Schools update weekly schedule

Classroom learning Monday-Thursday, remote on Friday

KINGWOOD — The back to school plan for Preston County students has changed again. Students will now be in the classroom Monday through Thursday, and participate in remote learning on Friday. School personnel will still work Monday through Friday. The change is to accommodate extra duties teachers will take on with virtual learning. Virtual learning students learn at home full-time. Remote learning is when students who have opted to

Pandemic-related unemployment contributes to overdose increase

Isolation, unemployment and disposable income. Bob Hansen, executive director of the Office of Drug Control Policy for the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Services, said those factors, both brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, have contributed significantly to a spike in drug over-

doses and overdose deaths. Hansen explained that data collected from Emergency Medical Services indicates a doubling of overdose calls in May as compared to May last year. "Data suggests two main correlating factors most likely to have contributed to the rise in overdose and overdose fatalities in West Virginia. A combination of isolation due to travel restrictions, combined with seemingly disposable income in the form of

stimulus payments coincide temporarily with the overdose spike in May," he said. Add to that the stress many faced over the loss of work. The state's unemployment rate nearly tripled between March and April, approaching 15%. Hansen said being socially isolated not only weighs on people emotionally, but also had the effect of decreasing access to overdose-reversing drug Naloxone for many dealing with sub-

stance abuse disorder. Through a pair of new initiatives the WVDHHR is working to eliminate some of the barriers for people seeking treatment for opioid addiction. In February, the Bureau for Behavioral Health State Opioid Response Program (SOR) awarded funding to the Bureau for Children and Families to broaden the income eligibility SEE DRUG, A-9

101-year-old navy veteran recounts her experience

At 101 years old, World War II veteran and resident of Morgantown Isabel Jones hardly seems a day over 85. "To be 101 years old and to be as sharp and alert and on top of things the way she is, is phenomenal," said Sarah Minear, a friend of Jones. "She's an inspiration to all of us here." Jones is one of the oldest living females to have served in the military, and was one of the earliest members of WAVES, the Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service program. She said she still remembers the day she received a letter in the mail in the early 1940s, asking her to join the Navy. "Of course I said yes," Jones said. As a coder stationed in Washington, D.C., she was responsible for charting courses for ships to keep sailors out of harm's way. She said she remembers during the D-Day invasion in Normandy, France, they were responsible for ensuring the safe passage of Allied ships.

Jones said coders could be working up to 12-hour shifts, communicating with vessels in places as far as off the coast of Australia. While these events and communications are now declassified, during the war, Jones was forbidden from discussing the information she knew from her job. "We never talked about it any time we left the building," Jones said. "We never mentioned what we were doing. We just answered [that] it was a secret." Prior to enlisting in the Navy, Jones attended Vassar College in New York. She later transferred to the University of Minnesota to be closer to home. After graduating with a degree in history and political science, she taught for only one year in Austin, Minn. before enlisting. "The principal didn't want me to leave," Jones said. "I said, well, it was wartime." After serving in the Navy for just over two years, Jones got married. Once she became pregnant with her first child, she retired to focus on starting her family. She had four children who went on to become a doctor, a teacher, a lawyer and a nurse. Now a grandmother, she enjoys spending time with her family whenever possible. Because of

Trump's executive order not tax holiday

All deferred money must be paid back at end of the year

President Trump's payroll tax suspension that goes into effect Sept. 1 is a deferral and the money will have to be paid back. "All it is, is an extension of time for employers to collect and remit payroll tax otherwise due," said Elaine Wilson, a West Virginia University law professor who heads the school's tax and estate planning law curriculum, in an email to The Dominion Post. President Trump announced the payroll tax suspension designed to sidestep Congress after talks on a coronavirus relief bill fell apart. "The President doesn't have the authority to change the underlying tax liability (only Congress can do that), only the power to postpone the due date because of a federally declared disaster." Under Trump's executive order, the deferral will be from Sept. 1 — the day it starts — and remain in effect through Dec. 31, 2020. Anyone earning less than \$100,000 a year would benefit, Trump said. The catch, however, is the deferred money comes from FICA, the payroll tax that helps fund Social Security. The employer pays half of the 12.4% tax, while the employee pays the other half through withheld money. Trump's order calls for employers to stop withholding half of the tax from a worker's check. But, the employer would still have to contribute for each worker. Also, Trump's order said the Secretary of the Treasury will explore ways — including leg-

be in the classroom are doing class work at home. These can be either scheduled days, such as these Fridays, or others that arise because of health concerns, for example.

"Because of the sheer volume of the virtual students that we have, in looking at how to operate that, we came up with a plan that our own teachers would do all of our virtual basically at the same time they're doing it in class," Preston School Superintendent Steve Wotring said.

About 20%, around 790, Preston students have opted to begin the year virtually. They have the option of going back to the classroom at the end of the grading period, if they are in elementary or middle school. High school students can only switch at the end of a semester.

Virtual students will be assigned a teacher, who will post

videos and make assignments for them.

They may Skype into the classroom and watch pieces of instruction or talk to the teacher. The teacher can record lessons and email them to the students.

"The sheer navigation of what we're asking our teachers to do and fully communicate with their virtual students and in-person students, that takes an exceeding amount of planning," Wotring said.

It comes down to enough time in the workday for teachers to do it all, he said.

"So our best option was to make Friday a remote day," he said.

It also allows an additional day to do intensive cleaning and air out schools.

School employees are already back at work, learning the details of school in the time of COVID-19. The Preston County Health Department worked with Preston County Schools on its

return to school plan.

Health Department Director V.J. Davis told the Preston County Commission at its most recent meeting that, "The plans that are in place with the school system, we have looked at them. ... There is no fool-proof way you can have for opening schools back up, but I think the plan we have in Preston County is as safe as it can be."

There is no change in the plan for students to return to school on a staggered schedule.

On Sept. 8, only fourth, eighth and 12th graders will report. On Sept. 9, only third, seventh and 11th graders will report. On Sept. 10, only second, sixth and 10th graders will attend school. On Sept. 11, first, fifth and ninth graders will go.

Parents of pre-K and kindergarten students will be scheduled for individual appointments that week.

All students will attend school beginning Sept. 14.

isolation — to eliminate the obligation to pay the deferred taxes, according to media reports.

"However, the postponement of the due date doesn't really apply to YOU," Wilson said. "It applies to the employer's obligation to collect it on your behalf and pay it to the government quarterly."

So what's an employer to do?

Wilson said there are three options for employers including to continue to withhold the tax. Or, the employer can collect the money from employees as usual, but hang onto the funds and remit it to the government at the extended date.

By hanging onto the money, the employer gets to hold onto the liquidity and interest, Wilson said. The downside is the employee does not benefit and there is no economic stimulus through additional spending.

The last option is not to collect the tax at all.

Collect the funds and remit it at a later date. Employees have more money to spend, but the tax is still due.

Dale Sparks, owner of All-Pro Framing & Photography in Morgantown and WVU sports photographer, said it is going to be business as usual for him.

"If we pause with payroll taxes, it will be due in one lump sum at a later date," he said. "I have decided, with my few employees, to stay the course on payroll taxes. This way neither the employer nor employee will possibly be hit with a large tax bill at a later date. Basically, a roll of the dice with the uncertainties of COVID-19 and the upcoming election."

Wilson reiterated Trump's order is not a tax holiday, only a deferral.

"The reality is that no one knows how this is going to work as a technical matter and there are lots of open questions," she said. "So most employers are watching it and waiting for guidance."

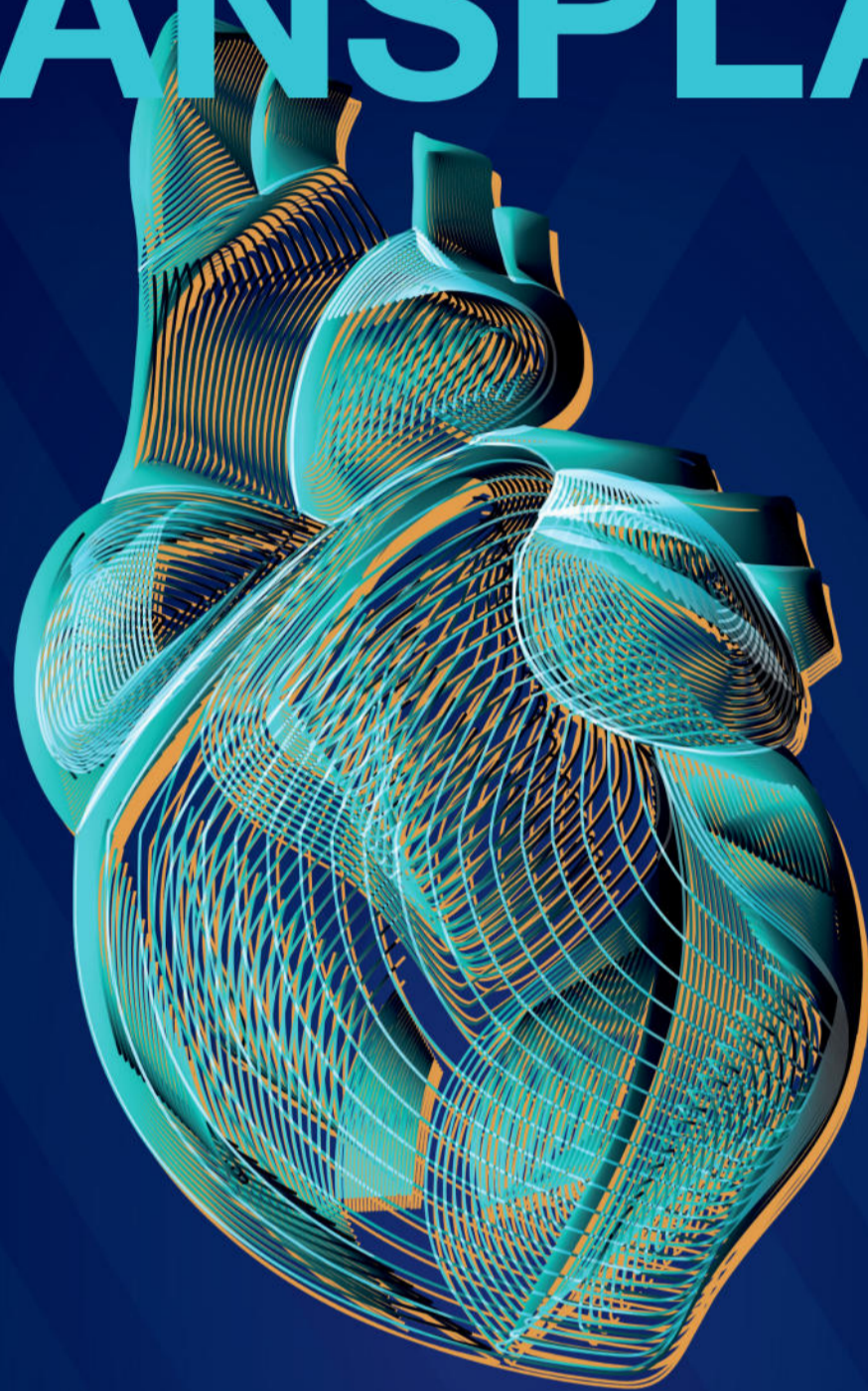

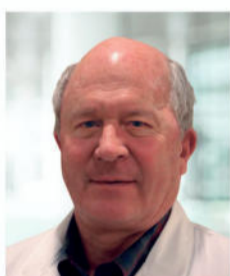

West Virginia in 1965 and has been a Mountaineer ever since.

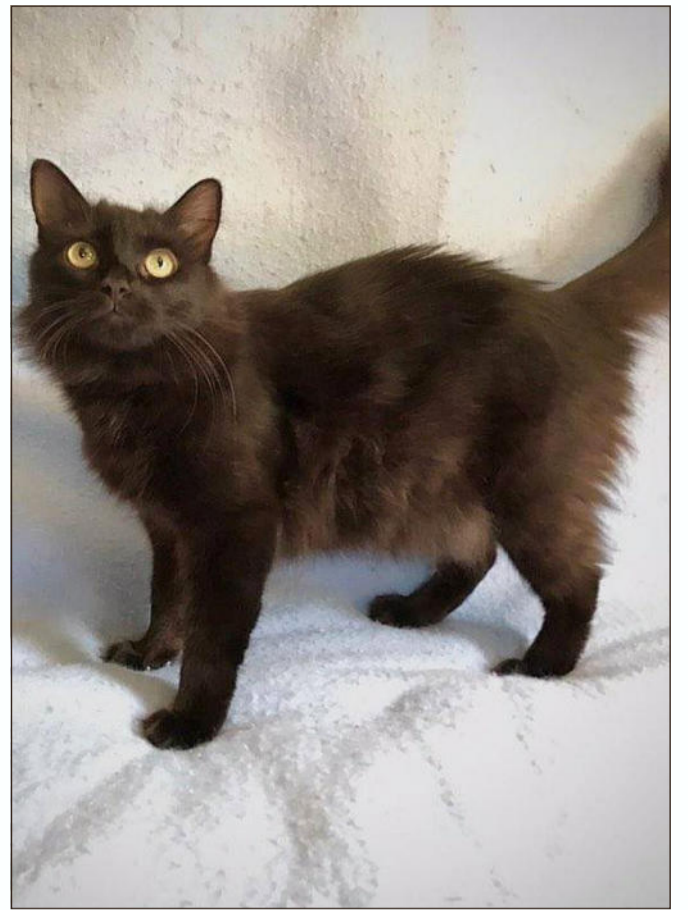
When she isn't cheering on her favorite sports teams, she said she likes to attend exercise classes multiple times a week at the Village.

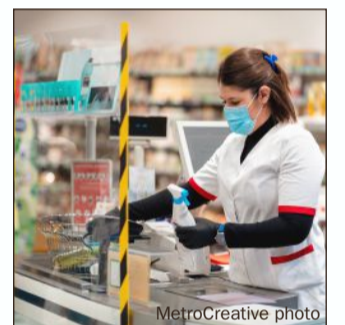

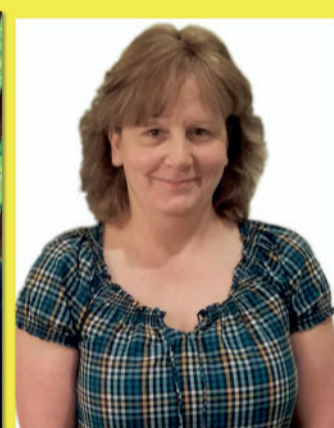

He also flew the KC-135A, Stratotanker, with the always ready 41st Air Refueling Squadron, "Anywhere, Anytime."

He participated in the USS Pueblo incident off North Korea and in the planning of emergency deployment of the F-4E's to Israel during the Yom Kippur War. Besides the hot war in Southeast Asia, he also participated in the Cold War, flying countless sorties and endless hours of alert duty both in the United States, Europe and Southeast Asia. He served in the United States Air Force from 1966-1976.

In 1976, he returned to Morgantown and joined his

father in operating the Phillips Family Farm in Stewartstown, raising Black Limousin beef cattle.

He felt highly privileged to have been allowed to shoulder the responsibility of carrying the colors of the United States of America into battle. He would like to be remembered as a patriot, cattleman and connoisseur of the wines of Bordeaux, especially Chateau Lafite Rothchild, whose extraordinary quality has set the standard for all wines decade after decade.

## Water Board receives five new generators for pumps

KINGWOOD — Kingwood Water Board members reported the delivery of five new generators.

The generators were purchased with funds from a Federal Emergency Management Agency grant.

Amy DeBerry, water clerk, said the generators are part of a project that includes concrete pads and security fencing.

New generators will be placed at the water plant, at pump stations and at water tanks.

DeBerry said they will ensure the town has water if electrical systems are down.

"We have to be able to pump water from the river, so we have clean drinking water," DeBerry said.

In other business, Kingwood recently changed its billing system and the appearance of water bills.

Since the change, DeBerry said she has received numerous complaints that they look like disconnect notices.

"I usually have calls from customers about not receiving their bill. I haven't received any of those this month," she said about the new system.

During a field plant report, James Marks said he has been checking storm drains and other areas for a "lingering leak" in a water line.

He said he is considering contacting Rural Water's leak detection specialist to help find the leak. No action was taken.

## House passes bill to reverse changes blamed for mail delays

WASHINGTON — With heated debate over mail delays, the House approved legislation in a rare Saturday session that would reverse recent changes in U.S. Postal Service operations and send \$25 billion to shore up the agency ahead of the November election.

Speaker Nancy Pelosi had recalled lawmakers to Washington over objections from Republicans who dismissed the action as a stunt. President Donald Trump railed against mail-in ballots, including in a Saturday tweet, and urged a no vote. He has said he wants to block extra funds for the Postal Service.

"Don't pay any attention to what the president is saying, because it is all designed to suppress the vote," Pelosi said at the Capitol.

Pelosi called the Postal Service the nation's "beautiful thread" connecting Americans and said voters should "ignore" the president's threats.

The daylong session came as an uproar over mail disruptions puts the Postal Service at the center of the nation's tumultuous election year, with Americans rallying around one of the nation's oldest and more popular institutions. Millions of people are expected to opt for mail-in ballots to avoid polling places during the coronavirus pandemic.

Ahead of voting the president tweeted, "This is

all another HOAX."

More than two dozen Republicans broke with the president and backed the bill, which passed 257-150. Democrats led approval, but the legislation is certain to stall in the GOP-held Senate. The White House said the president would veto it.

Facing a backlash over operational changes, new Postmaster General Louis DeJoy testified Friday in the Senate that his "No. 1 priority" is to ensure election mail arrives on time.

But the new postal leader, a Trump ally, said he would not restore the cuts to mailboxes and sorting equipment that have already been made. He could not provide senators with a plan for handling the ballot crush for the election. DeJoy is set to return Monday to testify before the House Oversight Committee.

"The American people don't want anyone messing with the post office," said Rep. Carolyn Maloney, D-N.Y., the chair of the Oversight Committee and author of the bill. "They just want their mail."

But Republicans countered that complaints about mail delivery disruptions are overblown, and no emergency funding is needed right now.

"It's a silly, silly bill," said Rep. Tom Cole, R-Okla.

Despite the postmaster general's vow election mail will arrive on time, Democrats remain skepti-

cal. They produced new reports showing declines in postal service since he took over in June. DeJoy acknowledged at the Senate hearing there has been a "dip" in service, but disputed reports of widespread problems. The Board of Governors of the Postal Service announced a bipartisan committee to oversee mail voting.

The bill would reverse the cuts by prohibiting any changes made after January, and provide funds to the agency.

In a memo to House Republicans, leaders derided the legislation as a postal "conspiracy theory" act. Many GOP lawmakers echoed such sentiments during a lively floor debate.

"I like the post office, I really do," said Rep. Glenn Grothman, R-Wis. But he said, "We have no crisis here."

Nevertheless, Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell is eyeing a \$10 billion postal rescue as part of the next COVID-19 relief package. While Trump has said he wants to block emergency funding for the agency, the White House has said it would be open to more

postal funding as part of a broader bill.

Hundreds of lawmakers returned to Washington for the weekend session, but dozens cast votes by proxy under House rules that allow them to stay away during the COVID-19 crisis. Another lawmaker, Rep. Dan Meuser, R-Pa., announced Saturday he had tested positive for the virus.

Trump's chief of staff, Mark Meadows, was on Capitol Hill meeting Saturday with GOP House leader Kevin McCarthy and other lawmakers, according to a Republican aide granted anonymity to discuss the private sessions.

The Postal Service has been struggling financially under a decline in mail volume, COVID-19-related costs and a rare and cumbersome congressional requirement to fund in advance its retiree health care benefits.

For many, the Postal Service provides a lifeline, delivering not just cards and letters but also prescription drugs, financial statements and other items that are especially needed by mail during the pandemic.

## Officials: Police shoot, kill man outside store in Louisiana

LAFAYETTE, La. — Police in Louisiana shot and killed a man as he tried to enter a convenience store with a knife, authorities said Saturday. The shooting was captured on video, and the state ACLU condemned what it described as a "horrific and deadly incident of police violence against a Black person."

The Louisiana State Police said in a statement that officers from the Lafayette Police Department were called to a store Friday at 8 p.m. about a disturbance involving a man with a knife. As officers tried to apprehend him, he fled. Officers deployed Tasers, but they were ineffective, the statement said.

The state police said the man was still armed with a

knife when he tried to enter another convenience store, which was occupied, when he was shot. The man, identified as 31-year-old Trayford Pellerin, was taken to a nearby hospital, where he was pronounced dead. No officers were injured.

The Louisiana State Police said they were asked by the police department in Lafayette to handle the investigation.

The ACLU of Louisiana demanded an investigation into the killing and identified Pellerin as Black.

"Once again, video footage has captured a horrific and deadly incident of police violence against a Black person who was brutally killed in front of our eyes," executive director Alanah Odoms Hebert said in a statement Saturday.

## 2 bodies found, 2 missing after explosion in Texas port

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas — The bodies of two missing crew members of a dredging boat were found Saturday following an explosion a day earlier in the Port of Corpus Christi in Texas, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

Two other crew members of the dredging vessel Waymon L Boyd remain missing and the search for them continues, Coast Guard Capt. Jason Gunning said during a Saturday afternoon news conference.

The explosion happened at about 8 a.m. Fri-

day when the vessel struck a submerged pipeline, according to the Coast Guard, and Port of Corpus Christi officials said it was a natural gas pipeline.

"Our thoughts and prayers go out to the impacted crewmen and their families," Sean Strawbridge, CEO, Port of Corpus Christi, said Saturday.

"A full investigation is underway; however, search and rescue efforts are our first priority. It will not be clear for some time the cause of this accident, and any definitive statements to the contrary would be premature," Strawbridge added.

The Waymon L Boyd is owned by Houston-based marine construction contractor Orion Marine Group.

"We greatly appreciate the efforts of the U.S. Coast Guard and other responders in their efforts to recover our missing crewmen," Orion CEO Mark Stauffer said in the statement.

The fire onboard the vessel was first extinguished Friday afternoon, but sparked again and was finally put out at approximately 10 p.m. Friday, shortly before the vessel broke apart and sunk, the Coast Guard said.

The vessel carried a

maximum of about 6,000 gallons of diesel fuel, said Brent Koza, the regional manager for the Texas General Land Office, which investigates oil spills.

"We have identified and are preparing for that as our worst case discharge scenario," and diesel is being recovered from the channel and around environmentally sensitive areas, Koza said.

Brooke West, spokeswoman with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, said air quality tests have found no air pollution and testing of the waterway is planned.

"TCEQ will collect water samples from the ship channel near the site of the incident ... this is still an active emergency response event," West said.

guidelines for child care for SOR program participants.

The idea behind the program — employment supports recovery. And child-care is expensive.

According to data put out by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the average monthly cost of infant care in West Virginia is \$728, about 4% more than the state's average housing rent.

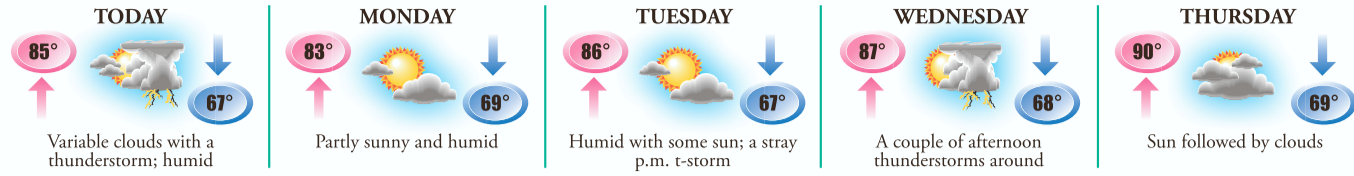

In particular, Mountain Line Transit Authority has completed 2,136 trips and a total of 54,413 miles since the program's inception.

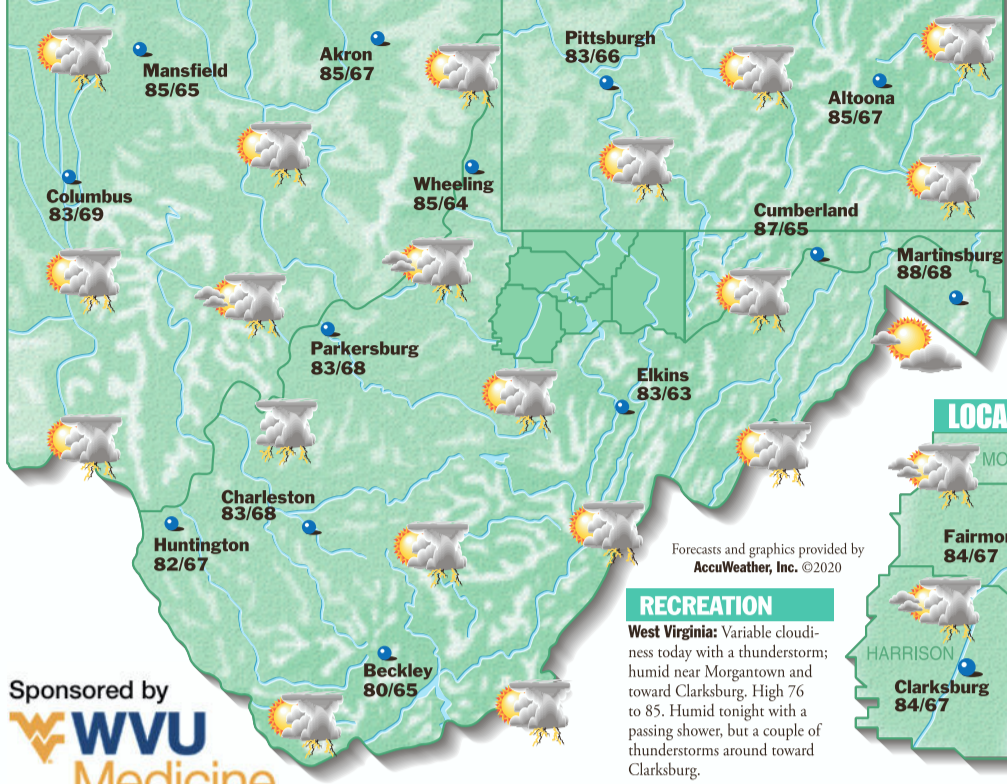

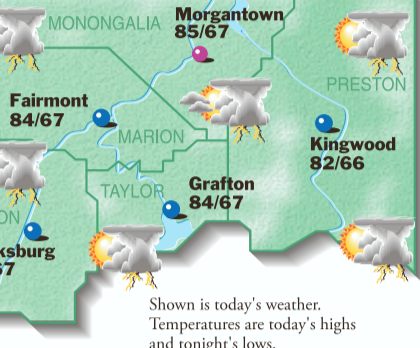

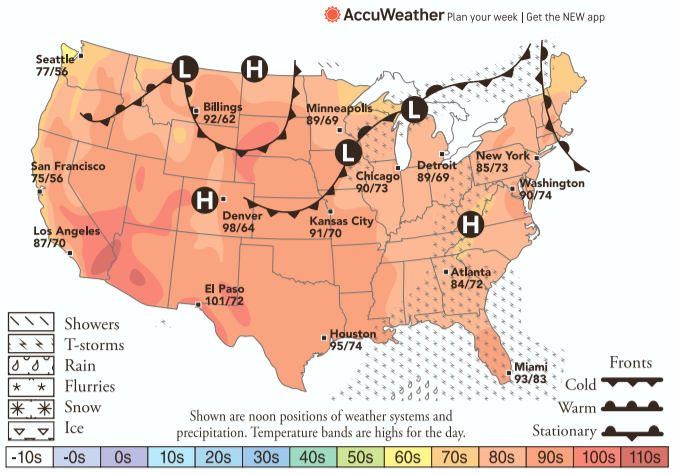

# Friends of the Cheat look to build spur trail

As Friends of the Cheat develop the Cheat River Rail-Trail next year, they hope to build a spur trail up to the site of the single largest contributor of acid mine drainage into the Cheat: The Lick Run Mine portals.

River users can see the effects of Lick Run's acid mine drainage — AMD — where it meets the Cheat. A vast swath of the riverbank is stained orange from the iron. And while the acidic Lick Run water runs clear, the collision with the higher pH Cheat causes the metals to precipitate out, so you can see the orange of the iron and the white of the aluminum swirling out of the mouth.

The scene is different up at the portals: A ghastly green nightmare of muck and ooze and a metal mini-mountain called The Scab.

"We hope that the hiking trail will bring people up here so they start asking questions and start understanding," said Friends of Cheat Executive Director Amanda Pitzer. "This is still happening everywhere. It just isn't in your face. ... I come here a lot, and it's still a shock."

For comparison, The Dominion Post regularly reports that the defunct Richard Mine is the single largest source of acid mine drainage into Deckers Creek. Each year, that contaminated flow puts into the creek 140,000 pounds of iron and 59,000 pounds of aluminum.

The also-defunct Lick Run Mine is worse: 300,000 pounds of iron and 200,000 pounds of aluminum per year.

Cheat River Rail-Trail construction will be funded with a total \$4.2 million of Abandoned Mine Lands program money. Treating Lick Run is a separate, expensive, problem down the road. Part of the AML money will allow FOC to partner with the state Department of Environmental Protection to examine the feasibility of treating the polluted waters in a specially-designed facility somewhere between the portals and the mouth.

Pitzer estimates it would cost about \$4.5 million for the facility, plus up to \$250,000 per year to run

## DIY: Building window boxes for flowers is a fun activity for all ages

Many of us are still mentally and emotionally stuck in May. Surprised to see late summer flowers blooming already, when the global pandemic slowed our lives down — bringing some things to a standstill — we must face that the seasons progress on the usual schedule.

Even though it's almost autumn, plenty of time remains to enjoy flowers, indoors and out. A great way to easily enjoy both at once is with a window box. Building one yourself can be an inexpensive and fun project.

If you have children, you can use building window flower boxes as a way to teach them some basic carpentry skills, or you can use it as a way to spend some productive alone time.

To make a window box, you will need:

- Wood: Cedar, oak and locust are good options, as they hold up to weather well; pine and others that rot quickly won't last as long
- Saw: circular, miter or even a hand-saw will do the trick
- Drill
- Drill bits
- Screws
- Wood glue (optional)
- Tape measure
- Level
- Paint or varnish
- Brackets and appropriate mounting bolts

First, determine the size you want your box to be. Measure the window it will hang under. Don't forget, a window box can also look great sitting on a window sill, railing, along the edge of a patio or anywhere else you want a space to grow some plants.

The easiest way to decide on the height of the box is to go with the height of the



boards you're using for this project. If buying new lumber, one inch by eight inch is ideal.

If you upcycle boards from other projects, you might need to plane or sand the wood before starting. If the wood is pretty

rough, use a table or bench-top planer, and work one side until it is smooth and pretty. Especially if you're not planning to paint, use a hand planer to fix up the edges.

# How do mountains form?

IT SEEMS A main defining feature of West Virginia is its mountains. The highest point in West Virginia occurs at Spruce Mountain in Pendleton County. It is about 4,863 feet tall. Spruce Mountain is part of the Allegheny Mountains, a mountain range in the eastern part of West Virginia. And, West Virginia University's mascot is a mountaineer.

West Virginia officially became a state on June 20, 1863. West Virginia used to be part of Virginia, but ended up breaking away from the state during the Civil War.

Hopes of secession were occurring as early as the late 1820s because, like America before the American Revolution, West Virginia felt as though it was underrepresented in Virginia's government and was overtaxed. More people lived in Virginia and people felt like the culture in West Virginia (where there were more farmers and less slaves) was vastly different than Virginia (where there were people who didn't work as farmers and were generally richer than the farmers

and had more slaves). There was also a natural barrier that separated West Virginia from Virginia: The Allegheny Mountains.

Mountains, in general, can form in three different ways. These methods have to do with tectonic plates, which are in the Earth's crust.

Earth has four inner layers. The innermost layer of Earth is called the inner core. The inner core is this really hot, solid, metal ball that is made up of mostly nickel and iron. It is about three-fourths the size of the moon, and it spins faster than the rest of Earth. The temperature of the inner core is around 5400 degrees Celsius (9800

The Encova Center strives to do the same for the region from its place in the university's Innovation, Design and Entrepreneurship Applied Ecosystem — or "IDEA," as the network is known.

"Our competitors were all bright," Vitale said. "Now we just have to find a way to keep

them in West Virginia."

Tara St. Clair, a consultant in the Encova Center, agreed.

"I was blown away by the ideas and even more impressed by the creative videos they produced," she said.

Those included a 90-second video with the student making the initial pitch of the product or outreach. That was the first round.

The second round also required an additional

3-minute video, followed by live question-and-answer session, via remote, with the judges.

"It's about empowering young people and getting them thinking," Vitale said.

"And if they keep thinking they just might come up with that one idea that changes everything."

The top pitches also netted cash prizes, and students from Morgantown swept the elementary

school division.

it. FOC hopes the proposed spur to the portals will help people see the need to treat the water.

The current route to the five mine portals is up a gated gravel road. FOC bought the 4.5-acre area in 2005 through a tax sale.

Two of the portals emerge from a grassy hillside. This is a reclaimed area and giant pipes drain into limestone channels. To reach the others, in unreclaimed land, you follow the run uphill, crossing it at one point. The coated rocks in the bed are so slimy they're hard to pick up.

The water is crystal clear but filamentous green algae, pretty much all that can live in the water, creates a green sci-fi effect. After crossing the run you mount The Scab, a wide hill that stands about 6 feet tall, composed of iron deposits built up over 60 to 70 years.

Pitzer said DEP didn't want to disturb it and release more metal into the water, so it now serves as a kind of protection.

One of the three portals has buried itself under iron

deposits. Icy cold water pours out. A deep bog of green brown muck that looks almost solid lies before the portals. The AMD prevents the fallen forest leaves from breaking down, Pitzer said.

Air colder than an air conditioner blows from one portal. It would be refreshing on a hot day, except it smells like sulphur.

Garrett Richardson, FOC monitoring technician, takes readings here and there along the run from the mouth to the portals.

At the mouth, pH was 2.76, highly acidic. Upstream, the pH is good, 6.87.

At the mouth, conductivity is 1,768. "It's full of metals," Richardson said.

Conductivity estimates water's ability to conduct electricity and gives a picture of the amount of dissolved solids in the water. Pure water doesn't conduct electricity.

At the portals, conductivity hits 3,000.

"I've never seen one that high," Richardson said. "Six hundred is bad."

The location of the treatment plant remains a question. Pitzer and DEP said

the valley is narrow, which makes placement problematic. Pitzer said it might have to go down closer to the trailhead.

And disposal of the metallic sludge removed from the water is another question, Pitzer said. Channeling it back might eventually fill the mine pool and

cause a dangerous blowout.

At Richard Mine, DEP said it's contemplating storing the sludge in the portion of the mine pool below the portal or placing it in geotubes — giant, porous textile tubes that allow the water to be drained out so the filled

tubes can be used for long-wall backfilling or other purposes.

And if the plant was built, Pitzer said, another problem would be paying for operation and maintenance. That would have to come from AML funds, and AML is set to expire in 2021.

Legislation to reauthorize AML is stalled, but Sens. Joe Manchin and Shelley Moore Capito and Rep. David McKinley all told The Dominion Post they're working to make sure the reauthorization gets done.

Cut three boards to the length you want the box to be — standard windows are 28 inches, which is the size of the example box in these photos. These will be the sides and bottom of your box.

Cut two end pieces — if using a one-by-eight-inch board cut the ends eight and three quarters. The actual size of a one-by-eight-inch board is three

quarters of an inch by seven and a quarter, so the end pieces will be the same height as the sides, and cover the ends like a cap.

Line your boards up for a dry fit, and determine where you will place the screws. Using a drill bit slightly smaller than your screws, pre-drill a hole in the center edge of your side boards, and into the edge of the bottom board in the exact same spot.

If using wood glue, apply now.

Screw together via this pre-drilled hole, then pre-drill more spots for screws through both the side board and bottom at once. Add screws to secure. Repeat for the other side board, then for the end caps.

Once you secure all the sides, turn your box over to rest on the open top. Using a large drill bit, create drainage holes, so water will not puddle and rot the

wood.

If keeping the box indoors, or somewhere where water dripping will be problematic, don't drill the holes, and instead line the box with plastic or another barrier. You can also set potted plants right into the box.

Paint or varnish your box, to keep the wood from showing weather wear, and to match the style of your home.

Before planting, add a layer of rocks to aid

drainage. Add soil and flowers — begonias are a great option for pretty foliage and bloom if you have a shaded window or spot for your box. For a sunny spot, options abound.

Mount the box under your window with brackets and appropriate bolts — these will differ based on whether your exterior wall is wood, brick or another material. Two or three brackets should be ample, depending on the length of

the box.

The true beauty of this simple box is how customizable it is.

Add trim along the top, frame it with two by two inch boards, add dog-eared fence tops along the outside, or make any other personalized touches so it will be unique and just to your taste, and spark a little joy every time you look at your home or out your window.

degrees Fahrenheit), which is almost as hot as the Sun.

The second layer is the outer core. This surrounds the inner core. The outer core is also made up of nickel and iron, but it is liquid. It is mostly heated by uranium and thorium's radioactive decay (the process in which an unstable atom loses energy). The outer core churns in huge currents, which also gen-

erates Earth's magnetic field. For reasons still unknown, this magnetic field reverses every 200,000 to 300,000 years.

The next layer is the mantle, which is the thickest layer. This layer is made up mostly of iron, magnesium and silicon. It is semi-solid and just like the outer core, it has currents but these currents circulate a lot more slowly. The mantle forms a layer of partially melted rock near the upper parts. This is the part that is believed

to be what the tectonic plates slide across. Pieces of the mantle that can be touched are actually diamonds. The outermost area of the mantle is cool and rigid, similar to the crust. This specific mantle layer and the crust make up what is called the lithosphere.

The outermost layer is called the crust. This layer is extremely thin, especially when compared to the other three layers. The crust is made up of silica, aluminum and oxygen. The crust is broken up into random pieces — kind of like a puzzle — and this is what we call tectonic plates. Tectonic plates

move at a rate of about 3 to 5 centimeters each year. We don't know why tectonic plates move but when they slide against each other, things such as earthquakes happen, and volcanoes and mountains occur.

When two tectonic plates slide toward each other (like a head-on collision), and if both plates rise up, mountains are created. If one of the plates goes underneath the other, this causes magma to rise up with the mountain and a volcano (such as Mount Fuji or Mount Saint Helens) is created. And, if just one plate rises up, this creates a fault-block moun-

tain range (Sierra Nevada in California is an example of a fault-block mountain range). If both plates go underneath, a valley is formed.

When I was in eighth grade, in our science class, we watched a documentary called "Mountaintop Removal," directed by Michael O'Connell. This was an eye-opening documentary, and I really recommend it. Mountaintop removal is essentially removing the tops of mountains, up to 800 feet, and it is a form of surface coal mining. It is done because the coal found in mountains has less sulfur than coal found using normal surface coal mining techniques.

Mountaintop removal is very dangerous. The particles that come from removing mountaintops can cause black lung and other serious respiratory problems, because metals mix in with the air. There are also many people living in areas around the places in which mountaintop removal occurs. The health effects that come from mountaintop removal are usually covered up by blaming the fact that most

of these people live in poverty. Additionally, mountaintop removal contaminates the water, giving it a strange orange tinge.

If we are aware of mountaintop removal and its terrible effects, we can help to stop it.

## WVU Heart and Vascular Institute cardiologist uses machine learning to predict ventricular disease

Dr. Partho Sengupta, WVU Heart and Vascular Institute Cardiology division chief and director of cardiac imaging, and an international team of researchers have implemented machine learning as an effective screening tool for early diagnosis of left ventricular diastolic dysfunction, a common form of heart failure.

Machine learning uses algorithms that automatically improve and become more accurate over time through the continued input of data.

“This research can be used by internists and physicians for early identification of heart dysfunction and to predict the progression of heart disease in order to help patients take action to improve their cardiac health,” Sengupta said. “We applied machine learning to the results of an electrocardiogram, a common, cost-effective test used by physicians. We can use that data to extract information that would otherwise come from more expensive imaging tests, using the heart’s electrical signals to provide information about the speed with which the heart is squeezing and relaxing.”

The researchers used electrocardiogram data gathered from a diverse patient population at risk of heart failure at four centers in North America to develop a predictive model of patient risk. Recent studies suggest that heart failure develops in 50% of patients due to the heart’s inability to relax. Slower relaxation requires higher pressures to fill the cardiac chamber, despite normal left ventricular ejection

fraction, the heart’s ability to pump blood out of the left side.

“By taking data from a large sample of patients in varying locations, we are able to gather information that can be applied to people from different locations and backgrounds,” Sengupta said. “We know that there are areas that are more likely to have higher incidences of heart disease due to socioeconomic factors that make it difficult to maintain a healthy lifestyle. This research will allow us to develop cost-effective screening tools that can be used in community to identify patients at risk even before they develop any symptoms.”

This model can be used to determine the patient’s current stage of disease so that early interventions can be taken in order to halt the progress or reduce the likelihood of heart failure. It takes into account the patient’s age and gender, which can inform individualized risk estimation and interventions for men and women.

Sengupta’s work is supported in part by funds from the National Science Foundation. The work is posted online on the website of the Journal of American College of Cardiology and features Naveena Yanamala, Ph.D., principal data scientist for the WVU Heart and Vascular Institute Innovation Center and Dr. Grace Casaclang-Verzosa, M.B.A., WVU Heart and Vascular Institute administrative director of non-invasive cardiology, among other distinguished international collaborators.

## Belarus blocks over 50 news websites amid large protests

MINSK, Belarus — Authorities in Belarus have blocked more than 50 news media websites reporting on how the country has been shaken by two weeks of protests demanding that authoritarian President Alexander Lukashenko resign after 26 years in power.

The Belarusian Association of Journalists reported the shutdowns Saturday, which included sites for the U.S.-funded Radio Liberty and Belsat, a Polish-funded satellite TV channel focusing on neighboring Belarus.

On Friday, the state publishing house stopped printing two top independent newspapers, the Narodnaya Volya and Komsomolskaya Pravda, citing an equipment malfunction.

Protests unprecedented in Belarus for their size and duration broke out after the Aug. 9 presidential election, which election officials said handed Lukashenko a sixth term in office in a landslide. Protesters allege the official results are fraudulent and are calling for Lukashenko to resign.

Police responded harshly in the first days of the protests, arresting some 7,000 people and harshly beating many of them. But the police crackdown only widened the scope of the protests, and anti-government strikes have been called at some of the country’s main factories, former bases of support for Lukashenko. Some police have posted videos of themselves burning their uniforms and quitting.

In an enormous show of defiance, an estimated

200,000 protesters rallied Aug. 16 in the capital, Minsk. Lukashenko’s main election challenger, Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, has called for another massive show of opposition at a protest Sunday.

“We are closer than ever to our dream,” she said in a video message from Lithuania, where she took refuge after the election. Some previous presidential challengers in Belarus have been jailed for years.

Public shows of support for Lukashenko, who has ruled Belarus with an iron fist since 1994, have been comparatively modest. A pro-government rally in Minsk on Aug. 16 attracted about a quarter as many people as the protest march. On Saturday, only about 25 people showed up for a bicycle ride to show support for the president.

On Saturday, hundreds of women dressed in white formed a chain in Minsk as sign of protest and a larger demonstration was expected in the evening.

“Threats, intimidation, blocking no longer work. Hundreds of thousands of Belarusians are telling him ‘go away’ from all corners and squares,” said Anna Skuratovich, one of the women in the chain.

Protesters said they are fed up with the country’s declining living standards and have been angered at Lukashenko’s dismissal of the coronavirus pandemic.

Lukashenko alleges that the protests are inspired by Western forces including the United States and that NATO is deploying forces near Belarus’ western border. The alliance firmly denies that claim.

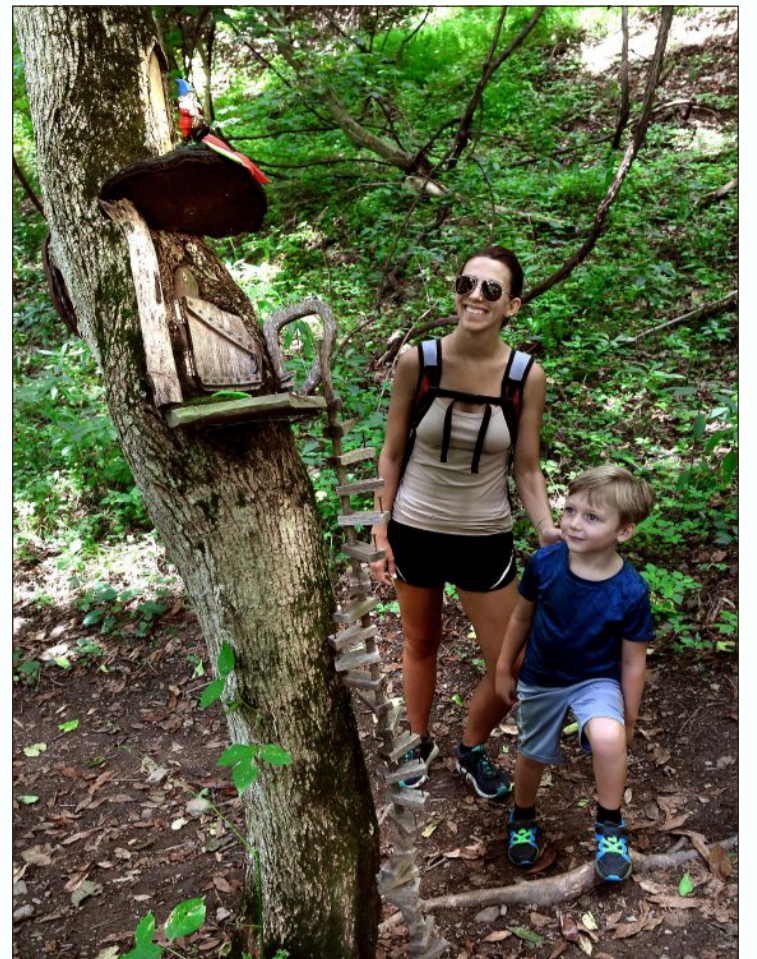

## Republicans Look Ahead

Did you watch any of the Democratic National Convention last week? This coming week, the Republicans will gather in two cities: Charlotte, North Carolina, from Aug. 21-24, and Jacksonville, Florida, from Aug. 24-27. Their meetings may look very different from the Democrats'.

### Coming together

A political party (a group of people who have similar ideas about how our country should be run) holds a national meeting, called a **convention**, before a presidential election. At that meeting, representatives from each state, called **delegates**, announce which **candidate** they have chosen to run for president.

The candidate also may announce his or her choice for a **running mate**, who would become vice president if they are elected.

At the convention, members of the party also discuss the party's **platform**, or its ideas and goals about different issues facing the country.

The Republicans plan to hold party meetings and formally nominate President Donald J. Trump in Charlotte. Then they'll move to Jacksonville, where there will be speeches and other festivities to celebrate President Trump's nomination.

### Who's running?

President Trump is running for a second term as the leader of our country. Vice President Mike Pence is his running mate.

When a president competes for a second term, he is called an **incumbent**. According to the U.S. Constitution, presidents can serve for only two terms of four years each. If President Trump should win a second term, it will be his last as president.

### About Jacksonville

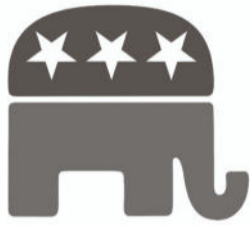
Jacksonville is also a city of about a million people. It is in the northeast corner of Florida, along the St. John's River and close to the Atlantic Ocean.

## Brown sees no issue for players with no fans at EKU game

Team practices with no music Saturday at football stadium

WVU coach Neal Brown doesn't think his players will have much of a problem getting up for the Eastern Kentucky season opener on Sept. 12, even with no fans in the stands.

In fact, he's more "disappointed" for the fans who won't be

able to sit in the friendly confines of Milan Puskar Stadium.

"Our players? They'll be fine. They'll get up there and be excited to play," Brown said Saturday. "Would they like to play in front of the fans and a full stadium? Absolutely, but I really feel for our fans because they really look forward to it. We have one of the best fan bases in the entire country, so I really feel for our fans."

Athletic director Shane Lyons announced last Thursday only

game-essential personnel and families of players and coaches will be permitted to attend the EKU game, but the situation will be re-evaluated for Big 12 play, beginning with the Oct. 3 home game against Baylor.

The decision, which was collaborated between university, state and local officials, is different from what many other Big 12 schools are trying to do. Texas Tech, Iowa State, Baylor, Kansas State, TCU, Oklahoma and Texas all announced capacities between 20-25%. WVU is the only school in the conference that said it will not have

## A look at what the 2020-21 season may look like for WVU

As of right now, the WVU men's basketball team is set to begin preseason practices on Sept. 29, which is 42 days from its season opener on Nov. 10 against Fairleigh Dickinson.

That may change in the coming weeks, as the NCAA is expected to announce some changes to the sport's schedule amidst the COVID-19 pandemic in September.

"What I'm happy about is we're doing it now," Kentucky head coach John Calipari told ESPN Radio. "We're not waiting until two months from now saying, 'Well, what do we do now?' No, we're doing it now to try to figure it out."

What those changes may be is up for speculation, but the successful bubble formats used by The Basketball Tournament in July and currently by the NBA will likely have the NCAA's attention. The problem: How do you cre-

ate a large enough and safe enough bubble for 32 Division I conferences that house 353 schools?

Other problems exist, too, like how much travel will be permitted and whether or not fans

will be allowed into arenas.

Will there be a delay to the season? Will non-conference games be played?

These are also good questions that the NCAA are looking at.

For now, let's have some fun and try to take an educated guess on what may and may not happen for the 2020-21 season.

### Will there be an NCAA tournament in 2021?

According to published reports, the NCAA lost out on \$375 million by canceling the 2020 NCAA tournament.

That is the governing body's No. 1 source for yearly revenue, since football money does not go to the NCAA.

So, it's highly unlikely the tournament can be skipped again.

The better question here: What will the format look like?

Could the NCAA expand the tournament for one year, especially if it decides to dissolve nonconference games?

That's a possibility, one that Dan Gavitt, senior vice president of NCAA basketball, told ESPN the organization was looking into in terms of costs

## Mon River Rail-Trail inducted into hall of fame

Chances are if you live or have ever lived in Morgantown you've walked along the Mon River Rail-Trail. Whether you were relaxing below the WVU Arboretum, taking in Hazel Ruby McQuain Park or moving from Morgantown Brewing Company to Mountain State Brewing Company, the Mon River Rail-Trail is a community gem that tends to be overlooked.

Except, when it matters most, it isn't. The 29-mile Mon River-Caperton trail system, which runs from the West Virginia-Pennsylvania state line to Prickett's Fort State Park, and the 19-mile Deckers Creek Trail which runs from Hazel Ruby McQuain Park to Morgan Mine Road in Preston County, was inducted into the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy Hall of Fame last week following a national vote. The honor makes it the 34th inductee in the history of RTC. Even better, it beat rail-trail systems in Pittsburgh, Milwaukee and Illinois — much bigger population centers than Morgantown — by a landslide.

"That's pretty significant," RTC's Director of Trail Development Kelly Pack said. "That is a testament to the amazing grassroots support that the trail has. And Wisconsin and Pennsylvania are two of the states with the most RTC members."

"The Mon River Rail-Trails are an entrance into the beauty of the Appalachian Mountains and all the bounty of wildflowers, wildlife, waterfalls, and birds, that comes with it," Ella Belling, executive director of the Mon River Trails Conservancy, said. "These rail-trails also show off our community spirit and unique character. The beauty of local artists grace the rail-trails, the talents of local musicians can be

## NCAA eligibility ruling solves some problems, creates others

For the college athletes who are heading into a season of uncertainty brought on by COVID-19, the NCAA's decision to not charge them a year of eligibility — no matter how much they play — brings peace of mind.

And happy parents.

"My mom's more excited about it than I am," said running back Deshaun Fenwick, who is heading into his third year at South Carolina. "When I call her later in the day she's going to tell me I can stay and get my master's."

The decision does not come without complications. Paying for all those extra scholarships

will be tricky for schools tightening budgets and some athletes might find their coaches aren't so eager to welcome them back. Plus, the backlog of athletes cycling out of college could mean fewer opportunities for the next wave coming from high school.

"We're trying to create flexibility like we've never seen in

college athletics," said South Dakota State athletic director Justin Sell, who is a member of the Division I Council.

College administrators have gone through this already. The recommendation made by the Division I Council earlier this week, and approved by the Board

**West Virginia high school games to limit attendance**

**PARKERSBURG** — Attendance at West Virginia high school football games will be limited to family members of players and coaches during the first few weeks of the season.

The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission (WVSSAC) released guidelines Friday for sports competitions and extracurricular activities.

The guidelines are based on the state's color-coded re-entry map for public schools during the coronavirus pandemic. The map uses four colors to classify the opening status of each of the 55

county school systems based on virus transmission rates.

The system will be used during the first two weeks of the football season, which starts on Sept. 3.

Immediate household family members will be allowed into football games involving counties in the green category, while only parents and guardians can attend games in counties in the yellow category.

No games are allowed if a county is in the orange or red category. Currently, Monongalia County is in the yellow (3.1-9.9 positive cases per 100,000 people), while Preston County is in the green (3 or fewer cases per 100,000 people).

**Steelers want LB Bush to take mental leap**

**PITTSBURGH** — Devin Bush's speed was never in question. If anything, it's one of the reasons the Pittsburgh Steelers traded up to grab the inside linebacker with the innate knack for getting to the ball as quickly as possible in the 2019 draft.

Yet for Bush to make "the leap" — the phrase Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin uses to describe what players need to do between their first and second seasons in the NFL if they want to succeed — the speed they need Bush to display won't come from his legs but from between his ears.

Bush's responsibilities entering 2020 will be more than just chasing the ball. He's expected to be the one wearing the green dot that relays the call from the sideline to his teammates, and then help them adjust when necessary.

"I'm looking for that step to be revealed in the quality and the amount of his communication, and he still has room for improvement in that regard," Tomlin said. "He's better than he was, but as a defensive quarterback, as you will, I'm really looking for significant maturation in that area. He's checking all the other boxes."

The practice field on Friday offered proof. During a live 11-on-11 series, Bush sniffed out a screen pass to running back James Conner and split a couple of offensive linemen before taking Conner down for a loss. It was typical Bush, whose lack of relative height at 5-foot-11 isn't a minus but a plus. He has the ability to slither around blocks with ease, his No. 55 often a blur before it reaches its destination. His 109 tackles led the NFL's fifth-ranked defense, and he played all 16 games, heady territory while playing for a unit that historically brings along rookies slowly.

Not Bush, who doesn't do much of anything slowly. Among the front seven, only outside linebackers Bud Dupree and TJ Watt played more than Bush's 889 snaps. He did a little bit of everything, intercepting two passes, recovering four fumbles and getting a sack, though his playing time dipped over the second half as the wear and tear of playing 16 games caught up with him.

Bush understands his first season was solid if not always spectacular, and that more will be required if the Steelers are to return to the playoffs for the first time since 2017.

"I think last year I came in, went in and played (and) learned as things came to me," Bush said. "Now, I have a pretty good idea of what I want to get done, how I can help this team win more, and what can I get better with as a player to help this team win."

That means not just knowing where he needs to go, but knowing where the other 10 guys on the field in black and gold need to go, too. Though the COVID-19 pandemic forced the NFL to run its typical offseason schedule virtually — taking away organized team activities and minicamp, which typically serve as important checkpoints in player development — Bush believes he's taken the necessary strides. Defensive coordinator Keith Butler's scheme no longer seems so foreign.

"Just watching myself from last season and critiquing myself during the offseason, I definitely picked up the playbook a lot easier," Bush said. "I'm a lot more comfortable with who I'm playing with and what scheme I am playing with. I have a good foundation that I laid down last year to build off. It should be a lot easier for me this year."

any fans for at least one game.

Brown, though, isn't worried about any competitive disadvantages and knows why the decisions on fan attendance are a local discussion and not a league-wide mandate.

"I don't think there's a way to make it uniform, honestly," he said. "It's all about how the virus is going in that particular area. Whether we play at home or on the road, or they have fans and we don't, we've gotta get ready to play."

A report released last week said the NFL is contemplating the idea of pumping in fake crowd noise, similar to what MLB has done throughout its season, as well as the

NHL and NBA in their respective bubbles.

A WVU spokesperson said it has not been decided whether crowd noise will be pumped into Milan Puskar Stadium, or whether the Pride of West Virginia and cheerleaders will be able to attend.

However, Brown is trying to practice in a situation where noise is as limited as possible.

"We practiced [Saturday] with no music or anything like that in the stadium," he said. In the NBA bubble, "Those are some of the best athletes in the world competing at an elite level with no fans. If LeBron James can play in front of no fans, I think all the Mountaineers can line up and execute and be excited about playing."

**Offense breaks out as Pirates rip Brewers 12-5**

**PITTSBURGH** — Adam Frazier and Jacob Stallings homered and drove in three runs apiece, helping the Pittsburgh Pirates pound the Milwaukee Brewers 12-5 on Saturday.

Pittsburgh collected 14 hits for the second straight day, good enough for its first win streak since last September. Gregory Polanco had a home run and a double for his first two-hit game in 15 months. Colin Moran doubled three times, and Erik Gonzalez chipped in a two-run double in the seventh as the Pirates batted around against Milwaukee's suddenly vulnerable bullpen. Pittsburgh's nine extra-base hits were a season high, and its run total matched the most surrendered by the Brewers this year.

Derek Holland (1-1) surrendered one run in five innings in his 300th major league appearance. The veteran left-hander allowed four hits in his first victory as a starter since April 9, 2019, for San Francisco.

The Pirates entered the weekend with the worst

record in the major leagues after dropping 14 of 16. Their sputtering offense, however, has found a semblance of a groove against the Brewers. Pittsburgh's 19 runs against Milwaukee in the first two games of the series is one less than the club managed over its previous seven games combined.

Polanco, who came in hitting .085 in his return to the lineup following an injury-marred 2019, drilled a two-run homer off Josh Lindblom (1-1) in the third. Frazier led off the fifth with his fourth homer, and Stallings hit a two-run shot in the sixth as the Pirates built a six-run lead.

Keston Hiura drilled a three-run homer in the seventh off Pittsburgh reliever Dovydas Neverauskas, pulling Milwaukee within three. The Pirates responded in the bottom of the inning by sending nine runners to the plate, highlighted by Gonzalez's big swing.

Former University High and WVU star Jedd Gyorko hit a home run for the Brewers against Holland in the fourth inning, his third homer of the season.

# Indy 500 does its best to shine as show goes on in pandemic

INDIANAPOLIS — The Indianapolis 500 has been stripped almost to the bone for the 104th running of “The Greatest Spectacle in Racing.”

The iconic test of man and machine is too important to new owner Roger Penske to cancel in the year of the coronavirus pandemic. Its importance to the survival of IndyCar teams meant the race had to be staged even if the gates at Indianapolis Motor Speedway will be closed to fans for the first time in its long, storied history.

“Virtually every sponsorship you have is tied to this event. It’s the 800-pound gorilla,” said Bobby Rahal, owner of three cars entered in Sunday’s race that was rescheduled from its traditional Memorial Day weekend slot.

“I think the idea of not having the Indy 500 would have been disastrous to probably every team,” he said. “It would have been a death knell to some teams, so, yes, this race had to happen.”

Penske, the billionaire businessman who closed his purchase of the national landmark speedway and the series itself in January, will host the marquee race practically out of pocket. The Indy 500 was

anceled only during World War I and World War II and Penske’s staff has gone to extreme lengths to make the race still feel like a world-class event even without fans.

It’s cachet improved when Marco Andretti won the pole, a feat not done by his famous family since Mario Andretti did it in 1987. Marco was just two months old when his grandfather won his last Indy pole and Marco’s father, uncle and cousin all failed to duplicate the effort.

Mario’s victory in 1969 is the only Indy 500 win among five Andretti drivers covering 74 starts. It was Marco, as a rookie in 2006, who last came closest to ending the “Andretti Curse” when he was beaten at the finish line.

This is his time, a full 15 years later, and Andretti is up for the challenge. The family will be honored before the race as Mario Andretti drives son, Michael, around the speedway in the two-seater before Marco takes the green flag.

“I feel good and I’m not stressed out. My grandfather and I even talked about it, there’s something about our family that lives for this type of good pressure,” Andretti said. “I feel

at home. I feel in my element. Feeling pressure means you are playing for something.”

His top competition seems to be his very own Andretti Autosport teammates as the Honda-powered cars trounced Chevrolet in qualifying. The Andretti camp starts four drivers in the first three rows, while Honda took all but one of the nine slots.

The front of the pack includes a pair of rookies: Alex Palou in a Honda for Dale Coyne Racing, and 19-year-old Rinus VeeKay, the lone Chevrolet driver to crack the fast nine who is mentored by fellow Dutchmen and two-time Indy 500 winner Arie Luyendyk.

The Chevrolet contingent is mostly stuck in the back of the 33-car field — which filled up late. DragonSpeed Racing with driver Ben Hanley announced its entry just last week and missed almost two full days of practice getting a car prepared.

The back of the field includes Penske’s entire four-car fleet, which includes the last two winners in Simon Pagenaud and Will Power, defending IndyCar champion Josef Newgarden, and three-time Indy 500 winner Helio Castroneves.

# Hamlin holds off JGR teammate Truex Jr. for 1st Dover victory

DOVER, Del — Denny Hamlin crossed Dover off the meager list of tracks where he had yet to win and turned his ambitions toward one more goal he’d like to scratch off the docket.

Pushing 40, Hamlin’s first career Cup championship is within his grasp — and he might never be better.

“I’m in the prime of my career right now and I’ve got things rolling,” Hamlin said.

Hamlin tamed the concrete mile oval that gave him fits for 15 years and zipped past Joe Gibbs Racing teammate Martin Truex Jr. with eight laps left to win the NASCAR Cup Series race Saturday at Dover International Speedway.

Hamlin was 0 for 28 at Dover, the kind of losing

streak that had him studying the runs of his more successful JGR teammates in Truex and Kyle Busch to pick up tips on how best to win at the track.

He learned from his teammates — then beat them in the No. 11 Toyota, though Truex’s runner-up finish and Busch’s third gave JGR a 1-2-3 finish in the first of two races this weekend at Dover.

“People always ask what your least favorite track is and I say Dover just because I’m not that good,” Hamlin said. “I love the track, I just haven’t been very good here.”

Hamlin matched Kevin Harvick for the season victory lead with six, matching his total from last season and closing within two of his career high set in 2010. He opened this season with a Daytona 500 win, and

added wins at Homestead, Pocono and Kansas to catapult toward the kind of sensational run he’s never had in an otherwise stellar career.

“There’s been no year where it’s been like this,” Hamlin said. “Every week. It’s literally every single week. We set some lofty goals at the beginning of the year to try to win 10 races. It’s still achievable. We should have more than six easily.”

He just had to mute the victory celebration. Hamlin was ordered by crew chief Chris Gabehart to save the No. 11 Toyota from a burnout because the car is needed again today.

Hamlin went from the car to carhop, laughing as he said he needed to order milkshakes for the crew prepping the car late into the night.

# Mountaineers scrimmage inside stadium

West Virginia conducted an 88-play, two-hour, officiated scrimmage Saturday at Milan Puskar Stadium under sunny skies and reasonably cool temperatures for mid-August.

It was just the second time since March 12 the entire team has been together in one setting and it was the first time since last year’s TCU game the team has tackled in a live setting.

There was no simulated noise nor music in the stadium to reflect the atmosphere the team will encounter for its season opener against Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 12.

“We just put the ball down and played a lot,” West Virginia coach Neal Brown said. “Conditioning wise, we’re not where we need to be. We ran approximately 40 plays with the ones and twos and 20 with the threes.

“We worked some situations also— two-minute, goal line, third downs and red zones.”

Brown thought the defense performed well in red zone, goal line and quick change situations while the three different offensive units had some success moving the football in open-field situations.

The offense ran the football much more effectively than it did at any time last year during preseason camp with Leddie Brown enjoying most of that success, the junior ripping off one long run down the far sideline and scoring a touchdown during goal-line scrimmaging.

“Leddie was really good and he is a guy for us to be one of the most improved teams in the country he’s got to be a guy that is consistent for us,” Brown said. “He was more patient. He finished runs and made guys miss and broke tackles at the second and third levels, which has been a point of emphasis.”

The interior offensive line consisting of guard James Gmitter, center Chase Behrnt and guard Michael Brown were responsible for a good deal of Brown’s success running between the tackles.

receiver Bryce Ford-Wheaton continues to string together solid practices with another strong showing. The Fuquay-Varina, N.C., native made a couple of nice long catches and also finished the scrimmage with a touchdown.

“Bryce has had really good days except for one. He’s got talent. He’s got the speed and he’s just got to put it together,” Brown said. “He’s a little bit further ahead than I thought he’d be and he had some big days.”

Brown mentioned the offensive work put forth by young wide receivers Reese Smith and Graeson Malashevich, who combined to make several tough catches in traffic.

The coach was also pleased that there was no fumbles committed by the three different offensive units that played.

The defensive play of the day was made by redshirt freshman Naim Muhammad, from Washington, D.C., who made an exceptional one-handed interception at the goal line of a Garrett Greene pass.

Junior outside linebacker Exree Loe picked off an Austin Kendall pass and freshman bandit linebacker Taurus Simmons was credited with a sack.

“I’ve been impressed with Exree,” Brown said. “He’s got talent. He’s gotten his weight up to where it needs to be. For the last two years he’s been one of our best special teams players and he

made plays on defense.”

Brown also cited the play of true freshman defensive lineman Akheem Mesidor and senior middle linebacker Dylan Tonkery.

Brown said Mesidor will be in the defensive line rotation when the season kicks off on Sept. 12 and Tonkery is fitting the runs better and is becoming more comfortable in the defense.

“I even heard him talk a little bit out on the field, which is a positive,” Brown said.

The players will have today off and will resume practicing Monday. The first day of classes is scheduled to begin Wednesday.

**Saturday scrimmage notes**

■ Brown said the last “150-plus” COVID-19 tests were all negative.

“I’m fired up about that,” he said. “I think that says that our processes are working. But by no means am I getting my pom-poms out and cheering because the next two weekends are going to be critical and that’s what I told our players.”

■ There were only five penalties during the two-hour scrimmage with all of them going against the offense. Three of those were procedure penalties, something Brown was unhappy about with Friday’s practice.

■ Senior Evan Staley successfully kicked two field goals covering distances of 44 and 38 yards.

“Outside of one day, Evan Staley has had a nice fall camp so far,” Brown said.

■ Quarterback Austin Kendall hooked up with Louisville transfer Keion Wakefield for a pretty back-shoulder 23-yard scoring play early in the scrimmage.

Kendall later hit Ford-Wheaton for a 35-yard reception down the middle of the field.

■ The longest play of the scrimmage was Leddie Brown’s 43-yard run.

■ Senior running back Lorenzo Dorr ripped off a nice 27-yard gainer and also had a nice finish to his run.

and locations.

However the tournament is formatted, you could bet good money there will be a 2021 NCAA tournament.

**Chances of it being canceled:** 0-5%

**If changes are made to the nonconference schedule, could WVU play Marshall?**

Some highly-unlikely scenarios would have to play out for this to happen.

Be very aware, though, that some type of change is coming for the nonconference season.

That could mean a delay. That could also mean a lower number of non-conference games.

The Pac-12 has already eliminated its nonconference hoops season, stating that its teams will not begin play until Jan. 1.

Other conferences may follow that lead. The NCAA may come out and say that’s the best way to go.

But, let’s get back to WVU-Marshall. Maybe the NCAA comes out and says it will allow nonconference games only if the distance between the schools is within reasonable driving distance.

Even then, both schools would likely be in a heated debate on the site of the game(s), because the Thundering Herd would almost kill for a home game against the Mountaineers and WVU has no interest playing in Huntington.

And the Thundering Herd don’t want to be looked down upon, so they would not likely agree to play at the WVU Coliseum without a return game in Huntington.

**Chances of WVU and Marshall playing this**

season: 0-10%.

**What about the Battle 4 Atlantis?**

This may be the biggest downfall of the nonconference season for the Mountaineers.

The Thanksgiving tournament takes place annually in the Bahamas and was also scheduled to feature top teams such as Duke, Ohio State and Creighton in November.

Utah was also scheduled to play, but the Pac-12’s decision to cancel all sports until Jan. 1 means tournament organizers are already searching for another suitable participant.

The concerning thing here is travel. Will the NCAA allow teams to fly internationally during a pandemic?

If the NCAA doesn’t allow it, that could also cancel plans for four other tournaments scheduled for the Bahamas, Jamaica and Puerto Rico.

The Battle 4 Atlantis organizers could move the tournament to the U.S. for this season, but has yet to announce any decisions.

**Chances of WVU playing in the Battle 4 Atlantis:** 50-50.

**What about Pitt?**

The two rivals are scheduled to finish their original four-game series — an additional two games were announced in June — at the WVU Coliseum on Nov. 13.

The only thing keeping this game from happening this season would be a cancellation of the non-conference season.

**Chances that WVU and Pitt play this season:** 80-100%

**Other key games**

WVU’s game against Purdue at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. is another key game in question.

The same could be said for the Mountaineers’ opponents in the Big 12/SEC Challenge and the Big East/Big 12 Battle, which have yet to be announced.

Travel restrictions and whether or not there is a non-conference season would be the main thing there.

Which leads us to our final dilemma:

**Can the Big 12 season be played in a bubble?**

WVU assistant coach Erik Martin actually floated an idea on social media not long ago, which called for Big 12 teams to play their conference season in Kansas City’s Sprint Center.

Martin’s idea was for each team to play six games in a two-week span, return to campus for two weeks and then repeat this process two more times.

That would have the conference season finished in 10 weeks, which is the same amount of time the Big 12 schedules for a normal regular season.

That would surely cut down on travel costs. The Sprint Center should be available for those times.

The question becomes what would happen to a team that has a player(s) test positive for COVID-19?

Having teams return to campus for two weeks could be dicey, but so could the players’ academics if they were forced away from campus to play in a bubble for nearly three months.

A bubble situation has worked for the NBA, because it only had to worry about the players’ well-being and not about keeping their athletes on track to graduate.

This one is truly a tough call.

## Bald eagles have fascinating story in United States history

When the average person sees our national emblem, the bald eagle, the word “majestic” comes to mind. I’m no different. There is something about eagles that stirs our soul and helps us relate to our country and our environment. It’s always been that way for Native Americans and Alaska Natives, and they have used eagle feathers for religious and cultural purposes for hundreds of years.

Depending what state you drive in, the sight of a mature bald eagle is not uncommon. It wasn’t always this way. In 1963, there were only 486 nesting pairs of bald eagles in the United States and extinction was a real possibility. The reason was that the eagles were eating fish contaminated with the pesticide DDT. This chemical prevented the production of strong eggshells, so much so that their eggs often broke during incubation or otherwise failed to hatch.

In 1972, DDT was banned in the United

States and ever since that time, bald eagles have made a steady growth. In modern times the first bald eagle nest in West Virginia was seen in 1981, and today, more than 100 nests occur here. This is nothing compared to the 30,000 bald eagles residing in Alaska, but their sightings are still attention getters.

Since Native Americans and Alaska Natives use eagle feathers for cultural and religious ceremonies, they have a need for them. However, as a protected species, there existed a bit of a conundrum. That was resolved in the early 1970s when the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service created the National Eagle Repository near Denver. The pur-

pose of this facility is to provide a location for the receipt, storage and distribution of bald and golden eagles found dead throughout the United States.

Government regulations determine the distribution of eagle feathers to Native Americans who want to obtain parts of eagles. You have to be 18 years of age and fill out an application to obtain eagle feathers and parts of eagles. The repository gets eagles from federal and state conservation agencies, zoological parks, federal rehabilitators and others who may legally possess and transport dead eagles.

There is no question that some living eagles are illegally taken from the wild, but the repository and leaders of the various Native American tribes work hard to reduce the pressure to do so. Plus, there are laws making such removal illegal. No one can legally buy, sell, trade, import, or exports eagle feathers or items made from eagle feathers.

Demand for feathers by Native Americans is such that there are waiting times for orders to be filled. Applicants have to wait approximately two years for a whole bird, and one year for a pair of wings from a bald eagle. For 10 quality bald or golden eagle feathers, the waiting time is six months and for 20 miscellaneous feathers the wait is three months.

If a Native American owned an eagle feather and eagle parts gotten before they were first protected by federal law (1940 for bald eagles, 1962 for golden eagles), they can possess them. If the feathers were passed down within a family, they can possess them and if a Native American received feathers as a gift from another Native American, they can possess them.

Native Americans may wear the feathers in their possession or make them into religious or cultural items for tribal or personal use. Again, no one, Native American or other-

wise, can kill or capture eagles. Those doing eagle research can get a permit to capture eagles from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife.

Back in the 1700s, Congress debated putting the bald eagle on the Congressional Seal, making it our national emblem. Ben Franklin did not like the idea. Right after the Declaration of Independence was signed in 1776, Franklin, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams were selected as a committee to design the seal. The designs included Hercules and the children of Israel and were so bad that Congress tabled the ideas.

A second committee in 1780 failed as did a third committee in 1782 (although one committee member did have an eagle in his proposal). Since Congressional Committees couldn’t get it done, Congress turned the job over to their secretary, a man named Charles Thomson. Thomson’s eagle drawings were bad, but verbally he wanted “an

American eagle on the wing, and rising proper.” “American” eagle referred to bald eagles, commonly seen around various colonies at the time.

Behind the scenes throughout this discussion, Ben Franklin spoke and wrote despairingly about the bald eagle, a predator that killed other animals and a bird that steals the fish captured by ospreys. Clearly, Franklin did not like eagles. He felt the wild turkey was more respectable and a “bird of courage.” Hmm. There are historians that feel that all of Franklin’s comments were tongue in cheek, and indeed he once spoke of the eagle being a “bird of victory.”

The debate ended, and the national emblem became the bald eagle. Revered then and revered today.

of Directors on Friday, mimics what was done in the spring after the pandemic canceled seasons in sports such as baseball, softball and lacrosse.

Seniors will be permitted to return next year and not count against a sport’s roster or scholarship limits. Underclassmen will get access to a waiver they can use to extend their careers, but beyond the 2021-22 academic year, those athletes will count against scholarship and roster limits. So Clemson junior quarterback Trevor Lawrence, who started as a freshman, could conceivably play a full 2020 season and two more.

And while the NCAA is giving back the eligibility, no athlete is guaranteed financial aid or a scholarship. Those decisions will be left to the schools.

The big difference between applying this model to fall and spring is football, where FBS teams can have up to 85 scholarship players and the FCS limit is 63. Those scholarship can range from \$30,000 per year to pushing \$80,000 at a private school like Notre Dame or Stanford. With colleges and their athletic departments facing massive revenue losses as a result of the pandemic, funding extra scholarships will be challenging.

“We may have some tough decisions, but we do all the time,” said Sell, whose school competes in the FCS Missouri Valley Football Conference.

Iowa of the Big Ten, which hopes to play football in the winter and spring, announced Friday it was discontinuing four sports: men’s tennis, men’s and women’s swimming and diving, and men’s gymnastics.

Major college football teams could end up with 100 or more scholarship players

next season. The thought of bringing back a bunch of sixth-year seniors will bring smiles to some coaches — especially at programs that rely more on developmental players than blue-chip recruits who tend to be short-timers anyway.

“I know this, if we had every guy who could come back next year and did come back next year, we would have a really, really loaded group,” Cincinnati coach Luke Fickell said.

There are 257 Division I football programs (130 in FBS) that will start the 2021 fall season with, essentially, two freshmen classes, upward of 40 players who still have four years of eligibility left. There are no plans as of now to adjust scholarship limits after next year to address the clogged pipeline.

“I think anybody that knows the true workings of inside programs, these college program will run kids off,” said Nate Hillerich, football coach at Pickerington North High School in the suburbs of Columbus, Ohio. “Kids will be transferring, going to lower levels.”

Eventually that could squeeze out high school players as college teams divert scholarships to players in the transfer portal or keep some tied up an extra year on players who want to cash in the 2020 eligibility they have in the bank.

What happens to the high school recruits as the scholarship opportunities shrink?

“You’re going to see junior college football really elevate,” said Chad Johnson, football coach at Mission Viejo High School in Southern California. “Fast forward a year or two, there’s going to be colleges going through all the JCs to get those players that got caught in the in between because they can play right away and they’re good vs. recruiting high school kids.”

heard at two trailside outdoor amphitheaters, community festivals, and in our trailside bars, and the flavors of our town can be tasted at many trailside restaurants and breweries in Morgantown and Star City. The Mon River Rail-Trails are a West Virginia gem that welcome, energize and restore the heart and mind of those who choose a rail-trail adventure.”

While a clear victory for the Mountain State, the Mon River Rail-Trail system is only part of a large network of trails around the state. It is, however, the model of success for those other trails and is the center point in the Parkersburg-to-Pittsburgh project that Pack has been heading, which would expand the tourism drive in West Virginia. And it wouldn’t just get folks from the Steel City but could draw people traveling from Washington D.C. on the Great Allegheny Passage Trail, a 150-mile stretch of rail-trail that crosses through the Cumberland Narrows, Eastern Continental Divide, Ohio, and West Virginia.

The link to the community Belling noted is what the Mon River system can hang its figurative hat on. Construction began in 1998 after the Mon River Trails Conservancy was formed in 1991. There were skeptics at first, but it didn’t take long for it to begin driving economic development, provide transportation corridors for those who work along the trail and spur activists to clean up and protect the ecosystems that encompass the trails, such as Deckers Creek. Along the Mon River Trail, the brightest example is the revitalization of the Wharf District. Once a barren strip of riverbank full of abandoned buildings and

other eye-sores, it’s now a vibrant area with restaurants, offices and hotels.

“The early vision was to transform the Morgantown riverfront from abandoned warehouses and industrial wasteland into a valued community asset and re-establish community life with a mix of residential and businesses,” Belling said. “That vision continues today with more neighborhood links to the rail-trail system in the works, and more trail art, more trail-side music, and more community causes being funded with runs, walks, and cycling events. Though known as a rail-trail hub in

the university town of Morgantown, the rail-trails route through a mix of urban amenities, remote outdoor beauty of forests and creeks, and small rural communities in three counties of North-Central West Virginia. At the earliest stages, this dedicated, founding group envisioned changes to the community health and the health and wellness of its residents being greatly improved with a 50-mile rail-trail. Even then, they had the dream of seeing hundreds of miles of connected trail as negotiations with CSX were happening on nearby corridors in WV and Pennsylvania.”

Belling herself has benefited from the trail system. After almost 30 years with the conservancy, she can say it’s a job she loves.

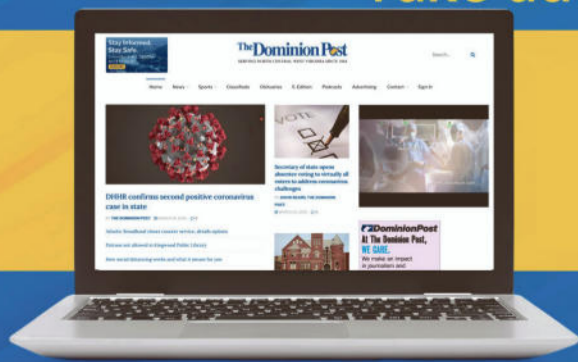
“I love to hear peoples’ stories that are associated with their adventures on the trail,” she said. “There is a lot of patience and setbacks that have to be connected to my job, but I go out, bike and hike, enjoy nature and enjoy going into our trail-side shops. It’s just been a wonderful community asset for someone who lives in Morgantown. It’s an amazing backyard asset to go on a 50-mile trail.”

## Still fighting over Diamond

People have long fought over diamonds, but this is getting ridiculous. Granted, we aren't talking about precious gems. Rather, we're talking about Diamond Village and its inhabitants — arguably far more valuable.

The discussion around Diamond Village even more complex than it is divisive, which is saying something considering the heated back-and-forth we've seen in the Morgantown community since June. On one hand, the homeless encampment is an eyesore for Greenmont and makes the neighbors uncomfortable. On the other, Diamond Village is a contained place where members of the unhoused community can go, and where they feel safe, which keeps them from hanging out in front of downtown businesses. On one hand, a tent city isn't exactly the warmest, driest, cleanest place for a person to sleep. On the other, it provides more shelter than sleeping on benches, under bridges or in the woods. On one hand, there have been 44 overdoses at the camp, all reversed by Naxolone, so we know drug use is happening. On the other, drug use can happen anywhere in Morgantown, and that's 44 fewer bodies in the morgue and 44 chances for recovery.

With a matter this multifaceted, there are no easy solutions. There are no quick resolutions. Which is why we're extremely disappointed with the Mon County Health Department's decision to issue citations against the city, resulting in the city deciding to clear out the encampment ASAP.

We have several issues with MCHD's actions. On a strictly humanitarian level, it is cruel to disband Diamond Village in the middle of a pandemic, particularly when doing so goes against CDC guidelines. Next, according to the 64-CSR-18 — which the statute MCHD insists Morgantown and Diamond Village are in violation of — a campground is defined as "a tract of land established, maintained and offered to the public for payment for the location or placement of two or more camping units [including tents]." Last we checked, the land wasn't offered to the public — the residents of Diamond Village set up shop there in protest — and residents haven't paid to be there. It seems Diamond Village doesn't meet the criteria of a "campground," which means Morgantown isn't running an illegal and/or non-permitted campground. Unless there's something we don't know. In which case, we hope someone will educate us.

Until the health department started issuing citations, there was a plan in place to gather members of the Diamond Village community and representatives of organizations to come up with a solution that meets everyone's needs and allows the unsheltered individuals a say in what happens next. Because of MCHD's interference, the city has implemented a housing plan (which is not a bad thing, per se) on an accelerated timetable (which is a bad thing), without input from the people directly impacted. And the current approach only helps the current residents, leaving other unhoused people without access to this opportunity.

If sanitation at Diamond Village is a concern, MCHD should have sat down with the various stakeholders and worked out a solution to keep the property clean while it's in use. Instead, MCHD threw down costly citations that forced the city into immediate action to avoid penalties, destroying carefully made plans and agreements.

### Support USPS despite recent spotty delivery

I am sorry to write this letter, but I must. In the greater Grand Street (South Park) area, we have had our share of mail delivery problems but recently the quality of U.S. Postal Service has deteriorated to the point where it is intolerable.

Let me present a few examples of what is happening. At the end of July, our regular mail carrier was removed from our route. Delivery is made by different substitutes who arrive any time between 3-6 p.m. Leaving outgoing mail for pickup is a gamble, so I now take it downtown myself. Netflix sent me two discs that were scheduled to arrive on July 30-31 but have never arrived. When I reported this to Postmaster Stephanie Teets (via e-mail because the Postal

Plaza phone goes unanswered), she told me that my mail slot was empty. I fear they were incorrectly delivered to another address. Netflix sent me two more discs on Aug. 4; one arrived Aug. 7, and the second was apparently delivered by a kind neighbor on Aug. 11.

One Grand Street neighbor received a whole bundle of packages and letters

addressed to the same house number on Wilson Avenue! Two days ago, I received all my next door neighbor's mail. I have heard several similar complaints from others about the increasing incidents of lost, late and misdirected mail.

If one neighborhood in Morgantown is having so many postal delivery issues, what must be the volume of problems at the national level? Given Trump's opposition, our mail service is in grave danger! Many people plan to vote absentee in the November election, but how can we be sure our ballots will arrive safely?

We must all speak up to protect this service. We must demand a dependable, quality postal service and a new Morgantown postmaster as well.

## Senate report on Trump and Russia is a triumph for truth

ONE OF TRUMPISM'S ENDURING SCARS WILL BE THE SOCIAL FISSURES IT'S WIDENED BY WAGING WAR ON OBJECTIVE REALITY AND PUBLIC FAITH IN BEDROCK INSTITUTIONS. It's also fostered a cult of personality around Donald Trump, allowing him to posture as the final arbiter of truth and guardian of the downtrodden. But division, chaos and disrepair — and the corruption of the American experiment — are the long-term consequences.

So it's encouraging when a bipartisan group of federal legislators reminds us that facts matter.

A 966-page Senate report published Tuesday leaves no doubt that an extensive network of Russian operatives with intelligence ties worked with Trump's operatives to torpedo Hillary Clinton's campaign four years ago. Russian President Vladimir Putin oversaw the effort, including a successful hack of Democratic Party computer systems. Why? To smear Clinton and hobble her administration if she won, and to gain leverage with Trump if he won.

The Republican-led committee that produced the report said that Trump's for-

mer campaign manager, Paul Manafort, was so steeped in the effort with Russia that he posed a "grave counterintelligence threat." It said that Donald Trump Jr., the president's son, participated in a covert effort by the Russian government to help his father in 2016. It said the president himself may have been a possible target of Russian blackmail. It said that Putin was aware that Trump — during his presidential campaign — was secretly pursuing a deal to build a skyscraper in Moscow.

The committee also found that Roger Stone, Trump's longtime political hatchet man, made elaborate efforts to learn about Russian leaks of confidential Democratic emails through Julian Assange's hacking collective,

WikiLeaks. And in the course of that discovery, the committee learned that Trump "did, in fact, speak with Stone about WikiLeaks and with members of his campaign about Stone's access to WikiLeaks on multiple occasions." That's interesting, because the president himself, in written testimony to former Special Counsel Robert Mueller, said he couldn't recall those conversations.

Mueller concluded his work last year by saying he hadn't found enough evidence to charge Team Trump with a criminal conspiracy. He clearly found evidence that the Trump camp tried to obstruct justice, however, and he left it to Congress to hash out the matter. For its part, the Senate report said that the Trump campaign's intersection with Putin's underlings didn't amount to a coordinated conspiracy — and that in some cases the sheer dimwittedness of the people working for Trump exposed them to manipulation.

You may remember that Trump and his GOP backers tried to spin Mueller's findings by saying that "no collusion" meant that Trump and those around him did nothing wrong. Republicans on Tuesday resurrected the "no collusion" mantra, working hard to convey the idea that the Senate report somehow meant that everything's all right, everything's fine, and we want you to sleep well tonight.

But, of course, everything isn't all right. The Russia scandal wasn't

## A sort of goodbye Germany?

PRESIDENT DONALD TRUMP RECENTLY ORDERED A 12,000-TROOP REDUCTION IN AMERICAN MILITARY PERSONNEL STATIONED IN GERMANY. That leaves about 24,000 American soldiers still in the country.

A little more than half of the troops being withdrawn will return home. The rest will be redeployed to other NATO member nations such as Belgium, Italy and perhaps Baltic and Eastern European countries.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel is said to be furious. She claims the redeployments will "weaken the (NATO) alliance." German commercial interests chimed in that the troop withdrawals will hurt their decades-old businesses serving U.S. bases.

Perhaps, but Merkel surely cannot be surprised. Six years ago, all NATO members pledged to spend 2% of their GDP on defense. Yet only eight of 29 so far have kept their word.

Germany spends only about 1.4% of its GDP on defense. As NATO's largest, wealthiest and most powerful European member, it sets the example for the rest of alliance.

Merkel's renegeing on her 2014 pledge helps explain why less wealthy and influential NATO members also see no reason to meet their obligations.

Germany surely knows that 2020 marks the 75th anniversary of the end of the World War II, and the 29th year since the fall of the Berlin Wall — the symbolic end of the Cold War.

Will there be any point in the future when Europe is confident enough to be a full defense partner with the U.S. rather than an eight-decade client?

NATO, of course, still provides a common European defense, but only by habitually relying inordinately on U.S. military contributions. That dependence seems increasingly odd when the European Union has an aggregate GDP nearly as large as America's.

More important, NATO's front-line threats are now mostly concerned with rogue member Turkey, especially its bullying of Greece and its increasingly aggressive stance in the Middle East.

Russia always poses a threat to Europe. But the likely flashpoints are not on the German border, but more likely eastward in the Baltic states or on the Russian frontier with Poland.

Moreover, the Merkel government has concluded, over American objections, a huge natural gas deal with Russia that is currently under some U.S. sanctions and short of cash.

Russian energy exports to Germany are said to earn Russia \$10 billion a year, with a likely doubling of that income once additional pipelines to Germany are completed.

Merkel likes to lecture the world on moral issues, but what is so noble about empowering Russian President Vladimir Putin, who recently reclaimed Crimea and seems now to be eyeing Belarus?

Like a modern-day Byzantine emperor Justinian, who recovered

a hoax. It was reality.

Even if the skullduggery the Senate documented didn't amount to a formal conspiracy, sabotage and malfeasance took place. Russia got its hooks into a presidential election, Trump used his campaign to try to make business deals in Moscow, the people around Trump invited foreign influence into an election, and the president apparently lied to Mueller. It's not a mystery why Trump has cultivated and coddled Putin throughout his presidency, even if the Senate didn't chart the money trail all the way to Russia. The president, who spent his business career consorting with mobsters, has always had an affinity with grifters and those, like Putin, who he thinks might help him grift.

Trump's supporters have worked overtime focusing on tangential aspects of the Russia scandal to keep Trump's presidency in play, confirm their own biases or soften any guilt they might feel for looking the other way in the face of overt corruption. Right-wing media and Republican apologists have argued that a minor piece of evidence used by federal investigators — an unreliable dossier about Trump's Russia ties prepared by a former British intelligence agent, Christopher Steele — meant that the entire Russian probe was improper.

As I noted at greater length last year, the Steele dossier wasn't the reason the Russia probe began, and its shortcomings simply weren't pivotal enough to demonstrate that the probe was ill-considered. The Senate report points out that the Federal Bureau of Investigation mishandled the Steele dossier and gave it too much credence. More important, however, the report doesn't dismiss the far greater weight of all the other evidence of Trump's corrosive and dangerous game of patty-cake with Russia.

Russia's threats to American elections and national security are ongoing, and that's another reason the Senate report is valuable. Because facts are fundamental, and it's impossible to make good decisions without them. Mother Nature has reminded us of this truth with the coronavirus pandemic. The Senate's report teaches the same lesson in its assessment of Russia, the Trump administration and White House propaganda.

much of the lost Western Roman Empire, Putin seems to think he can reabsorb the lost Soviet republics.

In recent polling, Germans were more anti-American than any other nation in Europe. And while about 75% of Americans believe the U.S. still has a good relationship with Germany, only about a third of Germans feel that way about the U.S. Nearly half the German population in some polls want U.S. troops out.

Note that Germany piles up the largest annual trade surplus with the U.S. of any nation in Europe — roughly \$55 billion to \$70 billion in most years. The Trump administration says the surpluses have grown in large part due to asymmetry in tariffs and duties, with Germany the far more protectionist of the two partners.

With Germany now united, rich and often angry, and with the Soviet threat largely over, it's Germany, not the U.S., that seems to have altered its view of this once-solid relationship.

Does Merkel really believe that if her nation cuts huge deals with NATO's historically greatest threat, polls as the most anti-American country in Europe and still refuses to honor its promises to increase defense spending, Germany still deserves a large American commitment of 36,000 troops to anchor its defense?

## WVU, city, state have solid COVID plans in place

I am most impressed by the detailed set of guidelines and policies now in effect regarding the upcoming fall semester at WVU. It is thorough, reasonable and implements consequences for those who fail to comply on-campus.

I would expect that our WVU, city and county leaders will make these establishments fully aware of these guidelines and provide to the extent possible any resources (informational and otherwise) necessary to implement them.

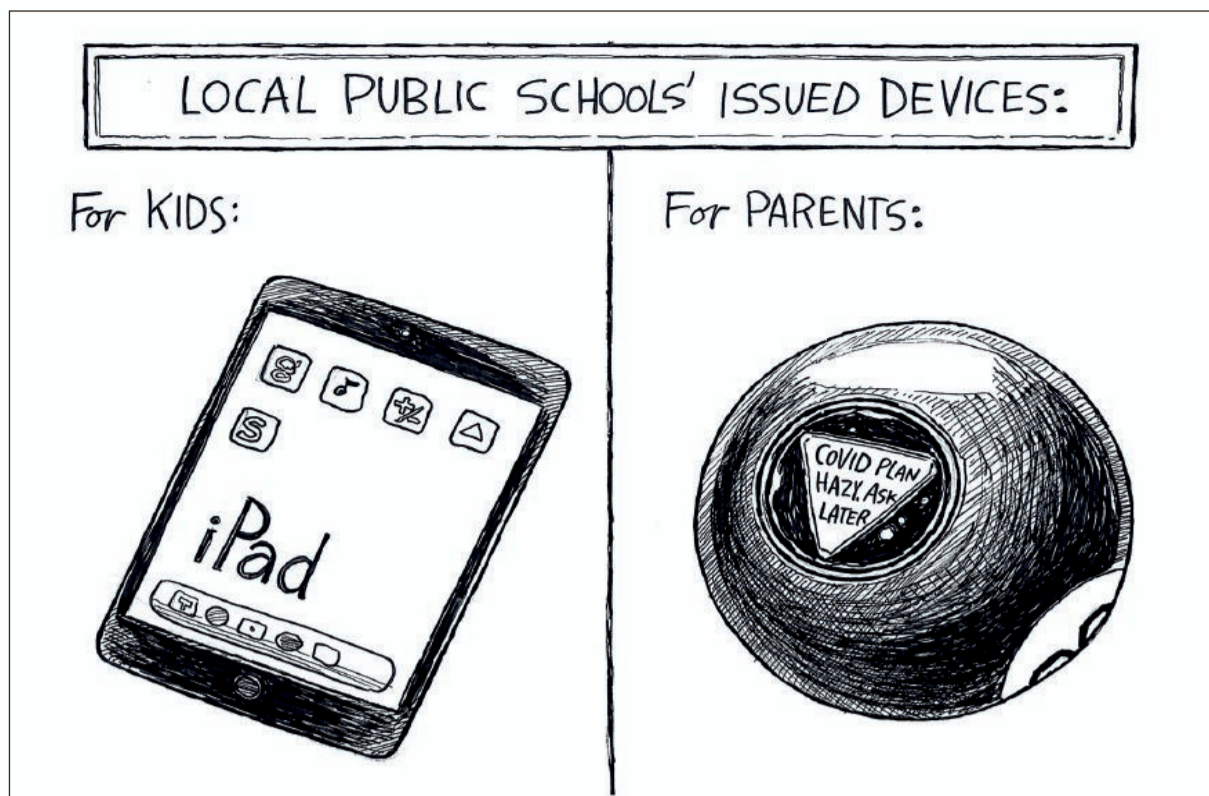

# Letter from President Gee to Morgantown community

**FOR MORE THAN 150 YEARS, MORGANTOWN HAS WELCOMED STUDENTS BACK TO CAMPUS EACH FALL.** Admittedly, this rite of passage will be unlike any before. The COVID-19 pandemic has transformed our world, and West Virginia University is transforming to protect the health and safety of the community while giving our students the best possible educational experience.

The big blue tent that inhabited the Coliseum parking lot for weeks is one signpost of this change. A steady flow of faculty, students and staff — including me — have taken the COVID test that is mandatory for anyone returning to campus. Our testing protocols have been nothing short of exceptional. And we have equally robust policies and procedures in place to mitigate and confine any potential spread.

You will see fewer students on campus this fall. Most courses for upperclassmen will be offered online or in hybrid mode, while we help our freshmen launch their Mountaineer journey smoothly and successfully in the classroom. Many faculty and staff members also will continue to work from home, reducing density on campus and making it easier to enforce the social distancing that inhibits COVID transmission.

The university is adjusting

everything from our transportation options to our dining venues to our cleaning regimens to make campus as safe as possible.

All faculty, staff and students must complete a COVID-19 education module; must wear masks or face coverings on campus; must follow detailed university policies for avoiding contact with others after a positive COVID test or close contact with an infected person; and must adhere to all local, state and federal physical distancing and maximum crowd size orders.

We know that student house parties and other large gatherings could increase spread of COVID-19, and we will not tolerate these negative behaviors that put our entire community at risk.

Many people are quick to assume that college students cannot act with the maturity and conscientiousness these times demand. By treating our students as intelligent young adults, I believe our university can help them stand strong as they manage their way through this crisis.

While the university is taking all precautions to make the campus as safe as possible, we cannot eliminate all risks. Are we going to have outbreaks? We might. Are we going to have spikes that come in unusual ways? We might.

We cannot eliminate the virus and its impact on the university

### A movie critic shares 10 of her tried-and-true favorites

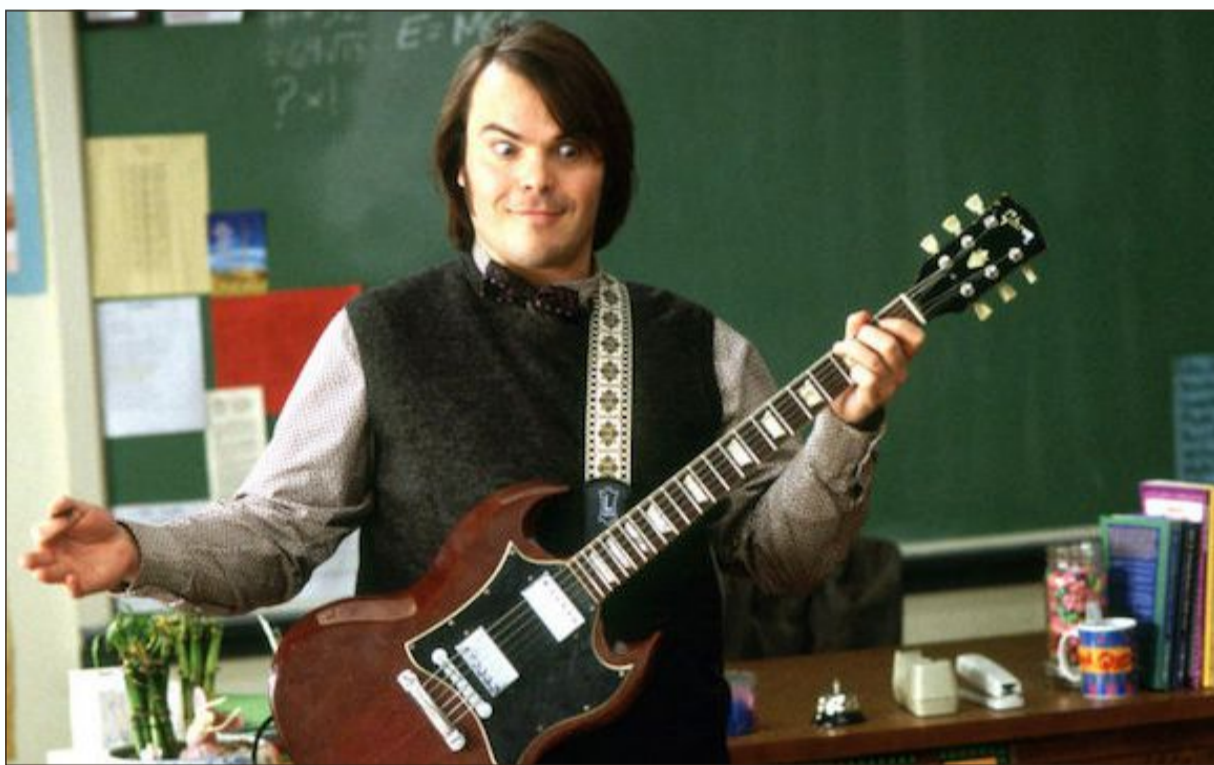

Smart, funny high school seniors Molly (Beanie Feldstein) and Amy (Kaitlyn Dever) decide on graduation night to cast off their good-girl habits; the result is an epic evening of adventure in which you just might fall in love with their friendship. ■ "Fame" (the real one from 1980, not the pallid 2009 imitation; R): As someone who once owned the LP soundtrack of this movie (yes, I am old), let me just say that this tale of a diverse, talented group of teens attending New York's High School of the Performing Arts thrilled me way back when — and that I can still hear Irene Cara in my head, belting out "Baby, remember my name!" ■ "The Half of It" (2020; PG-13): The sweetest high school rom-com imaginable, Alice Wu's charmer of a film is a fresh take on "Cyrano de Bergerac": High school senior Ellie (Leah Lewis) is in love with classmate Aster (Alexxis Lemire) but unable to express it — and finds herself writing poetic love notes to Aster

on behalf of her inexpressive friend Paul (Daniel Diemer). Enchanting complications — and some end-of-school growing-up — ensue. (Netflix)

■ "Juno" (2007; PG-13): OK, maybe Jason Reitman's comedy isn't strictly a back-to-school movie, but it's about high school students so let's go with that. Juno (Ellen Page) is a pregnant teen in love with her dorky classmate Bleeker (Michael Cera); the film, unfolding over a school year, becomes a warm, quirky tribute to love and to families, in all their unexpected forms. Have a tissue ready; J.K. Simmons, as Juno's supportive dad, is going to make

you cry. (Amazon Prime, Google Play, iTunes)

■ "A Little Princess" (1995; G): Based on Frances Hodgson Burnett's classic children's novel and directed by Alfonso Cuarón (whose "Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban" was the best of the Potter lot), this is an enchanting all-ages tale of a girls' boarding school in Edwardian England, in which a once-wealthy orphan (Liesel Matthews) faces a dramatic change in circumstances. Gorgeously filmed, it was an Oscar nominee for cinematography and art direction. (HBO Max, iTunes, Vudu)

■ "Rushmore" (1999; R): Wes

Anderson's second feature was this prep-school gem about an unlikely friendship, between a teen (Jason Schwartzman) obsessed with his school but unable to succeed academically and a businessman (Bill Murray) disappointed by what kind of man he's become. Murray is perfection here — he was robbed of an Oscar that year — and Schwartzman perfectly finds his character's balance between obnoxious and endearing. The ending brings guaranteed happiness. (Amazon Prime, iTunes, Vudu)

■ "School of Rock" (2003; PG-13): Though most of the titles on this list are high school movies,

this Richard Linklater comedy is an adorably raucous trip through middle school. Jack Black, in a performance so physical he practically becomes a guitar, plays a failed musician who poses as a substitute teacher — and ends up turning his class into a rock band. Raise your goblet of rock and watch this one again; it's every bit as much fun as you remember. (Amazon Prime, HBO Max, Vudu)

■ "The Spectacular Now" (2013; R): Young love is a staple of high school movies; this one, starring Shailene Woodley and Miles Teller, feels more honest than most in the genre. You believe that these two 20-something actors are teenagers in a small town; you believe the details of their romance; and you leave the film, after its note-perfect ending, wishing them well. (Showtime, Kanopy, Amazon Prime)

■ "Step" (2017; PG): This list needed a documentary, and this one is a joy: Director Amanda Lipitz followed three Baltimore high school seniors as they prepared for a tense step-class competition — and for the college applications that could change their lives. You realize, watching it, that you're seeing fledglings get their wings; just try to stay dry-eyed. (Seattle's Vulcan Productions was among the film's producers.) (Amazon Prime, iTunes, Vudu)

■ "To All the Boys I've Loved Before" (2018; TV-14): A breakout Netflix hit, this rom-com (based on the bestselling YA novel by Jenny Han) involves a couple of high schoolers in a fake relationship — and if you've ever seen a

## Make faith visible in lives and minds

**Q: I am Indian, and my version of Hinduism teaches vegetarianism. Even so I have this craving for eating meat. I see people of other faiths eating meat and living a peaceful and happy life. However, I'm scared that if I eat non veg it will be considered a sin and something wrong may happen. I have not eaten non veg for some time now due to the coronavirus pandemic. But I have a strong craving for non veg, especially chicken, but at the same time I'm worried it may cause me bad karma by causing pain to that animal. I'm an animal lover so I don't support killing animals even if it is for food, but it tastes good to me after being cooked. Please help me with the dilemma. Thanks and regards — J**

**A:** Before we consider what you might do to sate your carnivorous urges, let us first examine whether or not your version of Hinduism's vegetarian diet is correct. The most ancient of all Hindu texts are the Vedas that are over 4,000 years old. The most famous of all the Vedic sacred texts is the Rig Veda and in hymn 10.87.16 of the Rigveda the god Krishna, clearly prohibits the killing of cattle and prays to the fire god Agni to punish those who kill animals. This teaching supported the broader Hindu belief in ahimsa, nonviolence.

As you know, Hinduism believes that all sentient beings have a soul (atman) and that this soul is reborn after death thousands of times in the process of reincarnation. The residue of our deeds in each life we live is our Karma. If we have good Karma our souls are reborn into a higher spiritual level. Eventually, the few truly enlightened souls can achieve release (moksha) from the cycle of rebirth.

So, in this vegetarian's understanding of Hinduism, you had better try harder to overcome your meat-eating urges or you might come back into the next life as that chicken you just ate for dinner. In every religion that endorses vegetarianism, this is the basic spiritual motivation. By introducing an ethical principle of nonviolence into our common and necessary act of eating we can more easily spread the doctrine of nonviolence into the world. Aside from religious doctrines, it should be obvious to anyone with a sensitive soul that there is no reason to cause pain and suffering to animals just so that we can eat, especially when the world of vegetables offers us such a wide and nutritious variety of foods that can sustain our bodies and our souls.

As another Hindu text, the Pulaan Maruthal asks, "how can one be possessed of kindness, who, to increase his own flesh, eats the flesh of other creatures?"

However, there is another tradition within Hinduism that does condone eating what you call "non-veg." There is no Hindu teaching that eating meat is spiritually good, but there are some texts like the Manusmriti that allow the eating of meat if meat is the only nutritious food available in a time of adversity. In such cases of need the Manusmriti approves of eating fish and meats of deer, antelope, poultry, goat, sheep, and rabbit. However the animals must be slaughtered with minimal pain to them and in the form of ritual sacrifice.

Today, up to a quarter of all Hindus eat meat and in non-Indian Hindu cultures like Suriname and Guyana the percentage of Hindu meat eaters is even higher. However, Hindu carnivores do distinguish between beef, which is rarely eaten because the cow is a sacred animal to Hinduism, and other forms of meat.

So, dear J, your desire to eat chicken is, thankfully for your karmic condition, the least offensive form of meat you could desire to eat. My suggestion is that you try harder not to eat meat because you know it is wrong and you feel that it is wrong. One of the main lessons of a religious life is discipline. Discipline in your diet will lead to discipline in your life.

We are all challenged to make our faith visible in our lives and not just in our minds. Whether it is overcoming our lusts for other pleasures of the body or our lusts for money or power, we are all challenged by God to live better, higher, kinder, truer, more compassionate lives. Learning to overcome our baser instincts and learning to nurture what Lincoln called, "the better angels of our nature" is the fundamental task of making our faith real in the world and in our souls.

### When to pry in bonuskids' lives

**Q: Today when I came home from work, I walked into my bonusdaughter and daughter having a serious conversation. They are both 15 and have developed a great friendship. My bonusdaughter was very upset. Evidently, she got in a fight with her mother, but she didn't feel comfortable talking to me about it. She did, however, confide in my daughter. How do I handle this? Do I push? Do I stand back? If it were my daughter, I would be more persistent about trying to help her sort through her feelings, but it's my bonusdaughter and I don't want to pry. What's good ex-etiquette?**

**A:** Really good question! So many feel the rules are different with bio kids and bonus kids, but it's not as much as you think. Both bio and bonus divorced parents tend to walk on egg shells if a certain dynamic has been established; it's once parents are no longer together, threat of their children going to the other home lurks.

The older the child gets, the more they may use this tact and parents often find themselves being more lenient than they would like for fear of angering a child and off they go to the other home.

But your child deserves both parents. That's why it is so important that parents put their own issues aside and support each other in raising their children to respect them.

In your case, the solution is to get the teen talking about how they feel so that you have the full picture and can help as best you can. That help may include simply staying out of it, but you

need as much information as possible to make that judgment.

A child will not confide in you if he or she thinks you will betray their confidence — plus, telling you as the mother figure in the house about a problem that your bonusdaughter has with her own mother brings up all sorts of allegiance and betrayal issues. Your daughter is a more neutral party and she has become a friend. That's why she was privy to your bonusdaughter's confidences and not you.

But try not to let frustration impact your better judgment. Have patience and lay the groundwork for ensuring your bonusdaughter's (and any teen) confidence by:

1. Appearing to stay neutral.
2. Establishing trust by being a mentor rather than a dictator
3. Not diminishing her concerns
4. Asking for her opinion on how to solve the problem
5. Listen to her solution
6. Temper her solution with adult knowledge if it is needed.

Finally, both girls must know that protecting someone's secrets when they're in danger or making bad choices is not healthy for anyone, and if a family member is in trouble, you may have to intercede. Even a therapist may break the therapist/patient confidence if the patient is a "danger to themselves or others." That should be an understood rule in your home. That's good ex-etiquette.

## ASK MR. DAD

### When sibling rivalry rears its head

**Q: My husband and I have two sons. Our oldest is 4 and the youngest is 3 months old. The problem is that the older one is crazy jealous of the baby. We bought a bunch of books on how to prepare a child to be a big brother and everything seemed to be OK — until about two weeks after the baby arrived. Now, our oldest is angry all the time, constantly says he hates his brother, and my husband and I are worried that he might do something to hurt the baby. What should we do?**

**A:** You have every reason to be worried — after all, you have a baby to protect. But as unpleasant as it is, your older son's behavior is normal. Whenever anything changes in a young child's life, his or her biggest question is, "How will this affect ME?" In his developing mind, life was good until that whiny little brat showed up. The stars and the moon revolved around him and you and Daddy were at his beck and call. Then, all of a sudden, everyone's paying attention to that big blob that sleeps, cries, fills diapers, cries some more, and can't even play. Not surprisingly, big brother is feeling displaced, ignored and unloved. Can you blame him?

He's wrong, of course. You still love him just as much as before. But to him, all the available evidence supports his worst fears. Right now, the only way to help him get over his jealousy is to convince him otherwise. Here's how:

1. You and your husband need to tell your son — multiple times a day — that you love him and always will. Unfortunately, words won't be enough. You have to prove your love. Here's a simple

demonstration that worked well when my oldest daughter became a big sister and told me that she was afraid that if I loved the baby I couldn't love her as much.

Light a candle and ask your son to imagine that the flame is your love for him. Then, take a second candle and light it with the flame from the first one. The second candle will burn brightly and the first won't be dimmed in any way. That's the way it is with love.

2. Keep a stash of small presents that you can dig into during those times when people bring gifts for the new baby but thoughtlessly exclude the big brother. These presents shouldn't be big, just something to remind him that you think he's special too.

3. Scroll through your phone or make a special book of pics of your oldest when he was a baby. Make a point to talk about all the great presents he got when he was tiny.

4. Talk up all the advantages of being a big brother. For example, babies are too little to play with big-boy toys, or eat food that big kids do.

5. Help build the relationship between the siblings by teaching big bro to gently interact with little bro. If he wants to help you care for the baby, give him a chance. And be sure to praise loving, gentle behavior whenever you see it. However, never, ever leave him alone in the room with the baby.

Finally, make sure that both you and your husband spend some one-on-one time with your older boy, doing all the things you used to do in the before times — plus some new ones.

# Tips for leash training your puppy

Many people have welcomed new puppies into their homes during this unprecedented time and are ready to get outside with them. Going for walks is a great way to provide exercise not only for your dog but for yourself as well.

Your new pup probably won't know how to walk nicely on a leash when you first bring him home. All it takes is some time and training, and you two will be going for daily strolls in no time. The American Kennel Club's offers the following tips for teaching your puppy to walk on a leash:

- **Be consistent.** Determine what side you want your puppy to walk on and stick with that side to avoid any confusion. Find a toy or treat that your puppy really likes and use either of them to gain your pup's attention and to motivate him before you start walking.

- **Focus.** After putting the leash on your puppy, start with him at your preferred side. Hold the toy or treat at the center of your waist to keep his attention on you. It's extremely important to maintain your puppy's focus when there are so many distractions around.

- **Speak Up.** Give a verbal command like "let's walk" or "heel" to begin walking with your puppy. As you walk forward and your pup successfully walks along with you, praise him by saying, "Good boy, walk!"

- **Reward.** For every few feet your puppy walks beside you appropriately, stop and give him a little piece of the treat or let him play with the toy you brought. Start with five steps, then build up to 10, then 15. Eventually you'll be able to reduce or eliminate the use of a treat or toy altogether.

Each of these general anatomical types has several specific parts to them as well. There are 24 moving vertebra of the spine to make it even more complex. # Mayo Clinic Q And A: Adding plant-based foods to your diet

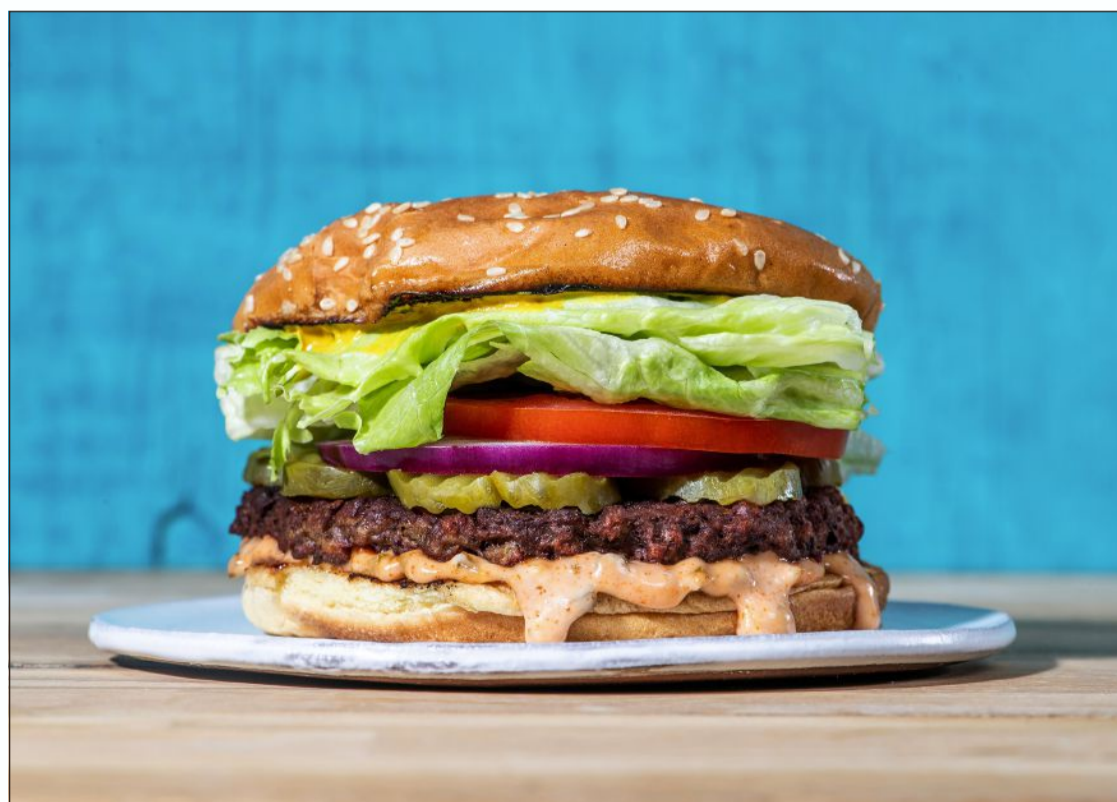
**Q: I am interested in limiting my intake of meat, but admittedly, I love burgers. Are there any really good plant-based options?**

**A:** Plant-based burgers have soared in popularity over the past couple of years. And these meat alternatives can be healthier for you depending upon the ingredients.

While eating meat can be part of a healthy diet, introducing more plant-based foods in your diet definitely has health advantages.

The biggest benefit of plant-based burgers usually comes in the form of fiber and other nutrients. Fiber can come in many forms and commonly is classified as soluble and insoluble. Both are beneficial, and most vegetables, whole grains, nuts and legumes have some of each. Look for burgers that have peas, beets, mushrooms, whole grains, soy, lentils or beans as main ingredients.

A plant-based diet in general has more phytonutrients — plant compounds that are thought to be both preventative and protective in our long-term health. Some phytonutri-

instead of salt and added fat.

Overall, it's a great goal to eat more plant-based foods like vegetables, nut, beans, lentils and whole grains to get more variety into your diet.

If you have been limited in the past with plant-based food, I would recommend slowly working new and different fruits, vegetables, legumes and nuts into your diet. You also can aim to eat smaller portions of meat.

Some simple ways to update your menu may include adding colorful vegetables into tomato-based sauces for pasta dishes or soup. For the latter, you also can add in beans, barley or another grain. You can add finely chopped mushrooms and onions to add texture and flavor to ground beef for tacos or casseroles. And finely chopping or pulsing nuts or seeds can boost pancakes and other baked goods.

Don't be afraid to experiment and modify recipes. You might find you like the new flavors and textures, as well as how you feel, since the additional fiber and nutrients will keep your body moving as it should.

ents act as antioxidants. Often times, the phytonutrients are identified by the different colors — red, orange, purple, green or tan. This is why you hear the phrase "eat the rainbow."

The challenge with any plant-based meal, however, is that the flavors and textures are different. So this presents an issue as far as what's added to the ingre-

dients to mimic the taste and texture of meat.

Some plant-based burgers are going to have added fat, and oftentimes, the added fat is a saturated fat. Commonly added fats are coconut oil or palm oil. Like with natural meat burgers, saturated fats can be concerning.

Saturated fat has been shown to raise LDL or "bad" cholesterol, and the

concern is that it may increase heart disease risk.

Salt is another common offender. Added salt is both a flavor enhancer and preservative in pre-packaged or restaurant plant-based burgers. Too much salt, or sodium, can raise blood pressure.

Keep in mind that the bun you select and condiments also will have

sodium, so the tally for the meal can add up quickly. Together, the added saturated fat and sodium may impact the overall nutritional quality of plant-based burgers. Compare products and choose wisely.

Alternatively, you might consider making your own plant burger at home. You can easily incorporate spices or other seasonings

## Urban gardeners share the ups and downs of growing food

MINNEAPOLIS — When a suspicious-looking sprout appeared in the St. Paul garden of LeAndra Estis, she plucked it. The willful plant popped up again. Instead of pulling it out a second time, the new gardener fired up Google. The would-be intruder was spinach.

"I kept thinking, 'That's not right,'" said Estis, who had never seen the leafy green emerge from the ground and was expecting the spinach she planted from seed to look more bushy, like the mustard and collard greens she watched grow as a child.

In Minneapolis, Christopher Lutter-Gardella faced a different problem. He had to sow peas several times because his plants were getting chewed down at the base from some unseen force.

"The littlest, humblest critter can bring your whole enterprise crashing down," he said.

Such challenges have not discouraged these two urban gardeners. Estis broke ground behind her home in St. Paul's Frogtown neighborhood, looking forward to teaching her two daughters — Quiaia, 19, and Lonna, 13 — the joys of growing your own food. Lutter-Gardella decided that with more time at home due to the coronavirus pandemic, this was the summer to expand his gardens, including the front yard of his home in Minneapolis' Powderhorn neighborhood.

Amid the exciting victories, both gardeners have accepted minor setbacks as an inevitable part of cultivating gardens that deliver food, beauty — and a few lessons along the way.

In this season of renewed interest in home gardening, we are following Estis and Lutter-Gardella throughout the growing season.

### Great growth

"Everything is growing so fast — especially the weeds," Estis joked.

The spinach that originally confounded Estis was the first plant to spring up and came in strong. Another robust grower has already produced fruit: "The tomatoes are growing like mad," Estis said.

The same is true in Lutter-Gardella's gardens. He calls his tomatoes — about 15 plants of them — "out of control." He is racing to stake them. "Every year I am like, 'Wow, tomatoes are amazing.' They are so low-maintenance and so productive," he said. Lutter-Gardella's squash is also thriving. But it's the native corn that he planted for the first time this year that has impressed him most. "The corn is blowing my mind. It's booming. You know the saying, 'knee-high by the 4th of July'? Mine is shoulder-high already

and gloriously beautiful," he said a few days after the 4th.

### Disappointing duds

"I have struggled with the leeks. I planted a ton but only a dozen have survived," said Lutter-Gardella. In another unpleasant surprise, only about half of his first planting of carrots germinated, and his pepper plants aren't producing. He's not sure why.

Estis has a row of strawberry and tomato plants that seem stunted. When she had no more room in her two garden plots, she added a row on the back side of the garage. "That was just a horrible spot," she said, "I'm not getting much growth there."

Eager to taste the fruits of her labor, literally, Estis nabbed a green tomato from a vine to make fried green tomatoes. It turned out to be too firm and lacking juice. She also picked a cucumber too early. "It was bitter. I'm hoping that ... if I keep it on the vine longer, it will taste better."

### Lessons learned

"Make sure you lay out what you are planting and pay attention to how much space they need," said Estis, who is in a quandary about three cantaloupe plants she now knows are far too close together. "I am trying to decide if I should pull the one in the middle and replant it in another spot."

She also recommends enriching the soil. In her garden plots, she laid down Miracle-Gro garden soil and nitrogen-rich coffee grounds, a trick she learned from her mother, longtime gardener Ann Estis. In those plots, you can hardly see the soil for

the greenery. She didn't amend the soil behind her garage, where the plants are withering.

Turn to trusted sources, Estis advises. She gets tips from experienced garden store clerks. She has turned to Google. But her favorite and steadiest resource is her mother, who lives a few blocks away and visits most days to weed and advise.

Estis also is glad she labeled her rows of vegetables. She used simple wooden sticks bearing the names of vegetables-to-come and empty seed packs, which show pictures of the mature plant and also note timelines for harvest.

Lutter-Gardella, meanwhile, has been working to protect his garden from animals that are as insistent on living as his plants. Bunnies were nibbling the stalks of the corn plants, so he put up a low fence to keep the hoppers away. He also sprinkles fox urine powder around the base of his plants and sprays a cayenne pepper wax onto plants every two weeks to repel little nibblers.

Beyond those organic protections, Lutter-Gardella has learned that trimming a plant back can enhance its production.

"I am being more bold with pruning," he said. Culling branches off his tomato plants encourages air flow, and sends more energy and nutrients to the fruit, he said. When his basil plants looked scraggly, he chopped off their tops, and they rebounded with vigor. "As long as you trim it right above an existing leaf, it will bush out more," he said.

He also recommends companion planting, in which certain plants benefit each other. The classic example is corn, squash

and beans. "Corn grows tall, and beans vine up the corn stalk; squash grows low around the corn to keep down the weeds. They support each other."

Both gardeners now know that shade is not necessarily the enemy of gardens. Lutter-Gardella was surprised to find that his squash plants in partial shade look much better than those in full sun. Estis has two garden plots, and one is doing better than the other. She intends to cover the poor performer with a canopy on super-hot days on a hunch that the temporary relief from the heat will aid the plants there.

### Excitement grows

When Lutter-Gardella greatly expanded his garden this year, it was with an eye toward the kind of food production that could help sustain his family. He stays busy tending his crops, but looks forward to the future. He plans to can tomatoes and also simply slice and freeze some to be added to sauces in the winter. He planted three varieties of beans. Some will be eaten off the vine, but others he expects to dry, to be prepared long after summer passes, for bean-based dishes such as burritos.

When Estis planted her garden, she hoped her enthusiasm for growing food would spread to her daughters. She now says they do more in the garden than she does, and they post pictures of their green-thumb successes on social media. Each new burst of life — a yellow bloom transforming into a squash, for instance — thrills them. Said Estis, "I come home from work and they say, 'Mom, Mom, look at this!'"

**YOU PROBABLY HAVE** seen a “swinger” clock but never guessed how it worked. Most are small metal statues standing on a base while holding a long baseball bat, pendulum or other long, thin rod that is topped by a clock or a globe. It keeps time and the pendulum keeps swinging, but there is no sign of an electric plug or other power source.

The first “mystery clock” was made by a French magician, Jean Robert-Houdin, in 1845. Many other versions followed. Junghans, a German clock factory, made most of those seen today. Ansonia, an American clock company, also made these unusual clocks. The secret clock parts that kept the hands moving were even patented. The trick is that part of the base moves around slightly, keeping the pendulum swinging and moving the clock’s hands. Another type of mystery clock was made with two clear crystal disks with a clock hand painted on each. The disks turned with power from the base. Many copies of antique mystery clocks have been made.

The model with an elephant swinging the clock is a favorite that was originally made by Junghans but has been copied in China. Surprisingly, the original had an elephant made of white metal while the copies made before 1930 were bronze. Watch out. There are many copies sold today, and it is very difficult to tell old from new. There are swinger clocks with figures such as a boy with a bat, the Statue of Liberty,

Diana, a cherub and even a kangaroo. Neal Auction Company recently sold a metal swinging elephant clock made about 1900, probably by Junghans, for \$576. It had a bronze patina.

**Q. I’m looking for advice on selling a business card with Thomas Edison’s autograph on it. It’s the business card of Harry H. Harris and written on the back of the card in pencil is, “Signed around 1916 in presence of Harry Harris.” The card was given to me by Mr. Harris in 1972, when I was his paperboy. I was thinking of writing a brief description of how I got this and signing it in front of a notary public. Do you think that is sufficient authentication?**

**A.** The value of an autograph is based on the importance of the signer and the rarity of his signature. Handwritten, signed letters sell for the highest prices. Autographed photos sell for more than just a signature in an album or on a card. Condition is also important. There are auctions that specialize in autographs, and they will tell you what they need in order to provide authentication. A written description of

how you got the card would help. You can find more information about what determines the value of an autograph on Heritage Auctions’ website, HA.com.

**Steve Harvey all signed this jacket for Shannon Marketic, Miss USA 1992. Is there any value to it?**

**A.** The USO, United Service Organizations, Inc., is a private, nonprofit organization founded in 1941 to support American troops and their families during World War II. The USO is best known for its tours of entertainers and other celebrities. They visit mil-

itary bases at home and abroad in an effort to boost morale and connect the troops to home. The autographs and provenance of your jacket may add to the price it will bring. Auctions that specialize in celebrity memorabilia include Hake’s Auctions (Hakes.com) and Heritage Auctions (HA.com). There are also auctions of war memorabilia that might

want to sell your jacket.

# Should you buy a foreclosed home? Here's what to know

Most people love a bargain - and in the real estate world, great deals can sometimes be found in the form of a foreclosed home. Proponents of buying foreclosed homes love the reduced prices, but inexperienced buyers may find the risks outweigh the rewards.

## What is a foreclosed home?

A foreclosed home is a property that has undergone the foreclosure process, which was initiated because the borrower defaulted, or failed to make payments, on the mortgage, and did not take alternative steps such as a deed in lieu of foreclosure or loan modification.

It's "a home that has been taken from an owner by a financial institution typically due to non-payment on a mortgage," explains agent and broker Cristyle Egitto of A Perfect Location LLC Real Estate, based in Palm Beach, Fla.

Once the bank or lender takes possession of the property, it typically wants to unload it as quickly as possible, and often that can mean a significant discount for the next buyer. To recoup its investment, the lender will send the foreclosed home to auction, where it may be purchased by a buyer or investor.

However, "if the bank does not hit their reserve or target auction price, they will keep the property," Egitto says. At that point, the home is "considered an REO or real estate owned." REO properties are also sometimes referred to as "bank owned."

"REO properties are then sold through a real estate agent, online auction plat-

forms and other routes," Egitto says.

Pros: Competition less stiff, discounted prices, flipping opportunities.

Cons: Cash required, hidden issues, such as liens, sold as-is, often sight unseen.

## Advantages of buying a foreclosed home

If you're looking to save money when purchasing or investing in a property, a foreclosed home can be one way to score a deal - but only if you're prepared to make an all-cash offer. If you have enough to pay for the home outright (rather than financing through a mortgage), you could purchase a property in an online or in-person auction for a steal.

"Foreclosed properties often go for below market value as the bank is usually just trying to cover the outstanding mortgage and fees due," Egitto says. "Foreclosures are great for investors, especially with cash on hand. Often they need work, which is perfect for flippers, and there can be a major upside on the resale."

"There is less competition because all purchases require cash, which limits the potential buyer pool," adds Cody Sperber, co-founder of 100 Million Academy, where he teaches real estate investment strategies.

"The biggest advantage is the potential of getting a discounted property (that you maybe couldn't have afforded if it was all fixed up and sold retail for a ridiculously good price," says Sperber.

## Disadvantages of buying a foreclosed home

If you're set on buying or investing in a foreclosed home, there are some drawbacks to

keep in mind.

For one, foreclosures are generally sold as-is, with little to no inspection time, and many have been neglected. This can come into play if you're planning to flip the home.

"If the property is in disrepair, no conventional lenders would be willing to lend on the property until repairs are made," says Sperber.

Competition at a foreclosure auction can also be high, which can be risky if you "get competitive and overpay for a property just to win the deal," notes Sperber.

According to Egitto, "foreclosures can also have unknown fees associated with them, like back HOA dues and other liens, that stay with the property and aren't forgiven through the foreclosure process."

In addition, "these are cash-only purchases with very limited information," says Sperber. "In some cases, it's difficult or even impossible to see the inside of a property before the auction takes place."

Overall, "if you are new to investing or real estate, then it's probably not the best way to break into the business, unless you love to learn through failure," Sperber said.

## Bottom line

If you've weighed the pros and cons and are ready to buy a foreclosed home, it's important to first assess your level of risk.

"The main factor I look at is the risk (buyers) are willing and able to take," Egitto says. "I would not recommend foreclosures for novice buyers."

Remember that to bid in a foreclosure auction, you need to have enough cash lined up ahead of time. It's also smart to partner with an attorney or other experienced adviser to help you evaluate the property.

# Existing-home sales surged in July by most on record

U.S. sales of previously owned homes surged by the most on record in July as lower mortgage rates continued to power a residential real estate market that's proving a key source of strength for the economic recovery.

Closing transactions increased 24.7% from the prior month to a 5.86 million annualized rate, the strongest pace since the end of 2006 and reflecting broad gains across the U.S., according to National Association of Realtors data issued Friday. The median estimate in a Bloomberg survey of economists called for a 5.41 million rate. Prices jumped 8.5% from a year earlier, on an unadjusted basis, to the highest on record.

"The housing market is past the recovery phase and is now in a booming stage," Lawrence Yun, NAR's chief economist, said on a call with reporters. "Certainly, record-low mortgage rates are bringing more buyers into the market."

Cheaper borrowing costs, pent-up demand and greater interest in suburban markets following the pandemic-related shutdowns earlier in the year are so far generating plenty of momentum in housing. At the same time, lean inventory, higher asking prices, and the

coronavirus itself represent hurdles to further outside gains.

"With the sizable shift in remote work, current homeowners are looking for larger homes and this will lead to a secondary level of demand even into 2021," Yun said in a statement.

There were 1.5 million existing homes for sale last month, down 21.1% from July 2019, the 14th straight year-over-year decline. It was the leanest supply for any July on record.

The number of houses for sale would last 3.1 months at the current sales pace. Anything below five months is seen as a tight market.

## Median Price

In July, properties remained on the market for an average of 22 days, the shortest timespan on record. The median home price increased to an all-time high of \$304,100 last month and compared with \$280,400 a year earlier.

Purchases of previously owned single-family homes rose 23.9% and sales of condominiums increased nearly 32%, according to the NAR data.

Existing-home sales increased in all four U.S. regions in July, including a 30.5% rise in the West and a 19.4% advance in the South, the largest U.S. region. Purchases climbed 27.5% in the Midwest and 30.6% in the Northeast.

# Real estate Q&A: How can I make the condo association repair a common area?

**Q: The condo's balcony has loose and missing tiles that are getting worse. I want to repair it myself, but the building manager told me I was not allowed to because it is part of the common area. However, the condo is not fixing it. What should I do? —Manuel**

**A:** When there is an issue or question with your condominium apartment, the first step most

people take is to speak with the association manager. This is a good idea and often resolves the concern. Most association managers are knowledgeable and are good at what they do.

However, even a consummate professional can occasionally get one wrong. So if you are not satisfied with the answer you receive, you will need to review your association's governing documents.

Every community asso-

ciation is different, but most I have dealt with require the unit owner to make this sort of repair to their balcony. If your review shows that it is your responsibility, you should politely show this to the manager, and you should be good to go.

If it turns out that the manager was correct, and it is your association's job to do, you should speak to the manager to see what the hold up is.

If this does not work, you may want to attend the

next board meeting and ask the board about it.

In my experience, most association managers and board members want to do right by the residents. Be polite but insist that the repairs get done. Be understanding about delays, but do not allow your concern to be forgotten.

Remember the saying that the squeaking wheel gets oiled, but a screeching one gets replaced, and you should get your balcony fixed.

# New windows aren't the biggest energy saver for your home

The window industry trumpets that its products will slash energy use and that you'll get most of the cost back when you sell the house.

And yet you will spend between \$800 and \$2,300 to replace each window. A small house may have eight windows and a big one 20 or more. Costs mount quickly. Replacing all the windows on an average house costs \$16,000.

Before you shell out for all new windows, take a deep breath. If you're looking to save energy, there are cheaper things you could do first. Insulate your attic. It costs about \$2,000. The Department of Energy estimates you will save 10% to 50% on your heating bill by insulating your attic.

By contrast, the government says to expect new windows to trim your bill by 7% to 15%, or between \$71 to \$501 annually. If you're replacing single-pane windows with newer double-pane windows, your savings will be on the high end. If you're replacing older double-pane windows with newer double-pane windows, your savings will be on the low end.

Other cheap energy savers, by the way: switching to LED light bulbs instead of incandescent bulbs; unplugging electrical devices when they aren't in use; and never running half loads in dishwashers and washing machines and dryers.

There's no disputing that window technology improved greatly. The most efficient windows have inert gases between the panes to create a better barrier, while the glass is treated with a special coating that stops solar heat from getting through. It also reduces ultraviolet light damage to your possessions in the summer.

Even the most upbeat estimates don't say you'll get all your money back from new windows. Zillow estimates you'll recover 73% of your money when you replace windows. That compares to getting back an estimated 98% of your money for replacing a garage door; 81% for

remodeling your kitchen; and 76% for adding a deck.

If you live in an older home, with multi-pane windows divided by strips of wood, it will cost more to duplicate that look with modern windows. Be wary of scrimping here. Putting in cheap replacement windows that look out of place can actually lower the value of an older house.

Does this mean you should never replace windows? Of course not. You have to live in the house. A leaky window that spills cold air into your bedroom all winter is miserable. At a certain point, window frames get so decrepit they have to be replaced, or the window will fall, literally, into your yard. New windows, if done right, can spiff up the appearance of your house both inside and out.

Instead of taking an all or nothing approach to new windows, consider strategically replacing them. That balky window in the attic bedroom that no one uses? Don't worry about it. That kitchen window that you can't open every time you cook something smoky? Take care of it.

After deciding which windows, your next decision is what type of window frames you want. Aluminum frames, common a few decades ago, are used less today because aluminum is a poor insulator. Most frames today are vinyl or wood. Wood windows cost more, as much as \$2,300 apiece, according to Home Depot.

Make sure the crew installing the window has plenty of experience, good recommendations from past customers, and will stand behind their work. Look for a certification from the American Window and Door Institute. Pella and Andersen also certify crews for their windows. Start out with just a window or two until you're comfortable with a new crew. It takes skill to properly fit a window and insulate the area around the frame.

If you can't afford new windows, there are low-tech solutions to make your old windows more efficient, such as caulking and sealing gaps. Hardware stores sell window films that cut energy loss. Finally, you can do what our ancestors did to save energy: Hang heavy curtains inside the house.

## Supra Gets Faster, Slower

### Beautiful Toyota Sports Car Adds Four-Cylinder Model, Ups Six-Cylinder Power

There's a risk to building a gorgeous car: it's got to live up to the hype.

The sexy lines of the car I'm driving this week, the new Toyota Supra, do a brilliant job hyping up what to expect as you walk toward it. The long hood, sensual roof and swept-back side profile give all the right cues to create heart palpitations in those of us who love two-seat, rear-wheel-drive sports cars.

Therein lies a problem. The Supra may look too gorgeous for its own good, at least in the new four-cylinder version I tested. My eyes saw the godlike immortality of a supercar, but my senses felt the sting of four-cylinder mortality under the hood that left me wanting more in several key areas: more power, more sound and more bang for the buck.

Fortunately, a six-cylinder Supra exists to solve all three of those issues, and it's the one I'd recommend.

The more powerful Supra, priced from around \$51,000, makes a thrilling 382 horsepower from its BMW-derived, turbocharged, 3.0-liter inline six-cylinder engine. That's a serious boost in power over last year when buyers had to settle for a still impressive 335 horsepower.

The four-cylinder engine in my tester, though, gener-

ates 255 horsepower with a starting price around \$43,000.

Normally, as a longtime Mazda Miata owner and enthusiast, this less powerful version would be my dream Supra, one more about balance, lightness and handling than the muscle-car speed of its gaudy, six-cylinder sibling.

In its role as a tossable sports car, the four-cylinder Supra really does excel. The driving experience on wind-

ing roads borders on spiritual. Steering, braking and handling all sparkle like they should.

The cabin feels futuristic and distinctive, something unusual in the current climate of lookalike dashes dominated by tacky but practical touchscreens. It evokes a hint of the "Tron" vibe of 1980s Supras without being obnoxious.

Still, I wouldn't buy the four-cylinder version for

several reasons.

One, the brilliant Toyota 86 fulfills that same connected-to-the-road mission for considerably less money, starting around \$27,000.

Two, you can't get a Supra with a manual transmission, which I think is bonkers if you're trying to summon the sensual pleasures of pure driving, which is the whole point of a car like this.

And three, the Supra's gorgeous body screams of

power. It looks more mean than cute, and meanness requires a minimum of 300 horsepower, according to my off-the-cuff gearhead calculus.

The V6, on the other hand, fits the mission of this vehicle much better. It's numerically and emotionally the one to pick and worth every cent of its premium over the base model, as I see it.

Still, despite my puritanical sports-car ranting, it's

impressive that Toyota offers two entirely legitimate contenders in this rare and low-selling category. As much as I love them, let's get real. Sports cars are expensive to create and tend to move off dealer lots slower than a tortoise on Ambien.

If you want a four-cylinder Toyota sports car, the 86 with a manual transmission is breathtakingly fun to drive. If you want a powerful, thrilling, exotic Toyota sports car, the six-cylinder Supra is your match.

And if you still pine for a four-cylinder Supra, at least you'll be driving one of the prettiest cars in the world.

## Don't disconnect battery when storing a car; plastic shields can deter brake dust

**Q: What is the proper method for storing a newer car for the winter, about six months? I have a 2019 Lincoln Nautilus. I've heard disconnecting the battery isn't necessarily a good technique with newer cars because of the numerous car computers. Is it better to keep them on a trickle charger?**

— J.D., Colorado Springs, Colo.

**A:** You're right about disconnecting the battery. On many vehicles, doing so will erase the entertainment system memory (as an anti-theft feature), requiring it be reset. You may need a special code to do the reset. Without removing

any battery cables, attach smart charger (often called a maintenance charger) without overcharging. Before putting a cover over your car, change the oil, fill the gas tank (add some fuel stabilizer) and crack the windows a tiny bit.

**Q: I had an I-PASS on my windshield that never seemed to stay on, so I removed it. However, the glue from the I-PASS is stuck on my windshield. I have tried Goo Gone and it does not seem to be removing the glue. Any other suggestions?**

— B. K., Chicago

**A:** Those toll transponders' Velcro fasteners are designed to stay put. I suggest a razor blade scraper with a fresh blade to remove the adhesive. If you chill

it, all the better. Try holding an ice cube on the outside of the windshield for a few moments. If the glue begins to smear upon scraping, apply more chill. Afterwards, chill out with a cold one.

**Q: I was unpacking some things that I had ordered online, and the newspaper page containing your column of May 11 was wrapped around something I had ordered. As an avid car person all my life, your column caught my eye, and I read it. I also own a Mercedes 380 S and was particularly interested in this question the gentleman asked you about brake dust. I had the same problem and it was driving me crazy until I found the ultimate solution and have never looked back! Eckler's**

**Automotive Parts (ecklers.com) has a wonderful Mercedes catalogue where you can even buy items for your vintage Mercedes. Eckler's sells plastic shields that fit behind the wheels and disperse the brake dust before it even touches the wheels.**

**A:** Dust shields are an excellent idea. Several companies make them and most are also available at traditional auto parts stores. Eckler's specializes in restoration and performance parts.

**Q: We recently took our Audi A4 to the service department of a national used car auto retailer to have 55,000-mile service done. They returned it to us running. When we got**

home and switched the ignition off, a message came up stating "Please drain oil." I called the dealer and they told me not to worry about it. I told them I wanted it fixed. My rudimentary knowledge from 1970s high school auto mechanics made me aware of the dangers of a crankshaft dipping down into an overfilled oil pan. I assume this still holds true to this day.

**A:** When the crankshaft dips into the oil, it whips it into a froth. Frothy oil can't be pumped and will not lubricate the engine. Damage is likely. If your crankcase is over filled, have the excess drained.

## Battery Basics

Batteries are an essential part of your vehicle and can cause some issues if not fixed before the winter months roll in. Here are some tips to help you check your battery and keep it lasting through the winter.

#### BATTERY MAINTENANCE

Batteries lose power over time. The longer you have had your battery, the more inclined you should be to check it. Check all the cables connecting your battery to the vehicle for damage or corrosion. Battery cables should fit tight on the battery. If there is corrosion making your battery cables loose, use a wired brush to clean off the corrosion.

Vehicle batteries usually last around three years. Check to see how long you have had your battery in your vehicle. Most local parts stores can test your battery's charge for free. Replace the battery at your local auto care store if it exceeds three years and is showing signs of degrading.

Cables, connectors and other parts for your battery can all be found and replaced at your local parts store. Invest in a portable battery charger that you can place in the trunk of your vehicle in case of emergencies.



#### KEEPING YOUR CHARGE

Batteries can lose their charge if your vehicle is stored or parked for too long. If you store your vehicle for an extended time during the fall and winter seasons, you might consider purchasing a trickle

charger. The device connects your battery to a wall outlet and gives your car enough power so that it does not lose charge. Trickle chargers can be found in most local parts stores. A less expensive way to

keep the charge in your battery is to have someone drive your vehicle for about 15 minutes or more a day. This helps keep not only your battery but the rest of your vehicle and engine running smoothly. One other low-tech option

you may have if you cannot find someone to help run your vehicle for you everyday is to disconnect the negative cable from your battery only. Doing so does have its cons. You will more than likely lose time, stereo and other settings.

## Ford hopes extras make Bronco stand out versus Jeep

The Ford Broncos came loaded with goodies on Tuesday at an off-road vehicle park near Holly, Mich.

Yakima racks, a fishing pole holder attached to the front of one, a winch to "rescue your lesser-equipped 4x4 friends" on another, an interior bike rack to carry two mountain bikes inside yet another.

Need a bottle opener to crack open a cold one when you get to your campsite? It's right underneath the liftgate. How about a place to attach a camera or phone? It's there on the dash.

There was even an appearance of a Bronco version of tube doors, those gnarly metal contraptions that let the open air in while you drive and have been seen at any number of Jeep events.

This was a chance for the Ford folks to show off the kinds of wild extras, not all of them actually available, that they hope will build a dedicated following for the new Bronco as well as hit Jeep, its main competitor, in one of the areas where that brand excels, accessories.

A short distance from some twisty and hearty off-road trails,

Mark LaNeve, Ford's vice president of U.S. marketing, sales and service, touted the excitement generated by the Bronco in just the last few weeks — more than 165,000 \$100 reservations — as well as lots of opportunities to customize those rides when the vehicle arrives beginning with the 2021 Bronco Sport later this year.

"In a way, with the modification and the personalization that we can do for our dealers or at the factory, every customer, if they want, can have a unique, one-of-a-kind Bronco," LaNeve said.

Ford said the Bronco can claim more than 200 "factory-backed" accessories for the two- and four-door models and more than 100 for the Sport model.

That's not as hefty as Jeep, which, through Mopar, "includes more than 500 factory-engineered, quality-tested off-road performance parts and accessories," according to an FCA spokesman, but it does show that Ford has a plan.

Stephanie Brinley, senior analyst with IHS Markit, said Jeep's connection to accessories is one of the things that differentiates the brand from others.

# A complicated man: Morse returns to solve mysteries in 'Endeavour'

TV sleuths have been staples of prime time for ages, and with good reason. They captivate viewers with tales of mystery, intrigue and drama, not to mention their fascinating personalities. Jack Webb's no-nonsense Joe Friday solved crime in "Dragnet" in the 1950s, Peter Falk fumbled his way to justice as TV's "Columbo" for decades in TV series and movies, and Kristen Bell recently returned to the airwaves as the spunky titular character in Hulu's "Veronica Mars." If TV crime solvers have something in common, it's that they're unique. To the de-

light of fans, one of modern television's most unique detectives has returned.

Shaun Evans ("Teachers") is back as gifted investigator DS Endeavour

the younger version of that show's protagonist, giving fans a glimpse at how his career began with the Oxford City Police CID.

Consisting of three interconnected feature-length films, Season 7 picks up with Morse in 1970. It's a fresh decade and a fresh start for the detective, who's left his memorable Season 6 mustache in the 1960s. Cleanly shaven, he's ready to tackle new cases alongside his mentor and friend, DCI Fred Thursday, played by Roger Allam ("V for Vendetta," 2005). This season, the unlikely pair tries to solve a number of homicides against the backdrop of the women's liberation movement and increasing racial tensions in the '70s.

As with all the previous "Endeavour" episodes, each of the three Season 7 installments was written by the show's creator, Russell Lewis ("The Ambassador"). In an official ITV release about Season 7, "Endeavour" executive producer Damien Timmer ("Poirot") had high praise for Russell's work on the new season.

"It's a thrill to enter a new decade and tell more tales of the not-quite-so-young now Endeavour Morse," Timmer said. "Russell has some very striking stories to tell in this new set of films which we hope will baffle, unnerve and delight the show's fans!"

The program may be a prequel, but that doesn't mean that it won't ring true with today's audiences. According to its star, the new season's episodes

take their cues from modern-day issues. In a February article with RadioTimes.com, Evans talked about the timeliness of this season's topics, which include sexual harassment and immigration.

"I don't want to say it's a comment, but I think these stories work best when there is a reflection of what's going on now," Evans said.

The storylines are new, but there will be some familiar faces returning for Season 7. Anton Lesser ("Game of Thrones") reprises his role as CS Reginald Bright, Sean Rigby ("Gunpowder") will once again appear as DS Jim Strange, and James Bradshaw ("Holbyaks") is back as Dr. Max DeBryn. Abigail Thaw ("Casualty") returns as Oxford Mail editor Dorothea Frazil, and Caroline O'Neill ("Coronation Street") portrays Thursday's wife, Win.

While the new season is sure to be full of captivating characters and mysteries, fans of the show may notice something's missing. Those hoping to see Sara Vickers ("Watchmen") as Morse's previous love interest, Joan Thursday, are out of luck in Season 7. The actress was busy with her new baby as they were filming the latest episodes, so she wasn't available to reprise her role.

As for the rest of the cast, viewers may be surprised to learn that it was a bit of a family fair on the set of "Endeavour." This season, Allam welcomed to the set both his real-life wife, Rebecca Saire ("Vanity Fair"), as Mrs. Radowicz and his son, William Allam ("A Little Chaos," 2014), as Gary Rog-

ers. Also, Thaw played opposite her daughter, newcomer Molly-Mae Whitmey, who played women's rights activist Sally Alexander, a character based on Thaw's real-life mother. Even more interesting is the fact that the real-life Alexander was married to Thaw's father, John Thaw ("The Sweeney"), who played Endeavour Morse in the original "Inspector Morse" series. Abigail Thaw joked about the experience in a February article on [oxinabox.co.uk](http://oxinabox.co.uk).

"I get to meet my mother played by my daughter. How confusing is that," Thaw was quoted as saying. "It's three generations in one, but we are all the wrong age."

It looks as if "Endeavour's" seventh season has plenty to offer PBS's North American viewers. The show aired in the U.K. in February to much critical acclaim and ratings success. Those who still aren't quite convinced may be interested to know that the series has landed on various must-watch lists of high-profile publications, including the New York Times, [popsugar.com](http://popsugar.com) and [The Atlantic](http://TheAtlantic.com).

See what all the fuss is about by checking out Morse's latest case. Endeavour investigates what appears to be a freak accident at Lady Matilda's College, but he soon discovers that the incident may be linked to other suspicious events throughout Oxford. Thursday is skeptical, but his young friend is sure that the so-called accidents are the result of foul play in a new episode of "Masterpiece Mystery: Endeavour," airing Sunday, Aug. 23, on PBS.

## The 104th 500: NBC airs the 2020 Indianapolis 500 live

The 104th running of the Indianapolis 500 (presented by Gainbridge) airs live on NBC this Sunday, Aug. 23. Originally scheduled for May 24, this world-famous IndyCar racing event has finally arrived for both the armchair enthusiasts and a brave few masked-up, in-person, die-hard fans who will be there to see the first-ever Indy 500 to be run in August.

The defending Indy 500 champion, 36-year-old Simon Pagenaud (Team Penske, No. 22 Chevrolet) of France, is having another good-looking year, all things considered. He's sitting pretty at Rank 2 in the official IndyCar Championship standings, despite the craziness of this year. Only New Zealander Scott Dixon (Chip Ganassi Racing, No. 9 Dallara-Honda) ranks ahead of him, and if there was ever a worthy racing rival, Dixon is it. His career is as long as it is award-winning, and he's still leading the pack after more than 20 years behind the wheel. Pagenaud will attempt to become the sixth person to win back-to-back Indys, and the first to do so since Helio Castroneves managed the feat in 2002 (before that, it hadn't happened since 1971).

The history of Indianapolis Motor Speedway, where the race has been held since 1911, is full of exciting, unbelievable and just plain strange events that are worth a read on either Wikipedia or in one of the many, often wonderfully illustrated, histories available for purchase on Amazon for those who might be looking for a more in-depth exploration. Shockingly, the first two races ever held at the speedway both ended in fatal accidents, and things only got more interesting from there. From the rise and fall of foreign cars, superchargers and pure-gold prize purses, to an infamous \$20-million "Double Duty" bounty and the rise of Danica Patrick, the 500 is responsible for, or at least had a hand in, nearly every stage of growth of auto racing as a sport.

One of the first sporting events that actually plans to allow crowds to attend, this Indy 500 is set to allow just 50% of the usual attendees, increased from the projected 25% of its standard 235,000 permanent seating capacity — and every single one of those people is going to be required to wear a mask or other face covering. The venue can host nearly double that amount in an average year when infield seating is included, but that will be shut down this year.

## 'Down' to science

Zac Efron series takes a different view of food



### Zac Efron in "Down to Earth"

If you're diving into Netflix's catalog on a rainy day and you happen upon "Down to Earth with Zac Efron," the visuals alone might draw you in.

The Netflix original series, which dropped last month, follows the former "High School Musical" (2006) actor/heartthrob and his health guru pal, Darin Olien, as they travel the world. Efron and the production crew certainly have a knack for finding the most photogenic locations, whether it's the waters of Iceland's Blue Lagoon or the lush green canopy of the Amazon rainforest. This is an environmental-minded travel show, one that champions sustainable living, but its strong focus on diet makes it an interesting streaming option for food-minded viewers.

The first episode of "Down to Earth" finds Efron and Olien in Iceland, and it's guaranteed to stir up memories if you've been to the land of fire and ice and re-

newable energy. Like many pre-pandemic tourists (myself included), the pair's first stop is the village of Laugarvatn on the popular Golden Circle circuit, where they learn how rye bread is baked in the ground. The Nordic island is literally a hotbed of geothermic activity, so that's really what the episode focuses on, although they do sample reindeer tartare and dung-smoked meat along the way.

Even if you have an open mind, questions about the science presented on-screen might start to creep in. And when Efron and "dining" partner Anna Kendrick ("Pitch Perfect," 2012) meet with a Hollywood water sommelier in Episode 2, it veers towards the kind of exotic wellness that has drawn heavy criticism from health experts (drinking imported "healing" water doesn't scream "sustainability," either).

Plenty has been written about some of the dubious claims made in the series, such as in Episode 6 when a farming student explains that fresh goat's

milk is naturally pasteurized (it's not). Currently, adrenal fatigue isn't an accepted medical diagnosis. Keep in mind, too, that Efron's travel partner is the author of "SuperLife: The 5 Forces That Will Make You Healthy, Fit and Eternally Awesome." Olien touts the healing benefits of superfoods throughout the series, though, at one point, he concedes that label applies to anything that has, "per bite ... more micronutrients than a doughnut."

Murky science aside, what "Down to Earth with Zac Efron" gets right is that it reminds us of the critical link between our health and the health of our environment. It's also casual, educational entertainment, with plenty of gorgeous shots and a fun rapport between the traveling pair. If "change has to start somewhere," as Efron declares in the trailer, then maybe it starts with a willingness to entertain different ideas — even if it sometimes leans more towards theory than fact.

**Ten-minute laughs:** The proverbial cloud with a silver lining takes on a hilarious new form in "Nice One!," a new comedy show by actor, comedian and writer Ron Funches ("Trolls," 2016), premiering Monday, Aug. 24, on Quibi. "Nice One" is a contest between four comedians who must try to say something nice about some pretty bad subjects in the sweetest, most considerate and cleverest of ways.

Thomas Lennon ("17 Again," 2009), Niecy Nash ("Scream Queens") and more are returning for the reboot, and while it's not exactly a reality series, it does pretend to be. Since

"Cops" has been canceled, this is the next best thing (we would argue it's far better).

Catch "Nice One!" and "Reno 911!" as they premiere back to back Monday, Aug. 24, on Quibi.

**Traveling for peace:** Buddy comedy docuseries "Ravi Patel's Pursuit of Happiness" is a four-part CNN original premiering Thursday, Aug. 27, on Warner Media's streaming service, HBO Max. The series chronicles the life, travels and realizations of actor, documentarian and philanthropist Ravi Patel ("Meet the Patels," 2014).

The doc was among CNN's most important features in its March upfront presentation for advertisers. This approach has previously worked among sister networks and streaming platforms, as when "The World According to Jeff Goldblum," a NatGeo original,

With his insatiable thirst for learning and growth, Ravi offers a no-holds-barred picture of his personal issues, shining a light on the similarities and differences between social norms at home and overseas.

In his own words, Ravi thinks that "maybe this show is what some of us

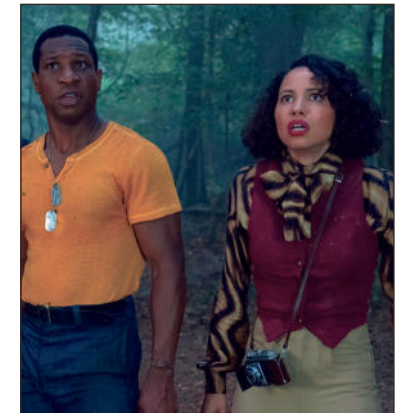

## Stars on 'Simpsons': Season 32 celebrity guests revealed

**Stars on 'Simpsons':** How do you keep things fresh when you've been on the air for over three decades?

That is both the enviable and unenviable position in which the creative team behind "The Simpsons" now finds itself — "enviable" because it's the longest-running scripted show of all time and "unenviable" because it puts a heck of a lot of pressure on the writers.

Luckily, celebrity guest stars have been spicing things up since Tony Bennett "appeared" as himself in Season 2 (although technically, Marcia Wallace, who voiced Edna Krabappel, was the first to be credited as a guest star).

You can count on Season 32 to keep this long-standing tradition alive by featuring a few famous names, er, voices, including singer/actor Ben Platt ("The Politician"), standup comedian Hannibal Buress and the world-traveling "Monty Python" legend Sir Michael Palin. "Stranger Things" star David Harbour is also on board as the voice of an alternate version of Mr. Burns, as is Olivia Colman ("The Crown") as a femme fatale.

They'll be adding their names to a very long list of guest stars — in fact, "The Simpsons" holds the Guinness World Record for Most Guest Stars Featured in an Animated TV Series, with a total of 810 celebrity cameos as of April 22, 2020. And a few of those guest stars, notably Kelsey Grammer ("Frasier") and Anne Hathaway ("The Dark Knight Rises," 2012), even won an Emmy for their vocal work on the series.

During a Comic-Con@Home panel, writer David Selman was especially excited about Palin, who has already recorded his lines. Selman described him as the guest "who I always wanted to get and who we finally did get." Meanwhile, showrunner Al Jean teased that another "Python" member had passed on the opportunity, though he declined to name the person. (Given that Terry Jones died earlier this year, Graham Chapman died in 1989 and Eric Idle has already made an appearance, it stands to reason it was either Terry Gilliam or John Cleese.)

**The vaccine race:** While the world waits for a safe and effective vaccine to safeguard us against COVID-19, the pharmaceutical race has inspired at least one potential TV project.

"Succession" executive producer Adam McKay and HBO appear to be

teaming up for a new limited series based on the book "The First Show," written by New York Times and The Atlantic writer Brendan Borrell, who has been covering vaccine trials for a number of different publications.

The book pulls back the curtain on the companies and individuals who are doing everything they can to find a vaccine that works. It also delves into the science behind it all and the risk of protectionism that could prevent equal access.

The "Untitled Vaccine Project" will be produced by McKay's Hyperobject Industries, which was launched last year after his amicable split with longtime producing partner Will Ferrell ("Saturday Night Live"). It's also part of McKay's five-year, first-look deal with HBO; his first project under that deal was another limited series centered on the Jeffrey Epstein case, while his 1980s L.A. Lakers drama (starring John C. Reilly, "Holmes & Watson," 2018) is still in the works. There's also a possible TV adaptation of the Oscar-winning film "Parasite" and a climate change-themed anthology series, "The Uninhabitable Earth."

As for "Succession," the pandemic-related shutdown has forced fans to wait a lot longer to wit-

ness the fallout from the Season 2 finale, after Kendall (Jeremy Strong, "The Gentlemen," 2019) implicated his father in the cruise ship scandal. Season 3 was only in pre-production when Hollywood was placed on hiatus, but once things resume and production is completed, expect more spectacular backstabbing on screen.

**Mob time:** If you've ever dreamed of a TV show that combines "The Sopranos" with "Goodfellas," you may soon get your wish.

Terence Winter, who won four Emmys and three Writer's Guild of America Awards during his time as writer/executive producer of "The Sopranos," is teaming up with "Goodfellas" writer Nicholas Pileggi to bring a new mob drama to Showtime. Winter will pen the screenplay based on Pileggi's in-depth historical overview of organized crime and corruption in America, as seen through the eyes of a Mafia family. Hollywood mega-producer Brian Grazer ("Arrested Development") will also serve as executive producer.

It's a world that both Winter and Pileggi know well. Winter, who wrote more than a quarter of all "The Sopranos" episodes, was the creator and executive producer of HBO's period mob drama, "Boardwalk Empire." He's also working on an upcoming crime drama, "Tokyo Underworld," though his work on non-mob dramas is equally impressive: his screenplay for the 2013 film "The Wolf of Wall Street" earned him an Oscar nomination; he co-created the HBO series "Vinyl" with Mick Jagger, Martin Scorsese and Rich Cohen; and he's working on a DC drama set in Gotham City.

As for Pileggi, his "Goodfellas" screenplay earned him (and co-writer/director Martin Scorsese) an Oscar nomination and was based on his book "Wiseguy." They teamed up again to write the script for the 1995 film "Casino," which was based on another of Pileggi's books, and Pileggi co-created the CBS series "Vegas."

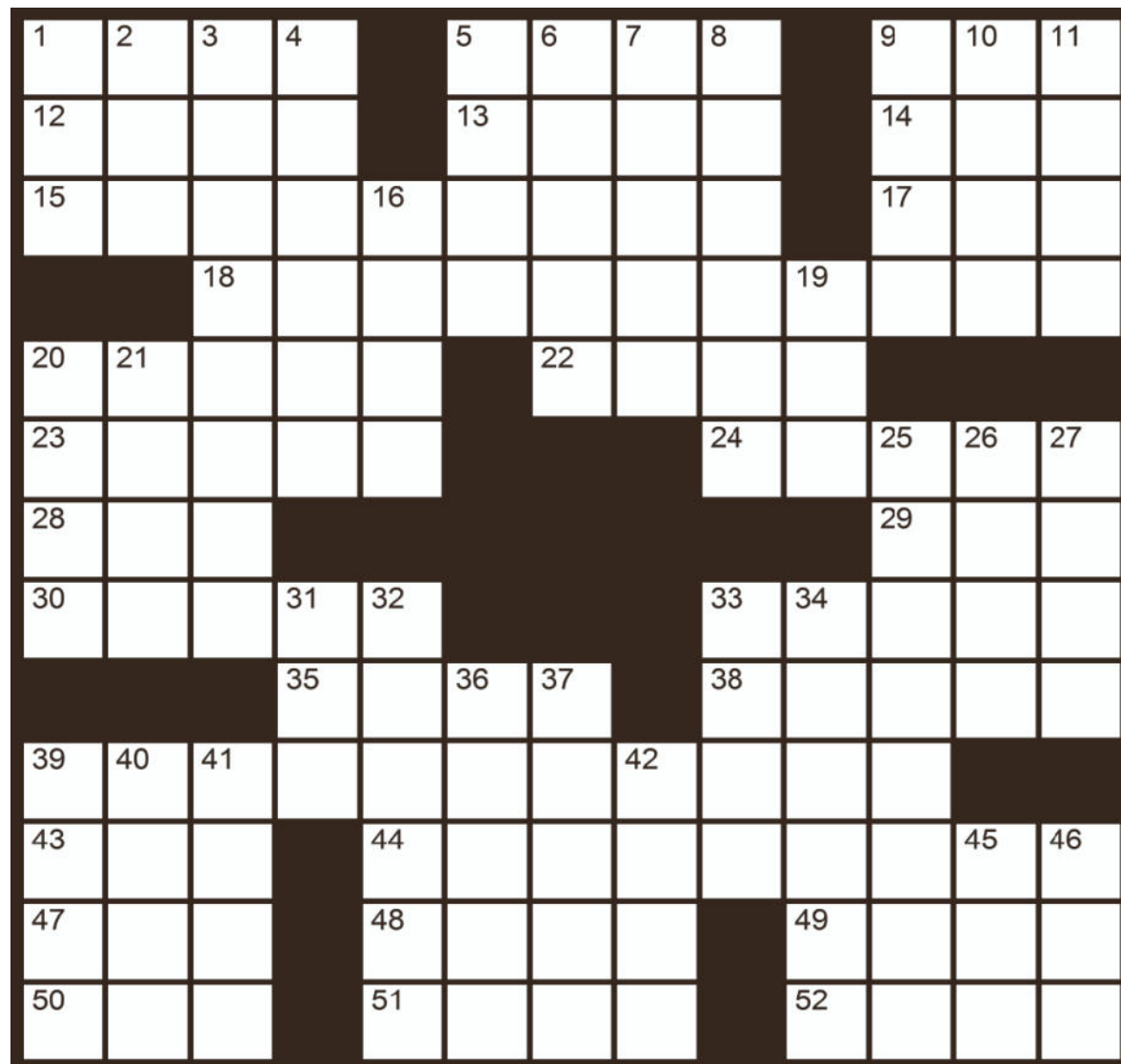

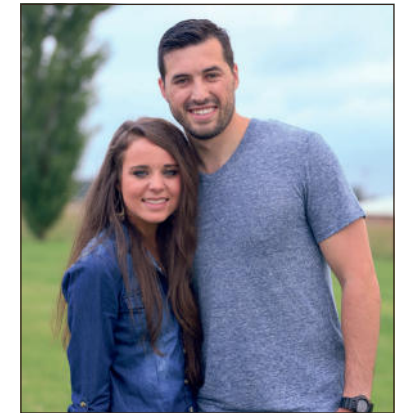
