts including retired officers in the armed forces.

Former military secretary Lt Gen (retd) Syed Ata Hasnain termed the operation "an appropriate response (delivered) with a sense of proportionality".

It was a nonmilitary, pre-emptive strike and "we have gone deep", so no scope for denial from Pakistan side, he

"We have only targeted a terror camp. No civilian area or military installation were touched by us. Also, our measure is such that onus of esca-lation will now be on the Pakistani side," he told PTI.

"Besides, the international community will continue to stand by us for the same reason and the traction gained form diplomatic and other means will continue to have impact," said the former general officer commanding for the 15 and the 21

Lt Gen (retd) Ajai Singh, former colonel of the Poona Horse, an over 200-year-old regiment, had mixed feelings about the air strike.

"It is like a double-edged sword. While the action has aroused our nation and fostered a sense of patriotism, by this strike, we have alerted Pakistan," he told PTI.

The 84-year-old veteran said, he has participated in 1962, 1965 and 1971 wars. "The message has been sent

to them, but we have alerted Pakistan, and now they will get cautious," he said, adding, "We need a master plan to handle the Former IAF chief, Air Chief Marshal (retd) S Krishnaswamy complimented the government for taking the stand, but cau-

tioned there might be "reaction" from the Pakistani side.
"It is a natural to have a reaction (from Pakistan). I'll be surprised if Pakistan doesn't react in the next 48 hours...They cannot resist certain temptation

of a tit-for-tat," he said. The former chief of air staff also said that there is "nothing called absolute safety, and we need to be on guard".

All you need to know about Mirage that smoked out Jaish

The Mirage 2000 aircraft deployed for conducting deep strike on Pakistan's deep state i.e. the camps of terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed in Pakistan was chosen due to its lethality and precision in the

As per the lethality count of Mirage 2000, 30 to 100 people can be killed every 30 seconds and a conservative estimate here suggests about 400 people could have been liquidated in the raids including two IC 814 hijack case masterminds, 25 terror commanders and trainers, some of whom are suspected to have been former Army officers besides 325 to 350 trained fidayeens being readied for hitting Indian interests.

The Mirage 2000 are the strategic bombers capable of delivering an array of bombs and missiles including nuclear and laser-guided ones with capability to hit long-range targets with "pin-point" accu-

racy.
India inducted the Mirage iets about three decades back and the fleet is undergoing upgradation and enhancements with a budget of Rs 20,000 crore. The multi-role, single



engine jet is a single-pilot fighter with a range of about 1,500 km.

The Dassault-manufactured jet can travel at more than twice the speed of sound at Mach 2.2 (2,336 kmph). It is capable of flying at an altitude of 59,000 ft. A commercial jetliner usually flies at 35,000 to 40,000 feet.

Interestingly, the Rafale, manufactured by the same Dassault, is now in the midst of a massive controversy even as the Mirage 2000 is garnering lavish praise from all quar-

The aircraft was preferred over other options as it is capable of conducting long-range engagement of targets and the assessment of success was estimated to be 100 per cent, sources said.

The Mirage also is fitted with the state-of-the art radar

system, control system and flight navigation system with virtual display of the function

The Indian Air Force has about three squadrons of Mirage 2000 fighter jets manufactured by HAL under licence from French aerospace major Dassault Aviation, the manufacturer of Rafale multi role fighters being procured by

A number of equipment and platforms of the IAF were also used in the deep operation, first inside Pakistan after the 1971 Indo-Pak war.

The Mirage 2000 was first commissioned into the IAF in 1985, when it was christened as Vajra (thunderbolt). India initially bought 36 single-seater Mirage 2000 and 4 twin-seater Mirage 2000 after US supplied F-16 fighters manufactured by Lockheed Martin.

Border tense, Army alert in J&K | Didi praises Air Force

Hostilities between India and Pakistan peaked on Tuesday along the Line of Control in Jammu & Kashmir. following fresh exchange of fir-ing at different locations, in Rajouri and Poonch sectors shortly after fighter jets flattened 'terror factories' deep inside Pakistan in punitive strikes. The jawans of the Indian Army, already in a state of high alert, maintained tight vigil to prevent any strike by the Border action team of the Pakistan army in the forward areas.

After the Pulwama terror

strike security of all the vital defence installations in the region was beefed up and high alert was sounded to prevent any strike by heavily armed terrorists in the region.

According to ground reports, Pakistan army violated ceasefire agreement at five different locations in the last 24 hours in twin border districts.

Five Army soldiers were injured and two houses damaged as Pakistani army resorted to heavy mortar shelling on 55 forward areas in Jammu, Rajouri and Poonch districts on Tuesday, officials said, hours after IAF jets struck a JeM terror camp across the LoC.

He said the firing continued for over two hours between 5 to 7.30 a.m in the forward areas. Indian army retaliated strongly and effectively, he added.

Deputy Commissioner, Poonch Rahul Yaday said, " we are monitoring the situation on ground zero on hourly basis. He said, as of now no specific advi-sory has been issued to the border residents to relocate to safer places in the wake of escalating tensions between India and Pakistan". Political parties asked to give mediation a chance

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked the contending parties in the politically sensitive Ram Janambhoomi-Babri Masjid land dispute in Ayodhya to seriously consider mediation for a permanent solution even if there is "one per cent chance

Observing it was looking at the possibility of "healing rela-tions" between the parties, a five-judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi also said it would pass an order on March 6 on whether to refer the dispute to a courtappointed mediator.

The suggestion for another round of mediation, however, drew a mixed response from the parties to the decadesold dispute.

The proposal was mooted by one of the judges, Justice S A Bobde, during the hearing when both the Hindu and the Muslim litigants were sparring over the veracity of documents related to the case which

Pradesh Government and filed with the apex court registry.

"We are considering it (mediation) very seriously. You all (parties) have used the word that this matter is not adversarial. We would like to give a chance to mediation even if there is one per cent chance," said the bench, also comprising Justices D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S A

Nazeer.
"We would like to know your (both parties) views on it. We do not want any third party to make a comment to jeopardise the entire process."

"This, we have done keeping in mind that the period of eight weeks that we have allowed to the parties to go oral and documentary evidence could be effectively

and resolve the issues in the manner indicated above,

> "We have suggested to the parties that during the inter regnum a court appointed and

court monitored mediation with utmost confidentiality could be initiated to bring a permanent solution to the issues raised in the cases," it The bench noted in its order that lawyers representing the legal heirs of original liti-

gants M Siddiq and Mohd Hashim and Nirmohi Akhara are "in broad agreement" with the suggestion of the court about mediation while counsel appearing for Sri Ram Lalla Virajman, Mahant Suresh Das and Akhil Bharat Hindu Mahasabha have "not concurred" with it.

"Do you seriously think that the entire dispute for so many years is for property? We can only decide property rights but we are considering the possibility of healing relations,"

"Keeping in mind that the mediation suggested by the court is in terms of the mandate under section 89 of the CPC and in an appropriate case it will always be open for the court to invoke its power, we deem it proper to observe that the mediation suggested is only to effectively utilize the time of eight weeks that would be taken to make the cases ready for hearing," the bench said in its written order.

Senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan, appearing for M Siddiq, said they were agreeable to the "very important sugges-tion" of mediation but said the

was a "knotty issue".
"We will also have to fix the time frame after talking to the mediator," the bench said.

Senior advocate C S Vaidyanathan, appearing for Ram Lalla Virajman, said they did not agree for "another round of mediation" as such attempts have failed in the

"In the earlier mediation, it was accepted that Lord Rama was born in Avodhva but not at this (disputed) site. Mediation has been tried not once but several times," he said. Senior advocate Ranjit Kumar, appearing for one of the parties, said things have not worked during earlier round of mediation and "everybody wants that the matter should be decided by the

'Mediation is not possible

Dhavan referred to the mediation held between 1991-93 and said, "In the larger interest, this court is saying do it (mediation) again. From our side, we are agreeable".

At the outset, the apex

court said it can proceed with the hearing if there is consensus among the parties with regard to the veracity of the translated documents. The bench referred to a report filed by the secretary general of the apex court on the status of documents pertaining to the case which said that "the record consists of 38,147 pages of which 12,814 pages are in Hindi, 18,607 pages are in English, 501 pages are in Urdu, 97 pages are in Gurmukhi, 21 pages are in Sanskrit, 86 pages are in other language scripts, 14 pages contain images and 1,729 pages are in combination of more than one language script".

As many as 15 smart command and control centres (SCCC) worth ₹2.771 crores in 15 smart cities have been completed and work orders for setting up 31 inte-grated command and control centre have been issued. In 18 cities, it is under tendering process. Due to this, crime rate has been decreased in these smart cities. According to HUA, smart

roads in 21 cities worth ₹795 crore have been completed, work orders amounting to ₹7,626 crore have been issued in 54 cities and tendering worth ₹5,942 crore is under progress in 40 cities under smart city mission (SCM). As per latest data, smart waste water projects in four cities worth ₹326 crore have been completed, work orders amounting to ₹5,342 crore have been issued in 41 cities and tendering worth ₹3,860 crore is under progress in 23

"Similarly, smart water

projects in 20 cities worth ₹1,135 crore have been completed, work orders amounting to ₹9,382 crore have been issued in 49 cities and tendering worth ₹4,239 crore is under progress in 29 cities. Impactful projects in 18 cities worth ₹232 crore have been completed, work orders amounting to ₹4,610 crore have been issued in 37 cities and tendering worth ₹3291 crore is under progress in 20 cities," the HUA Ministry said.

Puri said that the rapid rate of progress of the mission is an answer to the "cynics and naysayers who doubted what we are doing". "Till September 2017, projects worth ₹21,500 crore were tendered. The value of the projects tendered since then is ₹1.22 lakh crore," he said and claimed that India's Smart City Mission is one of the fastest implemented pro-

jects in the world

This is only the beginning. As we become a \$10-trillion economy by 2030, we are not going to stop at 100 cities, we cannot. These 100 cities will become the template that this is how you do it," Puri said. On the Swachh Bharat

mission, Puri said the Government achieved the target of constructing five lakh community and public toilets well before the October 2, 2019 deadline.

The Minister added that the goal of constructing 67 lakh individual household toilets would be accomplished by next

India strikes back

Pre-emptive action on Jaish camp in Pakistan shows that India's counter-terrorism template has shifted quite a bit



nough is enough. For far too long, since the Kandahar hijacking, terrorism has cost us too much blood, muscle and tradeoffs, hit after hit. For far too long, since 2004, we have been providing reams of dossiers to Pakistan on terrorist havens operating in its territory though it dismissed them as non-state actors. For far too long, we have desisted from smashing terror bases on foreign soil though there have been precedents by the US no less of doing so for protecting American civilians, wondering if we would be on the right side of

law and fearing a hitback. So yesterday's pre-emptive air strike on a Jaish-e-Mohammed camp deep inside Pakistan, killing a "very large number" of terrorists, trainers and senior commanders of the outfit, was more than just decisive and proactive. It meant that India had freed itself of a psychological baggage. It meant that India had broken the curse of coercion and would ensure that terror would be met with equal counter-terror. It also showed that it would now stare down at Pakistan by denting its missile shield and the frontline of the proxy war — namely UN-proscribed terrorists like Jaish chief Masood Azhar. That it would henceforth keep an eagle eye on every terrorist camp Pakistan hosted, be it on a hilltop or forest, and strike with precise brute force when needed. And do it intelligently. So within hours of the strike, India launched an equally precise diplomatic offensive, briefing envoys and telling the world that the "intelligence-led operation" on Jaish's biggest training camp in Balakot became "absolutely necessary" as it was planning more suicide attacks in India. It calibrated its response, emphasising there weren't any civilian casualties or collateral damage, that it stayed clear of human habitation and Pakistan Army facilities and, hence, had stayed clear of an "act of war." More so, by mentioning that the camp was run by none other than Jaish chief Masood Azhar's kin, Yousuf Azhar, it pin-pointed that it went after a man who was on the global watchlist and was jumping a lookout notice. Which is why international reaction has been tepid, too, with even a China not going beyond asking both countries to "exercise restraint" henceforth. Clearly, we have the tacit support of the US, France, Israel, Russia and Iran.

In short, post Uri and Pulwama, there is a new template for our counter-terrorism approach. For there was a number of firsts. This was the first aerial attack where IAF jets evaded Pakistani air defences and dropped 1,000 kg bombs deep inside, showing that the whole of Pakistan was easily under India's attack arc, that it could jam even US radar systems that our neighbour prided in. By choosing a hidden away terror training camp, the IAF proved that it could smoke out the toughest targets. India even called the frequent nuclear bluff of Pakistan, which has claimed the right of escalation, but on paper is limited in its ability and funds to do so. Finally, we have successfully included the phrase "non-military, preemptive strike" into our lexicon, which leaves us with many options to beat nonstate actors that Pakistan has used to needle and provoke us. However, the airstrikes have also meant that hereon, there can be no lowering our guard and preparedness given an unpredictable Pakistan. It does have Chinese jets and F-16s with upgraded avionics. And with Jaish linked to Taliban, which is increasing its political footprint in the reason, Pakistan will but have to yield to pressure to react. Back home, the Modi government definitely has got some firepower prior to the general elections, positioning itself as a deliverer versus the pusillanimous leadership of decades, avenging Kandahar by targetting key plotter Yousuf Azhar and attempting some salve for Pulwama. As for the Opposition, the strikes certainly take the fizz out of the Rafale debate considering Mirage 2000, its precursor, is also made by Dassault and its capability has only reinforced why we need these jets. And though mahagathbandhan leaders saluted the IAF, fact is they will have trouble coming up with another emboldening, nationalist narrative.

Charging up policy

Several agencies want to set up charging stations in Delhi. But will that be enough to encourage electric vehicle sales?



here can be no doubt that the future of personal mobility inside urban areas will be electric. The only doubt is: How long will that take? And there is also the chicken and egg problem. What should come first? The electric cars or charging stations? Well, while some electric cars have already made it onto Delhi's roads, some charging stations are also being set up. Now, the New Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC), the Delhi Government and the Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL), an entity owned by

India's power public-sector units, are establishing several charging stations across the heart of the capital. This is a good start that must be celebrated and indeed emulated by other Indian cities. But now, it is the time for Indian car-makers to step up to the plate and start selling electric vehicles that buyers want to buy. It is public knowledge that both Maruti Suzuki and Hyundai Motor Company, the country's two largest car manufacturers, are going to launch proper electric vehicles this year that might entice buyers — an electric version of WagonR and the Hyundai Kona. Unlike some electric vehicles on offer in India today, these vehicles should be able to assuage buyers that they will have enough range. At the same time, work by the Urban Development and Power Ministries on encouraging home-owners to upgrade their infrastructure to allow charging at home through new policies is also being undertaken.

But we should not underestimate the scale of the challenge. Even with new charging stations across the capital. Delhi will have around a hundred charging points, whereas Beijing, where the Government has been building charging stations for a few years, will have four million for its fleet of electric vehicles. Also, more encouragement has to be given to electric two-wheelers across the country as these would be cheaper and an easy goal to implement. Work also remains to be done on improving India's electric grid infrastructure that can support electrification of vehicles, thanks to work over the past few years. India already produces enough and more power. But that leads to a different set of questions given that much of our power remains thermal and is not extremely clean. Electrification will just transfer the pollution problem from cities to rural areas. While much work has been done on renewables, the Raiasthan desert is now dotted with thousands of wind-power generators. We cannot make electrification a situation of 'emissions elsewhere' but thankfully, some serious thought is being put into the problem by every level of Government. At the same time, electrification should not become the single answer for curbing vehicular pollution. Other alternatives such as increased gasification, waste-to-energy solutions and hydrogen-fuelled vehicles must not be forgotten just because electricity leads the way.

n 1948, Pakistan's Ambassador to the United Nations, Sir Muhammad Zafarullah Khan, declared that on April 1, 1948 India turned off the water of the Indus river which used to flow into Pakistan... India exercised this control upon the waters of rivers flowing through its territory...India turned off every drop of water which Pakistan had formerly received.

Surprisingly, no one in the audience had the presence of mind to ask how can the flow of rivers be suddenly switched off like a tap in the kitchen? The Indus river system issue was, thus, raised first with a thunderous lie. Negotiations between India and Pakistan began thereafter but years were wasted in wrangling as to where, between officers of what qualifications and rank should be involved in the talks.

The river waters issue was dramati-cally articulated again by former Prime Minister of Pakistan, Huseyn Shaheed Suhrawardy, in 1957. In his words, quoted from the *Dawn* by Prof Shashi K Gulhati in his book, '*The Untiring Indian*', "Canal waters and Kashmir are the two prongs of India's grip on us. There is nothing we can do. India is so powerful that everybody wants to be its friend, including America. If Bharat decides to cut off water. Pakistan would be within cut off water, Parlstan would be within its rights to fight for water supply but stopping of water will be greater aggression than our fighting."

The distinctive feature of irrigation

development in this basin, during about 100 years preceding the Partition, was that a development of 26 million acres of intensive irrigation, by far the largest irrigated area on any one river system in the world, had been based entirely on the runof-the-river with no storage at all, rightly earning the compliment of being one of the proudest achievements of human endeavour. The first four years after Partition had been marked by abortive bilateral discussions between India and Pakistan, leavened with threats and recriminations. Then major developments took place in 1952. First, the World Bank, interested in the economic well-being of both countries offered to serve as a mediator to help solve the dispute.

A working party of engineers of India, Pakistan and the World Bank was constituted. The World Bank team consisted of tuted. The working party had begun its work long before. Everyone agreed on its ultimate objective. In the words of General Wheeler, it was to develop a comprehen-

sive long-range plan for the most effective utilisation of the total water resources of the Indus river system for the development of the region. Pakistan wanted the discussions to be limited to the three eastern rivers only, keeping the three western rivers totally for itself; India wanted to consider the flow in all the six rivers. The Pakistani plan comprised largely a statement of its irrigation requirements, which added up to three times the

on February 5, 1954, General Wheeler presented the World Bank's proposal. But not necessarily from the same source as before. It divided the six rivers into two parts. All the water of the three east-ern rivers would be for the exclusive use of India. And all the water of the three western rivers (Indus, Ihelum and Chenab) would be for Pakistan except for some specific with-drawals allowed to India. The World Bank proposal

presented in February 1954, stipulated that: (1) The entire flow of water of the three east-ern rivers would be for the exclusive use and benefit of India after a brief transition period during which Pakistan will construct link canals that

would bring water from the western rivers to replace the water then being supplied to its canals by the eastern rivers and India would contribute funds for the construction of these link canals; and, (2) the flow of water of the three western rivers would be largely for the use and benefit of Pakistan.

Six years later, when the Indus Waters Treaty was signed, India could irrigate annually 70,000 acres from the Indus, 400,000 acres from the Jhelum and 231,000 acres from the Chenab, over and above the uses as on April 1960, and, according to Gulhati's book, could impound, for specified purpos es, 3.0 million acre feet on the tributaries of the western rivers and 0.6 MAF on the Chenab main, apart from storage in small tanks and for flood control in the Jhelum main. This is the maximum quantity of water India's latest decision can cause Pakistan to lose.

Pakistan never wanted that a solution to the Indus waters dispute should emerge through negotiations. It was not inclined to view the problem as a technical one. It wanted to take the issue to the International Court of Justice and seek adjudication. If not

that, then it would try to push India into seeking a solution through arbitration. India, however, did not wish anyone or a group, least of all those who were not familiar with the technicalities of river basin development, to thrust a solution upon it.

It soon became apparent,

however, that bilateral dialogue with Pakistan was not making any progress and so when the World Bank offered its good offices to assist the two countries to negotiate a settle-ment, it accepted that offer.

The key point in accepting the Bank's offer was that it would serve as a good officer that is a facilitator and not assume the role of an arbiter The World Bank most admirably stuck to this role for many years and went through very difficult times. Even when it seemed that negotiations were on the verge of a breakdown, it urged the two sides to contin-ue the dialogue. After six years of playing such a role, in early 1960, the Bank began to see the light at the end of the tunnel.

In a reply in the Lok Sabha, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru asked: "How is this House now to judge the quantum of supply or the quantum of money to be given? I confess I cannot judge it off-hand. I am distressed that a matter of this importance, an issue that concerns not only the present but the future should be treated so lightly and casually and in such a narrow minded spirit."

Give other half the right to live

Being migratory workers, those in the informal economy have been denied their due. It's time the Government takes note of this valuable social capital

he 16th Lok Sabha's five-year tenure came to an end on February 13 and political leaders said goodbye to each other in a rare bonhomie and are now getting ready for the Parliamentary elections scheduled to be held in May. The Indian polity remained embroiled in the Rafale deal and other superficial issues for most part of the year; though the NDA Government did give some parting gifts in the interim Budget to the farmers and the poor people, who largely constitute a work force in the unorganised sector. It's time to discuss what major political parties like the BJP and the Congress are going to offer to the unorganised workers, who constitute about 90 per cent of the work force and according to the National Commission for Enterprises in the Unorganised Sector, contribute 50 per cent to the GDP. India is the fifth largest economy of the world today and is poised to climb further to the third position. But did our planners think about the plight and acute hardship this group of people faces almost everyday? They constitute a solid vote bank of more than 45 crore and are mostly engaged in agriculture, construction and other such activities. Of these, the condition of migratory construction workers is very pitiable.

This writer had recently interacted with migrant workers from Madhya Pradesh during an extremely cold day in January. The workers said that they had to suffer from cold while living in plastic huts and that they had been cooking and bathing in the open for the past two months. They were working for the Noida Authority's civil works department and their wages varied from ₹400 to ₹500. Their condition reflected the lack of application of mind and a gross uncaring attitude to human welfare while planning for developmental activities. The construction industry plays a major role in the economic growth of the nation and occupies a pivotal position in its developmental plans, valued as it is at around ₹9 lakh crore. These are the people who toil hard to make big mansions, beautiful roads, swanky offices and posh residential colonies but themselves lead a precarious life under the open sky.

Largely being migratory workers, they are denied voting rights.

They are either landless or small farmers, who come to urban areas with their children in search of a better livelihood, seasonal employment but get trapped. Most of them are vulnerable to diseases. Around 30 per cent of the construction workers in India are women, mostly working as head loader or unskilled worker. Many are even unaware about their legal rights during an accident at work, which has become a regular phenomenon now. Several cases of deaths and injuries are reported due the laxity of contractors and unscrupulous builders, many of whom are spurious and play with human life in their greed for money. Yet another group of people are the mine workers. The gory incident in Meghalaya, where 15 coal miners were trapped in a rat-hole mine, must be our conscience call. It was such a horrific incident that the miners' bodies could not be retrieved. In a recent report, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Labour highlighted the plight of the unorganised sector workers. It is high time that political parties take cognisance of this most valuable social capital of the nation. They are much more in numbers than all the unions members put together but they have no voice.

It is essential to discuss issues that concern the livelihoods of these people. The Government must first classify the unorganised sector by occupation — agriculture, construction (rural and urban), service or manufacturing and nature of employment among others. It must then scrutinise the problems for each category. The most important issue is their exploitation due to poor wages, which is compounded with low productivity compared to the formal sector. They have seasonal jobs and are absent from social security systems due to poor human capital base in terms of education, skill and training. It would be in the fitness of things that the Government announces a separate national programme for different segments, particularly agriculture, construction and ones who are self-employed. New laws must be devised if existing laws do not support providing them basic necessities of life

The skill development programme must include these segments with an emphasis on personality development. Laws must have the provision for a decent shelter with basic civic amenities like clean water, sanitation, protection from extreme heat and cold in their living space, proper medical facilities, child care and legal remedies. Insurance companies can be be roped in. It would be worthwhile to provide earmarked housing on nominal rental basis for seasonal workers for which the Government should take action. To give a fillip to their welfare, a national commission on unorganised sector should be constituted to suggest a road-map for social security at par with the organised sector, structure welfare modules and review legal redress mechanisms

When cash is the king

Since cash flows are important for the smooth running of businesses, one should focus on improving and managing them and develop strategies to counter emergencies

hen it comes to business, be it small or large, cash is the king, always. Whether V a business is growing or struggling, man-aging cash flow effectively is absolutely essential and for many, it's the key to business survival. The importance of cash can be understood from the fact that over 60 per cent of businesses that fail are still profitable but they just ran out of cash.
On overusing the working capital, a business

can witness a cash crunch that can prevent pay-ments to its suppliers, purchase of raw materials and salary payments to its employees. Delay between the time when a business pays to its sup-pliers and when money is received from the customers is the problem. This requires effective cash flow management to survive and grow. Therefore, maintaining a level of working capital, that allows a business to make it through crunch times and continue operating the business, is crucial. Simply put, cash flow management means delaying outlays of cash as long as possible while encouraging customers to pay as quickly as possible.

So, what is cash flow? It's basically the move-

ment of funds in and out of one's business. Typically, businesses track cash flow either weekly, monthly or quarterly. Essentially, there are two kinds of cash flows: A positive cash flow occurs when cash entering into the business from sales, accounts receivables and so on is more than the amount of cash leaving the businesses through accounts payable, monthly expenses and employee salaries. A negative cash flow is just the opposite situation and occurs when the cash out-flow is greater than incoming cash. This generally means trouble for a business.

It is not possible, however, to look at the prof-

it and loss statement (P&L) and get a grip on cash flows. Many other financial figures feed into factoring cash flows, including accounts receivable, inventory, accounts payable, capital expenditures, and taxation. Effective cash flow management requires a laser focus on each of these drivers of cash in addition to profit or loss. Rules of accounting define profit simply as revenue minus expenses. However, a smart business owner understands the fact that whether one earned profit or not is not the same as knowing what happened to your cash. An astute businessman should know when the business will become profitable, not because it will affect the cash flow — because it won't but because it gives one an early goal to strive for and a ready-made target for projecting future cash flow. Negative cash flow and negative profits make for a grim combination. Focus your efforts on managing cash flow with an eye towards reaching that

moment when you realise your first profits.

Since cash flows are very important for the smooth running of any business, one should always focus on improving and managing cash flow and develop strategies to manage problems:

Short-term financing: This type of business

financing such as a line of credit can be used to make emergency purchases or to bridge the gap between payables and receivables. Many banks issue business credit cards that can be used to pay vendors

Long-term financing: Large asset purchases such as equipment and real estate should usually be financed with long-term loans rather than with working capital. This allows a business to spread payments over the average life of the asset.

Speed up recovery of receivables: The main mantra of any business should be to bill early and collect quickly. To guard against late payments, bill as early as possible and make those invoic-

es as clear and detailed as possible. Instead of waiting until the end of the month, generate an invoice as soon as the goods or services are delivered. For big orders, one can consider progressive invoicing while the goods are manufac-tured or services delivered. It's easy to lose track and then neglect to follow up on an overdue account. Experience shows that the longer one remains out of contact with a customer, the less likely he/she is able to recover the amount owed. One can even incentivise customers who pay

their bills rapidly by offering discounts

Liquidate cash tied up with assets: Does your business have equipment that is no longer in use or inventory that's becoming obsolete? Consider selling it to pecoming obsolete: Consider seiling it to generate quick cash. Idle, obsolete and non-working equipment takes up space and ties up capital, which can be used more productively. Equipment that has been owned for a longer period will usu-ally have a book value equal to its salvage value or less. So a sale might result in a value or less. So, a sale might result in a taxable gain. Excess inventory can quick-ly become obsolete and worthless as customer requirements change and new materials are introduced. Consider selling any inventory, which is unlikely to be used over the next 12 months, unless the costs to retain it are minimal and the pro-

costs to retain it are minimal and the pro-ceeds from a sale would be negligible. **Delay your payables:** This may sound obvious but is often neglected. Unless there's a worthwhile incentive to pay early, figure out how late you can pay your vendors without risking late fees or

harming your relationship. This keeps the cash in your account and out of your vendor's until it absolutely has to be there. Identify business risks and prepare

in advance: There are many risks involved in running a business. Serious challenges should be expected at some point in the future. You need to consider a number of scenarios such as "What if a big order suddenly comes in?" "What if a big order is cancelled?" or "What if that important client goes missing while still owing me money"? This kind of risk analysis should become a part of the cash flow budgeting process

Monitor inventory efficiently: Analyse inventory movement to determine which items are selling and which ones are duds that soak up working capital. Try to keep inventory levels lean so

that working capital isn't tied up unproductively and unprofitably.

Always keep buffer money: Once the break-even point is found, one must ensure that the business has enough cash ensure that the business has enough cash to fund working capital needs. It's advised to keep three months worth of outgoings in the bank for a rainy day. That may be a thing of the past but if that's the case, make sure you have a buffer of some sort, either personal funds available or an overdraft or revolving credit focility. credit facility.

Implement better systems to manage cash flow: Many businessmen pro-crastinate to invoice customers. Some do not invoice as soon as they deliver the product or services or do it just at the month end. Many do not even know how much is owed to them by their customers or how much they owe to suppliers.

If you are one of them, it's time to start implementing an efficient process

to manage cash flow. You can use a simple spreadsheet or an accounting software. But its important to have some sys-

Cut costs, control cash outflows: The best way to control cash flow is to stay on top of expenses. When we start making profits, we often tend to ignore cost-cutting opportunities. Unmanaged outflow could be a silent business killer.

Do not focus on profit but on cash flow: It has been found that 90 per cent of SMEs do not have a cash flow plan from day one, despite having forecasts of profit margins for years ahead. This is a common reason for early business failure. If cash flow is in order, profit will be in order. A lot of businesses do not make it past six months. They might have been a profitable business eventually but they

need to have good cash flow to survive. Young businesses should work with reliable, quick-paying clients initially, even if it means smaller clients and slim-mer profits margins. Small business owners should learn one principle early in the life: Cash is king. Building and keeping an adequate stockpile of cash provides maximum opportunity and flexibility to any business while enabling

owners to sleep soundly at night.
Without cash, profits are meaningless. Many profitable businesses on paper have ended up in bankruptcy because the amount of cash coming in doesn't compare with the amount of cash going out. Firms that don't exercise good cash management may not be able to make the investments needed to compete, or they may have to pay more to borrow money to function.

unending battle for statehood

Arvind Kejriwal has, perhaps, chosen a wrong time to press for full statehood for Delhi as wounds of the Pulwama attack have not healed yet. It would be better if he highlights his achievements in health, education and power sectors

elhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is back with his old game of street-level confronta-tion with the Union Government as a part of his political strategy. This time, his indefinite fast — that was supposed to start from March 1, but has been postponed — is to get full statehood for Delhi. Can he achieve this objective? It looks difficult because no party at the Centre wants to give full statehood to Delhi.

In the last two decades, both the BJP and the Congress have promised statehood to the capital city but when they came to power at the Centre, the issue took a backseat. Delhi being a special State, its land and law and order come under the purview of the Union Home Ministry. The Chief Minister wants them under his Government's control but the Centre will never part with these powers as there are several hiccups — financial and political.

Like West Bengal Chief Minister

Mamata Banerjee, Kejriwal is best at confrontational politics. There has been a constant tussle between him and the Centre ever since the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Government came to power in 2015. Earlier in his first term, he went on *dharna* and even held Cabinet meetings near the Rail

Bhavan on the pavement.

Last week, Kejriwal declared in the Assembly: "From March 1, I will begin a hunger strike. I am going to fast till we get statehood. I am ready to face death." The demand was one of the promises made by AAP in the run-up to the 2015 Assembly polls. "Ab aar ya paar ki ladai hai (this is going to be a decisive battle)," the Chief Minister said, announcing his decision. Prior to that, Kejriwal had declared in public meetings that if the AAP got seven out of seven seats in the Delhi Lok Sabha battle, his party would ensure that Delhi got statehood within two years.



Kejriwal is also prodding the people of Delhi to come to the streets to participate in the agitation for statehood.

The immediate provocation for this decision was the Supreme Court's verdict last week, which held that the Centre and not the Delhi Government had the power to order investigations against corrupt officers in the capital. The court also left the decision to a higher Bench as to who should control the officers. Prior to that, in July last year, a five-judge Constitution Bench ruled that Delhi cannot be accorded the status of a State but said the Lieutenant-Governor has no "independent decision-making power" and must act on the "aid and advice" of the elected Government. Keiriwal is not happy with these

judicial pronouncements. Therefore, he is building up this issue as a part of his campaign for the upcoming Lok Sabha poll and also to divert public's attention from his Government's failures. He claimed that statehood would provide two lakh jobs in the Delhi Government, *pucca* houses for every Delhiite, regularisation of contractual Government employees and new schools and universities.
Though Delhi is going for polls

in 2020, Kejriwal's compulsion is to raise the issue now because of the parliamentary polls. AAP has performed well on sectors like health, education, water, electricity and unauthorised colonies and is quite sure of support from the lower middle class and poorer sections but Kejriwal is not sure about prospects in the Lok Sabha poll. What better way than sit in *dharna* on behalf of the people. This way, he can impress on the people that he is the only one who is taking care of their interests. Second, Kejriwal may also need a

face-saving formula at some point of time later if he continues with the fast He knows he can expect Banerjee and Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, with whom he is on excellent terms, to come to Delhi and persuade him to end the indefinite fast. Are they not together in the proposed mahagathbandhan? He has come much closer to them and this is a part of taking on the Centre. They are all equally interested in embarrassing the Modi Government.

Kejriwal is not the only one fighting the Centre as Puducherry Chief Minister V Narayanasamy, too, has been locked in a turf war with Lt Governor Kiran Bedi over the latter's negative attitude towards various proposals of his govern-ment. He had been sitting in *dhar*na since February 13, outside the Raj Bhavan, demanding that the Lt Governor approve his cabinet's pro-

Kejriwal should realise that confrontational politics will not get him anywhere. The country is tense after the Pulwama terror attack and he has chosen a wrong time to press for his demands. What happens if a limited war with Pakistan starts before that? What is important is governance and this is where he is weak though he puts the blame on the Centre for his failures. Pressing for Delhi's statehood is something that cannot happen in a day. Kejriwal should realise the difficulties on the road to it. As a Chief Minister, his

Fiscal deficit touched 121.5 per cent of the full-year revised target of ₹6.34 lakh crore at the end of January on account of lower revenue collections, Government data showed on Tuesday.

The fiscal deficit, or the gap between the Government's expenditure and revenue, stood at ₹7.70 lakh crore during April-January of the current financial year ending March.

At the end of January 2018, the deficit was 113.7 per cent of the Revised Estimate (RE).

lakh crore in 2018-19, from 3.53 per cent in the previous financial year.

However, in the Interim Budget 2019-20, the fiscal deficit was revised upwards marginally to 3.4 per cent of GDP or over ₹6.34 lakh crore, on account of additional outlay of ₹20,000 crore for funding income scheme for small

Reliance Industries chair-man Mukesh Ambani has broken into the top 10 richest list globally with a networth of \$54 billion, while his younger brother Anil has paled into the oblivion having lost over 65

oblivion naving lost over 65 percent of his networth, according to a report.

The Hurun Global Rich List 2019 is topped by Amazon chief Jeff Bezos for the second year in a row, while the senior Ambani is placed 10th with a network of ₹3.83 lakh crore, thanks to a rally in RIL shares, which had topped the ₹8-lakh-crore-mark last month. Ambani owns almost 52 per-

Anil Ambani, held in contempt of court by the Supreme Court last week for not paying up Ericsson ₹540 crore, has lost over \$5 billion, from \$7 billion seven years ago to \$1.9 billion this year, even though both the brothers got off with more or less same amount of inherited wealth.

"Having started off similarly after the break-up of the fami-ly wealth, Mukesh added \$30 billion to his wealth in the past seven years, while Anil has lost over \$5 billion during the same

period," says the Hurun report. The other wealthiest Indians are Hinduja group chairman SP Hinduja with networth of \$21 billion, Wipro chairman Azim Premji is at third with a networth of \$17

billion, says the report released Tuesday.

Cyrus S Poonawalla, chair-man of the Poonawalla group that run Serum Institute, with a networth of \$13 billion is not only ranked as the fourth richest Indian but also breaks into the top 100 global ranking.

Steel giant ArcelorMittal's Lakshmi Mittal stands at fifth position, followed by Kotak Mahindra's Uday Kotak (\$11 billion), Gautam Adani (\$9.9 billion) and Sun Pharma's Dilip Shanghvi (\$9.5 billion).

Cyrus Pallonji Mistry and Shapoorji Pallonji Mistry, both with wealth of \$9.5 billion each come in the ninth and the 10th position, respectively, thanks to their 18.4 percent holding in the country's largest conglomerate Tata group.

According to the list, Smita Crishna, a third- generation heir of the Godrej family, tops the female billionaire list with a networth of \$6.1 billion, while Kiran Mazumdar Shaw of Biocon is the richest self-made female entrepreneur ranked 671 with a wealth of \$3.5 billion. 

RBI proposes tight relief norms for private, foreign banks

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Seeking to curb excessive salary payout practices, the Reserve Bank has proposed strict compensation norms for senior officials of private as well as foreign banks, including minimum 50 per cent variable component and money clawback provisions.

Floating a discussion paper, the central bank has also proposed that variable pay of CEO and whole-time directors, among other key personnel, should be "capped at 200 per cent of fixed pay". Earlier variable pay was capped at 70 per cent of fixed pay but did not include Employee Stock Option Plan (ESOP).

High pay packets and excessive risk-taking ways in the banking industry have been under the scanner ever since the global financial crisis of 2008. Employees were too often rewarded for increasing short-term profit without adequate recognition of the risks and long-term consequences for their organisations.

The latest discussion paper proposing changes to compensation norms comes more than seven years after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued such guidelines for private and foreign banks. "These (2012) guidelines are being reviewed, with an objective to better align with FSB (Financial Stability Board) Principles and Implementation Standards, based on experience and evolving international best practices," the RBI said.

Apart from CEOs and whole-time directors, the proposed changes in

ESOPs should be included as a component of variable pay.

The proposed guidelines also said minimum 50 per cent of variable pay is to be via non-cash component while mandating a compulsory deferral mechanism for variable pay, regardless

of quantum of variable pay.
"It should be ensured that there is a proper balance between fixed pay and variable pay. The total variable pay shall be limited to a maximum of 200 per cent of the fixed pay (for the relative

"Within this ceiling, at higher levels of responsibility, the proportion of variable pay should be higher. The deterioration in the financial performance of the bank should generally lead to a contraction in the total amount of variable compensation paid," the discussion paper said. Further, the paper said banks are required to put in place appropriate modalities to incorporate "malus/ clawback mechanism" in respect of variable pay, taking into account relevant statutory and regula-

tory stipulations as applicable.
"Wherever the assessed divergence in bank's asset classification or provisioning from the RBI norms exceeds the prescribed threshold for public disclosure, the bank shall not pay the unvested portion of the variable compensation for the assessment year under 'malus' clause," it added.

A malus arrangement permits a

bank to prevent vesting of all or part of the amount of a deferred remuneration. A clawback, on the other hand, is a contractual agreement between the employee and the bank in which the employee agrees to return previously paid or vested remuneration to the

These perverse incentives amplified the excessive risk taking that severely threatened the global financial system. The compensation issue has therefore, been at the centre stage of the regulatory reforms," it said.

The Financial Stability Forum

(later the Financial Stability Board) in 2009 brought out a set of Principles and Implementation Standards on sound compensation practices.

The guidelines have been pro

posed for private sector banks, including Local Area Banks, Small Finance Banks and Payments Banks. For the foreign banks operating in India by way of Wholly Owned Subsidiary structure, the guidelines would be same as that for private sector banks in the country

Sensex ends 240 pts lower on rising India-Pak tension

The benchmark BSE Sensex Tuesday ended 240 points lower as investor sentiment weakened after the India carried out air strikes on a terrorist camp in Pakistan

Weak cues from global equities and selling pressure on financials and realty stocks too weighed on market mood here. After cracking nearly 500 points, the 30-share Sensex pared some losses but ended 239.67 points. or 0.66 per cent, lower at 35,973.71. It hit a low of 35,714.16 and a high of 36,172.52. The gauge surged 342 points in Monday's trade. The 50-share Nifty also fell 44.80 points, or 0.41 per cent, to 10,835.30 after hovering between 10,729.30 and 10,888.75. Losses were more pronounced in banking, realty and PSU counters.

"Indian indices traded lower mainly due to two factors - first, the indications of weakness from all major Asian markets since their opening; and second, the strike carried out by the Indian Air Force against terrorist camps located inside Pakistan," said Joseph Thomas,

Head Research, Emkay Wealth Management.
While the former may be considered reflective of the evolving broader global perspective, the latter may have limited or transient impact on the market direction, he said, adding that markets may remain quite volatile in the coming days, especially, in the light of

the fast approaching general elections.

The Indian Air Force struck Jaish-e-Mohammed's (JeM) biggest camp in Pakistan early Tuesday in a major "reemptive" action, killing a large number of terrorists and trainers of the Pak-based terror group preparing to carry out suicide attacks in India. The move came 12 days after JeM carried out the Pulwama attack in

Meanwhile, the rupee which depreciated 38 paise to 71.35 against the US dollar in early trade, recovered partially to quote at 71.06 in late afternoon trade at the forex market, and was still trading 9 paise lower over its previous close of 70.97.

INDIAN E-COMMERCE MARKET TO TOUCH USD 84 BILLION IN 2021

New Delhi: The fast growing e-commerce market in the country will touch USD 84 billion in 2021 from USD 24 billion in 2017 on account of a healthy growth in organised retail sector, a report said on Tuesday. A fast growing economy and robust demographics provide a positive outlook to the consumer businesses in India, the report by Deloitte India and Retail Association of India said. These factors will fuel the retail market growth in the country, making India the third largest retail market in Asia and fourth largest in the world, it said. The retail market in India is expected to grow to USD 1.2 trillion by 2021 from USD 795 billion in 2017, it said. "Further, as the internet penetration in the country increases and more international retailers start operating in India, the share of organised retail market is expected to increase from 12 per cent in 2017 to 22-25 per cent by 2021. "This will also be driven by the growth of e-commerce market from USD 24 billion in 2017 to USD 84 billion in 2021," the report said. The report titled 'Unravelling the Indian Consumer' said increasing online shopping, smartphone usage and internet penetration across semi-urban and rural segments would help boost the sales. "India continues to hold a strong position as far as its market potential is concerned and is on its way to becoming the third largest consumer market in the world, poised to grow close to USD 1.2 trillion by 2021," Anil Talreja, Partner, Deloitte India said. Given the strong retail and consumer outlook, India is expected to witness redefining trends in the consumer market which will shape the future of the retail industry, the report said. It added that consumer experience will be the key focus of the companies. "Against the backdrop of the Indian and global economies that set the stage for achieving globalisation, innovation, M&A activity, and increased digitalisation, consumer companies are likely to continue to reinterpret traditional levers to stimulate growth in a competitive business environment," it said

JIO TO BECOME NO.1 TELECOM OPERATOR THIS YEAR: REPORTS

New Delhi: Billionaire Mukesh Ambani's telecom venture Reliance Jio will this year become India's No.1 telco in terms of both subscriber base and revenue, brokerages Bernstein and Credit Suisse said in separate reports on Tuesday. Jio, which stormed into the sector in 2016 by offering free voice calls and dirt cheap data on mobile phones, is reporting net profit and a positive return on invested capital was due to "non-standard depreciation metrics" and subsidies on selling bundled JioPhones being booked through Reliance Retail, Bernstein said. "Our high-level attempt to normalise these factors points to a potential loss of ₹ 15,000 crore in FY2019. Far worse than Bharti's or Vodafone Idea's," it said. Jio using non-standard depreciation and amortisation has been report-ed previously as well and the regulators have found nothing wrong with such reporting. Bernstein said it is making this point only to highlight that Reliance will ultimately want to make a positive return on its investment which will require a reduction in handset subsidies and a boost in subscriber revenue. "We expect average revenue per user (ARPUs) to eventually start to rise to enable this," it

India bombed and destroyed Jaish-e-Mohammed's biggest training camp in Pakistan early Tuesday,

killing a "very large number" of terrorists, trainers and senior commanders, officials said in

New Delhi.
On India's assertion that it was a "non-military pre-emptive strikes" directed against training camps of the terrorist groups who are carrying out violent acts in India, Lu said, "as for India's claim on taking action against terrorism, well fighting terrorism is a global practice". "It needs necessary international cooperation. India needs to create favourable condition interna-

tionally for the same," he said. To another question, he said Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Muhammad Qureshi has spoken to his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi on the Pulwama terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir. "During the phone call, Wang listened carefully to Pakistan foreign minister's noti-fication and proposals on the issues and reaffirmed his opinion that the two sides need to advance their cooperation in the counter terrorism for peace and stability in the region," the

Mohammed Javad Zarif's

resignation sent shockwaves through Iran, where tensions are already running high over America's withdraw from the nuclear deal he helped negotiate with President Hassan Rouhani.

The Tehran stock market dropped 1,927 points Tuesday, down some 1.16 percent. The Iranian rial, which has rapidly depreciated amid uncertainty over the deal's future, stood around 135,600 rials to \$1. It had been 32,000 to the dollar at

the time of the deal.

The state-run IRNA news agency said Zarif told colleagues his resignation would aid in "restoring the ministry to its legal position in foreign relations." The remark appeared to be aimed at other bodies with-in Iran's government. Zarif was not present for a meeting with Syrian President Bashar Assad on Monday. Assad was warmly received

by Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei as well as Gen. Qassem Soleimani, the commander of an elite unit of the Revolutionary Guard.

Later on Tuesday, and with-out mentioning the resignation, Rouhani praised Zarif as well as Oil Minister Bijan Zanganeh and Central Bank chief Abdolnasser Hemmati as soldiers on the battlefield against US pressure.



The SAT/ACT is no longer necessary for taking admission in over 800 US colleges and universities. ABHISHEK SINGHAL tells aspirants if the exam is still valid

he Chicago University recently announced that its inter-national students do not have any mandatory requirements to report SAT or ACT scores. Many other universities have eased out the SAT requirements over the years, and we expect that in another three-five years it would mostly be done away with.
As it is, SAT/ ACT scores are

not an important criterion when it comes to admissions in top universities in US. While most universities say that they do not have a recommended range of SAT scores and many good universities have varied SAT/ACT scores among their successful student applicants, going down to even extremely low scores like 1200/1600. Plus, SAT is one among the many parameters that a university judges an applicant upon. A case in point is MIT, among the most rigorous selection process. The MIT engineering applicants get selected from a range of criterion ranging from a research project, makers' portfolio, humanities and art portfolio, academics over a four-year time horizon, SAT/ACT scores, co-curricular and extracurricular activities including leadership positions, sports and athletic ability, etc. All of them (and some more) coalesce to create the unique story for each of the applicant which gets you in. Clearly, SAT is a very small portion of this story and as such should not be overemphasized. Chicago University's

decision is just another validation of the point that is veering US universities away from generalised tests like SAT/ACT.

There are some definite advan-tages of a generalised test score like SAT/ACT for a university. Clearly, not all boards or marking philoso-phies are similar. IB, A levels, different boards corresponding to countries/States — there are so many variations that it is extremely hard for someone to assess a student on a common yardstick. In such a scenario, generalised test scores provide a ready escape and give universities a common way of assessing a person's academic capability. To that extent, as a common platform to assess students across variety of parameters, SAT/ACT scores remain a meaningful mech-

However, SAT/ACT testing suffer from the same problems that any test suffers from. It captures a student's performance on a given day which may not capture his poten-tial/capacity correctly because of a number of reasons. Poor or exceptional test taking ability (not potential), it being a bad/good day, the test itself are amongst the many variables that leave the outcome from the test circumspect and indicative at best! Universities are cognizant of this and a blip in the form of SAT/ACT performance on a given day as opposed to a different story in your overall academic profile would not get undue weightage. Additionally,

SAT/ACT allow you multiple opportunities to improve your score so the performance on a given day would not determine your future. An entrance system which is holistic has anyways been assessing

performance and potential across a range of parameters for a very long period of time. Giving the assessors one less variable (SAT/ACT scores) would not impact their ability to judge. A good example is the ability of the same assessors to validate the narratives and applications of 'home-schooled' students. In these cases, application-assessors don't have access to much of standardized data that any normal school students have. Despite that they have been able to successfully assess and roll-out offers to many of these students. In fact, Stanford, Cornell and many of the top IVYs have rolled out record number of offers to home-schooled students. Again, this is clearly indicative of the fact that schools will judge your capability with or without SAT/ACT

Many of our students have been very adventurous with their SAT scores. Some of the flat-out refused to take the SAT tests - one of them shared the link of the business that she had created (a 5 MM \$ business at the time of her application), another posted the code of a successful algorithm that he had sold to Airbnb. In each of these cases (and many more), the application was extremely powerful (notwithstanding the lack of SAT/ACT scores.) Consequently, these students received admits from some of the top universities including Stanford, Cornell, UPenn, MIT and Princeton.

Apart from Engineering, if you look at Economics and Design applications, the relative value of SAT/ACT scores become increasingly clear. While it can be argued that in the case of design applications, there is an art portfolio that gives a sense of the student's capability; that is not the case with Economics/Business applications. Most students do not take subject SATs and while many still take the general SAT/ACT, it seems counter-intuitive to think that SAT/ACT scores determine entry. More so, when many of the top scorers receiving as high as 1580/1600 were denied admis-

In summary, we posit that your narrative determines your entry to a university and not your SAT/ACT scores. These scores are value additive in so much as they (may) support your story but nothing more than that.

Our general advice, therefore is to focus on building your story
— something which is more durable and harder than getting better SAT/ACT scores. That is what shall get you into a great uni-


With the series on the line, it remains to be seen if Dhawan is brought back into the side to open alongside Rohit Sharma or the team retains the opening combination which featured in Vizag.

In between Charlesworth plied his trade in Australian Football League as Performance Consultant with Freemantle Football Club, while until 2002 Oltmans was the Technical Director of Dutch football team NAC Breda.

"Who knows what happens in future? You might see me exploring options in football. In Europe, switching from hockey to football coaching and vice versa is quite common. You have Bernhard Peters, Charlesworth and Oltmans for example," Harendra said.
