Sheriffs warn:

There's a dangerous crossing ahead: time to

STOP, LOOK AND LISTEN!!

I imagine that the State of Florida is a school bus approaching a dangerous railroad crossing and Florida's crime problem is a freight train bearing down on that crossing at high speed, whistle wailing.

The Florida Legislature is driving the bus, and the Governor is sitting behind the driver, giving advice. Some of the passengers (mostly Sheriffs and crime victims) are screaming for the driver to STOP! Others who have failed to realize how fast the train is moving, or how near it is to the crossing, are clutching their teddy bears and urging the driver to keep going.

Florida's fate is in the hands — or, more specifically, the feet — of the bus driver, and the time has come to HIT THE BRAKES!!!

With the legislature currently in session, it is absolutely imperative for Florida's lawmakers to:

STOP accepting the status quo in the adult and juvenile justice systems;

LOOK at the realities of Florida's crime crisis;

AND LISTEN to law enforcement professionals who know how fast the freight train is traveling, and what must be done to avoid a total disaster.

In an era when kids carry guns to school, steal cars for fun, murder tourists, threaten judges and defy teachers, can legislators possibly doubt that the juvenile justice system has suffered a disastrous breakdown, and needs a complete overhaul?

Now that some of the most violent crimes are being committed by repeat offenders released from Florida's "revolving door" prison system, legislators should have no difficulty agreeing with a recent warning from the Florida Sheriffs Association that lack of prison space is the number one problem in the current crime crisis.

The Sheriffs Association is confident that house and senate members will be responsive to the Association's recent position statement that urges them to:

- Appropriate sufficient prison construction funds to keep dangerous criminals off the street and behind bars;
- Remove the juvenile justice "system" from the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, and put it in a Department of Juvenile Justice responsible for detention as well as rehabilitative programs;
- Maximize the incarceration of violent offenders, and oppose efforts to achieve this goal by weakening sentences imposed on other prisoners;

"In truth, we have no juvenile justice system."

I am not proud of the present state of affairs as it relates to juvenile justice. When you consider that there were 81,000 juvenile referrals to the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services (HRS) last year, and only detention space for 1,300 serious juvenile offenders, it becomes clear that, in truth, we have no juvenile justice system.

We know that many of these juvenile offenders have committed the same crimes with the same frequency as their adult role models who are in Florida prisons. Yet these juveniles are out on the streets continuing their rampage on society without fear of consequences. Surely, therefore, it has become obvious that the system is broken.

Yes, the system is certainly broken when juvenile court judges no longer have authority to enforce the rules, and juvenile delinquents continue to defy the judges' orders.

Recently I compared juvenile delinquency statistics for 1982-83 with those for 1991-92. During that period of time the number of delinquency cases received by HRS intake increased 92%. Felony cases increased 91%; attempted murder, 1,815%; felony drug cases 585%; auto theft cases, 329%; concealed firearm cases, 326%; armed robbery, 206%; and sexual battery cases, 74%. Since a big portion of these increases can be attributed to repeat offenders, can there be any doubt that the system is broken?

For further evidence, several Sheriffs around the state were asked to provide information about typical juveniles who are repeat offenders. In response, they described 37 offenders who had committed 978 serious offenses.

I can remember when a fight at school used to get you, at worst, a broken nose, and now it can get you shot or stabbed. Our newspapers are full of articles about guns at schools, and about juveniles involved in drive-by shootings, armed robberies and murders. And yet, Florida clings to the social work approach of treatment, rehabilitation and prevention — an approach that has never worked.

There is another approach involving strict enforcement and punishment, but Florida has chosen to use only the social work approach for all juveniles, and the results have been disastrous. The problem with applying only one approach is that there are at least three categories of juveniles and each category requires a different approach.

One group — the one we seldom hear about — includes the pre-delinquent kids who get off the track from time to time, but are helped back on track by family, friends and

role models. I should know about this group because there were times when I came mighty close to joining it in my youth.

Another group is made up of non-repeat, non-serious offenders who can be helped by treatment, prevention and rehabilitation — the social work approach.

Then there is the third group — those who have crossed the threshold and embraced a criminal lifestyle. These youngsters are repeat, or serious juvenile offenders, and applying the social work approach to them is not working. It never has. Therefore, with concurrence from members of the Florida Sheriffs Association's Legislative Committee, I am proposing a concept that will incorporate both approaches.

Florida needs a new — and separate — entity which I will call a Department of Juvenile Justice for lack of a better name. This agency should have two branches: One using prevention, pre-trial intervention, rehabilitation, and drug programs to deal with the kid who is on the threshold of a criminal career. Another to deal with serious youthful offenders through detention, boot camps and intense supervision. After all, these are little adults, and if they are going to act like their adult role models, they should be dealt with in the same way.

Currently juveniles are utilizing the very system established to protect society from them to protect themselves from society. Teachers and parents are being held hostage. Therefore, the Sheriffs Association's Legislative Committee is making the following general recommendations to the Florida Legislature.

1. Change the philosophy under which juveniles are being handled by creating a Department of Juvenile Justice.
2. Give judges the authority to enforce the rules.
3. Hold parents responsible in appropriate cases, but give back to teachers and parents the necessary authority to guide and discipline kids.
4. Amend Chapter 39, Florida Statutes, (the Juvenile Justice Act), in accordance with a change of philosophy.
5. Build the necessary detention centers and prisons.

No one in this state recognizes the severity of the present crime situation better than Florida's Sheriffs. We and our deputies are the troops in the trenches, and, if we can help the Legislature and the Governor to see through our eyes, the changes that are so desperately needed will be brought about without delay.

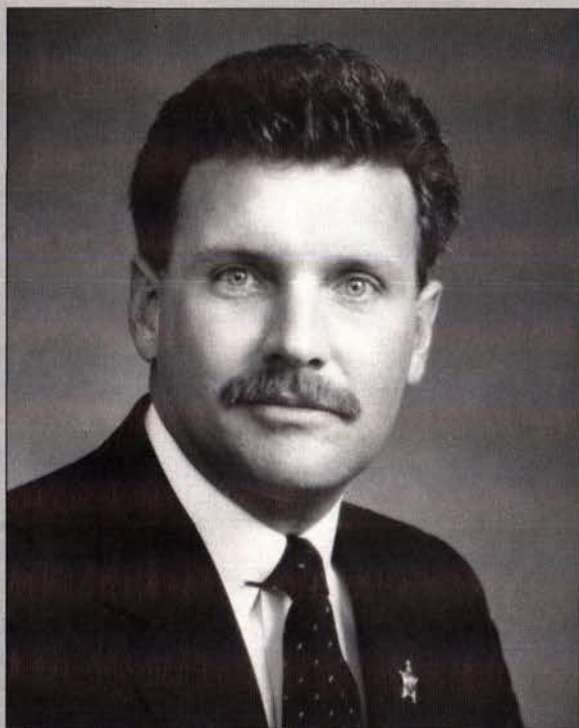

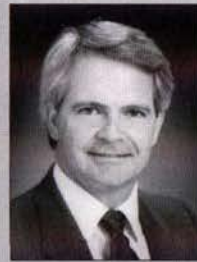

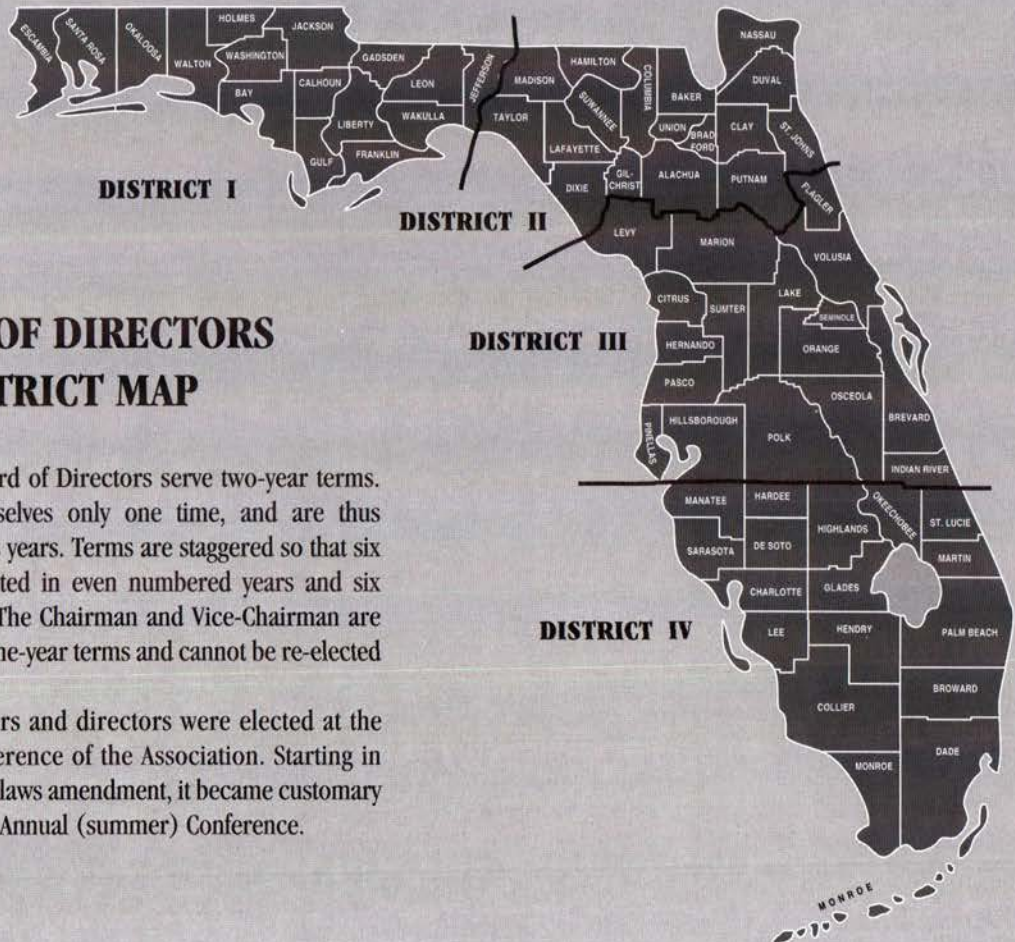

Members of the Board of Directors serve two-year terms. They can succeed themselves only one time, and are thus limited to four continuous years. Terms are staggered so that six Board members are elected in even numbered years and six in odd numbered years. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected by the Board for one-year terms and cannot be re-elected to succeed themselves.

Prior to 1990 officers and directors were elected at the Annual Mid-Winter Conference of the Association. Starting in 1990, as the result of a by-laws amendment, it became customary to hold the election at the Annual (summer) Conference.

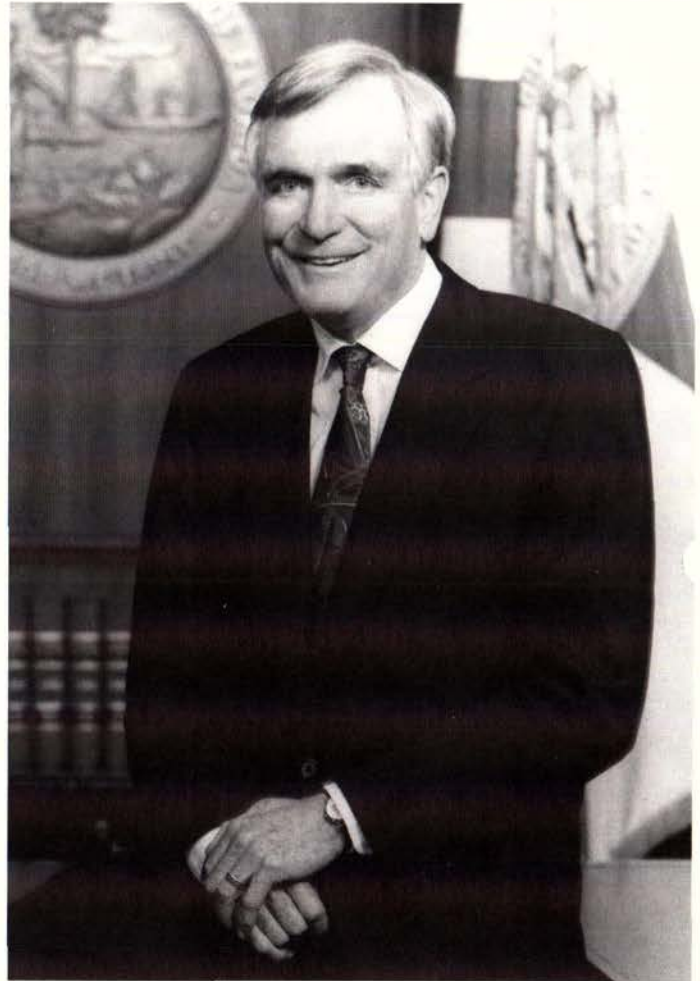
GOVERNOR LAWTON CHILES (D)

Governor Lawton Chiles was born in Lakeland, Florida, April 3, 1930. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Florida in 1952, and an LLB Degree from the University of Florida College of Law in 1955. Six Florida Universities have awarded him honorary degrees. He and his wife, Rhea Grafton Chiles, have four children.

Highlights of his professional career include: practicing attorney, Lakeland, Florida, 1955 to 1971; instructor, Florida Southern College, 1955 to 1958; Director, LeRoy Collins Center for Public Policy, 1989-90; Eminent Scholar, Manning Dauer Chair, Department of Political Science, University of Florida, 1989 to 1990.

Governor Chiles' political career began in 1959 when he was sworn-in as a member of the Florida House of Representatives. He held his House seat through 1966, and served in the Florida Senate from 1967 to 1970. He was in the U.S. Senate from 1971 to 1989 and held the following committee assignments: Appropriations Committee, Budget Committee (Chairman), Democratic Steering Committee, Governmental Affairs Committee and Special Committee on Aging. He was elected Governor in November, 1990.

He has received many awards during his years of public service, the most recent ones being: President's Environment and Conservation Challenge Award, 1992; National Science Foundation, for distinguished public service, 1988; Florida Wildlife Federation's Legislative Conservation Award, 1987; American Association of Homes for the Aging award for leadership and efforts on behalf of America's elderly, 1986; America-Israel Friendship League, Honorary Sponsor, 1984; United Synagogue Youth Soviet Jewry Award, 1984; National Security Council Leadership Award, 1983, 1986, 1987; American Federation of Senior Citizens Man of the Year, 1982; Florida Sheriffs Association award for contributing to the advancement of better law enforcement, 1982; Florida Informed Parents award for influence in the battle against drug abuse, 1981; Citizens Crime Watch award for legislative efforts to control criminal activity, 1981; and Disabled American Veterans' Commander's



Award, for outstanding service to disabled veterans, 1981.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

KENNETH H. "BUDDY" MACKAY (D)



Lieutenant Governor Kenneth "Buddy" MacKay is a former United States Congressman from Florida's 6th District. He was born on March 22, 1933, in Ocala, Florida, and attended Marion County public schools. He was graduated from the University of Florida in 1954. After serving three years as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force, he entered the University of Florida College of Law, from which he was graduated with honors in 1961.

MacKay is married to the former Anne Selph. They have raised four sons and have been active in the Presbyterian Church. From 1968 until 1974, MacKay served in the Florida House of Representatives, and from 1974 to 1980 in the Florida Senate. During that time he was designated Most Valuable Legislator more times than anyone in history. In addition to his Florida legislative service, he practiced law, and was also actively involved in the management of his family's cattle and citrus business.

MacKay began his first term as a Member of Congress on January 3, 1983. He served on the House Committee on Science and Technology, Foreign Affairs Committee, Committee on the Budget, and Select Committee on Aging.

During his first term in Congress, MacKay organized the Democratic Budget Group, which has played an active part in the

effort to reduce budget deficits. During the 99th Congress, he formed the Congressional Caucus on Competitiveness, a bipartisan, bicameral organization designed to improve America's standing in the global marketplace.

After his years in Congress, MacKay served as Chairman of the Florida Democratic Party's Campaign Committee and helped to develop a state-wide general election strategy for electing Democrats. He also was appointed as a national spokesman for the Washington-based Democratic Leadership Council.

MacKay took a leave of absence from the Miami law firm of Steel, Hector & Davis in order to run successfully in 1990 as Lt. Governor with former United States Senator Lawton Chiles. Their ticket was designated the "Democratic Dream Team" due to their combined 50 years of public service.

Governors hold "Supreme Executive Power"

In strong language, Article IV, Section 1, of Florida's Constitution decrees that "the supreme executive power shall be vested in a governor."

Then it adds: "He shall be commander-in-chief of all military forces of the state . . . He shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed, commission all officers of the state and counties, and transact all necessary business with the officers of government. He may require information in writing from all executive or administrative state, county or municipal officers upon any subject relating to the duties of their respective offices."

Other constitutional powers permit the Governor to: initiate judicial proceedings requiring public officials to do their duty, or refrain from unauthorized actions; request Supreme Court interpretations of his constitutional powers and duties; call out the militia to preserve the public peace; make appointments to fill vacancies in state and county offices.

STATE CABINET

The Executive Branch of state government administers and enforces laws. Top officials are the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and six cabinet officials — Treasurer, Commissioner of Agriculture, Attorney General, Comptroller, Secretary of State and Commissioner of Education. Each cabinet member is elected statewide and given specific duties.

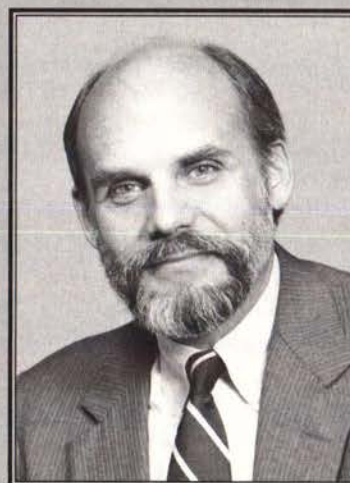

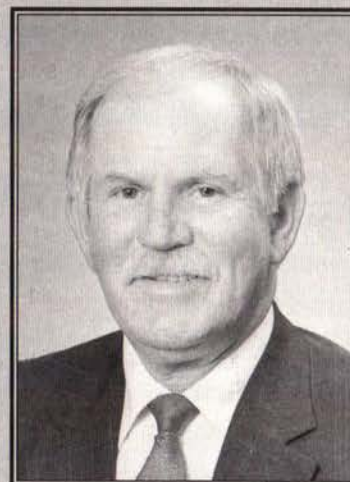

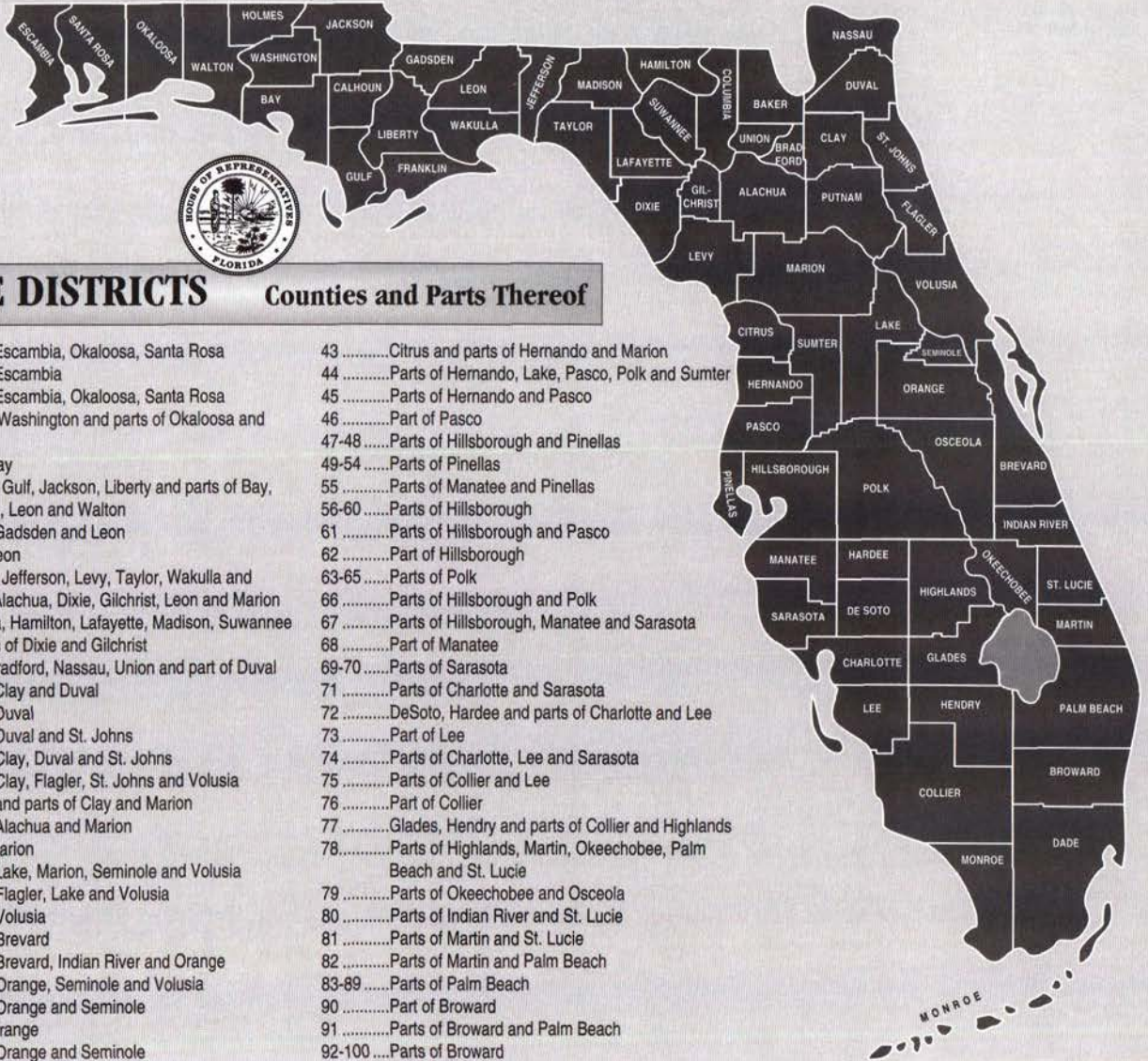

Child sex abuse by the numbers

According to the Association for the Treatment of Sex Offenders, child sex abuse is more common than most people would expect. The Association reported that the average pedophile can be expected to commit an average of 380 child sexual acts in his lifetime.

A survey of 232 sex offenders conducted by the Association revealed that the molesters claimed to have made 55,250 attempts to molest 17,585 victims, and were successful 38,727 times. Repeat offenses account for the numerical difference between victims and successful attempts.

An investigator who has been studying and arresting molesters for more than 12 years warned that "parents really need to wake up and be aware of what's going on out there." He said flea markets, beaches, churches, schools and video game arcades are all common places for pedophiles to pick up children.

Violent crimes holding steady

A recent report by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement shows that although the volume of index crimes declined slightly during the first six months of 1993, violent crimes (murder, forcible sex offenses, robbery and aggravated assault) remained at the same level as they were in the first six months of 1992. However, juvenile arrests for murder were up 16.7 percent; while juvenile arrests for rape were up over 32.7 percent. Crimes committed in Florida during the first six months of 1993 totaled 676,502. Victims of these crimes totaled 522,955, and arrests totaled 303,420. Ninety-six and five-tenths of the victims were residents of Florida.

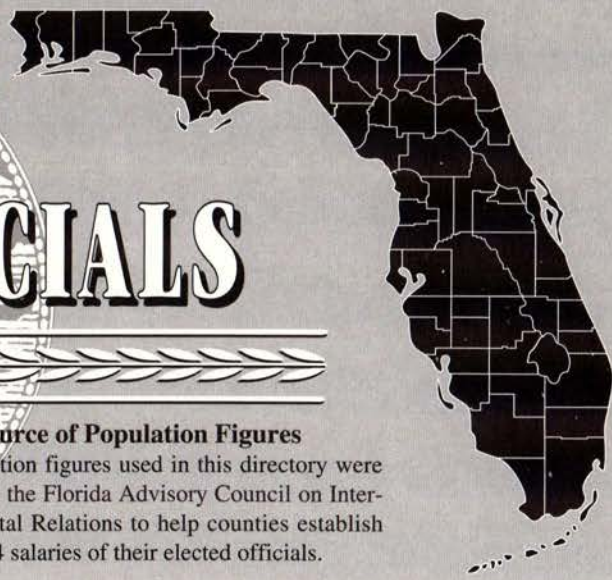

- Persons under age 25 have higher victimization rates than older persons.
- Males have higher rates of victimization than females.
- People who live in central cities have higher rates of victimization than those who live in suburban or non-metropolitan areas.
- In general, violent crimes are more likely to be committed by strangers than non-strangers.
- Most victims are victimized by offenders of the same race.

20-Year survey results

The National Crime Victimization Survey from 1972 to 1992 produced the following highlights:

- Overall crime rates have been stable or declining in recent years. However, violent crime rates for teenagers increased while rates for other age groups remained stable or declined. The violent crime rate for blacks in 1992 was the highest ever recorded.
- From 1973 to 1991, 36.6 million people were injured as a result of violent crime, and 6 million of these victims received serious injuries.
- In general, you are more likely to become the victim of a violent crime than to be injured in a motor vehicle accident.
- Twenty-five percent of all U.S. households are victimized by one or more crimes each year.
- About half of all violent crimes, and more than a third of all crimes are reported to law enforcement agencies.
- Teenagers and young adults consistently have the highest victimization rates.
- Handguns are used in about 10% of all violent crimes. Handgun crime rates are above the 1986 low, but have not returned to the 1982 high.
- The average dollar loss per crime increased from \$142 in 1975 to \$550 in 1991, a substantial increase even when adjusted for inflation.
- In violent crimes, males are much more likely to be victimized by strangers than by family members or intimates. However, females are as likely to be victimized by intimates as they are by strangers.
- About 30% of violent crimes and 25% of burglaries occur when the victim is engaged in a leisure activity away from home.

Facts about robberies in the 1980s and 90s

A recent report from the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics defines robbery as a completed or attempted theft of property or cash directly from a person by force or threat of force, with or without a weapon. It also offers the following facts about robberies in the 1980s and 90s:

In 1992, 1.2 million robbery victimizations occurred in the United States. Property was lost in two-thirds of these robberies. For the period 1987-90, four of every five robberies were com-

mitted by persons who were strangers to the victims. The most common outcome in robberies committed by strangers (42%) was for the victim to lose property but sustain no injury. In one out of 20 robberies the victim suffered a serious injury and lost property.

Robberies by strangers totaled 3,514,600 during the 1987-90 period. In 743,900 of these cases the robber used a handgun. Knives and similar sharp objects were the weapons of choice in 657,000 holdups.

Robbery rates reached a peak in 1981, then decreased through 1992.

A recent report by the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics shows that there were almost 19 million victims of personal crimes in the U.S. during 1992. Violent crimes accounted for 6,621,140; while personal thefts accounted for 12,210,830. The breakdown of violent crime was as follows: Assault, 5,254,690; rape, 140,930; and robbery, 1,225,510. Household crimes totaled 14,817,360. Black households, Hispanic households and urban households were the most likely to be victimized.

- Oppose any criminal justice legislation that will result in the sentencing of non-violent inmates to county jails rather than state prisons;
- Develop uniform contraband forfeiture regulations without diverting forfeiture funds away from the present law enforcement uses.

Hopefully, lawmakers will attach appropriate importance to these recommendations offered by front-line law enforcement professionals who have been actively involved in fighting crime throughout Florida's history. Moreover, the fact that the Florida Sheriffs Association has been providing innovative answers to Florida's criminal justice problems for almost 84 years should have considerable influence upon their decisions.

In 1955 the Florida Sheriffs Association persuaded the Legislature to establish the Florida Sheriffs Bureau as Florida's first statewide crime-fighting agency, then nurtured its growth as it evolved into the present Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

In 1957 the Association founded the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, a home for needy and neglected youngsters, that has since developed into a statewide network of child care programs and services managed by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. Often described as "Florida's charity for Florida's children," this unique venture has served over 8,000 pre-delinquent boys and girls and their families in its 36 years of crime prevention activities.

In 1963 the Association established the Florida Law Enforcement Academy as the State's first training facility serving all levels of law enforcement.

In 1966, Sheriffs working together through the Association also played a prominent role in establishing minimum professional standards for law enforcement officers.

Everyone with a knowledge of Florida's criminal justice history is fully aware of the impact Sheriffs have had on the progress of law enforcement and crime prevention; and, although this brief article merely "hits the high spots" in a long saga of success, it surely provides convincing evidence that Sheriffs are eminently qualified to lead Florida out of its present crisis. If Sheriffs don't know the answers, who does?

For safety's sake — toddlers receive free seats

Beware of telephone solicitors claiming to represent the Florida Sheriffs Association or Youth Ranches

Please remember this when you get a telephone call or a personal visit from someone who claims to be soliciting funds for these organizations.

Meanwhile, here are some tips from the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services that will help you to avoid being misled by unscrupulous solicitors.

- Don't judge a charity by its impressive sounding name. Some organizations' names are very similar to other well-known organizations. Be sure you know who is asking you for money.

- Ask questions, and do not contribute until you get satisfactory answers. Why is the group asking for a donation? What purpose does the group claim to serve?

- Be wary of emotional appeals. Be suspicious of organizations with only vague plans for spending donations.

- Not all organizations soliciting money are true charities eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions. Ask for the soliciting organization's federal tax-exempt number. If the organization does not have a tax-exempt number, donations will not be deductible for income tax purposes.

- Many telephone appeals for funds are conducted by paid solicitors rather than volunteers. This may result in substantial fund-raising costs.

It was a rare moment in the 36-year history of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches when leaders past, present and future held an impromptu summit conference on the Suwannee River, October 2, 1993.

Bonding over plates of Boys Ranch barbecue during a celebration that marked the Youth Ranches' 36th Anniversary were former Hillsborough County Sheriff Ed Blackburn who hatched the Youth Ranches project and served as the first executive director; Harry K. Weaver, the current headed-for-retirement President of the Youth Ranches; and President-in-Transition C. T. O'Donnell, Weaver's chosen successor.

Blackburn recalled how he and the late Don McLeod, former Marion County Sheriff, learned about Cal Farley's Boys Ranch during a trip to Texas, then persuaded Florida's Sheriffs to create a similar home

for pre-delinquent youngsters in 1957. He said hiring Weaver to head up the project in 1962 was one of many strokes of genius perpetrated by the Sheriffs and civilians who served as board members in the early days.

While thus engaged in a nostalgia trip, Blackburn was looking at the exact spot on the Suwannee River where Sheriffs appointed to a 1957 search committee had decided they had found the ideal location for their proposed anti-delinquency venture.

O'Donnell, an experienced child care professional selected by the Youth Ranches Board of Directors after a nationwide search, merely listened — while pondering the vast accumulation of tradition he will inherit on or before October 1, 1994.
