## Japanese firm developing AIDS vaccine

TOKYO - DNAVEC Corp., a
venture firm based in Tsukuba,
Japan, has begun developing a new
AIDS vaccine in cooperation with
the International AIDS Vaccine
Initiative (IAVI), the world's largest
institution for AIDS study and pre-
vention, sources said Saturday.
The companys's prototype vac-
cine has been highly effective in
animal experiments. DNAVEC
plans to improve the product to
start clinical tests on humans in
about three earrs.

worldwide are working on a vaccine
for AIDS, none has been developed

cine not only prevented AIDS infeccine not only prevented AIDS infec-
tions, but also slowed the reprotions, but also slowed the repro-
duction of the virus in monkeys duction of the virus in m
that were already infected. IAVI, DNAVEC's partner in
project, is a New York-based insti
tution that receives major finan tution that receives major finan-

Microsoft Corp. Chairman Bill Gates.
IAVI IAVI will provide billions of yen for development costs from the

IAvI has conducted clinical tests of six types of AIDS vaccines in other countries, including Thailand. However, DNAVEC's vaccine
is expected to provide a longer prois expected to provide a longer pro-
tection period than other vaccines, tection period than other vaccin

Thompson cooperated with White House during Watergate investigation

WASHINGTON-Fred Thomp-
son gained an image as a t tough-
minded investigative counsel for the
Senate Watergate committee. Yet
President Nixon and his top aides
viewed the fellow Republican as a
willing, if not too bright, ally, accord-
ing to White House tapes.
Thompson, now preparing a bid
for the 2008 GOP presidential nom--
ination, won fame in 1973 for asking
a committee witness the bombshell
question that revealed Nixon had
installed hidden listening devices and
taping equipment in the Oval Office.
Those tapes show Thompson
played a behind-the-scenes role
that was very different from his
public image three decades ago.

He comes across as a partisan will-
ing to cooperate with the Nixon White House's effort to discre It was Thompson who tipped
off the White House that the Senate committee knew about the tapes. They eventually cinched
Nixon's downfall in the scandal Nixon's downfall in the scandal
resulting from the break-in at resulting from the break-in at
Democratic headquarters in the

#### Abstract

WASHINGTON - Momentum is building in Congress for overhauling farm subsidies because of tight budgets and increasing enthusiasm for renewable fuels and conervation programs. Major change will not come eas- ily. The current farm bill, which expires in September, provides payments and other help to supplement farmers' incomes, support crop prices farmers' incomes, support crop prices and manage supplies. Any cuts in and manage supplies. Any cuts subsidies will face resistance. President Bush sought similar reductions upon taking office. But he made little headway in the latest farm bill, w Since then, Democrats have regained control of the House and energy prices have skyrocketed, leading to more calls for ethanol, which is derived from plants. Record prices for corn and other crops have

$\frac{\text { Associated Press }}{\text { WASHINGTON - President }}$ Bush accused Democratic lawmakers on Saturday of being unable to live up to their duties, citing Congress' the federal government he federal government. responsibility to make tough decisions and spend the people's money wisely," Bush said in his weekly radio
address. "This moment is a test." The White House has said the failure of a broad immigration overhaul was proof that Democraticcontrolled Capitol Hill cannot take
on major issues. "We saw this with on major issues. "We saw this with mith some other issues where Congress is having an inability to take on major challenges," spokesman

Tony Fratto said.
The main reason the immigration measure died, however, was staunch opposition from Bush's own base conservatives. The president could

third of West Virginia's adults were diagnosed with some form of arthritis in 2005, the highest prevalence in The Mountain State also continues to struggle with high rates of obesiension, according to the latest Behavioral Risk Factor Survey Reportfrom the state Bureau for Public Health. The report is based on data collected from
telephone surveys in 2004 and 2005 . telephone surveys in 2004 and 2005.
Nearly one-fourth of adults considered their health to be either fair or poor - 23.5 percent in 2004 and 24.7 percent in 2005. That assessseniors, those with the least education or those with the lowest household incomes, the report said.
West Virginia's obesity rate West Virginia's obesity rate
jumped from 27.6 percent in 2004 to 30.6 percent in 2005, and was the third-highest rate in the nation both years. Obesity has increased substantially since 1987 , the report said.
"Men and women from a wide Men and women from a wide categories contributed to this unhealthy trend," the report said. Poor nutrition and lack of exer-
cise are prevalent in the state, Eighty cise are prevalent in the state. Eighty
percent of adults don't eat enough vegetables and fruits, ranking the state seventh in the nation for this risk factor. About one-fourth of adults - 24.5 percent in 2004 and 28.5
percent in 2005 - were not physically active during leisure time. Tobacco use also persists in West
Virginia. More than 26 percent of Virginia. More than 26 percent of
adults in both 2004 and 2005 smoked adults in both 2004 and 2005 smoked
cigarettes, the second-highest rate in the nation in 2004 and the fourthhighest rate in 2005.
However, alcohol consumption is not a big problem. West Virginia
ranked 50th in 2004 and 49 th in 2005 for heavy drinking. Only 2.9 percent of West Virginia adults reported heavy drinking in 2004 . That rate rose slightly to

After progress threatened existence, black bear thriving

CHARLESTON - A half a cen-
tury ago, schoolchildren across
West Virginia helped select the
black bear as the state animal,
despite the fact there were only
about 500 of the bruins statewide.
Now state officials say a change
in attitude has helped the animal
thrive in West Virginia and sur-
rounding states. The rebound has
been a boon to bear hunting enthu-
siasts as decades-old hunting restric-
tions put in place to protect the
animal have recently been lifted.
The Division of Natural
Resources says West Virginia's
black bear population now num-
bers about 12,000 and there have
been sightings in all 55 counties.
"In the past ... it was considered
a varmint and shot on sight," said
Paul Johansen, the DNR's asssistant
chief in charge of game manage-
ment." "hat therception and attitude
has changed dramatically. People
view in tow as a valuable resource."
Not only is the black bear a sym-
bol of West Virginia, after being
officially named the state animal by the Legislature in 1973, it's also
seen as an important part of the ecosystem and an important game species, Johansen said. The black bear, the only bear species in the eastern United States, is actually brown and grows to an
average maximum weight of 250 average maximum weight of 250 roams freely throughout at least 36 states and Canada. the population started to dwindle as forests were cut for timber or for agricultural purposes. By the 1950s and '60s, there was concern for the
bear's survival, and states started bear's survival, and states started
taking steps - such as imposing hunting restrictions and establishing protected parks and forests - to save the animals. Several years ago, West Virginia
pushed back its bear hunting season from November to December, which protected females because
they were already in hibernation by they were already in hibernation by

## Those crazy flying fish are causing all sorts of problems


#### Abstract

wo WEEKS AGO there was a national news tory on flying carp in the Mississippi River. Perhaps you saw it. When a motor boat goes up the river these big carp jump out of the water and there are so out of the water, and there are so many fly ing fish that some hit people in the boats ing fish that some hit people in the boats. Many fish jump into the boats. It's all a bit humorous to watch, but from an ecologica point of view, these flying fish are a disaster in the making. The fish are Silver Carp, native to Asia, and brought to America by fish farmers in Arkansas. They were imported to eat phyArkansas. They were imported to eat phy- toplankton growing in catfish ponds, and also as a possible food source. More on that in a minute. They feed on ph They feed on phytoplankton, which is common food for our native fish larvae, fish juveniles, and native mussels. But fish juveniles, and native mussels. But when farm ponds flooded in the early 1990's, this exotic fish was released into the Mississippi River and they've moved down to Louisiana and north into many



tributaries in Illinois and North Dakota. They eat a ton and grow rapidly to as big
as 80 pounds though 15 -to- 25 pounds is more common. A 40-pound fish will eat around 15 pounds of food per day. This obviously makes them a major competito for native fish.
They also breed rapidly so numbers are growing by leaps and bounds where these
carp are found. So much so that they have become the dominant fish in many parts of the Mississippi and it's tributaries. State and federal wildlife agencies are
working hard to keep this carp out of the

Great Lakes. The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers constructed a temporary elec-
tronic barrier in 2002 A much bigger bar rier has recently been completed on the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Cannel con-
necting the Illinois River (where Silver Carp reside) to Lake Michigan. So far, so good. But the concern for the natural food chain and native fish in Lake Michigan is very real.
I don't lo
I don't look for an electronic barrier to prevent this carp from eventually getting the barrier can suck some fish or eggs with them, even though the technology is supposed to prevent that. Others could be inadvertently dumped into such waters by fishermen using small Silver Carp as bait.
Or they might be dumped into the Great Lakes on purpose by someone who has a grudge against a federal agency. Stranger things have happened. Silver Carp are a
huge aquaculture fish in China and other

parts of Asia. In fact, more pounds of Silfish in the world. Aha, using them for food might be a controlling factor, but the facts are that carp have never been a "food" species in our country. Even so, there are signs that this might change. Netting in the Illinois River can yield thousands of pounds of these carp per day, and some are being processed and sold to AsianAmerican communities in California, New York and other major cities. Some New York and other major cities. Some fish processors are even hoping to develop markets for these fish in Asian countries. However, right now, the demand comes nowhere close to the supply Some say that the name "carp" is the roblem. Usually, questions about schools are out of sight, out of mind during summertime. Not so this yea Some of the credit for that goes to the state School Build ing Authority, which took a new kind of roll call this year
But the real reason for this editorial and this "roll call" is But the real reason for this editorial and this "roul call is
the heartbreaking name that gave rise to this subject last spring: Virginia Tech.
Although the SBA implemented a school safety audit of all 55 counties' facilities nearly two months before the mas sacre in Blacksburg, Va., those events rekindled the discus sion and reaction to school violence.
Schools are like any community where, tragedy and ter
ror remind us, safety and security cannot be taken for granted - or ever guaranteed.
As of late June, 52 of West Virginia's 55 counties had sub mitted school safety audits, the first statewide effort at an accurate accounting of our schools security. The detailed
five-page questionnaire asks school administrators to list everything from doors that lock from the inside to notins


Most of the time, our children are safe, and schools have always taken precautions to ensure security. Now, however, school safety has our attention - year around y should b height of 24 inches. focuses on how well schoo administrators can com municate with classrooms and alarm systems already in service.
For insta For instance: Does the school have a dedicated outside line to reach emer gency responders during
crisis? Are public addres systems equipped with back-up power supplies? The SBA is asking schools to indicate the extent to which procedures and devices are already in place and breaks
down the categories into planning, deterrence, detection, delay and communications.
The SBA will present a formal report to the Legislature during interim meetings in September.
Although this audit won't erase all our fears, it will help everyone to know that when they part with their children at school, whether or not they will see them again is not just a leap of faith.
Most of the time, our children are safe, and schools have always taken precautions to ensure security. Now,

Clinton's library reflects him most clearly in stressing the minu
tiae of government, including detailed accounts of laws passed and global initiatives pursued.

look at that, too, because it's a safe guess they will want to tout such achievements as tax cuts, the No Child Left Behind education bill and drug coverage for Medicare Iraq and fiscal woes.

True, no one is forcing those
families to stay in isolated neigh-
borhoods, not by law anyway.


Nothing is stopping them from
moving to new school districts with higher-achieving classrooms - except their inability to afford it.
But an inferior education is the next best thing to legal segrega-
tion for keeping people stuck where they are, unable to rise to a higher living standard and, therefore, a more integrated neighbo
hood if they choose to do so. The Supreme Court's recent ruling on two school cases means that
nearly all uses of race to achieve or maintain integration will not be allowed. The ruling was based on
the idea that such measures violate he idea that such measures violate of equal protection.
The strong reactions that followed are understandable. Many saw the decision as a slap at the

wVU Hospitals has teamed up with the Rotary Club of Mor-

Mountain View Regional Rehabilitation Hospital to offer multiphasic and PSA health screenings. The screenings will be offered from 6:30-11 a.m.
Aug. 11 and Aug. 18, at Aug. 11 and Aug. 18 , at
HEALTHSOUTH, located at 1160 Van Voorhis Road. This is a new location and one that
hope will accommodate the growing number of participants. The screenings are being performed by WVU Hos pitals' Clinical Laboratories. The multiphasic screening
will provide 15 baseline blood analyses, including cholesterol. Results can help identify current or potential health
problems, such as coronary problems, such as coronary
heart disease, anemia, diabetes and kidney disease. Dr. David Deci, of the WVU
department of family medicine, department of family medicine,
encourages participants to discuss test results with their health-care providers. ""Tests results that fall out side of the recommended ranges may or may not indicate a health problem," he said.
"Your health-care provider can determine if abnormalities indicate the need for more test ing or treatment."
For the most accurate results, multiphasic partici pants should not eat, drink or smoke for 12 hours prior to the
screening. Medication may be screening. Medication may be
taken with small sips of water. The PSA test measures a substance called prostate-spe cific antigen made by the prostate - a small gland tha sits at the base of the male bladder. It's normal to find
small quantities of PSA in th blood, and levels tend to gradually rise in men over the age of 60. PSA may become elevated due to infection (prostatitis), enlargement of the prostate or cancer. Prostate cancer is the than skin cancers, in American men. It is the second leading ican men; lung cancer is the leading cause of death. mine if someone is suffering from prostate cancer is
through a digital rectal exam and a PSA test," Deci said. "These should be performed annually in all men over the age of 50 . Those who are at the disease should begin test ing at age 45 ."

Tips to protect your kids from unsavory online content

WASHINGTON - It's easy for your kids to chat online. And it's just
as easy for predators to chat with as easy for predators to chat with
your children. On top of concerns about criminal conduct and adul to cyber bullying and trash talk. But the Internet is here to stay. So experts say it's more important than ever for parents and other adults to
take responsibility and make sure that youngsters are protected. "Parents need to learn how to control the media. You can get anything you want on the Internet. It's got an amazing amount of content tionable," said Dr. Victor Strasburger, chairman for the American Academy of Pediatrics communications and media council.
Here are five ways to keep things safe:

## 1. Get smart

1. Most parents are confident that they're keeping track of what their
kids are doing on the Internet. Almost three-quarters of parents with children 9 or older using the Internet at home said they know "a lot" about their children's online activities,
according to a June survey from the Kaiser Family Foundation.
Despite the Kaiser report, "most parents are pretty clueless abou what their children are seeing,"
Strasburger contends. Strasburger contends. savvy can illustrate, it takes second to erase evidence that he or she has visited a forbidden site, or

are aware that kids can play online, and they could be playing with strangers online," said Patricia Vance, president of the Enterta ment Software Rating Board.
She added that monitoring you children's video game play is "very important" to make sure that they do not download anything that could significantly change the content of a game.

n the weeks leading up to our first trip to Provence, we pored over guidebooks, reacquainting ourselves with images
immortalized by Cezanne and poupimmortalized by Cezanne and popu-
larized by the films "Jean de Florette" and "Manon Of The Spring."
We fully expected to see fields of lavender, Roman ruins and old men playing petanque, and to feast on hearty ste.

No one told us about the pink flamingos. Much to our surprise - and delight - we encountered thousands of them, wading, feeding and flying in formation over the shallow hour's drive south of Arles.
The Camargue, a wind-swept river delta bordering the Mediterranean Sea, is one of Europe's most important wetland sites, a nesting ground for pink flamingos and home
to hundreds of other species of birds and other wildlife.
The park - an intricate patchwork of salt fields, rice farms, ranches and swamps - is has built a network of information centers nature trails and observatories through the marshes and lagoons.
From the vantage point of comfortable blinds, we peered for hours at flocks of water
fowl, marveling at the ability of the flamingos to retract one long, spindly leg beneath their bellies and balance on the other.
No matter how many of the exquisite creatures we saw, we only wanted to see more! You might say they blew a serious When we were still planning our trip from home, we had planned on staying five nights in Arles, hoping to use it as a base to explore other towns and villages in the south
ern part of Provence. A medium-size city r history, Arles has no shortage of its own attrac tions: excellent museums, a vibrant outdoor mar ket on Saturdays, an international photogra
phy festival in the summer phy festival in the summer.
Some of the ancient houses winding streets have been renovated and paint ed in delicate pastel hues. Just down the street

from our lodging was an organic bakery, and not far from
olive oil Wem
the Place du Forum featured in a famou painting by Vincent Van Gogh, who lived in Arles for one short, extraordinarily productive year of his troubled life.
We inspected giant vats of paella and
tables brimming with local cheeses at the ers market on Saturday - but mostly we hung out in the Camargue.
The trip from Arles was easy: Cross over the Rhone and take the D36 south. At a certain rower road that leads past a visitor information center at La Capeliere.
There, and farther down the road at Salin
de Badon, visitors can meander along wellgroomed nature trails and observe egrets, viewing platforms built over tall seas of reeds and other wild grasses.
Having come this far to the southeast corner of Provence, we decided it was crazy to leave the region without at least putting our feet in
the Mediterranean, even though when we were there, it was November.
So we drove to a parking area at the southeast edge of the park's largest lagoon, the Etang du Vaccares, and hiked toward the Phare de la Gacholle. Just before the entrance
to the lighthouse, we veered left and marched across the dunes to the sea. Despite the intense heat of the midday
sun, the air was cool. A stiff wind from the
north ruffled the surface of the salt marshes Off in the distance, kite-surfers danced over
the sparkling green waves the sparkling green waves. After reaching the water's edge, we retreat
ed to the dunes, where we picnicked our ed to the dunes, where we picnicked on ou
provisions from Arles - bread cheese and provisions from Arles - bread, cheese and
sausage. As we huddled against the wind, fear ful that the wind would carry off an unat tended napkin or paper bag, several people galloped past on horseback With the sun now arcing toward the west, it was ime to pack up our belongings and head ing toward the west, it was time to pack up our belongings and head back across the
dunes dunes.
Fresh blue shutters, the lighthouse also served as a visitor information center for this section of the park. Inside, there were simple displays of shells, feathers and wildflowers to illustrate
the ecology of the nature preserve. the ecology of the nature preserve.
The seaside resort of Saintes-Maries-de-laMer, where some believe Mary Magdalene and other early Christians washed ashore in a boat
from Jerusalem in 40 A.D., has attracted from Jerusalem in 40 A.D., has attracted
religious pilgrims for nearly two millennia. religious pilgrims for nearly two millennia
Besides humans, the Camargue has long sup ported wild herds of black bulls and white horses, which have given rise to a French style cowboy culture. French President Nico las Sar hozy was photographed there on a
white horse two days before the first round of the elections in France earlier this year. Tourists can watch bullfights; explore the Camargue on horseback alongside the gar dians, or French cowboys; and sample the dis local shops and restaurants.
Whether you're a wannabe cowhand, a devoted birdwatcher or a devotee of Van Gogh, you're likely to find something in the
park that strikes a chord. ark that strikes a chord gos we saw, which, by the way, are not the Pepto-Bismol pink of the lawn ornaments. Their plumage comes in delicate hues of
rosy pink and white with dramatic black flight rosy pink and white, with dramatic black flight
feathers visible when their wings are extended. feathers visible when their wings are extended.
The lawn ornament manufacturers who have turned these spectacular-looking birds
into tropical kitsch have simply got it wrong.

## Diagnosis on front end might call for a second opinion


#### Abstract

Question: I just got the shock of my life. The tire place where bought new tires says I need a front-end overhaul to the tune around $\$ 900$ ! My '98 Accord has 101,000 miles and seems to drive, stop and turn great. I told them they were nuts, paid for the tires and got out of there as fast as I could. My original tires made it to about 45,000 there as fast as I could. My original tires made it to about 45,000 replaced them. This place recommended a front-end alignment to go with the tires and that's when the trouble began. They said they "couldn't align it" because of everything being happen if I didn't fix it and they said I could lose control if I hit the wrong kind of bumps. Where else should I go to get another opinion? What is done in Where else should I go to get another opinion? What is done in a front-end overhaul? I know they were after my wallet, but they a front-end overhaul? I know they have me a little worried still. $\quad$ Walter Garrison, Eureka, Calif Answer: Good move, Walter. I'd certainly get a second opinion in a situation like this. The symptoms of worn-out suspension or steering parts might be irregular and rapid tire wear, pulling to one side, the the steering wheel. Since your old tires did so well and you have no complaints about the Accord's road manners, I think you did well getting out of there with just the tires. A front-end overhaul could mean different things, but I'd interpret it as the mass replacement of ball joints, tie rod ends, suspension bush ings and perhaps front struts or shocks. I can't imagine the need for such aggressive replacement tactics unless the car had several hundred thousand miles on the clock or the wheels were practically falling off. thousand miles on the clock or the wheels were practically falling off It's not unreasonable to find a worn ball joint or tie rod end at alignment, but as solid a car as the Accord is, this should be about the worst one should expect. Suspension and steering parts are somewhat like your hips, knees and ankles. While it might not be too difficult to align your feet while standing still, imagine how they might flop around as you ran acros varying terrain with loose joints and mounts from the hips down. When the tires/wheels are allowed to wander from the desired plane, tire tread is scrubbed away and the vehicle begins to track slop- pily. Testing suspension and steering parts is fairly easy with the vehipily. Testing suspension and steering parts is fairly easy with the ve cle off the ground. The various joints and bushings can be flexed or compressed, checking for excessive looseness. Sme parts, such as ball joints, might have a visible wear indicator or looseness specification, while other parts require subjective evaluation. Any general repair shop should be capable of inspecting and replacing worn suspension components. I'm confident their opinion will differ from the tire-shop rascals, and that noticeable symptoms would occur prior to the car becoming dangerous to drive

From the beginning, it seemed the union of Reggie Jackson, Billy Martin and George Steinbrenner on the late- ${ }^{-} 0 \mathrm{~s}$ New York Yankees would produce either spectacular results or a resounding explosion.
It ended up doing both.
A new, eight-part miniseries premiering Monday, July 9, on ESPN, titled "The Bronx Is Burning" ex plores the summer of 1977 in New York as seen through the prism of the turmoil in the Yankees clubhouse generated by the relationships between volatile manager Martin (played by John Turturro), demanding owner Steinbrenner (Oliver Platt) and self-aggrandizing star player Jackson (Daniel Sunjata, "Rescue Me"), oversized egos all.
This was a talented team that, with the addition the previous winter of accomplished slugger Jackson, was expected to win a World Series, which it did in 77 and ' 78.
But there were a few problems along the way. During spring training, Jackson gave an interview belittling team captain Thurman Munson's (Erik Jensen) contributions, while declaring himself "the straw that stirs the drink." There was a near-fight in June in the dugout at Boston's Fenway Park between Jackson and Martin after the latter pulled the former from a nationally televised game for not hustling. And there was the near-firing of Martin by Steinbrenner after the Fenway incident.

## 'Fore" seeks new golf gadgets

Mapn one respect, Tiger Woods is no different from the weekend hacker o dreams of one day breaking 100: When all else fails, they'll both p up the latest equipment in an effort to lower their score. Maybe it's something simple like a different driver to cure that crooked tee shot or a new putter to help sink those pesky 4 -footers. Or perhaps it's a product so ingenious, your initial reaction might be, "Why didn't I think of that?"
Well, it's probably because you're not an architect of golf ideas like the contestants featured on "Fore Inventors Only," an eight-episode reality series debuting Tuesday, July 10, on the Golf Channel.
Culled from a cast of thousands who auditioned are the 103 inventors who get to demonstrate their product in front of a panel consisting of Golf for Women senior editor Stina Sternberg, noted instructor Bill Harmon and PGA Tour pro Fulton Allem. Sports personalities and regular golf consumers will also field test each invention and provide feedback to the panelists, who will eliminate all but five of the contestants. Viewers then pick the winner, who receives shelf space for
his invention at retailer Golfsmith for one year and media time on the Golf Channel, in a live interactive finale on Sept. 4.
Some of the auditioners went to great lengths to foster their creations, including risking their life savings.
"The way they get to these inventions is so incredible," Golf Channel executive producer Jay Kossoff says, "you know, from having a parent with a disability that caused them to create one thing, or just finding a need within themselves to make something, or flat-out just finding a need to make anything. Some of these folks are just true inventors. So it was all very, very interesting to us, and there are emotional stories and funny stories, and it's happy and sad and it really follows the whole script of a dramatic series.
Guiding the entire process is host Vince Cellini, who admits he wasn't quite sold on the idea at first.
"I guess I went into it a little like, you know, ah, I rolled my eyes little bit," he says, "but as I got into it, you know, not to sound Joe Patriotic, but I really think there's something inherently American about inventors and people who say they're going to build a better mousetrap."

he once caused the winds of controversy to swirl with a nude photo spread. Now the only headlines Lauren Jackson earns are from being the center of the Storm.
Jackson is in her seventh season anchoring the middle for the WNBA's Seattle Storm, who selected her first overall in the 2001 draft. During that time she's crafted a career that ranks among the best ever in the women's league, and she's adding to it in the early part of this season by leading the WNBA in scoring, rebounding, blocks and player efficiency. (Player efficiency, or overall ability, is derived by assigning a number to each stat, then adding the positive ones and subtracting the negative ones. Jackson has led the league in that rating for three straight seasons.)
Despite dealing with an assortment of injuries last season, Jackson was named to the All-WNBA First Team for the fourth straight season, the only player in the league to hold that distinction. And in passing the 3,000-point mark in 2006, she became the youngest player ( 25 years, 33 days old) and the fastest ( 162 games) in history to reach that plateau.
Even before Jackson, who was born in New South Wales, Australia, took off her clothes for an Australian magazine in 2004, she was already famous in her native land, having led her country to a silver medal in the 2000 Olympics. She repeated the feat in '04, the same year she guided the Storm to the WNBA title.

If's been nearly a month
since the end of season one of Showtime's "The Tudors," and I'm still amped up to defend the virtue of the unfortunate Catherine of Aragon.

Think about it, the poor woman had to come from sunny Spain to damp England to marry some teenage prince. He dies (before consummating the union, she says), then she's married off to his younger brother,
Henry, by way of a papal dispensation, as the Bible apparently frowns on marrying one's brother's wife if the two had actually done the deed.
Then, after many years of marriage (faithful for her, wildly unfaithful for him) and several attempts to bear a surviving male heir, she finds herself shunted to the side because the
now-King Henry VIII wants to marry some upstart tart from a social-climbing family besotted by visions of grandeur.
If this were today, Catherine would be summarily divorced in Mexico and forced to live a Renaissance-era version of "The Starter Wife."

As it is, she wrestled Henry to the mat, defending her honor and her legal rights to the bitter end. Of course, she lost, but at least she kept her head, which is more than we can say for the upstart tart.
What allowed me to get so into Catherine's story is that "The Tudors" took its first 10 episodes (and, I hear, also a few from next season) to tell it. In normal Henry VIII tales, she would have been gone by the end of the first hour, if not sooner.

HBO's series "Rome" took a similarly lusty and long-form look at the time of Caesar, but it chose to focus the center of its tale on two minor figures, a pair of Roman soldiers who always seemed to be on hand when the big history was happening.
That's a fine approach, and for its two seasons, "Rome" was a fine series. While "The Tudors" is not as high-minded as "Rome," it showed a lot of audacity in keeping its focus squarely on the movers and shakers of Henry VIII's court. It took a lot of liberties, but it never lost the thread of history.
Both shows also had the luxury of spinning out their stories over time, rather than forcing decades to be squashed into a movie or miniseries.
This approach of making a full-on series based on history is not new, but HBO and

Showtime have demonstrated how it works for a modern audience.
I'd like to see an ongoing series about the Revolutionary War and the creation of the American nation. As we watch Iraq lurch along on its uncertain path to democracy, it might behoove us to remember that at the time, our beginnings were just as fraught with uncertainty, fear, discord and violence. (Yeah, HBO has "John Adams," but I'm talking about the "Rome" treatment.)
Maybe we could spend some time among the doomed folks of Pompeii,
or in the radical court of monotheistic Egyptian pharaoh Akhenaten. (Just think whom we could cast as Queen Nefertiti!)
Or, how about the lives and loves of young Will Shakespeare and his traveling band of players? It worked for "Shakespeare in Love."

## Diabetes Screening

Diabetes is a medical condition in which your body doesn't make enough insulin or has a reduced response to insulin. Diabetes causes your blood sugar to be too high because insulin is needed to use sugar properly. A high blood sugar level is not good for your health. For people with Medicare at risk for getting diabetes, Medicare covers a screening blood sugar test to check for diabetes. You are considered at risk if you have any of the following: high blood pressure, dyslipidemia (history of abnormal cholesterol and triglyceride levels), obesity, or a history of high blood sugar. Other risk factors may also qualify you for this test and based on the results, you may be eligible for up to two screenings each year. How often is it covered? You may be eligible for up to two screenings each year.

For whom? Individuals at increased risk for diabetes that have any of the following: high blood pressure, dyslipidemia (history of abnormal cholesterol and triglyceride levels), obesity, or a history of high blood sugar.
