Complainants file this complaint under penalty of perjury pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(1) with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") against Senator Alan Cranston, the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, and other parties named herein. Specifically this complaint alleges that Senator Alan Cranston and the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, Marvin S. Shapiro, Treasurer, have willfully and flagrantly violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("Act") by

- -- failing to report to the Federal Election Commission on time, as required by law, debts and obligations of the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee totalling more than \$300,000
- -- accepting illegal individual campaign contributions from persons who had already contributed their full legal limit to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee
- -- accepting illegal corporate campaign contributions
- -- accepting a contribution from a nonfederal political committee which may have included illegal corporate, labor, and bank contributions
- -- failing to report pre-election contributions in the timely manner required by law
- failing to make public, as required by law, the mailing addresses of certain contributors to the Cranston for Senate '86 campaign

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The FEC already has fined the Cranston for President Committee in April of 1985 for a continuing pattern of disregard for the Federal campaign laws. (See Attachment 1.) The FEC General Counsel's Report stated that the Committee was guilty of "substantial reporting violations" because it failed to file on time or to correctly itemize receipts and debts. Cranston failed to disclose over \$1.5 million in reportable debts.

Now, barely one and one half years later, Senator Alan Cranston and his reelection committee continue to disregard the law, resulting in concealment of hundreds of thousands of dollars in campaign debts and incomplete and faulty disclosure to the FEC and the public. Moreover, Senator Cranston and his Committee have compounded the violations by accepting illegal corporate political contributions and illegal excessive individual contributions.

I. Introduction

Paul Gann and Robert W. Naylor (hereinafter "Complaintants") are residents, taxpayers, and registered voters of Sacramento and San Mateo, California, respectively. Alan Cranston is a candidate for the United States Senate. Marvin S. Shapiro is the Treasurer of the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the principal campaign committee, FEC Identification No. C00138743).

II. <u>Failure to Report Debts and Obligations of the Committee as</u> Required by Law

According to 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. Section 104.11(b), "Any loan, debt, or obligation the amount of which is over \$500 shall be reported as of the time of the transaction." Attachment 2 details those expenditures made by the Cranston Committee in the first few days after each reporting period, beginning with the July 1 - December 31, 1985 period.

For example, the Cranston Committee reports an expenditure to the U.S. Senate Restaurant for "meals" on January 1, 1986 in the amount of \$1,955.00. Since there is no postal service on January 1, 1986, this bill is one which would have to

have been on hand as of December 31, 1985. However, no outstanding debt to the U.S. Senate in any amount is reported on the Cranston Committee's FEC report covering the period July 1 -December 31, 1985.

Likewise, the Cranston Committee reports an expenditure to Wells Fargo Bank on January 1, 1986 in the amount of \$1,733.00. This invoice also would have been on hand as of December 31, 1985, yet it was not disclosed as an outstanding debt on the Committee's July 1 - December 31, 1985 FEC report.

As these two examples and the other potential violations in Attachment 2 totaling \$312,985.00 indicate, the Cranston Committee clearly violated 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. Section 104.11(b) by failing to report its outstanding debts and obligations as required on its FEC reports.

In as much as the Cranston for President Committee, Inc., also violated 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. Section 104.11(b) by failing to report its outstanding debts and was assessed a civil penalty for said violation (see Attachment 1, copy of the Conciliation Agreement), the failure of the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee to report its outstanding debts and obligations appears to be a <u>willful</u> <u>misrepresentation</u> of the committee's financial status on the part of Senator Cranston.

III. Acceptance of Illegal Excessive Contributions

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According to 2 U.S.C. Section 441a(a)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. Section 110.1(a)(1), "No person shall make contributions to any candidate, his or her authorized political committee or agents with respect to any election to Federal office which in the aggregate exceed \$1,000." Thus, an individual may legally donate \$1,000 to a candidate's primary election and \$1,000 to a general election. The Cranston Committee, however, has repeatedly accepted and reported contributions in excess of these limits from the aforementioned eight individuals. The amounts of the violations are as follows:

See Attachment 3. Supporting FEC Schedules A as filed by the Cranston Committee are provided for each of the violating donors. No contribution refunds to these individuals have been reported.

In addition, in the four of these cases in which the spouses were known, they too contributed to Senator Cranston's campaign, thus eliminating the possibility of an attribution error. These individuals are Mary Jane Brinton, who donated \$2,000 on March 26, 1986, Sarah Hambrecht, who donated \$2,000 on March 6, 1985, Miriam L. Haas, who donated \$1,000 on April 10, 1986 and \$1,000 on December 3, 1985, and Edythe Broad, who donated \$1,000 to the primary campaign on May 29, 1986 and another \$1,000 to the primary campaign on December 30, 1981 (which is also illegal, although probably a minor accounting error). In all cases, the contributions have been reported by name and address as well as by business, which also indicates that they are not misrepresentations of spouses' contributions. There can be no doubt that each of these excessive contributions violates 2 U.S.C. Section 441a(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. Section 110.1(a)(1).

It should be noted that a review of the dates involved in these contributions leave some excuse for the donors themselves. This is not an excuse for the Treasurer of Senator

Cranston's campaign, however, who is already on notice from the Federal Elections Commission to be aware of violations.

IV. Acceptance of Illegal Corporate Contributions

The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) made two \$1,000 contributions to the Cranston Committee during calendar year 1985, one of which was reported by the Cranston Committee on June 11, 1985, and the other of which was reported on November 6, 1985. (See Attachment 4 and supporting Schedules A). According to the June 24, 1986 FEC listing of registered political committees, neither "ASCAP" nor "The American Society of Composers, Authors and publishers" is listed as a political committee that contributes to political candidates. It was further verified by telephone with the State of New York Board of Elections that ASCAP, located in New York City, does not have a political committee registered with the State of New York. However, ASCAP is an incorporated entity, registered in 1979 with the State of New York in the Corporation Division of the Office of the Secretary of State of New York. Therefore, the Cranston Committee has accepted and reported illegal corporate contributions totalling \$2,000 from ASCAP, which violates 2 U.S.C. Section 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(a)(2)(b).

V. Receipt of Contributions from Non-Federal PAC

The Cranston Committee accepted and reported \$200 from the "Friends Sup. Kennedy" on May 5, 1985, a committee registered with the California Political Reform Division in Sacramento. Because corporate contributions, labor union contributions, and state, bank and savings and loan contributions are permissable under the laws for San Francisco Supervisorial committees, it is reasonable to assume that this contribution was made from funds prohibited under 2 U.S.C. Section 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(a) and (b). See Attachment 5.

VI. Failure to Report Full Identity of Contributors

According to 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(3)(A) and 11 C.F.R. Section 104.3(a)(4)(i), a political committee must report the identification of "each person, other than any committee, who makes a contribution to the reporting committee during the

reporting period, whose contribution or contributions aggregate in excess of \$200 per calendar year..." 2 (.C. Section 431(13) and 11 C.F.R. Section 100.12 provide the definition of identification:

> "Identification" means, in the case of an individual, his or her full name, including: first name, middle name, or initial, if available, and last name; mailing address; occupation; and the name of his or her employer; and, in the case of any other person, the person's full name and address.

The Cranston Committee, however, has failed to report the mailing address of at least three individuals and one group. The details regarding these dates of violations and amounts of violations are listed on Attachment 5. 2 U.S.C. Section 432(c)(2) clearly states: "The Treasurer of a political committee shall keep an account of the name and address of any person who makes a contribution in excess of \$50...." Therefore, the Cranston Committee has obviously violated 2 U.S.C. Section 432(c)(2) by failing either to obtain the mailing address of these donors or to dispose of the illegal portion of the contributions as prescribed by 11 C.F.R. Section 110.4(c)(3).

In addition, the contribution from "Zimmerman, Martin" with no address other than "IL", may actually be a contribution from Marvin Zimmerman of Highland Park, IL, who has already donated the legal limit of \$2,000. If Martin Zimmerman in Illinois with no address is the same as Marvin Zimmerman in Highland Park, IL, then Marvin Zimmerman is the ninth donor to exceed the legal limit, with contributions totaling \$3,000. If the two donors are not the same, then it is impermissible to not find and report a contributor of such a large amount.

VII. Failure to Report Pre-Election Contributions in a Timely Manner

According to 2 U.S.C. Section 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. Section 104.5(f):

The principal campaign committee committee of a candidate shall notify the Clerk, the Secretary, or the Commission, and the Secretary of State,

as appropriate, in writing, of any contributions of \$1,000 or more received by any authorized committee of such candidate after the 20th day, but more than 48 hours before, any election. This notification shall be made within 48 hours after the receipt of such contribution and shall include the name of the candidate and the office sought by the candidate, the identification of the contributor, and the date of receipt and amount of the contribution.

The Cranston Committee accepted \$1,000 from Burston-Marsteller PAC of Washington, D.C. on May 19, 1986 and \$4,700 from Letter Carriers COPE of Washington, D.C. on May 21, 1986 and reported these receipts on pages 2 and 4, respectively, of its May 15 -June 30, 1986 FEC report (see Attachment 6). However, the Cranston committee did not list either of these two contributions on any of the five 48-hour notice reports which it filed with the Secretary of the Senate. Therefore, the Committee has clearly violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. 104.5(f) by failing to report these two contributions on its 48-hour notices as required.

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In addition, the Cranston Committee sent its 48-hour notices to the Secretary of the Senate via certified mail, return receipt requested, thereby ensuring that the notices and the contributions listed therein would arrive more than 48 hours following the date the contributions were received. As a result, each of the five 48-hour notices filed by the Cranston Committee obviously violates 2 U.S.C. 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. 104.5(f) because the contributions listed therein were not reported within 48 hours of receipt. (See Attachment 7).

In fact, the 48 hour notice dated May 29 for contributions received on May 28 did not arrive at the Secretary of the Senate until June 3, the day of the California primary election. Further, the 48 hour notice dated May 30 for contributions received on May 29 did not arrive at the Secretary of the Senate until June 4, the day <u>after</u> the California primary election, thereby making it impossible for these contributions to be made a part of the public record before the election.

VIII. Other Inaccuracies in Cranston Committee Reports

In addition to these violations, numerous reporting errors are brought to your attention:

- (A) The June 11, 1985 \$1,000 contribution from ASCAP is reported on Line 11c of the Mid-Year 1985 FEC report, while the \$1,000 contribution from ASCAP on November 6, 1985 is reported on Line 11a of the Year-End 1985 FEC report (see Attachment 8).
- (B) Attachment 9 lists unitemized contributors commingled with itemized contributors on Line 11a.
- (C) Attachment 10 lists expenditures for credit card expenses which are not fully further disclosed with the reporting of ultimate vendors.
- (D) Attachment 11 details bank charges and the return of insufficient funds deposited on Line 21 "Other Expenses" instead of Line 17 "Operating Expenses" and Line 11e "Total Contributions". As a result, operating expenses are under-reported, and total contributions are over-reported.

The Cranston Committee should be required to file amended FEC reports as necessary to correct these reporting errors.

Complainants swear under penalty of perjury and subject to the provisions of 18 U.S.C. Section 1001 that the foregoing is true and correct of their personal knowledge and, on the basis of the foregoing, Complainants request that because this is a repeat offense and because Alan Cranston's committee agreed in writing that it would "not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971", that the FEC:

> Conduct a prompt and immediate investigation of the facts and legal conclusions stated in this complaint and publish its findings before November 4, 1986;

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- 2. Enter into a prompt conciliation with Respondents to remedy the violations alleged in this complaint; and
- 3. Impose any and all appropriate penalties grounded in violations alleged in this Complaint.



CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Cranston for President Committee, Inc., and William M. Landau, as Treasurer ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(3)(A)(i) and 434 (b) by filing a substantially deficient 1983 Year End Report and a substantially late and deficient 1984 February Monthly Report.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement concluded pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437(a)(4)(A)(i).

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II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

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III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

 Cranston for President Committee, Inc., is a political committee registered with the Commission and is the principal campaign committee in Senator Alan Cranston's campaign for the 1984 Democratic presidential nomination.
 William M. Landau is the Committee's Treasurer.

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2. The Commission determined Senator Cranston eligible to receive presidential primary matching funds under 2 U.S.C. § 9033 on April 14, 1983. Senator Cranston competed in the Iowa caucuses on February 20, 1984, and in the New Hampshire primary on February 27, 1984. Senator Cranston became ineligible for matching funds on March 1, 1984 when he dropped out of the race for the nomination. As of July 26, 1984, Senator Cranston had received \$1,812,099.88 in federal matching funds.

3. The two disclosure reports required to be filed by publicly funded Presidential candidates prior to the start of the Presidential primary elections are the Year-End Report due January 31, 1984, and the February Monthly Report due February 20, 1984. Respondents contend that they employed good faith efforts to prepare and file these Reports and that they provided complete information as soon as possible.

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The 1983 Year End Report

4. On January 31, 1984, the Committee timely filed
the 1983 Year End Report, as required by 2 U.S.C. § 434
(a)(3)(B) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(b)(2)(ii).

5. Line 12 of this Report, entitled "Debts and Obligations Owed <u>By</u> the Committee" (emphasis in report), was blank. Also, the required Schedules C and D, for itemization of loans and of debts other than loans, were omitted.

6. On March 15, 1984, the Committee amended the Report to reflect a total on line 12, for outstanding loans of \$1,150,512.05 and included a complete Schedule C, itemization of loans. Totals for and itemization of debts other than loans were not included in the amendment.

7. On July 5, 1984, the Committee amended the Report to include Schedule D debts other than loans, and an accurate total of debts owed on Line 12. This amendment reflected additional debts of more than \$425,000.

The February 1984 Monthly Report

8. In 1984, the Committee was obligated under 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(3)(A)(i) to file monthly Reports of Receipts and Disbursements. The February 1984 Monthly Report,

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covering activity from January 1-31, 1984, was due February 20, 1984.

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9. The Committee did not timely file the report. A non-filer notice was sent to the Committee by mailgram on February 27, 1984. The Committee filed the February Report on March 15, 1984, 24 days late.

10. When it filed the February Report, the Committee did not provide complete debt totals on Line 12 or Schedule D itemization of debts. Also, the Committee failed to provide Schedule A itemization of receipts, required pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3).

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11. On June 18 and June 28, the Committee amended its February Report to provide the omitted information. The amendments reflected that more than \$500,000 of outstanding debts were omitted from the Report when filed, and that the required itemization of \$135,000 of contributions had been omitted from the Report when filed.

V. By its failure to timely disclose its substantial debt in the 1983 Year End and 1984 February Monthly Reports, the Committee and William M. Landau as Treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8).

VI. By filing the 1984 February Monthly Report 24 days beyond the February 20, 1984 due date, the Committee and William M. Landau as Treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(3)(A)(i).

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VII. By failing to timely itemize receipts in the 1984 February Report, the Committee and William M. Landau as Treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3).

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VIII. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437ç(a)(5)(A).

IX. Respondents agree that they shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

X. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

XI. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties have executed it and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

XII. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XIII. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be valid.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. Statement of the Case

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This matter was initiated by the Commission pursuant to information obtained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. It involves substantial reporting violations by the Cranston for President Committee, Inc., the principal campaign committee in Senator Alan Cranston's campaign for the 1984 Democratic presidential nomination. The Commission determined Senator Cranston eligible to receive presidential primary matching funds under 26 U.S.C. § 9033 and, thus far, Senator Cranston has received more than \$2 million in public funds. Senator Cranston competed in the Iowa caucuses on February 20, 1984, and in the New Hampshire primary on February 27, 1984, and dropped out of the race for the nomination on March 1, 1984.

A. The 1993 Year End Report

On January 31, 1984, the Committee timely filed the 1983 Year End Report covering activity from October 1 through December 31, 1983. Eowever, Line 12 of this Report, entitled "Debts and Obligations Owed <u>Bv</u> the Committee" (emphasis in report), was blank. Also, the required Schedules C and D, for itemization of loans and of debts other than loans, were omitted. On March 15, 1984, the Committee amended the Report to reflect a total on Line 12 of \$1,150,512.05 for outstanding loans and included a complete Schedule C, itemization of loans. The Committee did not include totals for and itemization of debts other than loans in the amendment. On July 5, 1984, the Committee amended the Report to include Schedule D debts other than loans, and an accurate total of debts owed on Line 12. This amendment reflected additional debts of more than \$425,000.

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B. The February 1984 Monthly Report

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The Committee's February 1984 Monthly Report, covering activity from January 1-31, 1984, was due February 20, 1984, the day of the Iowa caucuses when Senator Cranston was an active presidential candidate. Eowever, the Committee did not timely file the report. A non-filer notice was sent to the Committee by mailgram on February 27, 1984. The Committee finally filed the February Report on March 15, 1984, 24 days late, and 14 days after Senator Cranston had dropped out of the presidential nomination race.

When the Committee did file the February Report, it omitted complete debt totals on Line 12 and Schedule D itemization of debts. Also, the Committee omitted all itemization of contributions (Schedule A), required pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3). On June 18 and June 28, the Committee amended its February Report to provide the omitted information. The amendments reflected more than \$500,000 of outstanding debts and itemization of \$135,000 of contributions, omitted from the Report when filed. On May 22, 1984, the Commission found reason to believe the Committee and William Landau, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(3)(A)(i) and 434(b) for the late and incomplete filing of the February Monthly Report. On September 5, 1984, the Commission found reason to believe the Committee and its treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) for omission of its debts from the 1983 Year End Report.

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The Committee has asserted that the failure to itemize contributions in the February 1984 report resulted from a dispute with the computer company contracted with to compile and provide this information. According to the Committee, beginning in early 1984, the company refused to supply the necessary data, and the Committee could not prepare the contributor list manually. Regarding the omitted debts and obligations in both the February Monthly and 1963 Year End reports, the Committee contends it manually tabulated its debts through 1983, but upon discovery that such tabulation was seriously flawed, determined it necessary to verify transactions from all vendors to assure the accuracy of the debt. According to the Committee, the ongoing verification process was responsible for omission of the debt totals and schedules from the 1983 Year End Report as well as the 1984 February Monthly Report.

II. Lecal Analysis

Section 434(a)(3)(A)(i) of Title 2, United States Code requires the principal campaign committee of presidential

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candidates such as Senator Cranston to file monthly reports of receipts and disbursements in the calendar year of the election, and to file such reports no later than the 20th day after the last day of each month. Further, 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) requires political committees to disclose the amount and nature of debts and obligations owed by them. Also, 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) requires such committees to itemize individual contributions received in excess of \$200 in each calendar year.

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Accordingly, by their failure to disclose the Committee's substantial debt in the 1983 Year End and 1984 February Monthly Reports, the Committee and William Landau, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8). By filing the 1984 February Monthly Report 24 days beyond the February 20, 1984 due date, the Committee and its treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(3)(A)(i). Also, by failing to timely itemize receipts in the 1984 February Report, the Committee and its treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3).

These violations involve a serious failure of disclosure by a presidential candidate at a critical time in the primary race. Specifically, the Committee's 1983 Year End Report, due and filed January 31, 1984, and its February Monthly Report, due February 20, 1984, were pivotal disclosure reports at the*start of the early presidential primaries and caucuses. Here, the Year End Report did not disclose the Committee's substantial debt. The Committee did not file the February Report until almost a month after its due date, after Senator Cranston had left the race, and when filed, it too was substantially incomplete. The Committee contends that its treasurer exerted "best efforts" pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 432(i), vitiating any violation of the Act. Section 432(i) provides:

> When the treasurer of a political committee shows that best efforts have been used to obtain, maintain, and submit the information required by this Act for the political committee, any report or any records of such committee shall be considered in compliance with this Act or chapter 95 or chapter 96 of title 26.

This rule has its greatest force where the Act obliges the treasurer to provide information which must be secured from persons wholly outside the treasurer's or the committee's control. Accordingly, the legislative history of the "best efforts" provision focused on required contributor information, which is "voluntarily supplied by persons who are not under the control of the committee." E.R. Rep. No. 422, 96th Cong., 1st Sess. 14, Legis. Eistory of the FECA Amendments of 1979 at 198. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.9(d), 104.7(b). In contrast, here the reasons for the reporting violations were within the Committee's control: the insufficiency of employees it chose to perform the job, or problems with a vendor whom it similarly contracted with for the performance of services.

First, as to the Committee's failure to report its debts in the 1983 Year End and in the 1984 February Monthly Reports, the omission apparently resulted from the Committee's complete Thability to track a large volume of outstanding payables, and not from any arguable failure by a third party. Application of the best efforts rule in such a case would be grounded in the

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premise that committees cannot be expected timely to report their activity during the heat of the campaign, a premise which could obviate the Act's disclosure requirements on a broad scale.

Second, the Committee seeks to excuse its failure to itemize more than \$130,000 of contributions, asserting that "best efforts" were used. However, if the "debt dispute" resulting in the computer firm's withholding of the required information arose because the Committee chose to pay direct campaign costs such as media and not its compliance-related vendor, application of the best efforts rule to vitiate the violation would obviously be misplaced. Furthermore, the Commission previously has found probable cause to believe that a violation occurred where substantial reporting omissions allegedly were caused by the failure of computer service vendors to provide necessary information. MUR 1304 (Connolly for President); MUR 1294 (National Conservative Political Action Committee). Thus, the Cranston Committee here may not avoid its statutory reporting obligations merely by delegating responsibility for compiling the required information with a computer service vendor in lieu of having such services performed by campaign staff.

Last, it is highly relevant that the reporting omissions, and the Committee's excuse for those omissions, occur in the context of a publicly funded presidential campaign. In exchange for the receipt of federal matching funds, Senator Cranston expressly promised to abide by the requirements, including reporting, of Title 2, United States Code. Especially in view of

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this promise, and of the \$2 million in public funds thus far given to Senator Cranston in reliance on it, the Committee's substantial omissions of disclosure should not be excused.

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III. General Counsel's Recommendations

Based on the foregoing, the Office of the General Counsel recommends the Commission find probable cause to believe the Cranston for President Committee, Inc. and William Landau, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) for omission of complete debt totals and schedules from the 1983 Year End and 1984 February Monthly Reports, and 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(3)(A)(i) and 434(b)(3) for late filing of the 1984 February Monthly Report and omission of itemization of contributions from (Film (Film)) Report.

REPORT OF THE AUDIT DIVISION -ON CRANSTON FOR PRESIDENT COMMITTEE, INC.

I. Background

A. Overview

This report is based on an audit of Cranston for President Committee, Inc. ("the Committee") to determine whether there has been compliance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") and the Presidential Primary Matching Payment Account Act. The audit was conducted pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 9038(a) which states that "after each matching payment period, the Commission shall conduct a thorough examination and audit of the gualified campaign expenses of every candidate and his authorized committees who received payments under Section 9037."

In addition, 26 U.S.C. § 9039(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 9038.1(a)(2) state, in relevant part, that the Commission may conduct other examinations and audits from time to time as it deems necessary.

The Committee registered with the Federal Election Commission on November 22, 1982 as the Cranston Presidential Advisory Committee, Inc. In addition, the Committee conducted testing of the waters activity commencing January 1, 1982. The Committee changed its name to Cranston For President Committee, Inc. on March 24, 1983. The Committee maintains its beadquarters in Washington, D.C.

The audit covered the period from January 1, 1982, through May 31, 1984, the last day covered by the most recent report filed with the Commission at the time of the audit. In addition, certain activity was reviewed through July 13, 1984 for the Statement of Net Outstanding Campaign Obligations and through August 31, 1984 for allocation of expenditures to States. The Committee reported an opening cash balance of \$-0-, total receipts of \$7,294,652.16, total disbursements of \$7,279,893.52, and a closing cash balance of \$14,758.64 on May 31, 1984. However, the Committee continued to receive contributions and make disbursements. In addition, revised Statements of Net Outstanding Campaign Obligations have been submitted with each matching fund submission as required by 11 C.F.R. § 9034.5(d). Under 11 C.F.R. § 9038.1(b)(3) and (e)(4), additional audit work may be conducted and addenda to this report issued as necessary.

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This report is based upon documents and working papers which support each of its factual statements. They form part of the record upon which the Commission based its decisions on the matters in the report and were available to Commissioners and appropriate staff for review.

B. Key Personnel

C. Scope

The audit included such tests as verification of total reported receipts, disbursements and individual transactions; review of required supporting documentation; analysis of Committee debts and obligations; review of contribution and expenditure limitations; and such other audit procedures as deemed necesssary under the circumstances.

II. <u>Finding and Recommendation Related to Title 2,</u> United States Code

A. Matters Referred to the Office of General Counsel

Certain matters noted during the audit were referred to the Commission's Office of General Counsel.

- III. Findings and Recommendations Related to Title 26, United States Code
 - A. Calculation of Repayment Ratio

Section 9038(b)(2) of Title 26, United States Code states if the Commission determines that any amount of any payment made to a candidate from the matching payment account was used for any purpose other than to defray the qualified campaign expenses with respect to which such payment was made or to repay loans the proceeds of which were used to defray qualified campaign expenses, it shall notify such candidate of the amount so used, and the candidate shall pay to the Secretary an amount equal to such amount.

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The Commission, in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in the <u>Federal Register</u> on June 28, 1984, set forth a pro-rata formula which would base repayments for non-qualified campaign expenses on the proportion of federal funds to total funds received by the candidate. The text of the regulation and the Explanation and Justification were published in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> on August 22, 1984, and transmitted to Congress. On March 5, 1985, the revised regulations were resubmitted for publication. The proposed regulations were before the Congress for 30 legislative days as of May 20, 1985, and approved by the Commission for publication in final form on June 11, 1985.

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The formula and the appropriate calculation with respect to the Committee's receipt activity is as follows:

Total Matching Funds Certified Through the Date of Ineligibility (3/1/84) 1 Numerator + Private Contributions Received Through 3/1/84

 $\frac{1,697,633.91}{(\$1,697,633.91 + \$3,409,801.88)} = .332385$

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Thus, the repayment ratio for non-qualified campaign expenses is 33.2385%.

B. Use of Funds for Non-Qualified Campaign Expenses

Section 9038.2(b)(2)(i)(A) of Title 11, Code of Federal Regulations provides, in part, that the Commission may determine that amount(s) of any payments made to a candidate from the matching payment account, or contributions received by the candidate, were used for purposes other than gualified campaign expenses. Further, 11 C.F.R. § 9038.2(b)(2)(ii)(C) provides, in part, that an example of a Commission repayment determination under paragraph (b)(2) of this section includes determinations that funds were expended for expenses resulting from a violation of state or federal law, such as the payment of fines or penalties.

I/ On March 8, 1984, the Commission determined that the date of ineligibility under 11 C.F.R. § 9033.5(a) for Senator Alan Cranston is March 1, 1984.

1. Disbursements for Fines and Penalties

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A review of the Committee's disbursement activity revealed that the Committee disbursed \$875.00 for traffic and parking ticket fines. Additionally, the Committee disbursed \$6,076.96 for penalties for filing their Federal and State taxes on an untimely basis. These apparent non-gualified campaign expenses totaled \$6,951.96.

At the exit conference on October 19, 1984, the Audit staff presented Committee officials with schedules of the apparent non-qualified campaign expenses.

In the interim audit report, the Audit staff recommended that, absent a showing to the contrary, the Commission make an initial determination that the amount of payments of fines and penalties (\$6,951.96) be viewed as nongualified campaign expenses and the pro-rata portion of \$2,310.73 (\$6,951.96 x .332385) be repaid to the U.S. Treasury pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 9038(b)(2).

The Committee's response to the interim audit report dated May 2, 1985 did not address this issue.

Conclusion

On August 14, 1985, the Commission made an <u>initial</u> <u>determination</u> that the amount (\$6,951.96) of payments for fines and penalties be viewed as non-qualified campaign expenses and the pro-rata portion of \$2,310.73 be repaid to the U.S. Treasury within 90 calendar days of receipt of this report in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 9038.2(d).

Repayment Amount: \$2,310.73

2. Bank Charges Assessed for Issuance of Checks Drawn on Accounts with Non-Sufficient Funds

During the audit, the Audit staff noted \$5,502 in bank charges for Committee checks which were drawn on 3 bank accounts with insufficient funds. These charges occurred from October, 1983 through March, 1984. A Committee worksheet entitled "Bad Check List-Final" lists 736 checks, totaling \$166,498.07, that were drawn on these accounts.

In the interim audit report, the Audit staff recommended that, absent a showing to the contrary, the Commission make an initial determination that the amount of bank charges (\$5,502) be viewed as non-qualified campaign expenses and the pro-rata portion, \$1,828.78 (\$5,502 x .332385), be repaid to the U.S. Treasury pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 9038(b)(2).

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On May 2, 1985, the Committee responded that:

"section 9032(a) of Title 26, United States Code defines a qualified expense as a purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit or gift of money or of anything of value incurred by the candidate, or by his authorized committee, in connection with his campaign for nomination or election, and neither the incurring nor payment of which constitutes a violation of any law of the United States or of the State in which the expense is incurred. These bank charges fall squarely within this statutory definition. They constitute payments due under a contract between the banks and the Committee and are not expenses which arise from a violation of law. Thus, they are analogous to finance charges charged on credit card accounts, which are clearly gualified expenses, rather than governmental fines or penalties."

The Commission has not previously encountered the issuance of insufficient fund checks on such a large scale by a publiclyfunded committee. Here, the Committee issued hundreds of bad checks under circumstances suggesting either knowledge that the checks were unsupported or at least disregard for whether there would be sufficient funds to cover the checks. Although the Commission has accorded wide discretion to candidates in how to conduct their publicly-funded campaigns, and therefore in what costs are qualified campaign expenses, it has also found in specific cases certain expenses are not legitimate ones to be paid for with public funds. Thus, in contrast to legitimate finance charges mentioned by the Committee, the bank penalties result here from behavior which is not the type of activity Congress intended to finance with public funds in enacting the Matching Payment Account Act, and in fact could be illegal. While not intruding on the Committee's legitimate discretion in how to run its publicly-funded campaign, the Commission believes that public funds should not subsidize bank charges for widespread issuance of bad checks.

Conclusion

On August 14, 1985, the Commission made an <u>initial</u> <u>determination</u> that the amount (\$5,502) of bank charges be viewed as non-qualified campaign expenses and the pro-rata portion of \$1,828.78 be repaid to the U.S. Treasury within 90 calendar days of receipt of this report in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 9038.2(d).

C. <u>Determination of Net Outstanding Campaign</u> <u>Obligations</u>

Section 9034.5(a) of Title 11, Code of Federal Regulations requires that the candidate submit a Statement of Net Outstanding Campaign Obligations (NOCO) which discloses among other items, the total of all outstanding obligations for qualified campaign expenses and an estimate of the necessary winding down costs within 15 days of the candidate's date of ineligibility.

On March 8, 1984, the Commission determined that the date of ineligibility for Senator Alan Cranston was March 1, 1984. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 9033.5(a), that is the date Senator Cranston's candidacy terminated for the purpose of incurring qualified campaign expenses.

The Committee submitted the original NOCO on March 15, 1984 and has continued to submit a revised NOCO with each matching fund submission.

2/ The potential for an additional repayment(s) exists regarding expenses incurred by the Committee with respect to the Iowa state spending limitation (11 CFR § 9038.2(b)(2)(ii)(A)). Based on audit fieldwork performed through August 31, 1984, the Committee made \$641,424.40 in payments deemed allocable to the Iowa limit of \$684,537.50. In addition, approximately \$178,000 in accounts payable allocable to Iowa were noted. The Audit Division plans to perform follow-up fieldwork covering the period from September 1, 1984 through the disposition of the Committee's last matching fund payment (3/20/85) to verify the additional amounts paid and allocable to the Iowa state limit. After this audit work is completed, an addendum to this report will be prepared.

The Audit staff reviewed the NOCO dated July 13, 1984. This review was limited to verifying cash on hand, accounts receivable, capital assets and certain large accounts payable. 3/ The audited NOCO statement is included at Exhibit A.

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In its response to the interim audit report, the Committee did not address the NOCO statement. Should the Committee's financial position change substantially, additional fieldwork may be required to assess the impact of the change on the deficit and to verify additional components of the NOCO.

Conclusion

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The Committee received individual contributions totaling \$89,103.14 and a matching fund payment totaling \$34,131.07 during the period July 13, 1984 through August 31, 1984. Therefore, the Committee's remaining entitlement as of August 31, 1984, as audited, is \$1,100,472.72 (\$1,223,706.93 - \$123,234.21).

3/ The Committee's NOCO included other payables; however, these items were excluded since the Committee did not present documentation supporting these items prior to the completion of audit fieldwork.

This is in reply to a letter dated December 23, 1986, which I just received on my return after the holidays, on behalf of the Commission signed by Lois E. Lerner and follows my phone conversation with you today.

Apparently (if the facts are as stated) I contributed \$250 back in 1981 to Senator Alan Cranston (undoubtedly this was a lunch or dinner ticket purchase). Unfortunately I cannot find my cancelled checks for that period so I cannot verify this expenditure but I do not deny that it might have occurred. Then, during his recent campaign I contributed \$1,000 on December 2, 1985 and \$1,000 on April 11, 1986. Copies of these checks are enclosed. Because of the four year interval I obviously did not realize this last contribution put me \$250 over the limit, nor did the Senator's office notify me of the error.

In discussing this matter with Senator Cranston's local office they advise me that they plan to refund \$250 to me and believe this will correct the situation. I have requested them to do so. Though I realize I may be at fault I hope that the lapse of time between 1981 and 1985 as well as the relatively minor amount involved would provide ameliorating circumstances.

At this point I would like to leave the matter in your hands and do not intend to be represented by counsel; this would seem an unnecessary and unwarranted expense.

I have been notified by you of a complaint that I have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act by over-contributing to Alan Cranston's campaign.



We are responding to your letter dated December 23, on 1986 addressed to our client, the American Society of Composers, Authors & Publishers ("ASCAP") in connection with MUR 2304. ASCAP has filed a Statement of Designation of Counsel dated December 29, 1986.

The complaint designated MUR 2304 was filed by Paul Gann and Robert W. Naylor against Senator Alan Cranston, the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the "Committee"), and Marvin S. Shapiro as respondents. See Complaint, p.l. ASCAP was not named as a respondent. The complaint alleges that the three named respondents committed various violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA"), including "accepting illegal corporate campaign contributions" from ASCAP, namely two \$1,000 contributions in 1985. See Complaint, p.1. The complaint <u>incorrectly</u> alleges that ASCAP "is an incorporated entity, registered in 1979 with the State of New York in the Corporation Division of the Office of the Secretary of the State of New York." Complaint, p.5.

This matter should be dismissed as to ASCAP for two (a) ASCAP is not a respondent; and (b) even if ASCAP reasons: can be treated as a respondent, it is not a corporation and the acceptance of the contributions in question from ASCAP did not violate the FECA.

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As stated above, the complainants did not name ASCAP as a respondent in this case, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 111.4(d)(1). That regulation provides that a complaint such as the one at issue in MUR 2304 "should clearly identify as a respondent each person or entity who is alleged to have committed a violation." Complainants have identified only Senator Cranston, the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, and Marvin S. Shapiro as respondents. <u>See</u> Complaint, p.1. In the section of the complaint dealing with the alleged receipt of corporate contributions from ASCAP, complainants identify as the only alleged violator the Cranston Committee. <u>See</u> Complaint, p.5.

In view of the foregoing, ASCAP is not a respondent in MUR 2304 and the Commission should not treat ASCAP as a respondent. Any recommendation under 11 C.F.R. § 111.7 by the General Counsel to the Commission as to whether there is "reason to believe that <u>a respondent</u> has committed or is about to commit a violation" should not include ASCAP. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.7(a) (emphasis added). Similarly, ASCAP should not be included in any "reason to believe" finding or subsequent investigation by the Commission, or in any "probable cause" recommendation by the General Counsel or finding of the Commission. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.9, 111.10, 111.16, 111.17. All of these actions may be taken only against "respondents" named as such in the complaint, and ASCAP has not been named as a respondent in the complaint that initiated MUR 2304.

ASCAP is not a corporation and therefore the receipt of its contributions did not violate the FECA as alleged in the complaint.

The complaint states that ASCAP is "an incorporated entity" and that the receipt of its two \$1,000 contributions to the Cranston Committee therefore violated the ban on receipt of corporate contributions provided in 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). Contrary to these allegations, however, ASCAP is <u>not</u> and never has been a corporation. It is also <u>not</u> registered as a corporation with the Corporation Division of the New York Secretary of State.

ASCAP is the oldest performing rights licensing organization in the United States. It is an unincorporated membership association under New York's General Associations Law. This form of organization is factually and legally distinct from the corporate form. ASCAP currently has some 35,000 members who are composers, authors, and publishers of musical works.

to the proceedings in MUR 2304.

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ASCAP has filed an associational Certificate of Designation with the Bureau of Corporations of the New York Department of State. The sworn certificate is required of unincorporated associations such as ASCAP by Article 4, \$ 18 of the General Associations Law of the State of New York. A copy of ASCAP's most recent sworn certificate is attached as Exhibit 1 to this letter; it confirms that ASCAP is a New York association, and not a corporation. This certificate is dated May 23, 1986, but it is simply the latest of several such certificates filed by ASCAP as an association, and periodically renewed. The 1979 "registration" referred to on page 5 of the complaint was apparently one of ASCAP's earlier associational certificates. A copy is attached to this letter as Exhibit 2.

Under the FECA, any "person" may make contributions subject to specified limits. 2 U.S.C. § 431(17). The term "person" is defined as "an individual, partnership, committee, association, corporation, labor organization, or any other organization or group of persons." 2 U.S.C. § 431(11) (emphasis added); see also 11 C.F.R. § 100.10. As an unincorporated membership association, ASCAP is a "person" within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(11). ASCAP may therefore use its funds to make direct contributions to federal candidates and political committees up to the caps on the amounts of such contributions applicable to "persons," including unincorporated associations. ASCAP is not subject to the FECA's corporate contribution ban.

Conclusion

ASCAP should not be treated as a respondent in MUR 2304. Even if it is, the allegations concerning ASCAP are based on the erroneous factual assumption that ASCAP is a corporation -- when in fact it is not -- and should be dismissed.



This response is made on behalf of Eli and Edythe Broad. Upon review of the relevant records, it appears that Mr. Broad did overcontribute \$1,000 to the Cranston for Senate 1986 campaign. This amount has been refunded by the campaign. The Broads each made a \$1,000 contribution in December 1981 to the campaign. Mr. Broad then made a \$2,000 contribution in December 1984, forgetting that he had made the earlier contribution.

The apparent problem in connection with Mrs. Broad's contributions was a failure to designate to which election amounts should be attributed. In addition to the December 1981 \$1,000 contribution, Mrs. Broad made a \$1,000 contribution in May 1986. Both the campaign and Mrs. Broad had forgotten about her previous 1981 contribution and because Mrs. Broad had not designated that her 1986 contribution was for the general election, the campaign erroneously attributed it to the preliminary election. Mrs. Broad's intention was that the contribution of May 1986 be attributed to the general election.

The Broads regret any problems created by their oversight. Because the additional amount contributed has been refunded by the campaign and because of the inadvertence of the problems, we are hopeful that you will not take any further action in regard to this matter. 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



I am counsel for the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the "Committee") and Marvin S. Shapiro, Treasurer of the Committee. Enclosed are appropriate Statements of Designation of Counsel.

This letter is in response to your letter of December 23, 1986 concerning a complaint filed by Paul Gann and Robert Naylor which alleges that my clients violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. At the outset, it should be noted that the attempt by the complainants to link the Cranston for President Committee with the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee is incorrect. These committees are two separate entities with different Treasurers, officers, accountants and finance teams.

We will respond to each charge of the complainants in the same order as they have been listed in the complaint.

Section. I Failure to Report Debts and Obligations

The complainants contend that the Committee attempted to "willfully misrepresent" its financial status by not reporting "probable debts" on its reports. Yet, the total amount of asserted debts is only about four percent of the cash-on-hand figures as reported. No conceivable purpose would be served by

"hiding" such a small amount of debt. The following data illustrates the foregoing:

Why would the Committee purposely circumvent federal election law by saying it had \$1,050,555 of working capital instead of \$1,028,569 of working capital? What advantage is gained, especially in a primary election where Senator Cranston had no serious opposition?

In fact, many of the so-called "probable debts" listed in the complaint were not debts at all. In many cases, the Committee had not received the invoices prior to the end of the relevant reporting period, or the invoices represent advances paid to vendors. (Postage advances alone aggregate \$84,300 of the asserted debts.) Please see Attachment I which considers each asserted debt listed in the complaint. The Committee was under no obligation to report as debts in any given reporting period any amounts for which invoices were not received as of the end of that reporting period, or any amounts advanced to vendors in the following reporting period.

After reviewing each item appearing in the complaint, we have identified nine invoices totalling \$149,168 which were received prior to the end of a reporting period and not reported as debts in the report for that period. Since each of these invoices appears in the spending report immediately following, there was obviously no intent to conceal these obligations. The Committee acted on the belief that "debts" did not include trade payables which were paid on a timely basis. However, my reading of the Commission's Regulations § 104.11 suggests that this may have been a misinterpretation of what constitutes a reportable "debt." My clients regret any error. After receipt of a copy of the complaint, all further filings reflect the more expansive understanding of what debts must be disclosed on Schedule D.

Section II. Acceptance of Illegal Excessive Contributions

We believe that the Committee has established an excellent record of voluntarily refunding contributions that are excessive or are otherwise impermissible. In the course of its own on-going internal audit procedures prior to the complaint, the Committee identified and refunded 57 contributions totally approximately \$40,000.

Our research in response to the complaint uncovered a small number of contributions prior to 1985 that inadvertently were never entered into the data base when the campaign transferred all financial activity to an "on-line" computer system. With respect to a small number of contributors, contributions received prior to 1985 were not included in our campaign-to-date aggregates. After receipt of the complaint, the Committee confirmed the eight excessive contributions in the complaint, found three more excessive contributions not identified in the complaint, and refunded all eleven contributions. (See Attachment II.) The Committee regrets this error. In the context of a campaign that raised over \$11 million from approximately 140,000 contributors, we submit that the Committee's good faith has been demonstrated.

Section III. Illegal Corporate Contributions

The Committee was advised by ASCAP that ASCAP is not a corporation and that the contributions from ASCAP were not derived from corporate funds.

Section IV. Contribution from a Non-Federal PAC

It is our understanding that at the time the Committee received this check, the Friends of Supervisor Kennedy treasury contained sufficient non-corporate/non-labor funds to cover its \$200 contribution.

Section V. Failure to Report Full Identity of Contributors

The addresses of the contributors in question appeared on our amended report dated October 15, 1985. Please see Attachment III.

Section VI. <u>Failure to Report Pre-Election Contributions in a</u> <u>Timely Manner</u>

Please see Attachment IV, which demonstrates that the checks in question were general election contributions which were incorrectly reported as having been received on the date of the check. Instead, they were received and deposited along with other checks after the primary election.

The Committee was under the impression that transmission of the 48-hour notices by certified mail, which had been sufficient for the filing of Commission reports, was acceptable. Nevertheless, after receipt of the complaint, 48-hour notices with respect to the general election were filed by overnight delivery. It should be noted again that in view of the lack of a serious primary election contest, there was no motivation to defer briefly the disclosure of contributions made late in the primary election campaign.

Section VII. Other Inaccuracies

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(A) This was corrected on the amended report dated October 15, 1985. (Please see Attachment V.)

(B) It is not improper voluntarily to itemize contributions of \$200.

(C) When the credit card expense was broken down into individual vendors, none exceeded \$200, and therefore, it was unnecessary to make any further disclosure.

(D) This item was corrected on the amended report dated October 15, 1985. (Please see Attachment VI.)

Section VIII. Conclusion

In conclusion, we believe that the Committee's filings with the Commission and its conduct over the course of Senator Cranston's 1986 reelection campaign demonstrate substantial compliance with and a good faith effort to comply in all respects with both the letter and spirit of federal election law. We respectfully submit that no action should be taken by the Commission in this matter.

16	INTRODUCTION				
17	A. <u>Summary of Argument.</u>				
18	This proceeding involves a complaint filed with the Federal				
19	Election Commission ("Commission") regarding a \$200 contribution				
20	made by the Friends of Supervisor Kennedy (hereafter "Friends				
21	Committee"), incorrectly identified in the complaint as Friends				
22	Supporting Kennedy, to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee.				
23	This contribution was made in connection with United States				
24	Senator Alan Cranston's 1986 re-election campaign.				
25	The allegation concerning the Friends Committee				
26	contribution represents one paragraph of a nine page complaint				

in

against the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee. The complainants 1 allege that since the Friends Committee is not prohibited from 2 3 accepting contributions from corporations, labor organizations or banks, "it is reasonable to assume that [the Friends contribution to Cranston for Senate '86 Committee] was made from funds prohibited under 2 U.S.C. Section 441(b)(a) and 11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(a) and (b)."

The Commission should close its file on this matter with 8 9 regard to Supervisor Kennedy for three reasons. First, the Friends Committee was not at the time it made its \$200 10 contribution a political committee with the meaning of 2 U.S.C 11 Section 431(4) or 11 C.F.R. Section 100.5. Accordingly, the 12 13 Friends Committee could make contributions in accordance with the procedures set out in 11 C.F.R. Section 102.5(b)(1)(ii). This 14 15 subsection provides that an organization that is not a political committee may make contributions in connection with federal 16 elections so long as it demonstrates through a reasonable 17 18 accounting method that when the contributions were made to the 19 federal committee, the organization had received sufficient funds 20 from sources other than corporations, banks and labor 21 organizations from which to make the contributions. See Commission Advisory Opinions 1982-52, 1982-38 and 1980-130. 22

23 The uncontroverted evidence in this case demonstrates that 24 at the time the Friends Committee contribution was made to 25 Senator Cranston, there were available to the Friends Committee sufficient funds from non-corporate bank and labor organization 26

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sources to make the contribution in question. The Commission should close its file in this matter with regard to Supervisor Kennedy.

Second, even had the contribution constituted a technical 4 5 violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b, the violation would have been innocent and unknowing. Since the Friends Committee has never 6 7 been a political committee within the meaning of the Federal 8 Elections Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. §431 et seq.; "Act"), 9 Supervisor Kennedy has never had reason to believe that she was subject to the Act. Further, since nothing in the Act explicitly 10 11 prohibits contributions to candidates for Federal office by organizations that are not political committees even if those 12 13 organizations accept contributions from corporations, banks or 14 labor organizations, Supervisor Kennedy had no reason to believe 15 that the contribution was subject to any federal law. It is not 16 until one refers to the regulations promulgated and advisory 17 opinions issued by the Commission that it becomes apparent that 18 the contribution was regulated by any federal law.

19 Third, even had making the contribution constituted a 20 technical violation of the ordinance, the violation involved a de-21 minimus amount of money. The Cranston for Senate '86 Committee 22 raised more than \$12 million for Senator Cranston's re-election 23 canpaign. The two major candidates' combined campaign coffers in 24 this election exceeded \$24 million. See San Francisco Chronicle 25 newspaper article, December 5, 1986, page 12. Respondent 26 respectfully requests that the Commission take judicial notice of

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this article. The purposes of the Act would not be furthered by pursuing this complaint with regard to Supervisor Kennedy.

B. Summary of Facts.

On May 9, 1985, the Friends Committee contributed \$200 to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee. See Recipient Committee Campaign Statement ("Campaign Statement") filed November 8, 1985, a true and correct copy of which is attached to this response as Exhibit A and Declaration of Willie B. Kennedy, attached to this response as Exhibit B. The Campaign Statement, filed pursuant to California Government Code Sections 84200-84217, covers the period March 18, 1985 to June 30, 1985.

12 On April 5, 1985, the Friends Committee received a \$250 13 contribution from General True Value No. 3 store. General True 14 Value No. 3 store was not at the time it made the contribution a 15 corporation, bank or labor union. It became incorporated as GTS, 16 Inc. in 1986. See declaration of Tony Lo, the owner of General 17 True Value No. 3 store, attached to this response as Exhibit C.

In addition to the contribution by General True Value No. 3 18 store, on April 5, 1985, the Friends Committee received \$2500 in 19 contributions from other contributors. See Campaign Statement 20 attached hereto as Exhibit A. The total amount of expenditures 21 22 made by the Friends Committee for the reporting period in question, excluding the contribution to the Cranston for Senate 23 '86 Committee, was \$1,387.63, approximately \$1,100 less than the 24 25 amount of contributions (excluding the General True Value No. 3 store contribution) received by the Friends Committee on April 5, 26

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1985. See Schedule E of Campaign Statement. Even assuming that 2 all other expenditures made during this reporting period were 3 made before the Friends Committee made its contribution to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, the \$250 contribution from 4 5 General True Value No. 3 store was available to the Friends Committee at the time it made its \$200 contribution to the 6 Cranston for Senate '86 Committee. 7

The \$200 contribution to Cranston For Senate was the only 9 contribution made by the Friends of Supervisor Kennedy to a 10 federal election during the 1985 calendar year. See Declaration of Kennedy and Recipient Committee Campaign Statements for 1985, 11 12 attached to this response as Exhibit D. At the time the contribution was made, Supervisor Kennedy was unaware that it was subject to federal regulation. Declaration of Kennedy. 14

II.

THE COMMISSION SHOULD CLOSE ITS FILE ON THIS MATTER SINCE THE CONTRIBUTION IN QUESTION WAS NOT MADE BY A POLITICAL COMMITTEE AND WAS MADE FROM FUNDS OTHER THAN FUNDS CONTRIBUTED BY A CORPORATION, BANK OR LABOR UNION

Summary of Applicable Law. Α.

2 U.S.C. 441(b) provides in pertinent part that

it is unlawful for any national bank, . . . or for any corporation whatsoever or for any labor organization, to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with any election at which presidential and vice presidential electors or a senator or representative in, or delegate or resident commissioner to, Congress are to be voted for, or in connection with any primary election or political convention or

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caucus held to select candidates for any of the 1 foregoing offices, or for any candidate, political committee or other person knowingly to 2 accept or receive any contribution prohibited by this Section, or any officer or any director of any corporation or any national bank or any 3 officer of any labor organization to consent to 4 any contribution or expenditure by the corporation, national bank or labor organization 5 as the case may be, prohibited by this Section. Although the statute makes no mention of the issue, the 6 Commission has indicated that the prohibition against 7 contributions of corporate, bank or labor organization funds in 8 connection with federal elections applies to organizations that 9 accept contributions from corporations, banks, or labor 10 organizations, even though the committees are not themselves 11 such entities. For instance, in Commission Advisory Opinion 12 No. 1977-65, the Commission explained that: 13 Under 2 U.S.C. Section 441b, corporations and 14 labor organizations are prohibited from making a 'contribution or expenditure in connection with 15 any [Federal] election . . .'. For purpose of this prohibition the term 'contribution or 16 expenditure, is defined to include 'any direct or indirect' payment . . . or gift of money 17 . . to any [Federal] candidate, campaign committee or political party or organization . . 18 . . Although A.D.A.-A.M.C. is not an incorporated entity and has individual members 19 only, the account from which it seeks to contribute to A.D.A.-P.V.F. contains monies 20 given by entities prohibited by the Act from making contributions. Thus, such a transfer 21 from it may not be lawfully accepted by A.D.A-P.V.F. The contribution would represent an 22 indirect corporate or labor union contribution." 23 The prohibition against an organization contributing funds 24 in connection with federal elections if it has accepted 25 contributions from corporations, banks or labor organizations is 26

subject to an exception set out at 11 C.F.R. 102.5(b)(1)(ii). 1 2 This regulation provides that organizations that are not 3 political committees under the Act may make contributions or expenditures in connection with federal elections if they Δ 5 "[d]emonstrate through a reasonable accounting method that whenever such an organization makes 6 a contribution [or] expenditure . . . that organization has received sufficient funds 7 subject to the limitations or prohibitions of the Act to make such contribution, expenditure 8 or payment." 9 Hence, so long as a committee complies with this procedure and is not a political committee within the meaning of the Act, 10 11 contributions by a campaign committee do not violate 2 U.S.C Section 441b. "Political committee" is defined at 11 C.F.R. 12 13 Section 100.5. The general definition is set out in subsection (a) of that section and provides that: 14 15 "Except as provided in 11 C.F.R. Section 100.5(b), (c) and (d), any club, association or 16 other group of persons which receives contributions aggregating in excess of \$1,000 or 17 which makes expenditures aggregating in excess of \$1,000 during the calendar years is a 18 political committee. 19 The contributions and expenditures to which this 20 section refers are contributions and expenditures made in 21 connection with federal elections. See 11 C.F.R. Sections 100.7 22 and C.F.R. 100.8. 23 24 Β. The Friends of Supervisor Kennedy is Not A Political Committee Within the Meaning 25 Of the Federal Elections Act. 26 The Friends Committee expended a total of \$200 in

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connection with federal elections in 1985. See Declaration of Willie B. Kennedy attached to this response as Exhibit B and 2 Recipient Committee Campaign Statements for 1985 attached to this 3 4 response as Exhibit D. This expenditure was the \$200 5 contribution the Friends Committee made to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee. Id. The Friends Committee received no 6 7 other contributions in connection with federal elections in 1985. Hence, the Friends Committee was not a political committee 8 9 within the meaning of 11 C.F.R. Section 100.5(a). See also 2 U.S.C. Section 100.5. Further, the Friends Committee does not 10 fall within the definition of political committee as set out in 11 any of the other subsections of 11 C.F.R. Section. 100.5. $\frac{1}{2}$ 12 13 The Friends of Supervisor Kennedy is not a political committee within the meaning of the Act. 14

> C. It Can Be Demonstrated Through Reasonable Accounting Methods That the Contribution In Question Was Made Subject to the Restrictions and Prohibitions of the Federal Elections Act.

18 The contribution to the Cranston For Senate '86 Committee 19 was made on May 9, 1985. On April 5, 1985, the Friends Committee

22 1/ Subsection (b) of this section relates to separate segregated funds established under 2 U.S.C. 441(b)(2)(C). This section is inapplicable to Supervisor Kennedy. Subsection (c) of this section relates to local committees of political parties and it is again inapplicable to Supervisor Kennedy. Subsection (d) relates to an individual's principal campaign committee or authorized committee when that individual becomes a candidate for office. Again, candidate refers to candidate for federal office. See 11 C.F.R. 100.3.

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received four contributions. One of these contributions, in the 1 2 amount of \$250, was made by General True Value No. 3 store, an 3 Oakland, California company. As Mr. Tony Lo, the owner of 4 General True Value No. 3 store testifies, General True Value No. 3 store was not a corporation, bank or labor organization when it 5 6 contributed \$250 to the Friends Committee. See Declaration of 7 Lo. Hence, at the time it made the contribution, General True 8 Value No. 3 store could contribute to federal elections and money 9 contributed by General True Value No. 3 store to the Friends 10 Committee in turn could be contributed to federal candidates for office by the Friends Committee. 11

The total amount of expenditures made by the Friends 12 13 Committee during the reporting period in question, excluding the 14 contribution to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, was \$1,387.63. Excluding the contribution to the Friends Conmittee 15 by General True Value No. 3 store, the Friends Committee received 16 17 in contributions on April 5, 1985, \$2,500, more than enough to 18 pay for the expenditures, other than the contribution made to the 19 Cranston for Senate '86 Committee, made by the Friends Committee during this period. In other words, the \$250 contribution made 20 21 to the Friends Committee by General True Value No. 3 store on 22 April 5, 1985 was available to the Friends Committee to contribute to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee on May 9, 23 1985. The Friends Committee had received sufficient funds 24 25 subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act to make 26 the contribution.

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Further, at the beginning of the reporting period in 1 2 question, the Friends Committee had \$1,205 on hand. See Exhibit 3 A. A review of the campaign statement filed for the reporting period immediately preceding the one in question reveals that a 4 5 substantial number of these contributions were made by sources other than banks, corporations or labor organizations. 6 See 7 Campaign Statement filed on March 25, 1985 attached to this response as part of Exhibit D. This further demonstrates that 8 the Friends Committee had available to it sufficient funds 9 subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act to make the contribution.

The Friends Committee contribution to the Cranston for 12 Senate '86 Committee fell within the provisions of 11 C.F.R. 13 102.5(b)(1)(ii) and hence was not made in violation of 2 U.S.C. 14 15 Section 441(b) or any other provision of federal election law. 16 The Commission should close its file in this matter with respect to Supervisor Kennedy. 17

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THE CONTRIBUTION IN QUESTION WAS MADE WITHOUT 19 KNOWLEDGE THAT IT WAS SUBJECT TO FEDERAL REGULATION 20 Even had the Friends Committee contribution constituted a technical violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b, holding Supervisor 21 22 Kennedy civilly liable in this matter would impose strict liability on an local public official who made a de minimus 23 24 contribution without knowledge that such contributions are subject to federal regulation. Imposition of a penalty based on 25 strict liability is not explicitly authorized by 2 U.S.C. Section 26

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441b. The law does not expressly regulate committees that are not political committees for the purposes of the Act. Further, 2 U.S.C. Section 441b does not on its face prohibit committees of any type from making contributions in connection with federal elections, even if the committee has received contributions from corporations, banks or labor organizations. One must refer to the regulations promulgated by the Commission and Commission advisory opinions to become aware of this prohibition.

9 Further, it must be emphasized that the respondent in this matter is not a member of Congress, a United States Senator, a 10 governor or statewide officeholder. Rather, Supervisor Kennedy 11 is a member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, the City's 12 local legislative body. Supervisor Kennedy has never sought 13 federal office. Supervisor Kennedy and her Friends Committee 14 15 treasurer have dutifully and fully complied with all laws of 16 which they were aware related to elections and campaigns. 17 Declaration of Kennedy.

Supervisor Kennedy was not made aware of Section 441b until 18 19 the instant complaint was filed and the City Attorney conducted 20 extensive research on the question. In the future, Supervisor 21 Kennedy will not make contributions to candidates for federal 22 office until she has conferred with her attorneys. Where there 23 is some question regarding the legality of the contribution, she will seek the advice of the Commission. Declaration of Kennedy. 24 25 That she did not know of this federal law is hardly 26 surprising. The Act is a comprehensive statutory scheme,

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comprising over 100 pages in the United States Code Service. Although Section 441b has been interpreted by the Commission as applying to contributions made by organizations that accept contributions from corporations, banks or labor organizations, (11 C.F.R. Section 110.5), it does not appear on its face to apply to such organizations. It is uncontroverted that Supervisor Kennedy was unaware of the law.

8 Supervisor Kennedy's innocence in this matter is further 9 demonstrated by her disclosure of the contribution to the 10 Cranston for Senate '86 Committee on her Campaign Statement for 11 the pertinent reporting period. See Exhibit A. The full and 12 timely disclosure of this contribution belies any suggestion that 13 Supervisor Kennedy intended to contribute unlawfully to Senator 14 Cranston's campaign.

Supervisor Kennedy's lack of knowledge of the intricacies 15 of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b must be considered in relation to the 16 17 principle that laws regulating political contributions must be interpreted narrowly. Buckley v. Valeo, 424 U.S. 1 (1976), First 18 19 National Bank v. Bellotti, 435 U.S. 765 (1978) and Citizens 20 Against Rent Control/Coalition for Fair Housing v. Berkeley, 454 U.S. 290 (1981) teach that the making and receipt of political 21 contributions are protected First Amendment activities. 22 23 Accordingly, regulations or limitations upon those activities must serve a compelling governmental purpose and must be no 24 25 broader than necessary to serve that governmental purpose. Id. Preventing corporations, banks and labor organizations from 26

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1 corrupting public officials is clearly a compelling governmental 2 purpose. Further, holding public officials accountable for 3 violating this prohibition is closely related to this compelling 4 governmental purpose. However, holding persons strictly liable 5 in circumstances where they do not know that their local 6 organizations are subject to federal regulation is arbitrary and 7 is not closely tailored to further a compelling interest.

8 Hence, the Commission, like a court, must narrowly construe 9 statutes that impinge upon important First Amendment rights by 10 reading into the statute some reasonable cause or mens rea 11 element. Strict liability simply cannot be squared with the 12 right to freedom of expression guaranteed by the Constitution.

Additionally, the law should not capriciously be applied in this case where the violation in question is <u>de minimus</u>. In this case, the \$200 contribution involved was an insignificant amount in light of the campaign coffers of the two major candidates. The combined spending by these candidates exceeded \$24 million.

In short, Supervisor Kennedy has acted with the utmost good faith in this matter. Even had the contribution constituted a technical noncompliance with the Act, such a violation would have been made in ignorance of the law. The Commission should close its file in this matter with respect to Supervisor Kennedy.

IV.

CONCLUSION

25 Respondent Willie B. Kennedy has demonstrated that the
26 contribution by the Friends Committee to the Cranston for Senate

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1 '86 Committee was made by funds derived by sources other than corporations, banks or labor organizations. Since the Friends of 2 3 Supervisor Kennedy is not a political committee within the meaning of the Federal Elections Act, this contribution to 4 Cranston for Senate did not violate any provision of the Act. 5 Further, even had the contribution in question constituted a 6 7 technical violation of the Act, it was de minimus, innocent and unknowing. The Commission should close its file on this matter 8 9 with respect to Respondent Willie B. Kennedy.

In the future, I will not contribute to candidates for federal office until I have carefully reviewed the facts surrounding the contribution and consulted my attorney. Where there is any question concerning the legality of a contribution, I will 11 consult the Federal Election Commission for advice.

The contribution I made to the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee was the only contribution I made in connection with a federal election in calendar year 1985.

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

BACKGROUND

The Office of the General Counsel received a complaint on December 15, 1986, alleging numerous violations of the Acb by the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, ("the Committee") and 12 other persons. All persons received copies of the complaint, but many did not receive these until after the Christmas holidays. Subsequently, three respondents requested and received extensions of time to respond to the complaint. The last of these responses was timely filed on February 2, 1987.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

I. FAILURE TO REPORT OUTSTANDING DEBTS AND OBLIGATIONS

The complaint alleges that the Committee failed to report its outstanding debts. In support of this allegation the complaint notes the Committee's reports in which expenditures paid during the first week of a reporting period were not reported as debts on the preceding report. The complainants assume the Committee must have had bills for these expenditures at the close of the prior reporting period, yet did not report any debts as owed to these vendors. The Committee is alleged to have failed to report the following disbursements as debts:

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Responding to this allegation, the Committee notes the amount of alleged non-reported debt constitutes only four percent of the Committee's cash-on-hand and questions why the Committee would deliberately misrepresent such a small amount of money. The Committee further asserts that it had not received invoices for many of these debts and thus was not under any obligation to report these. The Committee then addresses each of the alleged non-reported debts, asserting that the invoices for many of these debts were received from vendors after the close of the prior reporting period and thus the Committee was not required to report these as debts. Moreover, the Committee states that \$84,300 of the total alleged unreported debts was, in fact, not debts but postal advances. Finally, the Committee admits failing to report nine debts totalling \$149,168, indicated on Attachment II to the Committee's response as "Current trade-payable paid on a timely basis." The Committee received invoices for these debts in a reporting period prior to the reporting period in which they were paid. The Committee's Response at 2 states it believed reportable debts not to include "trade payables which were paid on a timely basis," and regrets any error.

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The Act requires committees to report the amount and nature of outstanding debts and obligations owed by a political committee. 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8). Such debts must be continuously reported until extinguished. 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(a). A debt, obligation or other promise to make an expenditure, the

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amount of which is \$500 or less, shall be reported as of the time payment is made or no later than 60 days after such obligation is incurred, whichever comes first. Any loan, debt or obligation, the amount of which is over \$500, shall be reported as of the time of the transaction. 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b).

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In the instant case, the Committee admits that nine of its expenditures should have been reported as debts and were not. Additionally, its response indicates that the Committee reported its debts only after it was billed, and thus, not at the time the transaction occurred. The Regulations require that an obligation of over \$500 must be reported at the time the Committee assumes such obligation. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the Committee and its treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b).

II. APPARENT EXCESSIVE CONTRIBUTIONS

A. The Reports

Based on the Cranston Committee's reports, the complaint alleges the Committee accepted the following excessive contributions. $\frac{1}{2}$

B. The Law

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Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 44la(a)(l)(A), no person may make contributions to any authorized committee of a candidate that exceed \$1,000 per election. The Act defines "election" as a general, special, primary, or run-off election. 2 U.S.C. § 431(1)(A). Political committees are prohibited from accepting contributions exceeding the Act's contribution limitations. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Committees must provide the identification of persons (name, address, occupation and employer) contributing, in aggregate, more then \$200 per calendar year. 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(A). A contribution may be designated in writing for the primary or general election. If a primary contribution is made after the date of the primary election, such a designation must be in writing and the donee committee must have a primary debt. Former 11 C.F.R. § 110.1(a)(2)(i) and present 11 C.F.R. § 110.1(b)(3).²/

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C. The Cranston Committee's Response

The Cranston Committee does not dispute that the eight individual respondents specifically noted in the complaint made excessive contributions. The Committee explains these occurred because a small number of contributions received prior to 1985 were not entered into the data base when the Committee implemented a new computer system. The Committee cites its past performance of voluntarily returning excessive or impermissible contributions, stating that in the course of its internal audit procedures it has identified and refunded 57 contributions totaling approximately \$40,000. Committee Response at 3.

 $[\]frac{2}{}$ New regulations governing contribution limitations and prohibitions, and contributions by persons and multicandidate committees went into effect on April 8, 1987.

Moreover, the Committee has made refunds to the eight individuals specifically named in the complaint and has voluntarily identified and refunded three other excessive contributions as well.

D. Individual Responses

1. Respondents Demonstrating that No Excessive Contributions Were Made

Responses from individual contributors indicate two persons who apparently did not make excessive contributions. First, it appears that one of the contributions attributed to Norton Shapiro was made by his spouse, Barbara Shapiro, using a check drawn on Norton Shapiro's account. The Commission has stated that a checkless spouse may make a contribution using the checking account of a spouse provided the checkless spouse signs either the check or an accompanying writing. <u>See</u> A.O. 1980-11. The May 1985 contribution check said to be made by Norton Shapiro contains the handwritten notation of "Barbara Shapiro (MRS NORTON)" on the memo entry line. Therefore, because this contribution appears to be designated in writing as that of Barbara Shapiro, this Office recommends that there is no reason to believe Norton Shapiro violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A).

The complaint also raised the possibility that Marvin Zimmerman and Martin Zimmerman may be the same person, and if so, alleges Marvin Zimmerman made an excessive contribution. Responses reveal that these are two individuals, not one, and that the cited contributions were made by a father and son. Accordingly, because neither of these individuals appears to have

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made a contribution exceeding 1,000 per election, this Office recommends that there is no reason to believe Marvin Zimmerman violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A).

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2. Uncontested Excessive Contributions

Respondents Elaine Attias, William Brinton, Irwin Field, and J.K. Eichenbaum, do not dispute the allegations in the complaint. Ms. Attias states she is unable to recall making the \$500 contribution in 1981, but has been informed by the Committee that a \$500 excessive contribution occurred and will be refunded. Mr. Brinton was also advised that his \$300 excessive contribution will be refunded. Similarly, Mr. Field and Mr. J.K. Eichenbaum did not recall earlier contributions when they made subsequent contributions of \$1,000 per election. The Committee states the excessive portions of these contributions have been refunded. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the above-noted respondents violated 2 U.S.C. \$ 441a(a)(1)(A).

3. Designation and Identification Inconsistencies

Four of the other responses reveal designation problems and inconsistencies surrounding the reporting of alleged excessive contributions. William Hambrecht's response states the Committee's reports indicating he contributed a total of \$4,000 are in error. Instead, Mr. Hambrecht asserts his alleged \$2,000 in contributions during 1981 were from him and his spouse and were intended for the 1980 committee. The Hambrechts' could not lawfully make such a contribution, however, because the 1980 Committee did not have any debts at the times of these 1981 contributions. In fact, the Cranston Committee reported these as contributions for the 1986 election. The Hambrechts' state they each made additional \$2,000 contributions to the Committee in March, 1985, and that these contributions were intended for the 1986 Committee. The Cranston Committee has refunded \$2,000 to Mr. Hambrecht. However, because Mr. Hambrecht made contributions to the 1980 committee after the date of the 1980 election, at a time when the Committee had no outstanding debts, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe William Hambrecht violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A).

Eli Broad admits making three \$1,000 contributions to the Committee. One contribution for \$1,000 was made in December, 1981. A \$2,000 contribution was made in December 1984. Copies of these checks indicated all were made prior to the June 1986 primary, and did not contain a designation for an election. Therefore, consistent with the timing provisions of 11 C.F.R. § 110.1, Mr. Broad made \$3,000 in primary contributions. $3^{/}$ The Cranston Committee has refunded \$1,000 to Mr. Broad. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe Mr. Broad violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A).

3/ The Cranston Committee reported the \$2,000 contribution as \$1,000 for the primary and \$1,000 for the general. Because of the unclear language of former 11 C.F.R. § 102.9(e) (that appeared to allow recipient committees to designate contributions to ensure compliance with Section 441a(a)), this Office does not recommend that this reporting inconsistency be pursued. This is consistent with the Commission's actions in MUR's 1648, 1696, 1639, and 2110.

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Edythe Broad admits making a \$1,000 contribution in 1981 and a \$1,000 contribution in May 1986. Her response states that Mrs. Broad had forgotten her earlier contribution and her intention was that the second contribution be attributed to the general election. Mrs. Broad's checks provided with her response do not contain a designation and thus, because these contributions were made before the primary, must be attributed to that election. 4/ Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe Edythe Broad violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A). The Cranston Committee has refunded \$1,000 to Mrs. Broad.

Finally, Peter Haas states he cannot recall making a \$250 contribution in 1981. Additionally, Mr. Haas enclosed copies of his 1985 and 1986 contribution checks. Because these contributions were made prior to the primary and are not designated in writing for a particular election, they must be considered primary contributions. Therefore, Mr. Haas contributed \$2,250 to the primary election. The Cranston Committee has refunded \$250 to Mr. Haas.

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E. Recommendations Regarding Excessives

As previously noted, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe Norton Shapiro and

4/ Despite a lack of designation, the Cranston Committee attributed one half of each of these two contributions to the primary and general elections. This Office does not recommend that these inconsistencies be pursued given the language of former 11 C.F.R. § 102.9(e). Marvin Zimmerman violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A). This Office also recommends that the Commission find reason to believe Elaine Attais, William Brinton, Irwin Field, J.K. Eichenbaum, Peter Haas, William Hambrecht, Eli Broad and Edythe Broad violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A) by making these contributions, and the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting these contributions. This Office further recommends, however, that the Commission take no further action and close the file as to the individual respondents because the amounts of the violations are relatively small, and the Cranston Committee has attempted to refund the excessive contributions after it received the complaint. $\frac{5}{2}$

III. ALLEGED CORPORATE CONTRIBUTIONS

The complaint also alleges the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) by accepting prohibited corporate contributions from the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers ("ASCAP"). The complaint alleges ASCAP is an incorporated entity under New York law.

Responding to the complaint, ASCAP denies that it is an incorporated entity. ASCAP asserts that it has filed an associated Certificate of Designation with the Bureau of Corporation of the New York Department of State, as required by New York law. ASCAP thus argues that because it is not a

5/ Based upon our analysis, Mr. Broad made \$3,000 in primary contributions but the Committee has refunded only \$1,000 to date.

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corporation it is "not subject to the FECA's corporate contribution ban." ASCAP Response at 3. Additionally, the Cranton Committee's response states that it was informed that ASCAP is not a corporation.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), no corporation may make, and no political committee may knowingly accept, a corporate contribution in connection with a federal election. The Cranston Committee has stated that it was advised ASCAP was not a corporation and that contributions from ASCAP were not derived from corporate funds. Accordingly, because the Cranston Committee inquired about the status of ASCAP, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) by knowingly accepting a corporate contribution. A further factual question remains, however, regarding whether ASCAP's response does not address.

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> IV. RECEIPT OF A CONTRIBUTION FROM A CALIFORNIA STATE COMMITTEE The complaint further alleges that the Cranston Committee accepted a contribution from Friends of Supervisor Kennedy, a

6/ The complaint, at VIII(A), also alleges that the Cranston Committee incorrectly reported ASCAP's contributions on the detailed summary page.

California state committee.7/ Because political committees in that state are permitted to accept contributions that would be prohibited or excessive under the Act, the Cranston Committee and Friends of Supervisor Kennedy are alleged to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), no corporation or labor union may make a contribution in connection with a federal election and no political committee may knowingly accept such a contribution. The Commission's Regulations provide that organizations that are not political committees under the Act may make contributions to a federal election provided they establish a separate depository account for their federal election activity and only place into it funds subject to the Act's prohibitions and limitations. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b)(1)(i). Alternatively, such an organization may contribute to federal elections provided it demonstrates through a reasonable accounting method that whenever it makes a contribution or expenditure it has received sufficient funds subject to the Act's prohibitions and limitations. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b)(1)(i).

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In the instant case Friends of Supervisor Kennedy, a state organization without a separate federal account, made a \$200 contribution to the Cranston Committee in May, 1985. The Cranston Committee asserts it was its "understanding" that Friends of Supervisor Kennedy had sufficient permissible funds to

7/ The Complaint incorrectly refers to this organization as "Friends Supporting Kennedy."

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make this contribution. Cranston Response at 3. Friends of Supervisor Kennedy also states that at the time the contribution was made it had sufficient permissible funds.8/ Specifically, respondents cite a \$250 contribution received from General True Value No. 3 Store in April, 1985. At that time this store was an unincorporated sole proprietorship. See Friends Response at 4. Additionally, the respondents state they received contributions exceeding the expenditures made during that reporting period, and thus the \$250 in funds from General True Value No. 3 Store was "available" to be contributed to the Cranston Committee. Id. at 9. Additionally, Friends of Supervisor Kennedy submitted documentation for the reporting period prior to when the Cranston contribution was made. This report indicates that Friends had \$1,205 cash on hand, some of which appears to be from permissible sources. Id. at 10. Respondents also note this is the only contribution made to a federal candidate during 1985 and any further contributions will be with the assistance of legal counsel. Id. at 11.

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It is the opinion of this Office that Friends of Supervisor Kennedy has demonstrated that it had sufficient permissible funds on hand at the time the contribution was made to satisfy the requirements of 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b)(1)(ii). Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe

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^{8/} Respondents submitted a 14 page response with more than 50 pages of attachments. In light of their assertion that sufficient permissible funds were on hand, this Office analyzes only this aspect of the response.

either Friends of Supervisor Kennedy or the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

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V. FAILURE TO FULLY IDENTIFY CONTRIBUTORS

The complaint alleges the Cranston Committee failed to provide the identification of three individuals and one group. Attachment V to the complaint includes pages of the Cranston Committee's 1985 Mid-Year Report. These pages do not list addresses for Joyce Friedman, Frank Weil, Martin Zimmerman, 2/ and Friends of Supervisor Kennedy.

The Act requires reports to include the identification of each person (other than a political committee) who makes a contribution to a reporting committee during a reporting period whose contribution or contributions have an aggregate amount or value in excess of \$200 within the calendar year, with the date and amount of any such contribution. 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(A). The term "identification" of an individual means the name, mailing address, occupation, and employer. 2 U.S.C. 431(13)(A). "Identification" for any other person means the full name and address of such person. 2 U.S.C. § 431(13)(B). Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 432(i), when a treasurer of a political committee shows best efforts have been used to obtain, maintain, and submit information required by the Act, any report or records shall be considered in compliance with the Act. Moreover, the Regulations

9/ A discussion of the contributions of Mr. Martin Zimmerman and his father, Mr. Marvin Zimmerman, is included at Section II.

provide that with regard to reporting the identification of individuals whose contributions aggregate in excess of \$200, the treasurer will not be deemed to have exercised best efforts unless one effort per solicitation is made to obtain such information. 11 C.F.R. § 104.7(b).

The Cranston Committee does not deny that incomplete addresses were provided for the persons listed in the complaint. It notes, however, that in October 1985, before the filing of the complaint in this matter, the 1985 Mid-Year Report was amended to provide complete addresses for the four noted persons. The Committee has also provided a copy of this portion of its amendment as part of its response. Therefore, because the Committee's amendment of its 1985-Mid Year Report prior to the filing of the complaint in this matter is an indication of its best efforts to obtain required information, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(A).

VI. REPORTING OF PRE-ELECTION CONTRIBUTIONS

The complaint alleges that the Cranston Committee failed to meet the Act's reporting requirements for its 48 hour contribution notices by allegedly failing to report two contributions of \$1,000 or more, and by failing to mail these notices so that they would arrive within 48 hours after the contribution was made.

The Act requires a principal campaign committee to report to the Secretary of the Senate all contributions of \$1,000 received

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after the 20th day before an election, but more than 48 hours before any election. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6)(A). This notification shall be made within 48 hours after the receipt of such contributions and shall include the name of the candidate and the office sought by the candidate, the identification of the contributor, and the date of receipt and amount of the contribution. <u>Id</u>. The Commission's Regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(e) state that a designation, report or statement (with the exception of pre-election reports) sent by registered or certified mail shall be considered filed on the date of the United States postmark.

1. Failure to Include Contributions

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The Cranston Committee denies it failed to include contributions from Burson-Marsteller PAC and Letter Carriers COPE on its 48 hour notices. Instead, it asserts these contributions, dated on the Committee's reports as May 19 and 21 respectively, were not received by the Cranston Committee until after the date of the June 3, 1986 primary. The Committee asserts that by error it used the dates on the checks as the contribution dates on its reports. In support of this statement the Committee has provided copies of these checks, as well as a copy of the June 19, 1986 bank deposit slip listing these checks deposited on that date. Therefore, because the Cranston Committee has demonstrated that it did not receive these contributions prior to the primary, there does not appear to be a violation with respect to the contents of the Committee's 48 hour contribution notices.

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Because, however, the Committee reported the incorrect dates of these contributions, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(B) but take no further action.

2. Timing of the 48 Hour Contribution Notices

It appears that the Cranston Committee sent its 48 hour notices by certified mail the day after it received other contributions requiring immediate reporting. These notices were not received by the Secretary of the Senate until 5 or 6 days after mailing. The issue thus arises whether the 48 hour notices are a "designation, report, or statement," such that the postmarked date is the filing date. See 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(e). The Regulations do not explicitly address this issue. The requirements for filing a 48 hour notice are contained at 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(f), and thus appear to be distinct from the postmarked filing date section at 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(e). Additionally, a "48 hour notice" is not within the types of documents listed in 104.5(e). Moreover, using the postmark date as a filing date frustrates the intent of the 48 hour notices because prompt public disclosure is not made prior to an election.

The Cranston Committee states it was under the impression that 48 hour notices could be filed using certified mail. Response at 4. It notes it lacked a serious primary election challenge, and thus "there was no motivation to deter briefly the disclosure of contributions made late in the primary election campaign." Id. The Committee notes its general election 48 hour

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notices were filed by overnight delivery as a result of the complaint.

It is the opinion of this Office that the Regulations should be interpreted to require a 48 hour notice to be received 48 hours from the date the contribution is made. Because the Regulations appear ambiguous on this point, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6)(A), but take no further action as to this violation.

VII. OTHER ALLEGED REPORTING PROBLEMS

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Reporting Contributions of \$200

The Complaint alleges the Cranston Committee improperly reported contributions of \$200 along with contributions of more than \$200. The Cranston Committee asserts that it is not 2 0 improper to voluntarily itemize such \$200 contributions. The Act requires committees to report contributions greater than \$200, "or in any lesser amount if the reporting committee should so elect." 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(A). Therefore, because no violations of the Act are presented by voluntarily disclosing contributions of \$200, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe the Cranston Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(A).

> Credit Cards B.

The Cranston Committee allegedly failed to itemize vendors to whom the following disbursements were made using credit cards.

The Act requires an authorized committee of a candidate to report the name and address of each person to whom an expenditure in aggregate amount or value in excess of \$200 is made, as well as the purpose of the expenditure. 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(5)(A). The Commission's Regulations define "purpose" as a brief statement or description of why the disbursement was made. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(i)(A).

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In the instant case the Cranston Committee states that when its disbursements for credit card expenses were broken down into individual vendors, none of these expenditures 'exceeded \$200, and therefore further disclosure was not required. This Office agrees that in an instance where a payee would not be identified because an expenditures was less than \$200, the use of a credit card to pay this expenditure does not require additional disclosure. However, the issue remains whether the Committee made disbursements to these individual vendors that, in aggregate, exceeded \$200. The Committee's response does not provide this information. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the Cranston Committee and its treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(5)(A) and ask questions regarding the aggregate disbursements made to the vendors.

C. Bank Charges and Insufficient Funds

Finally, the complaint notes the Cranston Committee reported bank charges and the return of insufficient funds deposited on line 21 (other disbursements) instead of on line 17 (operating expenditures) and line lle (total contributions). This reporting appeared on the Cranston Committee's 1985 Mid-Year Report.

According to the Commission's published instructions for reporting checks returned due to insufficient funds, when a contributor's check is returned due to insufficient funds and where such check was previously reported, the committee must report the return under the appropriate categories of receipts and net out the amount of the check from the total of that category. If the original receipt of the check was reported on Schedule A, the return of the check must be reported as a negative entry on Schedule A. If the actual check was never reported, the return of the check should not be reported. Moreover, an authorized committee is required to report each person who receives a contribution refund or other offset to operating expeditures in aggregate amount or in excess of \$200, together with the date and amount of such refund or offset. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(v). The total amount of offsets are also required to be reported. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(1)(iv).

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The Cranston Committee admits it improperly reported these bank charges, but notes it amended the 1985 Mid-Year Report on October 15, 1985, prior to the filing of the complaint in this matter. The amendment lists the bank charges on line $17.\frac{10}{}$ Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the Cranston Committee violated 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(1)(iv), but take no further action.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Find no reason to believe Norton Shapiro violated 2 U.S.C.
 \$ 441a(a)(1)(A) and close the file as to this respondent.
- Find no reason to believe Marvin Zimmerman violated 2 U.S.C.
 \$ 441a(a)(1)(A) and close the file as to this respondent.
- 3. Find no reason to believe Friends of Supervisor Kennedy violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and close the file as to this respondent.
- 4. Find no reason to believe the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 434(b)(3)(A).
- 5. Find reason to believe Elaine Attias, William Brinton, Irwin Field, J.K. Eichenbaum, Peter Haas, William Hambrecht, Eli Broad, and Edythe Broad violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A), but take no further action and close the file as to these respondents.
- 6. Find reason to believe the Cranston For Senate '86 Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b)(3)(B), and 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(1)(iv) but take no further action.

10/ The Committee's amendment also increased its cash on hand figure on line lle. It cannot be determined whether this adjustment also included an adjustment based on returned checks. Because at that time the Committee was reporting on a bi-yearly basis, it appears the returned checks would not have been reported in a prior reporting period, and thus the Committee's cash on hand figure would not require adjustment for returned checks.

- 7. Find reason to believe the Cranston for Senate Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), as well as 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(f) and 434(b)(5)(A).
- 8. Take no action at this time regarding the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers.
- 9. Approve the attached letters and questions.

The Federal Election Commission notified your clients on December 23, 1986, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your clients at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint, and information supplied by your clients, on June 2, 1987, the Commission made a number of determinations regarding your clients.

First, the Commission determined that there is no reason to believe your clients violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 434(b)(3)(A). These findings relate respectively to alleged acceptance of a contribution from Friends of Supervisor Kennedy containing prohibited funds, alleged knowing acceptance of a alleged reporting violations stemming from reporting contributions of \$200, and alleged failure to include identifications of contributors.

Additionally, the Commission determined that there is reason to believe your clients violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b)(3)(B) and 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(1)(iv). These determinations relate respectively to the Committee's failure to correctly list the dates of contributions from Burson-Marsteller PAC and Letter Carriers COPE; the Committee's failure to provide the Secretary of the Senate with 48 hour notices within 48 hours of receipt of contributions; and incorrect reporting of certain bank charges. The Commission also voted to take no further action regarding these three violations. Letter to Ronald C. Peterson Page 2

Also on this date the Commission found reason to believe your clients violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), as well as 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Specifically, it appears your clients failed to report outstanding debts owed to the Committee at the time such debts were incurred. Moreover, it appears the Committee accepted excessive contributions from Elaine Attias, William Brinton, Irwin Field, J.K. Eichenbaum, Peter Haas, Richard Hambrecht, Eli Broad, and Edythe Broad.

Your clients' response to the Commission's initial notification of this complaint did not provide complete information regarding the matters in question. Please submit answers to the enclosed questions and request for production of documents within fifteen days of receipt of this letter. Statements should be submitted under oath.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of General Counsel may recommend that preprobable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, requests for pre-probable cause conciliation will not be entertained after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of General Counsel is not authorized to give extensions beyond 20 days.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A) unless you notify the Commission in writing that your clients wish the matter to be made public.

Except for items 6 and 20, although it may well be the case, we have no indication in our files that a contract or agreement was made prior to the invoice date. Our records do not reflect the dates on which the various invoices were received. We do know that they must have been received on or before the date of the check requisitions.

It should be noted that item 14 - invoice dated 10/17/85 - was not addressed to the campaign committee, but was later forwarded to us.

Enclosed please find a full response by Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the "Committee") and Marvin S. Shapiro, Treasurer of the Committee, to the Interrogatories and Request for Production of Documents transmitted with Scott E. Thomas' June 12, 1987 letter.

In addition, I would like to emphasize that the Committee had no intent to conceal any obligations. The Committee acted on its belief that "debts" within the meaning of Commission Regulations § 104.11 did not include trade payables paid on a timely basis. If that reading is incorrect, my clients regret any error. Certainly there was no intent to "wilfully misrepresent" the Committee's financial status, as alleged in the complaint filed by Paul Gann and Robert Naylor for obviously political purposes as indicated by the timing of the complaint (two weeks before the election) and the press release that accompanied the filing in violation of the spirit, if not the letter, of Commission Regulations § 111.21.

In addition, regarding excessive contributions, the Committee believes its overall record in promptly identifying and voluntarily refunding excessive contributions was excellent and regrets any delay in refunding the eight excessive contributions referenced in Mr. Thomas' June 12, 1987 letter. In the context of a campaign that raised over \$11 million from approximately 140,000 contributors, a "no further action" determination would seem to be appropriate on this alleged violation. I. BACKGROUND

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On June 2, 1987, the Commission found reason to believe the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee and Martin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), as well as 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Underlying the Commission's determinations were the Committee's failure to report outstanding debts at the time such debts were incurred, and the Committee's receipt of possible excessive contributions from eight individuals. Also on that date the Commission found no reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 434(b)(3)(A). The Commission further determined that there was reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C.

§§ 434(b)(3)(B) and 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R.

§ 104.3(b)(i)(iv), but took no further action regarding these latter violations. The Commission also approved interrogatories relating to the Committee's unreported debts. By letter dated June 12, 1987, the Committee was notified of the Commission's determinations.

II. INVESTIGATION TO DATE

On June 25, 1987, this Office received an initial response from Respondents' counsel acknowledging the Commission's determinations and requesting that this response be considered as a request for pre-probable cause conciliation. Counsel notes that he is "not sure such conciliation should commence prior to our submission of responses to the interrogatories." On July 6, 1987, this Office conferred with Respondents' counsel and stated that we could not recommend pre-probable cause conciliation until responses to the interrogatories are received. Counsel stated that these would be submitted in a timely fashion. The responses to the interrogatories arrived in this Office later that day. Accordingly, after evaluating these answers, this Office will report to the Commission with an appropriate recommendation regarding pre-probable cause conciliation.

I. BACKGROUND

On June 2, 1987, the Commission found reason to believe the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), as well as 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Underlying the Commission's determinations were the Committee's failure to report outstanding debts at the time such debts were incurred, and the Committee's receipt of possible excessive contributions from eight individuals. Also on that date the Commission found no reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. \$\$ 441b(a) and 434(b)(3)(A). The Commission further determined that there was reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. **\$\$** 434(b)(3)(B) and 434(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. **\$** 104.3(b)(1)(iv), but took no further action regarding these latter violations. The Commission also approved interrogatories relating to the Committee's unreported debts. On July 6, 1987, the Committee submitted its response to interrogatories and restated a prior request for pre-probable cause conciliation. As discussed below,

this Office recommends that the Commission grant this request.

II. INVESTIGATION CONDUCTED TO DATE

A. Debts

In its response to the complaint, the Committee incorrectly stated that because it had not received invoices for many of its alleged non-reported debts, it was not required to report these as debts on Schedules D. The Committee also admitted that it had failed to report as debts other obligations for which it had received invoices during a reporting period but had not paid within that reporting period. The interrogatories approved by the Commission requested both the dates of the contracts or agreements for the services resulting in these debts and the dates the Cranston Committee received these invoices.

- 2 -

The Committee submitted a voluminous response.1/ The Committee indicates that except for debts owed to the Blaine Group and Crown Gilbraltar Graphics, "we have no indication in our files that a contract or agreement was made prior to the invoice date."2/ Treasurer's Statement at 2. The Committee further notes that it has no record of dates for when invoices were received by it, but has provided the date placed on each invoice by the vendor. Moreover, the Committee has also provided

2/ This statement appears to be incorrect as to a debt owed to Facter, Fox, & McEvilly for direct mail. The Committee's requisition form notes a contract dated February 28, 1986.

^{1/} Because of the size of this response, we attach only the Committee's cover letter, treasurer's sworn statement and chart detailing debts. We have used the Committee's documentation and verified the information on this chart. This documentation is available for review in the permanent file in the Office of the General Counsel.

copies of each invoice and copies of the Committee's internal check requisition forms that include the dates the Committee's staff requested that debts be paid. $\frac{3}{2}$

- 3 -

A review of these materials reveals that for the 16 debts noted in the complaint owed to persons other than individuals, the Committee either received an invoice, incurred an obligation, or received services under contract in a reporting period, but failed to report these obligations as debts in that reporting period. $\frac{4}{2}$

With respect to expenditures made by the Committee to six individuals, <u>5</u>/ a review of the underlying documentation of the expenditures reveals that, with the exception of disbursements to Joy Jacobson (on 5/23/86) and to Darry Sragow (on 7/1/85), the underlying expenditures were all less than \$500. Thus, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), such debts, obligations or other promises to make an expenditure of \$500 or less shall be reported as of the time the payment is made or no later than 60 days after such obligation is incurred, whichever comes first.

3/ The Committee states it is unable to locate invoices for debts owed to Facter, Fox, & McEvilly and Pam Direct Mail. Check requisition forms were provided, however.

4/ We have annotated the Committee's chart next to the lines "Period Ending" to list the specific report referred to by the Chart. This new column indicates the reporting period in which the debt or obligation was incurred, and thus should have been reported in. Exceptions to this are debts owed to the United States Senate Restaurant, Chasen's, Union Offset, Inc., and Facter, Fox & McEvilly (5/23/83) which were outstanding for longer periods of time and thus should have been listed on the report immediately preceeding the one noted.

5/ These disbursements are to Darry Sragow on 7/1/85; Kim Cranston on 1/1/86; Andi Behlen on 1/3/86; Darry Sragow on 3/31/86; Joy Jacobson on 5/23/86; and Darry Sragow on 5/20/86.

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Disbursements made by the Committee to Kim Cranston (on 1/1/86) and Darry Sragow on (5/20/86) were paid by the Committee within 60 days after the expenditures were made, and thus were not required to be reported as debts. Accordingly, this Office will not incorporate these debts into the conciliation agreement and will so notify respondents. However, disbursements made by the Committee to Andi Behlen (1/3/86) and Darry Sragow (4/1/86) were not reported within 60 days after some of these expenditures were made. The Regulations require a debt of less than \$500 to be reported within 60 days after the expenditure is made. Thus, these latter two debts are incorporated into the attached conciliation agreement. Additionally, expenditures underlying disbursements by the Committee to Joy Jacobson and Darry Sragrow (on 7/1/86) exceeded \$500, but were not reported at the time these debts were incurred. The Regulations require a debt exceeding \$500 to be reported at the time of the transaction. Accordingly, these two debts are also incorporated in the attached agreement.

B. Receipt of Excessive Contributions

The Committee's response also requests that the Commission take no further action regarding excessive contributions, citing its voluntary refunds. It is the opinion of this Office, however, that the Committee's receipt of excessive contributions should be pursued.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

 Enter into conciliation with the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee and Marvin S. Shapiro, as treasurer, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

Approve the attached letter and proposed conciliation 2. agreement.

On June 2, 1987, the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that your clients violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b)(8) and 441a(f), as well as 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b). At your request, on October 21, 1987, the Commission determined to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a conciliation agreement in settlement of this matter prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

Enclosed is a conciliation agreement that the Commission has approved in settlement of this matter. Please note that attached agreement does not include a requirement that the Committee report as debts disbursements made to Kim Cranston on 1/1/86 and Darry Sragow 5/20/86 because the underlying debts were less than \$500 and the Committee paid these amounts within 60 days after the obligations were incurred. See 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(a). If your clients agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return it, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission. Gentlemen:

This letter is being submitted in connection with the Conciliation Agreement which concludes the above-referenced proceeding, and I request that it be made part of the public record along with the Conciliation Agreement.

MUR No. 2304 was initiated by the filing of a complaint alleging that the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the "Committee") violated federal election laws. The complaint was filed for obviously political purposes, as indicated by the timing of the filing (two weeks before the primary election) and the press release that accompanied the filing (in violation of the spirit, if not the letter, of 11 C.F.R. § 111.21.)

After a thorough investigation, the staff of the Federal Election Commission (the "FEC") concluded that the complaint, in large part, was not well taken. However, the FEC did pursue, and the Conciliation Agreement covers two alleged violations: alleged failure timely to report debts and obligations and alleged excessive contributions.

It is undisputed that the debts and obligations were reported; the allegation is that they should have been reported in the period prior to when they actually were reported. The debts and obligations in question - all trade payables - fall into two categories. First, for some, the Committee had not yet even received invoices during the reporting period in which the debt Federal Election Commission April 13, 1988 Page Two

was incurred. Second, for the others, the Committee received invoices at the end of the reporting period in which the debt was incurred. For both categories, the debts were paid soon after the beginning of the following reporting period, and the reports for that period reflect the debts.

The Committee acted on the good faith belief that "debts" within the meaning of 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b) did not include trade payables paid on a timely basis. The Committee subsequently learned that the FEC's interpretation was different and changed its reporting practices so as to report trade payables in the period the debt or obligation was incurred. At all times, the Committee had more than enough money to cover the trade payables. In fact, the total amount of such debts (\$225,733.00) is only about three percent (3%) of the cash-on-hand as reported as of the end of the relevant reporting periods.

With respect to the alleged excessive contributions, the Committee established an excellent record of timely refunding contributions that were excessive or otherwise impermissible. In the course of its own on-going internal audit procedures prior to the complaint, the Committee identified and timely refunded 57 contributions totaling approximately \$40,000. However, a small number of contributions prior to 1985 inadvertently were never entered into the data base when the campaign transferred all financial activity to an "on-line" computer system. As a result, the Committee did not timely refund \$7,050 in excessive contributions, but they were refunded immediately upon discovery. This situation must be viewed in the context of a campaign that raised over \$11 million from approximately 140,000 contributors.

In conclusion, the Committee's record of compliance with federal election law was exemplary and not surpassed by any other campaign of comparable size. The Committee cooperated fully with the FEC in its investigation and is pleased this matter now is concluded.

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

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Paul Gann and Robert Naylor. The Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe that the Cranston for Senate '92 Committee and its prior treasurer ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b) (8) and 441a(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and the Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (4) (A) (i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

Respondent, the Cranston for Senate '92
 Committee is a political committee within the meaning of
 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

2. Solomon M. Kamm, is now the treasurer of the Cranston for Senate '92 Committee. At the time of the violations in question, however, the Committee was entitled the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee.

3. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) (8), political committees are required to report the amount and nature of outstanding debts and obligations.

4. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b), a debt, obligation, or other promise to make an expenditure, the amount of which is \$500 or less, shall be reported as of the time the payment is made, or no later than 60 days after the obligation is incurred, whichever comes first. Moreover, any loan, debt, or obligation, the amount of which is over \$500, shall be reported by a political committee as of the time of the transaction.

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or

5. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a) (1) (A), no person shall make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committees with respect to any election for Federal Office which, in the aggregate, exceed \$1,000.

6. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), political committees are prohibited from accepting contributions exceeding the Act's limitations.

Respondents failed to report on Schedule D
 \$225,733 in debts owed to thirteen creditors.

8. Respondents accepted a total of \$7,050 in contributions exceeding the Act's contribution limitations.

V. 1. Respondents failed to report a total of \$225,733 in outstanding debts and obligations in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) (8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.11.

2. Respondents accepted \$7,050 in excessive contributions in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f).

3. Respondents contend that such violations were neither knowing nor willful.

VI. 1. The Cranston for Senate '92 Committee will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of one-thousand five-hundred dollars (\$1,500), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (5) (A).

2. Respondents will amend their reports to correctly report the above-noted debts.

VII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VIII. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

IX. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

X. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no

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other statement, promise, or agreement either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable. FOR THE COMMISSION:

Gentlemen:

This letter is being submitted in connection with the Conciliation Agreement accepted by the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") on April 29, 1988, which concludes the above-referenced proceeding, and I request that it be made part of the public record.

MUR No. 2304 was initiated by the filing of a complaint alleging that the Cranston for Senate '86 Committee (the "Committee") violated federal election laws. The complaint was filed for obviously political purposes, as indicated by the timing of the filing (two weeks before the primary election) and the press release that accompanied the filing (in violation of the spirit, if not the letter, of 11 C.F.R. § 111.21.)

After a thorough investigation, FEC staff concluded that the complaint, in large part, was not well taken. However, the FEC did pursue and the Conciliation Agreement covers two alleged violations: alleged failure timely to report debts and obligations and alleged excessive contributions.

It is undisputed that the debts and obligations were reported; the allegation is that they should have been reported in the period prior to when they actually were reported. The debts and obligations in question - all trade payables - fall into two categories. First, for some, the Committee had not yet even received invoices during the reporting period in which the debt was incurred. Second, for the others, the Committee received

invoices at the end of the reporting period in which the debt was incurred. For both categories, the debts were paid soon after the beginning of the following reporting period, and the reports for that period reflect the debts.

The Committee acted on the good faith belief that "debts" within the meaning of 11 C.F.R. § 104.11(b) did not include trade payables paid on a timely basis. The Committee subsequently learned that the FEC's interpretation was different and changed its reporting practices so as to report trade payables in the period the debt or obligation was incurred. At all times, the Committee had more than enough money to cover the trade payables. In fact, the total amount of such debts (\$225,733.00) is only about three percent (3%) of the cash-on-hand as reported as of the end of the relevant reporting periods.

With respect to the alleged excessive contributions, the Committee established an excellent record of timely refunding contributions that were excessive or otherwise impermissible. In the course of its own on-going internal audit procedures prior to the complaint, the Committee identified and timely refunded 57 contributions totaling approximately \$40,000. However, a small number of contributions prior to 1985 inadvertently were never entered into the data base when the campaign transferred all financial activity to an "on-line" computer system. As a result, the Committee did not timely refund \$7,050 in excessive contributions, but they were refunded immediately upon discovery. This situation must be viewed in the context of a campaign that raised over \$11 million from approximately 140,000 contributors.

In conclusion, the Committee's record of compliance with federal election law was exemplary and not surpassed by any other campaign of comparable size. The Committee cooperated fully with the FEC in its investigation and is pleased this matter now is concluded.
