An appraisal is the valuation of a home by a licensed appraiser, and reduces the risk to the lender by ensuring they subject property is worth.

What's the difference the deal can help prevent arrives at a value for the home. The first is the "comparable approach," which looks at selling prices for similar homes in the neighborhood. The appraiser will make adjustments for any between differences the property and the comparables, to arrive at a fair market value.

> A second method is by "cost of replacement," the peace of mind that in which the appraiser calculates replacement value if the property were to be rebuilt.

> > The third valuation method, "income capitalization," takes a sale price for the property in relation to how much income it would generate usually reserved for investment properties.

> > > If the valuation is

higher than the purchase price, the buyers should be very happy! However, if the appraisal valuation comes in too low, there are several different options available to save the deal. The buyer and/ or seller could make up the difference with a larger down payment; the seller could reduce the price; or the purchase agreement could be cancelled if the purchase agreement contains that contingency.

The cost appraisal is around \$400, and is included in the settlement statement at the time of closing.

Although it means expense, optional inspection and lender-requested appraisal should bring some peace of mind to the buyer, knowing the property has been checked for problems, and that it is worth the price they are paying.



A Timely Recipe

The Lloyd hunting party did not get a deer last weekend, Maggie and I were mighty happy when the man of our house returned safe and sound. We just got word that our fourteen-year-old granddaughter Taylor got her second deer of the season today. I guess she is turning out to be the hunter of the family! I can live without venison, although we do eat jerky, sausage and I can tell no difference if I use ground venison in chili.

This time of the year I am always browsing through my recipe file looking for holiday recipes that use ingredients that remind me of the holidays, such is the one I am sharing with you this week, I have no idea who gave it to me, its easy to make and the muffins are best served warm.

Cranberry Muffins:

Mix together in a small bowl, 1 cup fresh or frozen cranberries, halved with 1/2 cup sugar and 1 tsp. grated orange rind, set aside.

Whisk together in a large bowl: 1 egg, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/2 cup orange juice and 1 tsp. canola oil. To this stir in 2 cups Bisquick, stir just until moistened, then fold in cranberry mixture. Divide muffin mixture between 12 greased muffin tins, Bake in a preheated 375 degree oven for 20-25 minutes.

The Raptor Center

Established in 1974, The Raptor Center at the University of Minnesota treats around 1,000 sick or injured raptors each year in its clinic and trains veterinary students and veterinarians from all over the world. On October 18th, for the first time in The Raptor Center's 45 years, a nestling barn owl was admitted to the clinic. There are few reported barn owl nests in Minnesota. This nest was found in a barn in Douglas County, making it the northernmost barn owl nest reported in Minnesota in the last 50 years according to the DNR. You will generally be able to deduct the fair market value of the investment, and you can avoid paying capital gains taxes on the appreciation.

• Consider selling investments to realize capital losses. You may have taxable capital gains, either from selling investments that have increased in value or simply from own-

ing mutual funds (mutual fund managers constantly buy and sell individual investments within the funds). These capital gains could increase the amount of taxes you owe. If you own some investments that have lost value since you purchased them, selling them would generate capital losses that could be used to offset capital gains. Further, if you have more losses than gains, you can use up to \$3,000 of your losses to offset ordinary in-

Keep in mind that selling an investment may change the allocation and performance of your portfolio. Also, just because an investment is down in value is not necessarily a reason to sell. And once

you sell an investment to generate a capital loss, you need to wait at least 31 days to repurchase it to avoid incurring what's known as a "wash sale." Your financial professional can help you determine if selling any investments makes sense for your situation.

Before making any of these moves, you'll also want to consult with your tax professional. And remember that while taxes are a consideration, they should not necessarily drive your investment decisions. When investing, you need to build a portfolio that's appropriate for your risk tolerance and time horizon and that can help you achieve your goals, such as
