Reapportioning Florida

After each decennial (every ten years) census, Florida is required to reapportion its state legislative and U.S. Congressional districts. The legislature is currently in the throes of this procedure, and, practically speaking, the job must be completed prior to the 1992 general elections.

Reapportionment is the process of re-dividing a given number of seats (40 in the State Senate, 120 in the House) among units of government or geographic districts. This is usually done according to an established plan or formula.

The number of state legislative districts will not increase. However, some areas of the state are growing faster than others, and therefore the district boundary lines will have to be changed to give all Florida residents equal representation.

The 1990 census gave Florida a population of 12.94 million, a hefty increase of 32.7 since 1980. Dividing this total into 40 Senate districts and 120 House districts, produces an ideal "head count" of 323,448 for each Senate district, and 107,816 for a House district.

Florida's lawmakers will attempt to come as close to these "ideal" totals as possible, since the U.S. Constitution has been interpreted to require legislative districts with "substantial equality of population." Courts have generally determined that "substantial equality" means a total deviation of less than ten percent.

This is a complex task, and no "dilly dallying" is permitted.

If the Legislature fails to reapportion itself into "consecutively numbered, contiguous, overlapping or identical" districts in its 1992 regular session, the Governor is required to call a Special Apportionment Session. If that session fails to get the desired results, the Florida Supreme Court will do the job.

Reapportioning Florida's Congressional districts is an additional assignment faced by Florida's lawmakers, and the fact that Florida has gained four additional seats in the U.S. House of Representatives through its tremendous population growth will add to the complexity of the task.

Reapportionment will increase Florida's congressional seats from 19 to 23, and all are due to be filled in the 1992 general election. Since the U.S. Senate is not subject to reapportionment, Florida will continue to have two senators, the same as every other state.

After Florida's lawmakers have completed their intricate reshuffling chores, one final step will remain. Any reapportionment plan passed by the Legislature will be automatically reviewed by the Florida Supreme Court.

In 1982 when the Florida Legislature was reapportioned to fit a "one man/one vote" profile, Maury Kolchakian was the staff attorney for the Senate's Reapportionment Committee. Prior to that time he was the staff attorney for the Senate's Governmental Operations Committee.

Proceed with caution!

Reorganizing state law enforcement agencies is a major proposal facing the current session of the Florida Legislature, and it is an idea worth consideration and review.

However, increasing state law enforcement services should be the focus of the Legislature's reorganization efforts, and not consolidation of power.

Currently, Sheriffs' Offices and Police Departments provide the front line troops in the war against crime; and Sheriffs, being elected, have traditionally reflected the concerns of Florida citizens relative to crime.

State law enforcement agencies have a different focus. They concentrate on enforcement of traffic laws, as well as hunting, fishing, boating and alcoholic beverage regulations. They also patrol state college campuses; make fire safety inspections and investigate suspected arson cases; patrol state parks; and investigate tax dodgers.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement has a wide-ranging mission that includes providing crime lab services for state and local agencies; maintaining centralized crime files; and assisting local agencies with criminal investigations.

Each level of law enforcement has its own areas of responsibility, and this time-honored "division of labor" has worked amazingly well. Historically there has been a minimum of friction between state and local agencies, and an admirable amount of cooperation.

A directory published in this issue of *The Sheriff's Star* lists 17 state agencies responsible for enforcing a wide variety of laws and regulations. Each has its own sphere of responsibility. Each operates independently within a narrowly defined area of focused responsibility.

Reorganizing some of these agencies could conceivably result in greater efficiency and coordination at the state level, but over-zealous efforts to create a smoother operating "machine" could also produce a "monster."

The clear and present danger is that an all-powerful state police agency could dominate, and eventually supersede local law enforcement. It has happened in other states, and it could happen here with the following disastrous results:

- * Control of local law enforcement, which now resides at the local level through the election process, could shift to the state level and seriously cripple local self-government.

- * Taken to the ultimate extreme, consolidation could create a law enforcement "czar" who would be

answerable to a few state officials, rather than to Florida voters.

Upsetting the present delicate balance between state and local law enforcement could have devastating results even if the foregoing "worst case scenarios" never came to pass. That is why Florida's Sheriffs are urging the Legislature to "proceed with caution."

Sheriffs are saying, in effect, "don't go so far and so fast in pursuit of reorganization that you cripple local law enforcement and reverse the progress that has made Florida a recognized leader among law enforcement professionals."

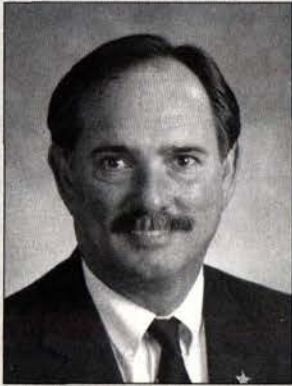
Florida's local law enforcement agencies are presently healthy, strong and progressive. They have proved that they can work together as a team for desirable goals. The current success of the Florida Sheriffs Association's Crack Cocaine Task Force is only one example of this teamwork in action.

Mutual Aid Agreements between local law enforcement agencies have proved to be an effective tool in combatting criminal activities that cross local and county boundaries.

Many examples can also be cited of close and effective cooperation between local officers and state and federal officers. It is possible that careful, cautious reorganization on the state level can enhance and improve this team effort; and it is also possible that going too far too fast can have disastrous results.

It's worth study, but, by all means, proceed with caution!

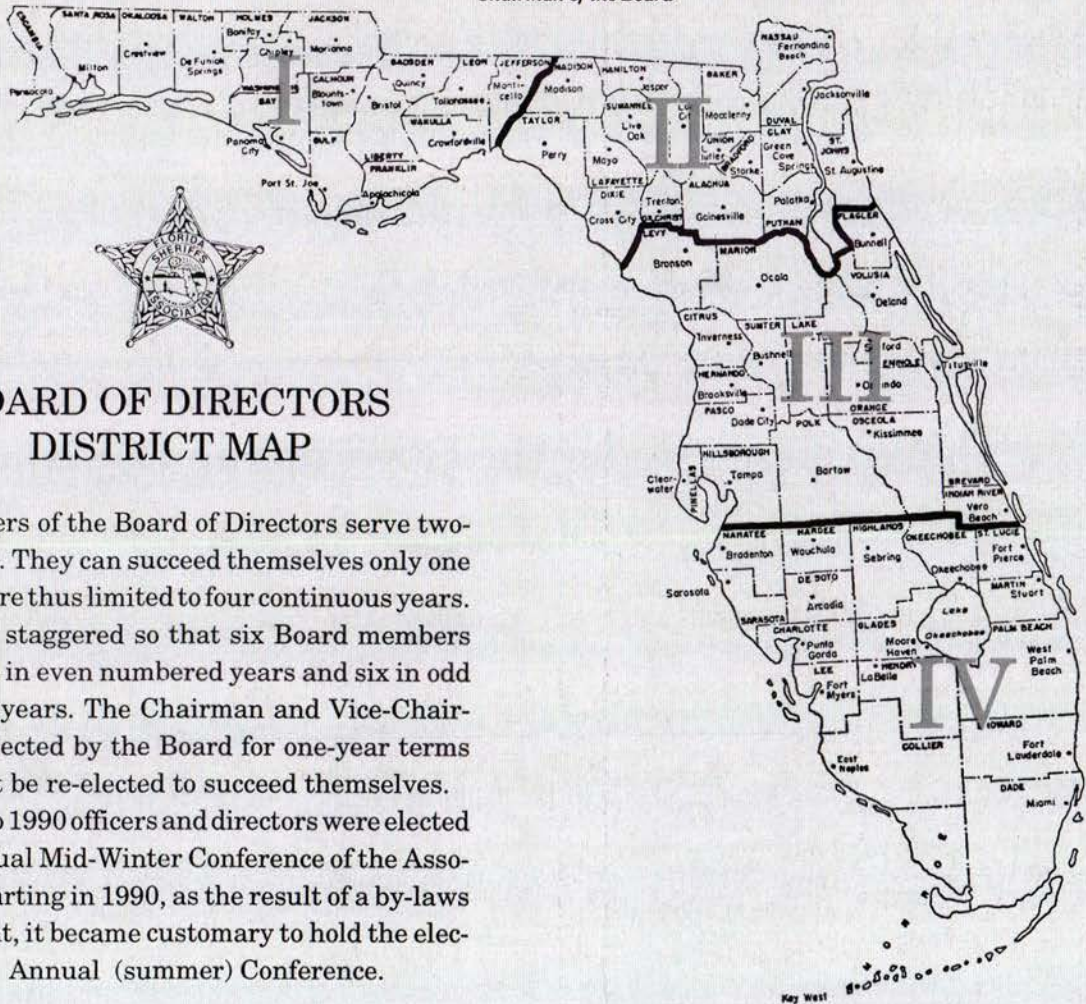

Members of the Board of Directors serve two-year terms. They can succeed themselves only one time, and are thus limited to four continuous years. Terms are staggered so that six Board members are elected in even numbered years and six in odd numbered years. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected by the Board for one-year terms and cannot be re-elected to succeed themselves.

Prior to 1990 officers and directors were elected at the Annual Mid-Winter Conference of the Association. Starting in 1990, as the result of a by-laws amendment, it became customary to hold the election at the Annual (summer) Conference.

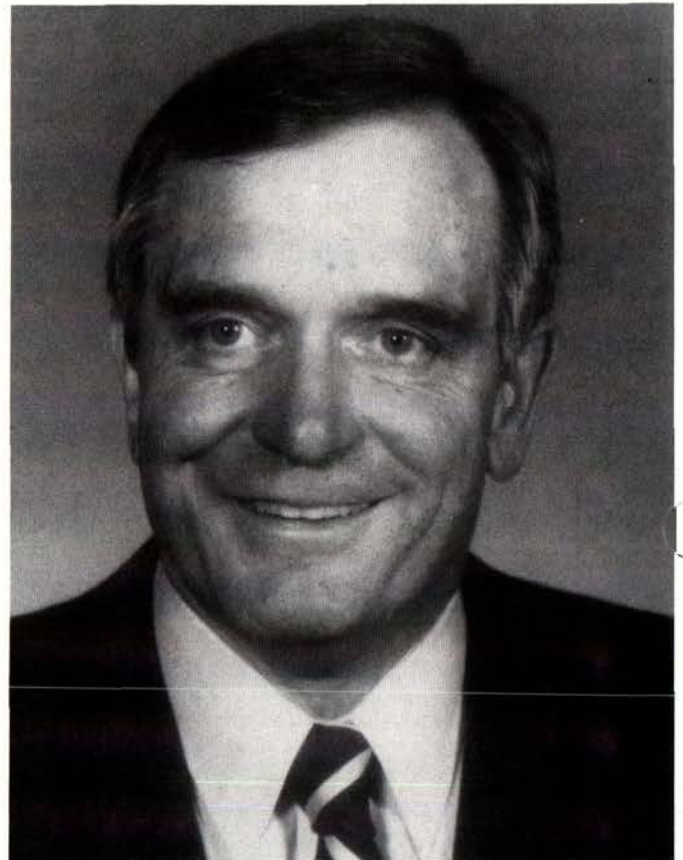
GOVERNOR LAWTON CHILES (D)

Governor Lawton Chiles was born in Lakeland, Florida, April 3, 1930. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Florida in 1952, and an LLB Degree from the University of Florida College of Law in 1955. Six Florida universities have awarded him honorary degrees. He and his wife, Rhea May, have four children.

Highlights of his professional career include: practicing attorney, Lakeland, Florida, 1955 to 1971; instructor, Florida Southern College, 1955 to 1958; Director, LeRoy Collins Center for Public Policy, 1989-90; Eminent Scholar, Manning Dauer Chair, Department of Political Science, University of Florida, 1989 to 1990.

Governor Chiles' political career began in 1959 when he was sworn-in as a member of the Florida House of Representatives. He held his House seat through 1966, and served in the Florida Senate from 1967 to 1970. He was in the U.S. Senate from 1971 to 1989 and held the following committee assignments: Appropriations Committee, Budget Committee (Chairman), Democratic Steering Committee, Governmental Affairs Committee and Special Committee on Aging.

He has received many awards during his years of public service, the most recent ones being: National Science Foundation, for distinguished public service, 1988; Florida Wildlife Federation's Legislative Conservation Award, 1987; American Association of Homes for the Aging award for leadership and efforts on behalf of America's elderly, 1986; America-Israel Friendship League, Honorary Sponsor, 1984; United Synagogue Youth Soviet Jewry Award, 1984; National Security Council Leadership Award, 1983, 1986, 1987; American Federation of Senior Citizens Man of the Year, 1982; Florida Sheriffs Association award for contributing to the advancement of better law enforcement, 1982; Florida Informed Parents award for influence in the battle against drug abuse, 1981; Citizens Crime Watch award for legis-



lative efforts to control criminal activity, 1981; and Disabled American Veterans' Commander's Award, for outstanding service to disabled veterans, 1981.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

KENNETH H. "BUDDY" MACKAY (D)



Lieutenant Governor Kenneth "Buddy" MacKay is a former United States Congressman from Florida's 6th District. He was born on March 22, 1933, in Ocala, Florida, and attended Marion County public schools. He was graduated from the University of Florida in 1954. After serving three years as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force, he entered the University of Florida College of Law, from which he was graduated with honors in 1961.

MacKay is married to the former Anne Selph. They have raised four sons and have been active in the Presbyterian Church. From 1968 until 1974, MacKay served in the Florida House of Representatives, and from 1974 to 1980 in the Florida Senate. During that time he was designated Most Valuable Legislator more times than anyone in history. In addition to his Florida legislative service, he practiced law, and was also actively involved in the management of his family's cattle and citrus business.

MacKay began his first term as a Member of Congress on January 3, 1983. He served on the House Committee on Science and Technology, Foreign Affairs

Committee, Committee on the Budget, and Select Committee on Aging.

During his first term in Congress, MacKay organized the Democratic Budget Group, which has played an active part in the effort to reduce budget deficits. During the 99th Congress, he formed the Congressional Caucus on Competitiveness, a bipartisan, bicameral organization designed to improve America's standing in the global marketplace.

After his years in Congress, MacKay served as Chairman of the Florida Democratic Party's Campaign Committee and helped to develop a state-wide general election strategy for electing Democrats. He also was appointed as a national spokesman for the Washington-based Democratic Leadership Council.

MacKay took a leave of absence from the Miami law firm of Steel, Hector & Davis in order to run successfully in 1990 as Lt. Governor with former United States Senator Lawton Chiles. Their ticket was designated the "Democratic Dream Team" due to their combined 50 years of public service.

Governors hold "Supreme Executive Power"

In strong language, Article IV, Section 1, of Florida's Constitution decrees that "the supreme executive power shall be vested in a governor."

Then it adds: "He shall be commander-in-chief of all military forces of the state . . . He shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed, commission all officers of the state and counties, and transact all necessary business with the officers of government. He may require information in writing from all

executive or administrative state, county or municipal officers upon any subject relating to the duties of their respective offices."

Other constitutional powers permit the Governor to: initiate judicial proceedings requiring public officials to do their duty, or refrain from unauthorized actions; request Supreme Court interpretations of his constitutional powers and duties; call out the militia to preserve the public peace; make appointments to fill vacancies in state and county offices.

STATE CABINET

The Executive Branch of state government administers and enforces laws. Top officials are the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and six cabinet officials — Treasurer, Commissioner of Agriculture, Attorney General, Comptroller, Secretary of State and Commissioner of Education. Each cabinet member is elected statewide and given specific duties.

elite**

DELAND — "This was almost like having a baby," Sheriff Bob Vogel told a news reporter after the Volusia County Sheriff's Office was accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA).

"We worked long and hard for this," he added, referring to the two-year effort he and his staff put forth to bring the agency up to the top level of professionalism, "but it was a labor of love."

CALEA awarded accreditation to the Volusia County Sheriff's Office in November, 1991, making it the 189th law enforcement agency in the nation to achieve this elite status. It is also the 11th Sheriff's Office in Florida to receive CALEA's stamp of approval, putting Florida's

Sheriffs far ahead of any other state's Sheriffs in the professionalization parade.

The other accredited Sheriff's Offices in Florida are Indian River, Charlotte, Manatee, Marion, Hillsborough, Broward, Monroe, Palm Beach, St. Johns and Pinellas.

To become accredited, Sheriff Vogel and his staff spent two years bringing their procedures and policies in line with approximately 850 state-of-the-art standards established by CALEA. Then they underwent a thorough inspection by a team of law enforcement professionals from outside the state. A favorable vote by the accreditation commission was the final phase of the process.

Getting accredited is like winning a law enforcement "super bowl," but after the celebration simmers down there comes the sobering realization that accreditation is for only five years. At the end of that period the Sheriff and his staff will have to once again prove to CALEA that they are still functioning at a high professional level.

Looked upon as "the wave of the future," accreditation is a relatively new development in law enforcement. CALEA was formed as a private, non-profit organization in 1979 through the combined efforts of the National Sheriffs' Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives, and the Police Executive Research Forum. It became operational in 1983.

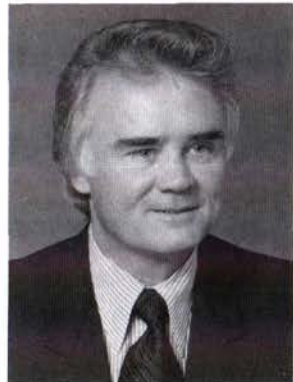

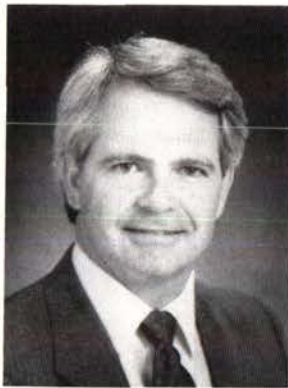

82 years of progress

The Florida Sheriffs Association was founded in 1910 to bring Sheriffs in closer touch with each other. It became inactive in 1915, and this condition prevailed until 1927-28 when Palm Beach County Sheriff Bob Baker stumped the state to successfully revive the organization.

During the 1930s and 40s the Association was actively involved in strengthening criminal laws and establishing a statewide communications network. It also opposed with marked success any attempt to establish a state police force. It did not oppose state agencies with specialized areas of responsibility such as traffic law enforcement, management of natural resources, or regulating alcoholic beverages.

In 1955 the Association was successful in getting the Florida Legislature to pass a law creating The Florida Sheriffs Bureau, a statewide agency designed to assist local law enforcement by providing a crime lab, top-notch investigators, centralized crime files and professional training.

Over the years the Bureau has evolved into The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) with a much broader scope of responsibility, but the original mandate to assist police departments and Sheriffs' Offices has not been abandoned.

In 1957 the Association established the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch as a home for neglected, troubled and unsupervised — but not delinquent — youngsters. Today the Boys Ranch is one of six child care programs for boys and girls administered by The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. Through these programs and a staff of social workers, over 7,000 youths have been given an opportunity to make a new start.

Working together through the Association Sheriffs have upgraded law enforcement in many ways that are too numerous to mention in this limited space. However, all of these improvements have had one objective: to modernize and professionalize Florida's criminal justice system.

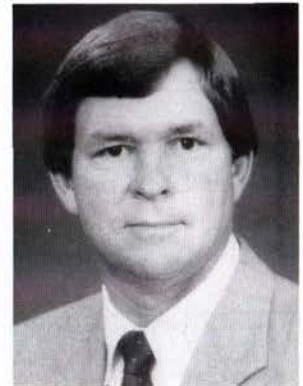

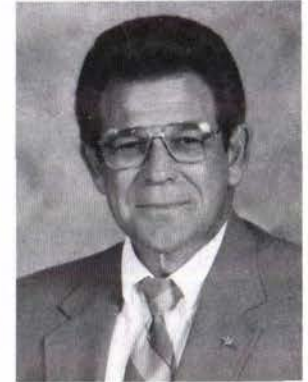

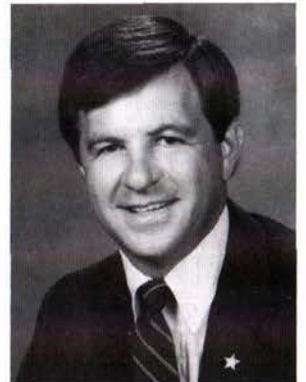

Medal of Honor commemorates a day that was not routine in any way

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — March 6, 1990, began routinely for Sgt. Russ Burke as he put on his Clay County Sheriff's Office uniform, buckled his duty belt, and gave his sidearm a final safety check before slipping it into a breakfront holster.

Some 15 miles away, in a rural residential section of Orange Park, thirty-year-old Victor Hickox was also arming himself, but he was not in uniform. What he wore was a look of desperation. Marital problems and continuing discord with his in-laws had taken its toll, and he was "losing the edge." Hardships and disappointments had built up intense hostility within him. He saw himself as the victim of raw deals, and he had decided this was the day when he was going to make someone else a victim.

Burke and Hickox had never met, but they were going to meet within a few hours under circumstances that neither would ever forget.

For Hickox, frustration had reached its peak. For Burke it seemed to be just another tour of duty as he checked the equipment in his white and green patrol car, filtered into the morning's flow of traffic, activated the radio, and signed on with a "ten-eight."

He had no way of knowing he would soon be molded into a chaotic drama of carnage and bloodshed and death—that his five years of law enforcement experience, his good physical condition, his standing as one of the "governor's top twenty" marksmen, and his training as a SWAT Team member would be put to the ultimate test.

Burke was as prepared as a man can be for his coming ordeal. In a similar but unlawful way, Hickox was also prepared for action. He was not an accomplished marksman, but, as he checked over his AK-47 assault rifle, a MAC-11 9mm machine pistol, and a 44 magnum revolver, he felt that he had plenty of firepower to compensate for his lack of skill.

The stage was set, and the drama began to unfold at exactly three minutes past five p.m. when Emergency Communications Operator Stella Monson received the first 911 call.

A frantic woman said a man had shot several people and had barricaded himself inside a house with a ten-month-old baby. Minutes later a man called and told Monson he had just shot a "bunch of people," and would kill any police officers who showed up. When this sketchy information went out over the Sheriff's radio system, Burke estimated that he was about three miles from the scene of the shootings. Backup units were even farther away, and therefore he was the first officer to arrive. His adrenalin surged and his mind raced as he tried to take in all of the details.

People on the verge of panic were scattered about waving their arms and screaming for help. Two wounded victims were lying motionless on the front lawn of a mobile home, and Hickox, the desperate man with the heavy arsenal, was barricaded inside holding his infant daughter hostage.

In the communications center Stella Monson was maintaining an open line to Hickox. She feared for the infant's safety, although Hickox insisted he had no intentions of harming the child. When he spoke of gunning down people as they scattered like "turkeys," and said his infant daughter was playing with a machine gun, it was not reassuring.

While Hickox was insisting that he wanted officers to approach the mobile home with a television news crew, and Monson was doing everything possible to keep the dialogue going, Burke was drawing his service revolver, taking cover beside his patrol car, and yelling at spectators to get away from the scene.

Keeping a wary eye on the mobile home, Burke cautiously advanced to a large oak tree near the closest victim, Hickox's father-in-law, William Cresgy, and noted that the elderly man was severely wounded but conscious.

Wailing sirens told Burke that backup units were arriving, but he decided to take immediate action and darted from behind the oak tree with his revolver pointed toward the mobile home. He dropped to the ground beside Cresgy, expecting bullets to begin flying at any minute, then dragged Cresgy to safety behind the oak tree. The rescue required only a few seconds, but it seemed like an eternity to Burke.

The other shooting victim, Hickox's wife Laveta, was lying close to the mobile home, and Burke realized that any attempt to rescue her would have to be carried out by the SWAT Team.

Meanwhile, Hickox was on the phone talking to Monson and Sgt. Ed VanDyke, a hostage negotiator. Arriving officers were taking up positions covering the house, and the SWAT Team was being briefed. At that point Hickox announced he was coming out, and he refused to follow directions. Out he

came, and it was not immediately apparent whether he was armed or unarmed. Burke yelled for him to stop and drop to the ground. Eventually he did, and was subdued by Burke and other officers.

A few moments later a heavy sigh of relief went up when Deputy Charlene Lahey rescued Hickox's uninjured infant daughter from the front porch of the mobile home; but the mood changed almost immediately when the body of the child's mother on the lawn was determined to be lifeless.

Tension gradually drained away, and routine operations resumed. The crime scene was turned over to homicide detectives; Sgt. Burke departed unceremoniously to investigate a suicide report; and Clay County Sheriff C. Dalton Bray, assisted by Director of Staff Services John D. McCormick, faced a barrage of questions from news reporters.

They explained that Hickox had confronted his wife and in-laws in the front yard when they arrived with a court order

giving them custody of the infant. Hickox's response, they said, was to lay the infant down, pick up a gun, and start firing. His wife and father-in-law dropped, while shocked relatives began to scatter.

So much for the bare details that made immediate headlines and telecasts, but the aftermath dragged on for months. William Cresgy eventually died from his wounds, and in the summer of 1991 Hickox was sentenced to life in prison.

However, the story didn't exactly end until October 5, 1991, when the Clay County Sheriff's Office held its annual Awards Banquet. At that time Sheriff Bray presented a Medal of Honor, the agency's highest award for valor, to Sgt. Russ Burke.

So now, when Burke dresses out for a shift, something new has been added to the ritual. He places above his right breast pocket not only the red, white and blue Medal of Honor ribbon, but also insignia received when he was chosen Officer of the Year, and (twice) Officer of the Month.

Editor's footnote: In future articles about Sgt. Russ Burke, writers are urged to consider opening with something other than, "The day began routinely . . ."

Accident-free in a high-risk job

JACKSONVILLE — Considering the kind of driving Sheriffs and deputies are required to do every day of the year and any hour of the day or night, is it possible for a Sheriff's Office to go through a whole year without a vehicle accident?

The answer is: Highly unlikely. However, it does happen, and the proof is in the photo that accompanies this article. It was taken after 12 Sheriffs whose vehicles had logged more than 2,400,000 miles in a 12-month period received awards for outstanding records in accident prevention.

None of these safe driving devotees reported any "at fault" accidents involving Sheriff's Office vehicles; and eight of them reported no accidents at all!!

The remaining four award-winning Sheriffs are Charles Schramm, Glades County; William Townsend, Lafayette County; Ted Glass, Levy County; and John W. Walker, Taylor County. They came mighty close to having a totally accident-free year, and were applauded for not having had any "at fault" accidents.

Sheriffs Peavy and Whitehead were "repeaters," having previously been honored for their safety records.

Wakulla County Sheriff David Harvey, the chairman of the Florida Sheriffs Association's Self-Insurance Fund, presented the awards at the Annual Mid-Winter Conference of the Association in Jacksonville, January 13, 1992. He praised the award winners for their achievements in highway safety and loss control.

Staying calm is award-winner's forte

Lu Rosskamp's ability to stay calm under stress, plus her knowledge of first aid and CPR have saved lives. These same attributes have won for her an award as Florida's "Emergency Medical Services Dispatcher of the Year." Rosskamp has been employed as a Public Safety Dispatcher with the Indian River County Sheriff's Office since 1984 and was promoted to Shift Supervisor in 1989, the position she presently holds.

However, she also has experience in emergency medicine that dates back to 1981 when she joined the Indian River

County Volunteer Ambulance Squad. She was certified as an Emergency Medical Technician in 1983, and continued to serve the squad through 1987.

In that same year, Rosskamp's reputation for helping to save lives by telephone began to develop, and a family in Sebastian will never forget the incident.

It began when Rosskamp received a call that a 15-month-old child had suffered a seizure after being given a vaccine. The child had stopped breathing and the father was trying to administer CPR. By questioning the mother, Rosskamp was able to determine that the father was blowing too hard into the child's lungs. She gave instructions to blow easier in short breaths, and in moments the child was breathing again.

The ultimate test of Rosskamp's ability to stay calm occurred later on when she received a call that her 16-month-old son, Joshua, had fallen into a swimming pool. The babysitter said the child was not breathing. She calmly dispatched Emergency Medical Services to the rescue, before rushing home. When she arrived she found that Joshua had resumed breathing.

Because of Rosskamp's special skills, it has become commonplace for other dispatchers to refer emergency calls to her when CPR assistance is required. Such was the case in 198 when a call was received about a child who had turned blue and was not breathing. After emergency crews were sent to the scene, the dispatcher handling the call switched it over to Rosskamp, and the child was soon breathing again as a result of Rosskamp's CPR instructions.

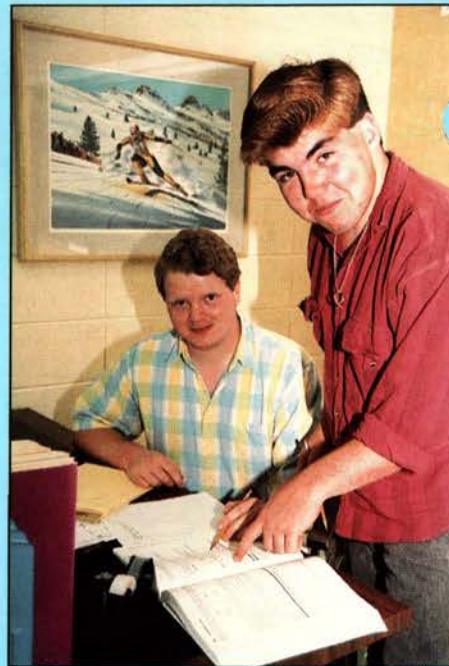

35 years of compassionate care



Founded by the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1957, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., is preparing to celebrate its 35th Anniversary on October 2, 3 and 4, 1992.

This unique venture in compassionate care for neglected, troubled and unsupervised youngsters began at The Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, near Live Oak, and has evolved into a statewide network that also includes The Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa near Bartow; The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch at Safety Harbor; The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch near Bradenton; The Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp near Barberville; and Caruth Camp near Inglis/Yankeetown.

In addition to these residential care facilities, The Youth Ranches maintains a staff of professional Family Social Workers who provide counseling for troubled children and their families throughout Florida.

The first youngsters were enrolled at the Boys Ranch in 1959. Since that time over 7,000 boys and girls have benefited from Youth Ranches services.
