President's Message

Don't let the task force become a task farce

The Florida Sheriffs Association is assuming a leading role in the attack on "crack" cocaine by creating a sophisticated team of narcotics investigators from various Sheriffs' Offices. This task force will operate statewide, hitting areas where manufacturers and sellers of "crack" are creating the most severe problems. Mutual aid agreements will provide broad jurisdictional authority.

This is a bold concept that can have a dramatic impact on Florida's current "crack" crisis, but it is only one phase of a broad battle plan involving the entire criminal justice system, and, in the final analysis, its success will depend upon the teamwork and commitment demonstrated by many branches of government.

The Sheriffs' task force project was announced on February 14, and Commissioner Tim Moore promptly pledged the support of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Initial reactions indicate that cooperation will be received from all levels of law enforcement, but the "crack" crisis cannot be dealt with by law enforcement tactics alone.

Law enforcement can provide the front line troops. However, these troops will be ineffective without the fully committed support of the Florida Legislature, the Governor's Office, the Department of Corrections, the judiciary and other government entities.

A team effort is absolutely essential, and it has been gratifying to see a pattern of teamwork emerging. Recently, there have been several strategy sessions involving a representative group of criminal justice officials. The results have been most encou-

raging. Department of Corrections officials attending these conferences have offered full cooperation, but have also warned that, unless new prisons are built, a concerted "crack" attack will intensify prison overcrowding and force them to grant early releases to inmates presently serving time for serious crimes. Overcrowded jails increase the severity of this dilemma.

Governor Bob Martinez is aware of the situation and has joined the "crack" attack by submitting to the legislature a 1989-90 budget that will provide over 8,800 new prison beds and increase incarceration alternatives such as electronic house arrest. He is also asking the lawmakers to appropriate funds for more judges, prosecutors and parole and probation officers to handle drug related cases.

Consequently, Florida's legislators have become key participants in "crack" attack strategy. If they demonstrate a spirit of teamwork by passing the tough laws Sheriffs are endorsing, and by giving an acceptable response to the Governor's budget proposals, current plans for an all out assault on "crack" dealers and manufacturers can be singularly successful.

Their full cooperation is indispensable. Without it the Sheriffs' "crack" cocaine task force is likely to become a task farce!



Members of the Board of Directors serve two-year terms. They can succeed themselves only one time, and are thus limited to four continuous years. Terms are staggered so that six Board members are elected in even numbered years and six in odd numbered years. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected by the Board for one-year terms, and cannot be reelected to succeed themselves.



GOVERNOR BOB MARTINEZ (R)

When Bob Martinez was inaugurated as Florida's 40th Governor on January 6, 1987, it marked the second time in 113 years that the powers of the state's highest office had been handed to a Republican.

Prior to that time only Republican Claude R. Kirk, Jr. (1967-71) and Prohibition Party Candidate Sidney J. Catts (1917-21) had been able to break a pattern of Democratic Party domination that began after the reconstruction era.

A lifelong resident of Tampa, Governor Martinez was born on December 25, 1934. He attained political prominence in 1979 when he was elected Mayor of his native city. He topped a field of five candidates without a runoff in that election, and was reelected in 1983 by capturing 81 percent of the vote.

During his terms as Mayor he was credited with a conservative approach to government that lowered property taxes, decreased the number of city employees and improved the quality of life.


His official biography points out that Tampa was chosen as one of ten "megatrend" cities of the future by author John Naisbett during the Martinez administration, and "its robust diversified economy has become a model for growth."

Governor Martinez is a Past President of the Florida League of Cities, and he served on the Board of Directors of the National League of Cities.

President Ronald Reagan appointed him to the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations. He also served on the Commission on Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies, and as Vice Chairman of the Southwest Florida Water Management District.

Governor Martinez holds a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Tampa, and a Master's Degree in Labor and Industrial Relations from the University of Illinois. He spent 12 years in the field of education, including seven years as a classroom teacher. He also operated a private business that was sold in 1983.

He and his wife, Mary Jane, have been married for 34 years. They have a daughter, Sharon Martinez Keen, a son, Alan, and twin granddaughters, Lydia and Emily Keen.

Governors hold "Supreme Executive Power"

In strong language, Article IV, Section 1, of Florida's Constitution decrees that "the supreme executive power shall be vested in a governor."

Then it adds: He shall be commander-in-chief of all military forces of the state... He shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed, commission all officers of the state and counties, and transact all necessary business with the officers of government. He may require information in writing from all executive or administrative state, county or municipal officers upon any subject relating to the duties of their respective offices.

Other constitutional powers permit the Governor to: initiate judicial proceedings requiring public officials to do their duty, or refrain from unauthorized actions; request Supreme Court interpretations of his constitutional powers and duties; call out the militia to preserve the public peace; make appointments to fill vacancies in state and county offices.

STATE CABINET

The Executive Branch of state government administers and enforces laws. Top officials are the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and six cabinet officials — Treasurer, Commissioner of Agriculture, Attorney General, Comptroller, Secretary of State and Commissioner of Education. Each cabinet member is elected statewide and given specific duties.

CHIEF JUSTICE RAYMOND EHRLICH

Born Swainsboro, Georgia, February 2, 1918. Education Received his undergraduate and law degrees from the University of Florida. Wife Miriam Religion Jewish Military U. S. Navy during World War II. Mid-Winter Conference Highlights - Part II

"My first priority is to add more than 8,800 beds to Florida's Prison System."

An address presented by Governor Bob Martinez during the Annual Mid-Winter Conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association

I appreciate this opportunity to join you for your Mid-Winter Conference. I want you to know how much I appreciate the cooperation of your organization and how important the assistance of the Sheriffs Association has been in helping my office to identify key issues. We are making important progress in law enforcement in Florida.

Last week I announced two important areas of my budget recommendations that will go a long way toward improving the quality of life in Florida. They directly affect you and their success depends on you.

Government's first duty is to protect our citizens ind we simply can't do that if we don't have anywhere to put those that break the law. That's why my first priority is to add more than 8,800 prison beds to Florida's prison system. We've increased Florida's prison system by more than 9,000 beds in the past two years and again we're looking at another 9,000 for this one year. We believe it can be done and it must be done.

What more prison space means to you and to every law abiding citizen in Florida is clear. Fifty-four hundred fewer inmates will get early release next year, we can prevent crime by locking up our career criminals and the worst predators. The bulk of my correctional budget, 152.4 million dollars, is for prison construction, because we've got to make up for lost time and lack of space.

But my plan is not simply a lock up system for criminals. I am recommending a comprehensive correctional plan that will maximize our corrections program by expanding alternatives to prisons. Another 14.7 million will go to fund cost effective and reliable alternatives like house arrest and community control, but not for violent offenders.

We can toughen Florida's early release program so that suspects or convicted criminals who assault law enforcement or correctional officers are not eligible for credits toward early release required due to overcrowd-

Ig. I am recommending that we develop a five-year master plan for our correctional system to project where our needs are, and where our money and our attention should be directed. As far as we know, Flor-

ida will be the first state to develop and use a master plan for corrections. Florida can and should be a leader in the area of criminal justice. We are the fastest growing state with one of the highest crime rates. Both of these dictate that we take the lead in fighting crime.

As you know, much of our crime problem is fueled by drugs. Last week I announced that my budget would include 15 million dollars to implement a series of programs to fight this problem. My plan targets both sides of the drug trade, the user and the seller, because they feed off each other and their combined efforts result in so much crime. I am recommending more than half of the 15 million dollars go for criminal justice efforts because we can fight this monster, we can prevent future drug abuse, the need for treatment and future crime.

I'm also recommending increases in personnel for state agencies that target drug activity, as well as, more judges, prosecutors, parole and probation officers, and corrections officers to handle drug related cases.

We could boost crime fighting in Florida with one important change in public policy, repealing our discovery deposition rules. Florida's discovery rule is detrimental to law enforcement. In fact, a DEA Administrator said last week that they prefer not to prosecute drug cases in Florida because our discovery rules compromise our cases. When that happens we in Florida pay the cost of crime but the recovery of money (continued on next page)

takes place in another state. We take the loss, they take the gain.

It's time that public policy makers make a determination on the discovery rule and not leave it solely to the legal profession. It is time that we go on the record to say that the discovery rule as it is applied in Florida is no longer acceptable public policy. A change in our discovery rule would eliminate abuses of the system and would immediately relieve some 35 million dollars in overtime and work load associated with the current discovery rule. That would enable us to direct that money into legitimate actions to fight crime.

We need the cooperation and support of all areas of the criminal justice system to effectively fight drug related crime. I am proposing legislation that would prevent courts from withholding adjudication on those convicted of drug related crimes so that they get full credit for their crime. We can make drug users and illegal drug traffickers pay for the cost of their crimes.

Law enforcement has taken the lead with drug test-

ing to encourage a drug-free work place. The State of Florida is right behind you. We are implementing policies to make State Government drug free and to send a message to vendors and companies that do business with the state that we expect them to be drug free as well.

Convicted drug felons would also be prohibited from receiving a driver's license and would be ineligible for loans and other assistance awarded by the state unless they complete a drug rehabilitation program.

And, I support more military support in fighting drugs. You will be hearing more about a summit meeting to bring together law enforcement and the military to fight our drug problem. We've got a lot of work ahead of us. This is one of the most important efforts we can make for Florida. I look forward to working with you this year on these important issues. Again, I appreciate the cooperation of the Sheriff's Association and I appreciate the great service each of you provides to your community.







There will be five camping sessions of ten days each, starting on June 14 and ending on August 18. The camp staff will include deputy sheriffs in addition to experienced counselors from the ranks of college students and school teachers. Last year 42 deputies from 20 counties reported for duty, giving credibility to the camp slogan: "Law enforcement officers are your friends." Sheriffs provided demonstrations by a bomb squad, a scuba rescue unit, SWAT and K-9 teams and helicopters.
