

## Howard's Evening Primrose

Oenothera howardii (Evening Primrose family)

Native

Large yellow flowers open in the evening and are gone by mid morning the next day



Prairie paintbush

Castilleja sessiliflora (Figwort family)

Native

Not as brightly colored as some of its mountain relatives but still a beauty



Stork's bill Erodium cicutarium (Geranium family)

Introduced

A common early weed with tiny flowers. The fruit pods look like a stork's bill. They open suddenly to catapult the seeds



## Missouri milkvetch

Astragalus smissouriensis (Pea family)

Native

Common plants on the plains, sometimes also called locoweeds

## Two grooved milkvetch

Astragalus bisulcatus (Pea family)

Native

Colors white to deep magenta. Leaves are smooth, pods have two longitudinal grooves





# Drummond's milkvetch

Astragalus drummondii (Pea family)

Native

Leaves covered with soft white hairs giving a gray-green appearance to the plant



### Blue flax

Linum (Adenolinum) lewesii (Linen family)

Native

Prolific this time of year. Flowers last only one day.

## Prairie groundsel

Packera plattensis (Sunflower family)

Native

## Bright patches of yellow that match well with the wild flax





Locoweed

Oxytropis sericea (Pea family)

#### Native

Differ from milkvetch in flower form and having no leaves on the stem. <u>Toxic to livestock</u> especially horses
