'93 Deputy of the Year risked his life to save the life of an elderly woman

MILTON — Arriving at a house fire on November 17, 1992, Deputy Sheriff Richard Wyatt was told that an elderly woman was believed to be inside the burning building.

Without regard for his own safety, the Santa Rosa County Deputy entered the smoke-filled house and searched room after room until he found Mrs. Viola Davenport, 77, on her bed.

As burning debris fell around them, Wyatt picked up the woman and gently placed her in her wheelchair. Then, after covering face with a cloth, he wheeled Mrs. Davenport through the burning house to the yard, where medical technicians were waiting.

Although suffering from smoke inhalation, Wyatt also assisted in removing Mrs. Davenport's husband from the front of the house where he was trying to save personal belongings.

Only after the scene was secure and the two victims had been treated by ambulance personnel, did the rescuer allow himself to be taken to a hospital for treatment of smoke inhalation.

Informed of this act of bravery, a screening panel selected Deputy Wyatt as the Florida Sheriffs Association's 1993 Deputy of the Year.

He received the annual award on July 20, 1993, during the 80th Annual Conference of the Sheriffs Association, and was given a standing ovation by

"By endangering himself in an act of bravery, he went beyond the call of duty," said Florida Sheriffs Association Executive Director J. M. "Buddy" Phillips, Jr., during the award ceremony.

"I was just doing my job," responded Deputy Wyatt.

Two good men named Glenn were Deputy of the Year finalists

When the Florida Sheriffs Association presents its annual "Deputy of the Year" awards, three honorees are selected by a screening committee composed of individuals outside the Association. The top award goes to the Deputy of the Year, and two awards are given to outstanding finalists.

This year the top award was presented to Santa Rosa County Deputy Richard Wyatt; while the finalist awards went to Jacksonville (Duval County) Sheriff's Office Detective Glenn A. Davis; and St. Lucie County Deputy Glenn Hoffman.

DETECTIVE GLENN A. DAVIS

In 1992, Detective Davis began investigating a large scale fencing operation in Jacksonville and eight surrounding counties. The investigation focused on burglary suspects who were stealing expensive clothing, electronic equipment and compact discs, and it gathered momentum with the arrest of a suspect named Tyrone Whitehead.

Under persistent probing by Detective Davis, Whitehead identified 90 Jacksonville businesses, and numerous other businesses in nearby counties.

As a result of his diligence, Detective Davis eventually secured the arrest of ten major fences, and this led to confiscation of valuable property. Seized as a result of the arrests were a Corvette, a Ford Bronco and a Mercedes

Benz. One suspect also said "goodbye" to his house, his business and \$4,000 in cash.

DEPUTY GLENN HOFFMAN

After St. Lucie County Deputy Sheriff Glenn Hoffman transferred from the Patrol Division to the Crime Prevention Section in 1991, he attended specialized schools in crime prevention, and put his training to good use.

In 1992 he chaired over 100 Neighborhood Watch meetings, and involved nearly 4,000 residents in crime prevention activities.

Hoffman also played a major role in a "Beat Representative" program that gives deputies opportunities to answer questions and concerns about crime and crime prevention. In 1992 he attended 30 homeowners' meetings for this purpose.

Additional activities included training local business owners in crime watch and crime prevention methods; using a remote controlled Volkswagen "Fuzz Bug" to teach safety lessons to children; helping to establish the county's first bicycle patrol; and coordinating the 5th Annual Crime Watch Picnic, an event that drew almost 600 residents.

Hoffman's activities were not limited to St. Lucie County. After Hurricane Andrew devastated a large area of Dade County, he made six trips there to assist with relief efforts. He also spent 66 hours of his own time assisting police officers who were made homeless by the storm.

Heavy business agenda keeps Sheriffs in session for two and a half days

HAINES CITY — Golf courses and swimming pools were sadly neglected when the Florida Sheriffs Association held its 80th Annual Conference at Grenelefe Resort, July 19-21.

Sheriffs looked longingly at the recreational facilities while on their way to the conference center, but a heavy agenda held them captive in business sessions for two and a half days.

Topics on the overloaded slate included Criminal Justice Reform; Crime Prevention for Senior Citizens; Jail and Prison Overcrowding; Safety Belt Education; Prevention of Family Violence; Services Provided by the Civil Air Patrol; Self-Insurance for Sheriffs; Diversion Programs for Drug Treatment; A Task Force Review of Criminal Justice and Corrections; A Status Report on the Florida Highway Patrol; The HRS Juvenile Justice Initiative; The School Crossing Guard Act; A U.S. Customs Surveillance Technique Code-Named "Wagon Train"; Proposed Career Service Legislation; A Status Report on the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches; Digital Telephony and Encryption of Telecommunications; and a description of the boot camp for juveniles sponsored by Manatee County Sheriff Charlie Wells.

Speeches and awards during mealtimes kept the momentum going. During coffee breaks Sheriffs visited displays presented by 67 vendors of law enforcement equipment and services.

NSA President states objectives

"My big push this year is to get the Sheriffs of this country involved in accreditation," National Sheriffs' Association President Johnny Mack Brown told a luncheon audience.

Brown, who is the Sheriff of Greenville County, South Carolina, noted that Florida's Sheriffs are leaders in accreditation; and he announced that three counties (Pinellas, Marion and Hillsborough) have received triple-crown awards for becoming accredited in law enforcement, corrections and correctional health care.

"The second thing I want to do this year," said Brown, "is push through the concept of community oriented law enforcement." He said Sheriffs have used business management practices to improve their performance, and now they need to go one step further and get involved with the communities they serve so the communities can be helped to solve their own problems. "I'll tell you it's an excit-



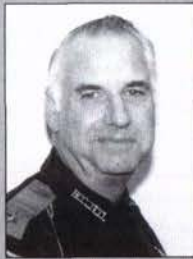

One of the grants went to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, and another was given to a youth enrolled in the Explorer program.

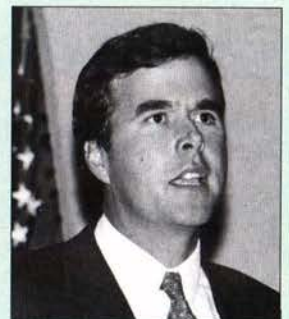

Potential candidate Bush

Jeb Bush, son of former President George Bush, was one of several potential candidates for governor who addressed Sheriffs and guests. The others were Attorney General Bob Butterworth and Senate President Ander Crenshaw.



"Why Jeb Bush?" he asked, then proceeded to name some of his priorities. He said putting limitations on the growth of government would be one of his major objectives.

"The welfare system is the only one that has grown geometrically," he said, "while criminal justice and education have suffered."

He reassured Sheriffs that the criminal justice system will be his first priority.

HAINES CITY — He sounded like a Sheriff. Standing tall, he looked like the classic image of a Sheriff. And, after he finished addressing a banquet audience of Sheriffs and guests, he was transformed into an Honorary Sheriff.

Sustained applause was still echoing through the banquet hall, when Sheriffs Bobby Knowles and Tom Tramel stepped forward to give Senate President Ander Crenshaw his new title.

Chosen as the keynote speaker for the 80th Annual Conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association, Crenshaw endeared himself to the lawmen in his audience when he said the war on crime is simply a war on “plain old evil.”

“Something’s wrong in our society,” he said, “and I think it’s more than just the sociological explanations that we hear from time to time. I’m tired of hearing that maybe he [the criminal] didn’t get enough education, or maybe the health system didn’t work right, or maybe he was socially deprived.

“I’m sorry, but these old sociological explanations just don’t get it with me any more. What we’re dealing with, in my view, is just plain old evil, pure and simple.

“Society . . . is sick because the wellspring from which we all drink has been poisoned to some extent.

“When I was growing up — and probably when you were growing up — we got our values about right and wrong from our religious beliefs. They were taught in the home and school, and they were echoed in church, and we saw them in books and films.

“Today, these conscience-forming institutions are breaking down in home and school, and we don’t have any restraint any more. We don’t have our consciences to be our guide any more.”

Harking back to the Great Depression, Crenshaw said that 30 percent of the people didn’t have a job, and 25 percent were considered poor, “and yet our cities were safe. People were poor and unemployed, but they respected law and order. Today we don’t have that kind of respect . . . It’s gone.

“The root cause of crime is not poverty. It’s evil men of criminal intent whose only concern is getting caught, and whose only fear is death. That’s why, to me, the death penalty is so fundamentally important to our criminal

justice system.

“When I was a young House member in 1972, just elected to the Florida Legislature, the U.S. Supreme Court had struck down the death penalty, and the first vote I cast was to reinstate the death penalty in Florida. I hope we never have to do that again. I hope it will be here to use as a deterrent over and over again.

“So, in closing, let me say that if we’re going to change life in Florida, we’re going to have to change life in Tallahassee. When I ran for the Senate six years ago, I was committed to bringing about that change. If I decide to run for Governor, I’m going to take the same attitude and make the same commitment.

“This is a war, indeed, and we don’t win wars by sitting idly by and doing business as usual. It takes leadership. It takes conviction, and I’m committed to that.”

Crenshaw began his address by recalling some of the “good things” that were done during the 1993 session of the Florida Legislature such as health care reform and budget reform. “We passed a budget without any new taxes for the first time in anybody’s memory,” he declared.

“And when the dust had settled, we had funded 7,000 new prison beds, which was almost unprecedented in Florida’s history, and it was because of your input. That was my first real experience with sitting down with you all and understanding the real, tremendous need we have to house violent criminals.”

Ain't no bad parts, really, and I betcha there's plenty of human deputies wish they could be K9s.

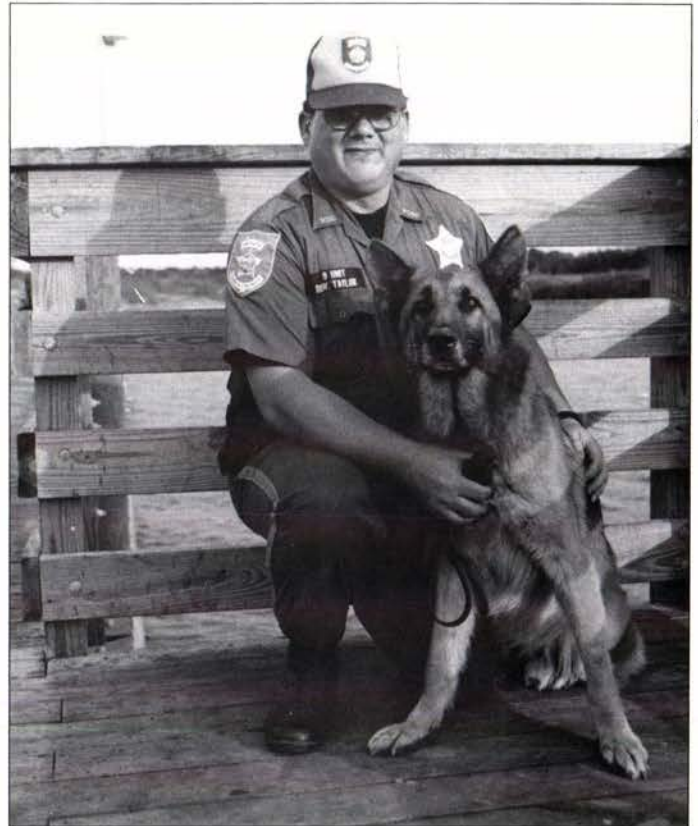
You don't mean it.

Sheriffs offer remedies for PRISON OVERCROWDING PROBLEM

Sheriffs attending the 80th Annual Conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association July 18-21, came up with remedies for prison overcrowding, and they spelled them out in resolutions that were sent to appropriate state and federal officials.

The suggested remedies were:

- (1) to use the state prison system to full capacity;
- (2) to accelerate the deportation process for over 50,000 aliens who are taking up desperately needed space in state and federal prisons; and
- (3) to pass the "Prison Litigation Relief Act of 1993" proposed by U.S. Rep. Charles Canady from Florida's 12th Congressional District.

Here is additional information contained in the resolutions:

Resolution 93-5 Full Utilization of Prison System

This resolution was passed after Sheriffs were informed that Florida's prison facilities are not being fully utilized, and that thousands of additional prisoners can be incarcerated if full capacity is achieved. It urges the governor and legislature to "undertake an immediate, independent review" to ensure that all available beds, bed space and prison sites are being used at full capacity.

The resolution states that citizens of Florida expect a reasonable degree of assurance that convicted criminals will serve their full sentences, and yet many are being needlessly released after they have served only a fraction of their sentences.

Resolution 93-6 Acceleration of Deportation

The following statistics were contained in this resolution: Over 50,000 prisoners in state and federal prisons are not citizens of the United States. The federal government spends \$800 million a year, and Florida spends \$40 million a year to incarcerate these prisoners. Immediate deportation of criminal aliens would save taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars and lessen the burden on overcrowded prison systems.

At the present time, the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service cannot begin the deportation process for incarcerated aliens until the alien has com-

pleted his or her sentence.

The resolution urges Congress to give local, state and federal authorities a discretionary method of accelerating this process. It also states that every lawful effort should be made to prevent re-entry of the deported aliens.

Resolution 93-7 Prison Litigation Relief Act

The courts have overstepped reasonable boundaries, and have required states and local governments to coddle prisoners, according to this resolution. It states that Americans cannot understand why courts require better treatment for criminals than the conditions experienced by men and women in the military service.

Courts should be prohibited from banning the use of tents and prefabricated structures to house inmates, and courts should not place a cap on the population of prisons and jails, the resolution adds.

Accepting this preamble, Sheriffs voted to support Congressman Canady's proposed Prison Litigation Relief Act of 1993 "to allow state and local governments to avoid early release of criminals."



Very technical, but Sheriffs understood it

After FBI Legal Advisor Pete R. Wubbenhorst explained Digital Telephony and Encryption of Telecommunications, Sheriffs passed a resolution supporting a proposed law that would require telecommunications firms and other electronic service providers — when legally authorized — to provide law enforcement with the capability to intercept the entire content of communications of criminals, to the exclusion of others, regardless of the technology involved.

Tournament honors former Sheriff for service to nation, state and county

KISSIMMEE — The Osceola County Sheriff's Office recently celebrated the tenth anniversary of the Ernest P. Murphy, Sr., Golf Tournament and raised \$2,600 for the Osceola Wish Foundation, a nonprofit organization that grants the wishes of children with life-threatening illnesses.

Sponsored by the Sheriff's Office, the tournament honors former Osceola County Sheriff Ernest P. "Kayo" Murphy, Sr., whose retirement at the beginning of 1985 marked the end of a distinguished 30-year law enforcement career.

This year, at the conclusion of the tournament, Osceola County Sheriff C. W. "Charlie" Croft gave Murphy a plaque recognizing his distinguished law enforcement and military service.

Murphy, who is approaching his 77th birthday, accepted the honor with his usual modesty, and added this award to the many laurels he has received as an authentic law enforcement and military hero.

Although born in Texas, "Kayo" became a Florida resident as a child, attended Osceola County public

schools and was graduated from St. Leo Preparatory School, in St. Leo, Florida.

He entered the U.S. Army as a private in World War II, became a paratrooper in the famous 82nd Airborne Division, and fought in all of the major European and Mediterranean campaigns. He was wounded in action at Anzio, received two battlefield commissions, and came home wearing a first lieutenant's bars above a chest full of medals.

His military decorations included the Silver Star, Purple Heart, Presidential Unit Citation with two bronze clusters, a combat infantryman's badge, parachute wings with three bronze stars, the ETO Medal with bronze arrowhead and seven bronze campaign stars, the French Fourragere, and the Dutch Fourragere.

One of his combat experiences was described in Cornelius Ryan's book, "A Bridge Too Far." A movie with the same title was based upon the book.

After the war, Kayo remained in the U.S. Army Reserve and eventually retired with the rank of Lt. Colonel.

His law enforcement career began in 1953 when his friend, Bob Buckels, was elected Sheriff of Osceola County, and offered him a job as chief deputy.

The title sounded impressive, but when Kayo reported for duty he discovered that, although he was the chief deputy, he was also the only deputy! "There were only three people in the department," he told an interviewer many years later, "Bob Buckels, his wife and me."

He said he started to work without any training. "Bob just called me in and said, 'here's a badge and a gun.' It didn't take me long to find out what law enforcement was all about."

The rookie deputy had to learn fast. His patrol car was an old Mercury with 100,000 miles on it. His "beat" was an area of 1,500 square miles, and he had no radio to summon backup help when the going got tough.

One day, while Kayo was transporting a prisoner from the east coast to Kissimmee, the old Mercury "blew up" and left him and his prisoner stranded in the boon-docks. He handcuffed the prisoner to a sign post, and called Buckels to "come get us."

That was the end of the old Mercury, and the beginning of better days for the chief deputy. As time passed he acquired better transportation, a shortwave radio, valuable experience and some good deputies who could back him up.

Kayo became Sheriff in 1968, and served 16 years in that capacity. When he retired at the beginning of 1985, his well-trained staff included 153 deputies, correctional officers and auxiliaries.

By this time, the veteran lawman had also acquired some impressive professional credentials, including a plaque that identified him as a graduate of the FBI National Academy. His office wall also held an "Outstanding Law Officer" award and commendations from top state and national officials.

The charitable tournament that now bears his name not only honors him, but also gives continuity to his concern for the needs of unfortunate children. He demonstrated this concern many years ago as a member of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund.

Former Bay County Sheriff dies

PANAMA CITY — Former Bay County Sheriff Tullis D. Easterling died on August 13 at the age of 83. He was an attorney and an FBI Agent before he served ten years as Sheriff.

Born at Clio, Alabama, July 29, 1910, Mr. Easterling held LLB and Juris Doctorate Degrees from the University of Alabama. He practiced law for three years in Ozark, Alabama, served as an FBI Agent from 1941 to 1967, and became the Undersheriff in the Bay County Sheriff's Office.

Mr. Easterling resigned his Sheriff's Office position in 1970 to found and head the Law Enforcement Program at Gulf Coast Community College.

Following the death of Sheriff M. J. "Doc" Daffin in 1971, the veteran lawman was appointed Sheriff of Bay County. He was elected to a four-year term in 1972 by the largest margin ever polled in Bay County, and was reelected by a two-to-one majority in 1976.

Mr. Easterling's many honors included a Good Government Award from the Jaycees; and an Outstanding Service Award from the Bay County Chamber of Commerce.

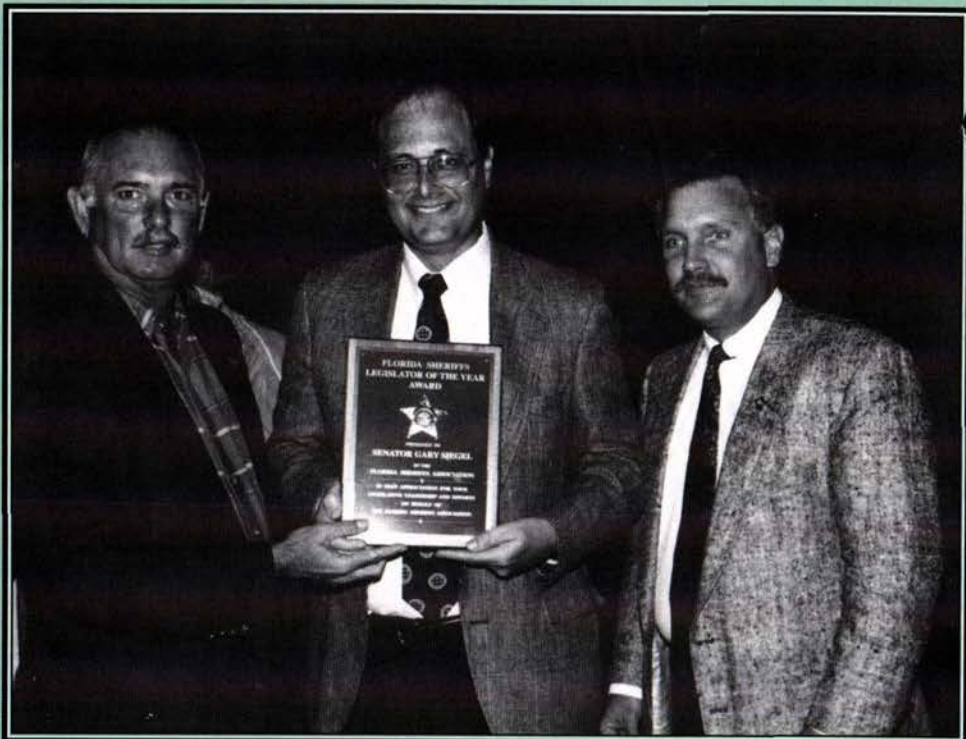

Legislator of the Year tells Sheriffs: "We're not going to drop the ball."

HAINES CITY, July 19 — After he was honored as the Florida Sheriffs Association's "Legislator of the Year," State Senator Gary Siegel responded by reassuring Sheriffs that he would continue to assist them in their efforts to unlock Florida's gridlocked prison system.

"We're not going to drop the ball," he told a luncheon audience during the 80th Annual Conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association at Grenelefe Resort.

"Next year we're going to look for a dedicated revenue source so we can spend the money we need to make sure that all violent, dangerous criminals are locked up behind bars where they belong."

Senator Siegel said the Sheriffs Association had "tremendous representation" in Tallahassee during the 1993 sessions of the Florida Legislature.

Sheriffs were "the people that really led the fight . . . for the 31,000 prison beds we're going to

build, and for getting rid of gain time," he added.

When Sheriff R. C. "Bobby" Knowles presented the "Legislator of the Year" award to Senator Siegel, he described him as "a breath of fresh air in the Senate . . . a rookie who didn't do business as usual."

Knowles, who is the immediate past president of the Sheriffs Association, was assisted by Sheriff Tom Tramel, the newly-elected president.

"It's not often that you find real friends in the legislature," said Tramel, "and it's less often when you find a former defense lawyer from New York in the legislature who's a friend of law enforcement. Gary Siegel did a tremendous job, and he deserves this award."
